



# Greeks split on endorsements

■ ABOUT 32 OF 44 SWAMP CANDIDATES ARE GREEK.

The house banners are fewer, but the Greek support is just as strong.

Only three days before the Student Government election, just a handful of Greek organizations had placed political support banners outside their houses, but both of this Spring's political parties have strong ties to Greek chapters.

Unlike past SG elections, in which a single party usually contained an overwhelming majority of Greek candidates, both the Swamp and Unite parties' slates have numerous Greek candidates this year.

Of the 44 Student Senate candidates being fielded by the Swamp Party, at least 32 are members of Greek organizations.

The Unite Party, which is running 41 Senate candidates, has at least 15 Greek hopefuls on its ticket.

Student Senate President John Boyles, who is running for Student Body president with Swamp, said the large quantity of Greek candi-

dates on his ticket simply reflects the candidates' ample leadership capacity.

Boyles is not a member of a Greek organization.

He added that to his knowledge, none of the Greek houses had come forth with a public endorsement for his party.

However, as of press time, at least 12 houses displayed Swamp banners.


Several others, including Sigma Phi Epsilon and Delta Gamma, displayed Swamp banners last week but have since taken them down.

"I don't think that affiliation with a Greek organization makes anyone any more or less qualified," Boyles said. "[Our candidates] are the best people."

But one former Swamp supporter said he never had a voice in selecting those people.

Student Sen. Ryan Nelson, who interviewed about 200 candidates for Swamp's senate slate, said he was denied the chance to help make

# Multiple universities witness increase in spamming

Public records laws may add to UF's spam woes, but the university's dilemma isn't unique.

State and federal laws require any public university in Florida to release its students' contact information — sometimes including e-mail addresses — if requested.

About 80 percent of e-mail received at UF is spam. That overwhelming majority is on par with other major universities.

At the University of Georgia, about 75 percent of e-mail received is seen as unwanted, which spam blockers try to delete.

UGA administrators agree that Georgia's open records law may contribute to the

spam count.

UGA Open Records Manager Bob Taylor said the university gives out student and faculty information on a compact disc — purchasable by anyone for \$100.

UF, on the other hand, tells anyone who wants a comprehensive list to go to its online directory.

Federal law says university students can make their "directory information" — including name, phone number, address and e-mail address — private.

Taylor said he sometimes disagrees with the accessibility of student information.

"Is it allowed under the law? Yes," Taylor said of the CD. "Is it an abuse of the law? Yes. For me, [the purpose of] an open records law is for accountability and not for helping someone with his business... They

can print a gazillion labels."

"However," he added, "I do comply with the law."

In addition, all faculty e-mail addresses are given on the CD. Like in Florida, faculty e-mail correspondence is also considered public

information.

"I do get some static from folks, especially faculty and staff," Taylor said. "We're not going to be difficult. We have to allow access. We've tried to streamline this. We just look at it as not being adversarial."

Taylor said Florida's public information law is more broadly defined than Georgia's and is more encompassing.

However, Georgia law requires UGA to produce public information within three days.

"That's like saying that you can't have that First Amendment right," he said of denying the public's right to know. "You have to take the good with the bad. I tell people that get upset with me, 'I feel your pain. If you want to

### Hernandez admits to arrest

Student Body presidential candidate Jared Hernandez, a Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity member who has publicly decried fraternity culture, admitted Friday that he and other Sig Ep brothers were arrested about five years ago.

In April 2001, Hernandez and 40 others were arrested for trespassing at a limestone pit in the Newberry area.

Thirty-seven of the 41 arrested were fraternity members.

Hernandez revealed his arrest in a Unite Party information package presented to the Alligator editorial board Friday.

"I was out with my friends at a location we didn't know was private property," Hernandez said.

He refused to explain the nature of the event, and when asked if he was taken to jail, Hernandez said, "The charges were dropped."

### Group collects jeans to curb unhealthy eating habits



## Students perform for funds

A variety of student organizations united in performance to raise money for an Indian charity Friday night.

The Hindu Students Council held their sixth annual Multicultural Charity Show at the India Cultural and Education Center.

The group raised money for AIM for Seva, a charity that works toward bridging the gap between mainstream society and the rural populations in Indian villages by providing medical and education facilities.

AIM stands for All India Movement; Seva, in Sanskrit, means "service," with connotations of devotion and caring.

A \$5 admission fee was charged at the door, with additional donations requested as well.

Campus groups, such as the Hip Hop Collective and the Chinese American Student Association, performed for about 250 attendees.

"Pretty much we just asked our friends in different organizations," said Prasanna Durairaj, HSC vice president.

Performances ranged from traditional Indian and Chinese dances to poetry, song and modern dance.

The HSC has been working since the beginning of the semester on the event. HSC's goal has been to increase its membership, which has since doubled to 600 active members.

The HSC is planning to host AIM for Seva founder Swami Dayananda Saraswati during its Southeast Regional Conference, which is on March 31 through April 2.

Funds raised by the Multicultural Charity Show will also go toward Saraswati's visit during the conference.

