



# Gator, Impact parties finish Senate slating

Public relations freshman Jill Peck said she wanted to slate with The Gator Party because her sorority, Delta Gamma, is active in Student Government's current administration.

"They're really involved in The Gator Party," she said. "I know this one's more Greek."

And she wasn't the only one.

The Gator Party interviewed 118 candidates Tuesday, the final day of slating, bring-

ing the party's total to 222, nearly three-and-a-half times as many candidates as the Impact Party, their opposition. Gator will slate for all 46 available Student Senate seats.

Their rivals, the Impact Party, interviewed about 40 potential candidates Tuesday, raising their total to 65. Impact will slate for 40 seats.

Gator Party President Laura Gonzalez said she was very pleased with the turnout.

"I am very happy to see so many people excited about The Gator Party," she said.

Impact Party spokesman Adam Roberts echoed Gonzalez's contentment.

"It could not have ended any better," he said. "We are very enthusiastic. We cannot wait to get started."

## Student Government

Both parties were required to present their completed slates at 11:59 p.m. Tuesday.

The Gator Party wrote up what Student Body President Joe Goldberg called a "good-faith agreement" between parties to campaign ethically. The agreement stated, "I shall not use or permit the use of character defamation, libel, slander or scurrilous attacks on any can-

didate or his or her personal or family life, nor shall I use or permit on my behalf misleading or untrue advertisements."

Both party presidents signed the agreement. "We took the initiative to put the campaign on the right foot," Gator Party spokesman Thomas Philpot said. "We want to agree to those standards from the start."

SG Supervisor of Elections Daniel Maland said no illegal activity was brought to his attention during slating.

## Towels carry high price

A bill allocating almost \$50,000 to the laundering of 15,000 free towels at the Southwest Recreation Center passed its first reading in Student Senate Tuesday.

The Gator Party campaigned on the issue last Spring with a \$25,000 price tag.

"The No. 1 thing I hear all the time is, 'Where are those towels?'" Student Body Treasurer Lindsay Cosimi said.

The Gator Party President Laura Gonzalez said students' re-use of one towel for many trips to the gym is a hygiene problem.

"It's kind of gross that they keep wiping down the machines with a towel they have not washed," she said.

Some senators, however, suggested the money could be spent more wisely.

"This is almost \$50,000 which could be spent elsewhere, like another vehicle for SNAP or more parking for family housing," said Sen. Brooke Seidman, adding that people could bring their own towels home and wash them.

Senate also approved a \$12,266,399 budget for the 2006-2007 period, but it needs one more reading to be finalized.

To accommodate the budget's growth spurt, the Senate proposed a 95-cent increase to students' Activity & Service Fee. However, the A&S Fee Committee has yet to confirm that figure.

Sen. Jackie Pace, chairwoman of the Senate Budget and Allocations Committee, said the budget's increase is largely due to Florida's new minimum wage and the recent spike in fossil fuel prices, which affect Student Government's operation of facilities such as the Southwest Recreation Center.

SG's subsidization of student tickets at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts, passed during Summer, took a \$41,400 cut in the budget.

Meanwhile, SG's renewed membership in the Florida Student Association meant state lobbying fees rose by \$34,400.

Because the budget was written before Supervisor of Elections Daniel Maland implemented a "secured-site" online voting method for SG elections, there is no reduction in the budget's \$49,500 elections line. Online voting

is supposed to decrease the cost of elections.

"We're going to come in drastically under cost of what we've been budgeted," said Sen. Jared Hernandez, who chaired the Senate

Online Voting Committee last Summer.

UF's music ensembles were also cut from the budget. Cosimi said they may not meet the standards for fundability laid out in SG statutes.

The music department should fund these ensembles, she said.

The budget requires one more reading and a signature to go into effect.


Senators also voted down a resolution advocating the repeal of a state law prohibiting vendors from selling gasoline below cost, which would allow vendors to sell gasoline cheaper.

Sen. John Printy said the resolution could hurt Gainesville's small-business community, as only large firms like Wal-Mart could afford to sell below cost.

