Looking for grants to finish Sports Complex

At the March 13 City commission meeting, commissioners took action that will allow the Hendry-LaBelle Recreation Board to apply for grants on its own that will not obligate the city or the county.

Although the rec board, is made up of members from the county, city and school board, it will be able to borrow the money on its own, the city and county boards must still approve the rec board's budget.

To pay off the loan, the rec board will allocate the \$25 of residents' recreation fee (which was previously earmarked for the old plan to build a golf course) in order to finish Forrey Sports Park.

Seeking a loan is the only way the rec board can finish the park and not encumber the city and county.

Franchise fees could bolster budget

Hendry County commissioners have a lot to think about as they begin to consider their options for the 2014-15 budget. At their March 25 meeting, they received information on how franchise fees could affect next year's budget.

Finance Director Jennifer Davis ran through an analysis for the board.

She said that imposing a 5.9 percent electrical franchise fee to all existing utilities in unincorporated Hendry County would bring in an additional \$875,000 per year, based on current figures. At today's property valuation, that would equal approximately .5000 mills, she said.

However, new property value estimates are due in June and July and the board is looking for somewhat of an increase in those property values.

Natural gas is only beginning to come into Hendry County and customers on both sides of the county could begin to connect soon. If that happens, revenue from that source could go up.


The impact of electrical franchise fees to taxpayers could be an estimated .5000 mill decrease in the proposed millage rate of 8.9709 mills (which would make it 8.4709 mills). That figure would be an increase of 1.25 mills over the current 7.2209 millage rate.

If the board were to impose

Learn about river boats plying the Caloosahatchee

David Glick, who retired from the Henry Ford Museum at Dearborn, MI, is the guest speaker for the April 3 program meeting of LaBelle Heritage Museum at LaBelle City Hall, 481 West Hickpochee Ave, at 7:00 p.m. Mr. Glick will relate his experiences with the restoration and preservation of some of the Caloosahatchee's more famous paddle-wheel steamboats, such as the Suwannee and the Thomas A. Edison, that plied the river during the early days of the 20th Century and were no strangers to LaBelle's waterfront that Henry Ford either had replicated or restored for his Henry Ford Museum. The program is open to all and there is no admission charge. A questions and answers period will wind up Mr. Glick's presentation followed by a break for refreshments. The meeting will end with the election of officers for 2014/2015 to serve a one-year term and one director for a three-year term. The nominating committee will present a recommended slate of officers and three candidates for the open three-year director's term. Nominations from the floor will be in order with only current dues paying members of the museum eligible to vote.

Borrowing may be the only answer, since it is illegal to mortgage public property, City Attorney Angela Hill noted.

The rec board received approval from the Hendry County Board of County Commissioners at its last meeting and was to adopt the at its Tuesday, March 18 meeting.

Mayor Dave Lyons, a member of the Rec Board, said the funding will be used in part to complete lighting and the concession stand.

The board approved a zoning change to allow Child Care of Southwest Florida's Children's Garden of LaBelle to relocate from its SR 80/Martin Luther King Blvd. site to 88 South Main Street, across from the Courthouse.

Last month the commission failed to take a vote on the request so it was brought forward again for the vote. The item passed 4-0 with some minor changes. Commissioner Greg Bone was not at the meeting.

Fire Chief Clint Walker reported that LaBelle Fire Department answered 57 calls for service last month, many of them brush fires or wrecks. This represents an increase in activity over the same time last year, he said.

In other business:

- The board approved a resolution that will allow the city to seek grant funding for a third section of the new wharf on the river. This portion will close the gap between the first phase east of the bridge, and the next section to the east.

- The city has ordered culverts for the washout at Selma Daniels and Withlacoochee Ave. The road will be closed for the work, which should be done in a week or so.

- The next regular city commission meeting will be Tuesday, April 10, beginning at 6 p.m.

both an electrical and natural gas franchise fee, taxpayers would see an estimated .5600 decrease in the 8.9709 proposed millage rate.

Even with the estimated electrical and natural gas franchise fees, taxpayers would be hit with a .6900 mill increase over the existing millage (or 8.4109 mills).

The board members were cautioned that these are just preliminary figures. Everything hinges on how property values change and on any change in county revenues.

Commissioner Michael Swindle made the motion to have staff move forward on

budget discussions using the proposed franchise fees. Commissioner Don Davis seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Firefighters save Muse homes from blaze

Muse, FL – Wildfire activity recently has increased in the Muse Area in Glades County. "Caution is needed this time of year due to drier weather conditions," states Melissa Yunas, Florida Forest Service.

Saturday a wildfire threatened two homes and damaged one boat and a power pole off of Ash Road. The cause was unauthorized debris pile burning.

