Bribery claims under review

The Impact Party's treasurer recently told police of a Valentine's Day rendezvous with the Gator Party's presidential candidate and a former Student Body president who reportedly asked at the meeting, "How much is a [Student] Senate seat worth, \$100, \$500 or \$1,000?"

During the meeting, former President Marc Adler "joked" about how individuals "may have had a new vehicle purchased for them or a semester's tuition paid for when they abandoned their political party and joined his political party," reports show.

In a telephone interview

Saturday, Impact campaign treasurer David Meyrowitz said no political bribe was explicitly offered to him by Adler, a UF law student, or Gator presidential candidate Joe Goldberg, "but it was really clear. He (Adler) never came out and said it, but it was obvious."

Meyrowitz said Adler, who did most of the talking while the "nicer" Goldberg played a "good cop" routine, then set a deadline for him to align with the Gator Party — the same deadline for prospective candidates to slate for the Spring election.

"They were trying to plant the seed of doubt in my mind about my party," Meyrowitz said, by

O'Dome erupts with UF victory

Just seconds away from a 53-52 victory against No. 3 Kentucky, the Gators had done their part.

But one more obstacle faced a rambunctious crowd desperate to storm the court.

Uniformed police officers surrounded the Rowdy Reptiles, but even if the unthinkable occurred, the fans would not make it on the court.

"If they run, I'm going to freaking slam someone to the ground," said one police officer to a reporter on press row.

There would be no police brutality. When Kelenna Azubuike missed the 3-pointer

that would have given Kentucky yet another win against UF, junior Matt Walsh grabbed the rebound, heaved the ball into the stands and watched a record UF home crowd release a collective

scream that was as much jubilation as it was a sigh of relief.

Knowing the fans wouldn't be able to join the Gators on the court, several UF players - including senior David Lee and freshman Al Horford - vaulted onto the scorer's table and

reached out to the fans.

Even Walsh, who received a nasty elbow by a Georgia fan last year after the Bulldogs fans stormed the court, wanted to embrace the fans the way they've embraced him all season.

"It was crazy," Walsh said. "I wish our fans could storm the court like all the other places do on us."

No longer would UF players have to answer questions about their inability to defeat Kentucky.

On Senior Day, Lee didn't have to explain why the Gators had lost their ninth consecutive game to the Wildcats.

And Kentucky, attempting to become the first team in NCAA

Student attacked

A UF fraternity member and a Gainesville man are charged with sexual battery for incidents that occurred over the past two weeks, according to reports.

Phi Sigma Kappa Fraternity member Huang Wei Chiu dragged a 20-year-old female UF student up five flights of stairs in the Orange and Blue Apartment Complex, 207 NW 17th St., reports state.

The victim was walking to her car when Chiu attacked her, putting her in a headlock and attempting to pull her up a stairwell in the complex, according to reports.

Reports state the victim fought against her attacker so violently that witnesses heard the commotion, despite that the stairwell was not visible from the street.

"She shredded his face with her fingernails," Gainesville Police spokesman Keith Kameg said.

Suspecting violence, witnesses flagged down a police officer and reported a "small Asian man running," as well as calling 911.

Machen selects Texan for human resources position

UF President Bernie Machen has chosen a Texas academic over his former colleague to take over the new position of vice president for human resources.

Kyle Cavanaugh will assume his vice presidential role May 1, which will include the responsibility of overlooking faculty and staff recruitment, benefits and salary. His annual salary will be \$220,000, according to a release.

In an e-mail to faculty, Machen outlined Cavanaugh's experience in human resources, which began in 1985 when he worked for AT&T human resources and included positions at Rice University and Vanderbilt University.






Cavanaugh oversees a body of 51,000 students as the associate vice president for human resources services at the University of Texas at Austin.

Machen created the position in the Fall after a survey showed that the faculty was unhappy with UF's administration. Cavanaugh will be one of the few human resources vice presidents nationwide.

Cavanaugh was up against Loretta Harper after a search committee recommended both candidates to Machen on Feb. 10.

Harper is the University of Utah vice president for human

resources, a school with 28,000 students. She held the position when Machen was president there before he came to UF.

In an interview with a faculty council Feb. 9, Cavanaugh said he would try to improve credibility with the faculty and consolidate services faculty and staff had in common. He also said he would love to take part in the vision of making UF a Top 10 public research university.

