



New policy hits UAA in pocket

■ **BANNING ALCOHOL ADS COSTS UAA \$200,000 A YEAR.**

A university policy prohibiting alcohol advertising during UF sports programming could cost the University Athletic Association \$200,000 in radio revenue during one year alone, said Martin Salamone, UAA director of marketing and promotions.

On Campus

Although the move "hits us in the pocket," the association believes in the message, he said.

"We don't need to be pushing alcohol," he said, adding that UF needs to "take a plunge" for the cause.

The policy is UF President Bernie Machen's latest step in a campaign to change the university's drinking culture.

Last week, he announced his plan to remove alcohol advertisements from all UF-owned programming.

Although the Clear Channel Gator Radio Network sold \$200,000 worth of alcohol radio commercials in the 2002-03 and 2003-04 academic years, this year only brought in \$10,000, Salamone said.

Furthermore, alcohol sponsors originally received four-minute commercial spots during UF football and basketball games. This year, the sponsors only got 10-second slots during the show "Gator Hotlines" and the commercials were not aired during games, Salamone said.

Academic bill suddenly reverses

TALLAHASSEE – A new report by Florida House staff states that, in a reversal from earlier analyses, students would not be able to sue their professors under the pending Academic Freedom Bill of Rights sponsored by Rep. Dennis Baxley of Ocala.

The report was commissioned by the House Education Council, which will meet today to take up the bill under the leadership of chairman Baxley.

"The bill does not create a statutory cause of action for students or faculty who feel their rights have been infringed," the report states.

A cause of action is a set of facts or allegations that make up the grounds for filing a lawsuit.

The new report, written by Education Council staff analyst Hyland Hunt, reflects recent statements by Baxley that the threat of lawsuits is overblown.

But it appears to contradict another report on the bill released just three weeks ago by the very same analyst.

In a report for the House Choice and Innovation Committee, which passed the bill March 22 along party lines, Hunt wrote the bill may shift responsibility for

balancing academic freedoms and deciding whether students' rights have been infringed from university faculty to the courts.

Moreover, Hunt wrote, students or faculty who feel their academic freedom rights have been infringed "may have legal recourse."

Hunt declined Monday to explain the discrepancy, citing House rules banning staff from speaking to the press.

Towson Fraser, spokesman for House Speaker Allan Bense, instead tried to explain.

"My understanding is that after the first analysis, people came to her and talked to her about problems they had, and she changed the analysis," he said. "As a bill gets discussed and goes through the process, the original analysis may need to be updated as new information comes to light."

Rep. Eleanor Sobel, D-Hollywood, an opponent of the bill, said that Baxley's influence as Council chairman may have caused Hunt to change the report.

"Baxley is chair of the council, so there might have been conversations," she said. "Baxley has said there's no cause of action, and she wrote what he wanted to hear."

Baxley could not be reached Monday for comment.

Musical styles mesh at Women's Music Festival

Mixing songs about sex, relationships and politics, three musical acts took the stage Monday at the

Orange & Brew, providing an eclectic mix of musical styles as part of Pride Awareness Month.

The event was an opportunity to socialize, showcase emerging artists and to "just enjoy the music and

enjoy a new type of music," PAM director Jason Freshly said.

Local band Redboy opened the show with a fusion of grunge rock, soul and funk, which included a violin and a gong.

Redboy's cover of "Let's Get it On," by Marvin Gaye, got people out of their seats and dancing.

Other songs, such as "In the Name of the Father," concerning the war in Iraq, delved deeper.

"We each have strong political views," Maria Carter said of her group's five members.

She said most of their songs either are about relationships or try to get a message across.

"What we're mostly trying to convey is passion," she said.

Citing other bands or events that prohibit men from attending, Carter said Redboy's goal was more inclusive.

"We come across as a 'girl-power' band, but that's not what we're about," she said.

In an interview before the show, Amy Steinberg, the evening's second performer, described her music as "theatrical love rock," calling it "an aural experience."

"I have an aural fixation," she joked.

She said she hoped the audience

would walk away with a sense of enlightenment after her performance.

"A lot of my stuff is spiritual but in a completely irreverent way," she said.

Her song "If I Was" described the different kinds of things she could be.

"This is the song that's sort of a metaphor for me," she told the crowd.

"If I was a punctuation mark, I'd be an exclamation point, and if I was a form of currency, I'd be a Benjamin Franklin," she sang.

Later, she encouraged the audience to join in.

"If I was a boot, I'd be steel-toed, and if I was a hue, I'd be indigo," she sang, to which the audience shouted "Girls!"

The event's last performer, Steph Taylor, used to live in Florida and perform in Gainesville.

"I give Gainesville my 'performing home' name," she said.

Though she now lives in Boston, she said she enjoyed coming back to Gainesville.

"There's good camaraderie among musicians here in Florida," she said.

Still no online vote

The online-voting bill will not be heard in the last Spring meeting of the Student Senate tonight.

Although all three parties in March's Student Government elections pledged to support the initiative, the issue may not arrive to the Senate floor until at least the Summer or Fall.

Newly-elected Senate President Diane Kassim said she will announce her agenda, which will include plans to work out an online-voting bill, at the first Summer Senate meeting May 10.

"My hope is to initiate a change of statutes," Kassim said, referring to the prohibition of online voting in the Student Body Statutes.

"I do see some type of online-voting committee in place before Fall," she added.

Kassim said plans to resume work on online voting were held until Summer to allow the Senate to stabilize after the March elections. "They

seem very eager — they're not letting anything slip under their noses," Kassim said.

