MLK events commemorate King, Parks

Local officials sought to make Monday's Martin Luther King Jr. events have a lasting impact on the Gainesville community.

More than 1,000 people participated in Monday's holiday events, during which Commissioner Ed Jennings announced the renaming of Route 301 in remembrance of Rosa Parks.

The stretch of Route 301 between Ocala and Waldo will be named Rosa Parks Memorial Highway, Jennings said. This year's King Week honored the late civil rights icon.

Monday's events began with A National Holiday Kickoff Program on the Downtown Plaza followed by a commemorative march to the location of the National Holiday Birthday Celebration.

"Our focus is not just on the work he did for African Americans, which is, of course, legendary, but the work that he did for every human being,"

Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan said.

The Women's Covenant Group sang various gospel hymns while leading the large crowd east on University Avenue and north on Waldo Road to the Martin Luther King Jr. Multipurpose Center. The march included area churches and service groups.

"It's the least I can do for all that Dr. King stood for and did for our country," said Eric Jewel, a marcher who presided over the celebration.


Jewel has participated in Gainesville's annual commemorative walk for more than 10 years.

"I don't think Dr. King wants us to think about what he thought, but it's about bringing everyone together," Jewel said.

Jennings urged people to take advantage of services offered in the Multipurpose Center, including voter registration, tax preparation assistance and blood pressure monitoring.

Student slaps horse

Slapping a horse in the face was a UF student's response to a spoiled dinner.

Elana Pearl Levin, 22, was standing on a sidewalk downtown near Market Street Pub eating a pizza Saturday before she was arrested for slapping a police horse called Calvery.

Nick Lamberti, who was with Levin, said Calvery pushed Levin, causing her to drop her Five Star pizza on her shirt.

"The cops grabbed her by the hair, she started screaming and they arrested her," Lamberti said. "I saw police

harassing people with their horses."

However, according to the arrest report, officer James Andrew Hinson was attempting to clear a crowd on the street and told Levin to move.

Levin, who declined to comment, told Hinson: "[Expletive] you. I'm eating my pizza," and then slapped Calvery in the muzzle, according to the report.

"Our horses are trained each week so they don't run away or move when someone strikes them," said Gainesville Police spokesman Sgt. Art Adkins. "If it was a normal horse, she could have seriously been injured."

Senate to pick treasurer

Former Student Body Treasurer Lindsay Cosimi is expected to announce three candidates to replace her tonight at the Student Senate meeting.

Although two-thirds of senators must approve one of the nominees for the candidate to hold the position, most senators said that as of Monday night they still did not know who those potential candidates were.

"Obviously, (Student Body) assistant treasurers will be likely candidates," Student Sen. Jared Hernandez said.

Assistant treasurers work with the Student Body treasurer as a liaison between the treasurer's office and the approximately 400 registered student organizations.

Cosimi created the position of assistant treasurer during her tenure, and she appointed

each of the treasurers herself.

"Finance backgrounds are all important (considerations for the job)," Hernandez said.

Although senators could only speculate about possible candidates, they said that they hope that someone with experience will replace Cosimi.

"I hope that they don't put someone totally random," Sen. Pedro Morales said.

Sen. Josh Weiss said he expects Cosimi to bring the candidates to the meeting so senators can question them before voting.

"I am very confident that Lindsay will make good choices," Weiss said.


Student Senate President John Boyles said that Cosimi is expected to turn in her three



UF a no-show at CLO kitchen

The Collegiate Living Organization ate its chocolate éclairs, rosemary potatoes and salmon Friday night, expecting UF officials to arrive shortly and try to close its kitchen.

But UF didn't show.

CLO residents received a letter Thursday stating that their kitchen would be shut down Friday night because it didn't meet university standards.

UF officials believe the building needs about \$500,000 worth of repairs, according to a November 2005 report.

The co-op, low-rent organization holds a trust deed with UF that dates back to 1947.

