# UF to recognize faculty union

The UF administration conceded its loss to the faculty union Tuesday, announcing it soon will begin negotiations on the contracts of its nearly 1,900 members.

The decision came after a state Public Employees Relations Commission ruling Friday that validated the United Faculty of Florida, saying it had represented

some faculty at UF continuously since 1976, despite the university's refusal to recognize it for the last three years.

"We could have appealed it, but we're done," UF President Bernie Machen said.

UF continued to fight for bargaining changes even after a court case and a state report suggested the union would win, because officials "thought we had a good case," Machen said.

He added that the \$50,000-plus

cost of fighting the union was spent long ago.

The traditional bargaining unit as set by the state commission represents

only 40 percent of UF's faculty, Machen said.

The UF administration argued that the entire faculty should vote on whether or not it wanted the union to represent it.

The traditional bargaining unit as set by the state commission represents

only 40 percent of UF's faculty, Machen said.

This bargaining unit excludes the Levin College of Law, the Institute for Food and Agricultural Sciences and the Health Sciences Center.

But Machen consistently said he would stick with the board's decision, and said he now expects a "positive environment" for working on the contract.

"It's a good feeling to have it

## Machen addresses Senate

UF President Bernie Machen attended the regular Student Senate meeting Tuesday night to discuss everything from a new university media campaign to the university's graduate-student insurance policy.

Machen introduced a new commercial, which shows a diverse group of UF enthusiasts

saying "Go Gators." The ad will air on national television during the UF-Tennessee football game Saturday.

"Some feel that the Gator Nation is an athletic term," he said. "We think the Gator Nation is everybody. I want people in Seattle to know the difference between UF and other universities."

Machen said the commercial cost about \$60,000 to \$70,000 to produce and was paid for by non-academic monies.

"I'm hoping that we have a better identity of ourselves," Machen said of the campaign. "We don't have a unified feeling of the university."

He said UF officials are concerned about the university's graduate-student insurance policies.

"It is a topic that we have been talking about a great deal," he said. "We have to solve that."

Machen said it is a personal issue for him because his daughter attends the College of Veterinary Medicine and is not adequately insured.

Machen said he was impressed by the Gainesville community's response to help the victims of Hurricane Katrina. However, he said he hopes the victims' schools are operational again soon be-

## Students seeing higher prices at Reitz

Hanging out at the Reitz Union just got more expensive.

Prices at the Reitz Union Game Room, Food Court and Hotel have risen from last se-

mester mainly due to increased minimum wage and utility costs.

A standard room at the Reitz Union Hotel used to cost \$60 a night.

After the hotel renovated the rooms with new carpet, tile, cur-

tains and furniture in August, the price per night increased to \$79.

Bowlers will pay more to reserve a bowling lane at the Game Room, up from \$11 an hour to \$13 an hour since July. The price increase was due

partly to a \$35,000 cut from video game and vending profits, which UF President Bernie Machen decided to allocate to another area of the university, said Game Room Manager Charlotte Dare.

An additional cause of the Game Room price increase is the fact that the prices of its competitors in the market, such as Alley Katz, have gone up as well.

However, the Game Room has not seen a decrease in customers since the price change, Dare said.

"Compared to our competitors, we are still the cheapest in town," Dare said, "and we always want to be a better value to students."

The main reason for these price increases is that the cost of running the building has gone up, especially the cost of electricity, said Michael Mironack,



# Toys on the way to Katrina victims

They left behind their baseballs, bicycles, stuffed animals and all their other beloved playthings when they fled their homes.

Sleeping and playing in shelters, some of the children displaced by Hurricane Katrina are a long way from their toys.

"We lose sight of the fact that the kids out there, even if we get the water to them, if we get the medicine to them, if we keep them healthy, they still lack the essentials that make their lives normal," said Ed Braddy, Gainesville city commissioner and SFCC employee.

Braddy began collecting stuffed animals, toys, books, crayons and games for children displaced by Hurricane Katrina on Sept. 7. His project, Operation Teddy Bear, raised enough toys in four days to fill a 200-square-foot storage facility.

"I realize that toys, games and stuffed animals are not the highest priority for victims of natural di-

sasters," Braddy said. "But once the essentials like food and water are taken care of, I believe that providing toys for the kids is absolutely essential to help them take their minds off the storm."