Owner attacked Friday outside of restaurant

Four men attacked the owner of California Chicken Grill outside his restaurant Friday, breaking his nose, cutting his face and giving him a concussion, according to reports.

Sherif Kamal Habib reported several men outside his establishment throwing cardboard boxes at the window of his store early Friday morning.

Reports state Habib confronted the four men, who attacked him. Store employees tried to help, but Habib was knocked unconscious.

Witnesses report the suspects possibly left nearby bar The Court of Hero's before the incident and that there were several spectators.

Of the four white male suspects, three are in their early twenties, according to reports. No description of the last suspect was logged.

A reward of up to \$10,000 is offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the attackers. Informants may remain anonymous by calling CrimeStoppers at 372-7867.

Online voting offline; candidates debate issues today

Court's ruling on petition stands

UF's highest court ruling against putting online voting on the ballot March 15 and 16 will stand – for now.

While Dean of Students Eugene Zdziarski did not overturn the petition denial before the Feb. 25 deadline to place items on the ballot, Student Sen. MacKenzie Moritz, said Zdziarski is expected to continue investigating the le-

gality of the court meeting under Florida public meeting laws.

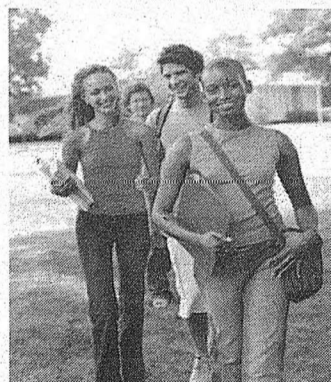

asserting several key Impact supporters would jump ship suddenly to Gator the next day, Feb. 15, and joking about Impact's early party-naming stumbles.

"At the time I thought they were lying," he said, but he later added, "There are several supporters who are no longer with us... It's not just a series of random coincidences."

Just hours before the Feb. 15 slating deadline, several Impact supporters suddenly changed to Gator, or bailed from SG politics altogether, reportedly under pressure from members of the Black Student Union, sources say.

Impact's treasurer candidate, Elda Auxiliaire, also abruptly abandoned the race, leaving presidential candidate and current Student Body Treasurer Dennis Ngin shocked and disheartened, he said.

Innovate Sen. Michelle Lightborne quickly replaced Auxiliaire on the Impact ticket.

Goldberg, however, said Sunday that Meyrowitz' allegations were an Impact political tactic and that no bribes were offered during the meeting.

"These tactics only serve to delegitimize Student Government in the eyes of the student body," Goldberg said in a telephone interview.

Adler could not be reached for comment for this article. Goldberg said the former

president is out of the country. He did not recall Adler mentioning tuition payments, money or vehicles during the meeting.

"I'm sure Marc (Adler) joked a couple times ... But who doesn't joke around?" Goldberg said.

No promises

In a February interview with UPD investigators, spurred by a complaint filed by an adviser to Student Body President Jamal Sowell, Meyrowitz reportedly "reinforced" that he was offered nothing during the Valentine's Day meeting with Adler, Goldberg and Gator supporters Sen. Jackie Pace and Sen. Jason Sherry at The Swamp Restaurant.

According to Meyrowitz's account, Adler, Student Body president from 2001-02, said he "was not promising a Senate seat if he joined their party" which statistically had won more elected SG positions.

"I asked, 'The Greek party?' and he (Adler) said, 'No, there's no Greek party.' He was very adamant about that," Meyrowitz said Saturday.

Sowell's adviser, Lowell Wong, told UPD investigators in February of a conversation with Impact supporter Jessica Goodwin, during which she detailed a meeting with Goldberg and Adler as well.

Wong said the duo reportedly asked Goodwin her price to jump ship and support Gator's campaign to control \$11 million

of students' money via SG.

However, Goodwin said Saturday that no such meeting occurred and — while she has seen the Gator Party leader speak — she has never met "Goldberg or any of his colleagues in private," confirming her account to UPD.

Goodwin said she has never been offered anything in exchange for political support but did point investigators toward Meyrowitz.

"My support isn't for sale, and I'm still supporting the Impact Party," she said.

Wong told UPD one day after the Feb. 15 slating deadline that he believed Goodwin was approached because "she is influential in the Black Student Union," reports show, but Goodwin denied having any such influence.

