## Youth meet Marine Corps challenge

America has always grown some amazing youth. It may go unnoticed in the avalanche of media stories and photos of kids going the wrong direction, but hard working, sacrificing young people with big hearts and strong bodies are still out there.

With the world in such constant uproar, it seems there is no time when this country can relax its vigilance and the US Marines are always ready to answer the country's call. That's because of dedicated young men and women who are willing and anxious to step out and serve.

Many LaBelle kids admire the work ethic it takes to be a part of an organization like the Marines and find their way early to The Few, The Proud.

The Delayed Entry Program allows young people to get a strong dose of the reality of a Marine's world.

SSGT David Foraker is the recruiter at the LaBelle Marine Corps facility. SSGT Foraker said he's always seen the military as "super heroes," ever since he listened to his great-grandfather's stories from his experience in the Pacific Theater during World War II. This 12-year Marine has served his country in aviation maintenance.

SSGT Foraker has served in Iraq and three years in Quantico. He said the biggest surprise for him was being classified "Yankee White," giving him direct Presidential contact, working on the Presidential Helicopter.

SSGT Foraker is looking forward to serving for a total of 20 years, then possibly going into the Florida Wildlife Com-

mission or forestry.

SSGT Foraker and two other recruiters from Lee County, who bring their ETP recruits here spend two nights a week - Tuesday and Thursday - putting the recruits through tough physical training in preparation for what awaits them when they actually enlist. That effort can make a huge difference for the recruit when he or she gets to basic training.

These young men and women receive physical training at Sky Manor. Gary Striker, who served in the Marines and in the Air Force, offered his place when he saw the Marines doing their physical training in the parking area behind the Fortune Cookie restaurant. Gary was mortified that his beloved Marines had no better place to train. Other recruitment centers were even worse off - training basically on the sidewalks around Fowler in Fort Myers and similar unsuitable places in Cape Coral. There was a better way, he knew, so he made his personal hangar available.

These recruits put their full effort into running, flipping huge tractor tires, lifting weighted ammo tins over and over as well as other heart-pumping, muscle wrenching exercises. They are expected to put everything they have into each of several training stations. And that is exactly what they do. Nothing less is acceptable.

"These kids fortify my belief in the future of America," SSGT Foraker said. They're only required to come once a month, he

said, but most come twice a week and even drive to Cape Coral or Fort Myers for training.

After every three stations they get a one minute rest and water break before they have to dive right back into the next station.

Recruits must be a resident of the US, pass medical screening, have no felonies, no visible tattoos and have at least a high school diploma or GED (plus 15 college credits at 100 level) and good standing in academics.

The accommodations at Sky Manor for the young Marines couldn't be better. There is even a pool available where recruits who need the required water skills for success can learn them before going off to the real deal.

It's not all about physical training, though. Recruits are taught teamwork and that there can be no weak links in the team.

Michael Hernandez, 17, is a LHS junior whose brother has been a Marine staff sergeant for nine years. Michael was inspired to sign up when he saw the immediate difference the Corps made in his brother. When his brother returned home on leave, he was a new person with more respect for their parents and an entirely new view of his life. Michael will go into the Corps after he graduates in 2016.

Sweaty and breathing hard from his training, Michael said that switching stations with no rest is the most difficult for him. "But I learned I can push more than I thought I could,"

He's planning to enlist after graduation and become an aviation crew chief. He hopes to go to college, then become an of-

ficer and become a Navy flight officer, ultimately retiring from the Corps.

Jesus Gomez is also a 17-year-old junior at LHS. He was inspired to enlist when he saw the difference the Navy made in his brother-in-law. The military changed his life and gave him a new perspective - the same thing Jesus wants for himself. It was just his first day at training, but Jesus said the military teaches so many things he wants to do. He already is learning that he will have to give as much as he can without giving up and that he can motivate himself from his mind and forget the pain. Although it's difficult and you want to give up, the effort is worthwhile, he added.

Jesus is looking for an 8-12 year enlistment and would like to inspire his younger brothers the same way he was inspired. He admits his parents are not sure about the military, but he knows it's what he wants.

