
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Chamber banquet: Send in the clown!

same time. She'll be helping out at the Caloosa Humane Society, then you see her spreading joy with the elderly. Next thing you know, she's having a ball with a bunch of kids before heading home to bake the cakes she shares with so many in town.

She has taken on the fight against cancer by coordinating the Cancer Resource Center where local cancer patients can find prosthetics, wigs, scarves and other items to help support them through the fight of their lives. She has a heart for the veterans and the hungry.

Mary's awards include: the 2009 James Stephen Award through the Area Agency on Aging, 2007 LaBelle Chamber of Commerce Citizen of the Year, 2006 Cornelius Kees Huijer Caloosa Humane Society First Volunteer Award and 2003 National American Legion Auxiliary Volunteer of the Year. She served as Grand Marshal for the 2013 Swamp Cabbage Festival and had a ball doing it.

Our Mary is a little dynamo, a perpetual motion machine, a real live Eveready Bunny - and she uses her powers for good.

Keynote speaker Matt Hudson of the Florida House of Representatives District 80 continued the upbeat atmosphere, although in a more business manner. (If you don't count the spot on Donald Duck impression.)

Rep. Hudson told the group, "The chamber of commerce is about how we present our businesses" and "They do amazing things."

He continued by saying that growth is "tremendous" in Florida and "Your state is heading in the right direction." He also not-

ed that Florida has a surplus and a balanced budget.

He commented on the upcoming Legislative session in the Spring, predicting much discussion on jobs and honing in on rural economic development - a particular interest of his.

Also expect the Legislature to consider bills concerning gaming and gambling, health (especially Alzheimer's Disease) and a subject very important to Hendry County's Lake Okeechobee and Caloosahatchee River - water quality. He is also looking forward to negotiating with the federal government on the condition of the Hoover Dike.

Our business climate is a fundamental focus of the Legislature, he stated.

Five hundred years ago this year - in 1513 - Ponce de Leon first set foot on North America, and he did it in what is now our home - Florida!

Hendry County's Heritage Festival is our chance to shed a spotlight on our own unique contribution to Florida.

Hendry's celebration will take place at the LaBelle Rodeo Grounds on November 9, beginning at 9 a.m. The fun doesn't end until after the last cowboy hangs up his spurs at the rodeo.

There will be booth space available for communities, churches, food vendors and exhibitors for profit and non-profit groups, musicians and historians free of charge.

The covered pavilion may be filled but tents will be available for vendors/exhibitors throughout the Rodeo Grounds. Organizers need to know how many vendors will need electricity for their booth. If you want to be in a 10x10 tent, those will have those available.

FYI: Good weather has been ordered and November can be very nice!

Ponce de Leon is credited with bringing cattle, horses and citrus to Florida on his second expedition and the cracker cattle and ponies of today can be traced back to that time. These days history reveals a dark side to the European "discovery" of this

continent, but the fact remains that there is much to be celebrated as well.

That's what the Hendry County Heritage Festival is all about - celebrating what is best about our forefathers (and foremothers!) contributed to our own history. The hope is that every area of the county will join in this once in a lifetime experience. There are lots of traditions and "lost" arts to celebrate. o you share a common community, ancestry, faith, industry or talent? Can you give today's residents a meaningful look back at life in "the old days" of Hendry County?

Organizers are hoping people with talents that reflect those days will share their stories and their skills.

Bryan released on bond

Eighteen-year-old Joshua D. Bryan has been released on \$100,000.00 bond. He is the second man charged with the sexual battery of a 16-year-old girl, The other arrestee, Timothy Alexander, 31, had been released earlier on \$150,000 bond. Both are required to wear a GPS tracking device as a special condition of their release. The courts are also requiring that they have no contact with victim.

Bryan and 31-year-old Timothy Alexander were arrested on October 9 on charges of sexually assaulting a 16-year-old minor.

According to arrest records, the incident occurred on October 1 on a party bus owned by Alexander. The victim was allegedly forced to have sex with both men after other party goers left the bus.

The men were arrested on a warrant October 7.

Hunt season modified at Big Cypress WMA

The National Park Service (NPS) at Big Cypress National Preserve and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) have worked cooperatively to modify the hunting seasons within the Big Cypress Wildlife Management Area (WMA).

This modification will help make up for hunting days missed due to the recent federal government shutdown.