Braddy, a father of four, created Operation Teddy Bear after considering what it would have been like for his children to leave their belongings and spend months in a hurricane shelter.

"My daughter loves to read, and my sons are very physical and like to play with toys," Braddy said. "If they had none of that, and we were

stuck in a hotel room or shelter, it would be just miserable for them."

Braddy delivered his first shipment of toys Saturday to a Holiday Inn housing refugees in Live Oak and other shelters in Tallahassee and Panama City Beach.

Jack Kegerreis, an independent contractor, donated his truck to the cause.

"People are helping out in their own ways; some in monetary ways, some by donating their time. In my case, I donated a truck," Kegerreis said.


Braddy said he has received calls from people in Hollywood and Ft. Lauderdale who would like to set up similar organizations in their areas.

"The project has yet to leave the state, but we have contacted Rotary clubs in Mississippi and Louisiana through the district governors in those states," said Tony Domenech, logistics coordinator for the project and former Gainesville city commissioner.

Braddy said he plans to continue the project for several weeks or months.

"As long as there is an interest, and as long as there are evacuees that are without, we will try our best to get them what they need," he said.

# Bowling club strikes out on Reitz funding

■ CLUB MEMBERS DO NOT KNOW WHY FUNDS WERE CUT.

Bowling strikes won't be the only challenge for the UF bowling club this year.

The club must find alternate ways to pay for the costs of bowling now that the Reitz Union does not fund it.

Mike Paiva, UF bowling coach, said he is unsure why the team was cut from Union funding, but he informed potential bowling club members about the situation and the expected costs at the organizational meetings.

**Student Government** "We have travel costs to pay for," he said. "We used to be able to use vans provided by the university in order to drive to some tournaments, but we can't even do that anymore."

The club has travel expenses, a \$50 membership fee and a \$7 weekly fee.

Paiva said SG usually provides the funds for UF clubs, but the process is lengthy.

Student Body Treasurer Lindsay Cosimi said the bowling club would need to fill out a request for the funds it needs through an allocation process that can take up to eight weeks before the club can access its funds.

She advised the bowling club to ask the Department of Recreational

Sports for funding since it is a competitive sport.

"Rec Sports recognizes and funds competitive teams under Sport Clubs Program funding, and SG typically funds teams that aren't competitive in nature," she said.

The costs of participating in bowling events this year will range from \$110 for each in-state event to \$620 for each out-of-state event, Paiva said.

The number of events is determined by the performance of the team.

Jesse Chiet, vice president of the bowling club, said she thinks students will show up initially but won't stay after they hear about the fees.

"We have to pay for airfare and travel expenses," Chiet said. "I had to drive to Atlanta one year in my own car."

Dennis Neeld, bowling club president, said the club is discouraged but is searching for fundraising opportunities.

"We're thinking about doing tournaments between sororities, fraternities and dorm rooms," he said.

Paiva said it would be a demanding thing to ask the members to try to raise money while worrying about school and other activities, but he is willing to do what it takes to keep students interested in the bowling club.

"We have such a good history," he said. "The thing that I don't want is to see the program die."

# Pledge faces theft charges

A Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity pledge was arrested for allegedly stealing \$1,225 in merchandise from a fellow pledge Monday night.

Michael Souder, 23, was arrested for stealing a Toshiba laptop, Altec Lansing speakers and a Lexmark printer from pledge Thomas Lavery, reports state.

Souder said he purchased

the merchandise for \$200 from a man calling himself Joey, who Souder thought was a brother of the house.

"He told me his name and that he lived upstairs and asked if I was interested in buying a computer," Souder said. "I thought it was a good deal, and I was planning to buy a computer anyway to have an e-mail address forum for the house."

Lavery's belongings were allegedly stolen while he was in the shower and were later

discovered by Lavery and other witnesses in Souder's truck, according to the police report.

"The victim and the witnesses advised me that there was no one in the house or allowed in the house by the name of Joey," the report stated.

Lavery said Souder was the only other person in his room the entire night.

"Obviously, if my stuff was in his car, then he had to do it," Lavery said. "He changed his story so many times."

# New wing of Harn Museum to feature cafe, more art

Like the teenager it is, the Samuel P. Harn Museum of Art is growing.

