

## **Senate hears** education bill Legislature vying for power to set tuition

Not officially associated with the University of Florida

TALLAHASSEE — The Senate Education Committee on Tuesday unanimously approved a House proposal designed to define governance over the state's universities.

House Bill 1001 and its Senate companion, 1920, define which powers belong to the Legislature and which belong to the Board of Governors.

The bill clarifies that the BOG has a constitutional duty "to operate, regulate, control and be fully responsible for the management of the whole publicly funded State University System."

Among other duties, the Governors will define the mission and strategic plan of each university, approve all degree programs, set enrollment levels for each university and negotiate with faculty for bargaining purposes. The BOG also would be able to delegate some respon-

sibilities to university boards of trustees.

Conversely, the Legislature would set tuition, fees and financial aid policies, as well as the total budget for the State University System and require universities to participate in state retirement and benefits programs.



The only new wrinkle in the Senate version of the bill is a measure banning lobbyists from serving on the BOG or as university trustees.

The measure empowers the BOG to use more authority than it has previously exercised. But it still falls short in the eyes of former UF Interim President E.T. York, who filed suit in Tallahassee last December.

In suing, York sought a declaratory judgment that the BOG, among other duties, should have the power to set tuition and fees for each university.

"The BOG has the authority to set tuition under the state constitution," he said Tuesday. "The BOG can make a more rational decision on tuition than the legislature, but more importantly, it has the constitutional duty to do so."

Bill sponsor Rep. Dudley Goodlette, R-Naples, disagreed with York's assertion. The constitution and its separation of powers grant

the Legislature power of the purse, he said.

Moreover, legislators are responsible for funding Bright Futures and the Prepaid College Plan, costs of which would skyrocket if universities had power to raise tuition by double-digit percentages each year.

Making matters more complicated, universities - including UF - argue they should have power to set tuition.

## Machen pushes alcohol moderation

While they're welcome to open a cold beer in their homes, Gainesville residents will no longer be encouraged to do so through TV alcohol advertisements during UF sporting events.

UF President Bernie Machen took another step toward changing the university's drinking culture by joining the na-

tional Campaign for Alcohol-Free Sports TV, a coalition of more than 200 colleges pledging to break the connection between sports and alcohol.

UF is the first major, public university in Florida and the Southeastern Conference to do so, Machen boasted.

He announced the move at a Tuesday meeting of the Alachua County Medical Society. Physicians, he said, see the problem daily.

Several audience members agreed,

some guessing that 70 percent of trauma patients are involved in alcohol-related accidents.

Banishing alcoholic messages from UF programming is the latest step of several that Machen has taken this semester.

More changes may be made as Machen makes his way through UF's existing policies, conforming to the "positive culture" he said UF wants to exude. A few months ago, he prohibited al-

#### **ADMINISTRATION Graduation ceremonies now separate**



UF students of all majors will have a more intimate graduation this year, but unlike past years colleges will pay for the privilege. UF's swelling enrollment forced university officials to split the once-unified graduation ceremony into separate events for some of the larger colleges beginning in 2002. Starting this year, however, all colleges will be in charge of organizing the ceremonies, including responsibility for costs UF paid in prior years. Holding a graduation ceremony involves a lot of behind-thescenes planning and expenses, including renting a venue, print-

ing programs, and paying for staff, said Allyson Beutke. As the publications coordinator for the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the largest of UF's 17 colleges, Beutke arranges the programs for the college's undergraduate and graduate commencements.

EÁG organized events for this week in honor of UF's Earth Week. There will be speakers and tabling throughout the week, a social on Friday and a 5K run on Saturday.




More than 300 students showed up Tuesday night for the Interfraternity Council's first-ever Stand Up for Comedy philanthropy event.

Non-Greek students represented several Greek organizations competing in the event.


Ben Caswell, who organized the event, said he was impressed with how many people signed up to participate.

## Studios keep close theaters from showing same films

A movie studio-established three-mile guideline is responsible for the monopoly Gainesville's two major theaters have on certain films, a local theater manager said.

The veñues, Royal Park Stadium 16 Theater and Regal Butler Plaza Cinemas, do not show the same films.

"The film studios decide on a policy, as far as I understand it, that theaters within three miles of each other can't play the same titles," said John Carpenter, manager of Royal Park Theater on University Avenue and Southwest 35th Street.

"We're two-and-a-half miles apart," he said, referring to Regal's Butler Plaza location. "It makes our business harder to run."

Jan Black, marketing director for Eastern Federal Theaters, which owns the Royal Park location, said rival Regal Entertainment Group has the power to share the movies it receives with Eastern Federal Theaters, but does not.

Calls to Regal Entertainment Group's corporate offices were not returned.

However, each is still in the dark about whether one of the biggest blockbusters of the summer, "Star Wars Episode III: Revenge of the Sith," will be coming to its silver screens because of the theaters' proximity.

Carpenter said he hopes his theater gets the

new "Star Wars" flick.

