



Katrina brings devastation to Gulf Coast

As New Orleans faces the aftermath of one of the most devastating hurricanes in its history, UF's Disaster Plan Committee is working to ensure that both the university and surrounding areas are prepared to cope with future natural disasters that may target Gainesville.

Since the conclusion of last year's hurricane season, the Disaster Plan Committee has learned which areas of campus are most susceptible to hurricane damage.

"We've had to make a few changes since last year was such an active hurricane year," committee Chairman William Properzio said. "We now have two ongoing grants, one to prevent flooding around the Lake Alice area and one to put new windows in Bryant Hall."

Although the Federal Emergency Management Agency provides funding to the state of Florida for distribution during natural disasters, UF has not been reimbursed for all the costs it incurred after last year's hurricanes.

"Last year UF reported an inventory of \$14 million in damages, and

not all of that can be recovered," Properzio said, adding that some university-owned research stations in southern areas of the state were badly damaged by last year's storms.

"We're still in the process of filing for the damages, and we anticipate getting a third of the total cost back," he said.

In spite of UF's losses, Properzio said the school is well-prepared to deal with future inclement weather.

"If we are going to have some kind of event, the university will make available food and resources for students living on and off campus," he said.

"Last year we only shut down for one day, but if we were having to shut down for an extended period of time this year, adjustments would be made."

While students are advised to remain in their residence halls during hurricanes, UF also shelters Gainesville and Alachua County residents at the Reitz Union and the Southwest Recreation Center.

However, Properzio said storm shelters remain one of UF's biggest concerns during the hurricane season.

Leaders sport new logo

UF and Student Government hope to make orange and blue the new colors of the season.

UF administration and SG are engaged in separate re-branding strategies that seem to be striving toward one goal — to highlight the best of being a reptile in the Gator Nation.

SG recently spent \$1,600 of the tuition-funded Activity & Service Fee on redesigning its logo.

"Our logo has been outdated," Student Body President Joe Goldberg said. "We wanted a new look and a new feel for SG. I think it was time for a change. It's been talked about for years. We finally took the initiative and got it done."

Student Body Vice President Joyce Medina said the change was necessary because the old logo was "cartoonish."

"I've been hearing talks about revamping the SG logo since I've been in it," she said. "We

want to have a professional look. We've gotten great feedback. It's a great step in the right direction."

SG and its Accent, Student Government Productions and Student Legal Services branches spent \$67,187 from Summer C to the first week of Fall 2005 on advertising.

Goldberg said his administration has about 5 percent more than previous SG leaders to spend on advertising, but the SG executive branch total is still in the \$50,000 to \$60,000 range of their predecessors. It was from this money that the

The assembly is set for 7 p.m. in the Reitz Union Grand Ballroom.





Gas bill up for talk

Tonight, one student senator hopes to take the first step to tell the Florida Legislature how rising gas prices are affecting the cost of living at UF.

Sen. Ramon Looby will present the Student Senate with a resolution supporting the end of the Florida Motor Fuel Marketing Practices Act.

The act makes it unlawful for gas to be sold below cost and, according to the resolution, "restricts competition in a market where foreign oil is unfairly driving the price of fuel to record highs."

And with the price of gas soaring, "university students are suffering," Looby said.

Undergraduate students are expected to spend about \$400

a year for local transportation and gas, according to the estimated cost of living on UF's admissions Web site.

The Motor Fuel Relief Act was filed last week in the legislature proposing to end the old law. If the Student Senate passes Looby's resolution at tonight's

Student Government 7:30 meeting in Room 282 of the Reitz

Union, a letter will be sent to the Florida House stating that the UF student body encourages them to vote in favor of ending the old law, which would be in effect until June 2006.

Looby said his resolution and research were conceived before knowledge of possible effects Hurricane Katrina could have on fuel prices.

Bikes get campus traffic tickets too

■ IN THE FIRST FIVE DAYS OF SCHOOL, UPD ISSUED 82 BIKE-RELATED TICKETS.

