Online voting to go secure

A new plan for online voting is two weeks away from becoming Student Government law, but not everyone in SG believes the new program offers the accessibility needed to increase student participation in SG elections.

The SG online-voting committee met Sunday and almost unanimously decided that "secured-site" online voting, which requires students to vote on-campus, was the way to go.

The committee made its final choice for the secured system over "unsecured-site" online voting, which would allow students to vote anywhere via the Internet.

"The only way to preserve voter insulation, complete anonymity of the ballot and privacy was to preserve polling locations that would not allow for voter coercion," committee chairman Sen. Jared Hernandez said.

The system, which will be presented to the Student Senate today for the first time, does not allow multiple votes and is re-

garded as the most secure option, according to an SG Web site.

It also would allow students to vote at any polling location on campus.

The current paper-ballot system requires students to vote at designated locations based on their majors and is believed to increase the likelihood of ballot-compromis-

"That will be the question for senators" on Tuesday," Hernandez said. "What do we

privilege most? Is it convenience or integrity?'

Hernandez said the proposed system will save SG \$25,000 to \$30,000 every election, the cost of maintaining and processing paper ballots.

The committee used the results from 19 non-SG member ballots passed out at last week's public forum in their decisionmaking process, Hernandez said, although the results of that informal ballot were inconsistent with their final decision

Seven participants in the forum poll voted for "online voting via unsecured system," six for "online voting via secured system," three for "none of the above" or didn't mark their cards, two for "paper system" and one for "electronic voting."

"The numbers are pretty low," Hernandez said. "I wouldn't make that big a deal out of the indications from the public fo-

Non-SG members also voiced their opinions anonymously on the ballots.

"We owe it to the student body to get the highest voter turnout possible," one participant wrote.

Another wrote, "'Secured' online voting is extremely imperative because 'unsecured' voting could get severely out of

The "online voting via unsecured system" does not have as many security checkpoints. But a description of the unsecured system on the SG Web site states that "ballots are not easily

Campus housing to receive wireless

MOST DORM COMMON AREAS SHOULD HAVE WIRELESS INTER-**NET BY NEXT YEAR.**

Students living in UF housing soon will have access to wireless Internet in common areas thanks to efforts by Student Government and the Department of Housing and Education to increase online technology usage on campus.

While wireless Internet access is available throughout much of UF's northeast sector, including Turlington Plaza, residence halls do not yet boast wireless capabilities.

Assistant Director of Housing Sharon Blansett said that will begin to change within the next year.

"In village communities, which house a lot of graduate students, we're trying to make commons areas wireless by 2006," she said.

After the technology is implemented in graduate housing areas, it will be tested in several undergraduate

housing facilities, including the common areas Campus of Hume, Graham and Broward halls.

In addition, several halls will feature outdoor wireless coverage

"The Tolbert-Riker park is going to have it, and the Murphree courtyards were just redone, and they'll have it as well," Blansett said. "We want students to have Internet capabilities outside of just their rooms."

However, Blansett emphasized that Internet access inside individual rooms will remain the same.

"I don't anticipate this replacing the

DHNet system," she said. "It's more of an additional thing."

While wireless access in graduate villages will be funded by the housing department, SG passed legislation during Spring providing for the new technology to be installed in other locations across campus as well as the Lake Wauburg area.


Last year, a Senate bill appropriated \$23,980 of reserve money toward funding the technology.

"For the most part, we wanted to cover outdoor areas," said former Student Body Treasurer Dennis Ngin, who also co-authored the bill along with the executive staff of last year's SG administration.

"We also covered indoor places like Hume and Broward because they're major traffic areas, and I think the Graham Gallery is open 24 hours a day."





Repairs put damper on O'Dome summer swimming

Students have to find a new place to swim for the dog days of summer.

The Stephen C. O'Connell Center Pool has been closed for five weeks to resurface the deck and to replace the pool liner. It is scheduled to reopen

Student Aug. 24.

The deck is being repaired because it is starting to wear away

and is slippery, said Jeremy Cynkar, assistant director of the O'Connell

Although there have been no accidents from the slick deck, it still has been a safety concern, he said.

Cynkar said the pool deck was resurfaced by Sundek last summer and is still under warranty.

"I know the deck wasn't done correctly," he said.

When the pool deck is resurfaced, an extra compound will be added to make it less slick when wet, he said.

Weller Pools will replace the pool liner, which has worn down over time, he said.

He said expenses will be minimal as both the deck and the liner are still under warranty.

Cynkar said he tried to minimize the time the pool will be closed by ordering the repairs for the end of summer. The pool will be closed for the last three weeks of school and the two weeks of break.

"I have made it a point to them that it must be done by the 23rd,"

Recreational swimmers can use the Florida Pool next to the Student Recreation and Fitness Center while the center's indoor pool is being repaired, he said.

Erva Gilliam, coordinator of the Carse Swimming and Diving Complex, said swim-team practice scheduled at the O'Connell Center will be held at the facility's outdoor pool, owned by the University Athletic Association.

