BATON ROUGE, La. — Urban Meyer's face froze. He remained expressionless for a few moments before quivering and, ultimately, shedding a tear.

The confidence-oozing general had finally hit a slick spot on the self-esteem highway.

How was he supposed to answer questions about the worst start to a season in his coaching career?

How was he supposed to defend a spread offense that is shredding itself in a Southeastern Conference mulcher?

After about 20 seconds of silence, Meyer regained some of his composure, uttering the following:

"I think Chris Leak struggled a little bit, but I thought our receivers struggled as well."

As did the offensive line, the offensive coordinators and seemingly everyone not a member of UF's defense.

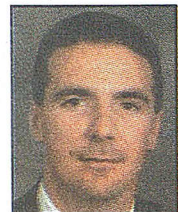
In what was the latest nail in UF's spread-offense coffin, in its Southeastern Conference title hopes, the Gators fell to Louisiana State 21-17.

"We just didn't take advantage of the opportunities we had," said Leak, who rushed for -32 yards. "We made too many mistakes."

UF's offense was moving against LSU; it was just going in the wrong direction.

The Gators now seem to have the offensive moonwalk down pat — a methodical backward movement laced with

Cancer survivors unite for walk

Once a nationally ranked junior triathlete, Cheri Ann Peterson didn't finish first, second or third — but she finished.

Peterson was one of hundreds of cancer survivors and supporters who walked or ran to the finish line at the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer event in Gainesville on Saturday.

A black hat with long ribbons covered her bald head.

"This is my hair," she said, smiling as she toyed with the ribbons.

Fellow cancer survivors greeted her with hugs, kisses and a breast cancer-awareness ribbon as she glided through the sea of people in pink, looking tired but full of spirit.

The noncompetitive walk began at 9 a.m. at Northeast Park, 400 NE

16th Ave., to raise awareness and money for breast cancer research.

Peterson is a UF alumna who majored in dance performance and ran track and cross country for UF for two years. She was diagnosed in 1999 at age 25 with an aggressive case of breast cancer.

She battled the disease and was in remission for four years until 2003, when it reappeared as tumors in her brain's frontal lobe, an area

Kanye West pulls no hot-button political punches at UF

■ WEST SAID 'N-WORD' 14 TIMES.

While Kanye West's concert at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Thursday was an entertainment success, he did not shy away from any of the issues that stirred tensions on UF's campus last month despite a campaign for censorship by a student group.

The three-time Grammy winner played 27 songs to a West Florida-record crowd of about 4,811 against a backdrop of protest, alcohol-related controversy and racial undercurrents.

During the show, West reaffirmed his controversial comments about President Bush despite a protest by UF College Republicans held outside the O'Connell Center.

At a telethon for Hurricane Katrina victims, less than a week before the announcement of his UF show, West said the president "doesn't care about black people."

During "All Falls Down," West changed "white man" to "George Bush" in the lyric "Drug dealer buy Jordans, crackhead buy crack, and a white man get paid off of all of that."

College Republicans Chairwoman Ashlee Black said that West's statements on television and during the concert "further the problem of racism" and that "in that aspect, he is very un-American."

O'Connell Center Associate Director Darius Dunn said he did not hear West's ex-

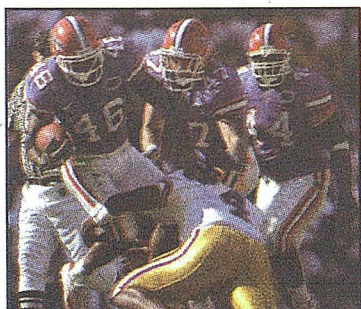
cerpt concerning President Bush. However, he did hear the 34 expletives West used, as well as the 14 instances of the "n-word."

Last month, controversy erupted about an editorial cartoon in the Alligator that depicted Condoleezza Rice using the "n-word" to criticize West's remarks about President Bush.

In response, the UF administration publicly decried use of the word, and some predominantly black student groups, such as the Black

Student conference engages Asian American activism

The open-mic troupe Exhale urged attendees to "know your role" and discredit stereotypes at the second annual Southeastern Regional Conference of Asian American Leaders on Friday.

Over the weekend, workshops and speakers taught 170 guests from eight states and 13 schools how to build and protect a cohesive Asian American community and identity in the Southeast.

