## County to rearrange planning department

The board offered its appreciation to Assistant Planner Sarah Catala for her years of service. She has accepted a position with the Department of Transportation, but promised she will be available to work with the county on District 1 matters.

The county plans to reorganize the Planning Department, shifting positions and responsibilities in a revenue-neutral manner. The county will advertise statewide for a new planner.

The Assistant Planner position formerly held by Ms. Catala is to be reclassified to a Planning and Community Development Director, who reports to the county administrator. A Strategic Initiatives

Coordinator position is also to be developed, who will also report to the county administrator.

The new Planning and Community Development Division manager will include Planning and Zoning, Building, Permitting, Licensing, Code Enforcement and Social Services.

The Economic Development Council is returning management of the Tourism Development Council to the county. Functions of the public information, community relations and other strategic initiatives, making one full time Strategic Initiatives Coordinator position.

Grants Coordinator Janet Papinaw currently handles Public Information Officer duties.

## City commission approves development

At the city's August 13 commission meeting, the board gave the final go-ahead to the DG. Lender PUD, a 277-acre development to be located at the southeast corner of R 29 and Helms Road. The development will include residential homes, retail commercial and light industrial zones.

There are two possible plans. The first includes 249 multi-family residences, 74,000 sf of commercial retail space, 300,100 sf of office space and 360,000 sf for light industrial. The other option would

include 507 multi-family residences; 190 sf of commercial retail space; 90,000 sf of office space and 80,000 sf for light industrial.

"This is a big deal," Mayor Dave Lyons said, wondering if this project could almost result in another city. City Planner Shellie Johnson admitted that it will be a big project with big plans that will come into being in phases. Ms. Johnson likened the development to a neighborhood designed for people to both live and work in.

The board unanimously approved the PUD.

The cost of this reorganization is covered in the county's current 2014-15 budget plan.

### Airglades

County Attorney Mark Lapp reported that the management agreement with Airglades International Airport, LLC (AIA) is ready for approval but the negotiation period needs to be extended to accommodate changes made to the agreement by the FAA. The management agreement has to be settled before the county can sell Airglades Airport to AIA. FAA will still need to approve the facility for privatization.

County Administrator Chapman said he was encouraged by the level of support throughout the process and reminded the board that, in the end, the FAA has to answer to Congress.

Airglades is expected to be turned over to AIA September 1.

Commissioner Janet Taylor moved to approve the management agreement. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Darrell Harris and passed 4-0. Commissioner Michael Swindle was absent from the meeting.

### Recycling

The county is eligible to apply for a \$90,909 Florida Department of Environmental Protection grant program. The grant would be used to offset operating costs and keep pickup rates reasonable for residents.

Board Chairman Karson Turner noted that Commissioner Harris got the School District on board with recycling but that the county needs to show a turnaround in recycling. Chairman Turner wants to jump start recycling by placing large, well marked bins at both high school football stadiums - to

get folks to buy in to recycling at these big events and also teach young people to take up the practice. Announcements would also be made at all the games.

### Commissioner travels

A member of the public and editor of the Hendry-Glades Sunday News took Commissioner Janet Taylor to task, questioning her travels on county business to many out of town and out of state meetings, particularly meetings of African American topics. Commissioner Taylor replied that the board approves of her travels in its name.

Commissioner Don Davis agreed that commissioners should have approval for travel, especially when the board will be seeking an increase in taxes from the public.

The board agreed that members who travel on county business should report back to the other commissioners and the public about those meetings.

All the board members do receive a summary of the commissioners' travels, but it should be more lengthy and accessible.

Commissioner Taylor agreed and said that in November the board designates which commissioners will represent the county on which agencies. If the board does not want a representative on certain boards, she suggested they should vote them down.

### Medicaid

Chairman Turner said the big budget question for the coming year is again Medicaid. He said Hendry County expects a huge increase in Medicaid costs Hendry is Number 1 per capita in the state for qualifying residents for Medicaid.

He said he and the board will continue to seek a reduction in Medicaid payments for the county.

The next meeting will be held Tuesday, August 26, at Clewiston City Hall.

### Golf course discussion

City Attorney Angela Hill asked the board for a letter of intent to support a six-month feasibility study for a private company considering putting in a golf course. There is no risk to the city, she said. The letter would simply allow the Elias Brothers company access to the old effluent disposal site on Forey Road north of the Sports Park. Only staff time would be expended. The project would include housing and a golf course operated and managed by a private entity.

The board agreed to issue the letter.

### Fire Department

Chief Clint Walker told the board that July was a very slow month with no structure fires. He reported on a water truck grant from the Department of Forestry for brush gear.

### Chamber information

Chamber of Commerce Secretary Carmen Corbitt appeared before the board seeking better communication between the two. She said the chamber often hears suggestions and complaints that would be important to the city and that the city has information important for the chamber. It was decided that Ms. Corbitt would be invited to the meetings to bring concerns to the city.

### Downtown Revitalization

City Planner Shellie Johnson said a workshop in September before the public hearing on the downtown revitalization regulations is under consideration.

