Dean, VP involved in firing of ex-official

A former Student Government member still is struggling to piece together the reason he was fired from his position in December. Peter Gruskin, former SG Advocacy Cabinet director, said he was removed from the SG office for "political reasons," a move in which UF's administration was complicit. And he might have records to prove it.

Gruskin was fired, he said, after students voiced concern about a controversial Israel-Palestine debate in December hosted in part by Gruskin's cabinet.

After making a public-records request, Gruskin obtained a stack of e-mails containing correspondence between Dean of Students Eugene Zdziarski, former Student Activities Director Lohse Beeland and former Student Body Vice President Jennifer Puckett, among others.

A sizable amount of information con-

tained in the e-mails, which the Alligator has obtained, was redacted, or "blacked out," because the information was deemed an exception under Florida's public-record laws.

One e-mail is entirely blacked out — including the sender and recipient.

"God knows what's in that e-mail," Gruskin said, adding he would like to see the e-mails

without the omissions to better understand why he was fired.

The response from an unknown sender to the completely redacted e-mail on Sept. 22 states: "We are most likely removing Peter Gruskin from the Student Advocacy Cabinet, and we are going to add [redacted]. The application period will be very short and I have already spoken to [redacted] seems happy about it."

Another e-mail about the Israel-Palestine

Stem-cell debate rages

UF research not affected

The stem-cell debate continues in Washington, with the U.S. House of Representatives passing a bill last month to allow federal funding for embryonic research and President Bush standing firm on his promise to veto any such bill that crosses his desk.

But UF professors say their research would not be affected either way.

"I feel that it is important to do some research with human embryonic stem cells, but they are far behind the research that we have done on adult stem cells," said Edward Scott, director of UF's Program in

Stem Cell Biology and Regenerative Medicine.

The only embryonic stem cells researchers at UF study come from mice, Scott said.

The focus of regenerative research at UF is on adult stem cells, with hopes to find cures to diseases like diabetes, Alzheimer's and Parkinson's, he said.

Stem cells are unspecialized cells that can replicate many times over and become another type of cell with a specialized function like a muscle cell or brain cell.

And unlike stem cells, most of the cells in the human body have specific functions and do not have the ability to replicate.

For example, the specific functions of a cell in the heart muscle would be to work with neighboring cells to pump blood through the body.

Crash on Southwest 34th Street leaves three injured

■ THE AREA ALREADY HAS AS MANY TRAFFIC FATALITIES AS LAST YEAR.

A local television reporter was taken to Shands at UF after two vehicles collided in the southbound lane of Southwest 34th Street on Tuesday night, according to the

Florida Highway Patrol.

A 1996 Toyota Tercel driven by WCJB-TV20 news reporter and UF alumna Sandy D'Elosua, 26, slammed into the passenger side of Norberto Alegria Gonzalez's green Ford Mustang at 2000 SW 34th St. at approximately 11:30 p.m., according to FHP reports.

Circumstances of the accident were unknown as of press time.

After the collision, the Mustang driven by Gonzalez, 21, came to a stop on Southwest 20th Street near Kash n' Karry, coming within inches of a traffic light post. The Tercel came to a halt facing oncoming traffic in the southbound lane of Southwest 34th Street.

Onlookers said the victims were not coherent after the accident.

"She couldn't even tell us her name," Gainesville resident Kim Ecel said of an unknown female passenger in Gonzalez's Mustang. "She's not moving at all."

Traffic was disrupted for half an hour as emergency personnel transported D'Elosua, Gonzalez and the unknown passenger in his vehicle to Shands and the road was cleared of broken glass.

Railroad Days chug through

A three-day festival celebrating one of Florida's most famous railroads kicks off Friday across the state, including Gainesville.

The event, Yulee Railroad Days, commemorates the cross-state railroad commissioned by Florida Sen. David Yulee in the mid-1800s.

Participating towns are located near or on the railroad's route; each will feature different activities to celebrate its heritages and connections with the railroad.

East Gainesville's Cotton Club will play a prominent role in the city's own railroad celebration, said local coordinator Vivian Filer.

The club, which has hosted such musical legends as James Brown, B.B. King and Ray Charles, is located close to the actual railroad site.

"The beauty is that our building sits right off the trail, so bikers can come through and see the venue and rest," Filer said. "A big part of this is also celebrating the work of slaves who built the railroad."