"I can't wait," he said. "But we don't know who has it yet."

However, Gator Cinemas, a small independently owned theater near the Oaks Mall, is free to choose from the Hollywood A-list lineup without restrictions. Theaters do not control which movies they get to show — studios do, Carpenter said.

"In theory the studios are supposed to be fair," Carpenter said. "[The situation] is kind of in the studios' best interest because it keeps

the old movies on the screen longer." However, despite the uncertainty surrounding the new "Star Wars" film that, according to officials at both theaters, will last for about another week, Regal's Butler Plaza location has posted advertisements in its theaters for the science fiction film.

Carpenter insists the theaters do not engage in bidding wars to compete for the next big release.

"I think it's a common misconception from some people," he said.

But Black said her company and Regal Entertainment Group are engaged in a sort of "power play."

"They're a large circuit and we're not," she said. "It's a matter of size."

Eastern Federal Theaters owns 23 theaters across three states, while Regal Entertainment Group maintains 563 locations throughout 40 states.

Black said there are numerous markets where the three-mile rule doesn't apply. She said that if the studios would disregard the distance constraint, consumers would be happier.

"Florida areas are more competitive. They seem to stick to those rules. The studios and the consumers would be the big winners," Black said. "We can't make sense of it."

She said she did not know the specifics of why Florida's market is more contested.

Gator Cinemas is free from the static caused by intense studio involvement, Assistant Manager Abhilash Trehan said.

"We can get whatever we want," Trehan said. "It's just between the two major movie theaters."

# In move to acquire cabinet director, ASU changes name

Reflecting a shift in programming and the desire for a director of Asian-American Affairs at UF, the Asian Student Union voted to officially change its name to the Asian-American Student Union.

Exactly two-thirds of the 60 delegates voted to enact the name change at an April 4 ASU meeting, President Mark Villegas said.

A two-thirds vote is the minimum requirement to pass an amendment under ASU's constitution.

"I think all of the change is reflective of the different stuff we've been doing and our desire to get an Asian-American Affairs director," he said.

In the past few years, the group's educational programming has dealt mainly with Asian-American issues, Villegas said.

Also, in 2004, UF agreed to create an Asian-American Studies certificate, a program that was implemented at the beginning of this semester.

He said he believed both these facts may have played into the voters' decisions.

Ten representatives from each of the five organizations under ASU, plus an additional 10 from ASU itself, were eligible to vote.

Delegates were informed two weeks prior to the meeting that the issue would be voted on, though the proposal has been discussed informally for more than a year, Villegas said.

ASU will not officially apply for the change until August, when all student groups must re-register with the Student Activities Center anyway.

At that time, the group will register under the new name,

pending approval from the director of Student Activities and vice president of Student Affairs.

Jen Counts, a program assistant for the Student Activities Center, said the proposed switch will have to meet several requirements before approval.

"We require that they submit a constitution that reflects the name change," she said.

Additionally, groups may not include "UF" or "University of Florida" in their name, as it may imply official university endorsement.

"It's fairly straightforward," she said.

Villegas said he realizes students who identify more with the term "Asian" may feel excluded by the new terminology.

"That's always a risk. That's a risk we have considered," he said.

He noted, however, that the same problem is posed in using the current name, adding, "The majority of people in ASU identify with 'Asian-American.'"

Villegas said any property with the ASU name on it will not be discarded, as the change is not so drastic as to cause confusion.

"The stuff we have now is still usable," he said.

The organization originally was part of Volunteers for International Student Affairs.

It took on the name Asian Student Union when it split off from VISA in 1993, Villegas said.

## **Secure server?** RIAA access to Internet2 could spell future trouble

Increasingly restrictive legislation sought by the government and intellectual property organizations already has led to visions of a "Big Brother" future, and the Recording Industry Association of America wants to make it clear that no one is safe.

Striking a blow for pampered corporate executives the world over, the RIAA plans to file lawsuits against students who have been using the new Internet2 allegedly to trade copyrighted material music and movies.

Internet2 is a network used by researchers at universities all across the world to explore the future of the Internet — and it just happens to be exponentially faster than traditional Internet.

As expected, ultra-fast Internet access plus college students has equaled a certain amount of illegal file sharing.

Of course, these students are a microscopic fraction of the huge number of Internet users who share files, and the files they share are a raindrop next to the vast ocean of illegal sharing.

Internet2 is a new frontier in the digital age, however, and the RIAA is making sure that it will be the first to set foot upon virgin soil and plant the first giant WARNING sign.

Cary Sherman, president of the RIAA, wants to send a message that Internet2 isn't "a zone of lawlessness where the normal rules don't apply," according to the Associated Press.

But file-sharing surveillance, apparently, should be a zone of conduct in which normal rules don't apply.

Access to Internet2, as could be expected of any experimental technology, is restricted.

Doug Van Houweling, Internet2's chief executive, told the Associated Press that no special access has been provided to the RIAA for it to gather information for these lawsuits.