Just because some students ride on two wheels instead of four doesn't make them exempt from traffic citations on the UF campus.

The University Police Department issued 82 bike-related tickets between the first day of school and Sunday.

"We've already given quite a few," UPD officer Darren Sanders said. "Traffic violations are enforced throughout the year."

When a ticket is issued, students have three options, Sanders said. They can pay the ticket, which is usually more than \$100; they can appeal the ticket; or, if it is the first offense, they can attend a Bicycle Traffic Safety Education Course within 30 days to receive a certificate that voids the citation.

"It's just trying to get people in compliance with the law," Sanders said. "With the number of bikes on campus, we feel like enforcing the law is just something we have to do."

The course takes about an hour to an hour and a half and is held at UPD headquarters Tuesdays at 7 p.m. or Saturdays at 9 a.m.

Holly Thomas, the officer who teaches the bicycle-safety course, said students should call the police department early because classes already are beginning to fill up.

"There are a few students who think this is a waste of time," Thomas said.

"But a lot of students say, 'I didn't know that' when we discuss bike laws."

On Saturday morning two students who had received tickets

during the Summer, five from the interim between terms and seven from Fall attended the class.

Those students received tickets for running stop signs, riding on the wrong side of the road, riding at night without lights and riding their bikes with headphones on.

Go Takahashi, an exchange student from Japan studying education, received a ticket near Century Tower two days after he arrived at UF.

"I didn't know the rules," Takahashi said.

He said he was glad to attend the class in order to learn them.

Miriah Karcher, a landscape architecture major, agreed and said, "I was kind of glad I got it anyway, because I needed to learn."

Karcher received her ticket during the summer for riding in the wrong direction in a bike lane.

"I knew it, but I couldn't get over, and of course there's a cop," she said.

Karcher's ticket would have cost \$118 plus three points on her license, but the class voided both consequences.

"You've got to treat it like you're driving a car. I guess the same rules apply," Karcher said.


Chas Robles, a senior majoring in English, works at the Student Government-sponsored bike repair shop near the Reitz Union.

"My experiences with UPD have been pretty bad," Robles said.

He said he has heard of students receiving speeding tickets on their bicycles, "which seems a little ridiculous."

"They seem to enjoy giving tickets," he added.

Free Your PC promises protection

Students and residents can cure what ails their laptops this week without the usual sky-high doctors' bills.

The Florida Free Culture student organization's first Free Your PC event, much like SG's Pimp my PC program, will help UF students, faculty and staff properly install virus-scanning software and provide information about error messages, ad-ware and computer viruses.

The event will take place on the Reitz Union North Lawn today and Wednesday from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

"Probably the best reason for students to come out is the security," organization co-founder and UF student Gavin Baker said.

The organization works to get people engaged in art, music and issues such as copyright law, free software and access to technological information, Baker said.

In addition to those services, Free Your PC will offer computer owners open-source software, free Creative Commons-licensed music, such as the Beastie Boys, as well as games, stickers, buttons and information to help protect their computers.

Open-source software such as Creative Commons music and Mozilla's Firefox Web browser can be redistributed and modified legally.

Firefox, Baker said, is known in the technology community to be a more secure browser than Microsoft's Internet Explorer.

He said visitors give testimonials about how Firefox has worked for

them. The best stories will be rewarded with Firefox hats and T-shirts.


Although everyone is encouraged to bring their laptops, only UF students, faculty and staff will receive free McAfee VirusScan, and the volunteers will only install software on Windows computers, Baker said.

The UF Help Desk and IT Security Team will secure and clean laptop computers of viruses and install programs.

Help Desk account specialist Sheel Amin said that up to 30 minutes of free laptop service is normally offered to UF students, faculty and staff.

Help Desk staff also offer unlimited over-the-phone technical support to install software available to UF students and staff, such as McAfee VirusScan, and to solve other problems, he said.

UF's software CD is available at the UF Bookstore for \$2, and the same software is available to download for free at www.software.ufl.edu.