Cotton Club festivities will begin at 10 a.m. Saturday, and will include fish-frying, dramatic performances and live music, Filer said.


Tillie Davis, one of the celebration's organizers, said that Yulee Railroad Days was founded eight years ago by Archer Historical Society President Phil Denton.



Mysterious 'Deep Throat' reveals 30-year secret

"Deep Throat" has been unmasked. Nearly 33 years ago, Washington, D.C., police discovered five burglars in the headquarters of the Democratic National Committee. This incident sparked the investigation of Watergate, a scandal that would make Washington Post reporters Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein famous and their anonymous informant, "Deep Throat," an infamous and mysterious figure. The identity of "Deep Throat" was a secret closely guarded by the two journalists for

more than thirty years, until Tuesday, when 91-year-old former FBI Deputy Chief Mark Felt's hidden identity was revealed.

Vanity Fair released an article in its July issue which reported that Felt admitted to family, "I'm the guy they used to call 'Deep Throat.'"

Felt was the second-ranking official in the FBI in 1972, making him privy to a plethora of sensitive information. He then gave the information to Bernstein and Woodward in exchange for promises that his identity would not be revealed until after his death. As a result of this promise, much debate persisted regarding the identity of "Deep Throat." Many even doubted his existence.

Dan Smith, an associate professor for the department of political science said, "Maybe it does take 30 years for a source to be revealed. But it does not mean that the source wasn't speaking truth to power."

Mike Foley, journalism lecturer and former executive editor of The St. Petersburg Times, is a self-proclaimed critic of anonymous sources. "If you use anonymous sources, then the reader can't judge the value of the information. But as far as 'Deep Throat' goes, he can be the patron

saint of anonymous sources." Foley said when the Watergate story broke, the guidelines governing the use of anonymous sources were much more strict.

"Today there are people like Jayson Blair who just make things up," Foley said.

Jayson Blair, a writer for The New York Times, used fabricated anonymous sources.

"Felt is the perfect anonymous source," Foley said. "He was a high-up insider and knew what was going on. He ... became a whistle-blower."

"He was a help. Maybe now it will give them [conspiracy theorists] some closure. They can't play this parlor game anymore."

Local residents take advantage of hurricane tax break

■ ITEMS LIKE BATTERIES AND GENERATORS ARE TAX-FREE THROUGH AUG. 12.

Just after the sun peaked above the trees, many Gainesville residents began milling around local home improvement stores.


The sales tax was lifted on hurricane-related items Wednesday, and hundreds of Gainesville residents were on hand to take advantage of the savings, said Lee Walker, a sales manager at Lowe's Home Improvement.

The Florida Department of Revenue has tagged items such as generators, batteries and weather-band radios as tax-exempt through June 12.

According to Walker, about 15 people were waiting at 5:45 a.m., and when the store opened 15 minutes later, that number almost doubled.

A half hour later, Walker said he had loaded 24 generators into people's vehicles.

He stopped counting gas cans because people were buying them

in packs, he said.

"As I'm loading the cans, I'm thinking it's going to take \$250 just to fill these," Walker said.

By 3 p.m., Lowe's on Southwest Archer Road sold out of the 123 generators it had in stock.

Even the 7,800-watt genera-

tors, which were priced above the \$750 exemption cap, were gone by Wednesday afternoon, Walker said.

Lowe's is doubling the rush on

hurricane-related goods by offering free how-to clinics on generator safety, hurricane shutter installation, proper techniques on boarding windows and chain saw safety.

Lowe's is expecting at least one truckload of supplies overnight, he said.

Lowe's wasn't the only store to be enjoying a tax-holiday rush Wednesday.

There were customers waiting outside Home Depot in Gainesville before 6 a.m. as well, according to Chuck Klacko, an assistant store manager at the building materials chain.

Although Home Depot, which has extended its hours until midnight for the tax-free holiday, still had generators Wednesday afternoon, the store noticed a rush on hurricane-related goods as well, he said.

Because last year's hurricane season left many Gainesville residents without electricity, Fernando Rodriguez, store manager of Zell's Ace Hardware, which also enjoyed a rush Wednesday, encourages residents to take advantage of the tax-free holiday.

"You'll feel sorry if you're not prepared," he said.