Because the outdoor pool has only five lanes compared to the inside pool's eight, practice times will be staggered to accommodate the swim team, she said.

The UAA pool also will be used by swim camps and the UF football team for water resistance, she said.

"It is going to be tight," she said.

Engineering college receives \$1 million endowment

THE GIFT COULD TOTAL MORE THAN \$2 MILLION.

A major employer of graduates from UF's College of Engineering gave back to the university Friday when Harris Corporation donated more than \$1 million to endow multiple professorships in the engineer-

Howard Lance, chairman, president and CEO of Harris Corporation, presented UF President Bernie Machen and College of Engineering Dean Pramod Khargonekar with the gift Friday morning in front of the New Engineering Building.

The college and Harris agree that the best way to move the engineering program to the next level is add well-respected faculty in specific areas of study," Harris Corp. spokesman Tom Hausman said.

The company initially pledged \$1 million over five years, but it then tacked on an

Gifts Trust Fund, Hausman said. Machen also announced the gift will be matched with \$250,000 from

a fund set up through his Faculty Challenge initiative, which brings the potential value of the gift to more than \$2 million.

Six years ago, Harris Corp. made a previous pledge of \$600,000, which was used for graduate fellowship awards, to the engineering school.

UF has been the No. 1 recruiting source for Harris Corp. for the past

five years, said Hausman.
"Many of our high-caliber engineers have gone to work for Harris," said Vikram Shishodia,

assistant director of the Division of Student Affairs for the College of Engineering.

Hausman said Harris Corp. currently employs 460 UF grads, 320 of whom are engineers. He said Harris Corp. also employs business and accounting majors for a total workforce of about 12,500 worldwide, 6,500 of whom are engineers or scientists.

Twenty-two UF graduates were hired by Harris Corp. this year, Hausman said.



Sweltering heat doesn't keep locals from protest rally

THE RALLY WAS PUT ON TO RAISE AWARENESS OF THE "DOWNING STREET MEMOS."

More than the local heat index rose this weekend as Gainesville residents gathered to call for a government review of documents challenging the U.S. government's impetus for invading Iraq.

About 80 people sweated, listened, fanned themselves, applauded, ate, performed and made speeches to commemorate the Downing Street Memo Third Anniversary Event at the Florida School of Massage on Saturday afternoon.

Organized by local political groups such as the county branches of Progressives, Democrats and the Green Party, Veterans for Peace and the Community Coalition Against War and Terror, the event called for government action on the Downing Street memos.

The memos are said to contain evidence that the Bush administration planned the war in Iraq before the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001 and that the British government had no knowledge of the development of weapons of mass destruction in Iraq.

Retired Navy officer Dave Bruderly, who plans to run in the 2006 Congressional race for Florida's sixth district, took to the small wooden house's front porch, a makeshift stage on the grounds of the school,

and emphasized the memos were "memorandum[s] of fact."

He said the United Nations should be brought into Iraq and the United States should get out.

Former Ambassador to Peru Dennis Jett, who now serves as dean of UF's International Center, was widely ap-

plauded as he de-Gainesville livered remarks at the request of his former research assistant who

was involved in the event. "If we supported our troops, we'd impeach their leader," he said, calling for listeners to involve

their friends. After his speech, Jett equated the events behind the war in Iraq to Watergate and said he thought "a crime has been committed at the

Event coordinator Shelly Packer said approximately 500 other groups met in cities across the country on the same day to discuss the issue.

Later in the afternoon, a handful of performers and a dog named Rooty staged a rendition of the meeting from which the documents originated at 10 Downing St. in

The basic script came from the Web site, www.afterdowningstreet. org, said Jerry Rose, the playwright who adapted the script for the day's performance.

Rose said he expanded the information from the Web site to include things for dramatic effect that may not have been said at the meeting but were from other memos.

Though hard to hear at times, it


drew an appreciative roar from the audience when "Tony Blair" made his entrance as a Bush-mask-wearing dachshund led by owner David Dick.


The event was funded by inkind donations from organizers and individuals who purchased food items or rented sound equipment for the event, Packer said. În total, he said the event was funded by about \$300.

Brenda Bayne, a co-coordinator of the Alachua County's chapter of Democracy for America, said the number of attendees who braved the summer heat showed the Gainesville community's interest in what was happening with its government. She also said the people who attended were not radical.

"They actually care about America," Bayne said.

Unsecure choice

Internet voting the only real step forward

e spoke too soon last week when we said online voting was on its way to Student Government. The proposal possibly on its way to Student Senate isn't for online voting at all - in fact, it's a lie.

For years, SG has appointed committees, commissioned independent reports, hired consultants and received petitions on this issue. Every time a plan gets close to implementation, it's killed before it reaches the Senate floor.

In February, a petition with more than 1,000 signatures calling for a ballot initiative on online voting was denied by the SG Supreme Court on less than a loophole - more like the eye of a

The letter announcing the Court's decision stated "ambiguous" language in the petition made it unclear whether it called for an initiative, which if passed becomes binding law, or a referendum, which is just a show of support or dissent.