The Harn's new wing, set to open Oct. 22 on the museum's 15th anniversary, will have additional exhibition space, a café and space for meetings, workshops and educational activities.

Harn spokeswoman Tami Wroath said the opening ceremony for the Mary Ann Harn Cofrin Pavilion will include tours, gallery talks and a performance by the Florida MOD Project dancers and the Gainesville Chamber Orchestra.

But the big night for the museum will be Oct. 27, Wroath said. The museum will stay open until 11 p.m. and feature a performance by the Chris McCarty Band.

Another draw to the new wing will be the Camellia Court Café, which will serve salads, sandwiches, soups and pastries during museum hours and before evening events at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts.

"The café will be upscale, where visitors will be able to order food and have it brought out to their table," Wroath said. "We want our visitors to be able to spend the day and enjoy the museum without having to leave for lunch."

The new wing will be dedicated to the museum's contemporary-art collection.

The inaugural exhibition, titled "American Matrix: Contemporary Directions for the Harn Museum Collection," will include works from more than 40 artists including Andy Warhol, Barabara Kruger, Louise Bourgeois and Willem de Kooning.

The Harn broke ground in 2003 to begin construction on the additional 6,500 square feet of exhibition space, including a 35-foot ceiling to accommodate both large and small-scale artworks.

The new pavilion was made possible by a \$3.2 million donation from David A. Cofrin and his wife. The pavilion is named after their mother, Mary Ann Harn Cofrin, daughter of Samuel P. Harn, for whom the museum is named.

Harn authorities encouraged the university's undergraduate students to take part in the museum's volunteer programs this year.

"Our goal is to increase the amount of UF student traffic throughout the museum," volunteer coordinator Christa Molinaro said. "It's a good opportunity for students who want to volunteer or intern in all departments of the museum including education, marketing and public relations, visitor service, special events or the museum store."



## Palestinians should re-evaluate quest

Now we see whether Palestinians believe their own propaganda.

For everyone's sakes let's hope they don't. Because if after 57 years the Palestinian people actually believe they will one day drive the Jews into the sea, then the next 57 years will be as tragic and bloody as the last 57 have been.

There is no doubt that the terrorist brood infesting the region considers the Israeli withdrawal from the Gaza settlements to be a dramatic triumph; the first wave of Palestinians into the abandoned settlements celebrated informally, showing extraordinary celerity in demonstrating their respect for the Jewish religion. The Associated Press reported that the moment the last Israeli soldier left Gaza, thousands of Palestinians burned down empty synagogues.

From their new bases in Gaza, terrorist groups almost certainly will continue to launch the rocket attacks that have marred the so-called cease-fire; in the future, Kassam rockets will strike Israel. It has, in fact, already started: Several rockets have smashed into the town of Sderot, in Israel proper.

As thoroughly reprehensible as such attacks are, they are even more chilling when considered in their proper context. The rocket attacks are not the main thrust; they are only the preliminary artillery bombardment of what too many Palestinians consider to be the final battle for the destruction of Israel.

This is the time for the Palestinians to recognize that their leaders have been lying to them. This is the time for the Palestinians to realize that no matter how many Jews and Muslims die, and no matter how much destruction is wrought, they will not, cannot destroy Israel.

The Palestinians need only visit the ruins of Masada,

not far south of the West Bank, to understand the determination and courage of their enemies. The Palestinians need only look at Israel to see the futility of their quest.

Born of war and death, nursed to the awful din of battle and the smell of gunpowder, Israel has grown into a model state, an oasis of prosperity and decency in what is a dark and tragic region.

Through death and destruction, pogroms, holocausts, despite the eternal enmity of almost all societies, the Jewish people have survived. But they have survived to accomplish an extraordinary feat, perhaps the most stunning of the post-World War II era.

Not embittered by their millennia of trials, the Jews carved out of hostile terrain a nation that has ascended beyond its martial origins to a level of compassion and restraint that is extraordinary.

This is the country that brought dozens of the survivors from the Beslan terrorist attack to rest and recuperate. Israel, unfortunately, has decades of experience in counseling the victims of terrorism.

This is the country that went out of its way to evacuate 250 Arab villagers from the village of Dahaniya in the Gaza Strip. Why? Because if left behind after the evacuation, the villagers, who had been branded as collaborators by their Palestinian "brothers," feared murderous retribution from the forces that will soon engulf Gaza.