"I don't think they wanted any type of confrontation," UF spokesman Steve Orlando said of officials. "There was some indication that the people staying at the CLO were not willing to let them in. Nobody wants to go in and have a standoff. It can be worked out other ways. The fact of the matter is the university has the right to be on the property."

CLO public relations officer Sarah Luffman said the kitchen, which has a city of Gainesville approval stamp effective until September 2006, does not present a danger to the nearly 70 CLO residents.

Jessica Behrens, a UF telecommunications junior, said UF's actions have "lit a candle under people's butts."

"I think they have some grounds," she said. "There are serious problems with this building. I had some friends come over, and they said: 'How do you live like this?'"

Since UF came forth Monday detailing CLO building issues, the organization has finished repairing its roof from hurricane season, fixed

Code toughens

■ THE NEW HONOR CODE PROHIBITS STUDENTS FROM USING UNAUTHORIZED STUDY RESOURCES.

UF's new Student Honor Code imposes more restrictions on students.

Previously, the rules comprised one page of Academic Honesty Guidelines and a pledge called the Student Honor Code.

The rules have been extended to five pages and consolidated under the title "Student Honor Code." The old pledge is now a preamble.

New prohibitions include using study resources not expressly authorized by a teacher and recording a class or organizational meeting.

Dean of Students Gene Zdziarski said "organizationally meeting" denotes meetings of academic organizations. A body like Student Senate or Faculty Senate falls under the Florida Government-in-the-Sunshine Laws and may be recorded.

UF Administration

The codes outlaw the submission of academic work obtained from an outside source, unauthorized collaboration with other students, and misleading statements made to procure an academic advantage.

The full document can be viewed by visiting <http://regulations.ufl.edu/> and clicking "6C1-4.017 - The Student Honor Code" under "Archived Notices."

Students found in violation will first face penalization from their teachers. If students do not accept a teacher's penalty, they can have their case heard by the judicial body particular to their college.

The changes originated in the Levin College of Law Honor Committee, composed of two faculty members and several students from the law school.

Zdziarski said the students on the committee believed they were making rules only for the law school, not knowing the university planned to consolidate every college's code into one.

Zdziarski said the Office of Student Affairs was impressed with what the law committee drew up and changed the rules for all of UF.

The university's general counsel then reviewed the changes. The Board of Trustees, UF's highest governing body, passed the new code Dec. 2.

Sandra Chance, a member of the Faculty Senate Steering Committee, expressed concern that no undergraduate students nor faculty had input on the code.

"I wonder if it's not something that the faculty from the university ought to have looked at, discussed and expressed an opinion on," she said at a Nov. 17 Faculty Senate meeting.

Former U.S. ambassador Soderberg to speak Wednesday

Former U.S. Ambassador Nancy Soderberg will deliver a speech at UF titled "The Superpower-Myth: The Use and Misuse of American Might" on Wednesday.

The speech, to be held in the Grand Ballroom of the Reitz Union at 7:30 p.m., will allow Soderberg to discuss her book, of the same title as her speech, as well as her many experiences working in the political arena.

"The book basically reviews the use of force and diplomacy over the past decade," Soderberg said. "The title refers to the idea that since we are the most powerful country on Earth, we do not need the assistance of other nations in protecting ourselves."

Soderberg will also be leading other talks Wednesday titled "Preventing Conflict in Africa" at 11:45 a.m. in Grinter Hall, Room 471, and "Can the U.N. Be Reformed?" at 2 p.m. in Anderson Hall, Room 216. All talks are free and open to the public.

"Students who attend my discussions will be able to learn what it's like to be on the Security Council and to work in the White

House," Soderberg said. "I can offer an insider's perspective on how decisions are made in that forum and how policy-makers struggle with real-life decisions."

But Soderberg never planned to go into politics.

She said she was encouraged to explore a career in politics by an influential professor during graduate school.

"I was at Georgetown University and really had absolutely no idea of what to do," Soderberg said. "My professor, Madeleine Albright, who was the first female secretary of state, suggested that I go into politics. I figured, well, I'm already in Washington; I might as well give it a try."