On Saturday, March 22, Cypress Fire, off Ash Road started about 1:44 p.m. and burned 20 acres.

The Sunday, March 23, Altman, off Altman Lane, burned three acres.

Florida Forest Service and Glades County Fire Department want to remind residents to know the law before you strike that match.

"Your local Florida Forest Service in Palmdale can answer your burning setback, authorization and onsite questions," Melissa explains, "if your fire escapes then you can be held liable for any damages or injuries."

Sunday a wildfire ignited off of Altman Lane and Glades County Fire Department quickly extinguished the grass wildfire. Florida Forest Service investigated the cause and found it was ignited by equip-

ment. Florida Forest Service & Glades County Fire Department want to remind residents do not pull off of roadways into tall, dry grass. Hot exhaust pipes and mufflers can easily start wildfires that you may not see until it's too late!

State Wildland Firefighters encourage homeowners who live near nature to build a wildfire emergency kit, and make a wildfire plan with your family.

Design your home and landscaping with safety in mind, and use materials and plants that might contain a fire, instead of fueling it.

Regularly cleaning gutters is a must, and move flammable objects like patio furniture away from the house. Protect vinyl and wood construction materials; they are more vulnerable to fire.

Comment on Big Cypress access

Big Cypress National Preserve has reopened the public scoping period for a backcountry access plan and environmental impact statement. The comment period will be open until May 11, 2014, in accordance with a related notice of intent published in yesterday's Federal Register. The purpose of the plan will be to provide off-road vehicle (ORV) secondary trails, non-motorized trails and a camping management approach that protects the Preserve's natural and cultural resources while providing for public enjoyment. The plan will also establish a permanent route for the Florida National Scenic

Trail and other hiking opportunities.

You may provide written input regarding backcountry access into the Preserve and the scope, issues and alternatives to be addressed in the plan and the environmental process. There will also be two public scoping meetings. The dates and locations will be announced in the near future. Who can you really trust?

March Madness got its name because the NCAA basketball tournament provides stunning upsets each season. Unpredictability is a big part of the tournament's appeal. At any point in the competition, an unknown squad can suddenly catch fire, hitting shot after shot, to knock off a heavily favored opponent.

However, if you were filling out an NCAA tournament bracket from 1967 to 1973, then you should have chosen the same champion every single year. Coach John Wooden's UCLA Bruins won seven consecutive titles! No other men's collegiate team has won more than two NCAA tournaments in a row.

Why did John Wooden's teams win so often? Obviously, they had talented players, but what set UCLA apart from the competition was their commitment to loyalty. UCLA's players were intensely loyal to their leader, Coach John Wooden. Why were they so loyal? One reason - they trusted him!

President John F. Kennedy wrote in his book Profiles in Courage, "Great crises produce great men and great deeds of courage." How do we respond when we face a great crisis?

As Christians, how does our faith change how we respond to a great crisis? Can you really trust God?

One of the most popular stories in the Bible is the story of Job. Job was a godly man, who loved his family and was very wealthy and influential. Job would appear today on the show Lifestyles of the Rich and Famous.

But then tragedy came his way, and he lost everything. Instead of giving up his faith, he declared, "Yet will I trust him" (Job 13:15). He suffered bankruptcy. He faced the death of his children.

He battled disease. He had marriage problems as a result of the other troubles.

Everything went wrong, but he could say, "Yet will I trust him!" What can we learn from Job about trusting God?

Trust God in spite of feelings. Job went through the same feelings of confusion,

depression and fear that we go through when we suffer a tragedy. But he held on to his faith in God.

"Yet will I trust him" means in spite of my feelings I will trust Him.

Just because we trust God doesn't mean we aren't going to be angry, disappointed and depressed. It means we aren't going to let those feelings control us and destroy us. We can rise above our feelings by our faith.

Trusting God doesn't mean your life is going to be perfect. "Yet" means that life brings us both positive and negative: good times and bad times. Faith is not fantasy!

We can face the realities of this life and still worship our God because He is with us in bad times as well as good. Faith doesn't always keep us out of the fire, but it always takes us through the fire, so that we are refined as pure gold.

Trusting God is a matter of personal conviction based on your experience with God. "Yet will I trust him," is a very personal statement. You can't hitch a ride on somebody else's faith!

You have to be able to say from your heart, "I will trust him." Nobody can do that for us. As you experience God more and more in your life, your personal faith in Him will get stronger so that you can make it through anything life brings your way.

Trust God for a new chapter in your life. The Lord turned things around for Job and gave him twice as much as he had before his troubles.

You need to know you can write a new chapter.

What you're going through right now is not the final chapter. God will turn things around for you just like he did for Job. You need only to look to Him and trust Him and not let anything keep you from trusting Him.



