



Student accuses fraternity of illegal hazing

When Troy Devine decided to join the UF chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity, he was hoping to meet new people and make good friends. He didn't expect death threats, stolen and vandalized property or hazing. But that's what happened.

Now Devine has complained to UF's Office of Student Judicial Affairs, which is investigating the allegations and may charge the fraternity, known as Pike.

Devine, who originally joined the fraternity at Florida Atlantic University, became affiliated with the UF chapter in Fall 2004.

However, Devine was never a UF student. He joined UF's chapter while attending SFCC, which is against university policy.

Because he was already affiliated, Devine didn't have to go through new-member procedures but said he witnessed pledges being hazed through two recruitments.

Greek Life

According to an e-mail from Devine, pledges were put through degradation and physical and mental suffering during the pledge week and "Hell Week" at the end of the semester.

The e-mail describes a hazing ritual called "scrubbing" that took place at the end of the new member period.

During "scrubbing" pledges were forced to scrub bathroom floors covered in detergent with their bare knuckles until they bled.

Devine wrote that fraternity members would sometimes force the pledges to go

"He seemed eager to participate," Green said of the coach, adding he thought the attendance was better than last year's.

UF keeps place in lobby group

Student Senate unanimously confirmed Tuesday night that UF will remain a member of the State University System's lobbying group, the Florida Student Association.

Student Government will pay \$29,262 in FSA membership dues, \$2,000 for hosting the organization's conference at UF this year and \$2,730 for travel expenses.

FSA Executive Director Mike Fisher said the organization exists to protect the interests of students across the state.

"One of our main goals is to be a watchdog on the state legislature and make sure they aren't doing anything detrimental to students," he said.

Student Body President Joe Goldberg agrees with the decision.

"I think it's important that students' voices are united all across the state," he said.

IT'S YOUR MONEY: Also at Tuesday's meeting, Budget and Appropriations Chairwoman Jackie Pace presented the Activity & Service Fee budget for the 2006-2007 fiscal year.


Pace said the budget of student money, drawn from tuition, looks weaker than in previous years.

"In the past we kind of tended to give away money," she said. "As a result our reserve account is pretty low. We're kind of in dangerous ground. For a while it's going to be a little tight. There is simply not enough money to fund everything that was requested."

Pace said utility-price hikes, minimum-wage increases and university-salary increases contributed to the hard times. One casualty of the cuts is the USA Today and New York Times readership programs, for

Gainesville residents urged to conserve electricity

Natural-gas production in the Gulf of Mexico virtually ceased following Hurricane Katrina, spurring the Florida Gas Transmission to ask utility companies throughout the state to advise their customers to conserve energy, according to a Gainesville Regional Utilities press release.

"The limited availability of natural gas, transportation issues in getting fuel oil here to replace what we are burning and higher prices for both fuels are all causing us some concern, but we are hopeful that this is a short-term problem," said Chip Allen, GRU's assistant general manager for Energy Supply, in the release.

Approximately 30 to 35 percent of the electricity in Florida comes from plants fueled by natural gas, the price of which is more than \$13 million per million Btu, the measure of the amount of heat required to raise the temperature of one pound of liquid water by one degree Fahrenheit.

Last August the same amount sold for \$5.3 million, the release stated.

said she would be a good replacement because she agrees with his stance on many issues.

Mastrodicasa said she has thought about running for the City Commission for a long time and spent the summer in Gainesville preparing for the upcoming election in March.

There is only one woman on the seven-member commission — Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan.

If elected, Mastrodicasa said her presence would add more diversity to the commission.

"I think it's the right opportunity at the right time," she said.

Protecting the environment and improving downtown and East Gainesville are some of the problems Mastrodicasa plans to tackle if elected. She also said she wants to ensure that as the city grows, it does so safely and in a way that is optimal for transportation, housing and other issues.

Mastrodicasa said she plans to keep her position at UF if elected. She pointed out that Rick Bryant, another at-large city commissioner, has been able to balance working simultaneously for UF and the city.

"We're planning to kick off my campaign in September, so you'll be hearing more," she said.

PC donates to fire victim

The Panhellenic Council presented the UF student whose room was destroyed in the Broward Hall fire with a check

of \$1,650 Tuesday to help in her recovery.

The student, who lost nearly all of her belongings, was in the middle of new-member recruitment week when the fire occurred nearly two weeks ago.

PC President Ashley Gomberg said one of the potential new members came up with the idea to collect money.

"It was them who really started it — and Pi Chis," she said.

Pi Chis are women who lead students through recruitment, but are disaffiliated with their sororities during the week.

The money was raised from anonymous donations over a three-day period.