Soderberg went on to become a senior foreign policy adviser to President Clinton and the third-ranking official at the National Security Council. From 1997 to 2001, she served as a U.S. ambassador to the U.N.

Soderberg has also served as a vice president of the International Crisis Group, which is a nonprofit organization that puts people on the ground in international hotspots in order to better understand the root of conflicts and how to solve them.

She is regularly invited to discuss issues

of foreign policy on NPR, MSNBC, CNN, Fox News and the BBC, but a different media experience was especially memorable for Soderberg.

"There are so many learning experiences out there for students, and I really think that the most important thing a listener can take away from my presentations is a sense that they can make a difference by getting involved."

"On March 1, I was on 'The Daily Show with Jon Stewart,' which was so exciting because I've always been completely addicted to it," Soderberg said. "Jon was nice, funny and smart but definitely shorter than expected."

Soderberg's appearance at UF is sponsored by the UF International Center and the Center for African Studies, the department of

political science and the Transnational and Global Studies Center.

Dean Dennis Jett, who worked with Soderberg on the National Security Council under the Clinton administration and served as dean of the International Center since 2000, said he hopes bringing someone of Soderberg's stature to speak on campus will encourage a discussion of important international issues among students.

"Nancy's book really shows how we as a nation cannot take a unilateral approach to every problem on our own and how important it is to act multilaterally whenever possible," he said. "This is an issue we all need to be concerned about."

Soderberg said she looks forward to speaking at UF, which will give her the opportunity to interact with some of the best and brightest students in the country.

"I really hope to give students a deeper understanding of the challenges facing the U.S. today in an age with terrorism, nonproliferation and humanitarian crisis," Soderberg said. "I also want to show them some of the challenges facing policy-makers in our world and offer insight on why they make the decisions that they do."

Study suggests acai berries may help fight cancer

UF scientists discovered that Brazilian acai berries, native to the Amazon floodplains, have shown an ability to combat cancerous cells in lab tests.

These scientists are beginning to test the berry's effect on human subjects.

Stephen Talcott, an assistant professor in the Food Science & Human Nutrition department, and a team of researchers revealed in a report published Thursday that chemical compounds extracted from the acai berry could battle human-cultured leukemia cells.

Acai berries, which grow on palm trees and have been eaten by indigenous communities for hundreds of years, have been used for pulp in many health drinks, but few researchers had tested the berry's effect on cancer since it became available for use outside of Brazil five years ago.

"We try not to assume that a plant used in food or health drinks has medical use," Talcott said. "In this type of experiment we look for two things. We try to see if the cancerous cells are dying, and we try to see if the cells release an enzyme known as caspase-3."

Caspase-3 is an enzyme released by cancerous cells as they die.

Talcott's team selected five samples from an acai berry and introduced them to a leukemia cell, according to Talcott's summary report of the experiment.

Depending on their concentration, the chemical compounds from the acai berry caused a fatal response in 25 percent to 84 percent of the collected leukemia cells, according to Talcott's report.

But Talcott and his team are hesitant to

say that acai berries can combat or cure cancer in human subjects. Testing on humans began in November, but Talcott will not reveal the results until after the experiments end later this month or in February.

"What we're looking for is whether the test subjects have lower blood pressure or lower cholesterol and whether the berries are absorbed into the blood stream," Talcott said.

If the acai berry study reveals more benefits for human subjects, Talcott and his team may recommend adding them to peoples' diets.

"We're always reluctant to say a fruit can cure or prevent cancer," he said.

and this week as an opportunity for you and your family," Jennings said.

The Kickoff served to award the 2006 Keeper of the Dream Award recipient

Kendra Grimes.

"I challenge the youth today that when they walk into a classroom, sit in the front," Grimes said in her speech. "Don't always run to the back."

The scholarship, awarded by the Martin Luther King Jr. Commission of Florida

Inc., offers \$2,500 to high school seniors who demonstrate work in community and school service, as well as academic achievement.