At the open-mic portion of the opening ceremony at Gator Nights, conference guest Anida Rouquiyah Yoeu Esguerra and her husband held a round-robin poetry performance.

"I think that art is a very active way of engaging the audience and bringing issues in such a way that doesn't pound people over the head," Esguerra said.

On Saturday, leaders of the Asian American community conducted workshops in keeping with the conference's title, "Turn It Up! Educate, Expand, Empower," teaching techniques for advocacy on college campuses.

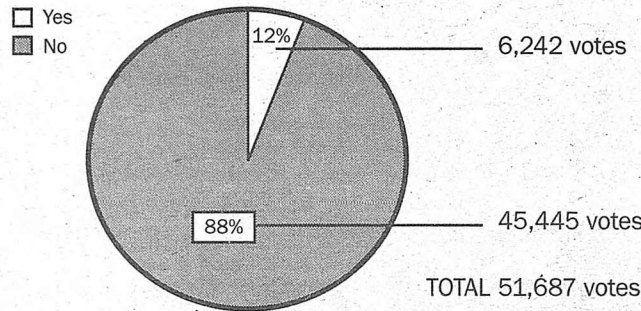
Conference co-director Michael Wong said some students believed the conference workshops were not at the proper level.

Python picks on UF student

Even a 911 operator couldn't believe what Elizabeth LaFoe found in her kitchen Thursday night.

"The dispatcher didn't believe me at first," LaFoe said. "She kept asking, 'Are you sure?'"

What the UF freshman found was a 2-foot live ball python coiled in the drain of her kitchen sink at Looking Glass Apartments.

Upon discovering the snake, LaFoe ran to her neighbor, UF junior James Golden, to ask for help.

"At first I thought it was a lizard," Golden said. "Then it moved, and I knew it was something bigger. When I saw the pattern on the scales, I jumped back."

LaFoe said she trapped the hissing python under a dish-drying rack and heavy math textbook.

Golden said he hurriedly tried to remember the riddle about snakes he had learned as a child.

"Black over red is a friend of Fred," Golden said. "Black over yellow will kill a fellow."

As the snake continued to move, both decided to call for help.

"I told her to call an exterminator," Golden said. "I didn't know if it was poisonous, so I didn't want to touch it."

LaFoe dialed 911 around 11 p.m.

While waiting for police to arrive, LaFoe said her imagination ran wild.

She remembered watching a recent newscast about a snake in Florida that had eaten an alligator.

"The police kept calling back to make sure it was still there and that I was OK," she said.

"At first I thought it was a lizard. Then it moved and I knew it was something bigger."

About an hour and a half later, four Gainesville Police squad cars pulled into the parking lot of Looking Glass Apartments, 111 NW 16th St.

GPD officer Ronnie Hartley, a former snake owner, said he immediately recognized the snake as a ball python.

"It's about the width of a golf ball," Hartley said. "They have teeth but aren't venomous."

"It's not that common, but sometimes they get loose and pay a visit," he added.

Police attempted to push the snake out of the drain with a

clothes hanger, but the animal wouldn't move.

Officers at the scene were forced to unscrew the garbage disposal to remove the snake, Hartley said.

"If she turned on the garbage disposal, it would have jumped up to bite her," he said.

The snake slithered around in a brown shopping bag while officers used their radios to find it a more appropriate home.

Because ball pythons are not found in the wild locally, Hartley said he suspects that the snake is probably a neighbor's missing pet.

"About three weeks ago we had a similar call about a snake in a vent at another apartment," Hartley said. "They like the water."

GPD was unable to contact a local couple known as the "snake busters," who usually handle snake problems and house them after they are captured, Hartley said.

After LaFoe's encounter, the snake was taken to the UF Veterinary Medical Center.

A group of LaFoe's neighbors curiously crowded her apartment door to see the snake.

LaFoe's neighbor, UF junior Joe Bushong, said he was disturbed by the entire situation.

"Every time I sit my butt down on a toilet, I'm going to think about this," Bushong said.