One student donated \$50 the first day. Others donated in any way they could.

People were bringing in punch cards for free meals and were donating those, Gomberg said, adding, "It was so nice of them." Amy Clark, the student's Pi Chi for the week, said the student was thrilled by the check.

"She was absolutely speechless," Clark said. "I think it's definitely representative of Panhellenic. Though we are 16 different chapters, we're all one community."





Feelings on new logo mixed

Armando Gonzalez was thrilled at the opportunity to live in Gainesville and immerse himself in the local sports culture when he transferred to UF from Miami-Dade College.

"Everything is amazing here," the UF junior said. "I'm really proud to be one of the Gators."

But Gonzalez wasn't as pleased with UF's decision to base a massive new marketing campaign on a slogan referencing the school's athletic program: "the foundation for The Gator Nation."

"It sucks that we have to spend so much money on something stupid like that when the money could probably be used for better resources," he said.

UF began its attempt to re-brand itself with advertising agency Lido Brand Strategy Group, which in the spring unveiled the marketing concept "an unparalleled university experience that lasts a lifetime" at a cost of \$85,000. But the university wanted to project a message that would work better in traditional media such as TV, and hired a second agency, Fletcher Martin, to produce a new concept that has so far cost \$200,000.

Since UF's university relations office presented the school's new slogan last week, some students and faculty members have voiced concerns over whether it perpetuates a negative stereotype of UF as a sports-centered institution.

John Sutherland, a UF professor and chairman of the advertising department, said it's probably too early to tell whether "the foundation for The Gator Nation" will even play a prominent role in the school's marketing plan.

"You can't jump the gun on this, because the slogan may not even appear in the ads," he said. "It could be just a tagline or a concept."

However, Joe Hice, UF's associate vice presi-

dent for marketing and public relations, said he looks forward to publicizing the slogan as much as possible in future advertisements.

"We'll call [the slogan] more of a theme, but we'll use it as much as we can," he said. "It could take a while, but we do want everyone to eventually recognize and accept it."

Although Hice acknowledged the slogan could be perceived as a reference to the university's athletics programs, he said it's actually meant to convey that being a Gator "is about believing that Gator Nation belongs to everyone involved with the university."

UF Administration The slogan is partially designed to appeal to potential donors.

Kim Tanzer, a UF architecture professor and chairwoman of the Faculty Senate, said she initially opposed UF's new slogan but came to appreciate it.

"I'm not a football person, but I believe this campaign can take the energy of the football program and put it toward academics," she said, adding that some of her colleagues take a different standpoint on the issue.

"Faculty members think of themselves as academics, not Gators, but I think the best part about this is what we could change — the perception from the word 'Gator' being only about sports," Tanzer said.

Although the total cost of UF's new advertising campaign is projected to reach \$500,000, Tanzer said the price "is more than worth it if this marketing can change people's perceptions."

However, UF graduate student Elizabeth Smith remains unconvinced.

"The premise behind the idea of wanting to get UF out there is good, but in my opinion the slogan seems kind of stupid," she said. "The money should still go toward advertising the school, but maybe not in such a silly manner."

Leisure courses still open

Learn Russian, try flamenco dancing or practice rock climbing this semester, all without leaving UF.

Leisure courses offered through the Arts & Crafts Center in the Reitz Union are non-credited courses that meet on a weekly or one-time basis.

"The idea is to do something fun and to take the stress away from regular classes," Program Director Bree Jung said.

This semester, courses such as pottery, guitar, tennis and hip-hop are offered alongside new ones such as poker, dream exploration, beginning meditation and introduction to Russian.

"I think it's a good break from regular classes," Jung said. "People who have signed up and tried something new find a new hobby and love it. It's nice to experiment and find something that you really love to do."

Art history major Katy O'Hearn tried screen printing during Spring semester and enjoyed the class.

"It was good because I'm an art history student, but I also have a creative side, and it's hard to take art classes through the [Fine Arts] college without jumping through a lot of hoops," O'Hearn said. "Also, you don't have to worry about being graded."

She became a member of the Arts & Crafts Center, where she continues her screen printing hobby by occasionally making shirts for herself and friends.

"It's fun to have some sort of creative outlet," O'Hearn said.

While leisure courses have been offered for more than 25 years, the selection of classes has changed with trends.

"In the '70s there were disco classes, and now there's hip-hop classes," Jung said.

The popular beginning and intermediate hip-hop classes are offered by Pofahl Dance Studio, 4201 NW 16th Blvd. The studio offers tap, ballet, flamenco, modern, jazz and hip-hop for the community, but it aims to include UF students through the leisure courses.