Grimes, an Eastside High School senior, has a 4.7 GPA and is a candidate for the International Baccalaureate diploma.

"Not all young African Americans are hoodlums, thugs, thieves, cutthroats," Commissioner Rodney Long said. "Not all of our young men are prison-bound."

Long also encouraged audience members to help children in elementary schools learn to read.

"Why is it so uncommon for so many of our African Americans to not make the dean's list now?" asked Long. "We cannot blame anybody for our failures. We are in charge of our own destinies."

The celebration featured speakers, gospel songs and dance groups, including gospel rapper A Major.

Additionally, Saturn of Gainesville selected a winner to receive a new car from a random drawing. Entries were received at Saturday's Empowerment through Education Symposium.




An admirer of Martin Luther King Jr. waves posters while marchers join her in chanting traditional religious songs Monday.

New GPD Web site may shed light on cold cases

The past 11 years have been full of pain for David Gernannt.

The murders of his mother and sister in 1994 continue to haunt him daily because their killer remains on the loose.

Now, the Gainesville Police Department has launched a Web site in the hope someone will come forward to help solve this case and 15 other local murders.

"It would help diminish the thinking about it," Gernannt said. "I would know that something was done, and my mind would be a little more at ease."

Detective Helen Legall, of GPD, believes the same thing, which is why she helped create the site.

"I wanted to get the information out to the community," Legall said. "I'm hoping someone will have a conscience if they're looking at it, and they'll give us a call."

Two years ago, Legall was assigned to review cold cases, or cases that have gone unsolved for more than a year.

Gernannt said the site offers hope for those like him who have been seeking answers for so long.

The 16 cases described on the Web site go as far back as 1974. The details of the cases and pictures of the victims are included.

Some of the cases include that of Norman Fry, 38, whose body was found by his 4-year-old son in 1978.

Also on the site is Robert Landis

Long, 47, who was gunned down in 1987 while walking with his daughter along Northwest 12th Street.

The most recent case on the list is that of John Franklin Porter, 46, who was shot and killed in May 2004. Witnesses had seen him riding his bicycle near Southeast 21st Street.

Many of the cases on the site are close to being solved, Legall said.

"We may just need that one person who saw just a little bit more to give us the probable cause we need to make an arrest," she said.

The case of David Gernannt's mother and sister falls into this category, Legall said.

"There's a very viable suspect in that case, but he's not talking," she said.

Gernannt was hopeful that police had the right person, but there was not enough evidence to take the case to trial, he said.

The victims, Treva Gernannt and Emily Wallace, were found dead in their bedrooms after a fire destroyed the home, Legall said. Gernannt

was found with stab wounds on her neck.

The suspect in the case has a history of arson, and Legall said she is currently working with investigators to determine if the fire was intentional.

"We're just trying to give the families some closure," she said.

Closure is something that Gernannt worries he'll never have.

"Every day there's reminders, and you think about it pretty much all the time," he said. "It eventually gets to a little lesser degree, but it never goes away."

The nature of the crime has been the hardest part to live with through all the years, Gernannt said.

"They were stabbed to death and burned up in their own home," he said. "Even after 11 years, my throat gets tight talking about it; it doesn't matter how long it is."

If the new Web site can help solve the case, Gernannt said it would make life easier.

"Hopefully someone will read about the case and come forward," Gernannt said. "I believe it could still be solved."

Book battle

No student input in enforcement decision

UF officials have announced this semester that they plan to start enforcing a requirement that would force professors to post their list of required texts online.

They promise that the move is in students' best interests, but we're having a tough time making up our minds one way or the other.

Some of the administration's arguments are compelling.

For example, when professors refuse to post their text requirements online, students are at an immediate disadvantage because they can't buy their books until they attend their first class.

Furthermore, professors who give exclusive deals to local bookstores and don't post their book requirements force students to support a monopoly that would not otherwise have existed.

Students will almost certainly pay more for their books because the stores will have no real incentive to keep their prices low.

With professors' exclusive deals also comes the massive potential for abuse.

