Crash that killed UF student a hit-and-run

Fraternity brother 'would just lift everyone'

The flag outside the Phi Delta Theta Fraternity house hung at half-mast Monday following the death of fraternity brother and UF sophomore Patrick Brett, 20, in a hit-and-run car accident Sunday.

Brett was driving with two UF students and two University of Central Florida students southbound on Interstate 75 after attending the UF-Louisiana State University football game.

At about 5:30 p.m. a van cut off Brett's 2003 Ford sport-utility vehicle, according to a Florida Highway Patrol accident report.

Brett swerved to avoid hitting the van but then overcorrected, causing the vehicle to flip. He died at the scene.

His passengers were not seriously injured.

UF sophomore Jennifer Ostrander, 20, was not wearing her seatbelt and suffered broken ribs, FHP spokesman Lt. Mike Burroughs said. UF student William "Bud" Hawkins, 21, and

the two UCF students suffered minor cuts and bruises.

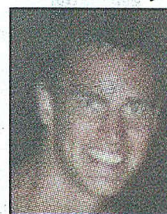
Drew Metzger, 20, and Matthew LaFleur, 22, were in good condition as of Monday night, said Michael Taylor, president of their UCF-chapter Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity.

The passengers told police they thought it was a silver or blue Nissan Quest that cut Brett off, Burroughs said.

They said the Nissan stopped a quarter of a mile south of the accident only for a moment before driving away.

Burroughs said the first aid

to arrive at the scene were a high school health teacher, who performed CPR on Brett, and a vehicle carrying doctors, who performed CPR as well.

"Everyone wanted to be around him. His laugh and smile were almost infectious," Zaltsberg said. "We're trying to take it a day at a time."

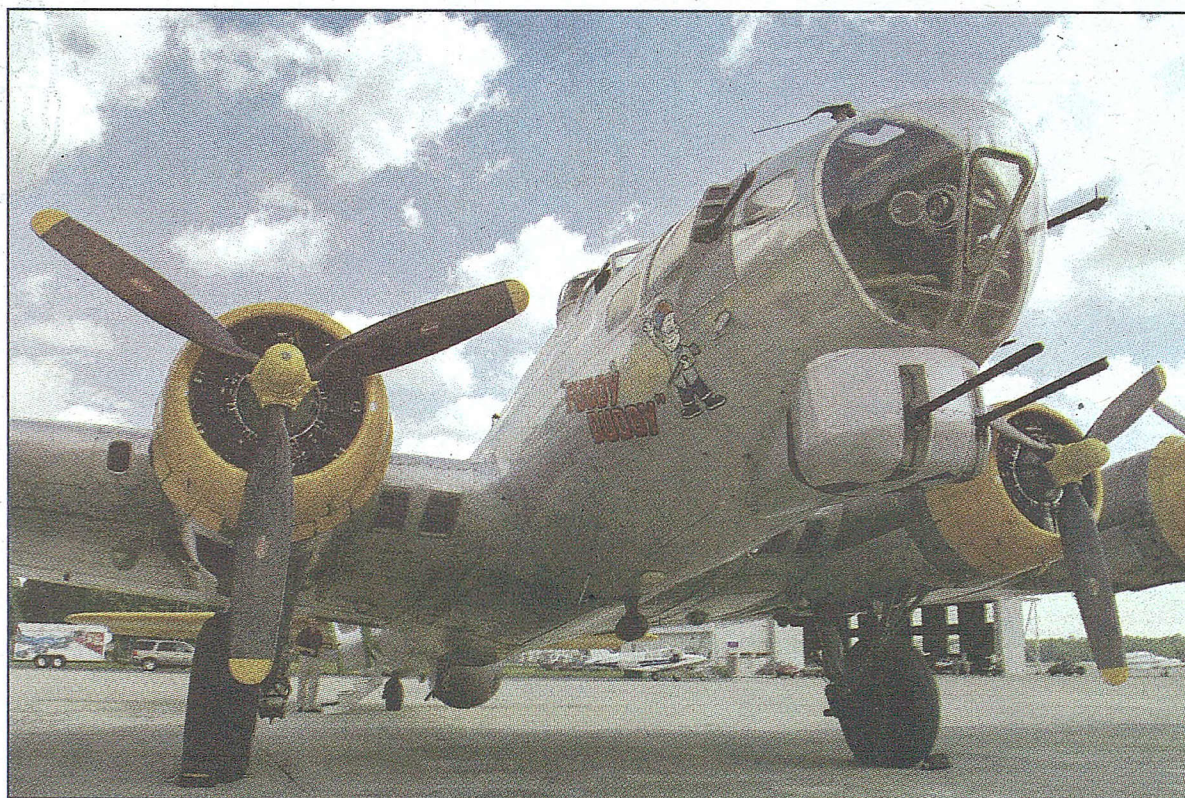
Brett joined the fraternity in Fall 2004.

Chris Seber, one of Brett's pledge brothers, said Brett was well-liked by everyone.

"You didn't have to know him. All you had to do is look at his smile," Seber said. "There's so many times where everyone around you is in a bad mood, and if Pat was there ... he'd just lift everyone up."

Florida Highway Patrol is seeking any information regarding the other vehicle involved in the accident.

