Orange defeats Blue

■ A UF-RECORD 58,500 FANS WITNESSED COACH URBAN MEYER'S FIRST SPRING GAME.

Urban Meyer calls it humbling. Dallas Baker calls it flat out strange.

A record 58,500 sunburned, tailgating fans witnessed a Meyer-coached home game.

And this was just a scrimmage. In April.

"This is the first time I've been nervous before a spring game," Meyer said. "I knew a lot of people would be watching."

Shattering the previous record attendance for an Orange and Blue game by nearly 20,000, fans were treated to an afternoon full of new offensive looks and unexpected stars in the Orange's 34-28 victory.

Meyer admitted that he "handcuffed" the defense, but a stadium more than half full didn't exactly show up to see what sort of tricks new co-defensive coordinator Greg Mattison

had up his sleeves.

"You can walk out there [with the score] 3-0 and the defensive coaches feel good, but 58,000 people and the players don't feel real excited about what's going on because nothing happened out there," Meyer said.

So Meyer decided to give the fans a treat, and the Orange team, led by third-year starter Chris Leak, didn't waste any time.

On the Orange team's second possession of the game, Baker made an acrobatic one-handed catch in the end zone off a 31-yard pass from Leak.

Meyer liked what he saw and on the Orange's next possession Baker hauled in a 48-yard touchdown reception.

For a player that has been labeled an under-achiever in his three seasons at UF, Baker suddenly looks like a real threat in the offense.

Chad Jackson and Andre Caldwell have been getting all the hype in the off-season, but six receptions for 134 yards and a third touchdown in the second quarter reaffirmed to Meyer what he has witnessed all spring.

Truck driver drags local to his death

A jewelry sale was tarnished when a pickup truck driver dragged and killed a 35-year-old potential buyer early Friday, police said.

Florida Highway Patrol spokesman Mike Burroughs said 43-year-old Newberry resident Joe Guenther was attempting to sell his wedding ring at around 1:05 a.m. Friday when he pulled up to the residence of John James Rushing Jr.

Rushing was in his vehicle with two other men at the scene, 290 NW 252nd Road in Newberry, Burroughs said.

Guenther reportedly offered a wedding ring to one of the men

standing outside Rushing's car — asking \$10 for the band.

The witness allegedly said he did not have enough money for the purchase, leading Guenther to back his car into Rushing's driveway and park.

Burroughs said Rushing approached the vehicle, in which Guenther was still seated, and asked

him to leave the property.

Burroughs said Guenther grabbed Rushing and placed him in a headlock outside of the car while driving down the street. Guenther reportedly dragged Rushing about 200 feet.

District 3 runoff begins Early voting starts today

Early voting begins today in the runoff election for the Gainesville City Commission seat still outstanding from last month's races.

Since no single candidate claimed 50 percent or more of the first election's turnout March 29, residents of south and southwest Gainesville's District 3 will choose between the two remaining candidates: incumbent Tony Domenech and Jack Donovan.

The extension of bar closing times, expansion of Southwest 24th Avenue and what will be used to fuel Gainesville Regional Utilities' new power plant are all decisions to be decided on by the next commission.

Only those residents who are already registered to vote and live in District 3 are eligible to cast a ballot in the runoff, which will be held April 19.

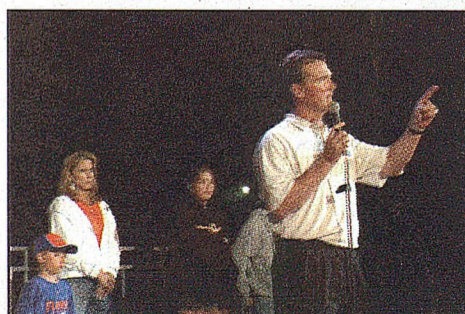
The Supervisor of Elections Office is the hub for early voting, which will continue until April 18. The elections office is located in the Alachua County Administration Building, 12 SE First St., across from the Downtown Community Plaza.

Residents can come from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday until April 18, and from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, April 16.

Absentee ballots may also be mailed to the same location until election night.

■ Urban Meyer's family watches him speak at the Orange and Blue Pep Rally held by the Interfraternity Council on Friday night. See story, pg. 3.