Wong also reported that Goldberg held an undetermined number of meetings, during which the Gator leader allegedly offered membership in Florida Blue Key to multiple individuals in exchange for political support.

FBK is UF's oldest leadership honorary and, according to circuit court records, has had a role in determining the leadership of influential SG positions.

The organization runs Gator Growl and the Miss UF Pageant and boasts the membership of many big names in national, state- and student-level political circles — including Adler, Goldberg, Sherry, Pace and Sowell.

Goldberg said he did conduct meetings with several influential students, including "almost every single" college council president, but never offered any FBK memberships. Meyrowitz is president of the Business Administration College Council.

"I would never offer anyone membership in (Florida) Blue Key," Goldberg said, adding, "It's not like, if I'm elected, I can say, 'OK, you're in Blue Key now.'"

UF probes bribery charge

After interviews with Wong, Goodwin and Meyrowitz, UPD closed the criminal investigation and passed its findings to UF's Student Judicial Affairs, whose staff has not yet returned phone calls.

UPD spokesman Joe Sharkey said SJA officials might be interested in information turned up during the investigation but added, "There's no proof at this point, and that's the reason they (investigators) didn't go forward criminally."

A criminal act would have to be uncovered to reopen the UPD investigation, Sharkey said.

Student Judicial Affairs Director Cyrus Williams will review UPD's findings and determine whether charges should be filed in the matter, according to the SJA Web site.

Goldberg said if he found members of his party had, in fact, attempted to bribe others, he would discuss the matter with them and possibly seek their resignations.

Gainesville man accused of two rapes in single evening still at large

The victim was found on the fifth-floor landing with most of her clothes ripped off, Kameg said. He said he does not know of an immediate correlation between the incident and the taping of the MTV show, "Reality Bar Crawl," that happened earlier that evening at The Grog House.

"We know both of the people were there," Kameg said.

It is not known whether the victim knew her assailant before the incident.

Despite prior comments made

by Phi Sigma Kappa denying involvement by its member, Chapter President Ryan Nelson stated in an e-mail that Chiu is suspended from the organization until the pending resolution of any charges.

Additionally, Nelson said members "in no way support, condone, advocate or encourage sexual violence or assault of women."

Chiu is being held at the Alachua County Jail without bond.

In another case, authorities still are searching for a former prison inmate accused of raping two women and failing at a third attempt in a single evening, Kameg said.

Christopher M. Duncan, of

1351 SE Fourth St., began his string of attacks at 3 a.m. at Glen Springs Manor, the apartment complex where his girlfriend lives, Kameg said.

"They all occurred within an hour-and-a-half period," he said.

All three victims said they knew Duncan because he was staying with his girlfriend.

"People know him and have

called us," Kameg said. "But we have yet to find him."

The attacks occurred Feb. 24. Since then, Kameg said his agency assigned undercover as well as uniformed officers to patrol the area.

The first rape attempt was unsuccessful when the woman's 13-year-old relative came into the room, interrupting Duncan, Kameg said. However, about half an hour later, Duncan allegedly entered another woman's apartment and raped her.

The reported victim of Duncan's final attack, at 4 a.m., was the first to report the incident to GPD on Feb. 25, and it wasn't until four days later that authori-

ties were informed of the two prior attacks, Kameg said.

He said he thinks everyone who was possibly a victim of Duncan's attacks has contacted police.

"We don't think there are any other cases," Kameg said, noting that it is common for a rape to go unreported.

Duncan is a convicted sex offender on probation for drug charges and may be armed and dangerous, Kameg said. A warrant has been issued for his arrest in one of the cases, citing burglary and sexual battery.

