official said Sunday.

Gainesville Pegeen Mayor Hanrahan told the Alligator that in an earlier meeting she had with Goldberg, he admitted to her that Domenech "promised to vote for changing the closing hours" in exchange for Goldberg's student supporters also lending help to the commissioner's campaign.

Goldberg assumes SG throne

THE NEW PRESIDENT OF-FICIALLY WILL TAKE OFFICE MAY 1.

The commencement new leadership in Student Government was celebrated Saturday night as Student Body President Jamal Sowell passed the torch to President-elect Joe Goldberg.

Goldberg was sworn in at the 88th annual Student Government Inaugural & Recognition Banquet in Emerson Alumni Hall.

"I am ready to be a leader that the entire student body can believe in," Goldberg told the banquet attendees.

"Joyce (Medina), Lindsay (Cosimi) and I stand before you tonight to let you know that we will not let you down," he added, invoking the names of his party's vice president- and treasurerelect.

Although he was sworn in, Goldberg does not take office until May 1.

"I am ready to be a leader that the entire student body can believe in."

Goldberg was welcomed into his position by UF President Bernie Machen, who cautioned that SG should do all it can to reach out to disenfranchised students.

"Many students don't feel that Student Government works for them," Machen said.

He noted that there is a belief that SG largely has been run by a small number of student groups, an assumption that, he said, has "historical justification," but has become "increasingly inaccurate."

Despite having endorsed the Impact Party in the spring elections, Sowell was complimentary of Goldberg's accomplishments and placed faith in the Gator Party's leadership.

"I know that the school will be in good hands," Sowell said.

Sowell also spoke of the accomplishments of his Access Party during his tenure in office, including efforts to fight the implementation of block tuition and the Chomp the Vote voterregistration drive.

'After I ran, many students who would never have run for a position in Student Government or for Student Body president ran because I gave them the courage to do so," he said.

The night also featured videotaped segments poking fun at SG officials and accusations made about them.

One skit featured Goldberg

Group to give pill

Citing feminist crusader Margaret Sanger's efforts to distribute then-illegal birth control in the 1920s, members of the Gainesville Women's Liberation community-education have scheduled their own form of civil disobedience.

As part of a larger movement to gain Food and Drug Administration approval of the "Plan B" morning-after pill as an over-the-counter medication, members plan to distribute illegally the emergency contraception on the corner of Southwest 13th Street and University Avenue on Tuesday at noon.

The group's 10 pills came

from personal prescriptions.

"Unfortunately, we only have a limited amount of pills we can pass out, but we still want to pass on information about the campaign and the urgency of the issue," UF student Claire Beach said.

On January, Campus four women representing area feminist groups were arrested after blocking the entrance to the FDA offices in Rockville, Md., also in protest of the delay in approving the Plan B pill for over-the-counter sale.

Among those charged with disorderly conduct was UF alumna Stephanie Seguin, who said the group blocked access to the FDA because the FDA is blocking access to the pill.






UF pushes version of tuition control

Despite the Legislature's moves to keep tuition-setting power in the hands of the lawmakers themselves, UF officials remain hopeful that the university might win the tuition tugof-war by the time the session

Jane Adams, UF vice president for university relations, has developed proposed legislation that would pass down the ability to set out-of-state, graduate and professional tuition to university boards of trustees.

That power is UF's No. 1 legislative priority this year and one of the first steps in giving local boards control over all tuition.

"It's been great that we've had expressions of support for the concept," Adams said, including from state Rep. J. Dudley Goodlette, R-Naples, who sponsored the bill that would keep tuition control in the Legislature.

"But at this point in the legislative session it's dangerous to speculate."

Adams would not say whether Goodlette's bill, which passed the Senate Education Committee last week, would be a threat to universities' goals of setting tuition.

The bill would clarify the often-ambiguous relationship between the Board of Governors, which was created through a constitutional amendment two years ago, and the Legislature, Adams said.

It would charge the Board of Governors with the task of overseeing academic policy but leave the Legislature with the power of the purse, that is, the power to set tuition.

"It doesn't do all the things we would like to see happen in devolution," Adams said. "But we can live with it."

Manny Fernandez, chairman of UF's Board of Trustees, the university's highest governing body that would have tuition-setting power under Adams' amendment, said if the bill passed, it might pose prob-

> lems for UF's overarching goals.