The Palestinians must adopt a new collective goal; their ambition must be directed away from the death of Jews. The futile longing for a day of destruction is far more lethal to the Palestinians than it is to the Israelis.

# Online-voting debate splits Gator, Impact parties

## ■ TERMINOLOGY OF ONLINE VOTING HAS CHANGED.

The potential for online voting in Student Government elections has been debated for years, and in this election it is split into two politically charged poles — intranet voting and Internet voting.

The Gator Party supports intranet voting, which it refers to as secured-location online voting. Intranet voting, which will be first used in this month's election, includes 12 on-campus computerized polling locations linked by an intranet.

Unlike the paper-ballot method used in previous elections, a student can vote at any computer polling location on campus. It is predicted to save at least \$30,000 every fiscal year.

The Impact Party is in support of Internet voting, which it refers to as universal online voting and what Gator refers to as unsecured-location voting.

Impact leaders boast Internet voting will increase turnout drastically by allowing students to vote from any computer with an Internet connection using their GatorLink usernames and passwords.

While Gator Party leaders praise the intranet voting system to be debuted in this Fall's SG election, Impact Party officials say its promotion is deceptive.

"Online voting, or 'secured-site online voting,' as they like to call it, is a sham," Impact President Thomas Jardon said.

Gator Party spokesman Thomas Philpot said intranet voting makes polls more accessible to students without compromising voter privacy.

"It's the safest way for us as a Student Government to provide that service to students," he said.

Some criticize the terms secured location and unsecured location — coined by an SG-appointed online-voting committee — as poorly worded to discourage support of Internet voting.

### Student Government

"The terms are horrible. I do believe it's a misnomer, and it confuses students as well as senators," Senate President Diane Kassim said.

Along with the contested terminology, parties argued the risks and benefits of Internet voting.

Impact hopes Internet voting will increase voter turnout.

"Anytime more people are involved in the system, I think that the system improves necessarily," Jardon said. "Not only would representation become more balanced, but I think

you'll see wiser spending."

Jardon said The Gator Party opposes Internet voting because it is content with the status quo.

"They came into power with an election with less than 20-percent turnout, so that suits them just fine," Jardon said.

Philpot said Internet voting could result in voter coercion because online voters are not isolated from outside influences and voter fraud resulting from hijacked GatorLink usernames.

"When you take voting out of a polling environment, it becomes not only unsecured but uncontrolled," he said.

However, Impact is pushing for an Internet voting system that includes security measures to ward off identity fraud. Precautions include restriction of an IP address to one vote over a specified time period and security questions only

the GatorLink's owner should be able to answer.

Impact said if Internet voting were implemented, it would also include one on-campus secured-voting location that students could opt to use.

In Fall 2001, Accelerated Data Works, Inc., the current provider of the intranet voting, conducted a trial run of Internet voting at UF. Six hundred students voted online, and 124 of 125 responses to a post-vote survey were positive.

Kent Tambling, the company's vice president of operations, said he met with SG every year since and consistently felt that its questions about the system were "more political concerns than technical or legal ones."

"I felt the answers I was giving were not the ones they were looking for," he said. "I felt they were looking for weaknesses."

## Mayor has baby girl

The Gainesville City Commission voted 5-1 to increase water, electrical and wastewater rates at Monday's meeting.

Gainesville Regional Utilities' customer rates will increase by \$9 for all services each month. The commission also approved an increase in GRU's annual budget.

The commission decided to tack on a 10-percent surcharge to natural-gas sales outside of Gainesville city limits. This tax goes into effect Oct. 1, said Kurt Lannon, clerk of the commission.

The commission also made early voting in city and state elections official.

"People have been able to vote, but we are now going to have an official policy," Lannon said.

Mayor Hanrahan was absent for this meeting because she was in labor from Monday morning until early Tuesday morning, when her first child, Evyleen Mary Malone, was born.

"Evyleen arrived at 2:03 a.m. Tuesday weighing eight pounds, eight ounces and is 18 and one-half inches long," said Bob Woods, spokesman for Gainesville's city manager.

### Corners plan has problems

Retailers are wary of leasing space in University Corners because they feel students are bad business, said the general manager of the development.