It is entirely plausible that bookstores would arrange to give professors some kind of under-the-table monetary kickback in exchange for their continued loyalty. The kickbacks would cause the exclusive-deal system to become self-sustaining, with individual students paying for kickbacks in the form of a pricier books.

Without alleging that any specific deals of the sort are taking place, we should recognize that there is an incentive for bookstores and professors to engage in that kind of noncompetitive collusion. A business environment that could lead to such dealings can't be good for students.

But the outcomes of UF's new policy enforcement may not be entirely a boon, either.

While open competition among local bookstores would probably result in lower prices for students and eliminate the potential for illicit kickbacks for professors, it could also result in students having to search around more to find available books.

When professors make exclusive deals with the local stores, the stores have a good idea of how many copies of each text to purchase. With free and open competition, individual stores won't be able to gauge how many books they'll need. The net result could be shortages at some stores and excess inventory at others, meaning that students will have to shop around.

It could also mean an end to small local bookstores if they're unable to compete with larger chains like Follett.

So we take an unambiguously ambiguous stand on the issue. We can't tell which policy would benefit students more because, in the end, it's really a matter of students' personal preferences.

We do, however, have a problem with the provost's office not getting student input. For a topic as multidimensional as this, we think students deserve more than just a tip of the hat and vague promises that the administration is working on our behalf.

We think students deserve real input.

But that doesn't mean we're surprised when they don't get any.

Iran may be next big problem for U.S.

Ever since the election in Iraq last month and the announcement of troop withdrawals, more and more media headlines are hinting at the next big showdown: Iran.

With the number of troops in Iraq expected to decrease, major nests of insurgency to be wiped out and the presence of an Iraqi police force to become increasingly powerful, Iraq isn't as newsworthy as it used to be. Iraq is still a dangerous place, and a national meltdown is possible, but we hear significantly less use of the words "quagmire" and "Vietnam" from commentators.

The insurgency will never be wiped out of the picture completely, but our successes cannot be measured in absolutes. For example, the U.S. military has had immense success training Colombian troops to defeat savage narco-terrorists, but Colombia faces a long road of instability.

Judging by the recent spike in coverage, the media have determined that the next major challenge to peace is Iran and its anti-Semitic, delusional and probably-a-former-terrorist president, Mahmoud Ahmadinejad. At a press conference last week, Ahmadinejad claimed that Iran "does not need nuclear arms," but not even the French are buying it.

America is approaching a situation very similar to that during the events leading up to the war in Iraq, except this time full-scale conflict is almost completely off the table. Both the Americans and the Brits are too exhausted to bluff that more severe steps could be taken. For months, Western nations have been considering and pushing for sanctions.

Ahmadinejad claims the Holocaust was a myth and reportedly believes the apocalypse is only two years away, and his revolution has paved the way for it. He makes

North Korea's Kim Jong Il seem reasonable.

Given his insanity and the United States' reluctance to continue removing crazed leaders in the Middle East, this is multilateralism's time to shine.

For everyone who believed that a diplomatic solution for ousting

Saddam was possible, now is the time to prove you were right.

Unfortunately, despite Ahmadinejad's intentions to wipe little Israel off the map, the United Nations is not considering expelling Iran. Even talk of sanctions is still several steps, and probably at least a month, away.

Israel, meanwhile, knows exactly where Ahmadinejad would point a nuclear missile if he had one. His rhetoric may tip the scales in favor of a hard-line successor to Ariel Sharon in the wake of the current limbo caused by Sharon's massive stroke.

Such a successor could choose to bomb Iran's nuclear facilities and inflame tensions in the region by doing so. America would have little choice but to stand by Israel and further isolate itself against Arabs and Muslims everywhere.

But despite the threat, America likely will steer clear of this mess and avoid a showdown. The confrontation with Iran will take place in the halls of the United Nations and be drawn out for years while Ahmadinejad builds his nuclear program.

If there's any backbone behind multilateralism, we'll know soon — for better or for worse.