Some of the students she will look to for assistance in writing the bill are former Student Sen. Andrew Hoffman and presidential adviser Andre Samuels, as well as some of the

newly-elected senators.

"I don't want it to get on the back burner," Kassim said. "I don't want this to become a partisan issue." Kassim worked on a Summer 2004 online-voting committee with Hoffman, who co-wrote legislation on the subject that was withdrawn after a March Senate Judiciary Committee meeting.

Some of the concerns brought up with Hoffman's bill were the definition of a polling location since computers would be used to cast ballots, as well as the possibility of voter fraud and voter coercion.

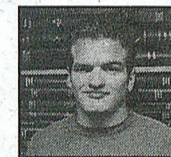

Text messaging service has a problem

Ramona Jones did not give you the whole story in her article on the possible presence of Short Message Service technology on campus. SMS technology, known as "text messaging," would allow university administrators and student leaders to send instant text messages to subscribed students. The key word here is that you must "subscribe" to this service; the university cannot automatically subscribe your cell phone.

The article leaves out a major pitfall to this service. This costly system would be provided for free to the university. The problem: Advertising will generate all revenue. Much like announcements on thefacebook.com, anyone wishing to advertise will be able to pay a fee to have the system advertise a message. That message then will be transmitted to your cell phone as a text message. If your phone plan limits or does not include incoming text messages, get out your wallets: You will be paying a text-message fee, charged by your service provider, for every message that comes in.

Let us not forget the frequency at which these messages may be

range from a few per week to several per day. Imagine, for a moment, the 680-seat Carleton Auditorium, which often is filled with cell-phone-carrying freshmen — freshmen and Greeks being the target populations for the pilot run. Now, imagine half of this classroom has subscribed to the SMS service. At noon, as the professor explains the intricacies of pre-calculus, over 300 cell phones simultaneously emit the latest Jessica Simpson or Usher text-message tone. Lo and behold, the lecture about sine curves has been interrupted by a text-message advertisement about where to buy the cheapest pizza tonight.

Furthermore, I would invite you to take a look at the Mobile Campus corporate Web site at mobilecampus.net. Yes, that naked, thirteen-line web page represents the company that wants to begin doing SMS business in the multi-billion-dollar economy that is the UF campus. This idea and this technology hold a great deal of positive potential for students. However, this particular

implementation, the fact that it is so blatantly tied to advertising revenue and the company that may be bringing that revenue in is of major concern to me and to several campus information-technology administrators.

Advertising could create a much-needed new source of revenue for the university, but what's the rush? The Interfraternity Council and the Board of College Councils already employ systems that use SMS technology that, while on a much smaller scale, do not use advertisements to support themselves. Additionally, USF recently implemented an advertising-supported SMS system. How are these groups using SMS? Has it been effective? We don't know — as of the April 7 meeting, no one had bothered to ask. Before any UF entity signs a contract with Mobile Campus or any other SMS provider, I would urge the UF administration and the next Student Government administration to examine which implementation and which provider will render the best service for the students at UF.

Local businesses work to diminish drunken driving

■ FROM TOWING COMPANIES TO "CAB CARDS," PARTIERS HAVE LOTS OF OPTIONS.

While new legislative measures seeking to curb hit-and-runs by drunk drivers make their way through the Florida Senate, some local businesses are already working to develop solutions to keep roads safe.

After a few drinks, UF student Natalia Hoogesteijn realized she was no longer enjoying herself at a party one night and left to get her car. Although parked only a few blocks from the house, by the time Hoogesteijn stumbled over to it, she knew she was too drunk to drive.

Though she returned to the party and slept on a sofa, many students either don't have that chance or would rather get home.

Aside from the Later Gator bus service and doling out cash for a cab, students and Gainesville residents have other options to protect both themselves and other drivers.

For the past six years, AAA Auto Club South and Budweiser have partnered to offer free towing for anyone who feels too inebriated to drive home safely by calling 1-800-AAA-HELP.

The "Tow to Go" program is conducted statewide during all major holidays or events, such as the Super Bowl.

The next date on the "Tow to Go" schedule is Cinco de Mayo, said Mandy Llanes, Southeast region manager of Consumer Awareness & Education, Anheuser-Busch Companies.

Llanes said people continually contact him to express their gratitude for the partnership's services.

"This is the most gratifying business that I've ever been in because you do see that you make a difference," Llanes said.

Several area towing companies, including Watson's Towing, Superior Towing and Freedom Towing, also offer discounted fees for people concerned with driving home impaired.

"We treat it as a situation where we can get the driver off the streets," said Gene Watson, owner of Watson's Towing.

For the most part, these offers have not been taken advantage of, and like many owners, Craig Cauthen of Freedom Towing can count the number of patrons on one hand.

Students are either using taxis or leaving their vehicles behind and having a friend pick them up, he said.

To make the former a more viable option, UF alumni Chet and Kris Justice invented the Cabeze Card.

Cabeze allows buyers to place \$25, \$50 or \$100 on a rechargeable card. Fare amounts as well as optional tips are deducted with a swipe, like a credit card.

Chet Justice said the idea for the company came in 2002 when he and his wife were celebrating her birthday. Kris Justice was pregnant with the couple's first child at the time, and they started talking about what they would do to keep him from driving drunk when he got older.

Justice suggested supplying money for a cab.

"She started joking — 'Yeah, the next round's on us' — and we thought it was interesting: What if you could give money to someone just for a taxi that they couldn't use for

anything else?" he said. "If they have a credit card, that's good and everything, but they can still buy booze."

Justice said he hopes to market the card to parents during UF's Preview, the orientation event for incoming freshmen.