So how did the RIAA find out exactly who had been sharing what, when there theoretically is no way for it to access Internet?

As of yet, the RIAA officially has declined to reveal what measures it took to acquire this information, saying only that there was no unlawful action involved.

Let's see if this sets any alarms off: This powerful organization found a way to access technology it shouldn't have been able to access, obtain information it shouldn't have been able to obtain, and then used this information to prepare lawsuits against private citizens — all without having to reveal its sources or methods.

But hey, it's OK: They pinkie-swore they didn't do any-thing illegal.


This is disturbing enough by itself, but keep in mind also that this is a university-based research system that deals with powerful, society-shaping technology and information.

If the MAA can take a peek whenever it wants into the file-swapping records of Internet2's users with impunity, what other, more sensitive information could be taken by anyone with enough money to "discover" a way in?

If the RIAA wants to sue students for file sharing, that's its prerogative. Those students technically are doing something illegal, under current law, even if taking action against a handful of individuals seems foolhardy.


Using questionable means to obtain private information, however, is an entirely separate story.

In court, the RIAA needs to prove that it has nothing to hide by revealing its sources. There had better be another lawsuit filed very quickly if it chooses not to do so, and we aren't talking about copyright violation.

**Bill threatens UF international students** Editor: If Rep. Dennis Baxley has his way, international students soon could be kissing their financial aid goodbye. As if the \$50 fee they pay each Fall and Spring semester for their own surveillance wasn't bad enough, international students across Florida soon may be denied state financial aid altogether. Baxley recently co-authored a bill that could eliminate financial aid by state funds to international students. The bill, which aims to "expand access to post-secondary education and reduce student indebtedness," also includes "prohibiting the use of such funds to provide financial assistance to specified foreign students."

UF has made it a priority to increase the diversity of the student body and faculty alike. President Machen has spoken on numerous occasions of becoming a Top 10 institution and the importance of a diverse campus to achieving that goal. International students are a vital part of UF. Many departments at UF rely heavily on international graduate students to do the bulk of their teaching. What message will the administration be sending to potential students from other countries if they don't provide any financial assistance to help them achieve their academic goals? Will international students enroll at UF at all? UF had 127 fewer international students enroll in the 2004 school year than the 2003 academic year, which amounts to a 22 percent drop in that year's enrollment and a 5 percent drop within the total international student body.

Those numbers only will continue to

plunge if this bill passes. I call on the UF administration to take a stand against SB 866 (HB 21). If UF truly values diversity as it claims, then it will take the measures necessary to protect international student financial aid. **Robin Collins**

#### Heros don't just 'overcome' disabilities

Editor: Jason Levitt's column "Midget Porn Star Not a Good Role Model," was offensive at its core. His ableism and fear of disability is apparent throughout the column, which does nothing more than help keep cultural stereotypes and stigmas in place.

While Levitt may choose to hold any beliefs he likes concerning pornography and subsequently judge anyone with or without a disability participating in pornography, the column had nothing to do with porn and everything to do with his misunderstanding of disability pride and disability culture.

Levitt refers to Bridget as "the actress who dehumanizes herself as some sexual circus freak." He does not say pornography

is dehumanizing, but rather he says being a "sexual circus freak" is. Is a black person in pornography being a sexual circus n\*\*\*\*? Is a homosexual in pornography a sexual circus f\*\*? Why is a midget in pornography a freak? Are all midgets freaks, or is that just when they have sex on or off the screen?

Levitt writes, "What Powerz does is the opposite. She becomes her disability. She is Bridget 'the Midget.' And then she takes her disability, now her whole person, and makes it a fetish for others." He suggests that, by identifying with a core aspect of herself — her disability - Bridget is committing an act of selftreason. This is akin to suggesting a Native American not take pride in being Iroquois or a female not take pride in being a woman.

Levitt continues this thread of ableism by writing that Bridget's identification with her disability "is not self-actualization; this is selfdehumanization." This is tantamount to saying that being disabled is dehumanizing.

Levitt attempts to mitigate his criticism by praising Bethany Stevens, but in doing so he only further reveals his position. He patronizingly salutes her for having "proved to be more than her disability." This is no more acceptable than saying that the president of the Black Student Association is a hero for overcoming his or her black skin tone.

Bethany Stevens is powerful and extraordinary, and none of this is because she has "overcome" her disability.

n his guest column, William James Martin begins with an elaborate description of events that allegedly took place in the village of Deir Yassin on April 9, 1948. This isolated "massacre," while generally accepted as having taken place, does not represent the state of Israel. Terrorism does not represent the state of Israel. Israel is a nation of peace, and one that does not deliberately target civilians or threaten to exterminate the existence of an entire people. The technological, social and humanitarian advancements made every day by Israel attest to her glory as a thriving member of the international community, and her numerous efforts at forging peace with the Palestinians cannot be overlooked. I ask you, Mr. Martin, have the Palestinian people ever made a concerted effort at peace with the Israelis? The answer is no. Do not fall into the trap of moral equivalency, asserting that an isolated incident should condemn the efforts of an entire nation, especially when terrorist groups supported by the Palestinian Authority believe that the use of violence is a legitimate activity.