Plug pulled on hot swimming spot

Making your way to Devil's Hole is tricky. On the way down the 80-foot descent, there are roots, ledges and slick clay to navigate, plus piles of old burgers, beer cans and broken glass.

But now it's illegal to visit at all. The popular swimming hole's owner, Timothy Knight, issued a no-trespassing order to the Putnam County Sheriff's Department in July, and an overabundance of garbage may be the reason.

"I can't even tell you how many trailer loads full of trash get carried out of there on a regular basis," said Knight's roommate, who refused to give her name because she said she feared retribution from former sinkhole visitors.

Knight, who is vacationing in Ohio, was unavailable for comment.

Rick Nelson, 22, is a native of Interlachen, where Devil's Hole is located. He said he has visited the cloudy sinkhole his entire life.

Nelson said many other lakes in the area have closed to the public recently.

"This is the only hole we got left out here for us kids," he said. "That's what draws us here."

There are two diving platforms at Devil's Hole, the smaller one comparable in height to an Olympic board. There are also three rope swings and a slide ending in the water. Locals said the hole extends to the aquifer and that its waters are 69 degrees all year.

Capt. Steve Rose of the sheriff's department said officers are giving warnings to trespassers and arresting repeat offenders. He said they have not encountered much resistance.

"Unfortunately, if they've been using that particular place for swimming or just congregating, they're going to have to find some other place," Rose said. "They have to abide by [Knight's] wishes."

Rose said when Knight bought the land four years ago, he told police he wasn't concerned about trespassers. But about six weeks ago, Knight authorized the enforcement, citing an agreement he'd signed with Nextel, which is building a tower on Knight's 50-acre property.

But Knight's roommate said the real reason for the order was the trash.

People have dragged house trailers, motorcycles, cars and boats into the seemingly bottomless waters, she said.

"It's been a constant source of headache and backbreaking work," she said.

Rose said word-of-mouth has been very successful in deterring trespassers.

"I know for a fact this past weekend I don't think anybody was out there," he said.

The people visiting Devil's Hole on Sunday, many of whom were college students, expressed frustration about the no trespassing order but said they understood the garbage issue.

Preston Grutzmacher, a UF economics junior, suggested posting signs around the hole warning visitors the hole could be closed if they don't clean up.

"It's totally ridiculous that it's here," he said.

Sun woes

New student newspaper an expensive brochure

It's time. After giving the Gainesville Sun's new student edition, creatively titled The Sun, more than a week to figure itself out, the Editorial Board has decided to sink its teeth in and tear that sucker apart.

Let's start at the beginning, with the quaint notion of conflict of interest: Sun coordinator Janine Young Sikes has chosen to allow fraternity and sorority members to report on Greek events.

While the stories have thus far been non-controversial, cotton-candy fluff, we just can't understand why a newspaper would choose to do this. These writers will be biased, whether it's conscious or not. Sikes formerly covered UF issues for The Gainesville Sun, and she's well aware of the line she's crossing. Is it a joke? Is she trying to throw us off by blurring such obvious ethical issues in The Sun's first week?

No newspaper should wobble into this questionable territory.

And talking about the whole ethical integrity idea, we're a little confused as to why Sun staff recently told UF faculty they wouldn't be covering serious stories about SG and the UF administration.

We shudder to think what gems would fall through the cracks if the Alligator took that stance.

So why would The Sun staff preemptively decide to cut out the stories that should make up the bulk of its paper?

We can only guess that since SG pays for the issues, the editors are uncomfortable with investigating controversial stories concerning their benefactors.

We remember when Sikes was a hardass reporter covering UF, unveiling issues by demanding public records and scrambling for the dirt. Has she transformed into a big soft teddy bear, with a heart full of love for all those budding politicians and hardworking administrators?

These editorial decisions all trace back to the biggest problem of all: The Sun may have some student writers, but the Gainesville Sun staff have all the power. This effectively makes it akin to The Gainesville Sun's other recent venture, The Gainesville Guardian. While the Guardian is a black weekly run by white publishers, The Sun is a student section run by the middle-aged. We'll throw them one bone: Much of the staff used to be Alligator reporters back in the 1970s.