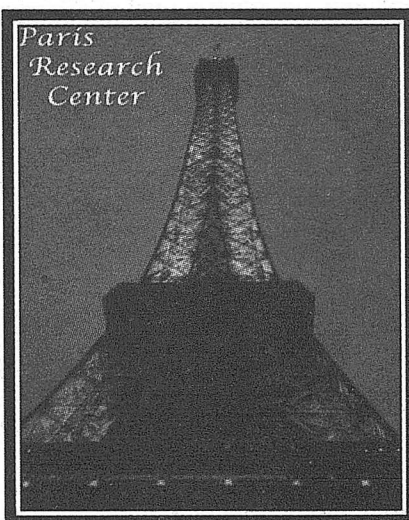

SG budget may not have room for health program

Future UF programs could face difficulties getting funding from tuition reserves. A new health program has already felt the pinch.

Student Government does not have as much student-tuition money to allocate to new health programs this year, Student Body Treasurer Lindsay Cosimi said.

One new program that could be affected is the Healthy Gators 2010 initiative, a local branch of a nationwide program designed to promote health in all aspects of life.

Healthy Gators 2010 is separate from GatorWell, which already receives funding from student tuition as a Student Health Care Center program.

GatorWell focuses on health concerns such as alcohol, tobacco and other drugs, nutrition services, sexual health and stress reduction.

The missions of the two programs overlap, but the Healthy Gators initiative is much more comprehensive, said Jane Emerée, spokes-

woman for Healthy Gators 2010 and director of GatorWell.

Healthy Gators 2010 is intended to unite UF's health programs and all organizations interested in health to make UF a health-friendly environment.

If the funding from SG comes up short, the initiative may have to look for other resources. Hurricanes Katrina and Rita raised natural gas prices, forcing SG to pay higher electricity bills for the SHCC and the Reitz Union, Cosimi said.

"It's affected our ability to produce new programs," Cosimi said.

Another factor driving SG's allocation of funds is the rise of minimum wage in Florida after last year's election, Cosimi said. This raise, which was not anticipated by SG, means workers at the Union and SHCC must be paid \$1 more per hour, from \$5.15 to \$6.15.

With the numbers adding up, the budget simply does not have the extra money for many new initiatives, Cosimi said.

"There's going to be a crunch this year," Cosimi said. "Incentives like this one could be

the first thing to go."

Several colleges, such as the College of Health and Human Performance, have given the initiative start-up money. It also received funds from the SHCC's programming fund, said Vladimir Oge, chairman of programming for Healthy Gators 2010.

"This initiative is quite unique in the amount of resources being allocated," Oge said. "The strength isn't in the allocation of money but in the time and resources that people give."

Thursday marked the first of five meetings to discuss setting the student Activity & Service Fee for the 2006-2007 school year.

The fee is broken up into three categories: an activity, athletics and health fee. In the past,

each fee had its own committee that would meet and then apply to SG for an increase in funding.

This year, the committees are being combined and one overall committee, consisting of faculty and students, will decide how to distribute the money to each fee area. SG is allowed to increase the fee by no more than 95 cents this year, Cosimi said.

"SG has not devoted any funds toward us at the moment," Emerée said. "Right now we don't have a whole lot of money. The vision is that we gather grant money."

Healthy Gators 2010 will hold a kickoff event Oct. 26 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on the Reitz Union Colonnade. The organizational health fair will have \$5 student flu shots, stress screening and information about a variety of health programs.

Chris Machen, wife of UF President Bernie Machen and chair of the steering committee for Healthy Gators 2010, will speak at noon. SHCC officials estimate about 500 students, faculty and staff will attend the event.

■ PARTY PATROL SEEKS THE ROWDIEST EVENTS.

Rohrbaugh said Kyle Andree was lucky because police could have taken him to jail.