"The more efficient businesses are going to benefit and profit from this," he said. "More efficient meaning big, huge, corporate."

# Latin flavor spices up Reitz Union

■ SOME 700 ATTENDED WELCOME MIXER FOR HISPANIC STUDENTS.

Chicas and chicos made the Reitz Union Grand Ballroom into a "carnaval" of beads, masks and dance and gave Tuesday night's Hispanic Student Assembly a Latin flavor.

Speakers UF President Bernie Machen, Dean of Students Gene Zdziarski and others remarked on that flavor.

About 700 participants attended at some point in the night, La Casita Director Leticia Martinez said.

After an hour of tabling by about 40 organizations, UF mascots Albert and Alberta got the crowd moving with the orange-and-blue cheer chanted by alumni and students at football games.

Interspersed through speeches and door prizes were promotional videos for some of UF's Hispanic organizations and Student Government.

The promotion for La Casita featured a student walking through the house explaining or illustrating what happened in each room.

When in the kitchen he mentioned the free lunches offered to students at the house across from UF on West University Avenue from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Wednesdays.

Cheers met the announcement that Bacilos, a Grammy- and Latin Grammy-winning trio, would be the main act for the Hispanic Heritage Month Concert on Sept. 24.

Polite applause met the announcement that a second group, Yerba Buena, also will appear at the concert.

Yerba Buena has an eclectic blend of hip-hop, Latin and African musical styles and performed for the soundtrack of the movie "Dirty Dancing: Havana Nights" according to a Hispanic Heritage Month flier.

Machen mixed with students before the start of the show in his Latin-style white button-down shirt with a small

gator on the cuff, a gift from one of the groups.

He told the audience that this year's freshman class has about 150 more Hispanic-Latino students than last year's.


Amalia Alvarez, introduced as the first Latina to graduate from UF with a doctorate degree, recognized winners of the Association of Hispanic Alumni scholarships.

The Latin American Club was the only organization for Hispanics and Latinos when she came to UF, she said.

Student Body President Joe Goldberg, a staple of the assembly circuit, fondly recalled how much he enjoyed dancing salsa with a Hispanic campus organization.

Zdziarski internationalized his welcome to this portion of the student body when he said, "Bienvenidos a UF."

Martinez said the event cost about \$1,400 and the Dean of Students Office contributed about \$1,200 of that amount. The Association of Hispanic Alumni paid for the rest.



## Soldier thanks dean

Interim Dean Jill Varnes walked into the conference room at 9:30 a.m. expecting to have her usual Tuesday staff meeting.

Instead, she received a round of applause and a big surprise when Senior Airman Jeffrey Solis dropped by the College of Health and Human Performance to thank her for her support.

Solis presented the interim dean with an American flag signed by himself and the 12 other members of his unit sponsored by the college during their six months in Iraq.

“That’s really special,” Varnes said, taking the flag and wiping tears from her eyes. “Thank you.”

Every month, the college faculty and staff filled two to three boxes with snacks, playing cards, books, games and calling cards to send to the troops in Iraq.

“It’s hard to find anything out in the middle of the desert, so everything helped,” Solis said. “Especially the lip balm and sunscreen.”

The project was organized by Solis’ mother, Janice Douglas, a secretary in the dean’s office.

“Janice mentioned one day that she wanted to do it, and

everyone was really good about pitching in,” said Michele Dye, the director of communications for the college.

“The whole dean’s office got involved.”

Solis, 21, said the care packages were extremely helpful and well appreciated, and it made him feel good to know that people back home were still thinking about him.

**Student Life** Douglas sent an American flag to her son in the most recent package, and asked him and the other members of his unit in the Air Force Security Forces to sign it as a way to thank Varnes for the college’s support.

Varnes said she plans to frame the flag and hang it up in the office conference room for everyone to see.

“We’ll have to put it up on the wall and replace that ugly old picture there,” Varnes joked, referring to an old UF campus photograph.

Solis said although he hopes to be home for more than six months, that may not end up being the case.

“It worked out all right though,” he said. “At least I made it back in time for football season.”

