Catholics weigh pick

The quick election of Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger as the new pope Tuesday surprised some local Catholics, who insist the cardinals' confidence overshadows Ratzinger's reputation as a conservative and strict leader.

The Papal Conclave chose Ratzinger in four ballots and two days, one of the shortest elections in 100 years.

"If so many of the cardinals chose him so quickly, no doubt they have confidence in him," said Larry Lataif, co-coordinator of the UF Catholic Student Fellowship.

Ratzinger named himself Pope Benedict XVI, conjuring up the last pope named Benedict, who worked to close the gap between traditionalists and modernists.

The new pope, however, has pledged to enforce strict conservative policies.

Ratzinger's humble side will come out during his papacy, said the Rev. Tim Lindenfesler of the Diocese of Saint Augustine, the organization that presides over many Florida Catholic churches, four of which are in Gainesville.

"There is this reputation he has of being strict and domineering and that stereotypical German, but if you meet him in person, he is very soft-spoken and humble," he said. "He really does listen."

Lindenfesler added that he has never met

Donovan upsets in city runoff

Local hospice chaplain Jack Donovan defeated incumbent Tony Domenech in the runoff election for the District 3 Gainesville City Commission seat by a margin of 88 votes Tuesday night.



Domenech

"First, we have a lot of work to do, and we have a wonderful opportunity with this city," Donovan said. "And second, the party is up the street at The Top."

The whoops, squawks and hugs of Donovan and his team filled the Supervisor of Elections Office when the numbers were announced — 51.68 percent for Donovan and 48.32 for Domenech, who actually won the previous election by 4.15 percent.

Lex & Terry morning show pulled from UF

■ EARLIER, UF DECIDED TO HALT THE AIRING OF "DRUNK BITCH FRIDAY."

Rock 104 may be digging a grave for mornings with Lex and Terry sooner than expected.

In just a few days, the entire show, not just "Drunk Bitch Friday," the most popular morning radio segment in the Gainesville area, will be taken off the air even though the segment was

not found to violate Federal Communications Commission standards of decency.

However, Syndication Director for Cox Radio Peter Welpton said FCC regulations were never the problem.

On Campus "This isn't an issue of FCC law. This is an issue with the president," Welpton said of UF President Bernie Machen. "At some point, we are going to be forced to hold the station in breach of contract and be forced to remove the show from the radio station. We're talking about a matter of days. Not just Friday's segment — we are removing the show."

WRUF came in breach of its syndication contract with Cox Radio when it stopped airing "Drunk Bitch Friday" earlier this month because selective airing of shows is not allowed. Selective cancellation of show segments also sets a troublesome precedent of censorship, so Cox cancelled the entire show.

Lex Staley and Terry Jaymes told the Alligator they both disagreed with UF administration's decision to cancel the "Drunk Bitch Friday" segment about two weeks ago.

Lex said it violates the First Amendment.



Old plan new again for 24th

■ THE COUNTY COMMISSION CHANGED ITS MIND AFTER IT DID NOT RECEIVE A PLEDGE OF ANOTHER \$1.3 MILLION.

When Clark Butler went back on his word, so did the Alachua County Commission.

The Commission decided Tuesday to revert to its original plans to create a two-lane Southwest 24th Avenue running west of 34th Street.

The step was taken just days after the developer refused to cough up \$1.3 million extra to make 24th Avenue a four-lane thoroughfare.

Butler previously committed \$4.7 million to the road's expansion, to preserve his interest in extending his Butler Plaza shopping complex north.

Representing Butler at the meeting was Robert Reller, the company's director of development.

"On [December] 14, your commission voted to four-lane the road," Reller said.

Butler then agreed to pay the \$4.7 million difference to build the four-lane road, Reller said.

However, costs have increased to an undetermined amount since then, and Butler never had a chance to sign a formal agreement.

"Mr. Butler is not interested in paying an open-ended agreement at \$6 million or more," Reller said.

Commissioner Rodney Long felt Butler "walked away" from the plan.

"There was an agreement on the table that gave you a four-lane road," Long said. "This deal could have been done two years ago."

The commission had before them three proposals at the meeting from which to choose:

In the first plan, a two-lane road would be built from Southwest 34th Street to Southwest 43rd Street.

A second option before the Commission for the same stretch of street, as presented by County Manager Randall Reid, consisted of developing the road with four lanes anyway. The third was to construct a two-lane road with enough space in the median to expand to four lanes if the money was provided in the future.

Butler proposed the four-lane road in order to

support future development, such as shopping centers akin to his massive Butler Plaza complex.

Reid recommended going forward with the two-lane road unless Butler committed to paying the difference within 30 days.

"I don't think even the primary developer wishes to have a delay on the project," Reid said.

Also, the four-lane right-of-way would have to be acquired within a 60-day period to be able to proceed.

But representatives with the county's Public Works said the project has already hit numerous delays in land acquisition and negotiations for a four-lane road.

"It's probably going to cost more as we go through the process of condemning the property," County Attorney David Wagner said.

If the primary developer were to pay the difference, there could be an agreement, Reid said.

"We currently have approved in our documents a two-lane road," he said.

But even after Reller presented Butler's position of not paying the \$6 million, Long continued to push the idea of giving Butler and extra 30 days to make a final decision.

"It makes sense for us not to take any action, period," Long said. "We need to wait."

Reller reinforced the fact that Butler would not be swayed in his final decision.

"It's been decided," Reller said.

There is no reason to wait extra time and let the costs for any future road escalate, he said.


Commission Chairwoman Cynthia Chestnut also suggested deferring any decision until Butler Enterprises filed impact forms outlining the company's future plans.

Chestnut said she did not see Southwest 24th Avenue as a Top 10 priority among road rehabilitation or construction projects in Gainesville.

But Commissioners Lee Pinkoson and Paula DeLaney saw a final decision for Southwest 24th Avenue to be necessary at this meeting.

The board should not pass up the chance to connect Newberry Road and Archer Road, Pinkoson said.

"We know that there's an existing traffic problem," he said.

Alcohol vendors push for preparation, not prohibition

As UF President Bernie Machen continues to spearhead the UF effort to curtail alcohol abuse by students, local beer distributors are expressing a desire to have a say.

Machen's community alcohol coalition now consists of UF faculty, administrators, students, elected officials, local law enforcement and health experts.