Low pay drives UF faculty away

UF isn't paying its educators enough to keep them from going elsewhere, according to some faculty members and graduate assistants.

Despite annual pay raises, some claim that UF's rates aren't competitive with other universities' or jobs in the private sector.

"A lot of departments are under pressure to meet the market if they're going to attract people," said Jon Hamilton, chairman of UF's Department of Economics in the Warrington College of Business Administration.

Hamilton was referring to the market that includes teaching positions at other universities as well as job openings in private companies — something especially relevant to business professors with a keen knowledge of the economy.

As a result, business-administration faculty members tend to earn more money than other educators.

For the 2004-2005 school year, business administration faculty members earned an average salary of almost \$134,000, beating out faculty in pharmacy, engineering, medicine and law, who respectively earned average salaries ranging from \$87,000 to \$114,000.

The salary average for faculty members was \$78,922.03.

UF's most recent raise boosted business faculty's salaries about 4.6 percent, Hamilton said, but that raise did not solve the problem.

"It may have kept up with inflation," he said. "What [administrators] haven't done is kept up with the professor job market, and so there's a lot of salary compression at UF."

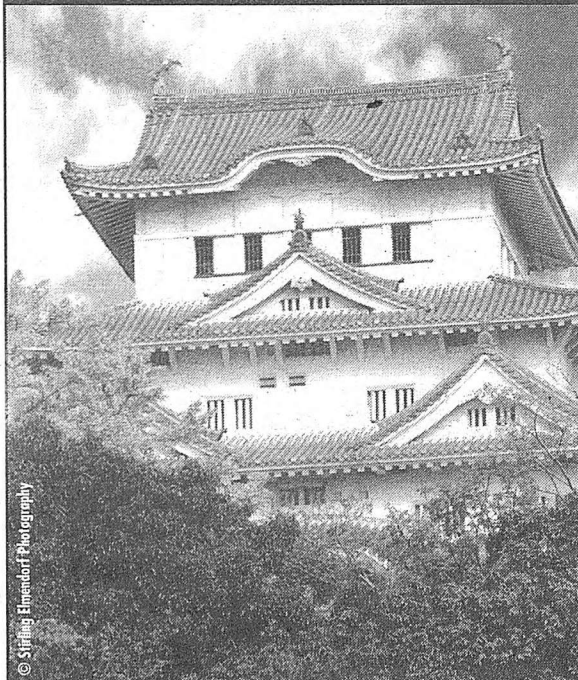

Park set to improve downtown

■ NOT ALL LOCALS ARE HAPPY WITH THE PROJECT.

At the intersection of Depot Avenue and Main Street, you can see three 25-foot-high earthen skyscrapers colored tan, gray and black.

These stacks of soil signal the first phase of the long-term East Gainesville Depot Park Project, which is intended to restore the environment and spur economic growth in the area.

But some doubt whether a park can facilitate business.

Steve Brotherton has owned land in East Gainesville since 1978, and the park's construction now backs up against his property. He describes the south strip of Main Street as "stagnant," where empty buildings are a common sight.

As president of Continental Imports of Gainesville, a specialized auto service center, Brotherton said he doesn't think the project will affect his business very much.

Matt Dubé, the projects coordinator for Gainesville's Community Redevelopment Agency, said the project promotes sustainable economic development by revitalizing the area and eliminating negative influences on community pride.

The project's key component is its stormwater basin, an 11-acre

shallow pond where 80 acres of the downtown area's contaminated runoff water will drain to improve the quality of water seeping into Florida's aquifer.

"It [the storm water basin] just moves stormwater capacity that individual businesses would have to use to the centralized location in the park," Dubé said.

Mark Brown, UF environmental engineering sciences professor, explained that stormwater basins improve the contents of the aquifer by trapping nutrients, such as phosphorus and nitrogen, attached to fall-out sediment in still runoff water. The basin will be lined with wetland vegetation that feeds on the nutrients.

City Commissioner Craig Lowe said the Depot Park Project addresses both ecological and economic responsibilities by helping downtown businesses reduce pollution.

"By providing for stormwater," he said, "we're allowing for economic development by allowing potential business developments to utilize the Depot basin instead of processing their stormwater on-site."

Another concern Brotherton voiced about the park project is that businesses in Gainesville traditionally do not infill, or tear down old industrial warehouses and rebuild their own. Rather, business owners

elect to find new land with less risk of contamination while the warehouses fill a series of minor, lesser uses until they almost fall apart.

In the long term, he said the new park might increase the value of his property, which hasn't changed for almost 20 years, but he's skeptical that the area will transform into a downtown extension.

"You gotta get people to build on top of old industrial buildings for that to happen," Brotherton said. "That doesn't happen in Gainesville."

According to the city of Gainesville's official Web site, the stormwater park will sit on the former site of a coal gasification plant. The soil's contaminants must be extracted before soil remediation can begin.

Dubé has not heard of any previous stormwater basins built on top of so-called brownfields.

He said Gainesville Regional Utilities' gas customers would fund the cleanup as part of their gas service bills.

Yolanta Jonynas, project licenser for GRU, said soil remediation would cost gas-utility customers a total of \$11.2 million over 30 years as a percentage of their bills.