"We offer a lot that isn't offered on a regular basis at the university, and it's something anybody can take," studio owner Kim Tuttle said. "You don't have to be a dance major."

Community members, UF students and alumni teach the courses. Potential instructors fill out an application and course-proposal form on the leisure course Web site before their classes can be approved and offered.

Fifth-year electrical engineering student Braden Korn has played guitar for the past six years. A year ago he decided to apply to teach a beginning guitar course.


"I was playing guitar and decided it would be great if I could get paid for teaching students," Korn said. "It's a personal passion."

He was approved, and this semester he will teach two classes Thursday evenings.

"I want to instill the love of guitars in others and make them enjoy learning the guitar instead of stopping after a couple of months," Korn said.

As of Tuesday, 480 students were registered for a leisure course. Of the 94 classes offered, 15 are full, but registration continues for the remaining courses until the first day of the specific class the week of Sept. 12.

University Club a survivor

■ NIGHTSPOT OWNER WAS ARRESTED ON FRAUD CHARGES.

Despite the arrest of its owner last week for tax fraud, popular downtown nightclub University Club will remain open.

Mark Spangler will stand trial Oct. 3 on eight counts of filing false returns from 1999 to 2002, two counts for each year, U.S. Attorney's Office Public Affairs Officer Alan Sprowls said in a phone interview.

Spangler is accused of underreporting profits made from the operation of University Club to the Internal Revenue Service.

"We really can't disclose how the investigation started," Sprowls said.

When asked if the club would keep its doors open, Sprowls said his office had "no control over the club closing."

The owner, in this case Spangler, is responsible for claiming the club's profits and losses on his personal income-tax return.

Spangler was responsible for the payment of any income tax on money generated by the nightclub, Sprowls said.

"If it made money, Mr. Spangler had to claim it," he said.

The charges state that Spangler provided false information on the club's informational tax returns as well as his own personal tax returns, Sprowls said.

Fraud is different from evasion in that evasion involves proof that the accused manipulated numbers. In this case something relevant to the accuracy of the return was false, so it was fraud, he said.

"It has to be something that matters that is false on the return," Sprowls said.

The sentence for fraud, which includes a maximum of three years in prison and a fine of up to \$100,000, would be less severe

than the sentence for tax evasion if Spangler is found guilty, he said.

Sprowls would not disclose how his office determined which charge was appropriate against Spangler.

The club will remain open during Spangler's trial preparations.

Several telephone calls made to Spangler about the club's future were not returned.

Spangler's attorney, George Tragos, said the investigation of Spangler's University Club-related finances has been going on for years, yet it has taken until now to amass enough information to charge his client.

After his first appearance in court, Spangler was released until he goes to trial.

"It went great. The judge released him, so he's able to help me with his own defense," Tragos said.

Spangler has no business partners in the University Club venture.

"We still maintain we did nothing wrong," Tragos said.

Century Tower bells have students at the controls

Every afternoon, professor Laura Ellis climbs the 194 steps of Century Tower to sit in a small room just below the bell chamber.

With no more than a little bit of light passing through the slits of the windows, she pounds out her finest

five-octave masterpieces on one of the largest instruments in the world: the carillon.

"It's a fun instrument to play," the associate professor in the School of Music said. "Of course, the view from the top of the tower isn't too bad either."

The carillon is a musical instrument composed of at least 23 caril-

lon bells arranged in sequence and tuned to produce harmony when the bells are sounded together.

The UF carillon was purchased in 1976 using about \$200,000 that had been accumulated from several generations of student fees. Though it was a large amount of money to dedicate to such an endeavor, the purchase of the carillon received

unanimous support from the Student Senate, and on May 14, 1979, the bells rung for the first time.

The bells were installed in Century Tower, which was constructed in 1956 to serve as a monument in memory of students killed in World Wars I and II.

The melodies from the bells of the 57-ton instrument are not played automatically by a computer as most seem to expect, she said, but are performed live by Ellis and the seven students in her applied carillon class.

The class is for anyone who's interested in learning to play the instrument, Ellis said, noting the course is open to both music and non-music majors alike.

The sounds of the tower intrigued chemical engineering student Julie Lawson, who took the course without prior experience with the carillon.

"I heard the bells being played one day on campus, and I told my friends that one day I would be up there playing them too," she said.

Lawson, who has played the carillon for two years, describes the instrument as being set up similar to a piano keyboard, but rather than having 88 black and white keys, there are 61 lower and raised wooden batons.

She said getting her hands accustomed to playing the batons wasn't as difficult as learning how to coordinate her hands with her feet, which are used to press 25 pedals.

"My height is probably the most challenging thing about it," said the 5-foot-tall Lawson. "I have to do a lot of moving and sliding along the bench."