And though representatives from Budweiser said they have spoken with the Office of Student Affairs, they have yet to see much headway from their meeting, said Dan Burkhardt, vice president of Burkhardt Sales & Services, the local wholesaler of Anheuser-Busch products.

"It's really a one-sided coalition — it's not a broad spectrum," he said. "Here we are in the beer industry, and we have no say in what's going on."

Machen has attempted to discourage alcohol abuse by limit-


ing student exposure to alcohol advertising on campus, starting by banning Coors Light advertisements at the Rascal Flatts concert in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Burkhardt suggested that representatives from the alcohol industry, as well as local establishments that sell alcohol, work together with the coalition to promote responsible drinking habits among students.

But Vice President of the Beer Industry of Florida Armando Sanchez-Aballi said the industry is on track to accomplish just that.

In 2001, the Florida Alcohol and Hospitality Coalition was created as a partnership between alcohol vendors to combat alcohol abuse.

Earlier this month, the coalition met with Machen while he was in Tallahassee for Gator Day to discuss a potential collaboration of efforts. During the meeting, the coalition pledged to offer Machen support with off-campus issues by providing resources and experience, Sanchez-Aballi said.


Speaking as part of Pride Awareness Month, two MTV reality show cast members "dropped some knowledge" on about 70 students Tuesday regarding their experiences with the auditions, the shows and coming out to friends and family.

Karamo from "Real World: Philadelphia" and Sophia from "Road Rules 10" and "Battle of the Sexes 2" gave tips for those interested in attending the upcoming Gainesville audition for "Real World." Sophia explained that an open casting call provides a better opportunity to display oneself.

Both revealed they were asked to stay after a group interview because there was a supposed problem with their written applications, at which point they were informed they had been advanced to the next round.

Though Sophia was happy each time she was moved forward, she said the interviews were often stressful and delved into personal issues.

"At the end of the interviews, I'm like, 'I hate my mom! My life is over!'" she said,

laughing.

The pairs also talked about what they learned from their experiences on the shows.

"We're gonna drop some knowledge on y'all; can you handle it?" Sophia asked.

She said she recently was asked whether

minorities are on the show just to educate other people. In reality, she learned as much from the white cast-mates as they learned from her, she said.

In response to a question about whether the shows address social issues or just promote stereotypes, Karamo said he felt they

provided an opportunity to learn about others.

"I have a personal belief that in 30 years, people should study the 'Real World,'" he said.

The duo also talked about more light-hearted aspects of the shows, such as "the line," a rule which states cast members cannot interact with the camera crew.

"It'd be a game to try to get them to talk to you," Sophia said.

Asked if she would have done anything differently, she joked, "I think I would have done my hair more."

Both also talked about coming out to their families and friends.

Coming out to her father, Sophia said she was worried because her mother had her convinced that her father would have a heart-attack if he found out she was a lesbian.

"I had pre-punched '911' on my cell phone, and I had mentally located the (Bayer's aspirin) in the house," she said.

In an interview after the show, Sophia said people usually want to hear about the show experiences, but after will talk more about their message.

"That's how I measure if it's successful or not, by the kinds of questions they ask," she said.

The event was hosted by the Pride Student Union and the Hispanic Student Association.



Celebrate Earth Day by calling for UF dining facility reform

This Friday is Earth Day, which is a time in which we examine our impact on the planet and make personal resolutions to make the environment cleaner and improve the treatment of animals. Some of us vow to be more consistent recyclers, others pledge to plant trees in their neighborhoods. What many of us have yet to discover is that one of the most important actions we can take for the planet has to do with our food choices.

Most animals raised for food are forced to live in massive industrial warehouses. These animal factories are leading polluters of our rivers, lakes and streams. The Environmental Protection Agency

reports that hog, chicken and cattle waste has polluted 35,000 miles of rivers in 22 states and contaminated groundwater in 17 states. In fact, 2.7 trillion pounds of manure are generated by livestock operations each year. This huge amount of waste is often concentrated around each farm, causing nearby residents to suffer from the nauseating stench emanating from the air and waterways.

Animals are by far the biggest losers in the growing epidemic of industrial farms. Most egg-laying hens are restricted to overcrowded cages too tiny for them to spread their wings. They're often starved for up to two weeks to shock their bodies into another egg-laying

Josh Balk cycle. **Speaking Out** These birds are never able to partake in natural behavior, breathe fresh air or even go outside.

Those chickens raised for meat are selectively bred and given loads of antibiotics to reach market weight as quickly as possible. This process takes only 45 days, nearly twice as fast as it did in the 1950s. Forced rapid growth is responsible for an immense amount of suffering, including heart problems and painful leg disorders. These chickens, like their egg-laying counterparts, never escape the stench of their own feces, nor do they step foot outside.

Pigs are also intensively confined in factory farms. Both pregnant and mother pigs are held in crates too narrow for them to turn around or move to change direction, while their piglets have their tails cut off and are castrated, both without painkillers.

Right here at UF, students can help animals raised for food by urging dining services not only to offer more vegetarian meals, but to stop purchasing the most abusive animal products.

Though this might seem daunting, UF will not be alone in this effort. With the help of The Humane Society of the United States, students are working to reform their dining facilities at more than

80 universities, including Yale, Arizona State and Cornell. And, their efforts are already succeeding: Just this month, students at George Washington University persuaded their school store to stop carrying eggs from caged birds. UF should and can be the next university to make this far-reaching commitment to help laying hens.

Such reforms at university dining facilities would go a long way toward phasing out the most egregious practices of abuse in animal agribusiness. It's hard to imagine a better way to celebrate Earth Day.

Japan's acts insult Americans, Chinese

I read Jason Levitt's Wednesday column concerning relations between China and Japan and want to express my full support. He did a good job of educating us as to why the Chinese are angry about Japan's bid for a permanent seat on the U.N. Security Council.

There's one thing I want to add: Another reason for the anger among the Chinese is that, almost every year since 1985, Japanese prime ministers visit the Yasukuni Shrine in Tokyo. Seventeen war criminals — including Admiral Isoroku Yamamoto, chief commander of the sneak attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941 — are honored in that shrine. Can you imagine if Adolf Hitler, Herman Goring and Heinrich Himmler were enshrined in a German temple,

and if German chancellors showed official respect to that temple every year?

