Gator Nation reawakens

It was just a walk. It felt like a parade.

It was just a first-time stroll through a dark tunnel — a 90-decibel, heart-throbbing stroll for Urban Meyer.

It was just a post-game song, yet the Gators never felt prouder, their fans never felt so loved and a semi-conscious program seemed to breathe again, one trumpet note at a time.

Meyer and the Gators might have won the first game of a heavily hyped marriage, but Saturday it was all about a wedding reception — the beginning of a novel nuptial tradition that stirred the soul and rallied Gator Nation.


"It felt like I was a freshman again," safety Kyle Jackson said. "It was a whole new experience. Everything has pretty much changed around here with all the new traditions."

Tailgaters plastered every inch of University Avenue before midday had even arrived.

Then Meyer, who has always been quick to label Gator Nation as the most numbing college football experience, sampled some of that very feeling as part of the first-ever Gator Walk. Serving as the anesthetic were thousands of fans that lined up to wish a sharply dressed team as they filed into the Swamp.

"I thought Gator Walk was big-time," Meyer said. "I had no idea it could ever be like that. This was about as big-time as it gets for a home opener."

Alcohol policy plays favorites

The game, the first since UF President Bernie Machen began a campaign against binge drinking, raised questions about whether UF's most lucrative sport conflicts with Machen's efforts.

The university's policy, while ever-tightening around students, may exempt alumni who bring money to the University Athletic Association.

Matt Bryan is a Bull Gator, a member of the highest tier of the Gator Booster club. Bull Gator status requires at least \$12,000 in annual donations to UAA.

Though fans can be ejected from regular stadium seating for alcohol possession, alcohol is allowed in select areas. These include the Bull Gator sections, Touchdown Terrace and Champions' Club, as well as the \$48,000 per-season luxury suites over the north end zone.

Meanwhile, 68 fans were ejected and/or arrested from the stadium Saturday in alcohol-related incidents. University Police Department spokesman Joe Sharkey said that most of the ejected fans were not UF students, but five of the eight arrested were.

Bryan said a separate alcohol-consumption standard for alumni raises a "tough question."

Maureen Miller, UF's Alcohol & Other Drug Prevention Specialist, echoed Bryan's sentiment.

New skin cancer vaccine created at UF shows promise

■ **TESTED AGAINST MELANOMA, THE VACCINE MAY HAVE BROAD REACH.**

Future cases of a common cancer may be prevented by technology developed at UF.

Though it is years away from being used on humans, UF professor of immunology Howard Johnson has tested a vaccine for the skin disease melanoma in mice with promising results, he said.

Eighty to 100 percent of the mice given the vaccine survived two lethal doses of melanoma, one given immediately after the vaccine and one given six months after the

vaccine was administered, he said. Mice that were not given the vaccine died within two weeks of the lethal dose.


In humans melanoma is the deadliest form of skin cancer, according to the American Cancer Society's Web site. The society estimates that in 2005 there will be 59,580 new cases of melanoma in the United States, and about 7,770 people will die from the disease.

Johnson hopes to change those numbers with his vaccine, but the path from Johnson's lab to hospital beds is a long one.

Johnson is applying for a patent for the vaccine, and if he receives it, human clinical trials could begin in three to four years. The trials could then last for many more years, testing both the safety and the effectiveness

SG slating ends today

Student Government parties will continue prospect hunting for the Fall election until 5 p.m. today in the Reitz Union.

The Gator Party reported that 60 candidates interviewed for a spot on its roster Friday, while the Impact Party screened 16 applicants.

Gator Party spokesman Thomas Philpot said he hopes his party continues its trend of interviewing about 50 candidates each day.

"I was very encouraged by the turnout," he said. "[We've] been very impressed with the quality of the candidates. I'm looking forward to a good final day of slating."

Impact Party Communications Director Adam Roberts said he expects a "significant spike" in interested students today.

"We want to work harder," he said. "We're still very optimistic about where it's going."

SG Supervisor of Elections Daniel Maland said the slating process is running "extremely efficiently."

Maland decided last week to cut the section of the sign-up sheets that requires students to name which party they want to join.

"It obligated students to make a decision they may not have been ready to make at the time," he said.

Students could research Impact through its Web site, but as of Monday night the Gator Party did not have a similar resource. Maland said students should visit the respective party rooms to find out more information.