However, Michael Conroy said retailers are not aware that many UF students have scholarships and would have money available to spend in their University Corners stores, located on the northwest corner of University Avenue and Northwest 13th Street.

"Our biggest challenge has been getting the retail space leased up," Conroy said. "It's been tougher to get than anticipated."

Project developers will plan details such as parking, sidewalks and aesthetics to persuade retailers.

Conroy said there could be 200 extra parking spaces.

"The amount of parking is going to take care of a lot of headaches," he said.

In order to widen sidewalks for pedestrian safety, the buildings will be moved back about 10 feet from University Avenue and 13th Street. The present Starbucks is only 54 inches from the curb.



Conroy said there are no definitive plans for a bridge midway between Southwest 14th Street and Southwest 13th Street crossing University Avenue, but he did say that a bridge would be helpful in bringing students safely across University Avenue to the second level of the complex.

cause he's not sure UF can handle a larger-than-normal Fall 2005 freshman class and hurricane victims for an extended period of time.

Student Body President Joe Goldberg said the bill allotting \$50,000 for towels for UF's recreational facilities, which was scheduled for its second reading Tuesday night, has been hung out to dry.

"We came up with a solution, and that solution is called gym wipes," Goldberg said.

Jeremy Martin, chairman of UF's Recreational Sports board of directors, said the \$9,000 needed for the wipes, which can be used for both the equipment and the body, will come from Recreational Sports' outside monies.

The board will vote on the measure tonight. "I would be shocked if it didn't pass," he said. The Activity & Service Fee budget for 2006-2007 was approved unanimously by the Senate.

Budget and Appropriations Chairwoman Jackie Pace said the axed New York Times/USA Today Readership Program has never been on the budget but is funded by reserves.

# Few schools in Top 10 have faculty unions

sort of out of the way," he told the Student Senate on Tuesday.

However, having a union will not help UF become a Top 10 public research university, Machen said.

Of the top 20 schools in the United States, few have faculty who are represented by unions, Machen said.

"I don't think they're needed to be a top university," he said.

Kim Emery, vice president of

the union's UF chapter, said many faculties at many top-tier universities, public and private, do not have the ability to unionize.

Negotiations should begin shortly, Machen told the Senate. The university will hire a professional team to handle the sessions.

The union has a bargaining team trained and ready to go, Emery said.

Machen couldn't say when the union and the university might expect to finish hammering out a contract.

"I don't think we should hold our breath," he said.

Machen noted that the union has three years of issues it wants to work on.

UF's recognition of the union should not have an effect on shared faculty governance, embodied in the Faculty Senate.

Shared governance is for all faculty, whereas the union only represents some, Machen said.

"If the union has a good idea — a really good idea — we should do it for everybody," he said.

# Minimum wage also factor

director of operations for the Union.

Another reason is the recent increase in the minimum wage from \$5.15 an hour to \$6.15 an hour.

"The Reitz Union hires 200 student employees, many of whom are minimum wage," Mironack said.

This minimum-wage increase has caused Subway to raise its prices \$0.10 more per sandwich and \$0.30 more per meal, said Darren Andrews, Reitz Union Subway employee, who has been working there for a year and a half.

Wendy's also recently chose to increase its prices by eliminating its \$0.99 menu. The restaurant now charges \$1.37 (with tax) for chicken nuggets and Jr. Bacon

Cheeseburgers, said Bradley Black, Reitz Union Wendy's shift manager.

"This is mainly due to the fact that 28 percent of our sales go to paying rent to the Reitz Union," Black said.

In order to alleviate future cost increases, the Student Senate has provided the Reitz Union with more Activity & Service Fee money, which accounts for 60 percent of the Union's budget, Mironack said.

This year, the union received an extra \$237,770 in A&S fees, a total budget of \$3,711,400 for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

Although future price increases in the Reitz Union are difficult to predict, Mironack said he hopes prices stabilize soon so the Union won't have to cut back on the services provided to students and customers.



Mentors can be UF employees and students or other members of the Gainesville community and must have a bachelor's degree and at least one year of experience, said Anide Harrigan, assistant director for Career Development and Diversity.

"Our mentors are very committed," she said. "They see it as really investing in a student's life."