Current Japanese Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi conducted the last visit to the shrine in 2004. This was an insult to the 2,403 American soldiers killed in Pearl Harbor; an insult to the more than 10 million Chinese killed by Japanese troops during World War II; an insult to my grandfather, a World War II veteran; and an insult to my uncle, who was killed by Japanese bombs at the age of one.

I hope this helps further explain the flames of rage in China against the Japanese government's actions.


hoarse, standing up during the whole game and going nuts after every Gators touchdown. That sounds like a M.O.B. to me.

Florida Blue Key elects non-Greeks in rare move

■ THE GREEK-CONNECTED PRESIDENT WAS RE-ELECTED.

Three non-Greek executive officers have been elected to run Florida Blue Key for what some say may be the first time in UF history. FBK, a leadership honorary that

runs Gator Growl and Homecoming, inducted the recently elected independent vice president, secretary and treasurer this weekend to serve for the Fall 2005 semester — a move that is catching attention from critics who perceived the organization as exclusive to the Greek and Student Government elite.

"It shows everyone that our organization has made significant changes in the last decade or so and it has been more inclusive," FBK President

Brian Roof said. "And we aren't looking for a certain type of person. What we're looking for are leaders."

In a 1998 case in which FBK was found liable of conspiracy to defame and defamation, former Student Body presidential candidate Charles Grapski proved the organization was a political machine working within the Greek-backed SG system.

It is not uncommon for a non-Greek student to hold an FBK office or other high-ranking position. But

Roof said since he became a member in 1999, he has not heard of three non-Greeks being elected at once, adding that it could be the first time in FBK history of non-Greek leadership taking the reigns.

The new officials are Vice President Chris Carmody, Secretary Cecily McLeod and Treasurer Lauren Fackender.

Roof is a Greek alumnus and a UF law student, but his re-election was noteworthy as well, since it is

extremely rare, he said.

"I think it shows members are looking to see (Florida) Blue Key continue to change and to be open and diverse," Roof said.

There are numerous ways to become involved with FBK, Roof said, but the biggest ways to participate are through Homecoming and Gator Growl. Applications for the two events are still being accepted and can be picked up in the Reitz Union FBK office.

IFAS helps create searchable database for pesticides

The UF Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences has partnered with a California company to update information on pesticides.

Crop Data Management Systems Inc. of Marysville, Calif., has put together ChemSearch, a searchable database for more than 1,600 pesticide products. It also gives instructions on how to use the chemicals and precautions workers should take.

Norm Leppla, director of IFAS' Integrated Pest Management division, and his colleague, Daniel Sonke, associate director of IPM, formed the business partnership, Leppla said.

"We're the first one to put together any

large-scale test," Leppla said.

The system operates through UF extension faculty who work with the state's growers and ranchers to help clients pinpoint the best pesticides and herbicides for their products.

In return, CDMS gets feedback from these growers and faculty on what works and what information is missing.

"The purpose of this is to get a large-scale test of the project and feed back to the company

what we want them to do," Leppla explained.

This testing will soon be over for Florida, but UF is pioneering ChemSearch's reach into the southern IPM region.

This region extends from New Mexico to North Carolina and includes 13 states.

Leppla's job will be to coordinate with the 12 other states' IPM directors in providing the ChemSearch services to their regions.

Leppla said he hopes to see the system broadened to include urban and building uses.



Group evades police eye as it hands out illegal Plan B

Members of the Gainesville Women's Liberation community-education class illegally passed out the emergency contraceptive Plan B to 14 people on the southwest corner of University Avenue and Southwest 13th Street on Tuesday at noon.

The eight members organized the morning-after pill handout to make people aware of the pill and to protest its prescription requirements.

Student Activism

"Over 70 medical groups say it's safe for use and in over 30 countries you can walk in and get it, but here you have to jump through so many hoops," class instructor Stephanie Seguin said.

Standing under a large "Feminist Pharmacy" sign, five members spoke about why the Food and Drug Administration should approve the morning-after pill as over-the-counter medication.

"We feel the FDA is keeping a perfectly safe pill from women's reach," student Claire Beach said.

Beach discussed in a speech her experience trying to get a morning-after pill after a condom broke during sex. After a nurse at the Student Health Care Center questioned and lectured her, she was given a prescription to get the pill.

"I felt like a slut when they asked me 'How long has it been since you had unprotected sex?' And I don't think it was fair that they pressured me to take an STD test," Beach said.

The speakers all advocated the pill become available over the counter since easy access is necessary for a medication that is most effective within 24 hours after sex.

"This is a free country, and every woman should be able to get the morning-after pill," UF student Jennifer Mallek said after receiving the pill. "I think it's a law that should be broken."

Several University Police officers monitored the demonstration from a distance, and two circled the perimeter on bicycle.

"We were there to protect their right to speak. Were we to witness any illegal activity, we could take any action, if needed," said UPD spokesman Lt. Joe Sharkey.

The officers did not arrest anyone at the demonstration.

"The officers that we had on hand did not witness the distribution that allegedly went on," Sharkey said.


Sharkey said University Police have the option to review a videotape from WCJB TV20, which recorded the speeches and distribution of the pill. Sharkey said they can work with the State Attorney's Office and file charges against any individuals seen violating the law on the tape.

'Academic Freedom' bill cleared for House floor

TALLAHASSEE — The Academic Freedom Bill of Rights passed the House Education Council on Tuesday, clearing the way for the controversial legislation to appear on the House floor for an official vote.

Sponsored by Rep. Dennis Baxley, the bill was approved 6-4. But Rep. Larry Cretul, Baxley's fellow Republican from Ocala, broke party ranks to speak out against the plan.

"This bill is unnecessary legislation," Cretul said. "As legislators, we have more than enough serious problems to address. The Legislature meets for only 60 days. We have to prioritize. This is just not a priority."

While proponents cited alleged cases of intimidation by professors against conservative students, Cretul said anecdotes do not warrant an expansive new bill by the Legislature.

"Are there occasional mistakes made by faculty?" he asked. "Sure. But I'm also sure there are mistakes made by faculty of all political persuasions. That's why our state's nationally renowned universities have policies in place to deal with these mistakes."

Despite Cretul's opposition, six Republicans

still voted for the bill, enough to pass the committee.

But while the bill advances in the House, an identical bill in the Senate appears to have stalled. With only one week of committee hearings left, the bill has failed to appear on the agenda of either of its two committees.