"There's really nothing like it," Justice said. "It's a great product in that it's socially responsible."

Only the Gainesville Cab Company accepts Cabeze cards, but Chet Justice said he hopes to expand the business in the future.

Because the penalty for a hit-and-run is less than that for driving under the influence — 15 years compared to 30 years of potential prison time — many offenders flee to sober up before dealing with police.


State Rep. Larry Cretul, R-Ocala, is working to toughen that penalty by making leaving the scene of an accident involving a death a first-degree felony punishable by up to the same 30 years in prison as a DUI conviction.

"That really, when you begin to think about it, encourages someone to leave the scene of an accident involving a death," Cretul said of the current penalties.

The bill is scheduled for final hearing today in the State Infrastructure Council before consideration on the House floor.

Living investments replace dorms for some students

■ PARENTS OFTEN BUY CONDOS FOR THEIR KIDS INSTEAD OF FOOTING RENT.

The end of Spring represents a time of change for students. Seniors move out, freshmen wander in and nearly everyone else is trying to figure out which apartment complex offers the best perks.

Some incoming freshmen opt out of this stress-inducing search. Instead, parents invest in property to be sold upon graduation.

Tracey Kelley, a realtor at Bosshardt Realty Services, said she is approached by at least 40 families

each Fall wanting to buy property in Gainesville for their children.

"They're all starting to realize that real estate is a much safer investment, and they're utilizing that," Kelley said.

Kelley said most parents spend \$125,000 on average for a condominium. Families typically buy property on Southwest 34th Street, Southwest 20th Avenue or within walking distance from campus, she said.

"It's very affordable if you have a roommate," Kelley said, adding that the condos appreciate about 13 percent on average each year.

Sharon Blansett, assistant director of housing at UF, said the demand for dorm space hasn't changed much.

Costs of living on campus range from \$1,142 to \$2,760 per semester,

Blansett said. That includes utilities, cable TV, local phone and Internet.

"Our goal has always been for the supply of on-campus spaces to meet the demand," she said.

Blansett estimated 6,700 new students will attend UF in the Fall.

More than two-thirds, or 5,208 of 7,551 spaces on campus were reserved for freshmen.

Jennifer Taylor, 19, lives in a condo off campus her parents bought in 1999 when her sister was attending UF. Taylor said she would recommend buying property in Gainesville to other students.

"The profits from the condo have grown over the years, so the condo is worth a lot more now than it was when my parents bought it," Taylor said. "It worked

out as a really good investment for them in the long run to actually make money on the condo."

Blansett said she thinks it is important for students to live on campus during their first year at UF so they don't feel isolated.

"When you're right out of high school, I think you need a little bit more help connecting to the university," Blansett said.

Taylor said living off campus during freshman year isn't easy for everyone, but it is something she was able to overcome.

Yi Chiang, 18, is coming to UF in the Fall from Miami. Although he will probably live on campus his first year, Chiang's parents plan to buy property in Gainesville for him to live in sophomore year.

Chiang's parents are also consid-

ering buying property to rent out to other students as well.

"It's better than the stock market," Chiang said. "You're never going to lose money off of it. It's only going to go up, so why not?"

Chiang said about five of his friends are also looking at property in Gainesville to purchase.

Kelley said buying property provides a tax shelter because expenses can be written off as costs of management. The interest rates are also low right now, she said.

Besides financial benefits, Kelley said students who live in property owned by their parents have more independence and learn responsibility because they have to take care of the place where they live.

"There's absolutely zero downside," Kelley said. "You can't lose."

ELECTIONS 2005 City Commission runoff today

Today is the last chance for registered voters to cast a ballot for Gainesville's City Commission District 3 seat.

Residents of west and southwest Gainesville can vote at seven precinct locations from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. for either candidate Jack Donovan or incumbent Tony Domenech.

Precincts are determined by address, and the proper polling location is on the back of residents' voter-registration cards.

Both candidates have continued campaigning since the March 29 general election because no single candidate, then including UF student Mike Belle, got more than 50 percent of the vote.

Donovan is optimistic about his extra campaign efforts.

"The signs are good," he said. "We're all very hopeful and optimistic."

Domenech said he is happy to have many people he knows and loves on his campaign but has no idea what the outcome will be.

Domenech said he chose to stay away from negative campaigning.

"I'm really proud to say that my campaign and the people in my campaign have stayed away

The seven precincts of District 3 are heavily student-populated. The Gainesville City Commission decides on issues such as changing bar-closing hours and roam-tow rates.

Both candidates expect a better turnout this time.

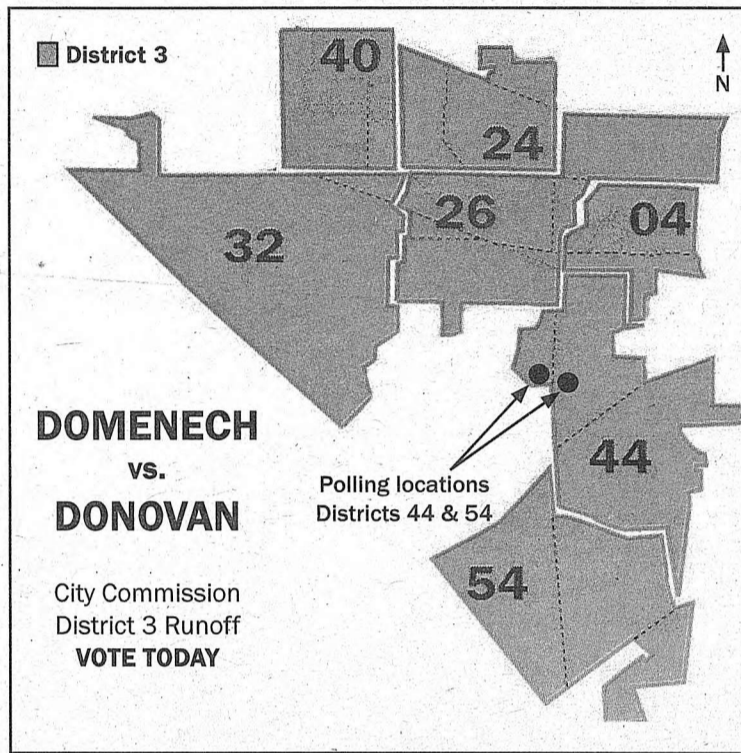
Donovan said he thinks there will be more supporters who will