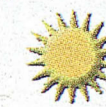



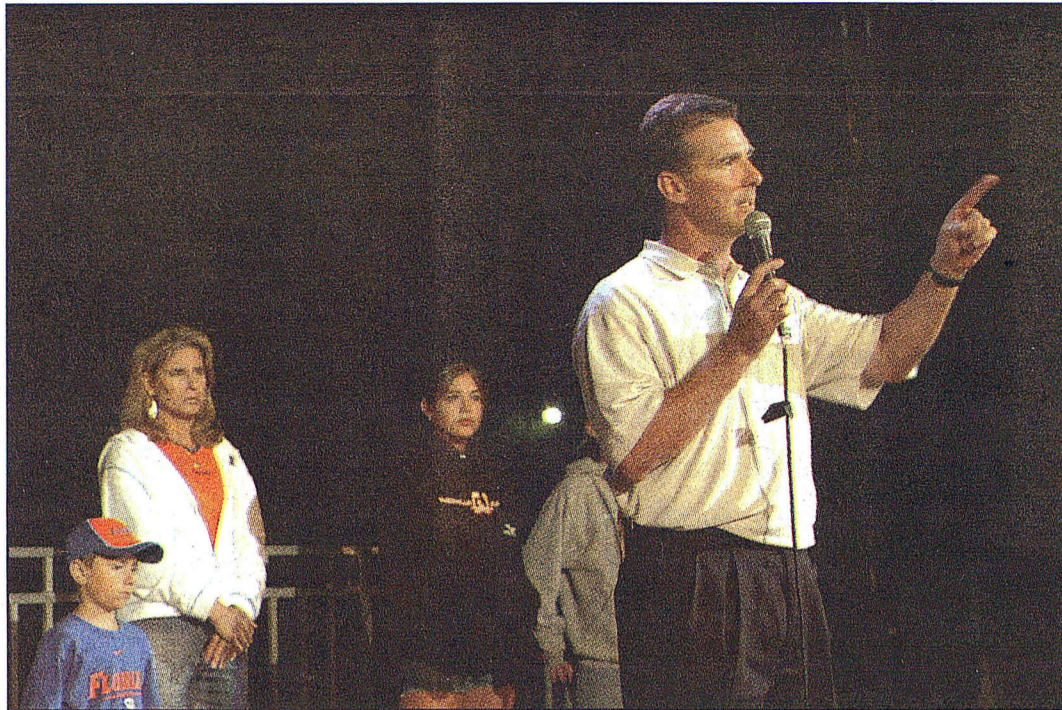

Coach welcomed before Sat. game

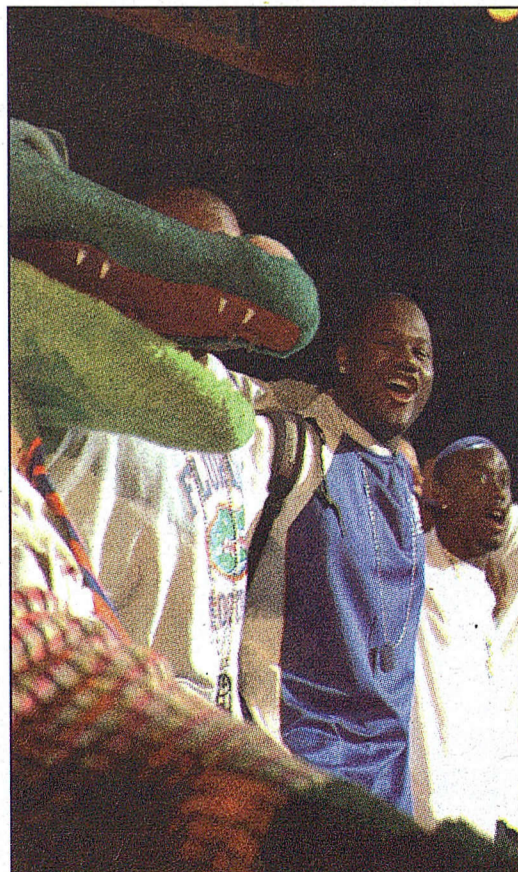

The Interfraternity Council hosted the event, which served as the official student welcome for Meyer as well as a pep rally for Saturday's Orange and Blue football game.

Meyer excited the crowd by proclaiming, "This is the best job in college football.

"We'll be that one school everyone wants to beat," he said.

Meyer gave fans a small peek into his personal life when he introduced his kids and his wife, Shelley, to the crowd.

Meyer said his wife, who was known at Utah for sitting with students at football games, will continue the tradition at UF.

"I sat in the student section for the first time, and it was the most fun I've ever had at a college football game," she told the audience.

Gator players also took the stage to fire up the fans. Linebacker Brandon Siler used his time in the spotlight to brag about Meyer.

"When he first came here, the team was like, 'Who does he think he is?'" Siler said.

"He talked to us for 45 minutes and by the time he got done, we were like, 'Well, we're about to win a national championship,'" Siler told the crowd.

IFC President John Dicks, who helped organize the event, said he was surprised and very pleased with the large turnout.

"It was energetic. It was everything we could ask for and everything we hoped it would be," Dicks said.

UF junior Connor Castelli was one of many students who attended "The Rally."

"This was the most fun I've had on a Friday night in a long time," Castelli said. "Tonight got me so excited for football season. I can't wait."

Meyer made sure the pep rally didn't end without letting the crowd know about a tradition starting this year.

After every game this season, the band will come out, players will raise their helmets and face the student section, and the crowd and team will sing UF's alma mater together, he said.

He told the crowd that if people don't know the words to the Orange and Blue fight song, they won't be welcomed back.

The event came to a close as the players, coaches, cheerleaders, mascots, the UF Glee Club and Meyer's family joined together to sing "We are the Boys from Old Florida."

Dicks said plans are in the works to hold another pep rally before UF's first game of the season against Wyoming.

Comics on display

■ UF RECENTLY RECEIVED A DONATION OF RARITIES.

Comic-book geeks love UF.

UF is one of the top institutions for comics research, especially following a recent donation of thousands of rare comics to UF's library. Some experts already see the university as a nationwide leader for comic and animation studies.

Scholars can review rare comic-book aficionado Sol Davidson's collection in the special collections section of Smathers Library. Davidson, 79, spoke at Smathers on Friday afternoon to a group of interested students and professors about his donation for the benefit of future research.

"You're the guys that are interested, so you deserve the materials," Davidson said, adding that UF is the "only one place in the whole world" that has a large group of scholars dedicated to serious research regarding comics.

Davidson and his wife, Penny, have worked on building a collection for decades. Davidson said most of the time, they did not know what they were looking for, just as long as it looked like a comic.

"I had no idea they'd be valuable, and I didn't care," Davidson said.

The collection is considered priceless, said Robert Shaddy, UF librarian and special-collections chairman.

Davidson is a pioneer in the field of comic studies and was the first in the nation to earn a Ph.D. in comics.

The Davidson collection consists of a few well-known pieces, such as the first Dick Tracy and Mickey Mouse comics. Other comics date back as far as the late 1880s and include Victorian comics and

nearly 21,000 clips from Sunday newspaper strips. The rare comics, some of which were educational or promotional giveaways to children, have never been studied, Davidson said.

The library also stocks modern comics, such as Superman and Batman. An extremely rare comic in the collection is "Reign of Superman," published in 1933 when Superman was a villain. He later debuted as a hero in 1938's "Action Comics."

The old comics can reveal much about the history of American popular culture and attitudes toward genders and races, among countless other research possibilities.

Shaddy said the collection now is accessible upon request but will be de-acidified, categorized and some of it digitized during the summer.

Machen appoints UF graduate as special assistant

■ BRIAN BEACH HELPED LEAD UF'S PRESIDENTIAL SEARCH.

UF President Bernie Machen has appointed a UF business graduate to serve as his special assistant, helping with the university's upcoming fundraising campaign, public relations efforts and meetings of UF's highest governing body.

Brian Beach, 35, is the managing director of the Fort Myers-based investment firm founded by Manny Fernandez, the chairman of UF's Board of Trustees.

He now will work full time in the president's office.

The position has not been completely defined, but he will serve as Machen's representative in certain roles. UF created the position because the president is being "pulled in all kinds of directions," Beach said.

He took the job because he is excited about the university's plan

to become a Top 10 public research university, he said.

He will earn about \$100,000 a year in salary and benefits.

"With two degrees from the University of Florida, I have a lot of passion for the place,"

UF **Administration** Beach said.

Beach holds a bachelor's degree in finance and a master's in business administration, both from UF's Warrington College of Business, and he isn't new to UF's administrative affairs.

He serves on the Dean's Advisory Board of the Warrington College and the advisory board for the Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation. He also helped Fernandez lead the presidential search that brought Machen to Gainesville.

The UF administration has never had a formal link with the Board of Trustees, spokesman Steve Orlando said. Beach will be the first since the board's creation in 2001.

"He's going to be a direct liaison between the president's office and the trustees," Orlando said. "There's

never been a position dedicated to that type of work."

Though Beach's background is in finance and investment, he said his past positions have given him plenty of managerial experience, such as developing long-term strategies and recruiting administrative teams, that will help him in this new role.

Beach earned his bachelor's in 1990 and his master's in 1995 and began his career at Ernst & Young as a senior consultant. He has worked in executive positions at several Florida investment firms.

Device verifies drinking age

Underage drinkers may soon find it more difficult to pass off fake IDs at local establishments.

Following recent controversies surrounding alcohol consumption in Gainesville, Scan Technology Inc. presented an age verifier to bars and clubs as a potential solution to one of the issue's many facets.

The age verifier is a machine that confirms the validity of driver's licenses by displaying the holder's information on a computer along with a green or red light depending on age.

Scan Technology plans to hold a press conference at Gator's Dockside on Thursday. Executive Vice President Stephen Flowers said he will donate an age verifier to the restaurant and sports bar.

Gator's Dockside, as well as Burkhardt Sales & Service, a local liquor distributor, and Corner Drug Store Inc., a nonprofit organization attempting to reduce substance abuse, have joined with Scan Technology to promote the system.

The company has yet to sell any age verifiers to local businesses.

"Some have shown interest, but in the local community we haven't had sales," Flowers said.

He said he hopes the new product will improve the community's quality of life.