After consultation with the NPS, the FWC has issued an executive order that will extend the archery and muzzleloading gun hunts in the WMA.

"This cooperative effort between the Preserve and the Commission highlights the strong partnership between the two agencies," said Big Cypress National Preserve Superintendent Pedro Ramos.

The order, issued Friday, Oct. 18, will add an additional six days of archery hunting and five days of muzzleloading gun hunting. The archery hunt will run from Oct. 31 through Nov. 5. in all units of the WMA. The muzzleloading gun hunt will run from Nov. 6 through Nov. 10 in all units except Deep Lake.

There is no quota for either of these extended hunt seasons.

The current muzzleloading gun season will continue as scheduled, ending on Oct. 27.

"We are pleased that our partners at the National Park Service have helped us extend the hunting season to make up for the time lost while the Preserve was closed," said FWC South Regional Director Chuck Collins. "We hope that hunters are able to get out and enjoy these opportunities."

The shutdown, from Oct. 1-16, reduced the archery season by six days and the muzzleloading season by five days.

God's Finishing Work: Tedious but worth it

I grew up in Fort Myers. After I was old enough to get a job I worked the summers doing construction jobs.

I learned about concrete, framing, laying block, and other various jobs. I worked for hard men and learned a lot about foremen and superintendents on the job. I enjoyed framing houses because the work went fast and it was easy to see immediate results.

When we framed a house we used the biggest pieces of lumber, the biggest tools and worked as fast as we could. That fit my personality for that is how I like to live.

Once we finished framing the house and dried it in (roof on and drywall put up), the finishing work would begin.

There is where it all started to bog down. Progress virtually comes to a grinding halt. Construction would go from warp speed to a snail's pace!

The finishing work, like putting up ceiling trim (sometimes in three layers), nailing baseboards or painting and hanging cabinet doors is often very slow, and very tedious. The reason is clear: it has to be flawless.

Up to that point a worker, when putting up studs in a wall, can hit a 16-penny nail as hard as he wants with the biggest hammer he can swing.

However, he can't do that when nailing up trim inside the house! He has to use tiny nails and a smaller hammer.

Finishing work is slow and tedious. Yet, the finishing work is what people see. They don't see the studs inside the wall or the floor joists or the roof timbers. They see the finishing work. Thus, it has to be right and it has to be perfect.

The illustration is clear and the application is abundant: when we are born again through faith in Jesus Christ it is a dramatic work of God and it happens fast.

We start growing spiritually, learning the Bible for the first time, making new discoveries and experiencing big changes in our

lives. Salvation is God framing our lives, and we see big changes at a rapid pace. It is exciting!

However, as we continue to grow spiritually, the changes that God makes in us and that we want to make get smaller.

Those changes are much more detailed, less noticeable to others and are often more difficult to achieve. We move from God's framing work to His finishing work.

Just like construction, God's finishing work is time consuming and much more intricate. He continues His work as He shapes us into the image of Jesus Christ. Just like it takes a lot more time and work to finish a house than it does to frame one, so Christian maturity likewise requires time and patience.

So... are you getting discouraged with your struggles and issues in your Christian walk? Are you trying to make changes in your life? Here's something we all need to remember. God's plan and timetable is different than ours. Be patient.

The Lord is faithful to finish the good work He started in you when He saved you by His grace! "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and the finisher of our faith!" (Hebrews 12:2)

Alico sells controlling interest in company

734 Agriculture, a private investment company owned and controlled by Remy W. Trafelet and George R. Brokaw, in partnership with Arlon Group, a global food and agriculture investment firm founded by Continental Grain Company, have entered into definitive agreements under which an affiliate of 734 Agriculture will acquire approximately 50.5 percent of Alico's outstanding voting stock from Atlantic Blue Group, a family owned holding company.

This all cash transaction values the majority stake in Alico at \$37 per share, for a

total purchase price of \$137.8 million. The transaction should close by the end of the year.

Alico is an agribusiness and land management company. It's principal lines of business are citrus groves, improved farmland including sugar cane, cattle ranching and resource conservation. It is one of the largest private landowners in Florida with approximately 130,000 acres in five counties. and is a leading citrus grower in Florida with approximately 11,000 producing acres.