Taking written piano music and playing it note for note on the carillon is not permitted due to copyright infringement laws. However, students are encouraged to arrange their own music by keeping the basic melody of a song but making some minor changes to it.

Century Tower's carillon is one of the largest university carillons in the United States. There are fewer than 200 carillons in all of North America, only four of which can be found in Florida.

Another student in the class, Kate Lindbolm, said she learned about the carillon when she read an article in the Orange & Blue Magazine three years ago about unusual classes the university offers.

Lindbolm, who is in her third semester of applied carillon, describes the feeling of being up in the 11-story, non air-conditioned Century Tower as extraordinary, especially given its history.

"There's a reason it's a symbol on campus," Lindbolm, 21, said. "It's not just a beautiful structure. It contains a beautiful instrument."



Administrators should stop playing with union

The Editorial Board has one question for UF administrators: Did you really think you would get away with it? We should probably be a little more specific. This question could be about almost anything.

Today's lesson in administration follies concerns one of the foundations of our university: faculty.

UF's faculty union has been pushed aside for entirely too long.

When the union was discarded in 2001, we could at least blame the bandwagon effect. All of Florida's public universities joined in on the massacre, claiming that the United Faculty of Florida's contract was void because of a reshuffling of the state's broken governing system.

For 25 years the union had one contract with the entire public university system. But then the Board of Education, which was acting as the system's governing body, devolved its power to the schools' individual governing bodies, the boards of trustees.

So all the universities' administrators jumped on the chance to break the contract and have some freedom with their decisions. After years of union negotiations being effectively out of their reach, university officials saw their chance to take control.

Fine. It's a mean and illegal way to go about it, but we'll give you the benefit of the doubt. You guys were a little cranky after being shut into a financial prison cell you didn't create.

But four years later, UF is the only university that has failed to recognize the union. That's right — every other public university in the entire state has reinstated United Faculty of Florida.

Furthermore, a July court decision basically outlines why the universities broke the law in 2001: The bureaucratic reorganization of the Education Department was no more than renaming a board. It wasn't a real shift of authority.

Why would UF administrators be so stubborn? Surely they've had plenty of time to come to an agreement with union officials. The union might even forgive their previous behavior if they at least seriously worked toward a new contract.

Instead, they prance around like upset 3-year-olds with dirty diapers.

First, they insisted that professional schools, like the Levin College of Law, be included in the faculty vote for a union. It was an obvious attempt to skew the numbers: Those schools have never been part of the union, and they don't want to be a part of it. Specialized schools have different wants and needs.

Then officials pushed shared governance. While the Faculty Senate has done its best to influence university policy, it's constantly pushed down by the administration.

The Senate is simply not on an equal playing field. Every so often UF President Bernie Machen strolls in to meetings and answers a few questions. But he never commits to anything, and his presence is a courtesy, not an obligation.

When Machen has to face a union, both sides will have equal control.

Pam Bernard, vice president and general counsel for UF, recently said schools like UF that are part of the Association of American Universities traditionally have stronger systems of faculty governance, so the need for a union is limited.

This is just ridiculously hilarious. Yet again, university officials are playing their favorite trump card: UF is better than all those sub-par Florida schools, so we don't have to accept the commoners' unions.

Wrong. Faculty governance gets as much power as the administration wants to bestow upon it. We're betting increased snobbery doesn't miraculously strip officials of their desire for control.

Administrators are engaging in an outrageous game.



Sheehan's Texas protest long overdue

The tents have been dismantled, the Porto-Potties have been emptied, and the crowds are heading to their cars. Today, after a 25-day run, the Cindy Sheehan circus is ready to leave Crawford, Texas, and only one order of business remains: Who's going to clean up the elephant poop?

But as Sheehan takes the show on the road, it's important to remember why it all began in the first place.

Sheehan, mother of fallen U.S. Army Spc. Casey Sheehan, set up camp outside President Bush's ranch in Texas on Aug. 6, demanding a meeting with the president to advocate the immediate withdrawal of all American troops from Iraq.

Sheehan vowed to remain there until her request was granted or until the end of the president's vacation, in which case he would be seen off by a thousand bare asses. Well, figuratively at least.

In all seriousness Sheehan's qualms with President Bush are completely justified.

There were no slam-dunk weapons of mass destruction. There was no connection between 9/11 and Iraq. Our troops were ill-equipped and too few in number going into Iraq. And "the intelligence and facts were being fixed around the policy" of removing Saddam, which was "justified by the conjunction of terrorism and WMDs," according to an official British document.

Regardless of how Maverick-esque President Bush looked in his "Top Gun" re-enactment May 2, 2003, major combat operations were far from over. Unfortunately, President Bush made a few boo-boos that even Robitussin can't handle.