The program, organized through the Career Resource Center, is open to UF sophomores and first-semester juniors and focuses on the career development

of minority Gators. "The program began in 2001 and started out as a minority program to help the university with retention of minority students," Harrigan said.

Initially, Gator Launch was a response to Gov. Bush's One Florida initiative to assist with minority-student recruitment and retention.

The program now accepts a broader range of students, including disabled students and the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer community, she said.

"The first year we had 10 students," Harrigan said. "This year we're shooting for 60."

Gator Launch Program Coordinator Tiffany Brown said not all the students who apply to be mentees will be selected.

"We want students who are going to be committed and proactive," she said.

Applicants must submit a two-page essay describing how Gator Launch will help achieve their career goals.

Brown said students in the program receive career guidance, professional workshops and exposure to their chosen field.

"Aside from the mentoring program, they are also required to meet bi-weekly to encourage network skills and interview settings," she said.

Gabriel DuPree, a 22-year-old wildlife ecology and conservation major, said the Gator Launch program was very helpful last year.

"The most successful aspect of this program was learning professional skills," he said. "I learned how to perfect my resume and my etiquette."

DuPree said he is willing to be a peer mentor to the incoming class if needed.

"It's definitely a growing program," Harrigan said. "We want as many students as possible to get involved."

Mentor interviews will be held at the CRC on Thursday from 10:30 a.m. to 4:40 p.m. and Friday from noon to 4 p.m.

## Vols' linemen plan to use Leak as target practice

■ TENNESSEE DEFENSE CONSIDERS HITTING LEAK HARD A KEY TO WINNING.

With kickoff three days away, Tennessee's defensive front fired the first shot at UF quarterback Chris Leak, hoping many more will follow Saturday.

"One thing that I've noticed about Chris Leak is that he hates to get hit," Tennessee defensive tackle Jesse Mahelona told the Knoxville News Sentinel. "You give him one real good shot and that will affect him the rest of the game."

Defensive end Justin Harrell elaborated on the Volunteers' game plan.

"We're going to try to hit Leak as much as we can," Harrell said. "It's going to be the key to the game, how much we can hit Leak."

The Gators' quarterback was the first victim of the annual trash talking fest, but don't expect anyone from UF to reply.

"It doesn't bother me that they said that," Leak said. "Of course they are going to try and fire you up before the game. I won't talk about his mom or anything, but I will try to lead my team to a win."

After Tuesday's practice, Coach Urban Meyer took aside a few of his players and specifically asked them to take the high road this week.

"Coach told us he wants us to prepare hard and leave the trash talking to Tennessee," offensive lineman Tavares Washington said. "I take the comments they made

personally, but I'll take care of Chris during the game.

"I'm protective of my quarterback. I love him to death."

Trash talking aside, the Gators' battle with the defensive front will decide the outcome of the game in more ways than one.

Meyer has studied the UF-Tennessee rivalry extensively this

week and has paid special attention to the running game.

In their last 15 meetings, the team that has rushed for more yards has won 13 times.

Time of possession is key, and Tennessee has won the time of possession battle each of the last three years. Since 2002, Tennessee has had the ball an average of 6:30

longer than UF.

"Whoever establishes the running game will set the tempo of the game," Leak said. "Our running backs will have to play a big part if we want to win this game."

Last year, consistent running by Ciatrick Fason and junior DeShawn Wynn helped to open up wider lanes downfield for the receivers.

In the fourth quarter, Leak faked out the Volunteers' defense and television cameramen with a fake hand off on an 81-yard play-action pass to receiver Chad Jackson. The touchdown, UF's longest play from scrimmage since 1996, was the product of an established running game.

The offensive line must open up lanes for whoever sees action at running back this week for the Gators.

That could prove to be difficult, as Tennessee's strategy in years past has been to place two massive defensive tackles up the field to clog up the middle. Speedy linebackers, then, only have to cover the outside. In last year's game, outside linebacker Josh Burnett racked up 16 tackles.

"Their defensive line is their strength and will probably be the best defensive line we face all year," Meyer said. "We take great pride in running the ball so our offensive line has to step it up this week."

## Tennessee game to provide early definition of Gators' season

The measuring stick is planted at the center of Florida Field. You may not be able to see it, but it's being held firmly there by the collective anxiety of Gator Nation.