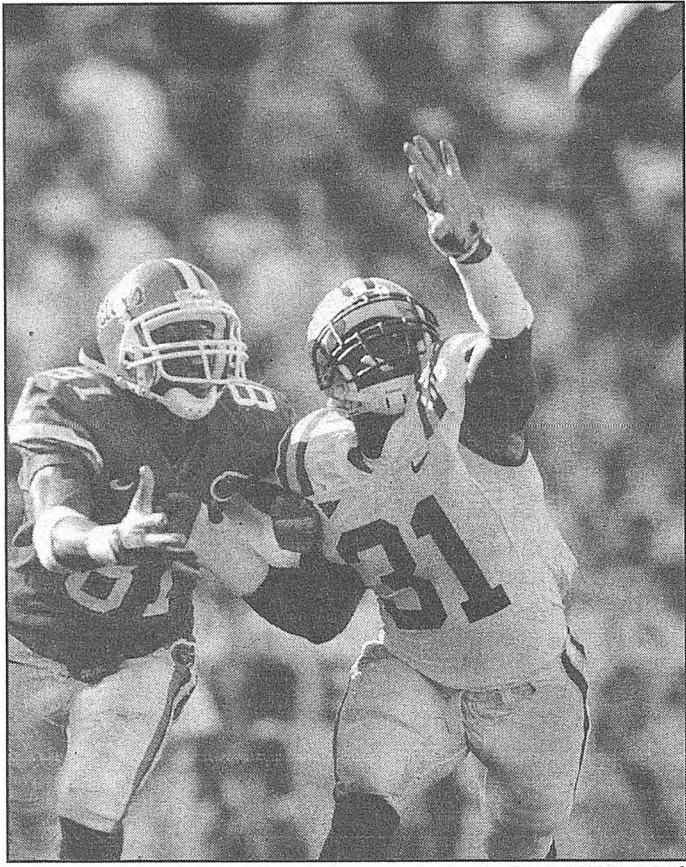

Gators hindered by penalties, missed opportunities

penalties, sacks and third-down longs galore.

Saturday, UF's offense was anemic at best. Its receivers rarely strayed for long passes. Neither could the Gators execute one successful option or shovel pass play, not to mention run a reverse or two. It was a 3-and-long funeral for UF, which was 1 for 12 on third downs after the first drive of the fourth quarter.

The only positive for the Gators was tailback DeShawn Wynn. The junior rushed for 93 yards and a touchdown, enough production for Meyer to dub him the team's official starter after the game. Still, besides that ...

"Our offense," Meyer said, "is terrible."

Leak played with a sore shoulder, but not even that seemed to explain his 11-of-30 passing. He finished with 107 passing yards, the worst numbers of any start in his UF career.

He was running for his football life on most plays, the offensive line continuing to struggle. The Gators added four more sacks to their SEC-leading — if

that is the appropriate way to describe it — 24 sacks allowed.

"You're really not supposed to be able to do that," said Meyer of the Tigers' incessant blitzkrieg strategy. "Our checkers were [supposed to be] even with their checkers."

But the offensive line was hardly the only thing wrong with the offense. Even when Leak had time to find a receiver, he never seemed to find any kind of groove. Overthrows, underthrows and misreads cluttered the field.

In UF's last two games against tough SEC competition — Alabama and LSU — Leak passed 27 of 67 for 294 yards.

"We didn't execute the way we could have," Leak said.

The offense's struggles were epitomized by UF's second-to-last series. With 4:02 remaining to assemble a drive from their own 6-yard line, the Gators were called for three penalties in a span of five plays. Soon UF faced third and 20 — a checkmate for Saturday's game and perhaps for the season.

"It's unacceptable, and we have to get better at it," Meyer said.

Student Union, pledged to start a letter-writing campaign to West asking him not to use the word.

BSU President Marie Denise Jean-Louis attended the show and said the petition went forward, but declined further comment.

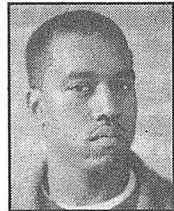
In "Gold Digger," an audience favorite, West replaced the "n-word" with "broke" in the first two choruses. However, the crowd cheered as he yelled the chorus twice at the end of the song without changing the lyrics.

Dunn said there is no official stance by the O'Connell Center concerning BSU's efforts and that in no way were any of West's lyrics censored.

UF President Bernie Machen's own campaign against binge and underage drinking

seemed to clash with West's request for 10 bottles of alcohol.

In February, Student Government refused to grant requests by Snoop Dogg because the tuition-funded Activity & Service Fee that SG controls cannot be used to buy alcohol.

However, West was paid to appear by UF and the O'Connell Center, a branch of the university's Finance and Administration office, which has a different stance on granting alcohol to performers.

"We provided absolutely no alcohol to [the performers] last night," Dunn said. "There are always things they ask for in the rider, but that doesn't mean that we can give it to them."