Rim theft caught

A Gainesville man jumped a bandwagon by trying to steal tire rims Monday.

Harry James Garner Jr., of 4312 SE Fourth Ave., was caught in the act of removing the second wheel of a vehicle parked at Dave Mays Automotive, 2906 NE 19th Drive, when a Gainesville Police officer questioned his peculiar behavior, a GPD arrest report states.

"The theft of rims in Gainesville is becoming more and more popular," GPD spokesman Keith Kameg said.

The reports said Garner was unscrewing the lug nuts from a tire on a light blue 20-year-old Oldsmobile Cutlass.

When authorities asked Garner what he was doing, he said he had permission from the owner to take the rims and wheels off the vehicle, reports state.

However, GPD officer Sean Dhillon said he contacted the owner of the car, who said he never gave permission to remove the parts.

Kameg said the rims were not very expensive, estimating the cost to be less than \$300.

When Dhillon arrested Garner, he found a pair of black brass knuckles in his front right pocket, according to the report.

The report states that Garner said he was using the weapon as "just a belt buckle."

Kameg said his agency does not see brass knuckles as often as in previous years, which he said he is thankful for because they are a "very effective weapon."

Dhillon also located the missing rim in the trunk of Garner's girlfriend's Daewoo Nubina.

Garner was arrested on charges of theft and carrying a concealed weapon and taken to the Alachua County Jail about 3 a.m. Monday.

Most of the sponsors were beer companies, he said.

Mark McCauley, who runs the Gator Radio Network, refused to comment on the policy's effect on the network.

But Salamone said officials will find other sponsors to fill in the missing revenue.

"We all saw it coming," he said. "We just need to knock on different doors."

Officials have known that the cut was imminent since a Student Affairs committee recommended that UF join the Campaign for Alcohol-Free Sports TV during the previous academic year.

The coalition of more than 200 colleges pledges to break the connection between sports and alcohol.

But erasing alcohol commercials from TV sports programming may end up being much more complicated than prohibiting them from radio airwaves.

The coalition is pushing for the NCAA to try to pull alcoholic ads from TV sports games.

However, it's unclear what individual colleges can do to prevent networks from selling alcoholic advertising during college sports, said Lohse Beeland, director of student activities.

Joining the ongoing campaign is just the first step in a long process, she said.

Salamone agreed that the legal implications are complex. To better deal with that national issue, he said the College Football Association needs to get involved.

In the meantime, the UAA will continue to support the campaign effort, especially since UF can afford the loss, he said.

The campaign includes colleges with lesser-known teams, which are probably losing their main source of revenue.

UF is a football university with no such problem, Salamone said.

"We will make it happen," he said.

Students may, or may not, be able to sue under freedom bill, analyst concludes

In contrast to Hunt's new report, a Senate staff analysis of an identical bill in the Senate Education Committee warned last week that "the bill appears to create a cause of action for students to litigate against the public postsecondary education in which they are enrolled."

Moreover, the report said some provisions of the bill "invite student complaints" against their professors or universities.

Senate committee analyst Lowell Matthews, author of the document, said Monday he stood by his report.

Robert Jerry, dean of UF's Levin College of Law, said the legislation does not provide an expressed cause of action, a paragraph expressly stating a plaintiff's right to sue.

"But the question is whether there's an implied cause of action," Jerry said.

The Florida Supreme Court has ruled that the intent of the

Legislature should be the primary factor considered by courts on whether a cause of action exists.

But a cause of action may be "judicially inferred," and a debate over a cause of action can be enough for plaintiffs to file suit and let the courts decide, Jerry said.

"Certainly the possibility that this bill would create a cause of action couldn't be disregarded," he said. "All you need to do is file a complaint, and the worst that can happen is the court says no."

Rep. Dan Gelber, D-Miami Beach, said the bill on its face creates enforceable rights that must also create a cause of action.

"It says in the bill, 'a student has a right to expect...,'" he said. "Rights aren't vindicated by themselves, and they're not spontaneously enforced. If you create these rights in the university system, they're going to be enforced by somebody."

Gelber, a trained attorney who sits on the Choice and Innovation Committee, said it was clear that lawsuits and the courts would fill that role. He cited a report by the Department of Education recommending \$4.2 million be spent to hire a new

lawyer for each of Florida's universities and community colleges if the bill was passed.

"I can't believe the legislature is going to seriously consider the bill," Gelber said. "If it wasn't so dangerous, it would be wacky."

The bill bans professors from introducing "controversial matter" into the classroom or introducing coursework serving "no legitimate pedagogical purpose."

The bill also mandates making students aware of all "serious scholarly viewpoints."

The bill defines neither "controversial matter" nor "serious scholarly viewpoints."

If the Education Council passes the bill, it could go to the House floor. An identical bill is pending before the Senate Education Committee.