She provided a little update on the revitalization effort, saying the city is one of four invited to an interview August 28 in Tallahassee for a Main Street funding. The cities will be ranked that day.

"This could be a game changer," she told the board.

### Barron Park

The city considered information that someone is using Barron Park for dance/exercise lessons and the like and charging. The commissioners were concerned about unfair competition with businesses supporting storefronts. Vendors are not allowed to set up booths in the park for the same reason. After much discussion, no one could decide how to police these kinds of issues.

### Fair Housing

The board listened to a Fair Housing workshop overview required for the city to be eligible for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding. The workshop is a reminder of the overall legal protections for categories of residents. The city is currently eligible to apply for an Economic Development grant for infrastructure, mainly benefiting low-moderate income areas.

Come January, the city will again be eligible to apply for housing rehab, neighborhood revitalization and community revitalization grants for a CRA.

He said he accepted a ride home and got into the back seat of a Jeep, behind the driver. He held the reins while the horse walked beside him, in the middle of the road.

That's when the silver KIA approached and the driver did not see the horse in the dark. As the vehicle approached the horse got scared and jumped in front of it. Alva-

rez got out of the Jeep and left the scene on an ATV with another person. When he got home he called 911 to report it.

The driver of the KIA, Wanda Lesea, 38, was transported to Hendry Regional Medical Center. The horse was euthanized at the side of the road.

## Teen Drivers at Risk

In spite of the safety advances of the last few decades -- seatbelts, airbags, improved crash standards -- teen driver death rates remain unacceptably high. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for U.S. teens. It's hard to believe, but on average, eight teens ages 16 to 19 die every day from motor vehicle injuries.

Young drivers increasingly die in groups. Young drivers are more prone to driver distractions, reducing their ability to react quickly and correctly to trouble. Along with carrying several passengers, other dangers include texting, talking on the phone, drinking, speeding, and playing loud music. The risk of motor vehicle crashes is higher among 16- to 19-year-olds than among any other age group.

According to a recent study from the CDC, among teen drivers, those at especially high risk for motor vehicle crashes are:

- Males: In 2009, the motor vehicle death rate for male drivers and passengers ages 15 to 19 was almost two times that of their female counterparts.

- Teens driving with teen passengers: The presence of teen passengers increases the crash risk of unsupervised teen drivers. This risk increases with the number of teen passengers.

- Compared with other age groups, teens have the lowest rate of seat belt use. In 2005, 10% of high school students reported they rarely or never wear seat belts when riding with someone else.

- Male high school students (12.5%) were more likely than female students (7.8%) to rarely or never wear seat belts.

- Compared with other age groups, teens have the lowest rate of seat belt use.

- African-American students (12%) and Hispanic students (13%) were more likely than white students (10.1%) to rarely or never wear seat belts.

- In a national survey conducted in 2007, nearly three out of ten teens reported that, within the previous month, they had ridden with a driver who had been drinking alcohol. One in ten reported having driven after drinking alcohol within the same one-month period.

- In 2008, nearly three out of every four teen drivers killed in motor vehicle crashes after drinking and driving were not wearing a seat belt.

- In 2008, half of teen deaths from motor vehicle crashes occurred between 3 p.m. and midnight and 56% occurred on Friday, Saturday, or Sunday.

Don't be afraid to talk to your teen about safe driving. Allow them to take Driver's Education if it's offered at their high school. Ask your vehicle insurance company about programs available to teach teens about safe driving tips. Most of all, remember that what YOU do affects your teen! They learn some of their driving habits from watching what you do. Help to teach them to be safe and responsible drivers.

## Black bear curriculum teaches kids

Giving schoolchildren a chance to learn all about Florida black bears is a great way to teach them about wildlife, while sharpening their skills in reading, math, science and problem solving.

For that reason, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) has updated its Florida Black Bear Curriculum, and put it online for the first time at [BlackBearInfo.com](http://BlackBearInfo.com).

The revised Florida Black Bear Curriculum is free, easy for teachers to use, and meets the new Florida Standards for educational curricula.

The curriculum offers 10 lessons on topics such as “The Black Bear Necessities” and “Oh Where, Oh Where is the Florida Black Bear?” and includes hands-on activities such as mapping and role-playing. There are also videos for students to watch such as the FWC’s “Living with Florida Black Bears.”

“The Florida Black Bear Curriculum takes children’s curiosity about black bears into the classroom, where learning about black bears can improve kids’ skills in basics like reading, math, science and problem solving,” said Sarah Barrett with the FWC’s black bear management program. “Whenever FWC staff talks to kids about Florida black bears, the response is overwhelmingly positive because kids are eager to learn and ask great questions about bears.”

With more encounters today between people and bears in Florida than in the recent past, it is increasingly important for children to learn about the state’s bear population.

The Florida Black Bear Curriculum was designed for children in grades 3-8 and has been in use since 1999, when it was created as a joint project of the FWC and Defenders of Wildlife.
