Fair Food

label released

October 24, 2014 – The Coalition of Imnokalee Workers (CIW) has officially released a Fair Food label to help shoppers identify which tomatoes come from ethical farms.

The label will be available to all grocery stores and restaurants that participate in the Fair Food Program. Participants in the Program pay a small premium when they buy Florida tomatoes, with the premium going to increase wages for farmworkers.

They also commit to a worker-created Code of Conduct to ensure safe working conditions and prevent forced labor, sexual harassment and child labor in the fields.

The Fair Food Program has been called “the best workplace monitoring program in the US,” in the New York Times and “one of the great human rights success stories of our day,” in the Washington Post.

“We have waited nearly five years before revealing this label to the world today,” said Cruz Salucio of the CIW.

“Over those years, we have been doing the hard, day-by-day work of building the Fair Food Program in Florida’s fields — educating workers about their rights, investigating complaints, and identifying and eliminating bad actors and bad practices — so that today we can stand behind the fair conditions and effective monitoring process that this label represents,” continued Salucio.

“We couldn’t be more proud of this la-

Hampton resigning as Tax Collector

After 29 years as Hendry County Tax Collector, Peggy Hampton has decided to retire as of November 30. She said she’s just ready to move on.

The Governor will appoint someone to fill her seat until the 2016 election.

It was January 1, 1985, when she took office, succeeding Mildred Lewis. She had worked at the Tax Collectors Office for a while in the ‘70s, then went into banking at First Bank, and at Federal Land Bank (now Farm Credit). When she was approached by the Democratic Committee to run for the office, Peggy said she knew it was “risky,” but she was young and ready for a challenge.

Throughout her tenure she has enjoyed working with people, she said, as well as the challenge of modernizing the office.

She said she has particularly benefited from good relationships with Clerks of Court Charlotte Fitzsmmons and Christine Pratt.

She recalls only having one computer for taxes and even manually typing in some

documents - very time consuming and tedious work.

The Tax Collectors Office isn’t just about “taxes.” The office has several departments which include licenses: driver licenses, occupational licenses, hunting and fishing licenses, license plates, titles and vessel titles/renewals.

The Driver’s License Bureau is a real challenge, she said, and costly to operate. When the state decided to close the Drivers License Bureau in Hendry County, Peggy volunteered to take it over because she did not want to see local residents do without.

Since Glades County does not have a Driver License Division, and the larger surrounding counties (including Dade, Broward, Palm Beach and Lee) have such a high demand that it’s often easier to come here rather than to their home county.

It’s not unusual for people to have to wait in long lines to renew their driver’s license.

Of course, the office also collects taxes for all county districts.

Over the years, the county budget has grown from \$5 million in 1985 to \$50 in

2014 - and the work has grown right along with it. At the same time, budget cuts always brought her the most headaches, she said,

bel. It symbolizes the new day for workers in agriculture that we, as farmworkers and in partnership with consumers across the country, have fought so hard to make real."

Whole Foods and Compass Brands, a major presence on university campuses, will be the first members of the Fair Food Program to display the label in their stores and dining facilities.

The label is a product of the Fair Food Program, which was created out of the success of the Coalition of Immokalee Workers (CIW)'s Campaign for Fair Food.

There are currently 12 retail food giants participating in the program, including Subway, McDonald's, Whole Foods, Chipotle, and Walmart.

The founders of the CIW were recently honored with the Clinton Global Citizen Award, presented by Eva Longoria.

Longoria has been a longtime supporter of farmworkers, including the CIW and the Fair Food Program, and recently executive-produced Food Chains, a documentary film that chronicles the CIW's Campaign for Fair Food.

"The Fair Food Label is a historic moment for both consumers and for workers. In an era when there is so much interest in food, this label will allow consumers to know that the products it represents were picked by people in what has been called the 'best working environment in American agriculture,' on the front page of the New York Times" said Food Chains director Sanjaya Rawal.

particularly when it meant having to cut jobs.

Still, she was glad to be able to turn money back over to the county each year after managing to invest it, easing the county's overall burden somewhat.

She also noted that handling tax deed applications is harder now because so many residents have suffered from the economy.

It's been good working with state agencies, she said, and would advise her successor "to be patient. There's a lot to learn."

The Department of Revenue provides training and it may even be available online these days, but she cautions that it's good to meet with other tax collectors throughout the state. They can provide "good ideas and you will learn a lot from them."

Peggy said she's looking forward to retirement so she can spend more time with family, do some traveling and just enjoy the "freedom." She will stay active and the community and plans to continue helping the Salvation Army cook its Thanksgiving dinner for 600.

"It's been an honor and privilege to serve the residents," she said. "I will miss it."



November 17 deadline for science teacher grants

Nov. 17, 2014, marks the deadline to apply for grants of up to \$1,000 each, which "Ding" Darling Wildlife Society-Friends of the Refuge (DDWS) will award to schools in the five-county area for conservation education-related projects that reflect the Society's education mission.

Schools may use the grant money to purchase teaching aids, books, and classroom materials; fund new classroom science projects; take field trips; or conduct work projects in the community.

All schools in Lee, Charlotte, Collier, Glades, and Hendry counties are invited to submit environmental education- or science-related unit proposals.

The approved proposals will be announced in December 2014 for projects to be completed by May 2015.

"This year the Wildlife Society board of directors doubled grant funding from \$5,000 to \$10,000 and eligibility beyond Lee County for the first time," said Doris Hardy, DDWS Environmental Education Committee chair.

The teacher grants are funded by DDWS monies from the DDWS Conservation Education Endowment Fund.

Be healthy: Don't let the flu sneak up on you!

Flu shots are still available! The flu virus is creeping around. If you get the flu, it can cause you misery for over a week! It can make you miss work, school, and activities that you enjoy. Many providers in the area offer the flu shot at a reasonable rate. The money you spend getting the flu shot will out-weight the costs of lost time from work should you get the flu. Remember, if you do get sick, please stay home! You don't want to take the risk of infecting others!

The top three reasons you should get your flu shot:

1. Protects You and Other People – Getting a flu shot not only protects you from getting the flu, but you are also protecting your family, friends, co-workers, or anyone that you may come in contact with.

2. Prevent Severe Illness – Over 200,000 people are hospitalized every year from flu

related complications. Kids under 2 years of age and adults over 65 years of age are more likely to be hospitalized from the effects of the flu.

3. Prevent Flu-Related Deaths – Each year, over 36,000 people in the US die because of the flu. Most of these deaths are infants and people aged 65 and older. More people die from the flu than from any vaccine-preventable disease.

Remember to wash your hands often. Try not to touch your eyes, nose & mouth until you've washed your hands thoroughly. Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Discard the tissue in the trash and wash your hands immediately afterwards.

If you do get the flu, stay home, get plenty of rest, drink plenty of liquids and avoid alcohol and tobacco use. Talk to your doctor about recommendations for getting a flu shot.

Remember that it takes up to 2 weeks to provide protection after you get the shot. Protect Yourself. Protect your family and friends. Get Vaccinated!