Martin casts a negative image on Israel as a state "created . for one ethnicity." I answer this in two ways.

this statement seems out of line with the global trend of the formation of the nation-state. A nation-state may be defined as a state whose political borders are

coterminous with cultural or ethnic boundaries. Some of the greatest examples of states created for one ethnicity are France, Spain and any of the former Soviet Socialist Republics.

Additionally, to say that Israel exists at the expense of the indigenous Arab population simply is false for many reasons.

First of all, a Jewish presence in the land of Palestine has existed far longer than an Arab population. The arrival of many more Jews into the region during the latter half of the 19th century initiated and contributed to the revival of the land and the reinstitution of its economy. Jewish immigrants, purchasing land legally from local authorities under the slowly destabilizing Ottoman Empire, were responsible for creating social institutions and a system of irrigation, among other advancements, which would lay the foundation for the state of Israel.

Evidence of this is beautifully cited by Alan Dershowitz and by Benny Morris, to whom Martin refers often in his writings. While I cannot claim to know much about Martin, one can deduce a certain amount about him and his ideologies from articles of his such as "Who Is Pushing Whom into the Sea?" and "Condoleezza Rice Confused about the Middle East." I generally am a progressive person, but I also am very pro-Israel, and it is time for liberal Americans, especially instructors such as Martin and his colleagues, to understand that these values are not mutually exclusive. Israel is a beacon of hope for democracy in an otherwise dark region of the world, and should be supported by every American regardless of ideology

The beautiful thing about supporting Israel is that this issue is one of the few on which most government officials agree across the aisle. It is time instructors on college campuses across the country come forth with pro-Israel views. It is not "popular" among liberal academics to support Israel, seemingly because the Palestinians are the "underdogs" and the tradition stands to support those in a weaker position. This is utter nonsense, and pro-Israel professors need not be embarrassed any longer to be as outspoken as their anti-Israel counterparts are. Perhaps, with the reinstatement of a study-abroad program to Israel at UF as well as at many other prestigious universities across the nation, professors finally will have their chance. A few good Samaritans brought two Gainesville law-enforcement agencies out for a chase of what they thought was a badly wounded patron Tuesday.

An unidentified man was allegedly wandering around the UF Bookstore on Tuesday with a woman when workers said they noticed red bandages wrapped around his left arm and what looked like

an untreated gunshot wound to his leg, according to a Gainesville Police incident report.

Employees thought wounds were severe and suspected the man had improperly treated them himself, the report states, and called University Police.

GPD Lt. Brian Helmerson said his agency responded to a UPD call reporting the situation.

Officers from both UPD and GPD were dispatched to the Bank of America on West University Avenue at 5:30 p.m. when a man fitting the description of the one seen in the bookstore entered the branch.

Authorities did find, and briefly spoke with, a man accompanied by a blonde female, but he had no apparent injuries, Helmerson said.


The lieutenant said those who thought they saw something suspicious were seeing things that weren't really there.

## Bill passed House 97-17

UF has some of the lowest tuition costs in the nation, and President Bernie Machen has argued that UF must raise tuition significantly to bolster university revenues.

However, at an event Tuesday, Machen expressed his confidence that the bill would not impede upon UF's goals.

Joe Kays, a UF spokesman on legislative issues, said that while he was encouraged that UF could have more leeway this year in setting tuition for out-of-state and graduate students - neither of which are covered by the Bright Futures or Prepaid programs - UF is still lobbying for more.

"It's kind of an evolving thing, this whole devolution process, and while this is a good start, hopefully they'll consider more as time goes on," Kays said. "We're going to keep working toward that goal, and we'll have to see how the economic and political environment evolves over the next year and beyond."

Since the Legislature has paid for Bright Futures and Prepaid, it has sought to keep tuition - and therefore its own Bright Futures costs - low.

The UF administration contends low tuition starves the university of funding and keeps faculty salaries well below the national average. But in an era where most students graduate thousands of dollars in debt, UF students want to keep it that way.

Lobbyists employed by Student Government at a cost of \$70,000 in Activity and Service fees supported the bill over the opposition of the university and urged it along in the Senate.

The bill passed the Florida House 97-17 on March 29, but no similar Senate plan had been considered until Tuesday. Senate President Tom Lee said he was uncomfortable

passing such a bill until the York lawsuit had been decided. But Lee, noted for opposing the power of lobbyists in Tallahassee, wanted lobbyists banned from serving on the

BOG or boards of trustees. In return for nudging the bill through the Senate, House Speaker Allan Bense, R-Panama City, agreed to keep lobbyists

off the boards, leading to a deal that advances the legislation. In 2000, lobbyist-turned-politician-turned-lobbyist John Thrasher abolished the Board of Regents while serving as House Speaker in order to build a medical school at Florida State University, his alma mater, and put state universities under the control of Gov. Jeb Bush's Department of Education.