"This is a marketplace of ideas, and sometimes even the nuttiest ideas can attract attention," Gelber said. "Sometimes the nuttiest ideas attract the most attention."

Fraternity receives probation for hazing

■ THE SENTENCE WILL LAST TWO YEARS.

Kappa Alpha Fraternity was placed on probation for hazing charges Monday evening.

Fraternity President Daniel Boda was apologetic to the Greek Judicial Board, which made the ruling, for Kappa Alpha brothers' and pledges' actions March 18, when members stole a number of signs from Gainesville businesses.

"These actions not only affect our status, but it also affects the lives of everyone at the University of Florida," Boda said.

The fraternity will remain on probation for two years, until Spring 2006.

Three Kappa Alpha pledges were found with several large signs in the back of a gray pickup truck on Fraternity Row, according to a report from the University Police Department.

"They had been instructed by the fraternity to go and steal signs for the hurricane party" on the evening of March 18, the report states.

Boda, who said he was not present the night of the incident, admitted that fraternity brothers did order the pledges to steal the signs.

"The brothers involved were younger guys ... and they undermined my authority and took matters into their own hands," he said.

Eleven signs were found at the house, totaling \$545 in damages, according to the report. The signs

were to be decorations for the fraternity's hurricane-themed party, which took place March 19.

As a result of the actions, apologies were issued to the businesses affected and the guilty members were punished within the fraternity, Boda said.

The brothers involved are suspended from all chapter activities for three months, will participate in a service project at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church next Fall and, along with the guilty pledges, will serve 30 community-service hours each at the Reichert House, a Gainesville after-school program for troubled teens.

The pledges also are under social suspension for the Fall semester and already completed a community-service project at Holy Trinity.

Boda suggested assembling an anti-hazing seminar for both Kappa Alpha and the Interfraternity. Council to the Greek Judicial Board, a subject that Boda said he had already spoken about with IFC President John Dicks and Administrative Vice President Jeremy Martin.

The Greek Judicial Board accepted Boda's suggestion, and, as part of the fraternity's punishment, 90 percent of Kappa Alpha members will be required to attend.

"This has been a huge, huge wake-up call for us," Boda said.

Faculty add to nature encyclopedia

The tempestuous relationships between man, his environment and his religious beliefs have been compacted and catalogued by a UF professor.

Religion associate professor Bron Taylor spent seven years working on *The Encyclopedia of Religion and Nature*, and the product will be released next month.

In over 1,000 entries spanning two volumes and including 520 contributors, Taylor sought to divine the connections between human beliefs and their subsequent effect on the environment, or vice versa.

"It is accessible, it's not jargon-filled and it gets you quickly to the main features," he said. "Very few people had looked at the possible impact of natural environments on human consciousness in general and religion in particular."

Taylor cited the religious context different cultures have put on volcanoes and eruptions as an link, or the ancient Temple at Delphi and whether the gases from the cave were responsible for the seer's trance.

But he said most of his research focused on more mainstream faiths.

"We spend a good deal of time in what are considered the world's largest religions," Taylor said.

However, the encyclopedia does address less common religions, both ancient pagan forms and recent movements, such as the nature-revering 11th Commandment Fellowship.

There are even entries on subjects that may not be considered strictly religious, Taylor said.

He explained that for some people, surfing is not only a hobby but a form of nature worship and can lead to activism in environmental movements to save the oceans.