Roberts said because of the expected boom in participation, it's difficult to determine whether the interviewed candidates adequately represent his party.

"I think the folks that have come have a good grasp on what we are about," he said.

Roberts said the Impact Party would do things differently than the current administration, especially regarding budget choices.

"Our No. 1 issue is the way in which the \$11 million (SG's budget of tuition-funded Activity & Service fees) is being spent," he said.

Roberts said he doesn't agree with the current administration's decision to spend \$67,187 from Summer C to the first week of Fall 2005 on advertising itself and its own organizations.

"I think their spending has become dangerous," he said. "It's spending money when it's needed for other things. It's setting a bad precedent. If students lose control of their own money, then the game is over."

Slating continues from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. today in the Reitz Union. The Gator Party is interviewing in Room 276 while Impact officials are in Room 277.

for reportedly assaulting three UF students, according to a UPD news release.

A UF official contacted police after he reportedly observed UF student Phillip Matthew Joseph, 19, and Pi Kappa Phi members Jordan Adam Light, 21, Kyle Ashton Cain, 21, and Derek Oliver Goldsmith, 19, fighting with three other students on Fraternity Row.

"The parking official said that he saw a battery in process," UPD spokesman Lt. Joe Sharkey said in a telephone interview.

Through the official's identification and that of another witness, UPD officers were able to find the individuals involved, Sharkey said.

Witnesses told police the four alleged attackers fled to the Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity house, 11 Fraternity Row, after the fight, where they were arrested, according to a police report.

Cain, Joseph and Light were arrested on two counts of misdemeanor battery for reportedly assaulting UF students Russell Reed Cochran and Jacob Danner Fuller, according to Alachua County Jail records.

Goldsmith was arrested on one count of misdemeanor battery for attacking UF student Michael Craig Plucinski.

"I was just walking to the game," Plucinski said, but declined further comment.

Although police do not know which individuals drank or how much alcohol they had, it was clear to the arresting officer alcohol played a role in the incident, Sharkey said.

"There was alcohol involved," he said. "The smell of alcohol was there."

Two of the four suspects arrested were underage, jail records state.

The victims had minor injuries and were treated on the scene, according to the release.

All four suspects have been released from jail.

Several failed attempts were made to contact Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity for comment.

Sharkey said he does not know if the students who were attacked were part of another fraternity.

When asked about possible consequences for the suspects' fraternity, Sharkey said the situation would be handled by UF and the Interfraternity Council, of which Pi Kappa Phi is a member.

Relief collectors sent off campus

■ TOTAL EFFORTS STILL RAISED MORE THAN \$16,000 SO FAR.

One group's efforts to raise money for victims of Hurricane Katrina were cut short when it was asked to move off campus Saturday.

UF Naval ROTC students, who raised \$4,049 collecting for the American Red Cross, said they were approached by a police officer claiming that student groups could not ask for donations on campus and had to leave immediately.

ROTC member Carolyn Work, who organized this weekend's fundraiser, said the UPD officer named UF President Bernie Machen among those asking for the students to move off campus.

Machen wrote in an e-mail Monday that he wasn't aware of the situation.

"I don't know anything about this," he wrote. "It doesn't sound very consistent with our approach."

Anna Sansiveri, a student collecting for the American Red Cross, said the group was only there 15 minutes before being asked to leave.

"Our commander came up to us and told us that there were complaints from the Alumni Association that they didn't want to be bombarded with donations," she said.

UPD did not return e-mails.

Work said she didn't know if the UF ROTC had a permit to collect donations.

UF spokesman Steve Orlando said both parties acted with good intentions in an unfortunate situation.

"We absolutely applaud the efforts of those students doing such a wonderful job," he said. "We hope this won't discourage them from doing all that great work."

Athletics Director Jeremy Foley wrote in an e-mail that there is a no-solicitation policy around Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

"The logistics of collecting and monitoring such solicitations are very difficult," he wrote.

Many of the collectors were dis-

heartened at being prevented from requesting donations for something they considered so important.

"I don't understand," said Adam Cohee, a student collecting donations for the American Red Cross. "There are people out there drinking and partying, and we're just students trying to do a good deed."

Will Cannon, a ROTC student collecting for the American Red Cross, said they were getting just as much help off campus as they were on campus.

"There were a lot of generous people dropping twenties - both from the Gator and Wyoming fans," Cannon said.