Two years later, former U.S. Sen. Bob Graham sponsored a voter-initiated constitutional amendment establishing the BOG to govern the system as a replacement to the Regents.

In 2004, the Legislature, led by FSU alumnus Senate President Jim King, approved \$9 million a year in perpetuity for a controversial chiropractic school to be built at FSU.

Thrasher, now chairman of the FSU Board of Trustees, refused to kill the plan fearing retaliation against his lobby, although many at FSU wanted nothing to do with the school. The newly-formed BOG, led by Carolyn Roberts of Ocala,

finally bared its teeth Jan. 27 when it shot down the plan. Reached Tuesday for comment, Roberts declined to talk

about the bill but said, "I think it's very important for the BOG to have a good relationship with the Legislature, and I intend to have that relationship."

cohol sponsorship for any event held at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. Then, he encouraged joint university and city meetings, spawning three subcommittees to research the problem.

And this week he suspended the Lex and Terry radio segment "Drunk Bitch Friday" from Rock 104's airwaves, citing that it is "dehumanizing" to women and promotes binge drinking.

But Machen said he doesn't expect these measures to stop students from imbibing, calling the acts "overly simplistic." The idea is to change the environ-

ment that leads to unhealthy drinking habits, he said. This includes alcohol specials, advertising and preconceived notions of college life.


UF already has begun educating incoming freshmen on the misconception that most UF students drink excessively. If students don't think they're expect-

ed to go through college in an alcoholic

blur, they're more likely to be responsible drinkers, he said. Responsibility is the focus at this stage, not abstinence.

"I have no intention of attempting to force a state of prohibition for any student who is over 21 and who makes responsible choices," he said. "Too many stu-

alike,



drinking," he said. But those who say that drinking is a

"right of passage" for students and nothing can be done are wrong, Machen said. "If we just give them a little help, they'll get it and they'll take off with this thing," he said.

A proposed City Commission ordinance closing bars at 3 a.m., however, is not a push in the right direction.

Even if alcohol was not sold during the extra hour that the ordinance would

provide over the current 2 a.m. last call, there hasn't been any research proving that students will then be less likely to get into accidents, he said.

UF medical student Kelly Hildebrand, 27, said she probably would have qualified as a problematic drinker during her undergraduate years. But after seeing the repercussions of alcohol abuse in friends, she now rarely imbibes.

Machen is on the right track, she said after hearing him at the event.

"I think he did a really good job bringing up valid points," she said.

Timothy Flynn, the Medical Society's president-elect, agreed. Machen, he said, is sending the right message by being

stringent with advertisements. "I'm a big believer in symbolism," he said.

The next step, Machen said, is to work with bars to curb the shower of alcohol specials around Gainesville.

Five alcohol-related deaths in 15 months needs to be addressed, he said.

"I don't want any more kids to die," he said.

## Convocation canceled after UF fails to find speaker

"It's great to have your own ceremony because you can personalize it and do pretty much whatever you want," she said. "It's not like we mind doing graduation."

But this year the ceremonies will cost the college \$35,000. "There's just the cost side involved," she said, adding that staffers across the college also have to take on extra work. "It's

definitely changed in the past few years. Lionel Dubay, the director of the Stephen C. O'Connell Center, wrote in an e-mail that UF colleges pay \$300 less than nonprofit outside organizations, and \$600 less than commercial organizations to rent the facility, although events cost the O'Connell Center the same amount. The bill adds up to ap-

proximately \$10,000 for a college that fills the building. The O'Connell Center will host seven ceremonies this year. Since the UF administration will not pay for graduation

anymore, Beutke thought that money would go toward a convocation the entire university could attend. But this year, convocation will not be held because UF

could not book a speaker in a timely manner, Associate Provost Sheila Dickison wrote in an e-mail. Interim Provost Joe Glover was not available to confirm whom UF invited to speak.

Last year's convocation brought the entire university together, which is a rare feat, said Neil Sullivan, dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

'It was a rallying point for the university as a whole," Sullivan said, adding he received good feedback from parents.

"I very much appreciated the ceremony last year." Pramod Khargonekar, dean of the College of Engineering, said he was disappointed graduates would not get convocation this year, but understood why it happened.

"It's great to have your own ceremony because you can personalize it and do pretty much

He said last year's convocation may have set the bar too high with U.S. Sen. John McCain as the keynote speaker.


You always miss something like that, but I think we will make up for it with the rest of the program," Khargonekar said. His college had to find funds in its budget to support gradu-

ation, but he said having a more personal ceremony is worth it. "I feel it's really important for our students," Khargonekar said. "We had to find the money."