Of course, the petition said "initiative" several times and in no place said "referendum."

But SG sat on the hopes of an appointed online-voting committee, which spent all summer reviewing information gathered by past committees.

Then that committee called a forum last week to present its findings. Suddenly, two options were considered online voting: "secured-site" voting, which used to be called "intranet voting," an online voting system restricted to on-campus polling locations; and "unsecured-site" voting, which is true Internet voting.

The latter was rejected and then banned by the committee in the face of strong student support because of "security concerns," a term as ambiguous as that loophole.

What security concerns? We've never heard a single argument outlining specific problems with Internet voting that don't have easy solutions and aren't an issue with all voting systems.

True, committee members can scare us by saying our votes could be coerced by evil forces within SG. But that happens now on campus using paper ballots.

Proponents of the "secured" system say keeping the polls controlled will prevent voter influence from crossing the "50foot halo" around the location, so voters won't have people looking over their shoulders. But the coercion that takes place now shows that 50-foot barrier means nothing.

Who really has an incentive to restrict voting to a handful of polling locations on campus? Groups who can capitalize on the relatively few students with a lot of access to the sites - like those who live on campus.

The recent SFCC transfer student with a full-time job and maybe a full-blown life outside of keeping incessant track of every detail of SG isn't the type we've heard accused of voter

It also means all the convincing we've had from UF about the ways we are forced to interact with the university online are safe and mostly free from harm - they're all predicated on a lie.

If a student thinks nothing of shooting thousands of dollars through ISIS on a semesterly basis, after having registered for classes, verified sensitive financial aid information and pulled a degree audit detailing every class she's ever taken, then she can handle an Internet ballot.

But that hard-working student may not pay as much attention as the few interested parties who vote in our current system.

That's what some in SG may want to say, to defend artificially limiting turnout, but won't because it exposes the inherent fallacy of the "democratic" system we have now.

Democracy is not supposed to be a system of elites. The process takes a leap of faith and gives everyone a fair vote, and then candidates try to appeal to as many as possible.

So we urge you to appeal to SG to do the right thing, the thing you've voted for in every poll we've run for years - let's bring real, fair Internet voting to campus elections.

'Happy Jack' opens for Judge Roberts

n July 19, President Bush hit the stop button on the official presidential boom box, thus ending almost three weeks of butt shimmying for the latest open seat on the Supreme Court.

There were many a bruised arse, but in the game of

Court musical chairs, "There can be only one!"
His name is John G. Roberts, Jr., and he currently serves as an appellate judge on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit.

Bush announced Roberts' nomination in his first ever prime-time press conference as president. No stranger to pre-emption, Bush ended up delaying the first 15 minutes of NBC's new show "I Want to Be a Hilton."

According to an anonymous but reliable source, "Happy Jack," as I like to call him, idolizes guitarist Pete Townshend of The Who.

The elder Roberts was born in Buffalo, New York but moved to Long Beach, Indiana when he was in elementary school. While in high school, he worked in a steel mill his father managed.

Rumor has it former vice-presidential candidate John Edwards responded to the nomination by running through the streets of UNC shouting, "I too, am the son a millworker!

Roberts graduated at the top of his class from both Harvard College and Harvard Law School. While in **Aaron Blye** Blye's Eyes ablye@alligator.org school, he was more of a bookworm than a Beantown boozehound.

After graduating from Harvard Law, Roberts became a clerk for then-Associate Justice William Rehnquist. He later entered private practice and argued 39 cases before the Supreme Court in addition to working for former presi-

dents Reagan and Bush. In 2001, a bipartisan group of more than 150 lawyers sent a letter to the Senate Judiciary Committee advocating Roberts' appointment to the D.C. Circuit, but it wasn't until 2003 that his appointment was realized.

Many Democrats and Republicans believe he is one the most talented legal minds in America.

It was inevitable that President Bush would nominate someone more conservative than retiring Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, but thankfully he chose a candidate that appears to be more even-minded than several of the rumored nominees.

However, Democrats are correct to withhold judgment until the Senate Judiciary Committee Hearings.

Liberals are ready to grill Roberts on the hot-button issue of abortion. As an attorney he wrote a brief advocating the Supreme Court overturn Roe v. Wade; but in all fairness he was representing the views of a client.

Although I believe women have a constitutional right to choose abortion, liberals must not forget there are other extremely important issues like civil liberties, abuse of executive power, environmental law and eminent domain.

It was basically inevitable that the Supreme Court would move to the right, but if "Happy Jack" keeps on rockin' in the free world, his antics just might influence good ol' dad to loosen up and take a chill pill.

Editor: Today, a bill will be brought before the Student Senate altering the Student Body Statutes Election Code, authorizing the use of online voting in Student Government elections.

The bill, authored by the Senate Committee to Investigate Online Voting, will recommend SG adopt a system of online voting that allows students to submit votes via on-campus computers from any of ten on-campus polling locations, once they have had their identification verified by a poll worker.

I applaud the committee for bringing to partial fruition a cause that is long overdue.