The Center for Leadership and Service, which is part of the Dean of Students Office, also collected donations on campus Saturday but was not asked to leave.

Alana Rush, the center's student manager, wrote in an e-mail that student groups needed permits, which the center had, to collect donations.

The Center is now focusing on the need for nonperishable food and other material necessities, Rush wrote.

of the vaccine.

Johnson's vaccine would be given to those most susceptible to certain cancers, such as those who already have had melanoma lesions removed and the elderly, so their immune systems can prevent cancer cells from growing to a point where the patients would require chemotherapy or radiation.

Although he has tested the vaccine only with melanoma, he said he is hopeful it could be used against other cancers.

Johnson's vaccine consists of powerful superantigens and inactivated melanoma cells incapable of reproducing.

Superantigens are proteins that generate a much more

powerful response from the immune system than the usual response to cancer.

The body's normal reaction to cancer is weak and usually cannot overcome the cancerous invasion on its own.

Little research has been done on vaccines administered before cancer is diagnosed, and no one has tested a vaccine using superantigens, Johnson said. Most research focuses on treatments given after the cancer has been detected.

The treatments of choice, such as chemotherapy and radiation, kill healthy cells while they are attacking the cancer cells.

When healthy cells are killed, the patient suffers side

effects ranging from fatigue to hair loss and nausea.

But this vaccine may not be without side effects either, he said.

Because the proteins on cancer cells and healthy cells are similar, the vaccine could cause the immune system to turn against itself in a detrimental autoimmune reaction.

It is hard to test for autoimmune reactions in mice, so it is something that would have to be tested for in human clinical trials, Johnson said.

Although early results are promising, Johnson cautions against too much hope. It is only after many more years of testing that people can be assured his treatment works without any problems in humans.

Empty justice

Bush rushes nomination of inadequate candidate

The Editorial Board is moving to the Antarctic. We thought about Canada, with its relaxed marijuana laws and young drinking age, but we didn't think the gentle Northern folk were far enough from American soil.

But don't despair; we'll continue to discuss national and university politics while we run through the tundra, catching our dinner with our bare hands.

We just can't sit by while President Bush recommends a fairly inexperienced candidate for chief justice of the Supreme Court, one of the most powerful positions in America.

We're not going to get into the conservative versus liberal debate. No, we're taking the higher road.

We want to address John Roberts' court experience and Bush's haste to get him into the high chair of chief justice.

When Chief Justice William Rehnquist died this weekend, Bush quickly chose Roberts to replace him without any apparent consideration of other candidates. He had mapped out his plans for when Rehnquist died, and his moves are political genius.

Originally, Roberts was nominated to replace Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, and politicians everywhere began to eat him alive. Is he too conservative? Is he not conservative enough? Was this whole thing part of Bush's evil plan to infiltrate the courts and threaten our rights with a religious AK-47?

Of course every candidate deserves immense speculation. The position carries a lifetime appointment and tremendous power to shape our lives.

During Rehnquist's tenure alone, the Court gave Bush the 2000 election and ruled that the federal government triumphed over state government in marijuana laws.

This job is huge.

But the attention should not only focus on ideological background; it should focus on experience as well.

Forget Roberts' partisan ideals for one moment. The real test for a judge is his knowledge and application of the law. Sure, Roberts was an experienced lawyer, but that's a far cry from the most powerful judicial position in the United States.

So why is Bush nominating Roberts, who has been a judge for only two years on the D.C. Circuit?

Rehnquist had 14 years of experience as an associate justice before he ascended to the throne.

We suspect Bush has two things on his mind: Roberts' age and political slant.

At 50, Roberts could reign for 30 years. He has the potential to affect America's laws for a decade longer than Rehnquist.

He simply doesn't deserve this step.

How can the government hand over such a permanent position to someone who hasn't even been tried out? This isn't about whether Bush is slanting the Supreme Court; it's about executive competence.

Bush is pushing Roberts because the judge has already gone through the media frenzy. Now he is suffering another partisan attack but with one difference: We've heard it all before. And the second time just isn't as effective.

Bush also wants his choice for chief justice to be swiftly appointed. The longer Congress studies his choices, the more compromise will come into effect.

So our president is playing off the timing of Rehnquist's death. In a month the Supreme Court reconvenes. Who would argue that we shouldn't have the head honcho in his seat before the Supreme Court carries out its duties?