The College of Engineering will have a keynote speaker at its commencement, but Liberal Arts and Sciences' undergraduate commencement is still too long for such an address. The ability to host speakers was considered one of the benefits to separating the ceremony into individual events.

But the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences is so large that it had to split its graduations this year because of fire codes, and the undergraduate ceremony still is expected to fill the O'Dome.

In a few years it may have to split up that event, Sullivan said.



## Marijuana legalization group says 'Know Your Rights'

Knowing the Bill of Rights is one's strongest asset when it comes to averting arrest, a National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws official told attendees at an on-campus forum Tuesday.

"I hoped they would learn self-preservation On techniques to keep Campus themselves out of

the criminal justice system and that they should assert their constitutional rights whenever possible," NORML Executive Director Allen St. Pierre said.

St. Pierre explained how the Fifth Amendment protects people from being compelled to testify against themselves, urging the audience to never consent to a search or to answer questions without an attorney present.

That knowledge served St. Pierre when he encountered a potentially compromising situation.

Years ago, while driving in Pennsylvania, he hit a median and was pulled over. The police officer began asking questions, but when the officer asked to search his vehicle, St. Pierre refused.

Without a warrant, the officer could not legally perform the

search, and St. Pierre was allowed to leave.

The UF chapter of NORML organizes a meeting every year regarding the topic of constitutional rights.

St. Pierre explained that even if a person is respectful, police often profile the people they pull over. In such instances, they may not be able to leave as easily as St. Pierre did.

"Profiling is a terrible cancer that comes out of prohibition," St. Pierre said.

He told the audience that the No. 1 factor that increases interaction with police is age, with profiling being the most pervasive among 24-and-under males.

To combat unjust situations in which officers take advantage of people's ignorance of the law, NORML created the Freedom Card, which states all of the relevant constitutional rights that one should invoke when being questioned.

The cards state that the person intends to remain silent, retain an attorney, invoke Miranda rights and refuse any searches.


NORML has many lawyers, including more than 20 in the state of Florida. St. Pierre explained how NORML has won cases based on officers' violation

of people's constitutional rights. "If you've got the gumption, and you've got the resources, you can challenge the government," St. Pierre said.

The president of UF's NORML chapter, Ashlee Valdes, met St.

Pierre at the organization's national conference in 2004 and invited him to speak at UF's event. "Knowing how to assert your

rights is very important," Valdes said. "People should now be able to use it in a police encounter."

# Cabinet increase sparks debate

Initial efforts by the soon-to-be Student Body president and vice president to increase the number and specialization of cabinets in Student Government succeeded Tuesday night, but not without fervent debate in the Student Senate.

The number of cabinets, which address a wide range of student issues under SG's executive branch, was increased from 36 to 41.

The Public Relations Cabinet was split into Advertising, Promotions and Publicity, and a Responsible Gators Cabinet was added to address UF administrative concerns about excessive student drinking.

The bill originally was authored by Student Body President-elect Joe Goldberg and Vice Presidentelect Joyce Medina, but Jennifer Puckett, who oversaw the cabinets during the past year in her role as Student Body vice president, added herself as an author during Tuesday's Senate meeting.

"They know what they're doing — the changes they've made address real concerns," Puckett said.

She added that she spent a lot of time discussing the changes with Goldberg and

Medina. Sen. Kevin Bacon, who said he has worked on SG's Cabinet for two years,

Baconmade two formal<br/>a m e n d m e n t sto the bill to prevent the Cabinet<br/>from becoming what he called a<br/>"sprawling bureaucracy."

Bacon said since an unlimited amount of staff members can work within each Cabinet, adding more cabinets would result in each of them receiving less funding and becoming less effective. He tried twice to stop the addition of an Internal Communications Cabinet, which he said does not meet statute requirements.

SG documents state that Cabinet requirements are to coordinate communications between organizations and SG, as well as maintaining an SG bulletin board and making the SG office a "welcoming and cheerful environment."

Both of Bacon's amendments to remove additional cabinets failed in close votes, as well as one amendment by Sen. Mike Belle to remove the Responsible Gators Cabinet from the bill because he said he felt it was more of a political gesture than something that truly was needed. Sen. Jackie Pace said Cabinet po-

sitions exist to serve the students, and an increase in cabinets would only further that cause. "I don't see how expanding Student Government is going to

hurt at all," she said.

Canseco is making the first college stop of his "JUICED" tour promoting his book "Juiced: Wild Times, Rampant 'Roids, Smash Hits, and How Baseball Got Big." In the book, not only does Canseco admit to using steroids, but he also names other players who he witnessed using steroids. Canseco hit over 400 home runs and was the first

Canseco hit over 400 home runs and was the first player to hit 40 in one season while stealing 40 bases. Canseco testified before Congress about steroids on

March 17. In his testimony, he said steroid use was rampant and baseball turned its back to it.

## UF weighs in on drug-free paths to sports fitness

COLLEGE BASEBALL HAS SEEN FAR FEWER STEROID ALLEGATIONS.