HENDRY COUNTY

US 27 just west of Berner Road: Maintenance permit project: Motorists can expect crews working near the roadway installing drainage on the south side of US 27 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. No lane closures are expected with this work. Motorists are asked to use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 27 from CR 835 to Palm Beach County line: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing shoulders and replacing sod on both sides of the roadway. No lane closures are expected with this work. Project is anticipated to be complete by November 2013.

US 27/SR 80 at Sky Valley Lane: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect the inside southbound and northbound lanes closed from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. for crews to build new turn lanes into the subdivision, weather permitting. Drivers are asked to use caution as crews work near the roadway. Project is estimated to be complete end of 2013.

SR 80 from CR 833 to east of US 27: Construction project: Work expands two-miles of SR 80 to four lanes from east of County Road 833 to west of US 27. Crews are installing drainage, stabilizing shoulders, placing sod, paving guardrail pads and pouring bridge approach slabs. Drivers should pay attention to traffic signs and barricades throughout the construction project, stay alert, and use caution in the work zone. Es-

timated completion is spring 2014. The contractor is C.W. Roberts Contracting, Inc.

SR 80/US 27 Interchange: Construction project: Work continues to modify the intersection with construction of an overpass for SR 80 traffic eastbound to US 27 northbound and for US 27 traffic northbound to SR 80 westbound. The project also realigns US 27. Crews also will widen approximately 3/4 mile of SR 80 to four lanes approaching the intersection, add a traffic signal at the overpass and install lighting at the interchange. Work currently involves placing fill dirt, installing drainage and constructing the new overpass and roadways. Southbound US 27 traffic is using the newly constructed lanes. The SR 80/US 27 intersection is temporarily shifted to the north. Motorists travelling east and west on SR 80 must use caution at the US 27 intersection and follow the posted speed limit of 25 MPH. Expect intermittent lane closures on US 27. Motorists are advised to be aware of construction vehicles entering and leaving the work zone and to use caution driving in this area. Project completion is estimated at end of year 2013. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, Inc.

SR 80 from Lashley Street to Elm Street: Maintenance permit project: Crews will be installing gas line from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. No lane closures are expected for this work. Estimated project completion is fall 2013.

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Services here for local cancer patients

The American Cancer Society (ACS) serves local patients and their families through its Cancer Resource Center, located at the United Way House on Bridge Street.

Patients can find prosthetics, wigs, scarves, hats, etc. there - all manner of items to help them feel better about themselves while they're going through the trials of chemotherapy and radiation.

Also, the ACS's Look Good Feel Better program - in which professional cosmetologists help women bolster their self esteem as they go through their lives coping with cancer.

In LaBelle, Letty Balderas of Salon Eight Four uses her expertise for the American Cancer Society's Look Good Feel Better program.

Since 2011 Letty has helped breast cancer patients get to a better frame of mind by simply showing them how to use makeup to mask the effects of the disease and treatment - and looking better always helps you feel better.

Once contacted by the ACS with a client, Letty takes over to work her special kind of magic.

Often the client coming in is under a lot of stress, confused and not really sure about what's happening. When they come to Letty, she first shows them a short video of what this program is all about. She gives them a kit from the Personal Products Consultant Foundation, which works with the ACS, providing top brand, hypo-allergenic cosmetics and skin care products essential to helping them regain some of their confidence and feelings of self worth. She teaches them how to apply makeup

Most are feeling and showing the effects of chemotherapy, so she shows them how to fill in their eyebrows. She asks them to bring in their wig (which they can get from the Resource Center) and she will cut it in a becoming style suited to them.

Letty said many of these women feel awkward at first, even that what they're doing is "selfish." They need to understand that they are carrying a lot on their shoulders - family, friends, often a job - trying to keep everything together. This Look Good Feel Better program is a much needed time devoted to taking care of themselves. A little morale boost can go a long way toward helping smooth out the rough spots.

A 2002 LaBelle High School graduate, Letty said she is part of this program because it is important. "This is my community," she said, "and I will support it any way I can."

Reach To Recovery

The American Cancer Society's Reach to Recovery program helps people cope with their breast cancer experience.

When people first find out they have breast cancer, they may feel overwhelmed, vulnerable, and alone. While under this stress, many people must also learn about and try to understand complex medical treatments and then choose the best one.