This Editorial Board will. Rehnquist had been far from entirely active before his death. Although he was known for being diligent in his work, no man can be all there while he goes through the effects of chemotherapy and operations.

The Supreme Court can wait for its chief justice. After all, what are a few months to 30 years of regret?

Liberals rush at chance to blame Bush

You've probably heard about the dead bodies in New Orleans' streets. The water supply is contaminated, refugees have gone days without food or water, and armed gangs still roam some streets and shoot at relief workers. Aid has trickled in, but reconstruction seems uncertain, and the death toll is still rising as gunfights and suicide persist.

Some seem to think America is reaping what it sowed.

After Sept. 11, 2001, most critics of American foreign policy had the good sense to wait at least a month before they started saying "they had it coming." But some Greens and anti-Bush fanatics have decided they can't hold their tongues that long. It's apparently never too early to politicize a tragedy.

On the homefront Cindy Sheehan has written that Bush was "heading to Louisiana to see the devastation that his environmental policies and his killing policies have caused."

Germany's Environmental Minister Jürgen Trittin claimed the hurricane was a result of Bush not signing the Kyoto Treaty.

The American president is closing his eyes to the economic and human costs his land and the world economy are suffering under natural catastrophes like Katrina and because of neglected environmental policies, Trittin said.

Joan Ehlers of World Wildlife Fund Germany said global warming has increased the intensity of hurricanes and that Americans "have a big impact on the greenhouse effect."

In fact German magazines and newspapers have taken some of the most disturbing positions on the tragedy. A writer for the Berlin-based daily Tagesspiegel suggested that America wasn't critical enough of Bush's climate policies and that such catastrophes would be avoided if we worked together with nature.

On a sidenote Islamic extremists are delighted about the disaster. They've given Katrina a military rank and are crossing their fingers that oil will hit \$100 a barrel.

There are far too many examples of pundits politicizing

the suffering, and you can expect there to be more in the coming weeks. So where is the sense of decency? I think America should cut back spending on NASA, but I didn't exactly talk

about that after the Columbia disaster. And I'm only singling out the Left because they are the only ones I've heard so far twisting the situation to promote an agenda.

But all this talk about Republican policies causing hurricanes is even more offensive because it's embarrassingly false. After the tsunami disaster in 2004, some environmentalists jumped on the opportunity to talk about global warming and Bush's failure to sign the Kyoto Treaty. As this didn't apply to the tsunami, the greens finally quieted down.

One of the nation's foremost hurricane experts, William Gray, has said that if global warming was to blame and truly a global phenomenon, cyclones would be increasing across the world and not just in the Atlantic.

So maybe the problem is not that Americans are reaping what they sowed, but that some of our friends, abroad and in our own backyard, want to use this crisis to take cheap shots at the administration or lecture us on controversial environmental theories. Or if you're Kanye West, hurricane devastation is also a good time to discuss how Republicans and the National Guard work together to shoot and otherwise oppress blacks.

But then again, with friends like that, who needs enemies?





Wynn could return to line-up Saturday

A day after Urban Meyer's Gators debuted to mixed results, the first-year UF coach said tailback DeShawn Wynn may be available to play Saturday against Louisiana Tech.

Meyer all but admitted Wynn's absence from the field in UF's 32-14 victory against Wyoming—and the Gators lack of a running presence—was the result of a suspension, although Meyer didn't exactly call it that.

Meyer said Wynn is paying for mistakes made months ago, and that UF's most talented tailback—who led the Gators in rushing touchdowns two seasons ago as a freshman—excelled in fall camp.

"That hole was built a long time ago in February and March," Meyer said. "[Wynn] climbed out of that hole in training camp, and it's week-to-week with him. He might play against Louisiana Tech, we'll wait to see how practice goes this week."

KATRINA HITS HOME: As accounts of storm-battered relatives and friends reuniting continue to surface in the wake of Hurricane Katrina, UF offensive lineman Tavares Washington waits for a phone call.

Washington, whose family in Greenville, Miss., dodged Katrina, said he still hasn't heard from friend and former Gators offensive lineman Sylvester McGrew.

In 2004, McGrew, a native of New Orleans, transferred to McNeese State located in Lake Charles, La., about 200 miles west of the Crescent City.