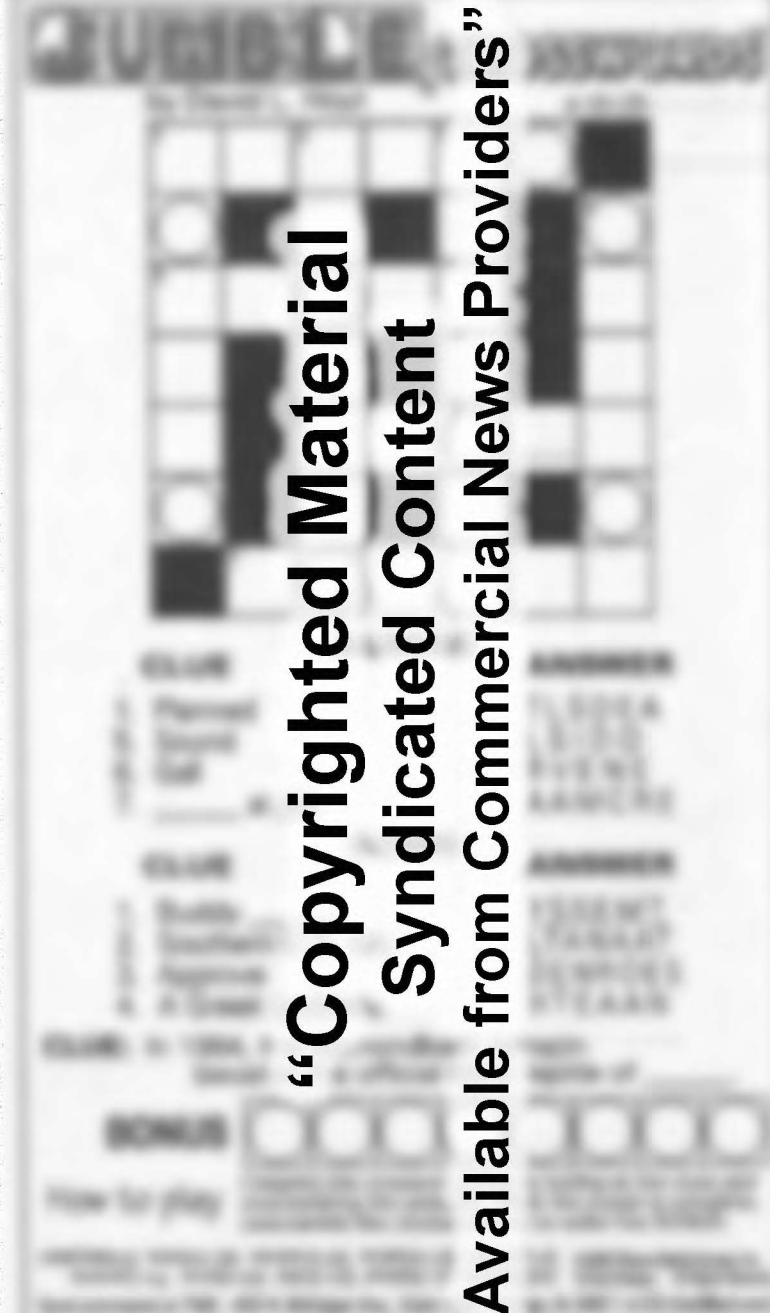





Gators shake off aches, pains of gymnastics world

There was a snap, a twist and an intense pained look as a body fell to the ground.

For the No. 7 UF gymnastics team, the sight was one that the Gators have witnessed many more times than they would have liked throughout the course of the season.

But in a sport that is well known for its high rate of injury, playing in pain is part of the game.

"Injuries are a part of gymnastics," co-captain Samantha Lutz said. "We deal with them all the time, so we have confidence in our teammates, and we put the work and training in all year long, so right now we're kind of relying on that."

Lutz is just one of several members of UF's team who have logged countless hours in the training room during the past weeks and months. She hyperextended her back during a floor-exercise routine in practice two weeks ago.

"I've been doing a lot of treatment, a lot of therapy, stretching, rehab, everything," Lutz said. "It's still sore, but it's getting better."

In addition to Lutz, fellow captain Erinn Dooley has spent the entire season battling a stress fracture in her left foot, Orley Szmuch re-injured the ankle that she spent the entire off-season rehabilitating, and Tracey Rai has had to deal with shin splints. Nicola Willis competed in just two exhibition performances before undergoing season-ending surgery to repair a torn rotator cuff that had plagued her since before the season began, and Savannah Evans sprained her ankle during her floor-exercise routine during the NCAA Regional competition.

Fortunately for the Gators and Southeast

Region Coach of the Year Rhonda Faehn, the majority of those injuries are just like Lutz's back: getting better.

And with the NCAA championships set to begin Thursday, the Gators could not be healing at a better time.

"We're definitely doing much better," Faehn said. "[Evans] is ready to go. She'll be competing floor and vault for us, which we're really happy about. And then [Szmuch] will be doing floor for us, so she'll be doing all-around, so we're really excited about that. And [Lutz] should be back in on beam, which is a big plus."

MORE FROM MOREHEAD: Two days after what may have been the biggest moment of her life, Tashia Morehead was still smiling.

The UF women's basketball team's most valuable player this season was selected by the Washington Mystics in the third round of the WNBA Draft on Saturday.

In comments Monday, the 5-foot-11 forward says she has been "overwhelmed" by the developments of the past few days.

"You can't say any words about it," Morehead said. "It's a great feeling to know that the hard work and determination that you had, and the sacrifices I have taken in basketball, that somebody recognizes my talent."

At home in her native Panama City on Saturday, Morehead's grandmother was supposed to order NBATV, which carried the draft. After that didn't work out, fellow senior Tamia Williams broke the news by sending a text message congratulating Morehead.

Morehead was humble despite the selection, saying, "My family was more excited than I was." While family members were

"jumping off the walls," she knows there is more work to be done.

"I have to remind myself, in the back of my mind," she said. "OK, I got drafted, but now I got my foot in the door. It's up to me to make the team."

Next up for Morehead will be the WNBA's rookie orientation beginning April 21.

A Higher Power?

More than ever, sports, religion mixing together

Each weekend, you attend. You and thousands of other people pick out similar clothes and don't think twice about it. When you enter the doors and cross into that open space, you suddenly feel a sense of pride.

You chant and speak in phrases that you only remember for this once-a-week event. Around you, there may be different races or different political philosophies, but for these moments, you are all one.

For some, this describes their place of worship. For others, it is a stadium. But many of us hear this and realize it is an accurate description of both.

The two grand things that unite Americans are sports and religion. Through the course of time, these two parts of American culture have come closer together, for better or worse.

Does God Care?

In recent years, it's been hard to watch a sporting event without religion being seen. There are the running backs who drop to a knee in the end zone, thanking God for a touchdown. Even boxers, fresh off of knocking someone out cold, thank the Lord for helping them to a win.

But does God care who wins or loses?

The Rev. Tim Lozier is an associate pastor at St. Augustine Catholic Church. As someone who attends about 100 UF athletic events each year, Lozier sees the good traits that a sport teaches us.

As for God caring if one team wins or loses, Lozier has his doubts.

"I think God cares that we do our best, that we do everything for God's glory," he said. "And God gave us talents, and we should develop those talents."

This concept is not exclusive to Catholics or Christians. Rabbi Jonathan Siger at UF's Hillel says people of the Jewish faith have the same feelings.

"The Jewish approach to God is that God gives individuals strength to excel in whatever they do," Siger said. "But it's not a very Jewish view of God to think that He's really concerned with which team is going to win."

Some may believe praying for a victory would help. But Lozier believes "we're all God's children," and people aren't necessarily praying for a particular team's victory.