The company has contacted Gainesville Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan as well as District 3 City Commissioner Tony Domenech, who faces a runoff election April 19, about the product in hopes of gaining their support to fight underage drinking.

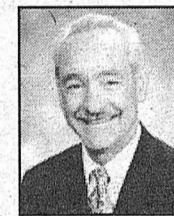
Both the mayor and commissioner received informational software, as well as a letter informing them about the product.

Domenech said he has yet to decide wheth-

er the machine is a useful tool in deterring underage drinking.

"There's so many things that come at you that seem to be good ideas," Domenech said. "I just don't know much about it."

Domenech said he thought those in charge of checking identification at establishments that sell liquor are adequately stringent.



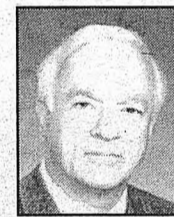

"My experience is they're pretty careful about that," he said.

The benefit the machines would have to the businesses is making the verification of IDs more efficient, Domenech said.

Domenech's District 3 challenger, Jack Donovan, said he feels it's up to individual sellers to find the best way to deal with the issue.

Although he does not know if this particular machine would help stop underage drinking, Donovan said some action should be taken.

"It's a society-wide problem," he said.

However, when it comes to getting alcohol, Donovan said he knows underage drinkers can find other ways to buy it if they are determined.

"They didn't need a fake ID," he said in reference to kids he used to work with at a youth center.

Donovan said they would find older friends who were willing to buy alcohol for them.

"If kids are going to try and pursue it, there's always ways," Donovan said.

However, he said he would support the new technology if retailers find the age verifier to be effective at fighting underage drinking.

Canseco to discuss steroids, baseball career at O'Dome

■ HE WAS A PRINCIPAL WHISTLE-BLOWER ON THE STEROID ISSUE.

A whistleblower on baseball's steroid-abuse investigation and one of the most infamous sports figures in recent history, Jose Canseco, will kick off his college tour Wednesday at UF.

Canseco, a retired Major League Baseball player, wrote the book "Juiced: Wild Times, Rampant 'Roids, Smash Hits, and How Baseball Got Big," where he admits to using

steroids while playing and named several players who he said used the banned substance to boost their performance.

As a result of the book's release, Canseco testified before Congress in March and has appeared on several television news programs.

"Canseco seemed to be the No. 1 figure in the news and media," Accent Chairman David Buchalter said.

UF's speaker's bureau Accent is sponsoring the event at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center at 8 p.m. It is free and open to the public.

Buchalter said the moral and ethical issues Canseco will address in the world of sports will open up a "Pandora's box" for organizations such as the University Athletic Association.

"It's a prevalent thing," Buchalter said of steroid use in sports. "It's not something he's willing to hide behind."

The speech will be especially relevant to UF, which is fueled by sports, Buchalter added. Canseco — who played for seven major

league teams — also will address his 16-year journey through the game ending in 2002.

One day after his announcement, Canseco told ESPN of his plans to write a tell-all book about steroid use in Major League Baseball.

Canseco is the latest in a list of controversial speakers brought to UF by Accent during the 2004-2005 school year, including filmmaker Michael Moore and porn star Ron Jeremy.

Students tend to show up in greater numbers for speakers with opposing viewpoints to their own, Buchalter said, noting that supporters and detractors of Moore came to see him.

Censorship belongs to the public

Telling people they can't curse on the air is not something that we can or should complain about. The airwaves that radio and television stations broadcast on are public airwaves, and it's a very scarce resource. Thus, those airwaves must be used in a way that is of the greatest use to the public. That's why they're called "public airwaves."

A broadcaster telling people, "They can just change the channel if they don't like it," is fine, but they had better be serving the greater good of the public in some way.

The problem is deciding what the greater good of the public is. I believe getting a few good laughs on your way to work or school is something that serves the greater good. People in better moods are more productive. The flip side is that what makes some people laugh gets others quite angry, and angry people usually aren't as productive as possible. That's what makes censorship such a controversial issue.

The other spectrum with this problem is cable. Most people believe cable is censored just like broadcast, because it's on TV. The truth is that cable does not have the same standards as broadcast TV. Indecency is allowed to be shown around the clock, seven days a week. On broadcast TV, it's only allowed during the "safe harbor" of 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. The line still is drawn at obscenity, but if you make it Pay-Per-View, obscenity is allowed. Cable is not a limited resource. They can show a guy cursing at a huge pair of breasts at 4 in the afternoon if they want to. They're afraid, though, they'll lose their advertisers and thus their profits. That's a form of censorship we face.

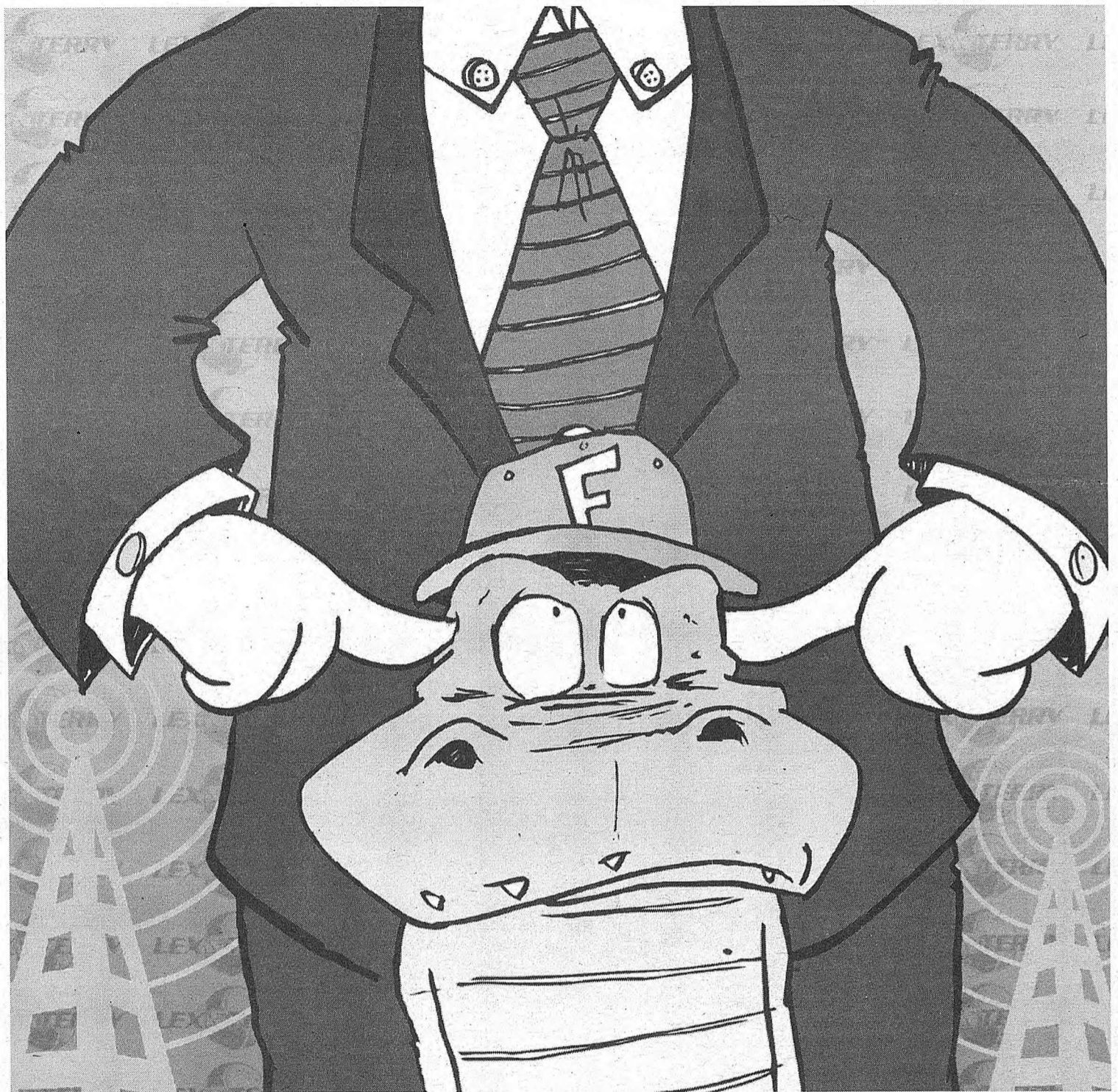
That's why eight radio stations operate out of the same building in almost every city. With eight stations working together, there's no need for eight news departments, so seven are eliminated, essentially deleting seven perspectives from the minds of the public. That's another form of censorship.