The park's design summary includes a skatepark, a children's play area, more than one mile of boardwalks and pathways, a sculpture garden, pedestrian lighting and a restored historic train depot.

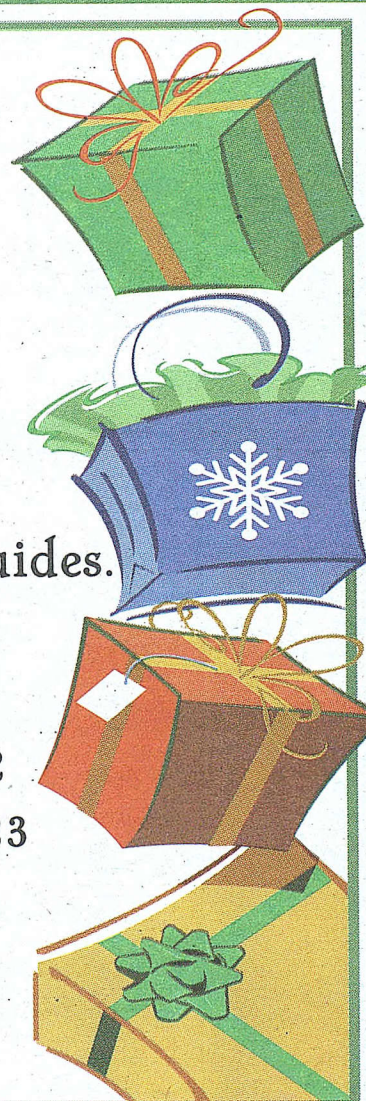

Med trips reach out to needy

While many students sunbathe on beaches during Spring Break, nearly 100 UF health science students will travel to underprivileged areas of Latin America to provide medical care.

Students from different health-related disciplines divide up into five groups to travel to the Dominican Republic, the Haiti-Dominican Republic border, Mexico and Ecuador. Every group is accompanied by two or three UF faculty doctors.

Each of the five trips costs about \$20,000, and about half of the funding is dependent on donations.

Fundraising for the trips has already begun, but gathering donations has been more difficult than usual this year.

Donations for Hurricane Katrina victims have sometimes taken priority over donations to help the students fund their trips, said Jeff Janus, a second-year medical student and a trip leader for Project Heal, a medical mission trip to Ecuador.

"We understand that people want to take care of their own, but in some of these countries, it's like Katrina 24/7," he said.

Each group will spend five days treating patients, many of

whom would otherwise receive no healthcare at all.

Kuon Lo, a second-year medical student, became a trip leader for Project Haiti after making the trip last Spring.

He said the lack of infrastructure in Haiti forces its people to struggle with afflictions that would never be allowed to progress in the United States.

"We see tumors the size of basketballs; we see fungal and bacterial infections progressed to really advanced stages," he said. "It's really amazing on an intellectual level and appalling on a socioeconomic level how something so simple that would be taken care of immediately in the U.S. progresses to such an unbelievable stage in these people."

The sometimes-grotesque effects of diseases leave an impression, Lo said.

"I can't see my education being complete without this," he said.

Lo added that some Haitians walked for two hours to reach the students because they offered the nearest medical attention.

In the Mexican state of Yucatan — where the healthcare system is much better — students faced the challenge of making diagnoses without many of the modern tests regularly performed in American hospitals, said Maahir Haque, a second-year medical student and leader of Project Yucatan.

On the Haiti-Dominican Republic border, the medical students and physicians would see 100 to 150 patients each day, Lo said.

In Ecuador, they would see 200 to 300 people per day, Janus said.

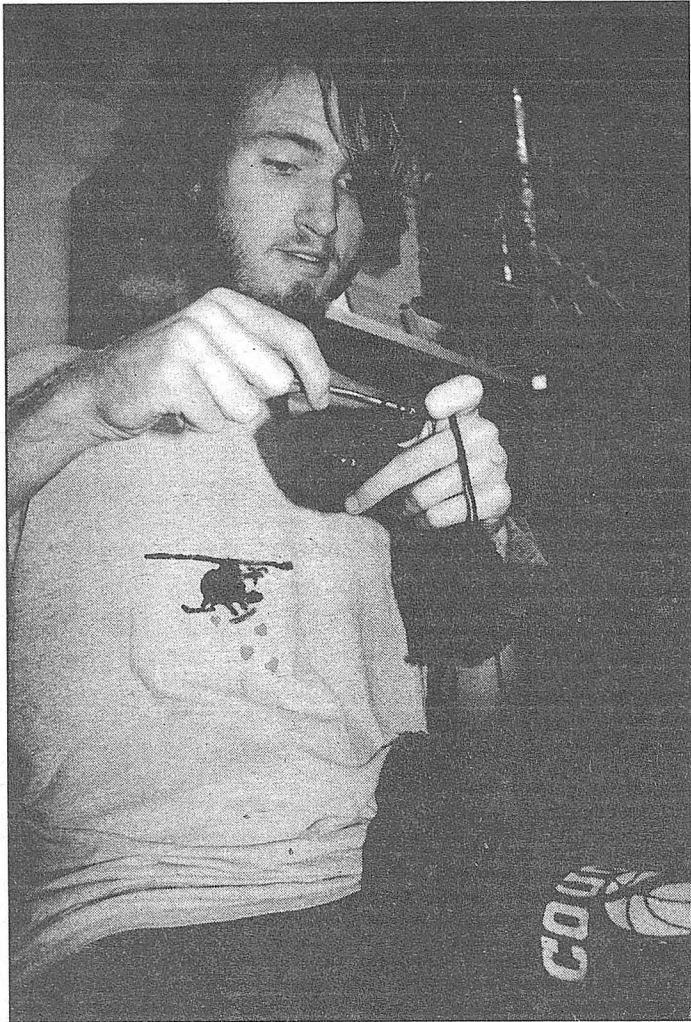
For some advanced cases that the students could not treat, they would give the patients money and refer them to a hospital, Lo said.