"I'm looking forward to hearing from him," Washington said. "I actually called his phone, but it wasn't working."

"It is upsetting because a lot of people don't know what's next; they don't know what their future will be. They're homeless right now, and some people are refusing to go to another city right now, so it's disturbing."

According to a team spokesman, McGrew no longer plays with McNeese due to academic issues during the offseason.

While the uncertainty of his friend's whereabouts concern Washington, he remains thankful his parents emerged unscathed.

"My family, as far as in Mississippi, everybody is all right because they're more up north," Washington said. "I called my parents right after [Katrina] hit, and I was just happy to hear from them. It could've easily been me. I'm just glad it's not."

Meyer didn't induct any offensive players, saying, "they're very close but we need to get second-year production out of them."

Attention Downtown Athletic Club, UF linebacker Brandon Siler would like to make an announcement.

Forget Matt Leinart, Reggie Bush and the rest.

Forget about even watching football for the next four months.

Bias granted, Siler knows what you're looking for, and he knows the perfect candidate.

"Chad Jackson for Heisman," said Siler, following the Gators' 32-14 win against Wyoming Saturday.

In Urban Meyer's debut game, the highly hyped UF receiver stole the show with 10 catches, 143 all-purpose yards while becoming the eighth UF player to score four touchdowns in school history.

But stats are only the half of it; a Heisman hotshot requires a juiced highlight reel. Jackson began filming in the third quarter.


Riding a 48-yard quarter-opening drive with a 17-0 lead, UF quarterback Chris Leak dropped back and checked down before lofting a pass toward the Gator-vacant east corner of the north end zone.

"I wasn't really expecting it," Jackson said. "The ball was supposed to go to Dallas on the deep-post route. I didn't expect Chris to throw it. He overthrew me, and I didn't expect to catch it."

With the Pride of the Sunshine the closest thing to an orange-and-blue-clad receiver in the vicinity, in swooped Jackson past a pair of Cowboys defensive backs to make a one-handed touchdown catch.

With the reception, Jackson became the first UF receiver since Jabar Gaffney to coach three touchdowns in a game.

For now he's not cuaght up in the

UF dominates four teams in four days

Soccer splits at Notre Dame

Faced with the task of playing four matches in four days, the UF volleyball team wasted no time disposing of its opponents.

The No. 8 Gators pummeled Eastern Washington 3-0 (30-27, 30-16, 30-16) Monday night after finishing a clean sweep of the Aquafina Volleyball Invitational over the weekend.

UF coach Mary Wise said the tough stretch of games started to affect the Gators on Monday, but she credits her team's stellar conditioning for allowing them to persevere.

"I was beginning finally to see a little bit of fatigue, but this is a well-conditioned group," Wise said.

On Saturday, UF defeated 15th-ranked UC-Santa Barbara 3-0 (30-25, 30-22, 30-24) in front of 4,798 fans. UF had already claimed victories against Dayton and Missouri State on Friday, sweeping them as well.

Senior outside hitter Jane Collymore led the Gators with 16 kills against UC-Santa Barbara and added 13 digs and four block assists. After the match, she was named Most Valuable Player of the tournament. Collymore said the Gators' dominance throughout the weekend tournament could be attributed to the way the team has gelled on the court.

"For us to come out and win each of these matches 3-0 against some pretty tough teams says plenty about this team's cohesiveness and chemistry," she said.

After Saturday's match against UC-Santa Barbara, Wise said she was impressed with UF's defensive performance.

"It's fair to say we're much improved from playing these three matches against three very different teams," Wise said.

"I'm not sure we'll play an opponent as good as serve, pass and receive as UCSB for a while. For us to go toe-to-toe and out-dig them says a lot about where we are."

SOCCER SPLITS AGAINST TOP-10: The UF women's soccer team scored six goals in two games this weekend, but it was defending national champion Notre Dame that treated the No. 19 Gators to an offensive clinic.

UF faced what could be its stiffest competition of the season at taking on the No. 1 Fighting Irish and then-No. 9 Connecticut in South Bend, Ind. The Gators (2-1) basted the Huskies 5-0 on Sunday, but could not handle Notre Dame, who topped UF 4-1 on Friday night.

"We thought we attacked well against Notre Dame," UF coach Becky Burleigh said. "But obviously we had to get a lot better defensively."