"I'm somewhat disappointed at this point in time," Fernandez said.



Goodlette's bill has already passed the House and has the potential to give boards of trustees that power and settle the conflict once and for all, Fernandez

Instead, it may conflict with a pending lawsuit that claims the Florida Constitution grants THAN 400 ON CAMPUS. the Board of Governors power over tuition.

If the bill is passed without Adams' amendment, the matter only may be resolved in court, Fernandez said.

"I would imagine that there would be litigation and eventually the Supreme Court of the State of Florida will have to decide where the powers do reside," Fernandez said.


was head coach Urban Meyer's idea, Goldberg said.


Meyer stressed that he wanted to do the project on campus and wanted to make it meaningful.

Portis said he thought the event was a success.


"I appreciate all the players comin' out," he said. "We (are) not no NBA stars."

Guardian program gives hope to lives of abused kids

The Florida Guardian ad Litem Program was created in response to the growing problem of child abuse.

A guardian ad litem, or guardian in the law, is a court-appointed volunteer who, by serving as the "eyes and ears of the judge," represents the best interests of an abused child.

Clarkson Cantrell, director of Guardian ad Litem and circuit director of the Eighth Judicial Circuit, has worked for more than 24 years to assist battered women and children and said she understands the influence of abuse on a child's mental health.

"Domestic violence has a profound longterm effect on children," Cantrell said.

"We are not trained therapists. Generally, we're counseled just to be good listeners," said Angie Tipton, a guardian for three

If a guardian believes that a child needs help, he or she can recommend it to the judge and check up to see if the child has been given the needed attention, said Tipton, who heard of the program while working for University Police.

"Not all people respond in ways that require specific counseling," she said. "Everyone has different ways that they

When she first enters a case, she said the children are usually "dazed and confused."

But at the end of the case, many display a complete change.

"You see a whole different child, literally a complete personality change," she said.

"You walk away knowing they've got a good chance now," Tipton said.

As the guardian works on behalf of the child and spends time with him or her, the two often become very close.

The abuse, followed by removal from their home and placement with strangers, "I encourage students to look into Guardian ad Litem. They won't be wasting their time. They're really going to make a difference."

Leslie Utiger UF law student and guardian

is absolutely the worst thing that could happen to a child, said Betty Jennings, who has worked with the Guardian ad Litem Program since 1982.

Everyone around the boy or girl is a stranger, but the guardian becomes the one consistent person in the child's life, Jennings

One of the biggest mental-health problems comes from the destruction of children's trust. The guardian can give them back the ability to trust, she said.

"The guardian is the only one that goes out to the home and spends time with the child," Jennings said.

The guardians not only spend time with the child, but they do a complete investigation of the case. They talk to the parents and the foster parents about the situation. They visit the children's teachers and look at their medical records.

Children may keep in touch with their guardian even after the program is fin-

Guardians must be 21 years old and are asked to give several hours a week to their work for at least a year. They may work on more than one case at a time.

UF students have given their time as guardians while continuing as students.

Leslie Utiger, a second-year law student at UF, has been a guardian for more than a


I hope your general thoughts about this are something along the lines of, "That's retarded."

Dirty doings?

Recent actions make the commission race unclear

The Alligator has chosen to withhold its endorsement of a candidate for Tuesday's City Commission runoff election.

We have no doubt whom we'd feel more comfortable endorsing in the battle between incumbent Tony Domenech and challenger Jack Donovan. We endorsed him once before.

Domenech has a boatload of ties to UF and to the community.

Donovan, to put it simply, does not.

But recent events have further muddied the waters of the already murky pond of Gainesville city elections.

Now, even more than in the Student Government campaigns, it is clear that elections make strange bedfellows.

When else would political entities like Pegeen Hanrahan be accused of behavior as erratic as that of her and her supporters' alleged introduction of controversial issues in an attempt to discredit Domenech in the days before the elections?

And when else would Hanrahan's views contrast so much with those of, say, failed Commission candidate Gabe Kaimowitz? The latter lashed out in anger over the past week about a Donovan advertisement emphasizing the Presbyterian minister's "relationship with God."

But Kaimowitz's campaign was a self-described experiment, which we will go further to describe as an outright joke. So we're back at square one.