But offering good primary care is a great help to those who would otherwise have virtually no medical care.

The groups focus on preventative medicine and education by giving prenatal vitamins to pregnant women and providing basic necessities, such as toothbrushes and toothpaste.

"It's a little effort for us to go, but it helps them so much," Janus said.

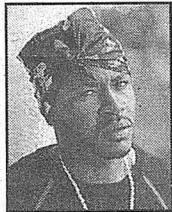
While Susse wouldn't comment on the price of her party, she said booking someone like Trick Daddy is "not cheap."

When salaries become compressed, new professors start earning nearly as much as returning professors, which can cause conflict about adequate pay for their skills and experience.

If money isn't available to keep UF salaries in line with national averages, it may drive faculty members to take jobs at better-paying private universities or at companies in their field of expertise.

"It's a problem in any institution that to some extent has a fairly rigid salary structure," he said.

A 2004 UF-sponsored study on faculty compensation supported the claims of some employees. It stated that UF must increase its wages to remain competitive in hiring and retaining professors.

The study also offered suggestions on developing UF into a Top 10 public research institution.

The study showed that UF salary averages trailed behind those of the Association of American Universities as well as Minnesota and Ohio State universities, two institutions similar in size and structure to UF.

Associate Provost Joe Glover could not be reached for comment.

Better pay at other universities could tempt more than just UF's top professors.

Todd Reynolds, co-president of UF's Graduate Assistants United, said the same thing is happening to members of his organization.

"They're losing graduate students because we're not competitive," Reynolds said.

Graduate assistants, like faculty members, receive a yearly raise. Reynolds said they were able to lobby for a 3.6 percent raise this year.

Salaries for graduate assistants are based on 9- and 12-month schedules, as well as what are known as full-time equivalencies, about 40 hours of work per week.

The average graduate assistant working 20 hours a week for nine months will make a minimum of \$7,665, or about \$393 every two weeks.

Stipends provided by the university cover the cost of tuition for graduate assistants, but Reynolds said they are not enough.

"Our stipends are among the lowest in the country," he said. "I can't pay my rent with my tuition waiver."

Graduate assistants are leaving to the University of Georgia, which Reynolds said offers better pay and benefits.

"If you're good at teaching, you'll pick what place pays you better," he said. "We're not going to be competitive until we offer better packages."

No choice

Healthcare program sets dangerous precedent

A choice has been made, and students will soon start to see the money they didn't know they donated in action.

Since January, we've all been paying an extra quarter-cent sales tax to fund a new healthcare program called Community Health Offering Innovative Care and Educational Services.

The Choices program's kickoff was Saturday.

Doesn't ring a bell? That's because you probably didn't vote for or against the initiative when it appeared in the August 2004 election.

Students make up almost half of Gainesville, yet we never go to the polls. And sometimes, the issues considered actually concern us.

In the case of Choices, we're paying an estimated \$15 to \$20 extra a year for a service for which most students don't qualify.

The program's mission is to provide limited primary healthcare to uninsured workers aged 18 to 64. Those residents must work full-time and have a certain income level. Those who are covered under Medicare, Medicaid and Veterans Affairs are not eligible, nor are those whose jobs offer insurance, even if they must pay for that benefit.

Basically, Choices is for the minority that slips through the cracks of government and private healthcare.

And the government has lots of cracks. The program is an indicator of the insufficiency of government healthcare.

But it also marks a dangerous precedent of local governments taking up the slack.

Students are the consumer majority in Gainesville and are a large force in Alachua County. Many don't have healthcare. Many work, but can't work full-time because of classes. Many forego the option of university healthcare because the price is above their budgets, and the plan is mostly useless.

Choices does not help them.

So if students put in the bulk of money for an Alachua County minority, then Gainesville residents can throw in a few cents to pay for students' missing healthcare.

We'll admit there are many privileged students of Gainesville. Their parents pay for their tuition, their cars, their shopping and their nice apartments.

But remember that this is a public university, and there are plenty of students in need and with families.

Why aren't residents helping them with a tax?

If every community were to try to fill the holes of state and federal government with individual initiatives like Choices, there would be no motivation to fix the system.

And the system must be fixed. If people are living in poverty and are not covered by an existing healthcare program, that's a serious problem. We can't just whisk it away by implementing a seven-year program based on taking money from the poor and giving it to the poor.

Once again, local government is using students for the benefit of a resident minority. But at the same time they help the community, students must also deal with different levels of prejudices that show up from property leases to bar laws.