However, I remain deeply disappointed with my representatives in SG who have decided to conserve instead of empower.

Instituting a truly universal system of online voting, one which more than 1,200 students expressed an interest in, and one which would allow any student to vote from any computer, would have been an opportunity for every member of the Student Senate to stand behind its promise from Spring 2005 to institute a system of online voting.

The committee's recommendation is a good first step, but it is just that: a first step. If SG officials want to be taken seriously, they must continue their work toward making true

online voting a reality.

Until then, the promise to "Bring SG to Every Gator" remains unfulfilled.


However, the jeering continued with chants of, "America! America! Go USA!"

New physical therapy grad program offered at UF

UF graduate students can begin working toward an entry-level clinical doctoral degree in physical therapy for the first time this Fall.

The Doctor of Physical Therapy degree, or DPT, will replace the current master's program in the physical-therapy department of UF's College of Public Health and Health Professions and is offered by only one other Florida public university, USF.

The goal of the new program is to make graduates capable of evaluation and patient treatment when working with other health professionals as part of a team, said Jane Day, clinical professor and assistant chair of the physical-therapy department.

"The practice has changed so much that we need more information to provide care,"

she said

Compared to the master's program, the DPT program will require 35 additional credit hours and a clinical internship, Day said.

However, she said the entire 113-credit curriculum has been refocused to meet the objectives of the new program.

"There's a bigger emphasis on health promotion and wellness in the programs," Day said. "The whole curriculum has been redone."

Old courses have been restructured and integrated with new courses to focus on topics such as radiology and imaging, pharmacology and diagnosis, she said.

Mark Bishop, physical therapy lecturer, said he has been updating his lecture notes and slides to the new curriculum during the summer.

"The old curriculum has anatomy and bio-

mechanics as separate classes," he said. "The new curriculum combines the subjects into one big superclass that's two semesters long."

Bishop said students complained in previous years about feeling disconnections in class material.

Students would dissect the arm but not talk about the biomechanics of the arm until the next semester when, at that time, they're dissecting the foot, he said.

By eliminating redundancy in classes and reordering lecture material, the new curriculum will help students

easily absorb information, he said.

To apply for the program, students need a bachelor's degree, a minimum score of 1000 on the Graduate Record Examinations and

at least 40 hours of observation or volunteer work as well as other requirements, Day said.

Current master's students caught in the transition will have the option to earn a DPT by completing an extra year of courses, she said.

As more planned classes arrive, the department will need more faculty members to fulfill the needs of students, Day said. One new instructor has been hired already, and the department plans to hire four more in the coming year, she said.

Since the American Physical Therapy Association is endorsing the switch to the new program nationwide, Day said she believes the program will continue to expand and grow in popularity.

"To be competitive realistically now, programs have to do this, or they're not going to get all the applicants," she said.

compromised."

The unsecured system is also cheaper.

Hernandez said the committee thought the unsecured option could promote voter

"I think there is voter persuasion (now)," he said. "There's a 50-foot halo around the polling location so there's not direct voter coercion."

This legislation does not include UF's satellite campuses and study-abroad programs, but Hernandez said that group of students will not be ignored.

"We would be able to set up

a polling location at the satellite campus," he said. "They would be able to vote there. Students studying abroad have to request an absentee ballot."

But Senate President Diane Kassim, who created the committee, said secured-site voting might not be the best conclusion given student sentiment toward an Internet system.

"This may be a compromise, but I don't want to compromise with the students losing in the end," she said. "I don't want them to be blind-sided by this version of online voting. I know a lot of my constituents prefer the unsecured option."

Kassim said at one point she thought the situation was a

political ploy, but added the diversity in the online voting committee gives her confidence.

"The diversification of the body helped," she said. "I do believe it's a step in the right direction."

However, she said the terminology used to distinguish between the online-voting models is confusing. Hernandez said the committee came to an agreement on the names.

Sources close to SG said some members had a problem with the way Hernandez handled his committee.

Committee member Sen. Gareth Kerr said he hasn't seen it.

"I think that he was biased in making sure that we had a system that would satisfy our three goals: integrity, access and participation," he said. "If you want to call that bias, then he's biased to those goals."

Committee member Sen. Susan Henriques said the committee's finished product just isn't the best option.

"I feel like a large portion of students would say that they want unsecured online voting," she said. "The bill that the committee has designed to put through is not what the students want."

Hernandez said his chairmanship has been a challenge.

"This is a political hand grenade," he said.

Ngin added that although SG reserve funding covered all the new technology's costs, the money was transferred to another department to be spent, and SG ultimately did not make any direct purchases.

"SG didn't physically buy any equipment," he said. "That money was transferred to Computing and Networking Services."

Ngin said he didn't know if Computing and Networking Services was the department that eventually spent the allotted funds but speculated the Department of Housing may have made the final purchases to implement the technology.

In order to help cover expenses for wireless networking, rental rates for residence halls may increase, though Blansett said students living on campus shouldn't anticipate major pricing changes in the near future.

"We have to work a year ahead on rental-rate adjustments, and the rates we have set through Summer 2006 are already in place," she said.