# Event urges opposition to Roberts' Court nomination

It was standing room only in the Civic Media Center on Tuesday night for a meeting to oppose the nomination of John Roberts for Supreme Court chief justice.

The event informed the audience of about 30 as to why Roberts, a conservative, should not be appointed to the Supreme Court.

"It's important for the president to appoint, and the Senate to confirm, judges who are fair — who follow the law and who aren't

known in their careers for being extremely right-winged," National Lawyers Guild member Shelbi Day said. "The judiciary branch is supposed to be a neutral third party."

Andrea Costello, president of the Gainesville National Lawyers Guild chapter, pointed out instances when Roberts spoke against affirmative action, women's rights, the Commerce Clause of the Constitution, separation of church and state, and the Geneva Convention.

She based these allegations on reports from the Alliance for Justice, the NAACP Education Fund, the People for the American Way and the National Organization for Women.

"This is not a lawyer who favors the use of federal civil rights laws as a way to protect the majority of people in the United States," she said.

However, President Bush said in his nomination speech that Roberts possesses experience, wisdom, fairness and civility and has devoted his career to the cause of justice.

To counter Bush's confidence Costello cited a case in Roberts' private practice when he represented the Toyota corporation.

"He successfully advocated that Toyota didn't have to provide accommodations under the Americans with Disabilities Act for a woman who developed carpal tunnel on the job," Costello said.

A prisoners' rights lawyer in attendance agreed that Roberts' record showed a lack of protection for minorities.

"It seems like he takes the side of the powerful most often, and that's troubling," said National Lawyers Guild member Cassandra Capobianco.

Speakers at the event hoped students and residents would familiarize themselves with Roberts' record and take action by contacting senators on the Senate Judiciary Committee.

"It's our court, and we really need to be talking about how to get it back," Costello said.

The students were ranked in areas such as GPA, SAT and ACT scores, leadership positions and community-service work.


IFC Vice President of Membership Chris Bucciarelli said the areas focus on the four pillars of IFC: leadership, scholarship, com-



## While government flubs, Americans take up slack

Last week the Editorial Board weighed in on the atrocities plaguing New Orleans and its outlying areas. Indeed, the hurricane seemed to bring out the worst in people. Desperation caused looting and violence, while the local and federal governments fumbled with how to clean up the fatal mess.

But today we want to focus on all the non-bureaucratic good that has emerged since the tragedy.

For all the shortcomings of our political leaders, individuals have taken up the slack with unprecedented vigor.

In classrooms all across campus, professors urged students to donate to the American Red Cross. And thousands of students, the biggest cheapskates of all time, actually took that advice and placed their almost nonexistent money into the hands of volunteers.

Local and campus organizations sat in the heat all day to collect donations.

Parents and students alike trudged out to the heart of the devastation to help in the traumatic efforts.

Businesses pitched in services, money and supplies.

Most relevantly many universities quickly came to the aid of the area's devastated colleges. All in all, Katrina affected at least 29 universities, 11 of which are in New Orleans.

UF is taking in some of these students, charging them in-state tuition, a financial strain that is both significant and surprisingly sympathetic. About \$10,000 lies between in-state and out-of-state tuition, and UF is already overenrolled.

Other schools have taken it further; since many students have lost the thread to their finances, some colleges are offering the stranded students free tuition. FIU, along with seven other colleges, has offered some students free or severely discounted prices.

So why is the entire country so devastated and moved by this disaster? Other parts of the world have experienced such catastrophes, most notably the 2004 tsunami.

While we watch news of those faraway disasters with interest, it's been awhile since our country has been so genuinely empathic for the victims of such devastation.

When the tsunami hit select groups asked for donations, but the same feeling just wasn't there. We saw it as a travesty far from home; it was a cause we could pick up and drop a couple months later. We could talk about it with reserve and logic; now, emotions run high with every utterance of New Orleans.

This response is different.

We don't just watch the news with the perverted eye we reserve for car wrecks; we watch it with mounting anger and depression. Every new development sparks an urge to help from almost everyone.