A rider is the list of needs and amenities requested by an artist as part of the contract to be honored at the venue hosting the event. For Snoop Dogg, the copy of the rider provided to the Alligator had all requests for alcohol crossed off. West's rider did not.

"There have been times when that request (for alcohol) has been granted," he said, citing for singer Elton John, his requested bottle of wine would have been provided.

Packaging science sophomore Natalie Lopez said she loved the concert even though her favorite artist, previously announced opening act rapper Common, did not perform.

Common signed a movie deal and dropped out of the tour just hours before its kickoff Oct. 11, according to MTV.com

"But Kanye definitely made up for it," she said. "He even got a 60-year-old woman in front of me to stand up and get down."

that controls behavior and mood, leaving her with poor judgment and impulse control.

"I turned into a crazy person," she said. "My parents thought I was having a breakdown."

By the time she realized she had cancer again, it had spread to her lungs, liver and bones. After taking a three-month break from chemotherapy, the cancer attacked her ovaries and an area behind her right eye.

Last December, Peterson, nearly blind in her right eye, faced death in the hospital with her right arm completely paralyzed and fluid around her heart, she said.

"The doctors said I would never receive the use of my right arm again, that I would never see out of my right eye again and that I would probably not even leave the hospital," she said.

Peterson proved them wrong. Still going through chemotherapy, she is able to move her arm and see out of both eyes.

She continues to volunteer and participate in races and walks, such as Making Strides.

About 1,000 attended the second annual Making Strides, hosted by the American Cancer Society. Participants raised \$85,000, exceeding the goal of \$60,000.

Making Strides began in 1993 in Massachusetts, but this is only the second year the event was held in Gainesville with a focus on breast cancer. Saturday's walk focused on awareness for young women.

Jackie Secula, the event's team recruitment chairwoman, was happy about the turnout.

"I have no more tears, I have cried all day," she said. "If you can't feel [the hope] when you come out here, you can't feel."

Missing e-mail

UF officials fail to educate students on options

The Editorial Board isn't worried about classwork or university deadlines; we can't access our UF WebMail, so we're assuming it just doesn't exist.

Apparently, our current e-mail problems stem from the solution of an e-mail problem past.

After months of planning, UF officials recently enacted the new rule that students cannot forward their university mail to other e-mail accounts, such as AOL and Hotmail.

Over the years, important e-mails from UF have been deleted from such accounts because the services tagged them as spam.

Outlawing those services seemed like the perfect solution; it put the responsibility on the students to check their UF accounts and eliminated the danger of the deletion of UF e-mails.

So what happens when all those conscientious students actually check their mail through WebMail?

It overloads, and thousands of faculty and students are unable to get any e-mail, much less those important ones.

We think officials went about this whole thing the wrong way.

Did they ever consider that university e-mails are spam? The UF Wednesday updates, department listserv announcements and Patricia Telles-Irvin outbursts weigh in at about the same level as penis-enlargement advertisements on our scale of informative.

AOL had it right all along. Delete the extraneous and leave room for the important stuff. It is a feature we will dearly miss.

But for the sake of argument, we'll assume the university sends some important messages.

However, the method of dealing with the situation is questionable.

First of all, the idea of using a standalone e-mail client, such as Microsoft Outlook, should have been pushed all along. In Friday's article, UF Coordinator for Computer Systems Control Frances McDonell said, "WebMail was never meant to be the primary method students use to access their GatorLink accounts."

McDonell goes on to say that someone said students should use WebMail, and officials are now trying to battle that perception.

But we've never heard anything but administrators telling us to use WebMail as the primary way to access e-mail. It was only recently that a link appeared on the login page of WebMail, touting the benefits of standalone e-mail clients.

However, that explanation reads more like a public-service announcement than a set of beneficial instructions. If you don't know how to use standalone e-mail clients, or if you don't know what they are, this little essay is really not going to help. It focuses on telling students that WebMail is not a primary provider; instead, it is the "convenience store" of e-mail.

That's very helpful.

Officials took away students' easiest options for retrieving UF e-mail, then lamented how WebMail can't be used as a primary method to check GatorLink e-mail.

It seems as though there was a huge gap between those who run WebMail and those who spoke about WebMail.

Perhaps other options should have been researched before implementing the current plan.