Protest aims for apology

Protesters of an editorial cartoon splashed fake blood on the entrance of the Alligator office Saturday, and then picketed for more than two hours along West University Avenue.

Stink bomb booby traps were placed around the doorway and perched on a glued-shut newspaper box.

"When [the Alligator] ran that cartoon, we had presumed it was out of ignorance," said Sheridan Murphy, state executive director for the American Indian Movement.

The cartoon, published Nov. 23, three days before the UF football game against Florida State University, depicted Albert the Alligator strangling a Seminole, the FSU mascot.

"If this paper doesn't have the common human decency to apologize for what it did, then it needs to be destroyed," Murphy said.

About 24 protesters showed up, most of them AIM members. They intended for the mess at the doorway to symbolize the American Indian blood spilled in hate crimes, which protesters said the Alligator cartoon supported.

Alligator Editor Emily Yehle called the Gainesville Police Department after protesters vandalized the property.

One protestor, Nkosazana Shihada, confronted Yehle after the protest.

"I am not a white supremacist," Yehle insisted.

"You stand by white supremacy," Shihada said.

"I do not stand by white supremacy," Yehle said.

Yehle was the Alligator opinions editor last Fall.

Because the Alligator did not respond to letters, and given that the newspaper has offended blacks, Asian Americans and Arab Americans in the past, Murphy said it must be a "National Association for the Advancement of White People paper" or a "Klan paper."


The Alligator printed two letters to the editor criticizing the cartoon Nov. 28. But the protesters demanded a printed apology.

After the protest, Yehle apologized for offending people but added that the real problem may be FSU's mascot.

After more than two hours, the protesters concluded with a millennia-old American Indian ritual. They linked hands in a circle, and Murphy wafted smoke from burning sage over each person. The act, called "smudging," is meant to purify one's spirit.

"I hope this message gets through to the Alligator," Murphy said from the circle's center. "I don't want to come back, because if we come back, we'll come back when there's people in there, and we'll go inside."

ship either directly under the mayor or in any local government department he or she chooses.







Richard's spurt seals UF win

During UF's first week of Southeastern Conference play, junior forward Chris Richard took just three shots and scored 3 points.

And while the No. 2 Gators' young starting five has garnered most of the team's national attention, Richard reminded everyone that he could play on Saturday.

Scoring 7 points during a span of 1 minute, 31 seconds midway through the second half, Richard helped break open a tight game and led the Gators to a 69-57 home victory against Auburn Saturday night.

"I think it's kind of expected out of me to contribute," Richard said. "I haven't been doing that as much as I should be doing the past couple of games."

With the Gators (16-0, 3-0 SEC) holding a 51-47 advantage with less than 10 minutes remaining in the game, Richard converted on a dunk, a jumper in the lane, a free throw and a lay-up to increase the lead to 59-47 with 8:20 remaining.

Auburn (8-6, 0-3 SEC) would only cut the deficit to less than 10 twice throughout the balance of the game. And Richard's contribution was not lost on his teammates.

"Chris Richard was big for us," said Taurean Green, who had a team-high 21 points. "Like I said, he brings a lot of energy coming off the bench, and he doesn't get a lot of credit. But the things he does when he's in the game — rebounds, being physical, getting easy dunks, tip-backs — he just makes good decisions when he's out there."

Richard's play could not have

come at a better time for the Gators, who had their second off-shooting night in a row, converting just 38.9 percent of their shots, including just 7 for 22 from beyond the 3-point line.

With Auburn's zone defense harassing the Gators, the Tigers led for a majority of the first half after falling behind 10-2 during the game's opening minutes.

"We've just got to adjust," said UF center Al Horford, who finished with 14 points and seven rebounds. "We've seen zone before. It's all about ball movement and attacking through the middle, and I feel like as the game went on, we did a better job doing that."

In addition to better offensive production in the second half, the Gators were able to clamp down on defense, allowing the Tigers 10 points during the final 12 minutes.

"It's the last 10 minutes. We had to get stops," Horford said. "We hadn't been getting stops all game, so we just had to make sure that we didn't let them score when we were trying to get a lead."