In addition to expanded wireless Internet, Blansett said her department will have upgraded DHNet speed from 10 MB to 100 MB by Fall.

"Students are so tech-savvy now, and we're hoping to accommodate that," she said.

UF freshman Liliam Jarquin, a resident of Rawlings Hall, said the plan for increased wireless coverage sounds useful.

"I think that's good in case you need to study in that area," she said.

"As long as it doesn't make a huge difference in your rent payment, it's OK"

UF's strongest students compete for campus honor

A final grunt of brute strength and determination was barely audible over the sound of about 50 cheering onlookers as the tractor tire was flipped over the finish line.

James Maynor, 20, let out a yell of victory and relief as he completed the medley event in just under a minute.


On Sunday at the UVS Field, 15 of UF's strongest students competed for the title of the strongest in the Strong Gator, a strength competition hosted by the Division of Recreational Sports and modeled after the World's Strongest Man.

The competition consisted of five mock WSM events. The crucifix hold tested endurance and strength as students held out 15-pound weights at a 90-degree angle until they dropped them. The Olympic dead lift required students to perform as many repetitions as possible in 60 seconds with 315 pounds on the bar.

The Atlas Stone event consisted of lifting three water coolers weighing up to 150 pounds onto a table. For the farmer's walk, competitors had to carry a 140-pound block of concrete in each hand as far as they could. The final event was the medley, which involved a weighted sled pull, pushing a wheel barrel filled with 240 pounds of sand and weights, and a giant tire-flip over a set course.

The weights were adjusted for the three female competitors.

Maynor took first place in three of the five events and won the overall title of strongest gator. He has power lifted since high school

and currently trains twice a day, six days a week. His favorite event was the dead lift, which he won with 20 repetitions.

"It feels great to win considering how tough the competition was out here," Maynor said.

Kristin Trout, known as "The Krusher," won the women's overall title of strongest gator.

"I'm tired, but all the pain was worth it because now I have a new pick-up line to use at the bars," Trout said.

She said she will take her opponent and roommate, Mandy, out to dinner with the gift certificates she won from the competition.

Rick Stone, a 39-year-old decision and information sciences graduate student, was

the oldest competitor at Strong Gator. He said he participated because he likes to compete and wanted to make a statement.

"I want to be UF's strongest computer nerd," Stone said.

Stone said it was difficult to train for the competition because there is no real way to simulate the events.

"I don't have a giant tire or a weighted sled in my backyard," he said.

Most competitors made only minor changes to their regular work-out routines while training for the event. Graduate student Ryan Hall said he added grip-strength training to his normal work-out routine in order to prepare.

Hall said his favorite event was the farmer's walk and that the crucifix hold "burned like hell."


Debbie Renelus, a UF senior, said she felt most comfortable with the crucifix hold and the medley.

In order to prepare for the Strong Gator competition she added heavier weights to her routine and didn't do any cardiovascular training for the last week and a half.

Mai Tran, a strength and conditioning graduate assistant, helped plan and run the competition. She said this event ran more smoothly and was more fun than the trial competition that had been hosted in the Spring.

"All the volunteers and the competitors really made this event great and worth-while," Tran said.

The next Strong Gator competition will be held during the Spring semester. Both Maynor and "The Krusher" said they will be back to defend their titles.

UPD offers free defense class

Last Tuesday, seven women filed into a classroom in the University Police Department with one goal: to learn to defend themselves.

UPD's Rape Aggression Defense program, or RAD, a free, three-part 12-hour class, gives women the basic tools they need to protect themselves from an attacker, said officer Darren Sanders, a RAD instructor and coordinator of the program.

Sanders spoke about topics ranging from how to stay safe at home to safety when walking to one's car and when out on a date.

One piece of advice he offered was to attempt to break into their own houses.

"If you can get in, the bad guys can too," he said.

Other advice included trimming shrubs and bushes, especially those covering windows, making sure entrances are well-lit and keeping a phone in the bedroom to call for help in an emergency.

On Wednesday, the class learned some self-defense moves, and during the third class the students experienced simulations of dangerous situations.

The chief benefit of the class is that people with no background in self-defense can learn to protect themselves; Sanders said. If they should ever be attacked, they at least have a chance to defend themselves.

"It gives them options," he said. Alissa Barnard, a junior at Florida State University who is home for the break, took the class a little more than a year ago. She came back because the class gave her confidence, she said.

"It's good to refresh," she said.
"You forget it quickly."

In 2003, eight cases of sexual battery, which includes rape, were reported on or near the UF campus. Sexual battery is the least reported crime, Sanders said. He said he believes the actual number of cases may be higher. According to a RAD brochure, 10 times more are committed than are reported.

According to a 2001 report by the U.S. Department of Justice, three percent of college-age women will have some experience with a rape during a typical college year.

Sixty women have been through the class this year, a higher number than usual, Sanders said, while 265 have completed it since the program came to UF in Spring 2000.

The classes are offered to anyone associated with UF and to those in the community.

Classes are usually limited to 10 or 12 women.