Although Sheehan's call for immediate withdrawal is not the right answer, American troops should be coming home sooner rather than later. More than 1,870 U.S.

soldiers have been killed in Iraq, and as stated by Sen. Chuck Hagel, R-Neb., "the White House is completely disconnected from reality," and "the reality is that we're losing

Israel pullout foreshadows Iraq problem

The Israeli pullout from Gaza has much to teach us about the cost of losing Iraq.

In both cases, liberals have long opposed occupation. Concerning Iraq, you may have even seen a couple "Support our troops - bring them home" bumper stickers around campus.

I imagine those that desire a premature exit from Iraq are led not completely by a genuine sympathy for the men in uniform but more by a misunderstanding of how much suffering Iraqis would endure in the wake of a pullout.

Take Gaza. If the politics behind the pullout seem confusing, don't be intimidated. Prime Minister Ariel Sharon's name almost always has been synonymous with hard-liner and far-right wing, and the pullout is his brainchild.

The West Bank security wall and pullout result from Sharon's frustration with terrorism and occupation. Bush faces similar pressure in Iraq. Exhausted by broken promises and ineffective Palestinian leadership, Sharon conceded to the only option he saw available.

Hamas has turned the pullout into a public relations campaign. Emboldened by the apparent success of their attacks,

Palestinian terror organizations are taking aim at the complete destruction of the Jewish state and will rely increasingly on rockets to attack civilians.

But the drama of booting out settlers and dismantling homes has masked the other losers here: the Palestinians.

Israel's one-way concessions are largely responsible for legitimizing failed anti-liberal Palestinian leadership. Palestinians will now inherit a government that exerts little or no influence on the violent regimes that have terrified Israelis for decades.

Now imagine Palestine becoming an anarchic militant state, and then consider what Iraq would look like in the event of an American pullout. Simply calling it a terrorist breeding ground would not do it justice.

The Sunnis and al-Qaida would drag the nation into a civil war.

The Kurds would stop at nothing to take control of oil-rich lands around northern cities Mosul and Kirkuk. Very likely oil fields around the country would be set ablaze, dooming the Iraqis'

only chance of economic prosperity.

Saudi Arabia, Syria and Iran would all be tempted to war with each other to get a piece of the action, while democratic progress in Lebanon, Egypt and Saudi Arabia would either stall or reverse.

Tyrants worldwide would cheer the United States' failure. Sentiment at home would be tipped in favor of isolationists, leaving Russia, North Korea and China all free to intimidate their neighbors without fear of retribution.

Terrorism, not civil disobedience, would be reinforced as the most potent tactic for minority factions to achieve political aims. The insurgents' victory would echo everywhere.

The Israeli pullout from the relatively small area, which was left no provisions to stop terrorists or promote democracy, could destabilize an entire region. A pullout from Iraq would have the same effect on a much larger scale.

More immediately, the consequences of abandoning Iraqi democrats to terrorists and civil war could make an impoverished and violent Palestine look like a vacation spot.

Machen's comments on GAU unfounded

In Friday's Alligator article, "UF Ignores Union Ruling," President Machen responded to my concerns of the motive behind administrators' stalling tactics with a terse statement that the Graduate Assistants United president "doesn't know what she/he is talking about."

To which suggestion of mine is he referring?

Is it the allegation that the administration is wasting university resources fighting the faculty union? Local papers, for example the Jan. 25 Alligator article "Costs Mount in Fight Over Union" and the July 31 Gainesville Sun article "Legal Pendulum Swings Toward the Unions in Lengthy Battle with UF," suggest that "all the time and money spent dismantling the unions ... may have been for naught."

Or perhaps Machen is referring to my questioning of the so-called "shared governance" structure. UF administration has pushed this model as the alternative to a faculty union, but Machen is not legally bound to take the Faculty Senate's advice.

Ultimately, any system of "shared governance" should be legally guaranteed by a union. Otherwise, administrators will once again respond to serious concerns with a terse "you don't know what you're talking about."

running for miles, and do push-ups and sit-ups, usually after a night of drinking, as early as 4 a.m. the next day. He was concerned that students could be hospitalized because they became so sick, he wrote in the e-mail.

Devine complained of pledges being told to stand on tables and recite things they had to learn during pledge week. If they got something wrong, they were yelled at and had food thrown at them.

The e-mail also included details of "pledge review boards" run by the new-member educator. Pledges were blindfolded and brought into the chapter room, where they were "grilled about the information they were to have learned that week." When they made mistakes, they were yelled at and forced to do sit-ups and push-ups, sometimes for hours, until they were "mentally and physically exhausted."