Notre Dame took control early, netting a pair of goals past keeper Jen Gardner in the first 20 minutes. The Fighting Irish racked up two more second-half goals on Gardner before the Gators tacked on a late Jasmine Johnson score.

"They really did a good job of finishing," Burleigh said. "When we made a mistake, they punished us."

UF turned the tables against Connecticut, defeating the Huskies in UF's largest margin of victory since 2001.

"It was a great recovery, a nice bounce back from the Notre Dame game," Burleigh said. "To score five goals on the No. 9 team [in an NSCAA poll] in the country is a pretty big feat."

UF QUARTERBACKS New shoes propel Leak's game

UF followers have been quick to criticize Chris Leak's ability to run the spread offense.

What they failed to consider was

one important change in the junior's game — he's wearing new kicks.

Sporting his upgraded and lighter Nike Shox after trashing his Nike Barracudas, Leak treaded over the Wyoming Cowboys in UF's debut of the spread offense. He completed 26-of-34 passes for 320 yards

and three touchdowns, breaking a school record in the process.

"[Leak] got rid of those big cleats and got lighter cleats so he can start running a little bit now," junior receiver Chad Jackson said.

It was Leak's arm that did most of the shouting, however. When he completed a shovel pass to Andre Caldwell during the third quarter, he broke Steve Spurrier's 39-year record of 16 consecutive completions.

"That's a heck of a record," UF coach Urban Meyer said.

Save for some missed reads and an occasional overthrow, Leak shined in his first crack at Meyer's Spread 'n' Shred offense.

"Once I got in a rhythm it just felt like everything was repetitions and just getting a better feel for everything ...," Leak said. "The more reps I get the more comfortable I think everybody will be."

The burning question all along had been whether Leak could motor fast enough to make the spread offense work. Leak answered with a wait-and-see "yes" Saturday by displaying an array of runs. In the second quarter alone, he picked up a crucial first-and-goal on a 5-yard draw and found receiver Dallas Baker for a 7-yard pickup after spinning away from a sack.


"Chris didn't run the ball too much, but when he did, I believe he stopped most of the criticism about whether he can run," Baker said.

Later, on a crucial 3-and-7 at the Wyoming 9-yard line, Leak scrambled to the right, picked up 8 yards, a first down and a licking by three Cowboys out of bounds.

"If you play in the SEC you're going to get hit, so I'm used to that," Leak said. "I've run the ball the past couple of years so that's really not a big adjustment to me."

Leak passed his first test with straight A's, but the question remains how his legs will fare against Southeastern Conference speed.

"I think he'll probably be ready further down the road, but I think [the spread] might be a little too much for him," Wyoming cornerback Derrick Martin said.

After showing enormous potential at the end of the 2004 season, Jackson picked up where he left off by scoring all of UF's touchdowns against Wyoming. The junior entered the game with just 32 receptions in his first two seasons, but racked up nearly a third of his career total in one game. His third touchdown—an acrobatic one-handed end zone grab—became a SportsCenter staple this weekend.

"There's a lot of people who couldn't have made that catch," UF coach Urban Meyer said. "People say, 'That's a great call, Coach' or 'Great throw, Chris.' No, it's not. It's a receiver making a great play."

While Wyoming cornerback Derrick Martin may have been unimpressed with Leak, ESPN analysts Lee Corso and Kirk Herbstreit are already labeling the junior quarterback a legitimate Heisman candidate. Despite his -11 rushing yards—the result of sacks—Leak showed an ability to run. Meanwhile, his passing game has never been sharper. Leak broke Steve Spurrier's 39-year old record of 16 consecutive completions, notching one more in the second and third quarters. Considering this was Leak's first game running the Spread-n-Shred offense, Meyer has reason to be optimistic about his quarterback.



3. Vernell Brown, CB, Sr.
6 solo tackles,
1 int.

For years, Brown's claim to fame has been his botched pass attempt against Michigan in the 2003 Outback Bowl. Now, the 5-foot-8, 165-pound senior is proving you don't need size to star in the SEC. One of college football's smallest cornerbacks excelled while covering Jovon Bouknight, holding Wyoming's star receiver to five receptions, 54 yards and a touchdown. Brown also led UF in tackles while recording the only interception of the game.





20 yards, en route to breaking a 39-year-old record.