It would be stupid for us to conclude that Donovan or Domenech would be unfit for the job.

What holds us back from reaffirming Domenech as the best candidate for students is the same plaguing problem that effectively precluded any support from us for the Gator Party in the SG elections — we don't like accusations of political collusion, no matter how legal or innocuous.

We said the same thing when Joe Goldberg ran: We don't want to feel our representation is being sold on the open market.

With SG, of course, the stakes involved often are along the lines of, say, chocolate alligators (or orange-and-blue M&Ms, as the case may be).

If students choose not to speak out, they themselves are the only ones who are hurt when their money is spent on candies rather than on improvements to their university experience.

It's different on the City Commission: Everyone in Gainesville is affected by the decisions commissioners make — and these effects can last for generations. Gainesville has a number of decisions to make in the next three years on issues of transportation, utilities, public safety and poverty to name a few, which SG has the luxury of avoiding.

And while we may or may not support Goldberg's highly politicized battle to extend bar-closing times by an hour, we feel that extending the UF political machine to support the proposal could hurt what little student voice the City Commission currently has.

There are times in politics when you can see corruption for what it is and take steps to support the side that is fighting against it.

There also are times when both sides are so mired in deceit at the basic level that it's foolish to think you know who you can trust.



Bad political weather coming for Asia

nother Asian tsunami is brewing — except this time it's political. The two great powers in the Far East, Japan and China, are vying for the top position in the region, and the dangerous tides are digging up all the unforgotten bones of the past.

Their beef starts with borders. They have not agreed on which country owns a certain stretch of land in the East China Sea — land that is thought to have deep natural-gas reserves. For both China and Japan, the world's second- and third-biggest oil consumers, this land is a valuable commodity.

They both also claim ownership of a group of uninhabited islands in the East China Sea, known as the Senkakus in Japan and the Diaoyus in China, according to Rueters.

The islands are around 255 miles west of Okinawa and give access to rich fishing grounds and possible oil deposits. Japan has claimed them since defeating China in 1895.

But history is another thing in dispute. Early this month, Japan approved a new edition of a textbook that downplays the wrongs of its militaristic past.

The most contentious issue is how the book refers to the 1937 Nanjing Massacre in China, which was an orgy of sexual violence and murder the likes of which rarely is seen in human history. More than 300,000 people were killed. But the new textbook changed the "massacre" into an "incident."

This incident also is called "The Rape of Nanjing." A Japanese soldier was quoted in a BBC News story as saying, "There were about 37 old men, old women and children. We captured them and gathered them in a square. There was a woman holding a child on her right arm... and another one on her left. We stabbed and killed them, all three — like potatoes in a skewer. I thought then, it's been only one month since I left home... and 30 days later I was killing people without remorse."

According to Rueters, the book explains that Japan's Jason Levitt is a journalist imperialism and militarism during World War II was column appears on Monday.

motivated by "self-preservation" and a desire to liberate Asia from the West's control.

Only a few Japanese schools are using the contentious text-book, but a few is too many, and the Chinese are rightfully angry. Now the flames of rage, at first fanned by the Chinese government, now are threatening to burn out of control.

According to the New Zealand Herald, the thousands of protestors who marched in the streets began committing acts of mob violence, smashing the windows of Japanese-style restaurants and injuring a few Japanese people. Demonstrators also hurled bottles and eggs at the Japanese consulate in Shenyang, the capital of once-Japanese-occupied Manchuria.

China also is wary of the fact that Japan is trying to gain a permanent seat on the U.N. Security Council. It should be.

Colin Powell said last year that America supported Japan's bid for a seat on the council and was quoted as saying, "If Japan is going to play a full role on the world stage and become a full active participating member of the Security Council, and have the kind of obligations that it would pick up as a member of the Security Council, Article Nine would have to be examined in that light."

Article Nine of Japan's constitution reads in part, "Japanese people forever renounce war as a sovereign right of the nation and the threat or use of force as means of settling international disputes."

Many Japanese don't want this fundamental change in the character of post-war Japan. But America needs a strong ally in the War on Terror, and it sees in Japan great potential for war. So does China, and that's the problem.

Cupping candles while bundling up against the cool evening, more than 100 students and residents gathered Saturday at the Reitz Union Amphitheater to honor the life of Pope John Paul II through words and song.