Choices, which was passed by a small majority last year, is just one example how students can be exploited because of their neglect of local affairs.

Students have become the food that Gainesville feasts on; they must vote or give up their rights as equal citizens.

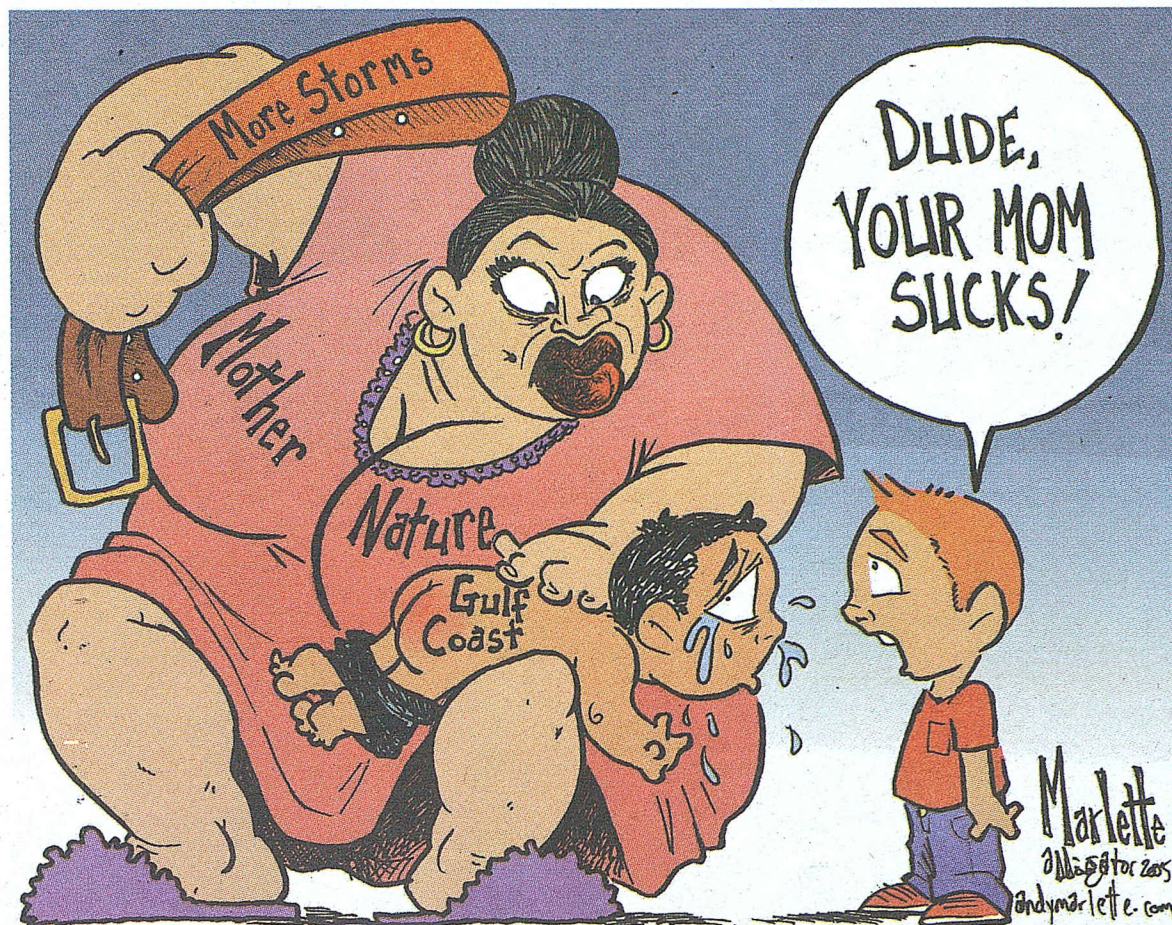

Miers' past reveals lack of experience

It's been two weeks since President Bush nominated Harriet Miers to the Supreme Court, and despite efforts by various news organizations to unearth some semblance of a legal record, her paper trail is about as long as a stray piece of toilet paper on the bottom of someone's shoe.

I've tried to withhold judgment until the confirmation hearings, but a look into Miers' past makes waiting unnecessary.

It would be incredibly surprising if Miers exhibited even a fraction of the constitutional knowledge that newly appointed Chief Justice John Roberts possesses in the tip of his pinky finger.

President Bush contends that Miers has "real-world experience." So does every other Joe Schmo.

Whereas Chief Justice Roberts argued 39 cases before the Supreme Court, Miers has argued none.

The problem isn't so much that she's never been a judge — neither were many justices before her — but that she has no experience in constitutional law.

Miers was never a law professor like William Douglas.

She never legislated in Congress like 27 other justices without judicial experience had.

And she was never a leading appellate lawyer like John Roberts.

The consistency of her constitutional knowledge is about as thick as a piece of one-ply.

As usual, President Bush has been blinded by loyalty. Miers has served him as his personal attorney in Texas, head of the Texas Lottery Commission, White House staff secretary and White House counsel.

As conservative columnist Charles Krauthammer

put it, "If Harriet Miers were not a crony of the president of the United States, her nomination to the Supreme Court would be a joke, as it would have occurred to no one else to nominate her."

Something along the way might prove all the naysayers wrong.