During the waning minutes, Auburn's apparent lack of stamina sealed the Gators' win. Several UF players said they could tell that the

Tigers were tired.

"You could just see it in their face," Horford said. "When we see they're tired — we're in great shape, so we aren't going to get tired. That's when we go in for the kill."


UF GETS NO.1 VOTE: As it has been all season, Duke ranked No. 1 in The Associated Press college basketball poll Monday. But this week, the Blue Devils weren't a unanimous choice. One of three undefeated teams in Division I, Duke received all but one first-place vote from the 72-member national media panel.

The other No. 1 nod went to the No. 2 Gators after a week in which 11 ranked teams lost, two of them twice. John Kaltefleiter of The Athens (Ga.) Banner-Herald switched his No. 1 vote from Duke to UF.

"I like Florida a lot, and I thought about it over the weekend after I saw quite a bit of the Duke-Clemson game," Kaltefleiter said Monday. "I know the game was in Clemson and Duke won by 10 points, but Clemson gave them fits in some areas. I've seen Florida a lot, and it is something totally different from last year as far as chemistry is concerned."

"There is no big man running the floor right now as well as Joakim Noah, and Lee Humphrey can shoot. He may not be J.J. Redick, but he can shoot. This may be one of Billy Donovan's closest-knit teams as far as chemistry, and I think Duke will lose before they do. Florida was very, very impressive. I thought there would be more people who would switch. I was surprised I was the only one."

Spiller receives raucous welcome at basketball game

■ THE NO. 3 RUNNING BACK MADE HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO UF.

When C.J. Spiller showed up at Saturday's men's basketball game, he expected to blend into the O'Connell Center crowd.

But if Spiller's aim was to remain unnoticed during his official visit to UF, sitting next to his friend, Gators' verbal commitment-turned-instant-celebrity Tim Tebow, was probably not the best idea.

Minutes into the first half, a chant of "We want Spiller" erupted from the student section, alerting the entire arena of the recruit's presence. Soon after, Spiller and Tebow were bombarded by fans looking for autographs.

"I believe it was the first time I have experienced something like that," Spiller said. "You could tell a lot of people kept looking up there because I was with Tebow and stuff."

When the chants grew louder in the second half of the game, Spiller saluted the fans with the chomp, driving the crowd wild.

Spiller and Tebow spent the rest of the game together, eventually sneaking down into the student section to catch the closing minutes.

Tebow, the nation's No. 1 dual-threat quarterback according to Rivals.com, teamed

with Spiller in high school all-star games such as the U.S. Army All-American Bowl and the CaliFlorida Bowl. The future UF quarterback has been actively recruiting Spiller for the Gators.

"[Tebow] is a great player and a great person to be around," Spiller said.

UF takes quad title in Oregon

Despite win, Gators fall to No. 2

The Gators left Oregon victorious on Friday, but a strict panel of judges and a conservative beam performance pushed the team out of the No. 1 spot in the nation.

The Gators' 193.575 was enough to topple the quad meet's three other teams.

Oregon State placed second with 192.2, while Brigham Young took third with 190.075 and Iowa rounded out the meet with 188.05.

Although the Gators' score was lower than the previous meet's national high, UF coach Rhonda Faehn said she was impressed because the team faced a panel of stricter judges accustomed to regional variations.

Staying strong mentally was the most difficult task for the team, especially after the initial round of scores, Faehn said.

And whether it is ignoring scores or blocking out hostile fans, Faehn said that mental strength has been a crucial part of her team's success, especially on Friday.

The Gators captured every event but the floor routine; however, only one UF gymnast, junior Breanne King, placed in the all-around event, capturing third place with a score of 38.35.

King was added to the vault and bars lineups after a particularly impressive week in the gym, Faehn said.

Helping King and the Gators to their strongest event of the meet, senior Sherie Owens picked up her first collegiate uneven bars title.

Still, the win was not enough for UF to hold on to the No. 1 spot.