Another form of censorship comes straight from the listeners. It's a different type of person who listens to Howard Stern or Lex and Terry than listens to Rush Limbaugh. Some Rush Limbaugh fans are what I call "letter writers." When they hear something they find offensive, and feel like their specific viewpoint is not being respected, they write a letter. This usually is sent to the boss of the person they heard say the thing that offended him. When a general manager gets an angry letter from a listener, talking about going to all of their advertisers and telling them, and starting petitions, etc., the GM is less likely to keep that person or show on the air. There's a local show here like that, which brutally tells us that anybody who doesn't think like President Bush is an idiot. When I and others like me hear a show like that, we just change the channel — we don't write letters and get people fired. That's the biggest form of censorship: the people listening.

Radio station censorship part of a disturbing trend

There is a short list of things you just do not mess with.
 You don't tug on Superman's cape.
 You don't spit in the wind.
 You don't, under any circumstances, mess around with Jim.

But most of all, you don't take away the only thing that keeps the surly, coffee-laden, early-morning workers of Gainesville going: raunchy talk radio.

President Machen and the Board of Trustees, despite assurances that they aren't trying high to remove all mention of alcohol from Gainesville, have struck again. This time, they've taken an entire radio program with them.

The Friday edition of the Lex and Terry show, the nationally syndicated program that helps countless Gainesville residents make it to their workplaces, likely no longer will be broadcast on WRUF-FM Rock 104.

Why won't it be broadcast anymore, despite the rabid following the program has in town?

Because it has a segment called "Drunk Bitch Friday," which, as you can imagine, contains a bit of alcohol.

Sure, there were complaints that the show objectifies women — despite the fact that the waiting list of women who want to get on the show is longer than the one for American Idol — but we know this really isn't about that.

It makes sense, though: If Machen and UF are committed to removing the "alcohol problem," they have to get rid of anything that might remind students of alcohol.

After all, students can't drink alcohol if they don't know what it is.

Of course, UF certainly can't get rid of the annual "A Celebration of Wine" fundraiser for WUFT and WJUF-FM Nature Coast 90. That's UF history, and it's much more proper and dignified than "Drunk Bitch Friday."

Then again, there was the very intoxicated woman who clawed and kicked a University Police officer when he tried to remove her from the event.

But that happened on a Sunday, so it's different.

Unfortunately, this is just another example of the growing censorship that is threatening the First Amendment rights of the media. 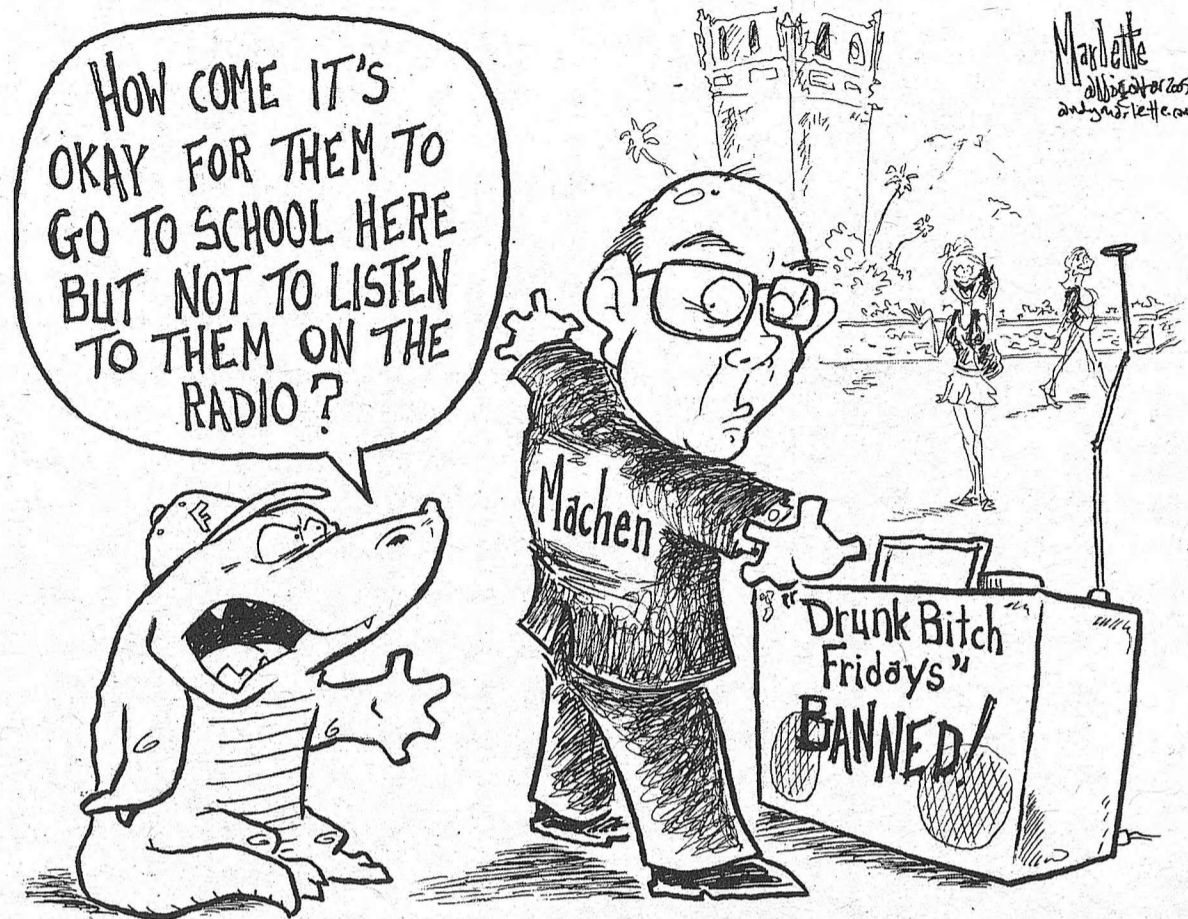

Think twice about supporting expansionists

On April 9, 1948, the Jewish terrorist groups of the Irgun — led by Menachem Begin, who became Israeli prime minister — and the Stern Gang — known as Lehi, led by Yitzhak Shamir, who succeeded Begin as prime minister — entered the peaceful Arab village of Deir Yassin on the western edge of Jerusalem and massacred as many as 250 residents.