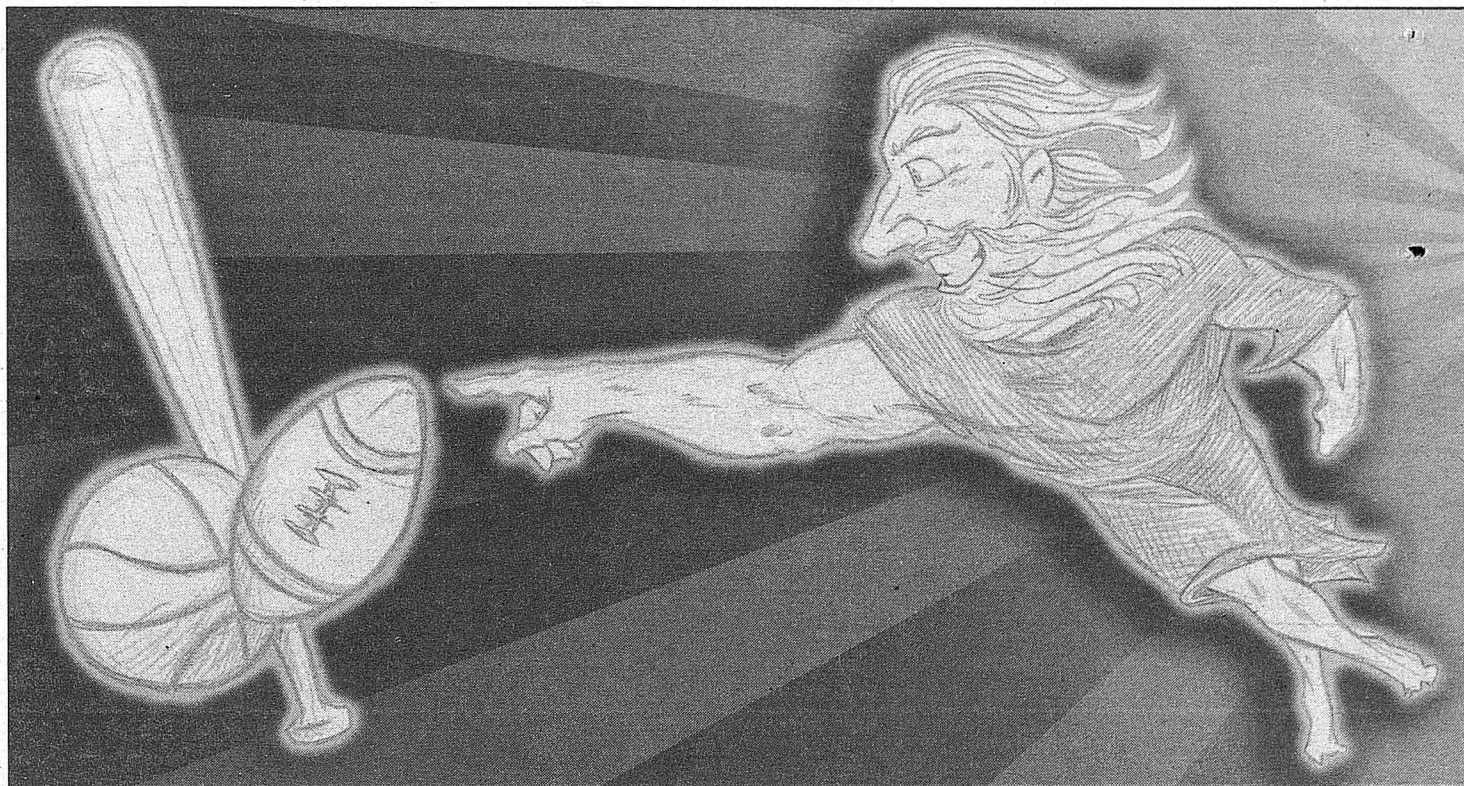
"You're praying for the other team to lose," he said. "Why is that any better an outcome in the grand scheme of things?"

Faith on the Field

Probably the first athlete to merge religion with sports was Muhammad Ali. No athlete before or since has made his faith such a large part of his public persona.

At the time of his conversion to Islam in 1964, Ali was the world heavyweight champion. Yet as Ali has become one of the most beloved men of all time, his religion is often misunderstood.

It is for that reason that Mikal Rasheed, president of Islam on Campus, says Muslim athletes have a special responsibility to



"model the best that our faith and this country has to offer."

Rasheed says athletics is a good way to promote not just Islam, but all faiths.

"When Muslims exemplify the tenets of our faith by observing religious practices," Rasheed said, "there is no limit to what they can achieve for the Muslim community or their sport. I think that being a role model in society is important and should be a goal of all athletes, which is why I commend all athletes that maintain their convictions in their religion, whichever religion it may be."

While she may be a far cry from Muhammad Ali, junior tennis player Jennifer Magley has never been shy about her faith.

A non-denominational Christian, Magley says she accepted Christ when she was six and her faith has grown since then. Her faith helps keep things in perspective, and while she may credit God for a good performance, God isn't the one playing.

Magley thinks that when an athlete with a deep sense of faith matches up with one who doesn't have one, the outcome isn't determined by who loves God more. But Magley says she would be better off anyway.

"I think I would have an advantage in the sense that, when the match is over, regardless of the result, I'll have peace and I'll have joy," she said.

Another athlete with a different faith is gymnast Orley Szmuch. After she completes her UF career in this month's NCAA championships, Szmuch will compete in the Maccabiah Games in Israel. The games are open to athletes of Jewish descent and are aimed to promote the Jewish faith and athletics.