Notices were put on doors stating "Ritual in progress" in an attempt to ensure police or school officials didn't enter.

Devine, who was a regional vice president for the fraternity before transferring to SFCC, said he opposed the hazing procedures.

He said Pi Kappa Alpha has a national policy against hazing and that he saw nothing at FAU like what he saw at UF.

"I have no problem with the little stuff, but when you're telling kids they have to bleed to join a fraternity, I just don't agree with that," he said. "They try to quote symbolism behind that you're bleeding for the house, but you don't need to make kids bleed."

He said other members of the organization agreed with him, but the majority didn't want change.

"I just realized trying to do things internally wasn't working," he said. "That is when I think they tried to get rid of me."

Following his outspokenness Devine said he was threatened and ostracized by the fraternity.

When he returned to the house to pick up his belongings June 4, his room had been vandalized, he said.

Devine then filed police reports with the Gainesville Police Department about the vandalism. GPD spokesman Keith Kameg did not return calls.

Devine's complaint with Judicial Affairs, which is public record, was not released because the case is under investigation, Associate Dean of Students Paige Crandall said.

Judicial Affairs officials are deciding if there are any charges, what the charges will be and who will be charged, she said.

"Realistically, there will probably be something coming from this," Crandall said. "It's our goal to get this done as quickly as possible."

Devine said he hopes changes are made within the organization.

"My intent is not to have the fraternity shut down by any means," he said. "There are still a lot of good people in the fraternity."

Devine is no longer attending SFCC and has moved out of state.

Pi Kappa Alpha President John Allen did not return phone calls to the Alligator.

which Pace said SG just couldn't meet the expense.

Pace said the A&S Fee is funded by about a \$9 fee per credit hour, which is also used by the University Athletic Association and for health programs. Each year the fee is increased by about 5 percent.

The newly formed budget will see its first reading next Tuesday.

CELLULAR CONNECTION: Campus Media CEO George Tingo introduced a text-messaging

service to Senate that would link students to UF administration, professors, SG and other organizations.

Tingo said the plan, which has already been approved by UF President Bernie Machen, will not be forced upon students.

"It's a pull theory, not a push theory," he said. "It's a completely free service to the university and the students. What the students pay for is an incoming message to them."

Tingo said the service is already available at five out of the 10 biggest universities. UF's version of the text-messaging program will be launched Sept. 12.

She said her distinction as the first female black president of the Student Senate belonged to all students.

Her attainment of the position is a "sign that UF is changing," she said.

The rousing applause and cheers that met Meyer, Machen and the other leaders seemed like a polite whisper compared to the mania that engulfed the Reitz Union Grand Ballroom for the dance and music presentations.

Women catcalled and screamed when 10 men of the Apocalypse Dance Troupe decked out in jeans, white T-shirts, open button-down shirts and black suit jackets hip-hopped and did almost acrobatic stunts,

including one man dance-walking across the backs of four other men.

The emcee announced the group as being UF's only all-male dance group.

Likewise, the male audience didn't contain their excitement when women from the Urban Essence Dance Squad jumped, hopped and kicked their way through a dance.

The Caribbean Student Association's troupe and Black Student Union's Shades of Unity also performed.

The crowd's chanting and cheering through the performances reached the back of the room, where the wall was lined with students who didn't get seats.

The audience laughed at the Association of Black Faculty and Staff's skit of studious and slacker students.

Institute of Black Culture Director Darius Bost said the event cost about \$1,000 and was paid for mostly by the Dean of Students Office through a Weeks of Welcome grant. BSU paid for part of the Spinal Tech costs.

U.S. poverty rate up

■ INCOMES FLAT AS CENSUS BUREAU SEES FOURTH HIKE.

WASHINGTON — Even with a robust economy that was adding jobs last year, the number of Americans who fell into poverty rose to 37 million, an increase of 1.1 million from 2003, according to Census Bureau figures released Tuesday.

It marks the fourth straight increase in the annual poverty measure.

The Census Bureau also said household income remained flat, and the number of people without health insurance edged up by about 800,000 to 45.8 million people.

"I was surprised," said Sheldon Danziger, co-director of the National Poverty Center at the University of Michigan. "I thought things would have turned around by now."

While disappointed, the Bush

administration, which has not seen a decline in poverty numbers since the president took office, said it was not surprised by the new statistics.

Commerce Department spokeswoman E.R. Anderson said they mirror a trend in the '80s and '90s in which unemployment peaks were followed by peaks in poverty and then by a decline in the poverty numbers the next year.

"We hope this is it, that this is the last gasp of indicators for the recession," she said.