That's right — we taught them their stuff. Maybe we should be partially blamed for this sticky moral mess.

Finally, The Sun has filled many of its pages with Associated Press stories. We know there are many journalism students waiting for an opportunity to write. However, instead of using the students they purport to be helping, Sun editors have decided to give them only half the space in the "student" publication. And those stories that are written by students tend to be "how-to" pieces, like where to catch buses, rather than timely hard news stories.

After all this talk about UF needing another university-focused paper, The Sun doesn't even begin to cover more campus news than the Alligator.

And those campus stories they do run tend to overlap with Alligator coverage.

That would be fine if the stories were investigative; competition could make both papers better. Instead, they're all press releases.

SG paid \$46,000 for a giant brochure with a circulation of only 2,500. That's money out of your Activity & Service fees.

So the Editorial Board has one last thing to say to UF students: The Sun is a city paper tapping the student body for money and circulation with a flimsy student section. Its focus isn't the university.

The Alligator is a student-run paper that covers university news, with thousands of absolutely free copies on campus.



Suing drug companies hurts public

When a jury in Angleton, Texas recently awarded a \$253.4 million judgment against pharmaceutical giant Merck in a wrongful death suit regarding its prescription drug, Vioxx, many people viewed the decision as a triumph of David over Goliath.

Few took the time to consider the true consequences of this most heinous ruling.

Forget for a moment that the trial focused more on taking pleasure in the fall of corporate America than the facts of the case. Forget that many of the jurors were blindingly incompetent and, according to one, "didn't know what the heck [the attorneys] were talking about." Forget that the coroner mysteriously changed her story regarding the cause of death after speaking at length with the plaintiff's counsel, and forget that at the time of his death, Ernst was a 59-year-old marathoner whose arteries were 70 percent clogged.

Forget all of that, but remember that more than 16,000 people die each year from bleeding ulcers caused by less stomach-friendly pain medications. For many chronic sufferers, Vioxx provided the best treatment and the only opportunity to live a normal life. Already, some patients have begun hoarding their last few pills while attempting to purchase whatever remains on the market at extortionary prices.

The resolution of this suit, however, only highlights a much more pervasive problem in the United States.

A lawsuit-happy population, urged on by ridiculous "send a message" jackpot juries and coupled with FDA regulations in the extreme, has created a legal environment that is downright unhealthy for America.

This unholy marriage of litigation and bureaucracy, according to the conservative Health Care News, is responsible for more than 80 percent of the cost of prescription drugs in today's markets.

Unnecessary testing to reduce liability directly translates into higher drug prices.

According to research scientist Mary J. Ruwart, "What we spend for prescription drugs can be predicted by what manufacturers spend on R&D [Research and Development]." Additionally, FDA red tape now requires that the average drug spend more than 14 years in testing while millions of Americans suffer in silence. This increased opportunity cost has also cut the number and types of drugs available by up to 50 percent, according to some estimates.

The first step to alleviate these problems is to examine the potential effectiveness of specialized medical courts. These courts, headed by similarly specialized judges, would not only be more efficient but more equitable, as an understanding of the underlying science and procedural issues would lead to more consistent judgments, all while preserving the right to a trial by jury. Such forums would not be without precedence: we already utilize the expertise of small claims courts, bankruptcy courts, tax courts, and business courts.

The institution of similar medical courts would provide an advantage over more drastic reforms such as damage caps, by retaining the ability to deliver harsh punitive damages in the worst cases of corporate wrongdoing.

It is also time to scrutinize FDA drug approval procedures with an eye toward expediency. We must not continue to sit by while our loved ones wait for their drugs to clear mile after mile of bureaucratic hurdles. Until we get real reform, continue to expect outrageous drug prices and a time-to-market measured in decades.

But make no mistake about it. We are all injured by decisions like the Vioxx verdict.