Senior Mike Degory has been a Gator since 2001. He's been around Spurrier's winning teams and Zook's losing teams—a necessary shot considering that University Avenue's own Crazy Scooter could have probably coached this team's talent to an 8-3 record. Monday, Degory spoke to reporters about the magnitude the Tennessee game would have on a team, coaching staff and fan base.

"Everything's going to come down to this game," Degory said. "I said it—this is our measuring stick. How our offense is going to do in the SEC, where we're going to end up at the end of the season. We know that and understand that. We've had this date marked since January, so we know the importance of

this game."

Truth is, Saturday night the Gators will play their biggest game since Tennessee won at the Swamp in December 2001. The loss cost UF a chance at the Southeastern Conference Championship, where they could have thrashed a LSU team they defeated 44-15 earlier the same year.

While students undoubtedly had their hearts set on College Gameday visiting Gainesville, and "the Lee Corso has a yeast infection" and "Trev Alberts died in the tsunami" posters must be put away temporarily, it doesn't take away from how monumental this game is.

In previous UF vs. UT matchups, the tale of the tape has revolved around the trenches. In 13 of the last 15 meetings, the team that has rushed the ball for more yards has come out on top. A telling statistic when you think of

all the talent that has played on each side, and this year should prove to be no different when Tennessee plays under the lights at The Swamp for the first time since 2001.

The Volunteers have won three of the last four games in the series, mainly because of their Ruben Studdard-esque offensive line. While they may not be as hearty and soulful, they've got the downright meanness and girth you'd expect from Tennessee offensive linemen. Couple them with running backs that would make Larry Csonka proud, and you have Volunteers football.

In recent years, UF's defensive front hasn't been game to hang with the Volunteers' talent,

but Coach Urban Meyer's development of the trench-town Gators will be the difference Saturday.

UF's defensive line was shut down in Knoxville, but the turn around Jeremy Mincey, Marcus Thomas, Ray McDonald and Steven Harris have orchestrated was not expected this early in the season. Tennessee is struggling with injuries along their offensive line, particularly at center where they could end up starting Richie Gandy, who hasn't played football for eight months nor practiced at the position.

Tenacious E's prediction you ask? I'm no Negrodamus, but here's one fool's opinion: If Meyer counts too much on the running game, things could get ugly. Tennessee's suspect secondary, which UAB torched for 282 yards, should fold when UF takes it to the air.

# Coaches challenge Caldwell

## Receiver must block better

Junior receiver Andre Caldwell drew the ire of UF coach Urban Meyer following Saturday's Louisiana Tech game.

Meyer, who has cited motivational issues with the receiver in the past, said Caldwell lacked intensity in UF's 41-3 win Saturday.

A stickler for blocking, receivers' coach Billy Gonzales dubbed some of Caldwell's blocks highlight-worthy, but said the junior lacked consistency.

"You can't be up and down," Gonzales said. "There are things he did great. He threw a couple blocks. I put him on the highlight tape because he blocked excellent. But then there were some plays where he didn't make them. That's called inconsistency. You can't have that."

Caldwell, who had one recep-

tion for 23 yards and one run for 26, admitted to having a lackluster performance but said motivation would not be an issue when No. 5

"He didn't see that fire in me like he saw the previous week, and I didn't go out and make

plays," Caldwell said. "I had a down game."

**SLIGHT RETURNS:** Blessed with such a stocked stable of speedsters, Meyer will not stand for the Gators' sub-par punt returning. Cornerbacks Dee Webb and Vernell Brown have averaged -1.5 and 3.4 yards per punt return, respectively, for a combined 2.3 yards per return. Their long of 22 came against Wyoming courtesy of Brown.

Meyer has suggested shaking up the return game, giving freshman cornerback Avery Atkins a shot but said improved blocking is still a must.

"We have to block better," Meyer said. "We have Avery Atkins out there holding up a gunner, and he needs to get a little better."

"Punt return around here has been an issue for a while. With kick returns, I think we're getting a little better although we dropped one. With punt returns, we need to get a lot better."

**KICKING IT:** Junior punter Eric Wilbur was named to the 2005 Ray Guy Watch List Tuesday. The award is given annually to the top collegiate punter in the country.

Wilbur, a coaches' pick for All-Southeastern Conference preseason second team, is averaging 43.6 yards a punt this season and placed three punts inside the 20-yard line against Louisiana Tech.