The needle is inserted into the body, or the cream is rubbed on.

That is all it takes for a baseball player to cheat the game by using steroids.

Major League Baseball steroid allegations have made news recently, leaving college baseball as a pure, drug-free form of the game. The NCAA has a strict policy in place for players who test positive for any banned substance.

The athlete becomes ineligible for 365 days and loses one year of eligibility.

Besides giving a player an apparent advantage, performance-enhancing steroids have serious negative side effects that can stay with a player long after his career is over.

'The side effects for men would be acne. It shrinks the testicles and can cause cancer," said Charlie Hunt, a certified personal trainer.

Hunt said oral steroids, those in capsule or tablet form, can put lesions on the liver.

College baseball has avoided the steroid allegations of the professional game by using regimented workout programs done under the supervision of trainers, and by using the extra power provided by aluminum bats.

"Anabolic steroids deal with the male hormone testosterone, which increases strength in the muscle," Hunt said.

Student for the UF baseball team, said steroids are not possed Matt LaPorta, first baseman "I think the workouts we do

here get you plenty big, plenty strong and it's the baseball kind of strength you need," he said.

The workout program starts in early Fall and consists of weightlifting four times a week. The workout program also consists of run-

ning four times a week, working on endurance as well as agility. The constant theme in all the workouts is

the need to make sure the workouts keep the athletes at the proper fitness level for baseball. "With baseball players, you don't want

them to get very bulky. You're always trying to increase flexibility," said Steve Oriss, strength and conditioning coach for UF baseball. "The main goal for any baseball player is to develop

power. We'll turn base strength and power into baseball-specific strength."

The NCAA has its own testing policy players must abide by, and the university also has a policy in place monitoring players closer than the NCAA requires, Oriss said.

The university randomly tests all its athletes every few weeks.

This policy has been in place for years and has not been affected by the recent steroid accusations at the professional level.

In 1999-2000, the NCAA administered 9,206 tests. Ninety-two athletes, less than 1 percent, tested positive for steroids.

Some players use additional supplements like Creatine, but not before they are specifically approved by a nutritionist.

Legal supplements are used in college baseball but are closely monitored. The Gators use a post-workout recovery drink known as Go Shake, a calorie booster, but that is all the university provides.

LaPorta is not into supplement use, preferring a more natural method.

"I use vitamins and just try to eat," he said. Players in college and professional baseball tend to agree that a player's athletic ability is what makes one successful.

LaPorta said he believes steroids are avoided at the amateur level because the urgency to be great is not as high as it is when baseball becomes one's occupation.

"You see it more when you get into the minors because you got guys with the same talent as you, and everybody is trying to up their game," LaPorta said.

College has avoided the black eye Major League Baseball has received because of frequent testing and players being honest and not trying to cheat the system, LaPorta said.


UF baseball coach Pat McMahon said he is proud of the strict drug policy the university mandates, and said Oriss maintains that the workouts and training done are what produce results on the college field.

"There is so much more training with athletes today," he said. "Aluminum bats is a big factor because the hitting surface on an aluminum bat is bigger compared to a wood bat."

LaPorta leads UF in home runs this season. "I don't really find a big difference between aluminum and wood," LaPorta said. "I've always believed if you're a good enough hitter, you're always gonna make good contact, which is gonna make the ball carry out of the yard or not."

erage is. I'm going to use perfect footwork. I'm going to use my eyes to look off the safety and I'm going to drive the ball in there like a 100mile-an-hour fastball."

Junior wide receiver Dallas Baker exemplifies UF's previously flawed cycle of receiver development. Baker has always been phenomenal in spring, but admittedly lost ground in summer.

"In the past, I used to make excuses and maybe [I was] immature," he said. "Now I've grown up. I'm going to be there every day of the summer working at 110 percent."

Added Mullen: "Dallas Baker has to run every route 1,000 times this summer and catch up to 1,000 balls if we want to be successful."



Crowder, Jarvis Herring and Taurean Charles were arrested, while Earl Everett and Skyler Thornton were implicated in two sworn complaints.

NCAA Division I policies forbid Meyer and his assistants from being involved with summer workouts, hindering their ability to monitor players. But Meyer has a backup plan.


"Instead of being a weight and training staff that kind of closes [its] eyes and hopes nothing bad happens, we're going to look into their eyes and tell what's going on," Meyer said. "If you do your homework and grind it, you can find out how your players are living."

Meyer's watchdog program. starts with the players themselves, such as redshirt senior Tavares Washington. UF's designated clubhopper, Washington frequents popular club on certain nights to ensure the players avoid trouble.

"I don't trust them because they're 18- and 22-year-olds in a college town with all kinds of things pulling at them, and I don't know them well enough yet," Meyer said.

For Meyer, UF's 2005 outlook hinges as much on discipline as touchdowns.

"If we don't live right, we're very average next year," he said: "If [we] do, we have a chance to win big."