It's like Sept. 11, 2001 — it's on our own soil. It's not removed; it's in our face. These could be our families. In fact many Floridians have friends who are residents of the area.

So we're selfish; we only care about our own. That's just human nature.

But maybe we can remember in the future the shock and horror we felt at something so close to home. In Asia families are still displaced and poverty-stricken but are only remembered at such times as these.

President Bush and New Orleans officials failed in evacuating the city properly, resulting in the poorest factions being left behind. Their incompetence is abhorrent.

This hurricane's devastation has revealed the racial divide of this country. The poorest residents, and thus the ones left to die, are predominantly black.

But if our government isn't up to the task, at least American citizens have shown their competence at helping their fellow man, no matter his socioeconomic status.



## Price gouging part of market economy

Professor Steven Slutsky wore a wry smile in my microeconomics class last Monday.

"The response will be inevitable," he mused.

Inevitable indeed — no sooner had Hurricane Katrina finished ravaging the Louisiana coastline than reports of price gouging started floating out of the inundated area.

Gasoline prices spiked well above \$3 a gallon in the storm's wake. Hotel managers overcharged for rooms. Generators and canned goods sold for double the usual.

The public cried foul.

President Bush and Louisiana Attorney General Charles Foti Jr. vowed revenge.

But are the so-called gougers really the scheming, unscrupulous highwaymen that politicians and popular opinion often portray them to be? Consider the effects of their behavior.

Following a disaster like Hurricane Katrina, stores suddenly find themselves short on goods. Spurred to raise prices and maximize profit in the face of dwindling supply and overwhelming demand, business owners provoke an innate conservational response in buyers, ensuring that meager supplies are used only in the direst situations. Higher prices therefore guarantee scarce goods go to their highest-valued purpose.

The shop owners benefit, of course, but it is their self-interest alone that promotes the outcome most favorable to society.

Higher prices also foster the production and importation of more of the goods in shortest supply. The prices, said economist Walter Williams, are "a signal saying that there are unmet human wants, leading people to strive to meet those wants." Eventually, higher prices become self-correcting: As goods flow in, prices return to their pre-emergency levels.

Sure, the gougers themselves are only trying to make a buck, but in doing so they bring in the supplies and rebuild the infrastructure that is needed after a disaster.

It can be a tough pill to swallow, and my heart goes out to all the victims of Katrina, but this idea is the basis for our entire market economy.

The most common alternatives

are not nearly as constructive.

Price controls invariably lead to shortages. Quotas encourage the unnecessary consumption of goods up to the quota amount while keeping those who truly need more from obtaining it.

So why do so many politicians still fight the natural response of vendors to raise prices during an emergency?

The answer is simple: Their constituents only see the most noticeable effects of higher prices. In the aftermath of a natural disaster, profiteering businessmen are easier targets of public indignation than government-mandated shortages.

Of course the most frequent argument against gougers isn't an economic one but that higher prices simply aren't fair.

But why not? In a marketplace, every exchange is voluntary. Patrons obviously value their hotel stays at more than the \$200-a-night rate. With both buyers and sellers necessarily agreeing to every transaction, a gouging environment is totally indistinguishable from the everyday market.

Because there is no qualitative difference between gouging and normal increases in price, legislators have had to develop an equally vague definition. Usually, theirs is based on the concept of sellers taking "unfair advantage" of buyers, whatever that means.

The bottom line is this: Even \$5-a-gallon gasoline is preferable to a fuel shortage.

But as long as they remain politically expedient, price controls and anti-gouging laws will linger in public policy instead of being relegated to the ideological junk heap, where they belong.

# Students' free speech rights threatened

It's one of those ideals almost synonymous with being American: freedom of speech.

Especially in the world of higher education, freedom to vocalize dissent either in or out of the classroom is practically inherent to the learning process.

Despite these ideals, a recent review by a national watchdog group claims that UF restricts students' right to free speech. In fact it gave UF the lowest rating possible on its scale.

Before my banner-waving allies start marching to UF President Bernie Machen's doorstep, let's get real.