"He is the leading authority in Hindu, and he really couldn't be more perfect to speak to us," said HSC President Ashwini Tankhiwale.

The exact amount raised by the show was unavailable at press time.

HSCs from Florida, Georgia and Alabama universities meet yearly. This will be the first time the conference is being held at UF.

"It's just a weekend where we can get together and learn about Hinduism," Durairaj said. "Our mission statement is to make people aware of Hinduism."

# Poker helps spay, neuter cats

■ THE TEXAS HOLD 'EM GAME RAISED ABOUT \$3,600.

Some play poker for money; others, for fame. But with the help of a dedicated group of Gainesville residents, a simple game of No-Limit Texas Hold 'em can spark a huge difference in the problem of stray cats in Alachua County.

PokerForPets, a volunteer organization devoted to funding local animal rescues, hosts a tournament of No-Limit Texas Hold 'em that benefits different organizations each month.

"People come out to play in our tournaments for a love of animals and for a love of poker," tournament director Iacono Cottrell said.

This month's tournament, held Sunday at the UF Hillel, had 89 participants and raised about \$3,600 for Operation Catnip, a non-profit group that aims to control the problem of stray and feral — or wild — cat populations through sterilization instead of euthanization.

The problem is a growing one, said Julie Levy, a UF associate professor of veterinary medicine and the president of Gainesville's Operation Catnip. There are about 43,000 pet cats in Alachua County and about 36,000 stray and feral cats that are often fed by humans.

"Each year, there are 36,000 stray and feral cats reproducing in Alachua County," said Levy. "We must find ways to increase the number of surgeries we're doing and therefore increase the impact of our program on the community."

The organization relies on Alachua County residents to bring stray felines to a monthly clinic where volunteer veterinarians and vet technicians sterilize more than 100 cats within hours. All cats have the tips of their left ears cropped, which identifies them as sterilized.

The system, called trap-neuter-

return, is essential to addressing the stray cat population without euthanizing, Levy said.

"This way, felines can continue to live out their lives without contributing to the problem," she said.

Usually, unsterilized homeless cats fall into two categories: stray, which are friendly to humans, and feral, which are wild and averse to human interaction and contact, Levy said. Operation Catnip sterilized over 2,700 of these cats last year and aims to raise that number to more than 3,000 this year.

The surgeries cost nothing to

the caretaker but cost the organization about \$25 per cat, which makes fundraisers like Sunday's poker tournament crucial.

At the event, a \$50 buy-in fee entitled players to a seat in the No-Limit Texas Hold 'em poker tournament, \$10,000 in tournament chips and free beer. A prize pool valued at \$1,479.96 awaited the top tournament winners, who also received automatic entry into next month's tournament and the chance to win the season's grand prize — a \$10,000 seat at the 2006 U.S. Poker Championship at the Trump Taj Mahal Casino Resort in Atlantic City.

## Law school to get a new courtroom

The Levin College of Law announced Wednesday a gift of \$2 million to help fund a new advocacy center for the law school.

The donation from Pensacola attorney Fred Levin, for whom the UF law school is named, will go toward the \$5.2 million needed for a state-of-the-art courtroom and will give students the most modern equipment to learn with.

"For the students that will be coming out in trial practice, they will have the opportunity to work with things that they will be working with in the real world," Levin said.

Dean Robert Jerry said the addition will provide students with sophisticated facilities and services.

"Many modern courtrooms have many modern innovations," Jerry said. "We want our students to have practice with those while they are here."

The two-and-a-half story addition will be added onto Bruton-Geer Hall and will feature a grand entry foyer and fully functional trial and appellate courtroom, with a 120-seat gallery and a bench for seven judges.

The addition would be a great asset to the program, Jerry said, noting UF's trial advocacy program is ranked 13 out of the country's approximately 190 programs.

The law school hopes to be able to host on-site, live judicial proceedings, Jerry said.

"Our students could watch the actual argument on site without having to travel," he said. "That could be a very valuable training activity for our students."

But students will not be the only ones benefiting from the center.

"The facility not only helps the students, but it will get top-notch faculty to come in and teach as well," Levin said.

Construction of the new advocacy center is scheduled to begin in May 2007 and should be completed in Fall 2008, Jerry said. It is to be named in honor of Levin's son Martin H. Levin, who is also an alumnus of UF's law school.

On top of Levin's gift of \$2 million, the state's matching grants program will match every dollar given over \$1 million.

With the addition of the advocacy center, there are hopes the law school will receive a boost in national rankings.

"In order to have a great university, you have to have a great law school," Levin said. "This is just another step in that direction."



the final slate selections. Nelson is now a supporter of Unite.

“It killed me,” he said. “I couldn’t understand how someone who interviewed over half our candidates didn’t have a say in our candidates.”

Nelson said that when he asked where Swamp leaders would go to decide on a slate, he was told he wasn’t allowed to know.

Swamp spokesman Josh Weiss said he was unaware if Nelson had been prevented from attending the meeting.