Collegiate misuse of prescription drugs on the rise

Prescription-drug abuse has become more prevalent among UF students during the last five years, a UF expert said.

Paul Doering, co-director of the UF Drug Information and Pharmacy Resource Center, said in a phone interview that students "are discovering prescription drugs."

A July 7 report by the National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University stated that the abuse of prescription drugs had reached "epidemic" levels, with 15.1 million abusers in the United States.

The number of Americans who abused prescription drugs nearly doubled from 1992 to 2003, according to the report.

Teenagers were the fastest-growing group of new abusers, with 2.3 million Americans.

Doering said he was not surprised by the recent findings.

"On college campuses, UF included, prescription drugs tend to be used for recreational purposes rather than prescription,"

Doering said. "The thing that concerns me the most is that people think they are safer than hard drugs."

Doering said prescriptions, especially when mixed with other drugs, can be more lethal than street drugs. He said students do not understand the consequences and underestimate the drugs' effects.

In Spring 2000, a UF freshman died after mixing alcohol with an 80-milligram dose of a powerful opioid pain reliever called OxyContin. Abuse of prescription opioids rose 542 percent among teenagers during the 10-year span, more than four times the rate of increase among adults.

"The perceived danger of a drug is inversely proportional to the level of its use," Doering said. "That's the problem with prescription drug abuse — people think the risk is minimal. I feel sad for people who are so naïve."

Charles, a third-year UF marketing major who does not want to use his full name because of a pending legal investigation, said he learned his lesson after misusing a prescription drug last Spring.

Charles took a rectangular pill known as a "bar" of Xanax, a benzodiazepine used for antianxiety, while drinking with friends at a party.

He said he drank no more than six beers over a couple of hours.

"I still have no idea what happened that night," Charles said. "I was at a party around midnight. Next thing I know, it's sunny outside, and I'm in my own bed. Lying on the floor was a notice to appear from University Police for disorderly conduct."

Charles was seen near a vandalized luxury car in a parking garage approximately two miles from the party, according to a police report. UPD escorted him home at 4 a.m.

He had no recollection of the incident.

Doering said amnesia associated with mixing Xanax and alcohol can be "pretty profound."

"When you start mixing and matching these drugs, it is hard to predict the outcomes," Doering said.

Since coming to UF as an undergraduate in 1967, Doering has seen a lot of changes in the drug scene. He said the student lifestyle has changed completely from when he was an undergraduate.

He believes the 2 a.m. bar-closing time is a reason for the "power drinking and power drugging" that occurs at the "pre-party."

UPD spokesman Lt. Joe Sharkey said his agency does not keep statistics on prescription-drug offenses but that arrests are "very rate"

In Charles' case, UPD was unaware he had consumed Xanax.

Doering said prescription drugs are fairly easy to obtain illegally through the Internet, theft, local dealers or fraudulent claims made to doctors

"Where there's a market, there is a supply," he said.



UF center accused of using tennis racket as weapon

Late night incident leads to arrest of 7-foot-2 star

Editor's note: One of the most hilarious crimes in UF sports history may have made Schintzius a laughing stock around the SEC, but the center would have the last laugh. Here are two stories about an unforgettable moment.

UF basketball player Dwayne Schintzius is in trouble with his coaches and with the police after two men say he attacked them with a tennis racket early Saturday morning behind a downtown nightclub.

Head basketball coach Norm Sloan suspended Schintzius indefinitely Monday for an "offthe-court" incident. The junior center, who has often been criticized for his on-the-court behavior, can practice with the team but will not play for an undetermined number of games.

Saturday morning, Gainesville police charged Schintzius with two counts of battery for striking Paul Sullivan, 20, and Eric Gettshall, 20, with a tennis racket following a 2 a.m. argument in the rear parking lot of the Animal House nightclub.

Police reports said conflicting accounts prevented them from making an arrest at the scene. Instead, police issued a sworn complaint against the 7-foot-2 Schintzius. They also filed battery charges against Robet Emmon, a friend of Schintzius, who was involved in the fight.

Sullivan, a UF psychology student, also faces charges for throwing a half-full beer can into Schintzius' car.

Classic

Conflicting witness reports have clouded the events that led to the attack.

Schintzius, 20, declined to comment Monday, but Sullivan said the fight started after somebody in Schintzius' car threw a beer can into a group of people standing outside the nightclub.

The police report said a beer bottle hit Gainesville resident Anne Caruso but doesn't mention Sullivan getting struck. Caruso said Monday she wasn't hit with a bottle.

Sullivan, however, maintains that a beer can hit him in the

After getting hit, Sullivan said he picked up the can and threw it into the passing car. The car stopped and Schintzius and a friend got out-Schintzius holding a tennis racket.

'You never realize how big he is until he's standing in front of you with a tennis racket," Sullivan said.

Schintzius told police the incident began after someone first threw a beer bottle at his car.

Police reports said Schintzius and Enmon, a 22-year-old Brandon resident, exited the car and entered the crowd. Schintzius began swinging the tennis racket in the crowd, striking both Sullivan and Getshall, reports said.