Two face off for **Commission seat**

MEITHER TONY DOMENECH NOR JACK DONOVAN WON 50 PERCENT OF THE VOTE ON MARCH 29.

After three extra weeks of anticipation since the Gainesville City Commission general election, District 3 candidates Jack Donovan and incumbent Tony Domenech will face each other again in a runoff election Tuesday.

The March 29 election did not yield a winner in District 3, representing west and southwest Gainesville, because neither of the candidates received more than 50 percent of

Domenech received 48.34 percent of the total votes from the seven precincts, and Donovan tallied 44.19 percent. UF student Mike Belle, who is not a candidate in the runoff, got

The last chance for early voters to cast their ballots is Monday at the Supervisor of Elections Office in downtown Gainesville.

So far, about 125 early votes have been cast as well as 284 absentee ballots, Supervisor of Elections Pam Carpenter said.

"Everything has been running very smoothly," she said. Due to the election only being between two candidates, Carpenter said she expects a higher turnout and that voters will be much more focused on the candidates.

"I'm hoping it's going to surpass the turnout from last election," she said.

Sunday, Domenech admitted to having a close relationship with Goldberg and UF.

'I know Joe Goldberg very well," he said. "I have never really disconnected from the university."

When directly questioned on the issue of his allegedly promising to vote for extending bar hours, Domenech deferred comment to Goldberg.

It would be a violation of the protocol to come out one way or another," he said, asserting that he has never committed to a position one way or the other on extending the closing time.

The mayor and Commissioners Craig Lowe and Warren Nielsen have already said they would vote for the extension, Domenech said.

Thus, he said, telegraphing which way he was leaning would make further study of the problem meaningless by revealing that four of the seven sitting city commissioners would vote for the extension.

As far as his association with SG and student groups, Domenech said, "I always listened to them."

Domenech, a UF alumnus, was 'the only City Commissioner at the Orange & Brew restaurant to hear results for the initial SG election as well as that race's runoff between Goldberg and the Impact Party's Dennis Ngin.

Goldberg, in turn, put in an appearance downtown at the Supervisor of Elections Office to hear the campaign results in the March 29 election.

However, Goldberg said he was there merely to show his support for city government.

"I don't recall this conversation," he said when

asked about the alleged meeting with Hanrahan.

Several campaign signs promoting Domenech for Tuesday's election surround the Phi Delta Theta Fraternity house.

Domenech was being supported in the election as a Phi Delta Theta Fraternity brother in the same way those fraternity brothers supported Goldberg for Student Body president, Goldberg said.

Patrons of the Swamp Restaurant said they saw Goldberg and companions passing out campaign stickers promoting Domenech before Sunday.

"I wasn't at the Swamp this weekend," Goldberg . laughed. "I know where my vote is going, but I'm not going to use my position as the next Student Body president in that way."

'Tony's absolutely a friend of mine," Goldberg said, adding he continues to include Hanrahan on his list of friends.





Alligator forum hosts criticism

A panel of seven editors and a cartoonist met in the "bat cave" of Weimer Hall to atone for a semester's worth of sins Friday evening, but some members of the audience left feeling there was more to be forgiven.

About 20 readers dotted the 250-seat Gannett Auditorium in the College of Journalism and Communications to ask questions and offer criticism of

The Independent Florida Alligator staff. "We're interested in constructive criti-Campus cism and deconstructive criticism," said moderator Mike Foley, master lecturer in the journalism college.

Some of the audience consisted of Alligator writers and reporting students from Foley's class. But a few, including Journalism Department Chairman William McKeen, had genuine grievances to air.

McKeen said the Alligator significantly misrepresented his position on bringing The Gainesville Sun on campus in a March 28 article and showed poor judgment in choosing what to print and what to cut.

Alligator Editor Dwayne Robinson attributed the duplication and deletion of paragraphs to a production error that occurred in submitting the paper for print.

Another reader told the Alligator staff that students get sick of reading about Student Government. She thought the Alligator printed too many stories about corruption in Florida Blue Key and Student Government, past the point where students got the message.

Rachel Wyzan, executive vice president of Gators for Israel and a reporting student who covered the event for class, told the panel she found stories about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict to be ignorant of basic terminology.