Leak completed 17 consecutive passes in the second and third quarter, surpassing the team record of 16 set by Steve Spurrier twice in 1966. Also, one of Leak's top receivers merged as a possible superstar.

Chad Jackson—who began to break out at the end of last season—exploded for 10 receptions, 138 yards and three receiving touchdowns while adding a five-yard rushing score.

Meyer also praised UF's defensive performance, which included six tackles and an interception by first-year starting cornerback Vernell Brown. Also, Ray McDonald, switch-

ing from defensive tackle to defensive end, kept Wyoming quarterback Corey Bramlet in check the entire night.

But UF's tailback woes were apparent, and an 18-point victory—while certainly not an immediate cause of concern—wasn't exactly what the Gators had hoped for in Meyer's debut game.

"They had fumbled snaps, their routes weren't that crisp and they just couldn't get

it all going," Martin said.

Still, Meyer wanted his players to appreciate the victory.

"I remember two years ago at Utah, we beat Utah State 40-20 and you walked in the locker room and everyone was disgusted ... including the coaches," Meyer said. "The one thing I promised these guys ... is we'll never be disappointed with a win ... I'm not apologizing for a win, it was a great effort."

Wright finished 16-for-28 for 232 yards and a touchdown pass.

So, it came down to the defenses and special teams, and even when nose units set up their offenses with prime field position, it was no sure thing they'd capitalize. The Seminoles wasted a first-and-goal from the 1 in the third quarter.

Most of the talk leading up to the 10th meeting of Miami and Florida State was about the two first-time starters at quarterback. And when it took almost nine minutes for either team to complete a pass, it became apparent the offenses were in for a long night against two fast and furious defenses.

Wright worked through his prob-

lems, including two early interceptions and a few dropped passes, long enough to guide an 81-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter. The sophomore's first career TD pass was a 34-yarder, zipped over a defender to Ryan Moore to make it 10-7 Florida State.

The Seminoles grabbed a 10-0 lead in the first quarter, with help from the first interception thrown by Wright.

The pick set Florida State up at the Miami 29 and moments later James Coleman bulled in from the 1 for a 7-0 lead and the Seminoles' first first-quarter TD against the 'Canes since FSU's last win six years ago.

Peattie, a veteran who made 15 of 24 field goal attempts last season, missed badly from 47 and 39 in the quarter. It turned out to be a good omen for Florida State.

sandwich meat in his honor.

Ooops. Too late.

But when someone publicly places the Gators in the company of Air Force, a thorough psychological assessment of said person's mental health and potential harm to society should follow immediately.

In the season opener against the Cowboys, the Gators rushed for 91 yards.

Meyer knows that won't cut it when the SEC big boys roll into town.

Meyer ripped the O-line after the game for creating holes inadequate to toss a dwarf through.

Still there's something missing—DeShawn Wynn.

If the Gators are going to live up to the hype, a silent giant will have to step up.



Gators defeat Wyoming, Meyer still not satisfied

The Gators call it the Spread 'n' Shred offense, but even after a 32-14 opening day victory against Wyoming, Urban Meyer isn't so sure if it's the Gators or their opponents who will do most of the shredding this year.

Despite an array of highlight plays, UF didn't pour on the points against Wyoming like Meyer's Utah team did a year ago—and Meyer said UF may not be balanced enough right now to compete with some of the upper-echelon teams of college football.

"In case you were wondering what the offense should look like, that wasn't it," Meyer said. "Chris has a lot of work to do as does our offensive line."

After the game, Wyoming cornerback Derrick Martin—who witnessed Utah's 45-28 victory over the Cowboys last year—was less than impressed with the new-look Gators.

"Utah was way better. They had a better quarterback," Martin said. "[UF] could be better, they've just got to start focusing better and they've got to run their

routes.

"I don't think they're going to win the SEC. They wouldn't win the Mountain West."

Whether or not Meyer and Martin are overanalyzing UF's opening day performance, there were still plenty of reasons for UF to be optimistic after defeating a team that Sports Illustrated ranked No. 25.

The last time junior quarterback Chris Leak saw game action he had one of the poorest performances of his career in UF's 27-14 loss to Miami in the Peach Bowl.

Many have questioned Leak's ability to adapt to Meyer's offense, and while Meyer said Leak surely hasn't mastered the offense, the numbers told a different story.

Leak completed 26-of-33 passes for three touchdowns and