The Foundation for Individual Rights in Education was founded to help sustain students' rights at what its founders believed were an increasing number of partisan universities. Since then, the foundation has brought several universities to court, usually after a student complained that his or her rights were violated. They've won a number of cases.

So what's so wrong with UF? It got a "red light" rating, meaning at least one of its policies "both clearly and substantially restricts freedom of speech."

The foundation further defines this as a policy that "unambiguously

**Amy Eisinger** infringes" on protected expression and has restrictions applicable to several types of campus expression.

The foundation's Web site points to various sections of UF's Student Rights and Responsibilities and to descriptions of what qualifies as sexual harassment.

I read each policy. A main issue the foundation has with Student Rights and Responsibilities falls on one sentence: "Organizations or individuals that adversely upset the delicate balance of communal living will be subject to disciplinary action..."

Slightly less than vague? Definitely. But whether or not the group will file suit against UF is open to question — they've done it before to other universities in similar situations.

Other than this one question remains: As a student at UF, have I felt my freedoms restricted? Moreover, if UF is brought to court over a few words in its policies, will there be any noticeable changes?

I'd say probably not. In cases like this generally the only people who come out winning are the lawyers. What this re-

view does mean is that students need to be more aware of the way in which the university can restrict personal liberties.

Will we see deans bolting across Turlington Plaza to shut down groups? Maybe not, but blatant displays of censorship are not the only ways in which the administration can limit quietly organizations or people on campus.

What the administration needs to do is rewrite both policies before they are used against it.

Universities should harbor free thought, without ever making students feel inhibited for expressing a personal belief. The foundation's review should be a wake up call and a reminder that we as students have an obligation to scrutinize constantly the words and actions of our school and faculty.

Over the last few years, and under laws like the Patriot Act, we must realize that rights we once took for granted can be called into question.

And though some might find them annoying, I loathe the thought of a Turlington Plaza void of leaflet-wielding campaigners.

# Campus bike theft spikes in Fall

With falling leaves come rising rates of bicycle theft on campus, according to the University Police Department.

"We see this every Fall semester," UPD Lt. Darren Baxley said. "New students either don't know how to lock their bike properly or don't even lock them at all, thus leading to the increase in bike thefts in the Fall."

Scott Baltz, a UF sophomore, has had two \$500 bicycles stolen on campus in the past year.

"If I were to give advice to anyone who wants to keep a bike on campus, I would tell them to get a bike that they wouldn't want to have for themselves," Baltz said. "I had two nice bikes, but apparently they are too much of a target for people who want to steal them. Now I have a \$75 Wal-Mart bike that I've had no problems with."


Many bicycle thieves target high-priced bicycles on campus, and the professional thieves can defeat most locking mechanisms, Baxley said, although he said he believes locking bicycles is still effective against theft.

Eric Johnson, co-owner of Chain Reaction Bicycles, 1630 W University Ave., said he sees at least a dozen students a week who claim their bicycles or bicycle parts were stolen on campus.

Johnson believes that a sturdy bicycle lock can deter a would-be thief. He recommends all students buy a U-lock and coil cable to protect their bicycles.

UPD recommends that students also register their bicycles. This increases the chance that the bicycle can be recovered and returned if stolen.

"There isn't a whole lot we can do if the owner doesn't register their bike," Baxley said. "Chances are they'll never see [their bicycle] again."

# Gas prices pinch delivery drivers

Delivery companies pay their drivers a fixed delivery fee. Drivers are solely responsible for the upkeep of their vehicles and the cost of repairs that may occur while delivering food.

Andrew Howard, another driver for Gatorfood.com, said he spends approximately \$3 more a day on gas because of higher gas prices after the storm.

"What's the point in staying with a company when you're not going to get paid more over time?" Howard asked.

Delivery drivers aren't the only ones affected by rising gas prices. Some students now bike to campus to counter the problem.

Nathan Kemper, a UF mechanical and aerospace engineering senior, said he rides his bike as much as possible to avoid using gas. He said it saves him time and money and alleviates the hassle of trying to find parking on campus.