And therefore never send to know for which pharmaceutical giant the bell tolls; it tolls for thee.

Morning-after pill stalled again

Screwed again. Last week the Food and Drug Administration announced it again will delay a decision on whether the morning-after pill will be available for over-the-counter sales, this time for 60 days. For the past two years, the FDA has been using any excuse it could think of to stall this decision.

Now FDA Commissioner Lester Crawford claims the FDA needs more public input before he can decide on the morning-after pill. But for four years the FDA has ignored a citizen's petition requesting the pill be sold without a prescription; it has ignored the American Medical Association, the New England Journal of Medicine and other mainstream medical organizations that say the pill is safe.

It has ignored the major newspapers all over the country which have run editorials in favor of over-the-counter sales. It has ignored the more than 3,000 women across the nation who have pledged to commit civil disobedience by giving out the morning-after pill.

What more public opinion does the FDA need?

The morning-after pill is a safe, effective form of birth control that can be used up to five days after sex to

prevent pregnancy, but which is most effective within the first 24 hours.

Right now if a woman needs the morning-after pill, she has to schedule a doctor's appointment, pay for it out of pocket, take time off work or school, call around to find a pharmacy that stocks it and wait in a pharmacy line before she can get and take the pill — and this is the best-case scenario!

The FDA wants citizen input? Let's give Commissioner Crawford what he's asking for and then some. The National Organization for Women has called for a National Day of Action today. To show your support, call Commissioner Crawford today and tell him to make the morning-after pill available over-the-counter for all women. You can leave him a message at 301-827-2410 during business hours.

We will not go back to the pre-Roe v. Wade days of illegal, coat-hanger abortions or tolerate further restrictions on our access to birth control. We will continue to fight for the morning-after pill over-the-counter.

Make the morning-after pill over-the-counter for all women now!

that we will take the lot for football game days," said Melissa Stuckey, assistant athletic director for UAA Operations and Facilities. "We have been putting these up in all of our lots for the last 10 years or so."

Residents also are warned of the towing policy with notices posted in their dorms' common areas or tucked under their windshield wipers.

The Gator Boosters are given the Orange and Red-1 lots for home football events.

"The obvious reality is we have a destination, and a lot of people are trying to get to it," said Scott Fox, interim director for Transportation and Parking Services. "Because of the proximity, the parking lot is reserved."

UF students and faculty members must find alternative parking lots or be towed.

On Campus "We are trying to make the visitors feel welcomed," Fox said. "Depending on the circumstance we'll relocate [the cars] because it's more convenient for us."

Stuckey said tow trucks are used to move the cars to the grassy area in front of the stadium west of Murphree Hall. For three straight weekends starting Saturday, Murphree area residents must park in other lots during home football games to avoid being towed.

"On campus, there are about 6,500 [parking spaces] total, and 136 spaces are located at Murphree," Stuckey said.

Parking spaces in the Murphree area open to Gator Boosters at 8 a.m. Saturday on game day.

"We will put notices on the cars," Fox said. "They're informed in a number of ways."

LaDaun Jackson, a linguistics and communication sciences and disorders sophomore, and a resident of Murphree Hall, was unaware of the UAA parking restrictions in her area.

"I have to live here and it makes me feel cheated and upset," Jackson said. "UF provides decals, but they don't provide enough spots for residents, and the parking situation isn't that great here to begin with."

Jackson also said she felt the notices and warnings were insufficient, adding that the university is in need of parking reform because no one wants to be forced to give up parking spaces.

Stuckey said UAA worked hard to maintain communication and minimize parking conflicts during home football games.

"We highly encourage people to take the shuttles," Stuckey said. "We run shuttles from commuter lots and garage nine."

More than 92,000 people attend UF home football games, and the parking situation has not been any different for the past three seasons, Stuckey said.

"Parking is just one aspect of it," Stuckey said. "It's not guaranteed parking; it's available parking."



Moore joins crowded running back competition

■ GATORS STILL SEARCHING FOR A STARTING TAILBACK.