With the outbreak of hostilities earlier that year, the Arab residents of Deir Yassin had signed an agreement with the neighboring, largely Jewish village of Giv'at Shaul promising to be good neighbors, share information regarding the movement of strangers in village territory and safeguard vehicles traveling between villages.

The attackers, operating as an uncontrolled rabble rather than a military unit, fired indiscriminately, blew up houses with their inhabitants inside, executed men, women and children by firing and dumped bodies into wells and the nearby quarry. There also were reports of rapes and mutilations. The villagers succeeded in wounding

The Jewish terrorists loaded some of the villagers into trucks to be paraded through the streets of Jerusalem in a victory parade before executing them. The terrorists invited journalists into the village to display the heaped corpses and general chaos.

There were other massacres during the ethnic cleansing of Palestinians of 1948: Perhaps 2,000 to 3,000 Palestinians were massacred. Historian Ilan Pappé believes the Deir Yassin massacre had implications well beyond the immediate slaughter. It was reported over and over on Arab radio and became propaganda broadcast from mobile loudspeakers into the Arab areas of the major cities by Irgun and the Haganah (the precursor of the Israel Defense Force).

The ethnic cleansing of the indigenous Palestinian Arabs has not ended, nor has the War of 1948. Israeli Prime Minister Ariel

40, and may have won had the invaders not been saved by the Palmach, the elite Jewish force.

Sharon has announced the creation of 3,500 new Jewish settlements in the West Bank situated to encircle East Jerusalem, thus cutting it off from Palestinian access. The Israeli government has announced plans to dump garbage into the Palestinian-controlled areas of the West Bank, likely to create stench and pollute the groundwater. Every hour from dawn until dusk, the bulldozers are running, building more of the Separation Wall, ruled to be in violation of international law by the International Court of Justice and designed for the purpose of expanding the eastern boundary of Israel into Palestinian lands. The bulldozers are running in order to create more "for Jews only" highways, inaccessible to Palestinians, which cut up the West Bank into disjointed subsections.

We need to think again about giving unqualified political support to a state created for one ethnicity that was founded on terrorism and is expanding at the expense of the indigenous Arab population.

Ngin and Eva Rosales, a former leader of UF advocacy group Recurso, which volunteers to help children in third-world countries, received honorable mention prizes.

Megan Hoot, a Florida Blue Key member and UF's 2004 Homecoming Queen, was recognized as one of the top seven finalists.

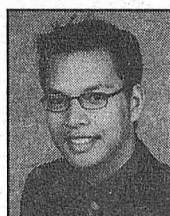
Ngin said he was excited that UF furnished more honorees than any other school in the state.

"It's a testament to our campus and the outstanding student leaders

it produces," he said. "It was humbling to be honored with a group of such amazing people."

The top winners were Matthew Collier of Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and runner-up George Austin of Florida International University.

Guest speaker Debra Austin,

chancellor of Florida's State University System, said the odds of winning the award were one in 765,322. That's how many Florida students attend state and private universities and community colleges.

While UF's three honorees outnumbered those from any other single school, this year was the first since 2002 that none were recognized as the winner or runner-up.

In 2004, the winner was UF's Anup Patel, a Goldwater scholar who earned three hard-science de-

grees with a 4.0 GPA. In 2003 UF Truman scholar Michael Gale won runner-up.

UF students have won the contest five times since it began in 1988. In 1990, UF had five honorees, one of whom also won the top prize.

Ngin and Rosales each won a \$650 cash prize given by Suntrust Bank, a \$250 gift certificate from Office Depot and an airline ticket from Gulfstream International Airlines. Hoot won \$1000, a \$500 gift certificate and two tickets.

Hours before it started, people camped outside the building. After the doors opened, it took 15 minutes just to get everyone inside.

Students and lifelong Gainesville residents

alike poured into the Alachua County Library District Friends of the Library building, 430 N. Main Street, to kick off the organization's five-day used-book sale Saturday morning.

"I love the surprises. Any area you're interested in, it's there," said Belkys Bracho, a UF graduate student who has attended the book sale for the past four years. "You always find what you're looking for."

Last year, the Friends of the Library raised nearly \$270,000, and it has raised close to \$2.7

"We have a policeman who helps keep everything calm," Bearden said.

UF junior Michelle Rowland said this was her first time attending the book sale, but she was able to find some great summer reading novels, as well as some Father's Day gifts.

"I was able to purchase hundreds of dollars worth of books for about \$20, and they are all in great condition," Rowland said.

Pizza driver nabbed

A pizza delivery driver was arrested Saturday for loitering and stalking after reportedly spying on allegedly exhibitionist customers, according to Gainesville Police.

After dropping off the food, Araujo climbed a staircase located in a separate building across a courtyard from the apartment to which he made his delivery, reports state.

Araujo claimed he wanted to "spy" on the allegedly naked women, according to reports.

A witness in the apartment whose stairwell Araujo climbed to see into the second-story apartment reportedly caught him as he was walking upstairs.

Araujo allegedly tried to conceal

himself at first, then walk slowly and calmly past the witness.

The witness questioned and detained Araujo, who tried to push past him and flee, until officers arrived, according to reports.

Reports state the Pokey Stix cravers did order the food but denied any nudity was involved.

■ Two UF students were arrested on charges of urinating in front of the Theta Chi Fraternity house and attempting to flee from police Saturday morning.

Theta Chi member Richard A. Chackman, 21, and Travis J. Kolbjornsen, 21, were urinating when they spotted a University Police officer in his car, reports state.

Instead of taking the ticket usually issued for public urination, the two allegedly attempted to evade the officer, another misdemeanor.

"It would have been a less severe kind of charge," UPD official William Barber said.

When the officer chased the two, Kolbjornsen reportedly ran and hid in a closet located behind the fraternity house while Chackman ran inside, locking the door behind him.

Charles marries longtime love Camilla in royal fête

WINDSOR, England (AP) — Prince Charles and Camilla Parker Bowles wed in a modest ceremony Saturday with the blessing of the queen and the Church of England, sealing a tangled love affair ignited at a polo match 30-plus years ago.

Once married, the royals knelt beneath the towering Gothic arches of St. George's Chapel in Windsor Castle, nervously pledging their

undying love and confessing their "sins and wickedness" — a phrase from the Church of England's Book of Common Prayer — as their vows were blessed by Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams.

"He did a bit of a dirty job on Diana," said Tina Quinney, 59, one of thousands lining the streets of the royal town. "But the past is the past."

The ceremonies went off flawlessly on a bright, sunny day despite sinister omens: A change of location

for the civil wedding vows, unsubstantiated reports of the queen's "fury" that the couple would wed at all and a one-day postponement for Pope John Paul II's funeral.

International News

Camilla is now officially the Princess of Wales, though she will be known as the Duchess of Cornwall in deference to enduring public affection for Diana. When Charles is crowned, she will

be queen — but the prince's office says she will use the title Princess Consort.