Sen. Stephen Wise, R-Jacksonville, said Tuesday that the Senate didn't appear to be receptive to the bill. Senate President Tom Lee and even Gov. Jeb Bush previously have gone on record questioning the bill's necessity.

Baxley and Rep. David Meador, R-Lake Mary, will speak to a meeting of the State University Presidents Association on Thursday in search of a commitment from presidents to better investigate student complaints of grade bias and public humiliation in class.

Wise said he may also attend and would be satisfied if the presidents gave assurances that student complaints would be addressed.

Nevertheless, debate at the House hearing was intense.

Rep. John Stargel, R-Lakeland, said he once received a C in an FSU Law School class that he believed was retaliation against conservative political views he espoused in class.

"We need to make sure that if a student believes they've been the victim of political

retaliation that they can appeal and get a fair hearing," he said.

Rep. David Rivera, R-Miami, said while he was uneasy with some aspects of the bill, he believed it addressed an important issue.

But Rep. Lorraine Ausley, D-Tallahassee, said universities already have policies for redress of student grievances.

All universities have an ombudsman whose job is to investigate and resolve complaints, she said.

"I'm wondering what kind of world we're in," Ausley said. "Republicans say they're for less government, lower taxes and more freedom. This bill would expand government power to regulate what professors can say, would require us to pay for new lawyers at every university and community college, and it certainly doesn't expand academic freedom."

Baxley had the last word at the hearing. "Some professors say, 'I don't give A's to Republicans,'" he said. "You're wrong, you're naive, if you think it doesn't happen. Yes we're interfering, and yes I'm shaking their cage, and we're intervening. We intervene when people are abused."

Baxley even said he'd received a letter from a UF senior thanking him for sponsoring the bill because she had felt oppressed in an unnamed UF liberal arts class.

"She wrote, 'I could not speak up against any of his lies, either for fear of retaliation in the gradebook or humiliation in class,'" he said.

Baxley would not name the student because he feared she would be acted against at UF.

Faculty and student groups have hotly contested the bill, which legislative staff lawyers have warned could allow students who feel offended in class to sue their professors or universities.

United Faculty of Florida President Tom Auxter, who also is a UF philosophy professor, said the evidence for passing the expansive bill affecting the whole State University System was "underwhelming."

"All we've heard is a handful of anecdotes," he said. "I'm sure abuses do happen, they occur at any institution. But there's no evidence to suggest they're widespread, and policies to address student grievances already exist."

In an interview after the hearing, Auxter said that even if the bill failed to pass the House, damage to Florida's universities has already been done.

Neither Domenech nor his supporters were present at the announcement, and none could be reached for comment.

Voter turnout averaged 13.78 percent of registered voters, totaling 2,618 votes, up slightly from the March 29 election that did not yield a winner for District 3.

In the two voting precincts dominated by students, 44 and 54, only 169 votes were cast. These precincts had the smallest voter turnout, only 1.25 and 2.37 percent respectively, with both giving the victory to Domenech.

The race was expected to be close.

By noon, the Elections Office had released the names of registered voters who had not yet voted. Donovan spent the afternoon calling them.

Helen Strain, his political strategist, said that technique is what earned Donovan the seat.

"This campaign was won because it made voter-to-voter contact," she said. "We have a committed community activist as a commissioner. For us to have someone like Jack is a true jewel in the bonnet of Gainesville."

City Commissioner Craig Lowe, the only commissioner in attendance, said Donovan's victory was "a move for a more progressive City Commission."

"Jack is someone who shares my views on how government should be conducted," Lowe said.

This was the only runoff from the March 29 City Commission elections, with Domenech having received 48.34 percent of votes cast citywide and Donovan earning 44.19 percent.

In that election, neither candidate received more than 50 percent of the vote, which mandates a runoff.


Rob Brinkman, a former At-Large candidate, came downstairs from the Blue

Ribbon Committee on County Finances meeting to congratulate Donovan on his victory. Brinkman previously said, after losing the At-Large race to incumbent

Commissioner Rick Bryant, that he would focus his efforts toward getting Donovan elected.

Donovan's youngest supporters were

too young to vote — the Eastside Young Democrats of Eastside High School updated 6,000 old campaign flyers for the runoff election and waved signs.

Ratzinger but knows many people who have.

Instead of electing a young, more modern pope, cardinals chose 78-year-old Ratzinger to be a “transitional” pope. He is the oldest pope elected since 1730.

“Just because they don’t want a long papacy doesn’t mean they don’t want an active papacy,” Lindenfelser said.

He referred to Pope John XXIII, who was elected at age 77 in 1958 and went on to revolutionize the church by opening up a dialogue with non-Catholics.

Bobby Angel, who coordinates the UF Catholic group with Lataif, said the organization wasn’t focusing on Ratzinger’s age.

“We have a pope, and we’re ready to rock and roll,” he said, adding, “It’s great to know we have a shepherd.”

There was “definitely something missing” in the interim period between popes, he said.

Lataif said the new pope obviously would not be around as long as John Paul II, but he seems healthy enough to take on the role.

“If this is what God wants for now, we should support that,” he said.




Students foot \$5,700 bill for awards, balloons, candy

UF students shelled out more than \$5,700 of their tuition money toward a Student Government banquet Saturday night.

The banquet incurred almost \$14,000 in charges, partly paid through the student-funded Activity & Service Fee, admissions fees and other means, SG finance reports show. Nearly \$600 and \$400 were spent on balloons and M&Ms candies, respectively.

Plaques and awards for SG officials encompassed the largest expense for the night — totaling approximately \$5,400, reports state.

But organizations funded through SG are never allowed to hold banquets and are rarely allowed to purchase plaques with student fees, said former Student Senate budget committee member MacKenzie Moritz.

"I don't think it's really fair for Student Government to spend more on itself than it allows SG-funded organizations to spend on themselves," said Moritz, former Progress Party presidential candidate.

SG Finance Code 808.12A specifically excludes money from A&S Fee expenditures for "banquet and banquet-related items."

"That wasn't my administration and my administration will be fiscally responsible," said Student Body President-elect Joe Goldberg, who was sworn in during Saturday's banquet but won't take office until May 1.

"If there are monies the student body feels shouldn't have been spent this year, I'll make sure that gets rectified next year under my administration," he added, noting that he was not yet familiar with the expenses.

