## Burn ban lifted

The county commissioners lifted the burn ban at their June 3 meeting, responding to the beginning of the summer rainy season. The ban was lifted by resolution, however in the next few weeks that ordinance is expected to be amended. Authority to put in place and lift a burn ban will be designated to the county administrator.

## County Administrator

The board completed a very positive initial six-month evaluation for County Administrator Charles Chapman. From now on, his performance will be evaluated annually. Commissioner Janet Taylor's only concern was that she felt the evaluating tools - the questions they use for the evaluation - should be refined. Commissioner Michael Swindle agreed, saying they need to make their evaluation on their knowledge of his performance and ability.

For his part, the county administrator thanked the board and noted that he will always have an open line of communication with the commissioners.

## History on the move

On June 3, residents watched as T. A. Youngblood & Sons Building Movers from Sanford moved the 1905 H. A. Rider Home and 1935 Law Office on trailers to their permanent home at the LaBelle Heritage Museum, 360 N. Bridge Street. ## Meet the needs of autistic children

Clewiston mother and special needs activist, Stephanie Schneider Busin, spoke at the May 13 Hendry County School Board meeting about the challenges students and families affected by autism face in Hendry County. Mrs. Busin cited the new autism prevalence rate released in March by the Center for Disease Control's Autism and Developmental Monitoring Program as 1 child in 68 being identified as having an autism spectrum disorder.

In an effort to illustrate the needs in Hendry County are very likely to be greater than what's on paper, Mrs. Busin states, "In a district of 7,000 students, like Hendry County, if we're on par with this statistic, we should statistically have close to 103 students identified. We currently have 40, up from 27 at this time last year."

"While it is solely up to a parent or guardian to seek a referral for diagnosis for a child, not so coincidentally, CDC statistics indicate children who are impoverished, and/or females, and/or minorities are less likely to receive a diagnosis and intervention services. Considering an approximate annual median household income of \$36,000 and our diverse socio-economic demographics, these are strong factors behind our numbers in

Hendry County," she continued.

"The lack of medical and therapeutic resources are also a major concern. There is currently no doctor in Hendry County who diagnoses or treats autism spectrum disorders and there are no certified private providers of speech, occupational or behavioral therapy services for children with ASD. The treatments and services available on the coast are often out of reach, both financially and geographically, for the majority of our

families," said Busin.

Mrs. Busin expressed to the school board that the speech and occupational therapy services the school district provides are, in many circumstances, the only help and intervention many of these students will ever receive and urged the school board to support enhanced services like social skills lessons provided under speech and language services.

She spoke of the need for cost effective programs like peer-to-peer mentoring in the middle and high schools that pair autism spectrum disorder students with non-ASD peers who accompany them to class and provide additional academic and social support, improving their academic performance and decreasing instances of bullying due to social and behavioral challenges inherent to autism spectrum disorder.

"I stand before you today asking for your support in getting these children the help they need and to offer support to you. I've been fortunate over the past three years to have had overwhelming support from the community in my quest to bring autism awareness and resources to Hendry County through autism awareness t-shirt sales. Funds raised in the past have purchased books for families and schools, provided trainings and training resources to Hendry County teachers," said Busin.

This year, I wanted to put funds directly into teachers' hands so they are able to provide classroom resources for their students with autism because trainings can only take you so far without tangible resources to work with, so it is with great love and gratitude to the folks who purchased autism awareness shirts this year that I am able to present a \$3,000 check to the Hendry County Public School Foundation in memory of one of Hendry County's great champions of children, Ray Clinard, to be used for classroom mini-grants for teachers with autistic students.

# Youths charged in church, school burglary

Four juveniles have been arrested in connection with burglarizing and trashing a school and a church. The incidents occurred May 24 and 25.

The first was at Community Harvest Worship Center, 55 Orange St., where suspects broke in and spray painted offensive words and pictures on walls, over televisions, a refrigerator and toys.

On June 25 LaBelle Elementary School was burglarized. A classroom was ransacked, windows smashed, computers, monitors, desks and ceiling fans ruined.

Five suspects showed up on surveillance video at the school, three males and two females, who used pieces of clothing to mask their faces.

Angel Browning, 15, Chelsea Marie Cruz, 13, Alejandro Lynn Browning, 14, and Andrew Tyler Pardo, 17, were all arrested June 5 and charged with burglary of a dwelling or structure damage over \$1,000 and criminal mischief over \$1,000. The fifth individual involved has not been located.

Arin Vinnin Crossno Jr., 43, June 9 was arrested and charged with sexual assault victim 12 years old or older no physical force no damage.