The wedding, the second for both Charles and Camilla, was far simpler than his spectacular 1981 nuptials with 20-year-old Diana. Saturday, the local registrar, Clair Williams, conducted the 25-minute civil ceremony at Windsor's 17th-century Guildhall, or town hall, before fewer than 30 guests — mostly relatives of the bride and groom.

Verde said she was nervous before the show Friday, the first time she had ever performed.

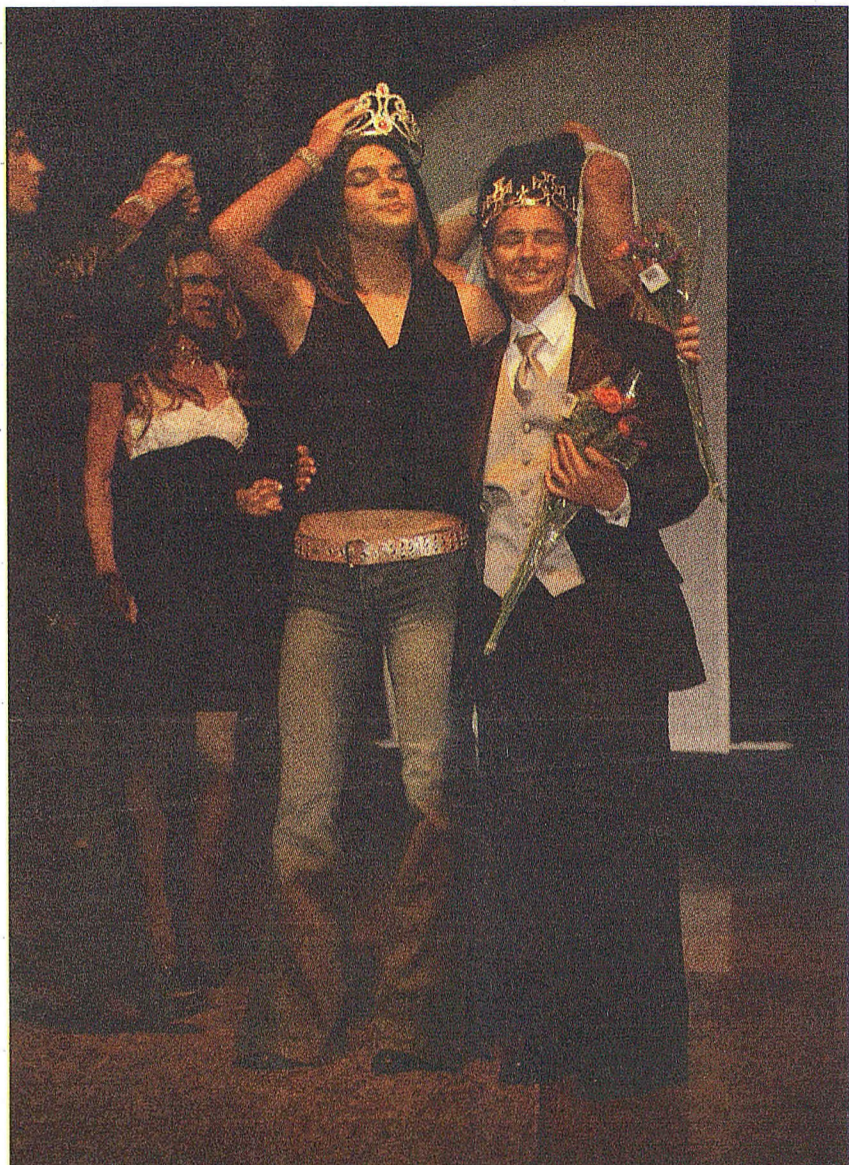
"(But) as soon as I got on stage, something took over me," she said.

Dispute over wedding band turns deadly

By this time, Burroughs said, the speed of Guenther's car was about 30 to 40 mph.

When Guenther finally let him go, Rushing's head hit the pavement almost immediately, which was the probable cause of his death, Burroughs said.

The back tire also crushed Rushing's left leg in the process.

Guenther allegedly fled the scene of the accident right away, but a witness said he might know where Guenther lived, so officers were sent to that location immediately.

Reports state that troopers found Guenther's red and silver Dodge Dakota truck parked behind a wooden building at the address provided.

"We are highly suspicious of why he was there. There may be some things we do not know."

Burroughs said troopers detained Guenther until witnesses arrived for identification.

Guenther was arrested at the scene and charged with driving under the influence as well as leaving the scene of a traffic accident resulting in a death.

"We are highly suspicious of why he was there," Burroughs said. "There may be some things we do not know."


Reports state that troopers detected a strong odor of alcohol on Guenther's breath and that Guenther's clothing was soiled and disheveled. FHP is awaiting blood-specimen results.

Burroughs added that he does not know if the other men involved were intoxicated.

"This is just an initial report; as the investigation unveils we may find new facts," he said.

Troopers reported that Rushing, who lived with family members at the same residence, was pronounced dead on arrival.

Burroughs said Rushing lived with his mother and possibly a cousin, but neither is willing to comment at this time, nor were they witnesses to the occurrence.



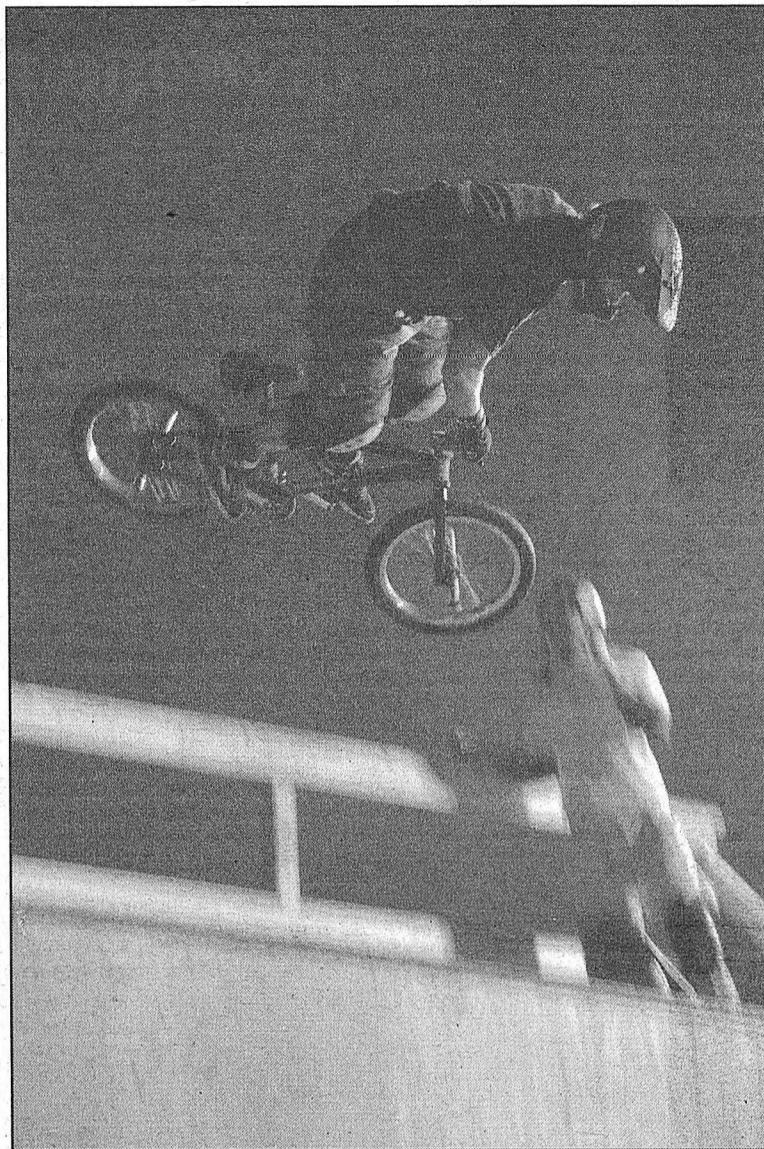
Katrina Moore, a 22-year-old from Tampa visiting friends, said she was also at the show to hear Hot Water Music.

