Low turn out for Primary

Only 14.67 percent of Hendry County's 16,536 registered voters cast ballots in the Primary election. Locally, only two school board races (nonpartisan) were on the ballot, along with several hospital authority and soil conservation district offices.

Political newcomer Stephanie Schneider Busin will take her seat for **School Board District #4**. She won 55.18 percent (460 votes) to win the election. Incumbent John Perry Jr., received 31.99 percent (247 votes) and former school board member Judy Cross-McClure from LaBelle received 11.27 percent (87 votes). This district includes parts of Clewiston, Everhigh Port LaBelle.

School District #5

Jon Basquin received 68 percent (210 votes) to beat out challenger Patrick Lucey. Mr. Basquin had been chosen by Gov. Scott to fill the last few months of the late Ray Clinard's position.

School District #3

The park will feature a large play area for kids ranging in age from 2 to 102, an exercise equipment area,

Answered prayers for a special needs child

It takes a big heart to take a child into your home as your own. Adopting any child is a life altering decision for an entire family. Adopting a special needs child is even more daunting.

James and Trish Holland of LaBelle have the will and the strength to accept this challenge and they are getting very close to actually bringing home their adopted son from Eastern Europe. The couple went overseas recently to actually meet their new son and make their status as his parents legal.

International adoptions are very complicated. The Hollands had to fly to Eastern Europe – the former Soviet Bloc countries – to make the arrangements. They had prayed about this adoption for years, believing it was the Lord's

will. After all the praying and thinking and researching, their dream is about to be complete.

They found their new son on a web site called Reecesrainbow, among many children in the same difficult situation. When they first came across his photo, they bonded immediately with this little angel, knowing he was the special child for them.

With Downs Syndrome, this new child is coming into a loving and welcoming family. In his own part of the world, he and other special children are not welcome. In fact, in many countries they are confined to a mental institution for life, once they're reached a certain age.

The entire Holland family, James and Tricia, with biological children Gracie and Joshua traveled to Eastern Europe for a six-week stay and the court appearance, which turned out to be only a 15-minute, cut and dry formality.

James and Trish are heading back at the end of the month to bring their new son home.

It's been a long haul but it's almost over now for the Holland family. Their miracle has been secured. Still, many other families are working their way through the international adoption process.

Each international adoption costs just under \$30,000. Community involvement has been an essential part in bringing this dream to fruition. As always, LaBelle folks stepped up to support their neighbors in their time of need. Last June a fundraiser at First Baptist Church brought in funds and many have donated through the website. As a result, their adoption has been completely paid for.

But there are many others still working and

This young family is growing, sharing the love they have been blessed with.





The Bible - God's Book Assuring Confidence to All Who Believe

The Bible is the most amazing book ever written in the history of the world. It is the inspired, infallible and inerrant word of God. Though many have attempted to dismiss it from cultures in various countries, the Bible continues to impact people of all lands unlike any other volume.

Consider this - according to statistics from Wycliffe International, the Society of Gideons and the International Bible Society, 168,000 Bibles are sold, given or distributed in the US every day! The Bible can be read aloud in approximately 70 hours. It contains 1,189 verses, 6,468 commands, 3,268 verses of fulfilled prophecy and 3,294 questions.

More importantly, the Bible contains 3,500 promises! When one thinks of a promise being given and stated there is an assurance granted by one person to another. A promise is the reasonable ground upon which we expect something to be done. The promises of God is the foundation of our faith. "For no matter how many promises God has made they are 'Yes' in Christ" (2 Cor 1:20). Titus 1:2 says "our God is not a liar" and, therefore what he promises will be delivered!

Now, we've all been disappointed by broken promises. "Daddy, do all fairy tales begin with the words, 'Once upon a time?'" a little girl asked. "No," he replied the wise dad, "A whole lot of them begin with the words 'If elected, I promise.'"

The good news is God is not running for election. He has no campaign He is competing in over an equally comparable opponent. He is a promise maker and a promise keeper!

What does this mean? First, it means that God gives the promises. They are based on the character of God who is faithful and true. God, the Bible says, is of such an impeccable character that "it is impossible for God to lie" (Heb 6:18). Our God is faithful. "For he who

promised is faithful" (Heb 10:23).

The phrase, "Yes in Christ" means Jesus guarantees the promise. The promises are yes "in Christ." Spiritual promises are grounded in the ministry of Jesus Christ for the salvation for our sins 1 Peter 3:18-22). I know I'm forgiven because Christ died for my sins (1 John 1:7-9).

I know I have eternal life because He rose again (Romans 10:9-10). I know I am saved because He promised eternal life (1 John 5:13). I know I am reconciled to God because He made peace through the cross (Colossians 2:13-15). I know I can come to God with confidence because He lives to make intercession for me (Hebrews 4:12-15). I know I can do all things because He strengthens me (Philippians 4:13). I know I can make it through life's difficulties because His grace is sufficient (2 Corinthians 10:9-12). I know I can survive hard times because He will supply all my needs according to His riches in glory (Philippians 4:19).

The promises are yes to me because I believe in Him. The phrase "in Christ" appears 172 times in Paul's writings to speak of our relationship to Him. "If anyone is in Christ he is a new creation" (2 Cor 5:17).

It is as the song writer said so long ago and these words have endured the test of time, "My faith is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness. I dare not trust the strongest frame but wholly lean on Jesus' name! On Christ the solid rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand.