But it's highly unlikely, as indicated by the records released Oct. 10 of Miers' term as chairwoman of the Texas Lottery Commission.

"You are the best governor ever — deserving of great respect!" Miers gushed in a belated birthday card to George W. Bush in 1997. On the front of the card was a cute little puppy.

Later that year, Miers wrote Bush a note saying she hoped his twin daughters, Jenna and Barbara, recognize that they have "cool" parents.

Honestly, I don't think I could make this up even if I tried.

Conservatives are eating Miers alive, and liberals are following the wise words of Napoleon Bonaparte — "Never interrupt your enemy when he is making a mistake."

But I have come up with a solution that serves everyone.

Miers seems to have such superb card-writing skills; instead of making her a lifetime appointee to the highest court in the land, why not appoint her lifetime CEO of Hallmark instead?

I must write a response to some of the most irresponsible journalism I have seen in a long time. ABC's "investigation" into "gaping security lapses" at university nuclear research reactors is nothing short of a hatchet job that shamelessly alarms the public.

These Carnegie Fellows who did the "investigation" may be distinguished journalism students, but that does not mean their findings are credible or well-researched.

They say they were allowed to drive a truck within 50 feet of a campus reactor building. They do not, however, bother to find out if the reactor is vulnerable to an explosive attack from an outside

vehicle.
Christian Acosta ABC even
Speaking Out writes in
its own

article that the MIT reactor has been studied and shown to withstand a large truck bomb.

The UF reactor, for example, is underneath 50 tons of concrete and sits inside a multi-story building.

If anyone decided to explode a truck bomb on campus, the least dangerous place for it to explode would be outside the reactor building.

ABC's "expert," Graham T. Allison, is a political scientist who has written nothing but negative articles on nuclear power. Just looking at his history of publications, I would venture to say he is not an unbiased source of information.

His statement, "highly enriched uranium that's vulnerable is an unacceptable threat to me," may be a responsible position, but it is irresponsibly applied in this report.

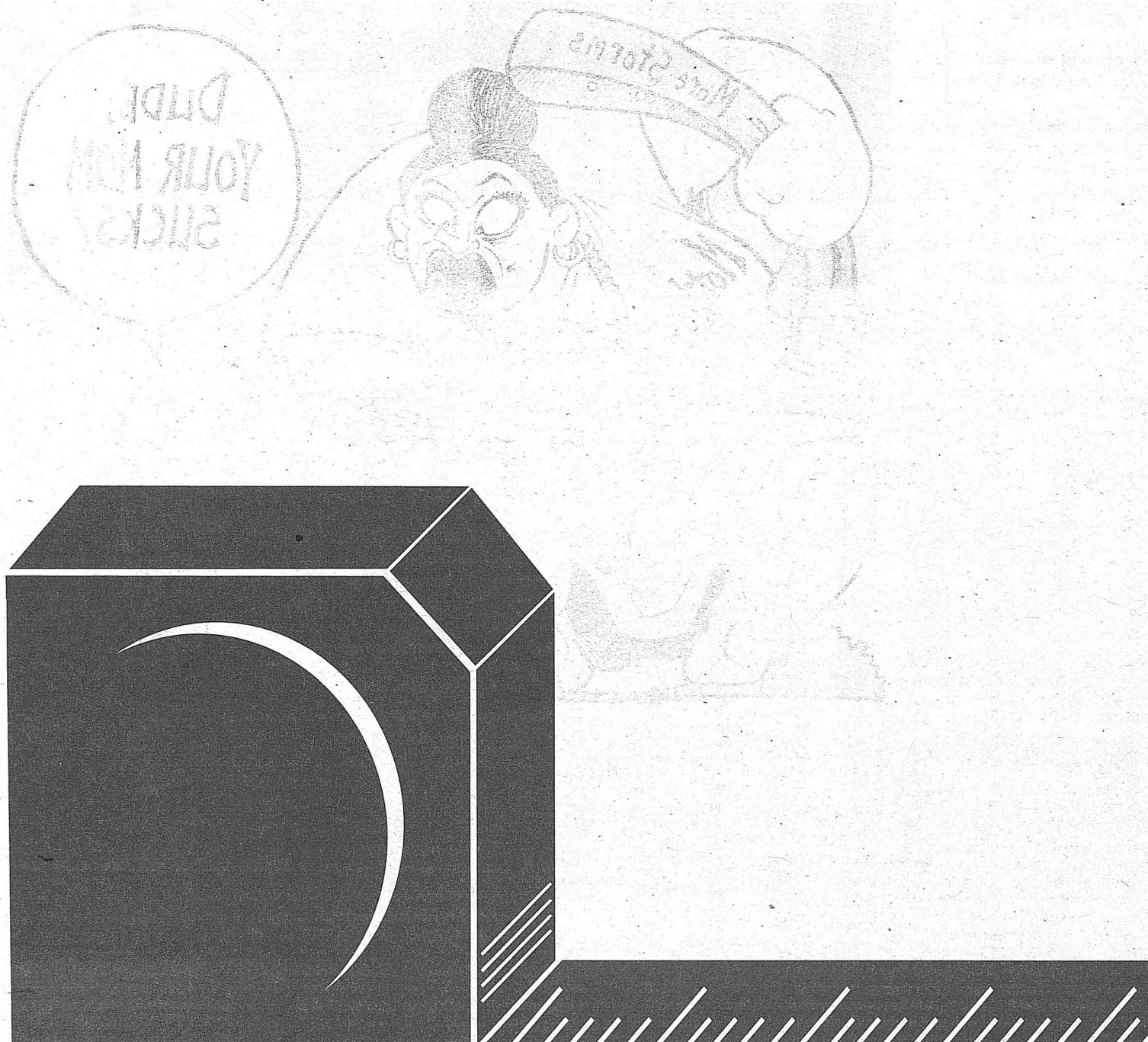
He never explains how the nuclear material is vulnerable when it is inside the reactor fuel bundles, placed inside a pit, covered by 50 tons of concrete and inside a large building. He said, "explosive material plus radioactive material equals dirty bomb."