The team fell to No. 2 and

has been replaced by Alabama, which the Gators will face this Friday.

But the Gators do not view the next match as an NCAA Championships preview or even as a battle to recapture the No. 1 spot.


Faehn stressed at a press conference Monday that the team's focus is on improving the routines, regardless of how its opponent is ranked.

"We really aren't focused on the rankings because they'll change from week to week," she said.

"We're focusing on knowing that Alabama is a very strong program and that we have to go out there and compete aggressively and compete at our very best at this point in the season with our full difficulty and not make any mistakes. That's going to be the real test right there."

The meet in Tuscaloosa, Ala., also could see more lineup changes.

"Very likely — you could see even this weekend — we may not have one all-arounder competing," Faehn said. "It's not that important at this stage of the game. More important is putting the best team out on the floor and the best athlete in each event."

Men swim away with Dallas meet

Even though they fielded only eight competitors, the No. 7 UF's men's swimming and diving team left Dallas on Saturday with a championship.

The Gators finished first at the Dallas Morning News Classic with a score of 342.5, while No. 17 Northwestern took second with 325 points in the six-team meet, which included No. 14 Florida State, No. 19 Notre Dame, Washington and host Southern Methodist.

"It's always a good meet because it has some great races," UF coach Gregg Troy said. "Nobody is ever really out of contention at this competition. Competitions like this are big confidence builders."

UF swimmers Ryan Lochte, Darian Townsend, Bradley Ally, Matt Coan, Brian Hartley, Nick Borreca, Luca DeMatteis and newcomer Lucas Salatta made the trip.

After making his UF debut against Louisiana State Thursday, Salatta traveled to Dallas the next day, where he won the 200-yard individual medley with a time of 1 minute, 48.75 seconds. He also helped UF's 800-freestyle relay team to a first-place time of 6:32.63.

"He is an extremely versatile swimmer," Troy said about Salatta. "He swims a lot like Ryan Lochte and competes in the many of the same events, so he should have an immediate impact on our team."

Lochte, who received the meet's Most Outstanding Swimmer Award, won the most individual titles, including the 200 freestyle, 500 freestyle and was a part of the 800 freestyle relay team and the first-place 200 freestyle relay team.

TOP-RANKED SINGLES PLAYER FALLS: Diana Srebrovic, the No. 1 collegiate women's tennis player in the country, lost in a three-set thriller in the second round of the National Collegiate Tennis Classic on Friday.

Stanford's Whitney Deason, ranked No. 25, upset the

UF sophomore 6-7 (4), 6-1, 7-6 (5). Srebrovic went 17-2 during the fall, losing last on Oct. 16 in the finals of the ITA Southern Regional Championships.

In her first competitive tournament since May 2004, senior Alexis Gordon won the consolation final in Indian Wells, Calif., winning 6-3, 6-3 to claim her fourth career singles title.

Gordon, who lost her first-round match before taking apart the consolation draw, missed the past 21 months due to personal reasons.

TRACK TEAMS OPEN SEASONS WELL: The UF men's and women's track and field teams picked up a combined three victories at the Florida Intercollegiate on Sunday at the O'Connell Center.

In the weight throw, seniors Rachel Longfors, an All-American, and Jyn Wynn both posted NCAA provisional marks.

Longfors passed Wynn on her final throw measuring 19.62 meters. Wynn's best, 19.56 meters, earned her the runner-up spot.

A couple of athletes won their collegiate debuts for the Gators. Shannon Leinert won the 800 meters with a time of 2 minutes, 11.5 seconds.

Jenna Utecht shared her victory in the high jump, equaling the 1.72-meter jump of Central Florida's Ann Larsen.

Senior All-American Sekou Clarke led the men with a first-place finish in the 200 meter, running a career-best indoor time of 21.56 to earn his 18th career win.

Former UF runner and All-American Moise Joseph edged UF junior Steven Hassen in the mile with a time of 4:10.51. Hassen clocked at the finish line with a time of 4:12.29.