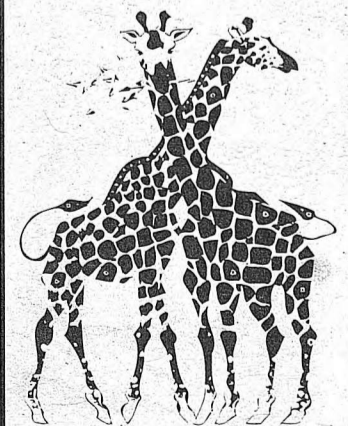





"I'm not really sure what happened in the past, but since we've been here, [Baker's] done the things we've asked," Meyer said. "He needs to be a little more consistent and a little more knowledgeable about the offense. He's had a great spring. I'm hard-pressed not to say he's not the best wide-out [on the team]."

Baker said while the previous coaches were like fathers to him, this coaching staff seems to bring out the best in everyone on the team.

"I woke up this morning and went to McDonalds for breakfast, and I saw people tailgating. It felt like an actual game. It was a big difference."

"They make you want to become leaders, they push you to want to do to better," Baker said. "That's what's prevented me before, just wanting to step up and make plays."

The Gators went five-wide most of the afternoon, and the passing game looked efficient.

Leak completed 14-of-20 passes for 221 yards and four touchdown passes.

Freshman quarterback Josh Portis continued to shine. The 17-year-old completed 20-of-30 passes for 253 yards, four touchdowns and an interception.

Caldwell led the Blue team with eight receptions for 149 yards and a touchdown, and Jemalle Cornelius grabbed four passes for 39 yards and two touchdowns. Redshirt freshman Kenneth Tookes also added a score.

For the Orange Team, Jackson added seven receptions for 87 yards and a touchdown.

The only tailback to put up any significant statistics was redshirt freshman Markus Manson, who ran 13 times for 68 yards. Meyer held Deshawn Wynn as well as center Mike Degory out of the game to prevent any injuries. Skyler Thornton, the Blue team starter, managed just one yard on three carries.

The rest of the rushing yards went to quarterbacks Cornelius Ingram and Portis, who totaled 68 and 39 yards respectively. Ingram added a score.

But the story remained the reenergized fan base, eager to see UF return to the upper-echelon of college football.

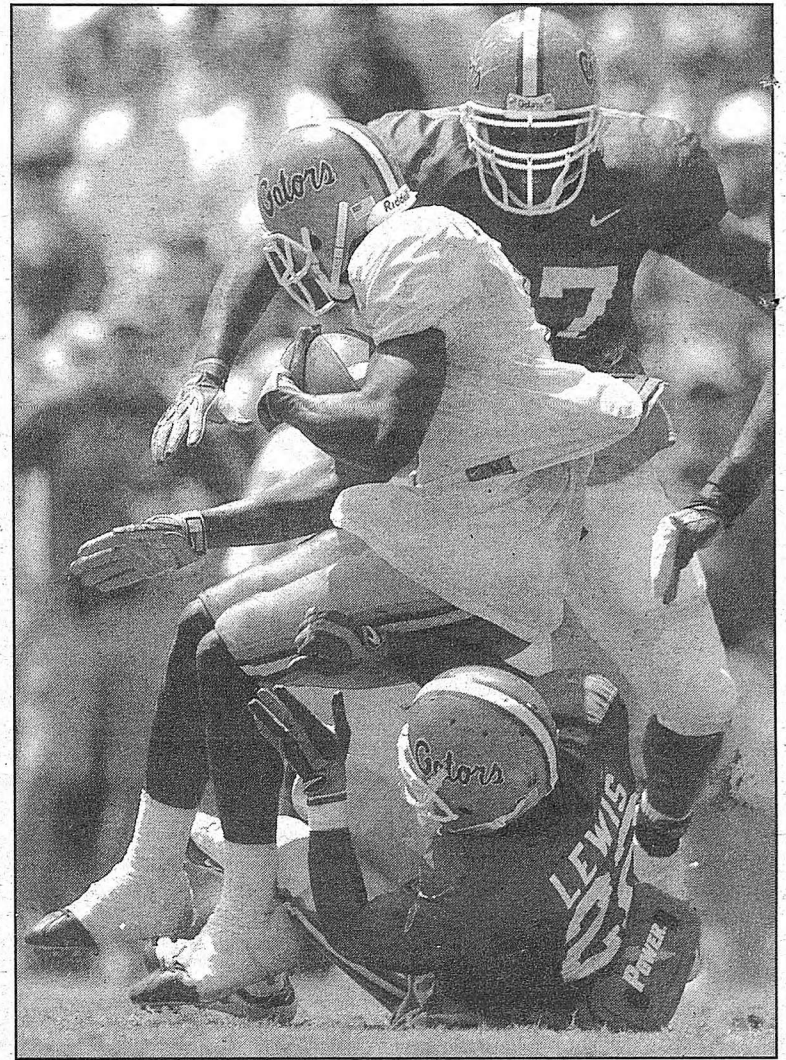

Solid swings stifle Georgia

A pair of freshmen on the UF baseball team will not be intimidated by the increased level of competition in the Southeastern Conference.

In front of 3,021 barking fans, Stephen Locke (5-0) won his first conference start, pitching 5.2 shutout innings Sunday in Athens, Ga.

Locke struck out seven batters and scattered five hits to lead the No. 5 Gators (25-8, 8-4 SEC) to a 10-1 victory against the Bulldogs.

Redshirt freshman Brandon McArthur extended his hitting streak to 11 games in convincing fashion. The third baseman had three hits on Sunday, part of an 8-for-12 performance in the series.

McArthur leads the Gators with a .500 batting average in SEC play, tallying 17 hits in 34 at-bats. His overall average now stands at .341, a significant improvement from his .190 average through March 11.

"I honestly felt like we needed to be prepared to not be going," Yoculan said.

UF's Savannah Evans injured her right ankle during her floor exercise routine, and was initially diagnosed with a sprain. She will be re-evaluated this week.