"Mel is just such a versatile player," Burleigh said. "She does a lot to solidify that back line and she attacks as well."


Booth is happy playing on either side of the field.

# Injury bothering Johnson

Jasmine Johnson spent nearly the entire off-season rehabbing her right knee. Now the left knee is giving

UF's top offensive threat problems.

Johnson, a sophomore, underwent a precautionary MRI on her left knee last week, but managed to play in matches against Loyola College and

Wisconsin-Milwaukee - during the weekend.

But Johnson is playing with pain, UF coach Becky Burleigh said.

"She's got an injury and she's just going to play through it," Burleigh said. "I think she's going to be ok."

Coming back from surgery to repair a torn cruciate ligament in her right knee in December, Johnson has spurred the UF offense, leading all players with seven points through five games.

**SHUTOUT STREAK:** When the Gators go up against No. 16 Florida State and Central Florida this weekend, state bragging rights won't be the only thing on the line.

Led by goalkeeper Jen Gardner, the No. 13 UF defense has gone three consecutive games without allowing a goal, outscoring opponents 9-0 in the process.


"The defense has been very impressive," Gardner said. "It's nice as a team to get a shutout, because you feel really secure about what your defense is doing."

The streak will be put to the test on Friday against the Seminoles, who average more than three goals per game.

"We still feel like we can get better defensively, but we're going in the right direction," Burleigh said. "It's going to be tough to shut FSU out, they're a good team."

**HONORS:** A two-time SoccerBuzz.com All-American, Melanie Booth added another accolade to her resume Monday as she was named Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Week.

# UT's Clausen to start

Tennessee quarterback Rick Clausen should be glad UF linebacker Todd McCullough isn't a vengeful person.

Clausen's older brother, Casey, stills haunts McCullough from an incident two years ago. After Tennessee defeated UF 24-10 in the Swamp, Clausen celebrated by directing "Rocky Top" for his band.

Naturally, McCullough wasn't too thrilled. While the rest of the Gators hurried into the locker room, McCullough couldn't. He stood at the end of the tunnel and watched the whole thing unfold.

"Tears were almost rolling down my eyes, I hated it so bad," McCullough said. "It ate me up, it wrenched at me, it was just like a knot in your stomach watching that."

"I won't ever forget that." So Rick Clausen, who will start Saturday, might bring back bad memories, but McCullough took the high road and said he wouldn't hold what Casey did against Rick.

But Clausen, a senior, won't be the only quarterback concern for McCullough and the rest of the Gators' defense. Sophomore Erik Ainge will also play, Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer said.

Last season, UF also saw two quarterbacks — Ainge and now-departed Brent Schaeffer. Schaeffer left the game early and Ainge picked UF's defense apart.

UF coach Urban Meyer praised Ainge, even though he made some mistakes in Tennessee's only game — a 17-10 victory against UAB, in which Ainge threw two interceptions.

"I think Erik Ainge is as talented a quarterback as there is," Meyer said. "I think he's going

through some youth issues as far as experience.

"Any time you have a couple of picks in the first game, a lot of times in close games that can be the difference."

Ainge and Clausen are relatively similar in their styles of play, unlike last year, when Schaeffer was much more of a running quarterback. The difference between Clausen and Ainge lies mostly in the fact that Clausen is a senior and has more experience with meetings, Fulmer said.

"Erik, on the other hand, has a bit more mobility and the ability to get the ball down the field better from an arm-strength standpoint," Fulmer said. "It's my hope that we can

catch Erik up as we go along." But Meyer isn't taking the arm-strength bait.

"With Rick Clausen, all that kid does is win games," Meyer said. "All I keep hearing is, 'Yeah, but his arm strength.' His arm strength is fine."

"Just ask Texas A&M how his arm strength is."

Meyer is referring to Tennessee's Cotton Bowl matchup with Texas A&M New Year's Day, in which Clausen threw for 222 yards and three touchdowns.

A knock on Clausen is that he lacks mobility, but Meyer said it's enough to win games for the Volunteers.

Although some might question alternating quarterbacks, Meyer endorsed it.

Fulmer isn't too upset about the situation either.

"We're fortunate to have two quarterbacks that can play in this league," Fulmer said.