Students to test skills at first mock NFL combine

■ MONDAY'S EVENT IS OPEN TO ALL STUDENTS.

Students can test their football skills at the first-ever mock NFL combine hosted by the Department of Recreational Sports.

The combine is open to all students and will be held Monday from 6 to 9 p.m. at the UVS field, located between the Southwest Recreation Center and University Village South.

The NFL combine, which has become a proving ground for college football players interested in becoming professionals, tests play-

ers' physical and mental toughness in front of their potential coaches.

"With the professional combine just finishing, we thought it would be fun for students to be able to compare themselves with the pros," said Mike Deibler, the strength and conditioning program assistant.

The mock combine will run some of the same drills college football players go through at the NFL combine.

Deibler said the drills will include the 40-yard dash, the bench press, the broad-jump, the 20-yard shuffle and the three-cone agility test. Some of these tests, such as the bench press, will be modified for personal size and safety reasons.

Position-specific drills will also be set up to test students' game-time abilities.

"We are going to have targets set up for the quarterback position and obstacle courses set up for running backs," Deibler said.

Speed drills for receivers and additional strength tests for linemen will also be set up, Deibler said.

Charlie Cookerly, 21, a UF student and a fitness supervisor at the recreational center, said she will be volunteering at the mock combine.

"It just sounds like fun," Cookerly said. "I'm a huge football fan, and it will be exciting to see how normal people compare with the pros."

Cookerly will be judging and keeping time at the events.

After checking out the competition, Cookerly said she might try a couple of the events herself.

"Hopefully, students will come out and meet some new people and at the same time settle some old scores with their friends," she said.

Matthew Remm, 20, plans on attending for some friendly competition.

"Me and my friends are always arguing over who's the best," said Remm, a UF junior. "I'm going to go out there and prove my total dominance."

Remm said he follows the NFL combine to keep track of where for-

mer college players may end up.

"Look, I'm a guy," Remm said. "I watch Sports Center six times a day, and there have been times when I've thought that I could have put up better numbers."

Remm was referring specifically to the less-than-spectacular times posted by Maurice Clarett, a former stand-out running back for Ohio State University and current player for the Broncos.

Remm and others will have their chance to prove themselves by running the same drills that Clarett did at the NFL combine.

Students do not have to do the entire mock combine in order to participate in the event.

SG deactivates Later Gator services for Summer A

UF shut its doors on the Later Gator bus service for Summer A due to funding concerns, leaving students without the familiar ride home after partying at downtown Gainesville's venues.

The bus service, which ran three late-night routes Wednesday through Saturday, was designed to provide students a free and safe alternative to driving downtown.

"The Later Gator is funded through Activity & Service Fees which are a part of every course credit paid by students," said Student Body president Joe

Goldberg. "We total about \$11.4 million, which serves as Student Government's budget."

Goldberg said during Summer A there aren't enough people riding the Later Gator to justify the costs of the service.

However, Goldberg said he feels there is a safety concern for students who decide to go downtown.

"The streets get crowded and dangerous when the bars start to close," he said. "Getting a taxi can be difficult and expensive, but so far we have not had any complaints about Later Gator's inactivity."

Goldberg said concerned students should bring it to the attention of SG.

"If students want the Later Gator for Summer A, we can work something out," he said.

Theresa Harrison, marketing coordinator for the Regional Transit System, said responsibility for the deactivation of the bus service rests entirely in SG's hands.

"The Later Gator is 100 percent funded by UF's Student Government," Harrison said. "We meet with Student Government officials and they tell us what services they want."

Harrison said if RTS didn't have the resources to run the Later Gator, it would let SG know.

Eric Diehl, a junior in the College of Engineering, said he feels the

Later Gator service is a necessity and SG should not have deactivated the bus service.

"Without the Later Gator it is really difficult to go out," he said.

"It's hard enough finding a ride to get downtown, and now I have to worry about how I am getting home."

Diehl said he learned the hard way about the bus system, having to walk several miles home when he realized the bus wasn't coming.

"I didn't even know the Later


Gator was shut down for Summer A," he said. "If I had known this earlier, I could have avoided the walk back to campus."

Diehl emphasized the liability of not having access to bus service.

"I think students are at risk of making poor decisions when it comes to leaving downtown at night," he said. "The last thing I want to do is get in a random person's car."