Talking with a specially trained Reach to Recovery volunteer can give a measure of comfort and an opportunity for emotional grounding and informed decision-making. Volunteers are breast cancer survivors who give patients and family members an oppor-

tunity to express feelings, talk about fears and concerns, and ask questions of someone who is knowledgeable and level-headed. Most importantly, Reach to Recovery volunteers offer understanding, support, and hope because they themselves have survived breast cancer and gone on to live normal, productive lives.

Through face-to-face visits or by phone, Reach to Recovery volunteers give support for:

- People recently diagnosed with breast cancer
- People facing a possible diagnosis of breast cancer
- Those interested in or who have undergone a lumpectomy or mastectomy
- Those considering breast reconstruction
- Those who have lymphedema
- Those who are undergoing or who have completed treatment such as chemotherapy and radiation therapy
- People facing breast cancer recurrence or metastasis (the spread of cancer to another part of the body)

Volunteers are trained to give support and up-to-date information, including literature for spouses, children, friends, and other loved ones. Volunteers can also, when appropriate, provide breast cancer patients with a temporary breast form and information on types of permanent prostheses, as well as lists of where those items are available within a patient's community. 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Florida Agriculture Hall of Fame honors Dallas Townsend

Tallahassee, FL – Hendry County's own Dallas Townsend was one of four honorees recently named to the Florida Agriculture Hall of Fame by Commissioner of Agriculture Adam H. Putnam four honorees who will be inducted into the Florida Agriculture Hall of Fame for 2014. These individuals have made outstanding contributions to Florida's agriculture industry and mentored future leaders in this field.

Retired Director of the University of Florida Hendry County Extension Office, Dallas served 39 years as an extension agent in Southwest Florida and was instrumental in working with IFAS and the agriculture industry to bring more research capacity to the area through the UF/IFAS Southwest Florida Research and Education Center. His involvement with youth and 4-H is legendary, coaching more than a dozen 4-H teams



and thousands of 4-H youth.

The award winners will be honored on Feb. 11, 2014 at the Ag Hall of Fame Dinner. Current Director of the UF Hendry County Extension Office, Gene McAvooy wrote the following letter in support of Dallas' nomination.

"As a life-long Floridian, Dallas Townsend has worked tirelessly during his 39 years with the University of Florida Extension Service to serve the needs of the farmers and ranchers of Southwest Florida and help improve their productivity and economic well-being.

"In an age of increasing specialization, Dallas stands out as a county extension agent who was broadly versed in a range of subjects and who could converse with and relate equally with producers of all types from citrus to livestock to vegetables. Throughout his career, Dallas worked on a range of practical issues from fertility programs to pest and disease management as well as pesticide and worker safety programming that benefitted farmers and ranchers large and small.

"In addition to his willingness to help others, Dallas displayed a keen awareness of the larger picture and realized that if the agricultural industry in Southwest Florida was to remain competitive in the global market place and contribute economically to the well-being of the region; farmers and ranchers would require assistance at the macro level. To this end, he was instrumental in working with IFAS and agricultural industry in bringing the research capacity to the area through the establishment of the UF/IFAS Southwest Florida Research and Education Center. He was also instrumental in working with the Hendry County Extension Advisory Committee in obtaining grants for a new Hendry County Extension Center.


"Dallas was active in a number of organizations including the Hendry County Cattleman's Association, Gulf Citrus Growers Association and the South Florida Ag Council.

"Dallas pioneered the multi-county Extension Agent concept and under his leadership garnered the support of the agricultural industry, the University of Florida and

local governments in SW Florida to establish the Hendry County Extension Office as the regional agricultural extension office for Southwest Florida. This agreement provides agricultural interests in SW Florida with four specialized agents in the areas of citrus, livestock, sugarcane and vegetables who are able to provide the level of expertise required by commercial agriculture in the region.

"Dallas's involvement with youth and 4-H is legendary. His fundamental belief in the power of youth has made him a leader in this regard. Dallas coached 16 Hendry County 4-H Meats Judging Teams from 1980-1999, with three of his teams taking first place in National Competition. Over the course of his career, he inspired and touched the lives of literally thousands of 4-H youth.

"His nomination was supported by a great many area agricultural leaders including Hugh English, former VP at Duda, Ron Hamel, Gulf Citrus Growers, Dr Bernie Lester, retired CEO Allico, Tom Jones, Barron Collier Companies, Joe Marlin Hilliard, John Stitt and others."