Urban Meyer would be one happy coach if his three-player race for starting tailback would shrink to one.

Instead, Meyer just added a fourth name to the mix.

With juniors DeShawn Wynn and Skyler Thornton as well as red-shirt freshman Markus Manson all vying for the starting gig, it seemed logical that true freshman Kestahn Moore would redshirt this season or receive little playing time.

But just days before the season opener against Wyoming, Meyer and running backs coach Stan

Drayton praised Moore, making the tailback picture that much cloudier.

"[Moore] came out from day one and worked his tail off," Drayton said. "He wasn't intimidated by any upperclassmen, he had a blue collar, lunch pail mentality. Whatever I asked him to do he did it. To be honest with you, the older guys learned from him."

On Monday, Meyer even suggested that Moore could start

against Wyoming, saying that the freshman could be on the field for the first play from scrimmage.

"[UF] recruited me for a reason," Moore said. "They knew what I could do."

While this could be fantastic news for Moore, it speaks to a larger problem for the Gators.

No tailback is truly standing out from the rest of the pack like Ciatrick Fason did a year ago, so one of the

most crucial positions on the team remains wide open.

"I'm waiting for someone to step up to the podium and say that 'I'm the tailback for the University of Florida. Give me the ball 25 times and I'll give you a bunch of yards,'" Meyer said. "I have yet to see that."

Wynn remains the most obvious candidate because of his natural

Gators beach Dolphins in season debut

The UF volleyball team entered the 2005 season with a myriad of questions.

Can two new sophomore middle blockers replace the production of two departed All-Americans?

Can the team once again be the dominant force that it was for nearly a decade before Tennessee snatched a share of the Southeastern Conference title?

Can Jane Collymore duplicate her 604-kill season of a year ago?

While it will likely take the duration of the season for the Gators to provide answers to those crucial questions, they made one thing abundantly clear Monday night: they still have the ability to dominate opponents.

UF (1-0) opened the season with a 3-0 (30-19, 30-17, 30-20) victory against last year's Atlantic Sun Tournament champion Jacksonville (0-4).

"For the first match of the year, it's a really good starting point," UF coach Mary Wise said. "The best thing is that now we have video that we can use to show our players, and I keep thinking back to where we were a year ago and how much further along this team is, particularly in the serve-receive."

The Gators improved to 9-1 in season openers at home under Wise, the only loss coming against Colorado State in 2000.

Although the offensive numbers tend to leap off of the page, as evidenced by 16 kills from Jane Collymore and 10 apiece from Marcie Hampton and Amber McCray, it was UF's defense that received the most praise from Wise.

"I think it's players [a year more experienced in] the position and playing next to each other makes a big difference, too," Wise said. "I love what Rhian Davis can do coming in off the bench, she made two consecutive digs, she gives us some real good foot speed there."

"Jane and Marcie have the potential to rack

UF deserves heavy hype

Ever since Chris Leak graced the cover of Sports Illustrated, the critics have come out of the woodwork.

"Is it an advantage? I think they scored 42 on us last year," Glenn said. "I wouldn't call it an advantage."

Louisiana Tech: Spurrier defeated Central Michigan 82-6 in 1997. This could be worse.

Tennessee: Last season, UF owned the Vols for nearly 57 minutes in Knoxville. This season in the Swamp, don't expect any misuse of the game clock by refs or coaches. Gators win.

ability, but rumors that he could be suspended against Wyoming for team violations continue to swirl.

Meyer said Wynn's status for the opener is still undetermined.

"I don't know if suspended is the right word," Meyer said. "I know

that there are going to be some players who won't play because they haven't done what they've needed to do. Is DeShawn one of those? I don't know yet, I'll have to make that decision on game day.

"The best players and the most invested players play. There is still time for investment."

And with little time remaining

before the season opener, Meyer's still searching for starters at other positions.

Four players continue to compete for the place-kicking job, and Meyer said Chris Hetland and Eric Nappy currently sit on top.