Voice focus is on office of treasurer

The Voice Party is known around campus as the "party of independents." 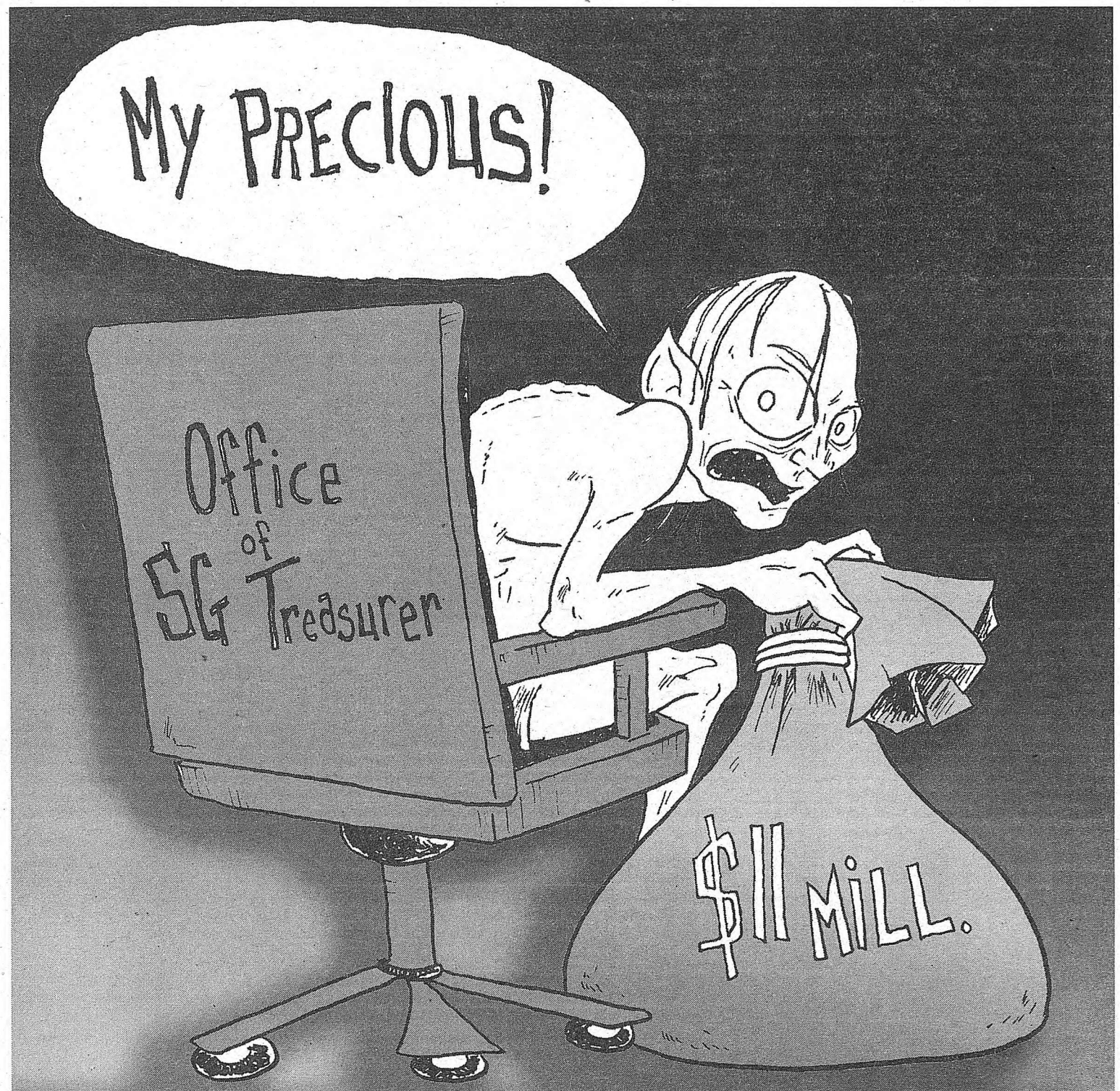

Treasurer trap

Students shouldn't lump SG office in with others

Contrary to what you may think, the office of Student Body treasurer is not a useless position tacked onto the bottom of the executive ticket.

It's not like the treasurer positions you remember from student organizations at your high school, which usually were filled by people who wanted to have a fancy-sounding title for their college applications without doing any of the real work.

The reality is that the Student Body treasurer has a great influence over the approximately \$11 million Student Government controls.

In addition to being in a position to influence the spending decisions of SG, the treasurer also has veto power over all spending bills.

A bill vetoed by the treasurer may only then be passed after a two-thirds vote of the Student Senate — which is not easy to obtain if there is any party diversity in the Senate. Such vetos are rare, but they still are an important check on the SG financial system.

In fact, the treasurer has veto power even over the Student Body president.

But how does that relate to the average student?

Simple. The treasurer has the ability to help make sure that your money goes toward funding something that benefits all students, such as increased bus routes or free copying service — instead of subsidizing something that benefits only a few, such as, say, a freestyle underwater basket weaving club bake sale.

Alternately, if you happen to feel that way, the treasurer can make sure the bus system stays the same and ensure that the basket weavers don't go hungry.