Cody Richard Gray Hawk, 43, was arrested June 10 and charged with sexual offense - failure to report a name/address change. M.

Qualls was arresting officer.

Eliseo Rodriguez, 42, was arrested June 7 on a search warrant at 408 Sabal Palm Court. He was charged with multiple counts of possession of cocaine with intent to sell, manufacture, deliver, etc., schedule II, poses/use drug equipment, sale of cocaine within 1,000 feet of a specified area schedule II and possession of cocaine with intent to sell, etc.

Eli Santa Maria Peralto, 29, was arrested June 6 and charged with battery second or subsequent offense, battery on an officer, firefighter, EMT, etc., and resisting an officer with violence. C. McVey was arresting officer.

### Clewiston

Alexis Rey Ortiz, 18, was arrested June 9 and charged with criminal mischief \$200-\$1,000, burglary of a unoccupied dwelling unarmed and grand theft \$5,000-\$10,000. R. Archer Jr. was arresting officer.

Pedro Furmero Garcia, 50, was arrested June 6 and charged with a crime against a person felony - committing an act that could cause death. He allegedly stabbed another man. CPD Officer S. Maldonado was arresting officer.

Michael Lashon Williams, 43, was arrested June 6 and charged with fraud using an illegal credit card twice in six months to obtain goods of money over \$100. CPD Det. Sgt. Clay was arresting officer.

## Lock restrictions

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Jacksonville District has announced restrictions on lock operations on the Okeechobee Waterway due to falling water levels on Lake Okeechobee.

Effective Thursday, June 5, locking operations at the W.P. Franklin Lock & Dam near Fort Myers and the St. Lucie Lock & Dam near Stuart are being conducted every two hours from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily. This action is the result of the water level at Lake Okeechobee falling below 12.5 feet.

"This is standard operating procedure whenever the lake falls below 12.5 feet" said Steve Dunham, Chief of the Corps' South Florida Operations Office. "We encourage boaters to be aware of the lake level and consider that drafts will continue to decrease if the lake drops more in coming weeks."

The updated schedule means that lockages will occur at Franklin and St. Lucie at 7 a.m., 9 a.m., 11 a.m., 1 p.m., 3 p.m., 5 p.m., and 7 p.m. Operations at the other three locks, Ortona, Moore Haven, and Port Mayaca, will continue on demand between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Should the lake drop below 11.5 feet, additional reductions in service will be necessary. A Notice to Navigation has been issued on this subject. For more information on navigation notices concerning the Okeechobee Waterway, please visit the following website:

# This Father's Day you can set the pattern, Dad!

My dad was born and raised in Venus, FL, just about 15 miles north of Palmdale - AKA, Fishing Eating Creek. He was reared during the Depression and knew what it was to wonder where the family of six children would be getting their next meal. In December, 1941, the day after the attack on Pearl Harbor, he enlisted in the Marines. For three and a half years he personally witnessed the horrors of war in the South Pacific.

In 1945 he married my mother and they settled in Ft. Myers and raised four children. Both of my parents had their own businesses and worked hard. While I have not always agreed with my dad about his viewpoints, one thing I have always been appreciative of was what he instilled in his children. Laziness and the "entitlement mentality" was unacceptable at 2268 South St.!

That strong work ethic has never failed me or my siblings. My challenge to the fathers on this Father's Day weekend is to instill that same standard into your children.

The following was written by a 21-year-old female who apparently grew up with a father like mine. Clearly she is viewing where we are in many areas of our country and is troubled. It's her future she's worried about and this is how she feels about the "social welfare-big government" state that she's being forced to live in! These solutions are just common sense in her opinion. From the Waco Tribune Herald, in Waco, TX, she titled her article "PUT ME IN CHARGE."

"Put me in charge of food stamps. I'd get rid of Lone Star cards; no cash for Ding Dongs or Ho-Ho's, just money for 50-pound bags of rice and beans, blocks of cheese and

all the powdered milk you can haul away. If you want steak and frozen pizza, then get a job.

"Put me in charge of Medicaid. The first thing I'd do is to get women birth control implants or tubal ligations. Then, we'll test recipients for drugs, alcohol and nicotine. We will sell your 22-inch rims and low profile tires and your blasting stereo and speakers and put that money toward the "common good."

"Before you write that I've violated someone's rights, realize that all of the above is voluntary. If you want our money, accept our rules. Before you say that this would be "demeaning" and ruin their "self esteem," consider that it wasn't that long ago that taking someone else's money for doing absolutely nothing was demeaning and lowered self esteem.