Despite his frustrations, Diehl recommended a solution.

"I would gladly pay a dollar or a reasonable fare to ride the bus after leaving downtown," he said. "It would be a lot safer and much more affordable than a taxi."

Starting next school year, Palm Beach County educators will implement their plan to remove all stress and competitive spirit from their students: Get rid of grades.

event, sent from Zdziarski to Puckett on Dec. 6, reads: "As it relates to the specifics of this matter, my written messages have been intentionally vague due to the sensitive nature of this matter."

After his firing, Gruskin spoke to UF political science teaching assistant Charles Grapski, who initially suggested Gruskin take legal action about the disputed dismissal.

After reading the e-mails, Grapski said he feels Gruskin was fired without reason.

"What's clear in those e-mails is that the [UF] administration was actively involved in having Peter [Gruskin]

removed," Grapski said. "Dean Zdziarski had a very active hand in having Peter removed from office, and he wanted to ensure that Student Government did that."

Calls to Dean Zdziarski's home and office, former Student Body President Jamal Sowell and Puckett were not returned Wednesday by press time.

Grapski was involved in SG in the 1990s and said UF has a history of abusing public-records laws.

"The University of Florida is openly defiant with regards to Florida's public records and public meetings laws," Grapski said.

Gruskin, who was appointed by Sowell in May 2004, campaigned for Sowell's presidential bid at Jewish Student Union meetings and in Turlington Plaza.

"I physically worked hard to get Jamal [Sowell] elected," Gruskin said in a February interview.

However, he now asserts that Sowell, along with Puckett, fired him from his position because of his views on the Israel-Palestine conflict.

UF studies focused on seeking disease cures

Advocates of embryonic research say because human embryonic stem cells are formed early on in human development, they have a greater potential than adult stem cells to grow into any cell or tissue of the body.

Some scientists believe that, because of this potential, embryonic stem cells could be the key to discovering ways to treat diseases such as Alzheimer's or diabetes.

However, because embryos are destroyed when the cells are extracted, President Bush opposes the use of "taxpayer money to promote research that takes life," according to a White House press release.

The president supports the use of adult stem cells, like those UF researchers study, which can be found in the brain, bone marrow and blood, including umbilical cord blood, according to the White House report.

But proponents of embryonic stem cell research disagree with the president's stand.

According to online information from the National Institutes of Health, the human embry-

onic stem cells used for research come from eggs that have been fertilized in a laboratory and have been willingly donated to science.

Scott said he doubts UF will do research with human embryonic stem cells in the future because they are unpredictable.

"Embryonic stem cells are more like children," he said. "They tend to behave poorly, and it's hard to get them to do what you want."

UF Research Unlike stem cells from embryos, if adult stem cells are used in the proper way, scientists could get them to do extraordinary things, he said.

UF's program, which was made official in 2002, receives federal funding along with grants from the National Institutes of Health and private organizations.

Dennis A. Steindler, executive director of the Evelyn F. and William L. McKnight Brain Institute and member of the program, highlighted the importance of stem-cell research.

"Research in regenerative medicine is more than the controversy [over the use of embryonic stem cells]," Steindler said. "The research is about the possibility to cure many types of diseases."

As of press time, D'Elosua remains in Shands' trauma unit. The others' conditions were unknown.

FHP, not Gainesville Police, had jurisdiction at the accident scene because the Southwest 20th Street area is unincorporated.

It is unknown whether drugs or alcohol were involved in the

incident.

"This stuff really scares me," Ecel said.

Gainesville's roads are proving to be more hazardous this year.

With the death of construction worker Justin Garland in April, who was run over by a truck on-site, the total traffic-related fatalities within city limits reached that for all of 2004.

Three people died on Gainesville roads last year.

This year's first fatality occurred when UF finance junior Christopher Small drove his car into a tree on Northwest 34th Street. Autopsy results showed he was legally intoxicated.

The second incident claimed 75-year-old Virgil Perkey, who lived in an apartment complex on Southwest 13th Street and was struck by a pickup truck while crossing the road's south-bound lanes.

"We've got this little revival of jazz in Gainesville," says Liquori, who organized the band and plays guitar.

The idea for a jazz night was formulated a few years ago when Liquori's friend asked him to accompany her on the guitar while she sang to her husband on their anniversary.