Because the treasurer has such influence, students should take care to seek out the candidate whom they think is most qualified and will best do the job.

Don't treat the treasurer position as an extension of the presidential and vice presidential ticket. The treasurer is separate from the other candidates on the ballot for a reason.

If you choose, you can vote for a treasurer candidate that isn't from the same party you will support for the other positions. If you think your favored party is weak in the treasurer department, feel free to look elsewhere.

Today's Viewpoints includes guest columns from all of the treasurer candidates running in the election, so take a moment to consider them—their qualifications, their proposals for the future, and even how much enthusiasm they seem to have (or not to have) for the office.

Even better, stop by the Reitz Union Amphitheater by the Orange & Brew this afternoon at 1:15, where the College Republicans will be hosting a debate for the treasurer candidates.

That way, you can judge their views firsthand and get a taste of how they will operate if elected into office.

However much research you decide to do (or not do), at least give it some thought before you sign away so much control over student funds.

If you decide you'd rather just trust your party's judgement — or worse, if you decide not to vote at all — don't complain when you see your money being frittered away.

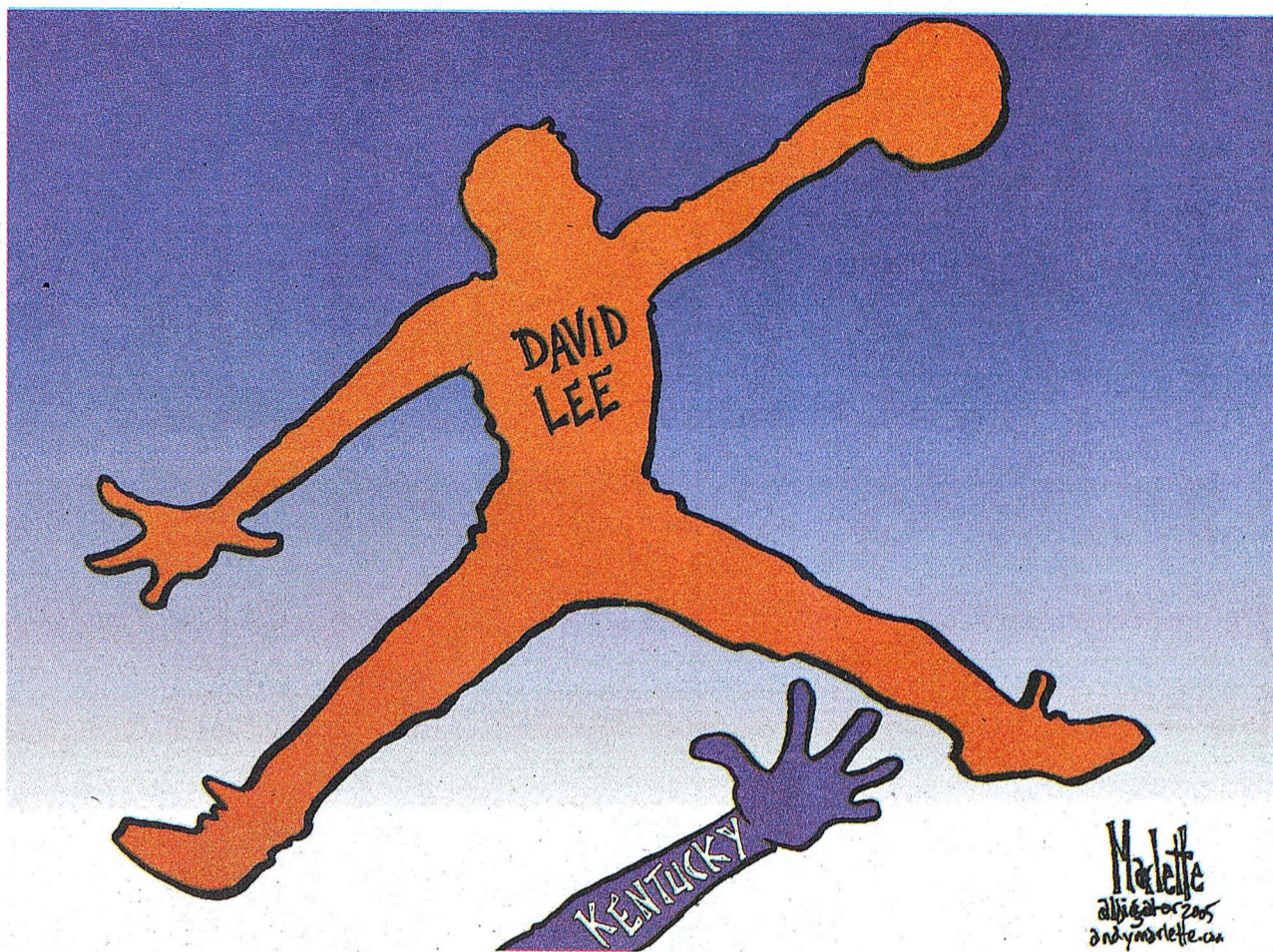

Freedom looks more likely for China

The Chinese government has an iron grip around the necks of the Chinese people. But the grip is loosening, and soon the Chinese will be free to breathe the fresh air of the modern world.

The National People's Congress of China convened this weekend to figure out ways to keep their chokehold tight. According to The New York Times, Chinese authorities gathered the managers of China's main Internet providers, Internet cafés and major portals and warned them against allowing "subversive content" to appear online.

The authorities have enlisted as many as 50,000 Internet police to check e-mails, conduct searches and block foreign sites. But this veritable army of Fascist computer geeks still is losing the war for information.

The most apparent sign of this is the irrepressible spiritual and cultural awakening going on in China. The New York Times reported that the most-used key word in China is probably Falun Gong. Followed by millions in China, the Falun Gong is a philosophy that mixes meditation and exercise.

The Falun Gong has showed that the old style of suppression and intimidation will not work. Despite, and possibly due to, the fact that the philosophy was banned in China in 1999, the group's demonstrations violently squelched and the leaders of the group arrested, the interest in the group has soared.

Guo Liang, an Internet expert at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences in Beijing, was quoted in The New York Times as saying, "I don't know the number, but I would guess every Chinese has received a Falun Gong e-mail. There is no way to stop it. You can shut down the Web site, but you cannot kill the users. They just go somewhere else online, sometimes keeping the same nickname."