The report also listed \$580 spent on balloons, a number that used to be much higher, Student Body Treasurer Dennis Ngin said.

"I did what I could to reduce the costs as much as I could," Ngin said, adding that the balloons once cost

about \$1,000. "I do think it was a lot of money to spend on a banquet."

He noted that the banquets have a historical tradition attached. Saturday's was the 88th annual banquet.

SG is not required to follow the

rules of the 800 finance codes, allowing them to fund events such as banquets with student money.

"There's kind of a double-standard for what Student Government itself can do and what it allows student organizations under it to do," Moritz said.

Additionally, Finance Code 808.13 states that A&S fees cannot be spent on "awards, recognition keys, etc." unless approved by the budget committee.

Moritz said that the budget committee never approved the purchase of awards for student organization members simply for completing their term in office, as was done Saturday for SG officials.

"We never spent more than \$25 on an [individual] award," he said.

Saturday, cabinet members received engraved wooden cases with two pens, a golden gator pin and a business card holder, all for completing their terms, said Senate technology cabinet member Adam Roberts, also a former Progress candidate.

Officials also spent more than \$375 on custom-printed orange and blue M&Ms emblazoned with the letters "SG" on one side, and the banquet's theme, "LEAVE A LEGACY," on the other.

These expenses come three years after SG spent \$500 of student tuition-funded A&S fees on chocolate alligators, an event that Roberts cited upon hearing of the expenses.

"I was under the impression that that was the reason we were paying the \$15 this time," Roberts said, referring to the \$15 admission fee.



Senate votes to increase cabinets



The size of Student Government's executive cabinet will increase by about 14 percent.

The Student Senate approved the second of two votes to increase the total number of student-funded cabinets from 36 to 41 in its last meeting of the Spring semester.

Student Body President-elect Joe Goldberg and Vice President-elect Joyce Medina



Goldberg

sponsored the bill to reorganize SG's Cabinet.

They will assume office on May 1.

Added cabinets included advertising, internal communications, on- and off-campus housing, promotions and publicity.

A "responsible Gators" cabinet was added to the roster to address concerns about excessive student drinking on campus.

About 170 applications for cabinet positions have been received so far, Medina said shortly before leaving to conduct further interviews for the positions.

In other Senate news, debate over a bill to purchase a \$207.15 portable hard drive for Student Upstart Films lured Diane Kassim out of her impartial role as Senate president.

Kassim uncharacteristically thrust herself into the spotlight to address what she said were concerns about Senate following proper policy and precedent.

Her proposal of an amendment to make sure SG owned and housed the hard drive instead of the film organization forced Judiciary Chairman Matt Chamoff, who was sitting in as Senate pro tempore for John Boyles at the time, to assume the Senate president role for the rest of the funding debate.

The dispute lasted only a few minutes.

Kassim emphasized that she still supported the bill's approval, and her concerns about proper funding channels eventually were written into the bill, with SG's technology budget expected to fund the purchase.

Sen. Matt Jones apologized to Upstart Student Films for the complications and advocated Senate purchasing equipment for similar types of groups.

"We usually have a sense of order in this room," Jones said.


In addition, a total of 21 replacement senators unanimously were approved to serve Summer terms Tuesday night for elected senators who will be out of town or unable to serve during the coming months.

The Senate Replacement & Agenda Committee recommended replacement senators in about one week's time, including applications and interviews.

Two Senate seats tentatively are open for Summer A, as well as five seats for Summer B and five seats for Summer C.

Seven Senate committee seats also have yet to be filled.

Students are encouraged to apply in the SG office on the Reitz Union third floor.

Rabbit-violence site stirs dispute

■ "BRYAN" WANTS \$50K — OR TOBY GETS IT.

While many UF students worry about final exams, two college students elsewhere have been spending their time warding off death threats, fighting legal battles, and best of all, collecting nearly \$25,000 in the process.

These events stemmed from SaveToby.com, a Web site the students created in efforts to save the life of their pet rabbit, Toby.

However, Toby's life isn't in any real danger.

The two students, who are choosing to remain anonymous, state on their Web site, "Toby is the cutest little bunny on the planet. Unfortunately, he will DIE on June 30th, 2005 if you don't help."

What help are they asking? Donations totaling \$50,000.

The owner found the rabbit under his porch and claims he is "truly remarkable" and "a fighter."

"To give Toby the life we feel he really deserves, after tallying up all the plans we have for him, we feel \$50,000 is a little on the low end," said the owner, who goes by "Bryan."

Bryan said he hopes money is raised so Toby, whom he considers more of a companion than a friend, will live.

"We really, in the grand scheme of things, would like to take Toby on some travels and let him see the world."

If the money isn't received by June 30, Toby's owners claim they will take him to a butcher, where he will be slaughtered, then prepare him for what they call a "mid-summer feast."

Many people and organizations strongly disagree.

Sue Brennan, the founder of Rabbit Haven, a nonprofit organization dedicated to rescuing abandoned and mistreated rabbits, is one of them.

"We currently shelter over 100 rabbits. They are well-cared for," Brennan said. "\$50,000 for one rabbit is just incredulous. I think it's ridiculous."

Her organization is opposed to the idea on the general principle that it's emotional extortion, she said.

Toby's owners don't seem too concerned with the accusations and have even posted personal responses to hate letters on their Web site.

"All the death threats are equally tied in terms of the worst," Bryan said, adding that hundreds of letters have recently come through.

UF junior James Bailey said he was surprised that close to \$25,000 has already been donated.

"Who the hell would give them money?" Bailey said. "I don't want the rabbit to die, but I'm not going to give them any money."

Classes to be held on reading day cause controversy

For a few UF students, 72 days of class may not be enough this Spring.

Some will return for one more day, Thursday — a university-deemed reading day.

The two days before finals each semester are deemed reading days. No classes or exams are held on these days, according to the UF Provost Office and the registrar Web site.

The class Anthropology and Film still will be held, and some students said they weren't happy.

Professor Peter Schmidt, who teaches the class, said no students objected when he added the extra period to screen more films.

"He just decided to tack on another day," said a student in the class who wished to remain anonymous.

"It's university policy that these are reading days," the student said.

The class is not mandatory and is supposed to help students who are behind, said Susan Mulder, another class member, in an e-mail.