Twenty-year-old Tyler Burke, graduated from LHS in 2013. He's been in the workforce for a while now - he did construction and worked with a marketing company. He's working at Sal Cal now, but knows it's time for him to be part of what he described as "an elite group called the Marines." He said he looked at all the branches of the service, before deciding on the Marines.

"Since I was four years old," Tyler said, "I've had a strong heart." He also said he has difficulty with the intensity of moving from station to station with all its intensity. "I learned I can push further than I expected," he said.

Tyler wants to go into the Military Police. He said his grandfather was on the force in Cape Coral for 27 years and he's always

wanted to be in law enforcement, too. He also has a brother who is a staff sergeant in the Air Force.

The military is for Tyler because, he said, he's seen the change in mentality it brings. He wants to "get best out of life" and to learn to hold himself with the pride and self sufficiency of the military. He hopes to retire from the Corps one day after working his way up the ladder.

## New law protect children's identity

Fort Myers, FL - The new Keeping I.D. Safe (KIDS) Act, allows parents to set up credit records for their children and freeze them, effectively blocking thieves from using a child's personal information to open a credit card, mortgage or other financial account. Before the passage of this legislation, more than 50,000 children in Florida were victims of identity theft each year.

Rep. Heather Fitzenhagen commented, "I'm excited that our hard work has paid off and this bill is finally available to help protect the personal identity of Florida's children!"

This new law requires consumer reporting agencies to establish and freeze a credit record for a minor upon request by the par-

ent or guardian. Parents in Florida can now ensure their child's identity and financial information is safe from criminals.

A new website provides information on the law and gives parents tips on how to protect their child's personal identification. It also explains what to do if your child's identity has been compromised. Representative Heather Fitzenhagen was elected to serve District 78, which covers part of Lee County and the City of Fort Myers, in the Florida House of Representatives in November 2012.

## Arrest at CMS for written threat

On September 22, 2014 at approximately 9 p.m., the Hendry County Sheriff's Office responded to an address off Laurel Drive in Clewiston regarding an informational report. Upon arrival, the Deputy met with the Clewiston High School Principal who advised that someone posted threatening comments to injure students at Clewiston High. Hendry County School Resource Officers (SROs) and detectives were contacted and they immediately began attempting to locate and identify the poster(s). While the post was continuing to be monitored by the SROs, investigators began contacting the iPhone Application Corporation, who provided investigators with the gps coordinates

of the poster. Investigators made contact with Manuel Castanon, 17 years of age, a student at Clewiston Middle School, who admitted that he did make the post.

"I am very proud of the efforts of our deputies and the relationship that has been established between the SROs and school officials. Everyone acted immediately to protect our students and staff at Clewiston High School," said Sheriff Steve Whidden.

Castanon was taken into custody by Hendry County Sheriff's Deputies without incident and transported to the jail. Castanon was charged with Written Threats To Kill or Do Bodily Injury. Castanon is currently being held in the Juvenile Detention Center.



# SWFL Korean War veterans establish endowment at FSW

September 25, 2014 – FORT MYERS, FLA. – Members of Cape Coral's Korean War Veterans of Southwest Florida Chapter 155 established a scholarship endowment for military students attending Florida South-Western State College (FSW).

For the last nine years the chapter has funded \$1,000 scholarships for a veteran or the sibling of a veteran from Southwest Florida who is registered at FSW, but this year the organization decided to establish a \$15,000 endowment to augment its annual scholarship giving.

"Approximately five years ago it was voted on by the organization to raise funds to start an endowment in our chapter's name, knowing that this would be on record long after we're gone," said Bob Kent, treasurer for KWVA Chapter 155. "The funds for this effort have come from several raffles, soliciting at local establishments such as Wal-Mart and RaceTrac, Aviation Day at Page Field, and several small grants from various corporations."

On average, 400 students enrolled at FSW receive veteran's benefits each year. While these students are each eligible for the \$1,000 scholarship, the endowment paves the way for more of them to receive this vitally important assistance. Veterans at the college train in all variety of fields that benefit the Southwest Florida community.