The Chinese authorities also are trying to reign in a wildly successful economy that is making the rich richer and the poor pissed off. According to another New York Times report, "There have been several mass riots and

thousands of small protests over land seizures, corruption and unpaid wages."

Toni Peich wrote in the Asia Times Online, "A caricature would show relatively few Chinese yuppies drinking imported dry white wine and polishing their foreign cars, while across the great wealth divide, hundreds of millions in

the countryside and some in the cities are howling about economic injustice."

It sounds like a piece of Communist propaganda except that it's true, and it is under the thumb of a Communist regime. Fan Gang, director of the National Economic Research Institute, was quoted by Peich as saying that China's income gap is "one of the worst, if not the worst, in the world."

One more factor may help break the grip of Chinese oppression: the example of democracy in the Middle East. All within months, Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak opened the presidential elections for multiple candidates, street demonstrators helped topple Lebanon's pro-Syrian government and the Palestinians and Iraqis held democratic elections.

Like the Arabs, the Chinese have been derided as a people unsuited for democracy. The Chinese too have been characterized as a strictly obedient people who would never revolt against the established patriarchal leadership. But the Chinese people may soon come to believe, "If the Arabs can do it, so can we."

The possibility of a free China is closer than ever before. The combined effects of the Internet, the economic boom and the example of democracy in the Middle East could give the Chinese true hope and prosperity in the 21st century.



Impact has experience

spring break alone, several organizations requested my assistance

in getting their funds. During my term as a student senator, I also have assisted student organizations in making special requests for money in addition to their original budgets. That requires doing research, preparing a request, going before the Senate Budget Committee and then finally before the Student Senate. I have helped student organizations obtain over \$40,000 of SG money in this manner. I know how to get funding from SG because I have been in the Student Senate and have gone through it myself.

As Student Body treasurer, I will make the outside revenue accounts for student organizations through student government finance more user-friendly. I will increase knowledge and awareness of where all \$11 million of SG money goes next year. I will increase coordination between the Senate Budget Committee, which determines the budget, and the treasurer, who helps student organizations spend budgeted money. I will improve the acquisition process so students can spend their money expediently. I also will advocate for the entire financial process to be available online to be more accessible to students. Most importantly, I will make myself a constant resource available to assist students with their needs. Finally, with my financial experience in student organizations accompanied by my relentless desire to re-engineer the financial process, I am ready to serve you as Student Body treasurer.