Also, UF's reliable punter Eric Wilbur hasn't returned to form after suffering a knee injury in training

camp. If he's not ready on Saturday, Nick Fleming will fill in.

"[Wilbur's] not punting like a big league punter right now," Meyer said. "He's close though. At times he'll smack it."

LEAK MAKES LEAPS: While the tailback situation may worry Meyer, UF's coach finally appears satis-

fied with quarterback Chris Leak.

Meyer has continuously called out the junior to improve his play and leadership. On Monday, Meyer had a different evaluation.

"His leadership skills and his ability to function in this offense as a quarterback are like night and day from the first day we had him at practice," Meyer said.

up big time numbers defensively, and certainly Rachel [Engel], as evidenced by her 18 digs."

While the Dolphins entered the match as the Atlantic Sun Tournament champions, they had already been swept over the weekend at Georgia Southern and their early season woes showed again Monday — they hit for just a .047 percentage in contrast to UF's .331.

"I mean Jacksonville was a great team, I'm not going to take it from them," Angie McGinnis, who had 41 assists and five kills, said. "It's the beginning of the season for everybody, you can play a little shaky, I think we played shaky, too."



"Most of the time you can find me hanging with B. Siles," Demps said. "It makes me happier that I'm playing with some of my family on the field and that is pretty nice."



Manson is only a redshirt freshman and could be the Gators back of the future if he becomes more consistent.

Just a week ago Moore wouldn't have been in the mix, but consistent play and hard work has the true freshman's stock on the rise. Recruited out of Texas, Moore flourished in his high school offense that was similar to what the Gators are running now. In his senior year, he had 132 carries for a total of 1,256 yards averaging almost 10 yards a carry. If any of the more experienced backs put one on the ground, Meyer might not hesitate to put Moore in the game.




Skyler Thornton

New starters fill big shoes

How do you account for 639 kills, 297 blocks, a double helping of All-American status, and a gaping hole in the middle?

That is what former UF middle blockers Sherri Williams and Michelle Chatman left behind from last season after exhausting their eligibility.

The duo left some pretty big shoes to fill. The good news for the Gators is that their new middle blocking tandem of Kisy Killingsworth and Kari Klinkenborg, at 6-foot-3 and 6-foot-2 respectively, sport some pretty large shoes.

The bad news for UF is that after the Gators' 3-0 victory against Jacksonville Monday, neither Killingsworth nor Klinkenborg were pleased how they fared individually in their starting debut.

"I think I played alright," Killingsworth said. "I think I can play much better and so does this team and so does [coach] Mary

[Wise]. We all have high expectations for ourselves and for this team, so I think that I didn't live up to it tonight."

Klinkenborg shared similar feelings about her own play.

"I think I got off to a slow start. I started getting into a rhythm a little more in the second game, but overall [my performance] wasn't great," she said. "Hopefully my next game will be better. I feel like I have been playing well in practice. I am going to try to figure it out and do better for Friday."

Killingsworth had two block assists, while Klinkenborg tallied three, but their presence in the middle seemed, at times, to overwhelm a Jacksonville team that struggled to get the ball over their outstretched arms.

Wise thinks it will take time before Killingsworth, Klinkenborg

and freshman Kelsey Bowers will begin to contribute at a high level.

"The middle blocking position is our least experienced position," Wise said. "They have the talent [and] I predict they are going to be really good."


Neither of the sophomores saw much time at middle blocker last season, because they were utilized in other areas of need. Both spent time playing opposite hitter after Amber McCray's injury all but destroyed UF's depth.

Despite having never played opposite hitter in her life before last season, Killingsworth, a true middle blocker, feels it has been a difficult adjustment switching back to her natural position this year, sentiments that Klinkenborg shared.

As for her team's latest performance, Wise sees the early season schedule as a learning experience for the Gators.

"I think they got their feet wet and showed us some good things and showed us areas where they need improving," Wise said.