"If there is a problem, the administration needs to know," said UF Ombudsman Tommie Howard. "They definitely need to be coming to me."

The purpose of the Office of the Ombudsman is to help students resolve issues with teachers and the university, the office Web site said.

"If it's taking place and no one is bringing it to our attention, there's nothing we

can do." Howard said. "I would bring it to the attention of the department chair."

Interim Department Chairman Michael Moseley said a student from the class called him about the Thursday addition, but he left the decision to Schmidt.

"This is the first time I've heard of this happening," Moseley said. "It's an unfortunate situation, but I'm not sure what it's caused by."

Anthropology department professor Jean Dennison said she also will hold class Thursday to help students who are behind.

They voted to have the class, and it's not mandatory, she said.

Some may not be aware of the rule, said UF sophomore Adam Langston.

Teachers should not have the right to have classes or hold votes because some students may feel pressured, he said.

"I don't think they should have any control over it," Langston said. "They should have no say if there's class or not 'cause that's university policy."

If students have an objection, they should go to the ombudsman's office, Howard said.

"They surely can come to me during or after the process," Howard said. "I always make time."

Second hunt for next provost drags on

Costs of searching continue to mount

UF students will have a new person to direct their academic careers in the Fall, but the search for UF's next chief academic officer — the provost — will likely cost the university \$150,000.

UF's administration has invested several months and thousands of dollars into finding the right person.

"It's important that we get somebody who has a clear vision," Interim Provost Joe Glover said. "It's extremely important that we get someone who has the savvy to manage large business operation."

The position opened in February 2004 when then-Provost David Colburn announced he would step down, partially to give UF President Bernie Machen the chance to bring in his own person for the second-in-command spot.

The search has taken about six months since the committee formed in October. The first search, which failed, cost \$73,859, and so far the second has racked up \$26,333, UF spokesman Steve Orlando

wrote in an e-mail. The second search is likely to add up to about \$75,000.

The final, public stages of the search will go on this Summer, when many faculty and students will not be watching. But with the meager results of the first candidate pool, UF officials have said it was the best option.

The search committee will review a preliminary list of about a dozen candidates on May 9 and 10.

At those meetings, it will cut that number down to about six prospects, who will then visit campus for interviews with the committee. After a second round of cuts, the three or four finalists will visit the campus to meet with Machen, faculty representatives and other UF stakeholders.

Not having a provost has not been a hindrance to UF thus far because the position is only one of a team of top-notch administrators, Glover said.

But several open positions will not be filled until the provost takes office. The Colleges of Health and Human Performance and Fine Arts are holding off on searches for their deans, and UF will not choose a director of admissions until the provost has a say, Glover said.

"This is part of a normal evolution of a

university," he said. "The university continues to move forward in a variety of ways."

Pierre Ramond, chairman of the Faculty Senate, said not having a provost hasn't hampered UF's strategy to become a Top 10 public research university, but it may if the position hasn't been filled by Fall.

"I think the faculty would have wished that a provost be in place six months ago," Ramond said.

But administrative searches can be difficult in Florida, where meetings of any two or more members of the search committee must be public. The firm Machen hired for the second search reminded the committee of candidates' hesitance to come forward several times at their first meeting.

Applicants might feel awkward about their home institution knowing that they're looking for another job, Ramond said. Additionally, the administrative structure at UF — in which the provost is one of three top vice presidents to report directly to the president — may seem unusual to prospective provosts, he said.

He has not come across many issues that were waiting for a permanent provost, but Machen's team is not in place until a provost is picked, Ramond said.

"The most interesting thing about being provost is in the sense that you're setting up the academic direction of the university," he said. "The pieces are not in place yet."

Radio hosts decry UF administration's 'hypocrisy' concerning alcohol policy

"Nobody is doing anything against their will," he said. "This is done by a college that has a school of journalism? What are you teaching these kids?"

UF spokesman Steve Orlando sees the situation differently.

"If you're talking about underage alcohol consumption, that is something we cannot tolerate," he said. "Certainly, I don't think the framers of the Constitution had 'Drunk Bitch Friday' in mind when they wrote that."

Both hosts said they were upset about the action taken by UF administration.

"It makes me feel sad," Lex said. "I have a past in Gainesville. I went to Santa Fe (Community College) for a while. It's a great station, and it always has been. This is a dark day in the history of the network."

"I think that if you lined up all 40 of our stations that would cancel 'Drunk Bitch Friday,' Rock 104 would be the last one on the list," Terry said. "I am just going to follow the president around for a year and make sure he doesn't have a cocktail."

Welpton said the cancellation was not a consequence-free one for the university.

"[UF] just signed a three-year deal six months ago, and this will cost the station a lot

of money," Welpton said.

Welpton would not say how much money will come out of UF's pocketbook for breaking the contract. He added that the syndication of "The Lex & Terry Morning Show" helps pay for the salaries of WRUF staff members.

Orlando said the university is prepared to suffer monetary losses for the decision.

"If they choose to cancel the entire program, then that is their decision," he said. "[Machen and College of Journalism Dean Terry Hynes] spoke with each other when they made this decision, and I think they understood the potential consequences. A monetary price compared with the life of a student — there's just no comparison."

Larry Dankner, general manager for WRUF, said he thought the station had more time before a decision was made about the show.

"They have been trying to work with us," he said. "I thought that we had a couple more Fridays to work with."

Lex said he feels the decision to cancel the show was more personal than well-informed.

"While I understand what it must be like to be the president of a university, I don't think there has been adequate fact-finding," Lex said. "That pretty much tells me that this is of a political nature. I really don't think that the show's content offends anybody but one person."

Terry echoed his co-host.

"I can't wait for [UF] to stop the world's largest cocktail party," he said of the annual bash at Jacksonville Landing for the UF-Georgia football game. "I've got my sights set on that. If that doesn't relay the hypocrisy of all this, I don't know what does."

Relatedly, a UF student fell to his death from a parking garage at the event last year, allegedly due to alcohol-related reasons.

Neither considered the show indecent.

"I don't think that we can stand on a soapbox and say that the show is a public service," Terry said. "It's up to the person to decide. We give people more credit for being smart."

Both Terry and Lex said listeners can make their own decisions about how to behave.

"I think this is pretty over the top," Lex said. "Not everybody is a moron."

Terry noted that numerous women apply to be on their show.