"I am immensely thankful for the scholarships I received from the Korean War Vet-

erans. They helped me meet my financial obligations in the trying times of the recession," said FSW student and veteran Carlos Barahona, who explained that he was only able to find temporary work while going to school. "Some of these obligations included purchasing computer parts and peripherals, paper and ink, and anything involving transportation to and from school like gas, car insurance and maintenance."

Barahona, who is in his final year of completing a Bachelor of Arts in Education at FSW, concluded that the scholarship played a major role in his success at the college and he was proud to be a part of a culture that cared for fellow comrades.

Arlene M. Knox, senior director of Development and Planned Giving at the FSW Foundation, said the endowment is an exciting chance to continue supporting our veterans.

"The annual scholarships have been so helpful for veteran-students at FSW and this endowment is not only ensuring that the giving continues, but that more of these students will be eligible in the future," she said.



# COE students study author Roald Dahl

This year, the 4th grade at Country Oaks Elementary will be doing a year long author study on Roald Dahl. Roald Dahl is one of the most famous children's authors of all time; writing such classics as James and The Giant Peach, The BFG, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, Esio Trot, George's Marvelous Medicine, Fantastic Mr. Fox and Matilda. ## Rotary lights the way

Governor Doragh said the theme for the current Rotary year, 'Light Up Rotary' "makes us think what Rotary is, it illuminates Rotary, (shows) a clear path forward, a well-lit path. "What are we doing? Most cases are now in mountainous northern Pakistan but local leaders are buying into the inoculation program. Governor Pete said, Rotary has started the blue bucket program to collect coins for Alzheimer's research. Florida was the last state to get involved in this specific Rotary Program. Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is aimed at developing leadership skills among high school students. A similar program Seminar for Tomorrows Leaders (S4TL) for junior year students. is supported by the LaBelle Rotary Club. Governor Pete closed his visit by saying this Rotary year we want to hold up a torch for the world... it's better to light even one candle than none." ## Hunter course October 4

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) will host a free hunter safety course on Oct. 4, from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m. in Hendry County and on Oct. 5, from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. in Palm Beach County.

Participants must successfully complete the online portion of the course prior to attending and bring the final Web report to the FWC course on Oct. 4. The form does not have to be notarized.

Students will learn about several topics, including hunting laws, safe gun handling and hunter ethics/responsibility before taking the final test. The course also includes live-firing instruction on a shooting range.

The Hendry County class will be held at the Hendry County Sheriff's Office Shooting Range, 700 Witt Road, LaBelle. The Palm Beach County class will be held at the Ev-

erglades Youth Camp, J.W. Corbett Wildlife Management Area, 12100 Seminole Pratt Whitney Road, West Palm Beach.

Participants can sign up at MyFWC.com/HunterSafety or by calling the FWC's South Region Office at 561-625-5122. Links to the online portion of the course and a statewide schedule of hunter safety classes are available at MyFWC.com/HunterSafety.

Parents or legal guardians must accompany children under 16 years of age to all classes. To participate in live-fire exercises, children under 18 years old must present a parental release form signed by a parent or legal guardian.

Anyone born on or after June 1, 1975, must pass an approved hunter safety course and have a hunting license to hunt alone (unsupervised).

According to Collins, simulations at FSW ensure that every student receives an equal and consistent educational experience.

"We all benefit from health care and education," added Fitzgerald. "They are the fundamentals of any great community."

"Through the use of simulation education, we can guarantee that every student has equal experiences with medical scenarios such as complications which may occur during and immediately after birth. These simulated scenarios may be repeated over and over again to allow students to gain the skills and confidence needed for optimal real world patient care."

Over the last six years, SWFL Children's Charities has raised more than \$11.6 million in donations to benefit only three local charities serving children: The Golisano Children's Hospital of Southwest Florida, the Music Therapy Program at Florida Gulf Coast University and the Pediatric Nursing Program at Florida SouthWestern State College.