Steve Solomon, the owner of the local Leonardo's restaurants, heard the performance and asked Liquori to play in his restaurant at the 706 location.

At the time, Liquori didn't feel ready to perform regularly, as it had been more than 30 years since he last picked up a guitar. He practiced for a year or two before haphazardly picking Thursday night for shows.

Since then, "Marty Liquori and Friends" has drawn musicians who are not in it to make a buck — they just want to play. And because of jazz's large emphasis on improvisation, the musicians who play with Liquori are among Gainesville's best.

"It's a true jazz club in that, no, we don't practice before we play together," Liquori says. "Frankly, I don't even know who's going to show up that night — sometimes we have four horn players."

The weekly jazz night has gotten so popular that it has expanded to Monday evenings with Liquori's more permanent band, Hot Club de Ville, which recently featured world-renowned

trumpeter Tim Hagens.

UF alum's surreal paintings land exhibit in Tampa

Sometimes a painting will tug at your imagination, keep your eyes roaming the canvas longer, make you want to ask the person in the painting who they are and maybe what they're thinking.

Malcolm Cooper's paintings have that something. The UF alum knows just how to add that element of bizarre mystery to a painting. The 28-year-old painter and former UF fine art studio major specializes in creating large scale surreal paintings. "The biggest painting I did was

7-and-a-half by 12 feet," he said, adding that it took him about three weeks to complete.

However, because of time constraints, Cooper dedicates himself mostly to oil paintings instead of other art medium. "Making paintings that size makes it hard to really do anything else because they take so much time," he said.

Seven of his recent paintings will soon be on display at the Matthews Fine Art Gallery in Tampa. The exhibit, which will host the work of several Florida, California and

New York artists, will open June 3.

The subject of his paintings are usually women, but if you ask the artist, he'll tell you he's not quite sure why.

The constant in his paintings, however, is the dreamlike quality associated with surrealism, an artistic movement that expresses the work of the sub-

conscious through imagery and juxtaposition of subject matter. In one of Cooper's paintings, a realistically-painted woman in a yellow tank top stands before a broken

white picket fence, a fallen mailbox at her feet and an ominous red sky hanging threateningly above her. Other paintings are similar, with figures pitted against strange backgrounds, sometimes disturbing, often times thought provoking. Some of his paintings are giant portraits, all the expression locked in the eyes and faces of his subjects. The vivid colors and dreamy imagery of movies like "The Wizard of Oz" and "The City of Lost Children" have influenced him, he said. The influence is clear. The shadowy blues are eerie, the reds are violent and the yellows are bright as the summer sun, all like some-

thing out of a long, twisted dream. After graduating from UF last Fall, Cooper stayed in Gainesville for another semester, concentrating on his artwork and minor side projects before moving back home to Orlando.

"Right now I'm buying houses and fixing them up," he said. "Just doing whatever I can do to make money without having to get a real job."

That's just for now.

This artist has bigger plans in the future.

"Hopefully I'll become rich and famous," he said with a slight laugh.

Acoustics to strum Eddie C's

He is known as Brian Ware offstage, but when he is playing, he is an act. He is A Shameful Display.

Ware is a 20-year-old acoustic artist playing tonight at Eddie C's, to be specific. Playing shows with bands such as Yellowcard, Fall Out Boy and The Starting Line is taking his career everywhere but in a shameful direction.

Ware says the name came from a saying he used a lot when he was a kid.

"Anytime I would see something funny or embarrassing, I would say 'that was a shameful display,'" says Ware. "I wanted a name I wouldn't be embarrassed to say and it leaves me open to expand the act."

But right now, he isn't looking to add any band behind him.

"If I ever added a band, I would want to do a classical approach with lots of string instruments," Ware says.

Ware's love for being onstage

keeps him from attending many local shows.

"I hate going to concerts now, especially big ones," he says. "The more you're sitting there, the more you wish you were up there on stage."

Ware is often compared vocally to bands like MxPx, The Used and Yellowcard. He describes his new album as an acoustic mixed-down version of Yellowcard, Punchline or Fall Out Boy.

It's easy to describe Ware as another Dashboard Confessional or The New Amsterdams because of the one-guy-with-an-acoustic-guitar act. But after you listen to his music, you can hear the difference.

"Every day I get compared to Dashboard Confessional. Chris Carrabba is a pussy," Ware says.