"I get places faster, and I exercise every day," Kemper said.

# UF upgrades cable TV

On-campus residents now have almost twice as many options when they spend the night in.

Cox Communications Inc. and the UF Department of Housing & Residence Education upgraded the Housing CATV System from 40 to 73 channels, reflecting the demands of students who filled out TV surveys last Fall.

"I have been lobbying for this for at least the last 10 years," said Sharon Blansett, assistant director of Housing for Marketing, Public Relations & Research.

The cable renovations began in the Spring and completed at the end of July. New channels include MTV2, Oxygen, The Golf Channel, Turner Classic Movies, Cox Sports Television and Bravo.

Cox also offers additional digital cable packages that include premium and Pay-Per-View channels.

"I think it was a good decision to get a cable upgrade," said Ari van den Berg, UF sophomore and Rawlings Hall resident. "I got the

HBO and digital cable package also. I like to watch 'Entourage.'"

The Cox upgrade is installed automatically in dorm rooms whether the resident owns a TV or not. Housing rent increased this year due to utility charges, which includes the Cox Cable upgrade that, coupled with telephone service, comprises 4.3 percent of students' rent, Blansett said.

"An increase of \$75 each semester was issued this year," Blansett said. "Renovations received \$25, and \$50 went toward increased operational expenses like utilities, sewage and cable."

When asked about billing complaints by residents, Blansett said the department is not given that information.

"All of the marketing and billing goes to Cox," she said. "The students are paying for any additional packages directly to Cox."

# UF robot sinks the competition

UF electrical and computer engineering students made waves at the annual Underwater Vehicle Competition held last month, snagging first-place with their robot, the "SubjuGator."

The competition, which took place Aug. 3-7 at the Space and Naval Warfare Systems Center near San Diego, presented a greater challenge than expected for the team of eight.

The teams were required to complete three tasks: locate a light beacon, find and mark a break in a pipeline, and surface over an acoustic "pinger," said James Greco, a first-year doctoral student in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering.

"This year we decided to go with a completely new platform, one that could be as small and mobile as possible," said Greco, the team's leader.

He added that the sub, which weighed 140 pounds two years ago, now weighs in at a mere 30 pounds.

SubjuGator's lightweight design and innovative technology overshadowed submarines constructed by teams from 20 other universities around the world. UF's team has been involved in the competition since its creation eight years ago, but this is the first overall victory.

"Autonomous robots, like SubjuGator, can replace humans in dangerous environments," Greco said, citing NASA's Mars Rover as an example.

The robot was created in the Machine Intelligence Laboratory over the course of two semesters.

While many other teams had an unlimited sup-

ply of money to fund their submarines, creators of the SubjuGator worked on a tight budget, with major donations from Harris Corporation and Lockheed Martin.

"Money isn't always the answer. A little ingenuity and some thinking outside the box is all it takes," said faculty adviser Eric Schwartz, who has been greatly involved with the project for the past five years. "We won this competition because we had the most robust system by far. Our robot is representative of Gator spirit in general — in all sorts of weather, it all sticks together."

The robot, which has been called the SubjuGator for the past eight years, dominated its competition, with the second-place design weighing an additional 40 pounds.

"We had a brand-new team and submarine. Competing and triumphing over established opponents like MIT, Cornell and Duke was extremely satisfying," Greco said. "I would like to see our team continue down the path we started on."

"No personal complaints have been brought up to me yet," he said.

However, last year's election was an entirely different matter. Maland said there were instances of coercion and intimidation in which some students were put in uncomfortable circumstances.

A member of the Elections Commission feared personal harm at one point, he said.

"That's despicable," he said.

Maland said students were not punished for last year's infractions — but that could change.

"If someone does something of that sort, I wouldn't hesitate (to punish them)," he said.

However, not everyone was pleased with the slating process. Thursday and Friday, The Gator Party's slating room was much closer to the qualifying room, which every participant is required to enter, than Impact's. On Tuesday the rooms were somewhat closer.