Alligator editors responded that words were com-plex in describing the Middle East and that freelance writers, usually those new to writing, covered campus events, but Wyzan said their explanations were excuses and made it sound like they couldn't do anything to

Nevertheless, the forum was a positive gesture on the part of the staff, she said.

Cartoonist Andy Marlette also explained the controversial cartoon depicting UF basketball player Matt Walsh crying tears that read "choke." Some fans felt the cartoon betrayed the team, but he said his job was first as a cartoonist and second as a fan.

Man warns of lead

Marc Edwards stood in front of a crowd of about 50 people Friday and insisted that he wasn't crazy.

Edwards, a civil-engineering professor at Virginia Tech, spoke of his experiences in Washington D.C. trying to protect consumers from dangerous lead levels in drinking water.


"Disinfecting water has probably saved more lives than all the medical breakthroughs combined," he said.

However, when chlorine is added to rid the water of germs, it can produce carcinogens. Recently, the chemical chloramine, which is ammonia mixed with chlorine, has been added to public water to kill these carcinogens.

But the addition of chloramine can raise lead levels. In Washington D.C., lead amounts spiked after the D.C. Water and Sewer Authority began adding the chemical.


Edwards did tests in consumers' homes that showed lead content could be as high as 1,250 lead parts per billion. The Environmental Protection Agency stated a mere 40 ppb was enough to endanger children.

UF golf teams finish short in SEC Championships

STAFF REPORT

For the second consecutive year, the UF men's golf team entered the final round of the Southeastern Conference Championships with at least a share of the lead.

For the second consecutive year, the Gators saw that lead slip away.

UF stumbled on Sunday, shooting its highest round of the tournament, a 22-over 302, and slipped to fourth place, 13 shots behind tournament-winner Kentucky.

"It's disappointing when you don't perform well on the final day of a tournament, especially when it's the SEC Championships," UF Coach Buddy Alexander said. "It's definitely tough to take, but I told our team that

the day is ruined but the season isn't. There are still goals that this team can accomplish and we'll come back and work hard to give ourselves a chance of accomplishing them."

The No. 6 Gators entered third round play at the Seaside Course in Sea Island, Ga., with a five-shot lead over Auburn.

Juniors Brett Stegmaier and Matt Every placed in the top 10 for UF.

Finishing seven shots behind individual champion David Skinns of Tennessee, Stegmaier shot rounds of 75, 70 and 72 en route to a fourth place finish at 7-over.

UF next travels to Nashville for the NCAA Regionals beginning May 19.

WOMEN SIXTH: At least some good came out of a sixth-place finish at the Southeastern

Conference Championships for the UF women's golf team.

The three-round tournament marked the

return to form of freshman Whitney Myers, who followed an even-par 72 on Friday with successive 74's, good enough for a solo runner-up finish.

Myers earned the highest finish for a UF golfer this season and her first

Briles-Hinton top-10 since the opening

event of the fall. "Whitney played to win today and she did a fantastic job," Coach Jill Briles-Hinton said. "She didn't back down and just kept going at it. She put three solid rounds together and I am proud of her. Whitney was the leading

lady on our team with a cast that couldn't come through."

The cast of four freshmen and a senior took sixth in the 12-team tournament with a final tally of 911 (+47), seven shots behind SEC champion Auburn.

The team had a much better day today," Briles-Hinton said. "I am proud of them for hanging in there from start to finish. They played hard and it was very disappointing.

"We finished just seven strokes out of the playoff. The girls know we are better than what we played. We just couldn't play well. We shot a 304, 307 and 300. The way we started off wasn't good, but I am proud of the way they came back today.'

No. 11 UF will host the NCAA Regionals from May 5-7.

Although he's rated as the top recruit in the state of Florida, there's been some concern about Brumbaugh's attitude and if Donovan would be willing to sign a guy some consider a head case.

Telep said it should be a no-brainer.

"Brumbaugh is an immensely talented offensive basketball player," Telep said. "This is a guy who's 6-8 and can play on the perimeter. He [should fit into] the style of offense Florida wants to play. If he wants to come to Florida, they would have to take a long, hard look at him.

Telep also is high on incoming freshman Derwin Kitchen, a 6-foot-4 guard who he believes could receive the most playing time of any freshman next season.

"Kitchen's a combo guard that can play both positions for them. He's also a proven winner," Telep said. "He's a versatile a guy who can play both guard positions and defend both spots.'

different this year, all one needs to do is look at South Carolina's spring game attendance.