Not that Ware doesn't like Dashboard Confessional, he says

it is just what they write about that makes the two acts different.

"That's all he (Carrabba) writes about is girls and he is blunt about it. He is open-hearted about that stuff," Ware says.

Ware says his new album is about life.

"Everyone telling you that you're going to fail. No one is behind you," he says. "That's what my new album is about."

Ware says his biggest obstacle so far has been his parents.

"They avoid the topic," he says. "They just pretend like it's not happening."

His new album should be released in July.

And ladies, Ware says it only takes him four minutes to get his clothes off.

There is nothing shameful about that.

Movie nails cliché head on

When you go see to a movie there are many things you expect. You expect a great story, memorable characters, a little action and a little romance. Well, "Cinderella Man" gave me everything I expected — a little too much of the expected, to be honest.

The film, opening tomorrow, is an uplifting Depression-era drama starring Russell Crowe ("Gladiator," "A Beautiful Mind") as the real-life New Jersey boxer James J. Braddock. With Renee Zellweger ("Chicago," "Bridget Jones's Diary") starring as his loyal wife Mae and Paul Giamatti ("Sideways") as his smart-mouthed manager, the film will no doubt be the sentimental, good-hearted movie of the summer.

Crowe portrays Braddock convincingly, and we sadly follow the boxer as he falls from success during the Depression, struggling to cope with a life of poverty for his family's sake. When Braddock earns a second chance to rise to the top of the boxing world, Crowe becomes an emotional and commanding powerhouse in and out of the ring. Crowe and Zellweger have definite chemistry, but the dialogue and situations seemed way too rehearsed. I felt like director Ron Howard meticulously placed the emotional scenes so that all I needed was a man walking across the bottom of the theater with a big, blinking sign that said, "Cry now!"

The three Braddock children bring some of the most heart-wrenching moments in the movie, since nothing tugs at the heartstrings more than a cute child in jeopardy. Howard hits the struggle of the Depression head-on and authentically portrays the helplessness of Americans during the '30s.

I found the boxing scenes to be very well-shot and choreographed. Howard really brings the feel of the golden age of boxing to the screen. Rated PG-13, the violent fight scenes aren't entirely gruesome, but I found myself cringing during some of the hard blows.

Audiences will applaud the boxer's heart as he fights for his family's well-being, instead of the glory of winning. Everyone loves an underdog. Giamatti brings most of the light-hearted humor to the story and adds to Braddock's comeback.

With four components of Oscar-nomination criteria — Howard as director, Crowe as the hero, Zellweger as the strong wife and on-the-money cinematography — "Cinderella Man" will almost certainly be a typical "safe" nomination for Best Picture. While I don't think "Cinderella Man" will win, it will be the "Seabiscuit" of the 2003 Oscars, bringing a light of happiness to the usually twisted and depressing Best Picture category. Overall, the film is a safe bet and by the end of it will have everyone singing, "Cinderelly, Cinderelly" — what else can you expect?

New theatre spotlights the times

8-track offers free love, Bee Gees, booty shakes

Flashing vanity lights, tinsel-string curtains and a checkered floor with multi-colored lighting all scream "Get down tonight."

"8-Track, Sounds of the '70s" portrays the disco-decade in all its glory. The eight-part musical reminisces about the protests, parties, free love and overall spirit that inspired the hit music of that infamously groovy period in time.

As the song says, "Where do I begin." Between the skyscraping platform shoes, the promiscuous dance moves or the crazy — excuse me — far-out music, it's impossible to choose a favorite.

All of the greats make their way into this two-hour time warp. Rick Seiber, creator of the musical, chooses The Carpenters, Barry Manilow, Marvin Gaye, The Bee Gees and The Jackson Five, among others, to define the era.

The four-person cast, directed by Lauren Caldwell, has endless energy. But no one shakes their booty as well as Rachel Anton. Her vocals are strong and rich, her move-

ments are sharply executed at just the right second, and she does it all with a constant, contagious smile.

Chad Hudson single-handedly makes the corniness and clichés of the time unbearably endearing. He is best with his pet rock in "Alone Again Naturally." His expressions are genuine and his movements are well timed.

Kelly Atkins has a wide vocal range, well demonstrated as light and fluffy in "Everything is Beautiful," but full and deep in "What's Going On." Her movements are always accurate but sometimes lack pizzazz.