Overall, the nation's poverty rate rose to 12.7 percent of the population. Of the 37 million living below the poverty level, close to a third were children.

The last decline in overall poverty was in 2000, during the Clinton administration, when 31.1 million people lived under the threshold. Since then, the number of people in poverty has increased steadily from 32.9 million in 2001, when the economy slipped into recession, to 35.8 million in 2003.



Players admit to slacking during Zook regime

Ron Zook was no Bear Bryant, though the guy did work like a bear.

Spending endless hours con-

fining to the bowels of the Swamp, Zook tirelessly toiled to make the Gators "better and better," to quiet "the noise in the system," all the while chasing a dragon that would ultimately turn around and bite off his head. If one statement rings true about the discarded coach, it's that

he cared about his job. The same couldn't be said for his players last season.

For all the noise certain Gators made about Zook's firing last season, few, if any, put their muscles where their mouths were. Admittedly, Zook's boys left him

out to dry, as complacency reigned supreme throughout the ranks of the Orange and Blue last season.

"We were kind of set in stone [last season]," defensive tackle Marcus Thomas said. "I'll admit I know I was, because I figured nobody would take my spot, so I just kind of did what I wanted."

But don't crucify Thomas. Others also will attest to their lackadaisical affliction last season.

"I was probably a victim of it too," center Mike Degory said. "I think we all were. But Coach [Urban] Meyer has definitely preached to us that it's not our choice anymore. Everybody is committed to the same goal. If you're cheating yourself, you're also cheating somebody else."

Kind of like how the defensive line cheated the rest of the Gators last season. Meyer doesn't like being cheated.

"Our coach was telling us we only had [13.5] sacks last year, and for a defensive line, that was terrible," junior Ray McDonald said. "So they wanted to make a few changes for guys to be in the right places to make good plays."

Meyer reassigned McDonald from tackle to his former defensive end position. The coach has no favorites and isn't afraid to shake things up in order to instill a sense of urgency in his squad. It's a refreshing departure from last season for some.

"Last year, I guess a couple guys had problems with the coaches," linebacker Earl Everett said. "They were a great staff, but a couple guys, I guess they weren't buying

into what the coaches were bringing."

According to one holdover from UF's former regime, however, age played a significant factor in the Gators' motivational woes.

"Coach Meyer told us this is an investment. As much as you invest in it, you're going to get that much reward out."


"Two years ago, we went into the season, and Mo Mitchell, an offensive lineman, is playing defensive line," co-defensive coordinator Charlie Strong said. "The competition has gotten a lot better for those guys at their positions. Now you look at Ray, you look at Marcus, you look at [Jeremy] Mincey, you look at Steven Harris and Joe Cohen. There was nobody to push [before]."

Thanks to such competition and coaches like Strong and his counterpart Gregg Mattison, Everett claims UF's lazy days are finished.

"There are a couple guys behind some of us who are really pushing for a spot," Everett said. "If we don't jump up and do what we are supposed to do, the next guy is going to be there."

And if a benching doesn't strike fear in their hearts, perhaps a little economics lesson will.

"Coach Meyer told us this is an investment," Degory said. "As much as you invest in it, you're going to get that much reward out."

Goalies vie for starting spot against Notre Dame

A half-hour before practice began on Tuesday, Jen Gardner was already sweating.

Before the rest of the team came out, goalkeepers Gardner, Brittni Goodwin and Katie Green took turns fielding kicks from assistant coach Danielle Fotopoulos in front of two goals formed into a right angle.

With head coach Becky Burleigh holding back on naming a starter for Friday's match against No. 2 Notre Dame, the practice field turns into a battleground.

"The starting job is on the line every time we go out there," Gardner said. "I could have it one day, Brit could have it the next day and Katie could have it the next day. It's up in the air."

Gardner started the first game against Drake, allowing one goal while stopping three shots, but came away irked by giving up a late goal.

"I think it was disappointing for the entire defense as a whole," Gardner said. "We worked really hard the entire game and to give up a goal on a set piece was highly disappointing."

"Ironically, [I didn't have any apprehension]," McCray said. "The Orange and Blue game kind of prepared me for being in front of the Gator crowd and everything, and once you step on the court and start warm-up, any butterflies I might have had are gone."



Portis, Dickey prepare to play

UF quarterback Gavin Dickey boasts a career throwing accuracy of 73 percent.

But Dickey hasn't completed, say, 110 of 150 passes. Nor is it 55 of 75 passes.

The redshirt junior's stellar rate stems from having completed 11 of 15 passes.

That's it — and not just for Dickey, but for UF's entire reserve quarterback crew.

Sound bad? If starter and Heisman hopeful Chris Leak suffers injury, yes. If Leak outlasts a season's worth of pounding, no.