I say that explosive rhetoric plus ignorance equals shamelessly lying to the American public.

I am deeply saddened that ABC would release such a poor piece of reporting. The truth is that where there exists an economic agenda, there also exists a bias.

I am not saying we should disregard reactor safety, nor am I saying that constant oversight is a bad thing. What I am saying is that the type of journalism ABC seems to support is self-motivated, poorly researched and does nothing but alarm people without just cause.

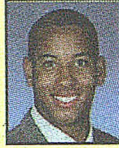
ANOTHER SHOT: Although Urban Meyer and Chris Leak both said his shoulder was fine for the game against LSU, it was revealed on Monday by offensive coordinator Dan Mullen that Leak received another cortisone shot before the game.

"I think he took a shot on Saturday before the game, but he didn't need to, and I kind of told him, 'I don't think you have to, why even bother?'" Mullen said. "He said, 'Well, why not? Just to have it done.'"

Mullen said the trainers said Leak was 100 percent going into the game, but it was done for precautionary measures.

Leak's problems were mostly due to poor mechanics, Mullen said.

"The ones that he threw, if you go watch the tape, you can tell when he planted his feet and threw the ball and you can tell when he kind of didn't plant his feet and was trying to aim it," Mullen said.

the game, but one of his players had another explanation as to why the Gators are making mental mistakes and playing losing football.

"We're trying to build a team right now and we have a couple of people on the boat but not everybody," junior defensive tackle Marcus Thomas. "Once we've got everybody it's going to be something special."

It's more than halfway into the

season, and the Gators are still having the same problems they had a year ago when it comes to team leadership.

Thomas blamed himself and other leaders on the team for not forcing some of the less vocal players to get it together mentally.

"It's frustrating because it's partly me to blame. I should be in their ears," Thomas said. "I've got people back in there trying to be too cool and everything [to yell at other players]. But you're going to see a different team come [our next game against]

Georgia."

What makes it so tough to swallow for many players on the team is that despite an extremely poor outing by Leak and the receivers, the Gators had not one, but two chances late in the game to score a single touchdown and come out victorious.

"We've just got to be disciplined and make sure we ... believe and don't get false starts and not jump offside," Leak said.

"It's just something we have to improve on."

has been frustrated the past two seasons.

Tendonitis slowed him down his freshman year, and when the plan to rest him for 10 weeks at the end of the season didn't help, Richard had to undergo surgery.

Richard rushed his rehab to try and make it back for his sophomore season, but he had limited leg strength and wasn't in optimal shape.

This year, however, it's a different story. For the first

time in his career, Richard was able to participate in summer workouts.

"Chris has seen himself improve and get better," Donovan said. "And I think that is a tribute to him really making some great strides as a person in terms of his work ethic, in terms of competing, in terms of understanding what we want as coaches."

And because Richard has now been able to get the work in, he has the opportunity to step up, contribute and compete for the starting job.

"He's healthy now. He's going into his junior year," Donovan said. "He needs to play and perform and contribute to our team now [that he is an] upperclassman."

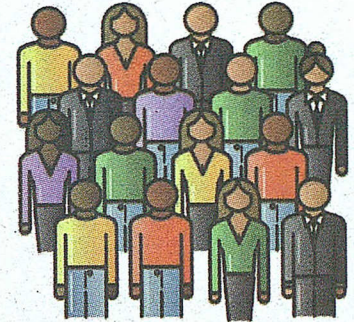

Gators continue to be haunted by mental breakdowns

LATE GAME PENALTIES AGAINST LSU COST UF A CHANCE AT VICTORY.

BATON ROUGE, La. — With just more than four minutes remaining and staring at a 21-17 deficit, the Gators have possession. It's first-and-10 from their own 16-yard line.

Holding on Randy Hand — 5-yard penalty, repeat first down.

After an incomplete pass and a 7-yard run

by Leak it's third-and-13 from UF's own 13-yard line.

Offensive pass interference, Dallas Baker — 7-yard penalty, back to the 6-yard line.

The next play?

Incomplete pass. Punt. Misery.

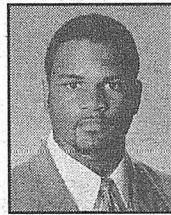
Add another penalty on the Gators' final drive that didn't make it past UF's own 30-yard line and it was a slew of late-game mental breakdowns on Saturday that ultimately doomed the Gators to a possibly catastrophic defeat.