Armando Acevado is perfect for most of the faster songs — "War," "Takin' it to the Streets" and "The Letter." However, he is sometimes a little stiff and his expressions do not mesh well with his softer songs.

The all-out flashback ends with a burst of energy, and then the disco era is over. The cast and the songs linger a while — kind of like the decade of peace, love and happiness. It was definitely a worthwhile trip.

'Over the River' debates modern life complexities

To Grandmother's house we go. "Over the River" jabs at today's youth culture — college graduates that are adamantly independent, work-oriented, endlessly picky with love and, more often than not, in need of therapy.

The focus is on the common conflicting interests between work and family. Which is more important? The answer is ultimately left up to the audience, but the show makes a great case for the family.

Every Sunday, Nick Cristiano goes to his big Italian family dinner, complete with both sets of grandparents, ravioli and a side dish of guilt.

This family comedy is executed heartily and with a lightly profound air. Performed entirely on a living room and dining room set, complete with grandma's afghan, the plot is simple and moves along quickly, as does the dialogue. There are no hidden motives and very few secrets in the tightly-knit family, but their close

ties unravel when Nick decides to move to Washington — "not the close one, the far away one," as Grandpa says.

The play unfolds, offering a subtle, yet fluid debate between the virtues of tradition and the opportunities of modern life. What makes the play is the cast's ability to slip into its roles to the point of submersion.

They seem to have bonded, and their chemistry feels genuine and familiar.

Nick, played by Jeffrey Nowlin, is the adequate center of the performance. He portrays an urgent annoyance that melts throughout the show to a calm appreciation and happiness.

Jennie Stringfellow was especially glowing in her portrayal of Nana Aida, a cheerful woman with a dying wish to please and feed anyone who sets foot in her house.

Newcomer to the stage Elizabeth Hovarter is a close second as Caitlin,

the girl next door with a shy smile, part of a ploy dreamed up by Nick's grandmother to get him to stay in New Jersey.

Pat Thomson plays the scheming busybody grandmother, Emma, who is half of the louder set of grandparents. Her other half, Nunzio, played by Henry T. Wihnyk, may be the most selfless character and under appreciated of the bunch. Wihnyk accomplishes a rare kind of disguised sadness to his smiling face.

Bill Sabis is the grandfather we all know and love, Frank. He is gruff, he is stubborn and he is also very honest and often funny.

Catch "8-Track, Sounds of the '70s" at the Hippodrome June 3 through June 26.
"Over the River" will play weekends at the Gainesville Community Playhouse's second stage location from May 27 through June 12.


NCAA MEN'S GOLF UF tied for 15th

The only two golf teams under par after one round of the NCAA Championship hail from the Southeastern Conference, but UF isn't one of them.

The No. 7 Gators completed the first of four rounds on Wednesday tied for 15th at 9 over par, 15 shots behind leader Georgia and 10 behind Tennessee.

James Vargas spurred the Gators with a 3-under-par 67 at the Caves Valley Golf Club in Baltimore.

The junior birdied three holes in a row from 14-16, finishing with five birdies on the day. Vargas ended the round two shots behind the leaders and in a tie for fourth place.

Three more UF golfers shot rounds of 4-over-par 74 and finished tied for 87th after day one.


Juniors Matt Every and Brett Stegmaier and redshirt senior Richard Treis combined to record eight birdies, but also fired eleven bogeys, three double bogeys and a triple bogey.

round draft pick next year. They have two other arms that are unbelievable also."

Miller is a 2003 graduate of Buchholz High School. He chose the Tar Heels over the Devil Rays, the team that selected him in the third round of the 2003 draft.

"There won't be any blow-outs in this regional," Corsaletti said. "There will be a lot of exciting games."

Stetson comes into the NCAA Tournament after winning the Atlantic Sun Conference Tournament.

The Hatters nearly defeated the Gators on May 18 at McKethan Stadium. UF came from behind to win 6-4 on the strength of a Matt LaPorta home run.

"I thought that game, at that time of the season, was a pivotal point for our ballclub," McMahon said. "We came from behind to win, and as a result, it really helped us in many ways."

In the game, Stetson's Chris Ingoglia pitched six innings to hold the Gators to three runs before the bullpen allowed three runs in the loss.