#### **Receivers getting serious**

## **Additional game could lead to UF-Miami matchup**

NCAA Division The Management Council has backed legislation that would allow Division I-A and I-AA schools to add a 12th football game starting with the 2006 season.

The plan was given tentative approval by the council at its meeting on Monday and will be sent to the NCAA Board of Directors for final consideration April 28.

The ramifications for UF could be huge. It's long been discussed that if the Gators had a 12th game on its schedule, the UF-Miami series could be renewed annually. If the legislation passes, a yearly clash between the Gators and Hurricanes could return for the first time since the 1980s.

Berst said Tuesday he didn't know whether the NCAA board would go along with the council's recommendation, which was opposed only by the Atlantic Coast Conference among I-A conferences.

"I would expect there will be more discussion," Berst said. "The board should have the freedom to make its own decision.'

There was no discussion of the issue at the council's meeting. "The various conferences came

to the meeting prepared to vote,

and we just tallied the votes," Berst said.

Ron Wellman, the athletic director at Wake Forest and chairman of the ACC's athletic directors, said many of the conference's concerns dealt with academics.

"We believe the season is long enough at 11 games, and we actually enjoy the bye week," he said.

## **CATCHING ADMIRATION** UF embraces Jeroloman's leadership

A leader, almost by definition, is supposed to be more experienced than his peers. In a college baseball setting, the upperclassmen are the ones who usually field this role.

Then there's Brian Jeroloman.

The catcher is unquestionably a leader of UF's baseball team.

Jeroloman has been shown respect by fans, teammates and opponents in different forms.

"When I play at another field, I think of it as respect," Jeroloman said. "When someone boos you, that's respect. They're showing you that they don't want you up at bat."

But Jeroloman deals with more than just boos from opponents.

His teammates tease him about his clothing and close relationship with his girlfriend.

"Darren O'Day busts my chops because I wore sweatpants a lot last year," Jeroloman said. "I dressed the way I felt comfortable dressing, so he busted my chops about that."

But last season, at a Vanderbilt road game, Jeroloman solidified the status among his peers. It all happened after former UF pitcher Justin Hoyman pegged Commodores' slugger Cesar Nichols.

"I'm only six feet tall," Jeroloman said. "Cesar is like 6-foot-7. He "You never know what could possibly happen. That one day you don't give 100 percent, the next thing you know, the other guy's got it."

got hit by a pitch. I don't care how big you are, if you show up

my pitcher, I'm going right after you." Nichols took exception to Hoyman's er-

rant pitch and showed him up. "I went right after him," Jeroloman said.

"That's the one thing I can't stand. If you show up my pitcher, that's my job to go after you. Just like if someone charges the mound, I have to get to that guy before he gets to my pitcher."

As for the pegged Nichols?

"He was walking down to first base and I was yelling at him the whole way down there to first base, letting him know, 'You never do that," Jeroloman said. "He didn't say a word. The next time he came up, he just said 'I'm sorry.' I believe I got respect from that, from him and my teammates."

Jeroloman has only been playing catcher for four years. He switched to the position while he was a sophomore at Wellington High School. His coach told him he was too slow to play second base anymore.

He was voted to the All-Freshman Southeastern Conference team by conference coaches last season after batting .318. This season he has thrown out 21 of 38 runners, which leads the conference.

Jeroloman has earned national recognition for his efforts, as he was named to the watch list for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the top national collegiate catcher.

Despite proving himself as a skilled player, Jeroloman won't even say his starting job is safe. To explain provides an example of what can happen when a good player gets lazy.

"There was a guy who's name was Walter Pipp," Jeroloman said. "He played with the Yankees, he was an All-Star outfielder. One day, he thought he was big-time and told his manager he wanted a day off. So they put the backup in, Lou Gherig. Walter Pipp never played for the Yankees again.

Added Jeroloman: "You never know what could possibly happen. That one day you don't give 100 percent, the next thing you know, the other guy's got it."

In a home game last season against Auburn, Jeroloman witnessed his older brother, Chuck, get heckled. Gators fans broke into a "Brian's sister" chant.

"Did I believe the fans got to my brother? Yes, in a way," Jeroloman said. "He played better. He ended up sitting two home runs, three doubles, six RBI."

Chuck Jeroloman played well enough to get drafted by the Boston Red Sox.

"My brother knew the fans called him that because he was my brother, and I expect I'll get the same thing when I go over there," Jeroloman said. "I believe it helped him in a way. He was loving it, he said."

Home fans call Jeroloman "Slammer," because his first career home run was a walk-off grand slam against Northwestern last season. This year, his first home run came in the bottom of the ninth inning to tie the opening game of the season.

But his teammates still tease him about his girlfriend, UF gymnast Savannah Evans. That doesn't bother Jeroloman one bit, as he doesn't


ask for." As second baseman Adam Davis sat beside him, mocking the sentimental words, Jeroloman continued unfazed.