But the past is over; officials can correct this problem by giving students easy instructions on how to set up Outlook or Eudora.

Perhaps that link on the login page could serve a real purpose.

The responsibility for all this continues to be muddled, but one thing is clear: Communication in all forms failed in this venture, and now is the time to correct it.

Avian flu poses realistic threat to U.S.

If you're not scared, then you're not paying attention. A new threat stands ready to bring about the second coming of the Dark Ages, and it makes nuclear war seem civilized.

The World Health Organization believes that avian flu is acquiring the ability to move easily between humans and could cause a pandemic of biblical proportions, claiming millions to tens of millions of lives.

You've probably heard that already, but it gets worse.

Some strains of the virus in Southeast Asia have already developed a resistance to a vaccine that many countries are stockpiling. Producing a new vaccine in significant quantities would take at least four to six months.

The flu is already creeping in through Europe's back doors, such as eastern Romania. The U.S. government is moving to action, and there's talk about using the military to quarantine entire states if the disease reaches our shores.

But there's a subplot to this story, and it's worthy of a James Bond flick.

This month, U.S. researchers resurrected a copy of the 1918 Spanish flu virus in a frighteningly bizarre bit of science fiction that involved digging up tissue samples from World War I soldiers and an Alaskan eskimo.

The Spanish flu killed as many as 50 million people faster than any other disease in human history and left a greater death toll in a few months than AIDS has in 24 years.

Researchers mapped out the genome of the virus and decided to make it publicly available to scientists. The choice to publish was made because of the Spanish flu's similarities to the bird flu, and the information could lead to a more effective vaccine quicker.

But maybe the advantages don't outweigh the risks.

Richard Ebright, a bacteriologist at Rutgers University, said in the weekly science journal "Nature" that there is

a risk "verging on inevitability" of an accidental release of the virus or of it being stolen by a "disgruntled, disturbed or extremist laboratory employee."

Viruses have escaped labs before, as SARS did in both Taiwan and Singapore. Ebright also mentioned the possibility that a hostile nation could create its own version of the virus.

And let's not forget why biological weapons are sometimes called the "poor man's bomb." Biological warfare is far easier and far cheaper than building a nuclear arsenal. A moderately sophisticated research lab could get the job done and order some of the necessary DNA sequences through the mail.

So, if you're Osama bin Laden and have a whole lot of money, too much free time and a desire to wipe that silly grin off America's face, why waste your time with nukes?

A nuclear attack on a major U.S. city would be devastating, but the release of a virus on par with the Spanish flu would bring this nation to its knees. It would be like the sequel to the sacking of Rome, except far bigger and uglier.

If America is spared the wrath of the bird flu, we shouldn't waste time counting our blessings. We cannot grow complacent in the face of other biological threats that could unhinge the whole of Western civilization.

In a world where money and the instructions to recreate doomsday viruses can travel from Atlanta to Algeria in seconds, it's a splendid time to be a bad guy.

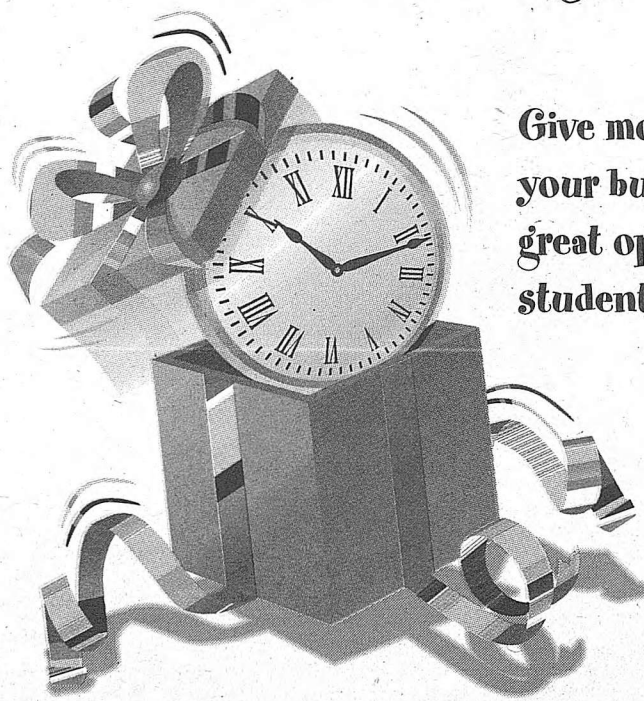

Wynn, Herring provide bright moments on gloomy day

BATON ROUGE, La. — After experimenting for seven games with a running back-by-committee approach, UF coach Urban Meyer finally found his guy in junior DeShawn Wynn.