When police arrived they questioned Schintzius Enmon, who were about to drive

Freshman basketball player Jose Ramos, who was also in the car with Schintzius, was questioned but not charged in the

Schintzius has had a turbulent career at UF since arriving in 1986. His problems have been related to his on-court attitude.

Some players and coaches who have worked with Schintzius said that his trying out this summer for the U.S. Olympic basketball team, under the instruction of Georgetown head coach John Thompson, has helped Schintzius mature.

Being hit by a tennis ball probably never felt so good for UF center Dwayne

A hail of tennis balls directed at Schintzius enabled him to send Wednesday's game against Vanderbilt into overtime and ultimately allowed

UF to beat the Commodores 81-78 in the Memorial Coliseum in Nashville.

Vanderbilt led 72-70 when UF forward Livingston Chatman threw the ball away with one second remaining in regulation. Fans then threw tennis balls onto the court to taunt Schintzius, who was suspended for four games this season for hitting a UF student with a tennis racket.

But the tennis balls kept Schintziusand UF—in the game this time. Schintzius and the Gators were awarded two technical foul shots. With 15,498 Vandy fans looking on, Schintzius sank both shots to send the game into overtime.

He then proceeded to score the first seven points of overtime to give UF a lead that Vanderbilt could not overcome.

UF improved to 10-9 overall and 4-4 in the Southeastern Conference. Vandy,

which was third in the SEC before the game, fell to 10-9,

"Schintzius stepped right up there and made both of them," UF coach Norm Sloan

said in his post-game radio interview. "You can't have any more pressure than what he had. I'm just real proud."

Schintzius scored 24 points in his 43

minutes of action despite playing with a sore back. Forward Dwayne Davis led UF with 15 rebounds, 10 of them offensive. Gator guard Clifford Lett played all 45 minutes.

Vanderbilt guard Barry Booker led Vandy with 23 points and eight rebounds. Booker hit seven of his 13 3-point field goal attempts.

UF led for most of the first half, but Vandy scored the first eight points of the second half to take a 32-24 lead with 17:50 remaining. The Gators, behind 11 points from Schintzius, closed the gap in the second half.

Experts sound off on Gators' chance at national, SEC titles

With the 2005-06 football season rapidly approaching, preseason predictions are heating up in media outlets across the nation.

A big name first-year coach and plenty of returning talent have fueled especially massive speculation over how Urban Meyer and the Gators will fare this season.

As they usually do on the playing field, UF and Tennessee have found themselves battling across a number of preseason polls this offseason, heightening intensity of the teams' already crucial Sept. 17 showdown.

But in the the world of gambling, the betting lines are painting a different picture. Current Las Vegas odds place the Gators at 20-1 to win the National Championship, while the Volunteers trail slightly at 22-1. LSU is the heavy favorite from the SEC, currently sitting at 12-1.

The Gators' odds are 7-2 to win the SEC, with the Volunteers falling closely behind at 4-1. LSU tops the lines again at 2-1.

A recent ESPN poll asked sports fans to pick the quarterback most likely to win the Heisman Award other than USC's Matt Leinart.

Crowder-less UF moves on

When a team loses a starter like Channing Crowder to the NFL Draft, there would normally be a learning curve or struggle in the following year to make up for the production

But with sophomore linebacker Brandon Siler stepping into Crowder's lead role, and junior Earl Everett becoming a veteran, UF's linebacking core could actually improve in

Siler, last year's Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year and last year's team leader in tackles, took every opportunity he could to study from the Miami Dolphinsbound Crowder so that UF wouldn't miss a

"Brandon came in his freshman year and learned a lot from Channing," Everett said. "He was lucky enough that he got a whole bunch of playing time early and he's learned the system perfectly."

From the front seven to the secondary, nine starters from a year ago return to anchor UF's defense.

While the faces might be the same, the system itself has been tweaked in order to be more aggressive in the trenches and in coverage.

Co-defensive coordinators Charlie Strong and Greg Mattison will provide a flash of old and new-school defense that should be vastly improved from where the Gators stood in 2004.

Junior defensive back Dee Webb could be poised for a national breakout year after leaving his mark on the SEC last year. Like many other athletes, Webb can easily recall when the lights went on for him a year ago.

"I was learning more and more every game, but in the LSU game when I got my first pick and I had my hands on the ball it was a relief," Webb said. "I dropped a couple. [of balls] in the games before, but that's the game that made me feel like I was in high school and the game came to me easier."

UF will be counting on several of the new defensive faces to get comfortable early on and make an impact much like sophomore safety Kyle Jackson did last year.

Four true freshmen — Jon Demps, Kalvin

Baker, Ryan Stamper and Darryl Gresham — will compete for playing time at the linebacker position.


Of the four, perhaps the one with best chance to emerge and make an immediate impact would be Demps.

At 6-foot-4, 219 pounds, the speedy linebacker looks and plays much like Everett did in his freshman year.

In the secondary, three true freshmen could compete for time at starting corner, nickel packages and the safety rotation. Avery Atkins is the only true corner UF signed, but he was widely regarded as one of the nation's best while at Daytona Mainland High School.