Impact Party campaign staffer Gareth Kerr said if he were in Maland's shoes, he would

have allowed equal opportunity for both parties to be close to the qualifying room, which is where the candidates make their first impressions about running for Senate.

"Obviously, the closer you are to the qualifying room, the more you are seen," he said.

Maland said party representatives picked the rooms, but in the future he thinks a raffle could improve the situation.

Roberts said he is hoping one of the main reasons students chose to slate with Impact was to change the way the \$11 million tuition-funded Activity & Service Fee budget is spent.

Roberts said one of the last interviews of the day, political science freshman Victor Bard, was right on target with Impact's philosophy.

"It was an amazing interview," Roberts said. "He was right on track with how we felt."

Economics freshman David Markus, a member of Alpha Epsilon Pi, said he didn't know the difference between the two parties but was slating with Gator.

"It's the party affiliated with my fraternity," he said.

Finance freshman Brandon Vantuijn said he was interviewing with Gator to get involved.

"This is what college is all about," he said.

## Minor slips haunt defensive linemen

■ MCDONALD LEADS REVAMPED, IMPROVED DEFENSIVE LINE.

Adorned with mischievous grins and each other's jerseys, Steven Harris and Marcus Thomas turned the heads of reporters after Tuesday's practice.

It's just the kind of trick one can expect from such fun-loving jokesters, but when Harris and Thomas picked up the phone late Saturday night, it was no prank call. Haunted by blown sacks, the two coped the best way they knew how, by waking Coach Urban Meyer with a midnight telephone confessional.

"I was just telling him we could've done a whole lot better with the D-line," Thomas said. "He can expect a lot more of us next game."

Explained Harris, "We had a couple missed assignments."

Following such a turnaround perfor-

mance from a much-maligned defensive front, however, Meyer isn't sure a few harmless slips necessitate such an awakening, joking that he'd have to discuss suitable hours for phone calls with his team.

Sleep-deprived and all, however, Meyer couldn't be happier with the attitude change that has swept over his defensive linemen.

"All I've heard since I was hired in December is 'You've got lazy guys playing defensive line for you,'" Meyer recalled. "They're not lazy. I think they're great young men, and they could be a special group if they keep going."

Just how special? Defensive end Jeremy Mincey, a first-week inductee to Meyer's Champions Club, claims that UF has the most athletic defensive front in the country. Allowing Wyoming's prolific pass-heavy attack 222 yards and two touchdowns — both resulting from UF special teams breakdowns — the Gators' defense is now ranked No. 7 in the country. Playing a large role in the

Gators' defensive success, the D-line sacked Cowboys quarterback Corey Bramlet twice on Saturday, while forcing countless hurries.

It's somewhat of an early, yet mild, turnaround for a unit that gained only 13.5 sacks last season.

"That's all we talked about the whole summer, spring, working on our pass rush," Mincey said. "Now we have to work on our run a little more because they scored on us. But we've worked on our pass rush a whole lot, and we're taking a lot more pride in getting sacks."

With an immature group and a coaching staff in limbo, Mincey said confidence lacked last season. After sustaining an off-season makeover, courtesy of Meyer and his staff, Mincey claims, "It's a whole 'nother ball game."

According to Mincey, the new coaching staff pushed the defensive linemen in a manner the former regime failed to, concentrating on strengthening minds and attitudes rather than just muscles.

"They pushed us mentally," Mincey said. "It wasn't even the physical battle. They knew we had talent. It was the mindset they put us all in. Instead of a bunch of boys walking around, now we all carry ourselves like men. We do manly things: work hard in the weight room, go to class. It's just the simple things that make you a better player."

Overall, Meyer considers the defensive line's transformation in academics, lifestyle and passion for football the most drastic and impressive on the team.

As Mincey explained, there's always room for improvement. To have a repeat of Saturday's success when Tennessee comes to town in less than two weeks, the Gators must become more consistent.

"[Saturday] shows how great we can be, but we know we made a lot of mistakes," defensive end Ray McDonald said. "But when we get those mistakes eliminated, it's time for teams to watch out."