Wynn was expected to be the top back before the season started, but work ethic issues that had plagued him for two years returned this season.

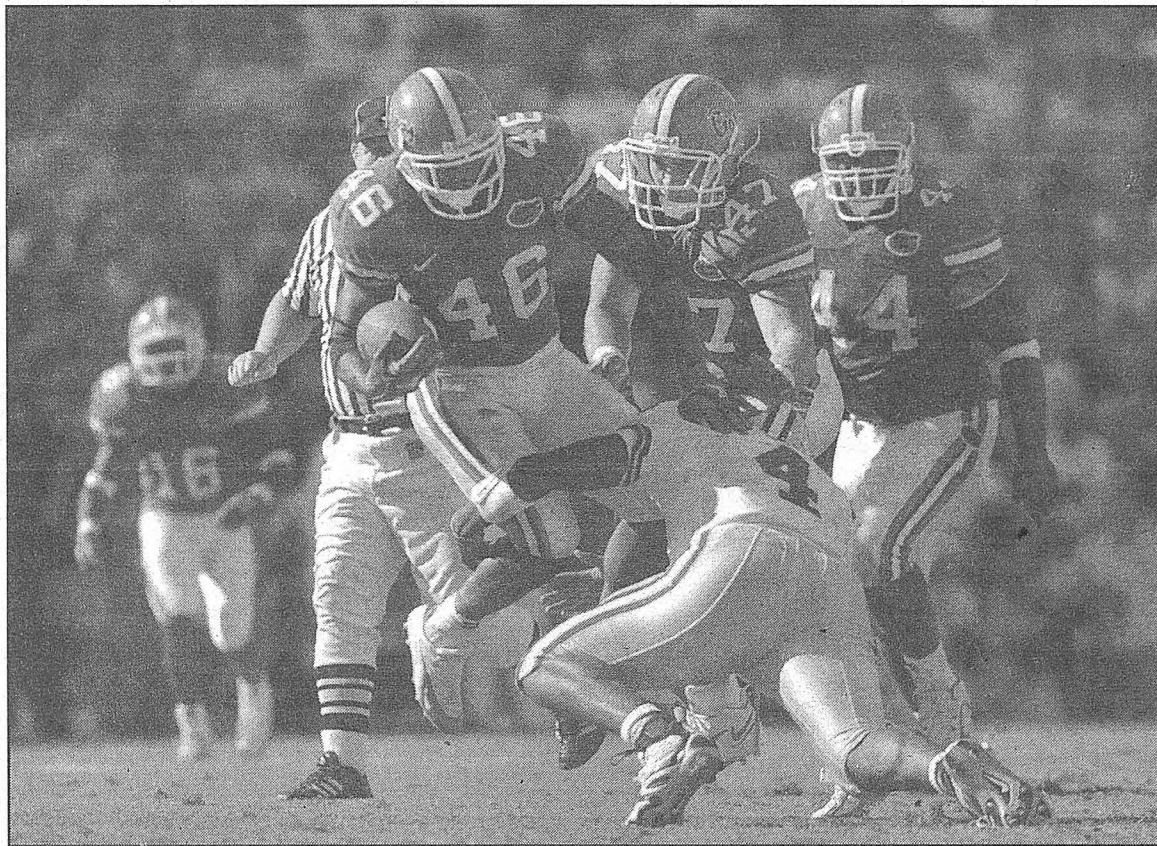
Now, the veteran has finally emerged to claim the starting gig.

"Our run game showed up, so you can really say that we got a running back at Florida," Meyer said. "I just had a long talk with him, and Florida needs a tailback."

Meyer has started up to three different running backs this year, and with Wynn favoring a sore shoulder during the week, it seemed unlikely that his break out game would come against a defense allowing a scant 62.5 yards a game on the ground heading into Saturday's game.