Gators add high-profile alumna to soccer staff

When three-time All American Danielle Fotopoulos pounded the ball over the head of North Carolina

goalkeeper Siri Mullinix more than six years ago, Fotopoulos gave the Gators the only goal they would need to claim the 1998 national championship.

At that point, she was quickly running out of contributions to

make to the program.

But on Aug. 10, Fotopoulos managed to find a new way to give something to her alma mater.

Fotopoulos, who replaced UF assistant coach Zac Shaw – now the head coach at Rhode Island – gave

the UF women's soccer team a high-profile alumna to add to its assistant coaching ranks.

"Returning was something that I maybe wasn't really vocal about because it wasn't something I was always sure I wanted to do," Fotopoulos said. "But this is definitely something I've had in the back of my mind for some time now, and now that it's happening, it's very exciting and rewarding."

Fotopoulos left the Gators in 1998 after an illustrious collegiate career and went on to enjoy a successful run in the now defunct Women's United Soccer Association. She remains a member of the U.S. National Team and helped the squad claim a gold medal in the 1999 World Cup.

Now Fotopoulos could bring a level of excitement back to her collegiate squad.

"I can bring national exposure just playing on the national team and on television," she said. "From now on the University of Florida will be mentioned whenever I'm playing on TV and I think that will definitely help the program."

Fotopoulos returns to a team that, while still consistently among the national elite, has struggled to meet expectations set after the 1998 national title.

"The team is always one of the best in the country, and we've always been held to that standard," Fotopoulos said. "But would we like to be in the top-10 or five instead of top-20? Absolutely."

"I think having a little bit of 'old school' back on the team is a good thing. I never really thought of it that way until some of the players on the team came up to me and really expressed how it feels to have some of

the tradition right in their face."

Fotopoulos recognizes the hard work and expectations that go hand-in-hand with coaching at UF.

"[UF athletics director] Jeremy Foley holds everyone accountable and holds us all to high standards," she said. "I like that ... I'm just competitive that way and love being in that environment."

"I learned a lot about having the responsibilities of a whole soccer program on your shoulders."



UF works on fourth-quarter woes

Under former coach Ron Zook, the Gators showed they could hang with any team in the country. That is, until the fourth quarter rolled around.

Many college football experts believe that UF has the talent to win a national championship, but question if the Gators have the toughness to close out games.

During fall training camp, UF coach Urban Meyer admitted that the Gators are a little soft.

"That's a valid statement and a fact," Meyer said. "Our toughness and finish are the two things this team is being challenged on right now. If we do not fix those issues from last year, we will be an average team again."

In Zook's final two years at UF, he lost eight regular-season games. Six of the losses came when the Gators were up late in the fourth quarter before allowing teams to storm back and steal the win.

In 2004, UF was leading with 6 seconds left on the road against Tennessee and again with :27 remaining at home against LSU but managed to lose both games. Also,

Mississippi State's Jerious Norwood ran for a game-winning 37-yard touchdown with just :32 left in MSU's shocking 38-31 win against the Gators.

In 2003, heavily favored Miami found itself down 23 points at home against a UF team it had blown out the previous year. However, it only took 18:35 for the Hurricanes to regain the lead for good.

How could the Gators be so dominant for the majority of a game only to give it all away at the end?

"Honestly, I don't know what happened at the end of games last year," sophomore safety Kyle Jackson said.

"We must not have been mentally or physically ready but it's a whole different story this year. From day one, this coaching staff was all about finish. We have signs everywhere that read 'Finish, finish, finish.'"

Defensive end Jeremy Mincey shares in Jackson's optimism for the upcoming year but has a different explanation for the blown leads.

"I think it was a lack of rotation," Mincey said. "If you don't have people constantly rotating, you're going to tire out after a while. Teams will take advantage of you when you're tired."

Opponents did just that last season in the fourth quarter. The Gators dominated opponents through the first three quarters last year, outscoring them 307-173. In the fourth quarter, however, the Gators were outscored 80-75.

Co-defensive coordinator Charlie Strong was present during Zook's tenure, and he is adamant that UF will no longer be suspect at the end of games.