Ingoglia will face the Gators

again on Friday. The sophomore left-hander holds an 8-3 record with a 4.56 ERA this season.


The Gators will send Alan Horne to the mound, four days before he will likely be drafted for the third time in the MLB draft.

"It feels great to be chosen to start on Friday," Horne said. "We have confidence in any of our guys to go out there and get it done. To be recognized as the guy that gets to go out there and get in the winner's bracket, it's awesome."

Horne was selected in the 30th round of the draft in 2004. In 2001, he was the 27th overall selection in the draft, but opted to enroll at Mississippi.

"This year has been the first time in a long time that I've had fun playing ball," Horne said. "I've been healthy down the stretch. That's a big testament to Coach McMahon and the rest of the team. Hopefully we take it all the way and keep winning, so there won't be anything to regret after the season."

McMahon has not yet decided which pitcher will start the Saturday and Sunday games. Junior Bryan Ball struggled against Mississippi in the SEC tournament, but senior Tommy Boss and freshman Stephen Locke were impressive.

Yet something feels different about this season, besides the fact that UF cannot face Miami unless both teams make it to Omaha and the baseball gods feel like sharing a good laugh.



Gators ready to go mad on Hatters

The promised land of Nebraska waits only six wins from Gainesville.

The sixth-ranked UF baseball team has talked of breaking the season down into different stages since January.

After a disappointing loss in Coral Gables last year in the Super Regional round of the NCAA Tournament, the Gators hope to have an opportunity to finally break through to the next level.

In college baseball, that next level awaits in Omaha, Neb., in the College World Series.


UF coach Pat McMahon and his four senior players hope to extend their fourth season for another month.

The Gators will face McMahon's alma mater, Stetson (35-26), at 8 p.m. on Friday in the opening game of the regional tournament for each team. The winner will face the victor of the Notre Dame and North Carolina game that will be played at 4 p.m.

LaPorta needs seven more home runs. He has been stuck at 23, the second most in the nation, for five games now.


He's tied for the UF single-season record with former Gators Ryan Shealy and Brad Wilkerson. But the seven he needs aren't about the record.

Corsaletti would not only hand LaPorta a bag with a dollar sign on it, but he'd probably give Matt his ATM pin number and a stack of blank checks.

You see, the 30th home run would likely occur sometime during the College World Series.

While a trip to Omaha — college baseball's version of Zion — would be a fantastic accomplishment for LaPorta, Brian Leclerc and the rest of UF's youngsters, it would be the ultimate moment of bliss for Corsaletti and a handful of seniors who, in their four years in Gainesville, have achieved plenty and little at the same time.

The final journey for the seniors begins Friday at McKethan Stadium, which is ironic because that's the same place the tumultuous journey took its first unexpected twist.



He's had so many chances. It was basically a lock five games ago.

It doesn't really matter to him.

"I'm at 23," he said. "There are only three people at the University of Florida that have hit 23. That's an elite group; they're great people."

"If I hit 24, I hit 24. If not, I'm in good company."

Good company, indeed. Wilkerson is now the leadoff hitter for the Washington Nationals. During spring training this year, he said he would welcome his record being broken.

"Records are made to be broken," Wilkerson said. "If somebody can step it up and do that, I'd be happy for them. I think guys focus sometimes too much on the home run and hitting the ball hard sometimes."

But not LaPorta. Just ask Corsaletti, who worked with LaPorta on being a more complete hitter.

"The funny thing is, he doesn't try to hit home runs," Corsaletti said. "He just has so much raw power, it's scary."

How scary? Well, LaPorta hit three game-winning home runs in the final week of the regular season.

"Coming up in big situations like that and helping us to the SEC Championship is one of the highlights of my career," he said, adding that he

got lucky.

Coach Pat McMahon said that is one of the things that makes LaPorta special. He said LaPorta likes hitting in crucial situations.

"There a lot of guys that have been around certain seasons that have put up numbers, but very few have the impact numbers," McMahon said. "I've been around a lot of players that hit a lot of home runs or do some things when it's a 10-0 or 0-10 game."

This is the time of year that matters most. These games mean something.

Because of that, one teammate said the rest of the Gainesville regional better watch out.

"I know he hasn't hit one in five games, so this regional should be kind of exciting because he's due," Corsaletti said.