Increasing participation in school breakfast in Florida districts

Some Florida school districts have found certain strategies to be highly beneficial in helping increase participation their School Breakfast Programs.

- Make breakfast a part of the school day — Move breakfast out of the cafeteria before school and make it convenient for students to participate. Implementing alternative delivery models have proven to be the most successful strategies for schools to increase breakfast participation. Options include
 - Breakfast in the Classroom — All children are offered breakfast in their classroom, either at the beginning of the school day or early in the day.
 - Grab-and-Go - Children can easily grab the components of their breakfast quickly from the cafeteria line or from carts or kiosks elsewhere on school grounds and eat outside of the cafeteria.
 - Second Chance Breakfast -Offers students a second chance to obtain and eat breakfast after homeroom or first period.
 - No cost to Students — Providing “universal” breakfast at no-charge to all students, helps erase the stigma associated with free breakfast
 - Support from teachers and administrators- Gaining support from the school administration and teachers is essential to providing a seamless School Breakfast Program.

- gram.
 - Provide a free breakfast for teachers.
 - Provide specialty trashcans for breakfast trash only.
 - Serve what they like — Providing breakfast items that the children are interested in and want to eat. It helps draw them to the program.
 - Second chance for older students - Serving middle and high school students after first period allows them ample time to socialize in the morning before the beginning of the day and provides them with a nutritious start early in the day.
 - Involve students in the process — In a high schools with a culinary program, having students in training to help pack classroom breakfasts for the next morning provides necessary training time for these students and helps support the school breakfast program.
 - Combat litter - For grab—and-go models, schools implement garbage pick-up for students who are late to class; this eliminates the litter but also encourages students not to litter in the first place.
- For the little ones, schools can assign one student each week to pick up the classroom breakfast trash and deliver to a central, designated spot outside the classroom to reduce impact on the janitorial staff.

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Bass are back at Lake Trafford

After nearly a decade, fishermen are finally catching noteworthy bass in Lake Trafford again.

The good news comes after years of habitat problems for the lake in northwest Collier County, the largest natural lake south of Lake Okeechobee. During the mid-1990s, excessive amounts of muck created poor water quality with low oxygen levels that led to several large fish kills. The problems nearly eliminated the largemouth bass population in this location.

In 2004, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) led a multimillion-dollar dredging/restoration project. The task took six years to complete after crews removed more than 6 million cubic yards of muck. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) established a plan for controlling problem exotics such as hydrilla and West Indian marsh grass, and helped restore beneficial aquatic plants like bulrush and Illinois pondweed.

Starting in 2010, the FWC began restocking the lake with 500,000 largemouth bass fingerlings to help supplement the native population. Today, the stocked bass make up about 40 percent of the bass population at Lake Trafford, and are generally at least 12 inches long.

Several agencies continue to work together to improve the long-term health of the lake, and their efforts are paying off. At a recent bass tournament, the winning team caught five fish that together weighed 28.2 pounds. The largest fish out of the bag weighed 7.5 pounds. The second-place team had a bag limit of five fish that totaled 25.4 pounds, with the largest fish weighing 6.7 pounds.

As if good fishing alone weren't enough reason to fish Lake Trafford, the FWC's TrophyCatch (TrophyCatchFlorida.com) program just announced a special incentive. An award will be given to the angler who has the first bass heavier than 8 pounds from Lake Trafford that is approved for TrophyCatch recognition. This package contains several items, including a U.S. Reel casting reel, Glen Lau DVD, gift certificate for four adults at Airboats and Alligators at Lake Trafford Marina, in addition to standard TrophyCatch incentives. 

Panthers in the news

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) biologists released an endangered Florida panther March 10 on private property in southeast Hendry County.

The kitten was rescued last May in Collier County after the panther had apparently been struck by a vehicle.

The approximately 9-month-old female kitten had a fracture in her right hind leg, rib fractures and bruising around the lungs. Rescuers took her to the Animal Specialty Hospital of Florida, where she had surgery that used a steel plate to mend the bone together.

After she recovering she was transported to White Oak, a conservation center in Yulee, where she received care until she was fully healed and ready for release.

A four-year-old male, wearing a radio collar, was discovered dead March 17 at the Everglades and Francis S. Taylor Wildlife Management Area, which encompasses sawgrass marshes, tree islands, levees and canals.

The cause of death is unknown. The panther will be sent to the lab of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission in Gainesville for a necropsy.

This year seven panthers have been found dead, four from vehicle collisions. An estimated 100 to 160 panthers remain in Florida, most occupying Big Cypress National Preserve, Everglades National Park, Fakahatchee Strand Preserve State Park and the private lands to the north and west of these areas.