"The facts are we have over 2,500 women that apply to be a drunk bitch," he said.

"Ninety-five percent of them we cut off by 9 a.m. They've had an equivalent, at that time, of about three to four drinks."

Terry said he does not want to see the show leave UF, but said he might cancel "Drunk Bitch Friday" to make a statement. They encouraged outraged listeners to take the mic and speak up.

"I would tell them to do what suits them best," Lex said. "If it means anything to them to show the outrage of this, they should contact [the administration]. That seems to be what gets people's attention."

"If they are going on sheer volume," Terry said, "there are a hell of a lot more people who would love to hear it."

Orlando said that UF is in charge of the radio station that makes its home on campus.

"The station is part of the university. What the station chooses to air reflects the values of the university and its leadership."

Orlando called the actions on the show "clearly irresponsible."

Lex and Terry disagree.

"I don't think a radio show has an impact on whether somebody drinks or not," Lex said.


Terry, who said he doesn't usually drink, offered the bright side of what listeners can do when the show is canceled.

"The good news is it kind of frees up everybody's time to have sex," he said.






Star joins Gators

The UF baseball team and Coach Pat McMahon recently announced that outfielder Chris Petrie, from Jacksonville, has signed a national letter of intent.

"We are extremely excited that Chris has decided to join the Gator baseball family," McMahon said. "He is a quality individual with outstanding power."

Through April 16, Petrie ranked third for Lake City Community College with a .375 batting average and paced his squad in total bases (124), runs (46) and doubles (20). He has belted seven home runs and tallied 36 RBI, statistics that place him second and third on the team, respectively. In addition, Petrie leads the Timberwolves with a .402 clip in conference play and has totaled nine doubles.

Petrie started all 51 games last season for head coach Tom Clark and batted .386 with 40 RBI and five homers. On the mound, the southpaw was 2-1 with a 4.11 earned run average and totaled 11 strikeouts. Petrie was a first-team all-conference selection and achieved second-team all-state status. He was selected by the Minnesota Twins in the 47th round of the 2004 Major League Baseball

Draft.

"Chris is an outstanding athlete who can play any of the outfield positions for us," assistant coach Tim Parenton said. "We are looking forward to having him arrive on campus to start his career as a Gator."

Petrie was a four-year letterman and three-year starter for head coaches Storm Davis and John Newman at the Bolles School in Jacksonville. He helped the Bulldogs to the 3A State Championship during his junior year in 2002, when he hit .376 with 35 RBI and six homers as his club finished 30-4 overall.

In addition, Petrie was a pitcher and outfielder for the 1998 AAU national champions for head coach Chet Lemon and was a member of the 2000 AAU national runner-up squad coached by Mike Jones. He was also selected to the 2000 AAU all-tournament team.

"It is an honor to become part of the Gator baseball program," Petrie said. "I look forward to working with the coaching staff and having the opportunity to contribute to the team."

In addition to Petrie, Florida has already signed 11 other student-athletes to a national letter of intent. This group includes Michael Allen, Avery Barnes, Patrick Keating, J.K. LaCoste, Jarrod Langlois, John Matulia, Andrew McCutchen, Cody Neer, Clayton Pisani, Chas Spottswood and Drew Thompson.

The Gators played a rare error-free game, while also outthitting the Seminoles 9-7.



Eight of the nine UF batters had at least one hit, with right fielder Brian Leclerc coming up 0-for-4. Leclerc lined out to first base with the bases loaded on a play that might have swung the game in favor of the Gators.

"We hit the ball really hard; it's a game of inches," McMahon said. "Our goal is not to out-hit people, our goal is to out-score. To score is to be productive.

First baseman Matt LaPorta collected one of UF's nine hits against Florida State. The Gators fall to 27-10 for the season.


It was a well-played game by both teams. It was a fun game to manage in, there were some neat plays within plays of the game."

Those lineup shifts come as a result of several key team members fighting off injuries. Savannah Evans will return to vault after missing the event at the Southeast Regional due to an ankle sprain, Orley Szmuch will complete her comeback from her ankle woes by adding floor exercise, becoming the third all-around competitor for UF along with Breanne King and Ashley Reed, and Lutz will be back on the balance beam.

The Gators are hoping that those additions help push them back to where they were a year ago, tied for first in their session.

They will have to do this all in spite of the difficult competition they will have to face.

"I kind of like our draw actually," Lutz said. "We've seen all of the teams that we're competing against, we've been against them already, so we know what we're up against."

The meet will mark the fifth meeting this season between the Gators and Georgia, and both of UF's wins against the Bulldogs this season have been significant.

UF grad named coach

For the first time, a UF graduate was named the head coach of an NCAA Division I women's basketball team.

Former UF women's basketball standout Amanda Butler (1990-94) was named the head coach of the Charlotte 49ers women's hoops program today.

Butler served as 49ers' associate head coach for the last two years, after working as an assistant coach there the previous two seasons.

Butler was promoted following the 2002-03 season, when the 49ers won their first Conference USA title and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. She played an integral role on a coaching staff that has led the 49ers to three straight postseason appearances for the first time in the program's history.

Butler has been heavily involved with recruiting, overseeing classes graduating in even years. In her first season with the 49ers, she helped the team put together the nation's 24th-ranked recruiting class.

Three of those players, Pam Brown, Sakellie Daniels and Andrea Davidson, were named to the C-USA all-freshman team.

Butler spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Austin Peay before joining the 49ers. While there, she helped the

Govs reach the NCAA Tournament in 2001, finishing the year 18-13 and winning the Ohio Valley

Conference championship. She recruited and coached back-to-back OVC freshmen of the year. She also coached the school's all-time

leading scorer, Brooke Armistead, who was the Govs' first player drafted by the WNBA.

As a player, she finished her career second on the Gators' all-time assists list, and among the top five in both three-pointers made and three-point percentage. Butler was also a three-time academic All-SEC selection.



UF prepares for SEC Tournament

■ GATORS LOOK TO NAB 13TH WIN OF 14 MATCHES.

The No. 5 UF men's tennis team heads to Georgia today in an optimum situation.

For a regular season that began plagued with uncertainty after the loss

of one of the Gators' best players, they enter the postseason co-Southeastern Conference champions and ranked highest since Feb. 18. Not only are they confident, but they are eager and excited to play teams in a league they have dominated during past months.