Religion has provided Szmuch with the

talents to be a successful gymnast, but the final result is her doing.

"I feel very blessed to be given this upbringing from my parents and be given a healthy body to compete in a very difficult sport," she said. "The successes and all my failures, I think, come from all the hard work ... When I mess up, it's me messing up. And when I do well it's because I worked hard and put in a lot of time and effort and put it all together."

Coaches and the Man Upstairs

While athletes and religious experts say God can apply to sports, the merger isn't perfect. It may not even be acceptable.

The secular view of religion and sports revolves around this: If sports are to accurately represent America, they cannot favor one religion over another. In fact, they cannot favor any religion.

While it may be impossible to separate

a person's faith from his or her daily actions, that is exactly what is asked of many coaches around the country.

Unless they work for a private school, coaches represent

not only a public

institution, but a state that has no designated religion.

So when Urban Meyer gathers his team before their first game, is it wrong of him to lead them in "The Lord's Prayer"?

The former president of the Atheist and Agnostic Students Association, Ben Galecki, says "it's no one's place to prevent someone from displaying their belief system," like the player who prays after a touchdown. But a coach leading a team in a prayer is a different story.

"Then it becomes coercive to anyone who happens to be on the team that isn't a part of that religion," Galecki said. "And unless it's

a religious school, there's no requirement to be a certain religion to be there."

Siger says there is nothing wrong with a coach's spirituality, but having a Christian-oriented prayer can divide a team.

"The issue is more of sensitivity," he said. "In that, if you're not of that particular faith or denomination, then it feels exclusive."

The rabbi said he'd prefer prayer over no prayer, but a way to work around the problem or exclusion would be to cite scripture that can apply to all faiths.

Coaches seem to be aware of the fact that their beliefs can bother some players. Instead, they say things like 'I believe things happen for a reason' in response to a recent event that has shaken the team. But even this can become an issue.

"I don't know if things always happen for a reason," said Lozier. "To say that God always directly willed that adversity is very problematic, if you start thinking that God willed you to be a paraplegic to make you a better person. But could God use that paraplegia to make you a better person? Absolutely."

Sports and Religion — Hand-in-hand

Even with the criticism of religion in today's society, the three religious experts agree that faith is an important part of an athlete's life. Does faith make a difference on the playing field? Only God knows.

With Christianity and Islam spreading through the Southern Hemisphere, and as Jewish leaders continue to seek new ways of outreach and revitalization, religion and faith will only become a bigger part of our society. And as more children are introduced to sports, it will only grow.

However, this merger of athletics and faith may have already occurred.

"What is so great about athletics in general or sports is that, in many ways, it does the same work that religions do. I think that's why there is a certain compatibility," said Siger. "The fact of the matter is the hard work and the teamwork and the constant struggle for self-improvement is very similar to what most religious traditions teach. So they're not mutually exclusive by any stretch of the imagination."

Tallahassee native hungers for revenge at FSU

■ DICKEY EXPECTS TO SEE A LOT OF FAMILIAR FACES.

A first-place position in the Southeastern Conference and a promotion in the polls are enough to make any baseball player relaxed and happy.

That was the mood of Coach Pat McMahon's No. 5 Gators team as it practiced for tonight's game in Tallahassee against Florida State.

None of the players seemed to remember a stunning last-inning loss to Alabama on Sunday.

"We discussed what happened [Sunday], how we can improve and get better in completing games and doing the best we can," McMahon said. "We did not give away Sunday's game. They hit to win the game. There's a big, big difference."

The Gators led 6-3 in the top of the ninth inning on Sunday, but lost 9-6 after winning the first two games of the series.

"We don't like the outcome. The outcome is unacceptable, but our players' effort and everything that we did was exactly what we want to do," McMahon said.

The ninth-ranked Seminoles were swept during the weekend while playing an Atlantic Coast Conference series at Georgia Tech.

Tallahassee native and UF left

fielder Gavin Dickey said both teams will have extra motivation.

"It's going to make for a good game," Dickey said. "Both teams are hungry. I'm sure the fans are going to get on us."

Some fans will again comprise a

Dickey cheering section, as they did in the Gators' 9-2 win in Tallahassee on March 30.

"I had about 15-20 family members that came to the game," Dickey said. "It's good to go back. There's nothing like playing at home, but

it's good to go see some friends and family I might not see too often."

Each team will start a right-handed pitcher who doesn't even have his own page in the teams' media guides.

For UF, freshman Tommy Wynn

(0-0, 4.66 ERA) will make his second start of the season. FSU will send sophomore transfer Bryan Henry (2-2, 1.80 ERA) to make his third start of the season.

Henry has allowed only five earned runs in 25.0 innings, including three home runs, while Wynn has pitched 9.2 innings in six games.

McMahon has advised Wynn on how he might become the second UF freshman to defeat the Seminoles this season.

Stephen Locke pitched 5.2 innings without allowing an earned run in the first meeting of the season.

"Tommy needs to do what he does well; he's a different type pitcher than Stephen," McMahon said. "Tommy Wynn will compete, I'll tell you that."

The game will be broadcast on SUN Sports, pitting the in-state rivals against each other for the second time in three weeks.

"I always appreciate the publicity of television because it gives all of our Gators fans an opportunity to watch our team play," McMahon said. "We play with class and we play hard, regardless of the score, so it's a wonderful thing for our players to be seen on television."

The rivalry between the teams has been even during recent years, with the two teams splitting the last 12 meetings. UF is 4-1 in the last five games between the schools.

Machen: No more tackle football, cheering, orange, blue or Gators