If Billy Donovan can't convince Anthony Roberson to stay at UF - and it's unlikely he will - the men's basketball coach did the next best thing.

Donovan signed a prospect who could be the next Roberson.

Walter Hodge, the Florida Gatorade State Player of the Year out of Florida Air Academy in Melbourne, doesn't have quite the same accolades of Roberson - a McDonald's High School All American – heading into UF, but the 6-foot guard's style of play sounds very similar to Roberson's.

"Hodge is a guy who is extremely fast baseline to baseline," said Scout.com recruit-ing analyst Dave Telep. "The guy will fire threes; he's not a pure point guard, but he's a

speed guy that can run your offense."
Hodge averaged 25.4 points, 5.4 steals and 4.2 assists as a senior.

In the Class 3A title game, Hodge scored 33 points, winning MVP of the state tourna-

"Walter adds speed, quickness and shooting to our backcourt," Donovan said. "He has the potential to be a very good defender and is coming out of a great high school program, so we're certainly excited

to have him join us. Despite the loss of senior David Lee and the likely departure of Roberson, UF could be loaded with young talent next season.

The potential battle between Hodge and soonto-be sophomore Taurean Green for the starting point

guard job should be extremely competitive. Green had a solid freshman season backing up Roberson. Unlike Hodge, Green is a true

point guard, looking to pass first. But if Hodge turns out to be as explosive as Donovan hopes, it may be tough to keep him on the bench for long.

After a disappointing season, the UF women's basketball team has a reason to celebrate.

Senior Tashia Morehead was selected by the Washington Mystics in the third round of the WNBA Draft on Saturday.

The 5-foot-11 forward will be joining a team that finished 17-17 in the WNBA Eastern Conference.

However, the Mystics took the eventual conference champion, Connecticut Sun, to a decisive third game in the playoff's first round.

Morehead is the first signee of Coach Carolyn Peck to be selected in the WNBA. Since 1997, a Gator has been selected in the WNBA Draft in every year except 2003.

Morehead, who began her college career at Panama City's Gulf Coast Community College, was surprised by her selection.

"I still can't believe it," she said. "It's been a dream to play professional basketball, and now, I'm one step closer to that becoming a reality. I'm numb, and it hasn't even sunk in that I was drafted. It didn't care which team picked me, I'm just so happy."

The Mystics already have two former Gators on the roster; forward DeLisha Milton-Jones and center Murriel Page. While connected to Morehead through alma mater, the two left UF in 1997 and 1998, respectively.

After winning the 2003 Junior College Championship with Gulf Coast, Morehead fit right in with UF. Scoring 12 points per game, and starting in every one, Morehead was key to UF's surprising 19-11 record and finish in the second round of the NCAA in 2004.

This season, Morehead was hampered by injuries from the start and did not regain her form until Southeastern Conference play. Starting with a heartbreaking loss to Tennessee at home on Feb. 2, Morehead scored in double figures in eight of the next nine games. She averaged 14.2 points during that

This season, Peck put Morehead on the back line in part to utilize Morehead's 34 percent three-point shooting. Morehead may find herself in the same situation in Washington, as the Mystics' lineup is stacked with players at least six feet tall. With the sixth overall pick, Washington selected guard Temeka Johnson from Louisiana

For 26 innings, the fifth-ranked UF baseball team (27-9, 10-5 Southeastern Conference) played like the best team in the SEC.

UF fell to No. 17 Alabama on Sunday 9-6 after leading 6-3 as the Gators entered the ninth inning, with pitchers Stephen Locke and Connor Falkenbach having held the Crimson Tide to just seven hits up to that point. UF closer Darren O'Day took the mound, having already recorded two saves on the weekend.

"It didn't look too good, I can't say that our dugout was sitting in there going 'It's just a matter of time,'" Alabama coach Jim Wells said. "We were pretty down and beat up."

Just as things looked bleak for Alabama (26-12, 9-6 SEC), first baseman Evan Bush hit a single. Wells then sent four consecutive pinch hitters to the plate.

After another single by senior Matt Grooms, Alabama freshman Matt Bentley leaned into a pitch to load the bases

"You have to give Alabama credit, they're an outstanding ballclub," McMahon said.