"An injury is something we don't want to happen," Dickey said. "I think Coach [Dan] Mullen and Coach [Urban] Meyer have been getting everybody prepared to play, and we're ready to step in and do a very good job."

And that's where they stand, or sit on the bench.

As well as Leak might flourish under Meyer's new system, there is a three-headed enigma lurking on the sidelines.

There is Dickey, a play-every-position kind of player, who could

catch more passes than he throws as he battles for the fifth wide receiver job. There is freshman Josh Portis, a California product who rescinded his intent to play for Utah once Meyer joined the Gators. And in case of emergency, break the glass and plug in sophomore Cornelius Ingram, who is considering splitting time between football and basketball, seeing how the UF basketball team will lack guard depth.

Though Meyer has yet to name a No. 2, it's Portis's job for the taking. The freshman showed tremendous poise during the Orange and Blue game and flaunts the pass-run ability the spread offense requires of a quarterback.

Then again, will Portis sport a deer-in-the-headlights look once he runs out of the Swamp's tunnel this Saturday?

"I want to see his reaction," said Meyer, who added that both Portis and Dickey should see time against Wyoming, regardless of their places on the depth chart. "If his reaction


is what I'm worried it will be for the first couple of minutes, he might not see a snap until I see him settle down."

In a nutshell, UF's problem at quarterback is that behind Leak there is virtually no experience.

Even so, all the reserves possess speed, an invaluable asset for the spread offense. It is their ability to keep defenses guessing that will warrant them playing time throughout the season. Don't be surprised to see Portis or Dickey enter every game for a series or two to mix things up. Under Meyer's spread offense at Utah last season, reserve quarterback Brian Johnson played in seven games, completing 14 passes. And that was with Heisman finalist Alex Smith manning the offense.

"What we have is a committee backing up Chris," Mullen said. "Josh Portis is doing a lot of good things at practice, learning as a young guy. Gavin Dickey has played a lot of quarterback in the SEC, and we're working him at receiver now, but if you ever get to see him when he jumps into the quarterback position, he's going."

"He's a really sharp kid, and he's really comfortable with the offense."

Spread offense gives No. 5 receiver opportunity to shine

The No. 5 receiver spot may not be the most glamorous position on every football team, but in Urban Meyer's spread offense it's a vital role — and UF's coach may have found his guy.

Meyer has mentioned several players throughout fall camp that could be the fifth receiver, including quarterback Gavin Dickey and tight end Tate Casey, but right now Meyer likes Kenneth Tookes.

In two seasons at UF, Tookes recorded just two receptions in eight games. But the 6-foot-2, 205-pound junior has always been regarded as a talented player, and now he may finally

have his chance to contribute.

"Tookes has made a big push," Meyer said. "He's a pretty good blocker and that's a big part of what we do, too. We run a lot of perimeter plays. Our first year at Utah, we weren't very good on the edge and we weren't a strong perimeter run team. The second year, I thought we were as good as anybody in the country on perimeter blocking."

PLAYING TIME: Just days before UF's season opener against Wyoming, starting linebacker Earl Everett remained out of practice with a neck injury.

However, Meyer said Everett will be ready on Saturday.

Meyer also said that starting offensive linemen Tavares Washington and Jim Tartt are suffering from minor injuries but should also be ready to go.

As for the starting tailback spot, Meyer continues to say the job is wide open, but

once again he praised true freshman Kestahn Moore.

"He's one of those every play guys," Meyer said.

Meyer said that redshirt freshman receiver Mike McIntosh might play on Saturday, albeit in a limited role. The same goes for true freshman Nyan Boateng, UF's highest-rated receiver in the high school class of 2005. The biggest knock against Boateng is that he didn't play his entire senior year of high school due to injury.

DEFENSIVE WOES: While cornerback Dee Webb seems fully recovered from a shoulder injury, the defensive line rotation took a hit on Tuesday.

Sophomore defensive tackle Javier Estopinan sprained his foot and is expected

to recover, but the injury places an added burden to the interior of a line short on depth and experience.


"Going into the ball game this weekend, it's where we wanted the line to be at two deep," co-defensive coordinator Greg Mattison said. "Some guys in the rotation are going to have to step up."

Derrick Harvey, Clint McMillan, Joe Cohen and Lutrell Alford make up the second string defensive line, Mattison confirmed.

The lack of experience at the defensive tackle position could hurt the Gators in the trenches.

Alford, a sophomore walk-on, has yet to record a snap in his career, while McMillan has four career tackles.

Cohen, a Palm Bay native, can play anywhere along the defensive line, but he has spent much of training camp dealing with nagging injuries.