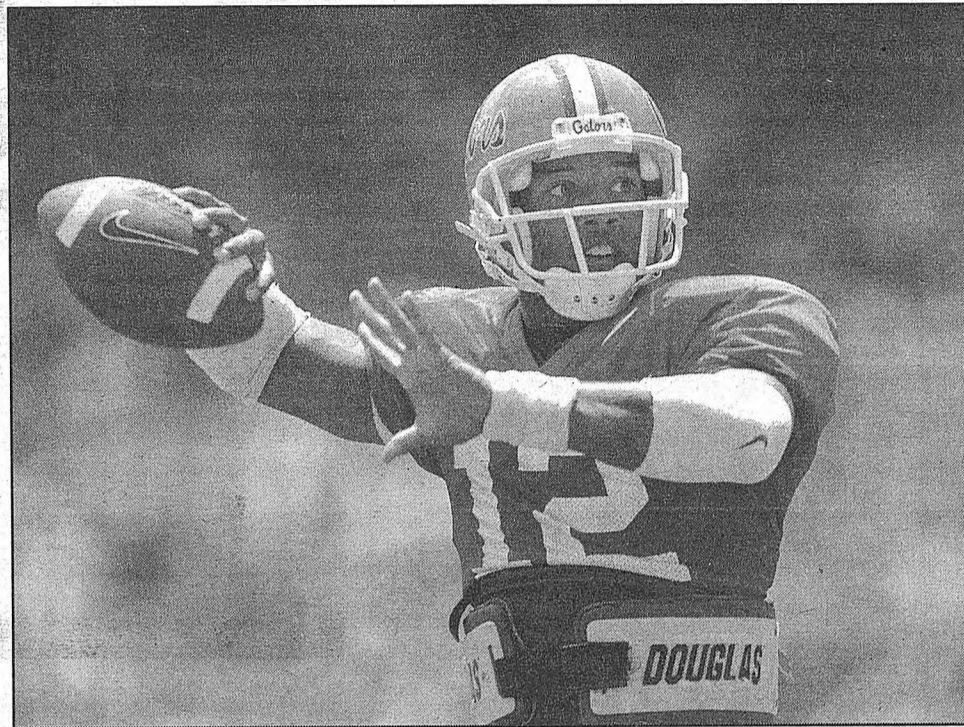

After notching 20 of 30 for 253 yards and four touchdowns, Portis may be in line to be Leak's backup come Sept. 3.

"He's as explosive on his legs as he is throwing the ball," Meyer said. "I was very

impressed with him today."

IT'S NICE TO SHARE: With spring season finished, co-defensive coordinator Greg Mattison can say with confidence that his relationship with Charlie Strong has been nothing but positive.

Gators earn Regional title

Two weeks ago, they were walking around shell-shocked.

The No. 7 UF gymnastics team entered the Southeastern Conference Championships with great expectations, but they were crushed by uncharacteristic mistakes and a near-flawless performance by Georgia, and the Bulldogs cruised to the conference crown.

Saturday night, however, the Gators and Bulldogs flipped the script.

This time, it was UF consistently putting up high scores, and Georgia needed a series of mistakes by Denver in order to advance to the NCAA Championships.

The Gators won the meet, earning the sixth NCAA Southeast Region title in school history and the first since 1997, with a score of 196.575. The Bulldogs also advanced with a score of

195.15.

"I really can't say enough about how this team performed tonight," Coach Rhonda Faehn said. "We really spent the last few weeks after SECs focusing in, once again, on the real reason everyone is here doing gymnastics, and it's the passion and the love of the sport, and to not worry so much about the final standings or the results, because those things will happen when you do everything that you plan on and set out to do."

The Gators talked before the meet about wanting to prove that they were capable of a high-level performance when under pressure, and they went out and supported their words.

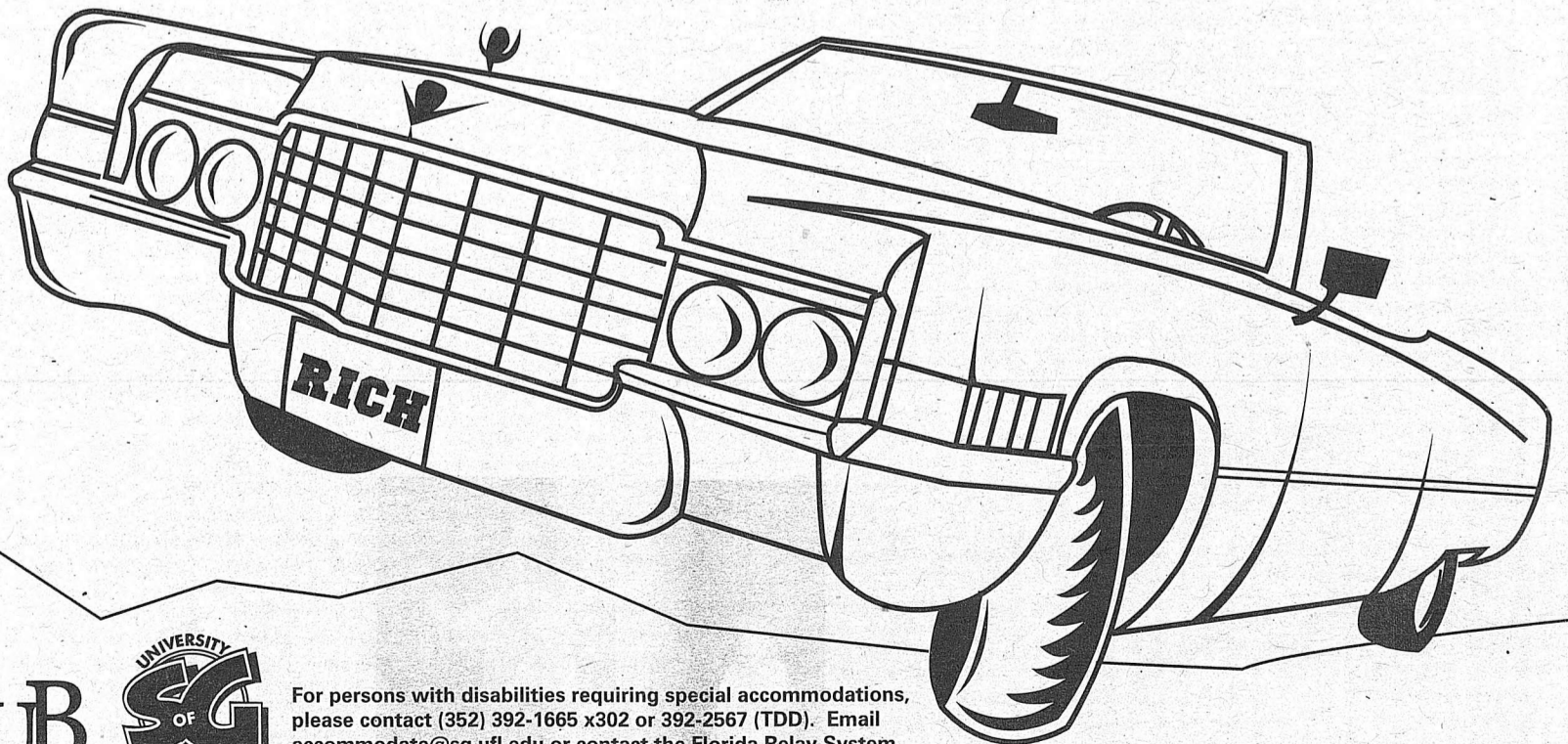