## Columnist likes Portis

Anyone watching the game could tell Portis is faster than Leak. Even anyone not watching the game could probably tell you that. Leak doesn't get that.

When asked if Portis brings anything to the game that he doesn't Leak responded with a mind-boggling, "Like?"

Maybe Portis is a little faster, the reporter suggested. Leak didn't understand, asking what the reporter meant.

"We run the same plays out of the same offense, so the plays that are called are exactly the same except for instead of a running back running the ball, he'll run the ball," Leak said. "We're calling the same plays, so I really don't see a difference."

To me, Leak was taking a shot at Portis, implying that he can only run. It's clear that Leak is scared of Portis taking some of his playing time.

"If the game is ... out of hand you always want your twos to be ready," Leak said.

Except Portis came in with most of the fourth quarter left and the Gators up 26-7 — 19 points is not exactly out of hand.

Portis had 56 more rushing yards than Leak on five less carries. Portis is better suited to the Meyer offense. Meyer obviously knows this since he recruited Portis, but he also knows Leak is too good to not play.

While it is by no means a quarterback controversy, it could become one, especially by next season.

Sure, Leak had a great game, but just catching a glimpse of Portis makes me think that he can do what Meyer wants better than Leak.

# Game distracts players from Katrina

For a 30-point underdog, a road game against one of the nation's top 10 teams ever seemed so comforting.

Less than two weeks ago, Louisiana Tech coach Jack Bicknell considered a date with the Gators at the Swamp anything but an escape from a miserable reality. For teams like the Bulldogs, games like these usually mean two things: a hefty paycheck and a double-digit loss.

Now, with players scrambling to find loved ones in the harrowing aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, and others mourning the loss of friends and family, three hours on the gridiron seems like a pretty nice remedy, albeit a temporary one.

"We're excited about playing that game," Bicknell said. "I think it will be a nice diversion. There are 120 guys [on this team] and the No. 1 thing they wanted to make sure of was that [this game is] televised back here.

"I know those people are looking forward to coming over, watching the game and seeing their sons. I think it'll be a good diversion for everyone."

Ruston, located in the northwest corner of Louisiana, 330 miles from New Orleans, didn't feel the wrath of Katrina.

But with seven players on Louisiana

Tech's roster residing from the now deserted and decaying city of New Orleans, and many others from neighboring areas, the last week has been terrifying and surreal.

At one point, 16 players were unsure of their families' fate. Quarterback Donald Allen spent days attempting to contact his father and grandfather. He didn't find out they were alive until Sunday.

"He said, 'Coach, the weight of the world, I feel like, has been lifted off my shoulders,'" Bicknell said. "I think that's the way the team is looking at it now."

While most of the stories echo that of Allen, not every player enjoyed such a

fortunate ending.

For Oren Lewis of Waveland, Miss., the aftermath was bittersweet. His mother, missing for days, was spared. But his uncle, sister-in-law and godchild perished.

Lewis, a third-string nose guard, plans to play on Saturday.

"It was a very sad situation," Bicknell said. "Thank goodness his mom was okay."

"A lot of our players have lost everything. A lot of their families are up here. It really hits home.

Bicknell expects many of the Bulldogs' family members to remain in Ruston throughout the season. Initially, the families were housed at the Thomas Assembly Center, but most have moved to campus dorms.

And while part of the healing process begins Saturday against the Gators, the anguish will remain for months and even years.

"It's not like it just goes away. It's not like it's over," Bicknell said. "It's not over at all. It continues to go on. The people are still here and they still need to be taken care of. There are just so many ramifications to it, it's just overwhelming unless you take it step-by-step, day-by-day, and that's what we're doing."

# UF to play in Alamodome

kind of far from it now. We've been thinking about them and we've talked about them and had a moment of silence and prayed for them, so we'll definitely be thinking about them."

Senior Jane Collymore needed 11 kills in Monday's match against Eastern Washington to pass Ashley Mullis for eighth on UF's all-time career kills list, but finished with just four.

Wise praised Collymore's ability to not let a shaky offensive night affect how she performed in other aspects of the game.