"If we are expected to pay for other people's mistakes we should at least attempt to

make them learn from their bad choices. The current system rewards them for continuing to make bad choices.

"While you are on government subsistence, you no longer can VOTE! Yes, that is correct. For you to vote would be a conflict of interest. You will voluntarily remove yourself from voting while you are receiving a government welfare check. If you want to vote, then get a job.

Not bad, huh?

Sound harsh? Insensitive? Even "unchristian?" Please be reminded on the teaching from 2 Thessalonians 3:10: "If a man doesn't work, do not let him eat." Granted there are those who genuinely need help due to physical or mental limitations and the Scripture calls all believers to aid those who are incapable of caring for themselves. ## SouthWestern College to renovate

June 1, 2014 -FORT MYERS, Fla. - Today, Governor Rick Scott signed the 2014-15 state budget, which includes \$6.5 million for renovation projects at Edison State College, which will become Florida SouthWestern State College on July 1.

"The funding for our renovation work means the science classes our students need will continue in an environment that helps them reach their educational and professional goals," said Dr. Jeff Allbritten,

President, Edison State College, soon to be Florida SouthWestern State College.

Most importantly, \$5 million will support the complete renovation of Leonhardt Hall, a 47 year-old science and learning facility, the most heavily utilized science laboratory building across the college.

The remaining \$1.5 million will be dedicated to general maintenance for regular projects across the Lee Campus in Fort Myers.



# It took a village to move a playground

FORT MYERS, Fla. (June 2, 2014) – It took a village to move a playground when Community Cooperative donated equipment to Child Care of Southwest Florida. A spontaneous public-private partnership materialized to relocate no-longer-needed play structures from Community Cooperative in Fort Myers to CCSWFL's new LaBelle early-education center, scheduled to open June 30.

Employees from Waste Pro, a waste-removal service company, had volunteered to dismantle the equipment, and The Mitchell Family offered to transport it in a Bud Light semitrailer. When some of the pieces were unexpectedly too big for the truck, Sam Galloway Ford came to the rescue with a flatbed truck and assistance from All Star Rentals.

"Watching this effort unfold and seeing everyone so willing to help was wonderful," said Community Cooperative Executive Officer Tracey Galloway. "It was more of a challenge than we anticipated, but everyone was determined to get the project done."

In January, Community Cooperative (then CCMI) closed its Montessori Preschool, and most of its 34 preschoolers transferred to Child Care of Southwest Florida's P.A. Geraci Child Development Center,

less than two miles away. The move eliminated some duplication of services within the Dunbar community and was consistent with the United Way philosophy of partner agencies collaborating on shared services. When Community Cooperative offered the unneeded equipment, CCSWFL's new LaBelle center was the right place to rebuild the playground.

"Our new LaBelle center, less than a mile from the current Children's Garden of LaBelle location, is a larger facility with room for an expanded outdoor play area," said Executive Director Beth Lobdell. "With the move, we expect to increase our enrollment by a dozen youngsters, so the new playground will be well used."

Since its creation in 1984, Community Cooperative has been providing emergency food outreach and resources to communities across Lee County, as well as partnering with agencies throughout Southwest Florida. Child Care of Southwest Florida, founded in 1967, works to strengthen and enhance the lives of children and their families at six accredited early-education centers in Lee and Hendry counties. ## Woman's Club supports education

Because members of the LaBelle Woman's Club care enough to work hard for others, numerous young women in Malawi, Africa, will have the opportunity to spend more time getting an education. In fact, sanitary kits constructed by these local ladies will make it possible for these girls to spend some 60 days a year in school than they otherwise could.

The community opened its heart to the cause, providing over 1,100 bars of soap, 1,144 Ziploc Freezer Bags, 756 wash cloths, 847 shields, 895 liners, 105 bags and 443 pairs of panties - all in just the last six months.

Each kit includes a draw string bag, wash cloth, bar of hotel soap, eight absorbent flannel pads and two moisture barrier shields to hold liners in place, a pair of panties size 10-16 and a visual instruction sheet with a gallon size zip lock bag.

Many women of the community have donated colorful materials, cottons and dark flannels for the project.

Women from the local club delivered all the items for Days for Girls kits to Ocala on Friday, June 6.

The project isn't over yet. More kits are still to be made and the group is having a Days for Girls sew day on June 17 to work on bags and liners. They have some "super sewers" who have knocked out the more difficult shields, but could use a few more volunteers to help with the easier tasks.