While most of UF's offense did little in the Gators' 21-17 loss to Louisiana State, Wynn had 16 carries for 98 yards and a touchdown. It was his ability to hit the rushing lanes that set him apart from the rest of the competition.

Wynn also ended his season-long standoff with the media, saying he decided to speak up since he finally proved himself.

"At the beginning of the game, Coach Meyer told me to step it up, and I took it personally," he said. "With the way I was running hard, and the line opening up a lot more holes, I think he has a lot more confidence in me."

Ray Mac Barely Back

The winks kept coming and coming, but in the end it wasn't enough. Junior defensive end Ray McDonald, who hadn't played since partially tearing the ACL in his right knee, hinted to coaches all week that he could be ready to go

by game time. Despite warming up and seeing action for only a few plays, the effects of his knee surgery still lingered.

"He'll be ready for Georgia, but he tried to go as hard as he could," Meyer said.

While McDonald wasn't able to

contribute, his two replacements played the best game of their careers. Sophomore Jarvis Moss recorded three sacks, one of which caused a fumble that he recovered.

Junior Joe Cohen recorded the first sack of his career and constantly pressured LSU quarterback JaMarcus Russell throughout the game. His constant presence in the pocket paid off when he intercepted a deflected pass at the line, also the first interception of his career.

Don't blame the spread

After Saturday's 21-17 loss to LSU, quarterback Chris Leak refused to criticize Meyer's spread offense that had so much success at Utah but has done little in the SEC.

"Everybody has bought into it," Leak said. "We've just got to get more comfortable and make the plays when we have the opportunity."

Herring's big day

While an emotional Urban Meyer may have had little to be positive about following Saturday's 21-17 loss to LSU, he praised strong safety Jarvis Herring who had one of the best games of his career.

Herring's fumble recovery and interception led to UF's only two touchdowns of the game. Without those contributions, the Gators could have been looking at another blowout loss like the 31-3 suffered at Alabama two weeks ago.

Emotional Gators taste bitter defeat, leave Meyer pondering next move

BATON ROUGE, La. — Can you really blame Urban Meyer for wanting to bawl after UF's pitiful offensive performance against LSU?

Meyer fought back tears in the postgame interview, but they weren't tears of rage. These were tears of confusion and bewilderment.

For the first time in Meyer's previously flawless coaching career, the bitter and skunky taste of defeat filled the 40-year-old's mouth.

The last time Meyer failed like this, he was half his current age and trying to jumpstart a career in the Atlanta Braves organization.

The difference is that Meyer's first failure was a personal disappointment. This time, he had a locker room full of slain giants who spent months trying to air out the stench of a losing atmosphere that has plagued UF foot-

ball since Steve Spurrier parted ways nearly four years ago.

After Saturday's game, a stunned Marcus Thomas couldn't comprehend the numbers 5 and 2, UF's tarnished record.

"This year, it hurts real bad," he said. "We were on the road to not losing any games."

That's how it stands right now, and while Gator Nation cries along with Meyer, everyone's trying to figure out whom to blame.

In the past everyone blamed Ron Zook. So why not blame Meyer this time around?

The difference is that Meyer came to UF with a glorified resume.

That's what makes this fall from grace so stunning. And if you think I'm finding too much fault with a 5-2 record, review UF's two losses.

Saturday's 21-17 score is misleading. Without Jarvis Herring's interception and fumble recovery that put UF's offense in prime field position, it easily could have been 21-3.

Last season, in the four losses suffered under Zook, the Gators lost by a combined 19 points. The Zooker always said a play here, a play there and UF would have been undefeated.

Nobody cared about Zook's claims in the off-season, because the Gators were replacing a Chrysler Sebring with a Lamborghini

Diablo. Suddenly, the Gators' offense would become the greatest show this side of Vegas.

But nothing the Gators have tried to do seems to work against quality teams.

Will Meyer's spread offense ever work in the SEC?

Did everyone exaggerate the talent of UF's roster? Was the injured Andre Caldwell really that key of an ingredient?

Or how about this: does Meyer know the answer to any of the above?

The Gators are lost right now, but expect Meyer to eventually figure out the SEC.

But try telling that to players like Marcus Thomas and Jarvis Herring, who won't be around for a long-term rebuilding project.

That's why Meyer's crying. His players bought into a system that's simply not ready.