How does that feel?

"It's heartbreaking," junior tailback DeShawn Wynn said. "That [really] slowed

down the drive and the momentum."

Weren't mental mistakes supposed to be a trademark of that other Gators team from a year ago, the one that supposedly didn't think before acting and didn't truly work together as a team?

Yet as Coach Urban Meyer — facing failure and humiliation for the first time in a previously flawless career — searches for answers, he should look no further than this telling statistic: heading into Saturday's game, UF ranked

second-to-last in the Southeastern Conference in penalties.

It just got worse.

Nobody saw this coming, because at Bowling Green and at Utah, Meyer won games by coaching teams that played efficient, smart football.

Meyer spent the entire off-season preaching this very point, and the players seemed to have bought into the system. Careless mistakes simply wouldn't be tolerated.

"It's unacceptable and we have to get better at it," is all a visibly shaken Meyer said after

Richard looks to live up to promise

As the third Mr. Florida Basketball to play for Billy Donovan, Chris Richard has been expected to star for the Gators since he arrived in

Gainesville two years ago.

Two years later, much of those expectations have been left unmet.

While the 6-foot-9, 255-pound junior showed signs of improvement late last year, including a six-point, six-rebound performance against Kentucky

in the Southeastern Conference title game and a career-high four blocks in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, his development has still lagged behind the curb.

This year is make-or-break for Richard, as he has the opportunity to grab the starting power forward position vacated by a graduated David Lee.

"I think I have the drive to do it," Richard said. "I think I'm capable of doing it."

No one really knows what to expect from him this season, but much of his underachieving past can be traced back to lingering knee injuries that have hampered him throughout his first two seasons.

"I don't know if I've babied him or not," Donovan said. "But it probably wasn't fair to evaluate him because he really was injured his first two years."

With the injuries mounting and his performance not where he wanted it to be, Richard couldn't remember the lowest point of his career but admits that the situation was difficult.

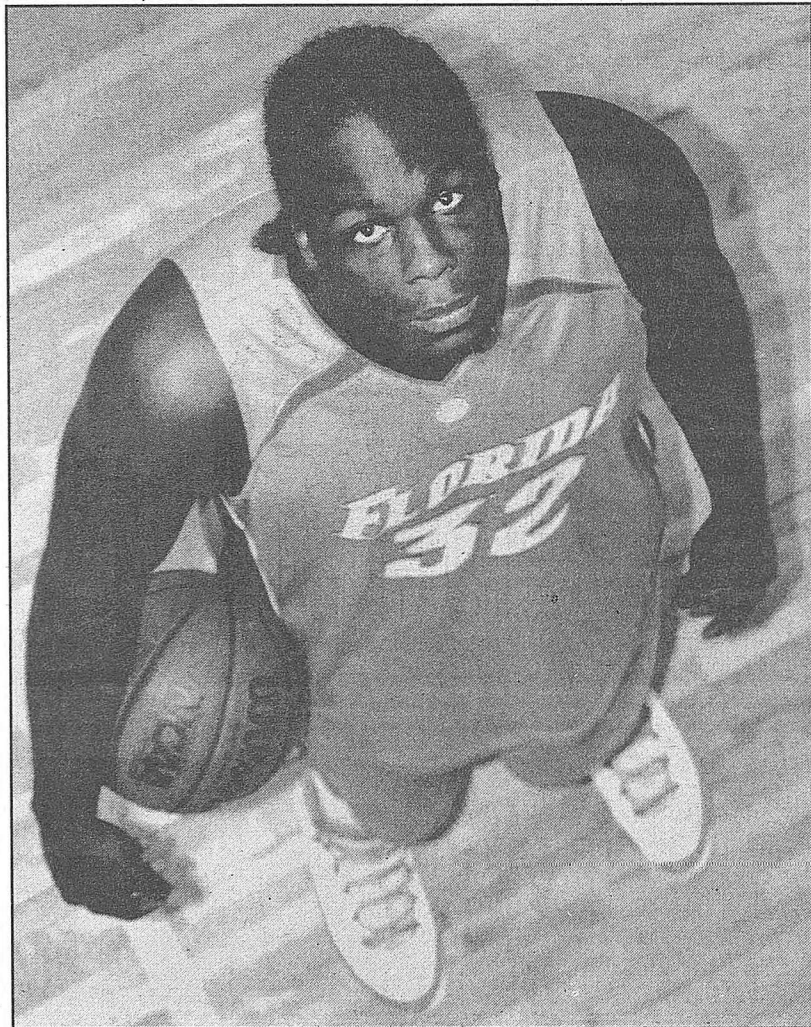
"It got kind of frustrating," Richard said. "But I came through it, and tried to fight through it everyday, talking to my family and praying a lot, so I got through it."

Richard came to Gainesville after starring at Lakeland Kathleen High alongside Rashad Anderson, who went on to play at Connecticut.

Richard averaged 17.3 points and 14 rebounds his senior year, but once he arrived in Gainesville, Donovan had trouble coaching the high school stud.

"Chris, really, to be honest with you, was a very, very difficult guy to coach in his first two years here," Donovan said. "And he has really grown."

Donovan pointed to Richard's injuries as part of the reason that Richard