UF plays its first match Friday against the Kentucky-Vanderbilt winner. Both teams fell to the Gators in their first meetings. The Gators are one of four teams to make their tour-

nament debut in the quarterfinals after receiving a first-round bye.

With their lone SEC loss coming to No. 3. Mississippi, the team that shared the SEC championship title with UF, the Gators are not so quick to disregard the slew of top-25 opponents they will face.

"We're going to have to be sharp, we're going to have to have energy and we'll have to play well or we will lose," Coach Andy Jackson said. "There are too many good teams to think that you can play any match at a normal level or below normal level and expect to advance."

The SEC tournament is regarded as one of the top events leading up to the NCAA Championship in May. The semifinals are slated for Saturday and the championship round will be played on Sunday.

While the Gators might be play-



ing some of the year's best tennis, Jackson said the team could always perfect their game, especially when it comes to doubles.

Overall, the Gators finished 10-1 in the league, but only 6-5 in doubles. Jackson said he plans on adjusting the lineup throughout the tournament until he finds something that works.

"Obviously we need to keep trying things until we come up with something that allows us to be more successful in doubles," he said. "We should be better and we're going to work to prove that."

After the tournament, the Gators will take a week off to finish up with finals and rest before returning to the courts in preparation for the NCAA Regionals, beginning May 14.



UF unable to overcome Seminoles' strong pitching

TALLAHASSEE — Check. Not check mate, not yet.

Both coaches made moves to out-coach the opposition, but it was Florida State coach Mike Martin that got the better of the contest.

FSU won the second game of the in-state baseball rivalry 4-2 Tuesday night in Tallahassee on the strength of an impressive pitching performance of sophomore Bryan Henry.

"Bryan has a very good baseball mentality," Martin said. "He had a good outing tonight. He knows he needs to have more outings like that to stay in the starting rotation."

Henry (3-2) pitched 7.1 innings to hold the Gators to two runs, then played third base while his bullpen closed the game.

"He's a good baseball player, but he's still got to do a little better with that bat," Martin said of Henry's strikeout in his only at-bat.

UF (27-10) started an inexperienced pitcher as well, freshman Tommy Wynn.

"I wasn't hitting my spots," Wynn said. "I competed, I worked hard and tried to give the team all I had. I just wasn't able to pull it out tonight."

In 4.1 innings, Wynn allowed two earned runs and three walks while striking out three batters. Wynn had not thrown more than two innings in any appearance this season.

"Once your adrenaline gets going, you really don't feel the fatigue as much," Wynn said. "Especially playing here, the crowd gets on you so you work off of that."

Senior left-handed pitcher Mike Pete relieved Wynn (0-1) in the bottom of the fifth inning after a leadoff walk was issued.

The second pitch out of Pete's hand was blasted against the high right field wall for a double. FSU left fielder Gibbs Chapman followed with a two-run double, his third RBI of the game.

"Our pitchers did great tonight holding the Gators, but I thought we'd need more than three," Chapman said. "It's going to be a good game in Gainesville in a couple of weeks. It will make it interesting with the series tied."

UF second baseman Adam Davis had two stolen bases, batting 2-for-3

Gators eyeing Super Six

Samantha Lutz remembers the feeling.

As part of the UF gymnastics team last season, Lutz performed under the sport's biggest collegiate spotlight: the NCAA Super Six.

And it's something that she'll never forget.

"It's really not something that I can even describe," Lutz said. "It was just so exciting to walk in there, to realize that 'Wow, this is the culmination of all the work I've done all season and all the time and effort we put in,' and just being able to experience it at that time was amazing."

Before the Gators can walk onto that stage again, another challenge awaits

them on Thursday night, as they compete in the second session at the NCAA Championships.

Each session includes six schools, and the top three in each will advance to the Super Six Friday night.

The Gators have advanced to the Super Six four times, the most recent being 2004, where they finished fifth.

Their highest finish ever was second in 1998.

UF received a fairly difficult draw for their session, including four of last year's Super Six teams in No. 2 UCLA, No. 4 Alabama and No. 5 Georgia.

No. 9 Iowa State and No. 13 Brigham Young are the other two teams in the group.

SEC showers Jackson, Ouellette, Mirzadeh with awards

Tally a bevy of awards for a team looking to make a post-season statement.

The UF men's tennis team welcomed a number of accolades from the Southeastern Conference Tuesday. Men's tennis head coach Andy Jackson was named SEC co-Coach of the Year while newcomer Greg Ouellette was tabbed the SEC Freshman of the Year. In addition, Ouellette was a First Team All-SEC selection while Hamid Mirzadeh made the First Team for the third time in his career. Redshirt junior Chris Brandi represented the Gators on the All-SEC Second Team.

Jackson earned SEC co-Coach of the Year honors, which league coaches vote on, for the third time in his career and the second while at UF. In 1991 he earned the distinction while at Mississippi State before doing so with the Gators

in 2002. This season, he shares the award with Sylvain Guichard of Mississippi State. In 2005, Jackson led the Gators to a share of the SEC title, as UF posted a 10-1 conference record to match Mississippi. Jackson is the only coach in SEC history to win titles at two different member institutions.


Ouellette earned the sixth-ever SEC Freshman of the Year award. He is only the second UF player to win this accolade, the other being Janne Holmia in 2003. Ouellette, who is ranked No. 39 in the ITA singles poll, led the Gators with a 34-6 overall record in 2005 and went 16-3 in dual-match play. He posted an 11-0 mark against SEC opponents in dual-match play, becoming the first player in the Jackson era to do so. Ouellette defeated a team-high seven

ranked opponents this season and became the first Gator freshman to be named SEC Player of the Week, when he was selected for the honor on Jan. 25.

Mirzadeh, who was also named to the first team in 2003 and 2004, is ranked No. 31 in the latest ITA poll. Mirzadeh went 12-9 in dual matches at the top of the singles lineup for the Gators. He also went 8-3 against conference foes and defeated six ranked opponents. He was named the recipient of the United States Tennis Association (USTA) Sportsmanship Award at the USTA/ITA National Men's Team Indoor Championship at the Mid-Town Tennis Club this past February.

Mirzadeh was chosen for this annual award by the 16 participating coaches for displaying outstanding sportsmanship and exemplifying the spirit of college tennis during the course of the tournament and throughout his career.