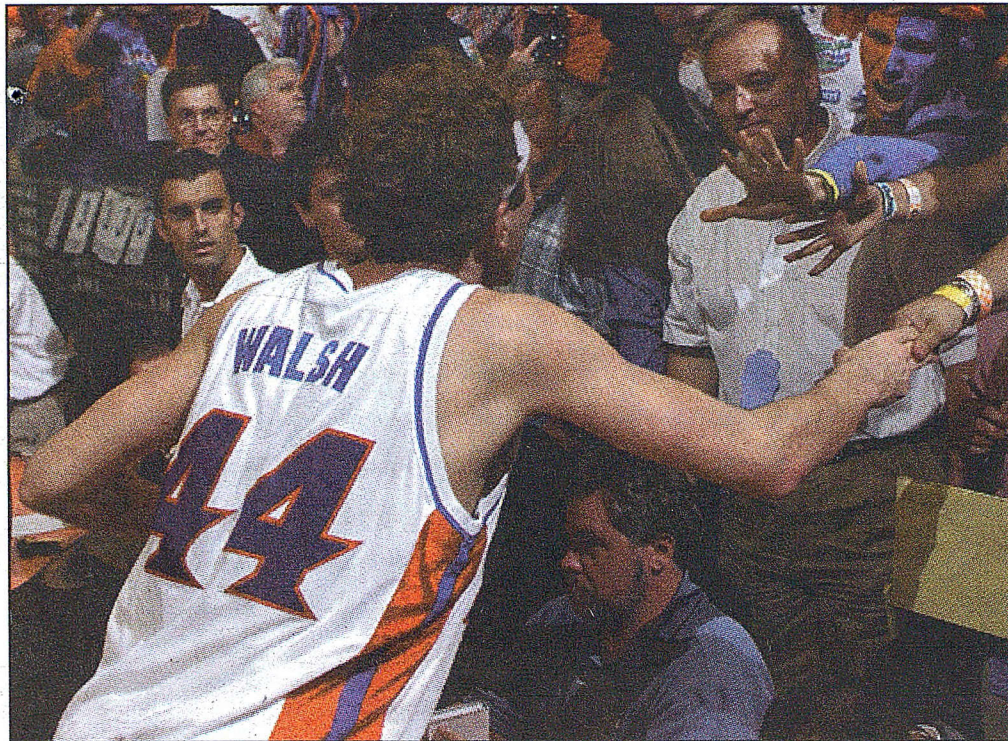

Wild win against Wildcats

The terrible tease had become all too familiar for Coach Billy Donovan.

For four years, his Gators had reached the threshold of defeating Kentucky, only to be bounced by the Southeastern Conference clutch-shooting kings.

"For whatever reason, they always seem to have the ball on the last possession," Donovan said. "They always find a way to come up with that play or that shot to propel them to victory."

So as Donovan crouched on the sideline with the Gators trying to nurse a 1-point lead through yet another Kentucky clincher, all he could do was brace himself, saying, "Here we go again."

But with 11 seconds remaining UF's defense dug in, forcing Wildcats forward Kelenna Azubuike to take a desperation 3-pointer.

The shot careened off the rim's left side and, seconds later, the elated Gators celebrated a 53-52 win with a tabletop dance on press row.

"The streak is off now," boasted freshman Corey Brewer.

In senior forward David Lee's final game at the O'Connell Center, the Gators (20-7, 12-2 SEC) snapped an eight-game losing streak to the Wildcats, beating No. 3 Kentucky (23-4, 14-2 SEC) for the first time since March 4, 2001.

With Lee's curtain call, UF's Big Three of Lee, Matt Walsh and Anthony Roberson stepped onto their home court as teammates for the last time.

"What a way to go out," Walsh said. "I mean, I'll never play another game in here with those guys. It's the best win of my career - of my entire life."

Walsh overcame 1-for-5 shooting in the first half to lead the Gators with some key shots and hustle plays during the game's waning minutes in which he scored six of his 11 points.

In a game Donovan described as a "slugfest," the Wildcats turned a one-time 5-

Lee's 10 points and 11 rebounds could have made it three.

Kentucky rivalry re-ignited

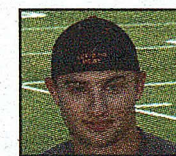