Dorian Munroe led Miami-Dade County in interceptions while playing at Coral Reef and Reggie Nelson could prove to be the best of the bunch in time.

A sophomore transfer, Nelson was a dominating safety while at Palm Bay High School two years ago and continued to play at a high level in junior college, leading his team in tackles with 72 and catching six interceptions.

Celtics sign Greene

When Orien Greene left UF for Louisana-Lafayette in 2002, few Gators fans expected to hear much from the former Gainesville High

Greene had failed to live up to expectations, and after he committed a last minute turnover in UF's first round NCAA Tournament loss to Creighton, Greene was hardly a fan favorite.

But after the Boston Celtics surprised many UF fans, and Greene himself, by selecting him with the 53rd pick in this year's NBA Draft, Boston president Danny Ainge went a step further on Monday, agreeing to a three-year deal with Greene worth approximately \$1.8 million. The first year of the contract will be guaranteed.

'It's a tremendous accomplishment and I'm just excited to be here," Greene said. "To get a chance to play for a franchise like this, it's a dream come true."

Mr. Florida Basketball in 2000, Greene didn't duplicate his high school success at UF, averaging just

more than 4 points per game in two years. But he did lead the team in steals his sophomore season, and his reputation as a defensive stopper followed him to Louisiana-Lafayette.

As a second round pick, Greene's contract was non-guaranteed, and after he fractured his foot this summer, Greene didn't expect to receive a contract offer.

So despite averaging just 10



points per game this past year and injuring his foot, Greene said that the Celtics were impressed with his ability to play the point at 6foot-5.

"I'm pretty polished right now, and I feel like I'm on the top of my game," Greene said. "I'll basically do whatever they need me to do to get on the court and play."

Greene said he wasn't sure how his career would have turned out had he stayed at UF, but he has no

"I'm always a firm believer that everything happens for a reason," he said. "It's the way the cards fell. I worked hard for it."

Durrance burst onto the scene in 1969 as part of a UF team dubbed the "Super Sophs."

Since freshmen weren't allowed to play varsity football at the time, Durrance, quarterback John Reaves, receiver Carlos Alvarez and other first-year players led the nation in passing yards.

A threat both on the ground and in the air, Durrance scored a then-SEC record of 18 combined touchdowns.

He still holds the UF record, along with Reidel Anthony, who tied it in

"He was a great player," Cheney said. "He was really great with both running and receiving skills plus he was tough as nails. It was really hard to bring him down."

A 1971 14th round NFL Draft selection by Pittsburgh, Durrance didn't attempt to make the roster, instead

choosing to head Halifax Paving, a family business.

"Contracts weren't like they are now. It was a big difference," Chaney said. "He would have been a pro player if he had his heart in it, but he was ready to go home. He was a Daytona boy, always has been. He was a hunter, a fisherman, an All-American kind of

Gators record-setting back Durrance dies at 55

■ TOUCHDOWN TOMMY IS STILL TIED FOR UF SCORING RECORD.

More than 35 years after he set the Southeastern Conference record for touchdowns in a season, Tommy Durrance had become just a shell of the colossal running back that instilled fear in the rest of the SEC.

But at his final team reunion this year, Durrance was still viewed as a larger-than-life figure to everyone that had come to know and love the former Gators star.

"He was in bad shape, but as we were leaving I walked out and tried to get his attention," said Ray Graves, Durrance's first coach at UF. "I told him about one of his great runs he made against Alabama, and he started smiling. His hand came out and I shook it.

ing. His hand came out and I shook it.

"Tommy was a winner. The players believed in him. To think he's gone is really sad."

The player known as Touchdown Tommy—both for his initials and a keen ability to find his way into the end zone—succumbed to a rare neurological disease on Friday that had plagued him since 2000. He was 55.

On Monday, hundreds of friends and family gathered in Ormond Beach for the funeral, but it was hardly a day of mourning. Instead, the group spent the day reminiscing about the man that thrilled UF football fans for three years and, more importantly, became a respected and beloved man in the Daytona community.

"It was a huge tribute, a lot of people were there to honor him and it was overwhelming to us," Durrance's wife Jo Lynn said. "It's just been a beautiful experience to see how many people's lives he touched."

Former UF teammate Andy Cheney said Durrance was always the team leader, but continued that role well past his playing career.

"It all went back to the stature he had as an athlete. He was such a physical specimen, he was in great physical

Most expect the receiver to play football.


Alabama's media frenzy is a must-see

Then I informed a couple of friends that I'd be driving to Birmingham this week to hear a bunch of coaches talk at a podium, they called me all sorts of strange names.

"You might as well drive to South Carolina and visit the boyhood home of former president James K. Polk," one friend said. "It just seems sort of pointless."

Welcome to the world of Southeastern Conference football, where every year 12 coaches, 24 players and nearly 1,000 media members flock to a Wynfrey Hotel in Alabama like it's a Grateful Dead fest or a Billy Graham tent revival.