“As far as I know, I never heard anyone say that to him,” he said. “He definitely did help interview a lot of candidates.”

Weiss said he was attending a Senate meeting when Swamp’s slate was finalized, so he could not com-

ment on who was in attendance.

Nelson, a former president of Phi Sigma Kappa Fraternity, said neither John Boyles nor the Greek system is controlling SG.

“After a long time in that system, it begins to wear on your nerves,” he said. “The system everyone refers to, in reality, isn’t just Greek. It includes the greater black community and a lot of the cultural communities.”

Nelson emphasized that although he publicly supports Unite, he did not leave Swamp because of qualms with Boyles.

“I legitimately don’t like painting Swamp as these evil conspirators,” he said. “It is not John I’m against.”

Instead, Nelson said, he opposes the “system” that promises SG positions before an election takes place.

“Thursday morning, I came out and donned a red (Unite) shirt,” he said. “Now, my brothers are wearing Unite shirts with me.”



## Two wrongs Presidential tickets look to be a wash

In many past Student Government elections, there was a single party that we felt we could wholeheartedly support. Candidates had clear differences on the direction they wanted to take the university. Parties had distinct platforms with real differences. The entire university seemed to be wrapped up in a political fervor.

This time, our job wasn't so easy. The executive candidates seem to be working off each other's talking points. It can be difficult just to tell the parties apart.

The only contender for the SG executive branch that really wowed us was Susan Henriques for treasurer. Running as an independent, it's clear that Henriques' experience with budgeting and SG finance trumps anything that her opponents could come up with.

Henriques has earned our full support and endorsement.

The rest of the ticket was more difficult to decide. But after careful consideration, we have decided to throw our support behind the Unite Party's senatorial candidates. Their platform appears to be marginally more feasible than Swamp's, though that's not saying much.

But as for the presidential and vice presidential races, we endorse no one.

Because despite all of Unite's posturing about "the end of politics as usual," we see a lot more of the same. As a student senator and Unite presidential candidate, Jared Hernandez saw his share of shady dealings. Over the summer, the former Interfraternity Council president opposed the institution of true online voting, a measure he now enthusiastically supports. Last semester, Hernandez also used student funds to pay for a private pig roast off campus, though he later admitted that he was wrong to do so.

Hernandez's running mate, UF football linebacker Brandon Siler, is a welcome addition to the ticket. We have been concerned about potential time conflicts with football during the Fall, but we now think he can handle it. And the linebacker is surprisingly well spoken about what he wants to do with the SG Cabinet — like cutting positions to decrease its size.

Yet we have to admit that having Siler on the ticket looks a bit like a publicity stunt. After all, Siler has little to no experience with SG, although this could be an asset when dealing with the Cabinet.

Swamp has its own set of problems. On the face of it, presidential candidate John Boyles looks like a great pick.

But Boyles has been in the game for a long time. And while he isn't in a fraternity, he sits atop a largely Greek-backed party — all eleven of Swamp's undergraduate senators come from fraternities and sororities. Although Boyles claims to want to change the climate within SG to be more inclusive, it's uncertain whether he'll be able to do so once in office.

Lydia Washington, Swamp's vice presidential candidate, boasts much more cabinet experience than her opponent Brandon Siler, but other than that, we don't know much about her. She also professed to want to roll back the Cabinet, though that may prove difficult if she's already associated with Cabinet leaders.

Both of the presidential tickets have serious flaws. Unite's Jared Hernandez has a great deal of historical ties to special interests. So does John Boyles. The vice presidential candidates, Siler and Washington, are probably only of secondary importance.

And we just can't shake the feeling that a vote for either ticket is a vote for the status quo.

So for treasurer, vote for Susan Henriques. For senate, vote for Unite. But for president and vice president, flip a coin.

## SG needs to restore trust in leaders

In fiery oratorical theatrics, he promises to be more representative of the student body to better serve our constituent interests. However, his platform promises are eerily identical to those of John

Boyles. This article isn't meant to condemn or uplift such promises, but merely to point out the fact that every candidate in the past decade has made such pledges verbatim.

The disheartening fact is that though Jared Hernandez can give no concrete assurances as to his ability to implement change, his opponent, John Boyles, does not even acknowledge the problems present in our current state of political affairs.

Boyles wishes instead to work within the system through a process of slow and steady change. Such efforts are doomed to failure, and their proposal is not encouraging. It smacks of naiveté at best and insincerity at worst.

Radical reform is needed, but a prerequisite for that is a revival of confidence in student politics and its ability to deliver change.

I do not wish to hear more bombastic and unattainable campaign promises or recitals of formulaic resumes. Such delusional claims and previously held offices do not impress me. Furthermore, I resent the unabashedly shameless self-aggrandizement that characterizes our prevailing student political atmosphere.

I am here instead to ask you for an honest, realistic and heartfelt written response explaining what differentiates you from our sordid political past. Only an extremely persuasive response will carry any force, but without such a response, student civic participation will be forever condemned to its current exile from the realm of significant discourse.

Months later, I now look back at that night and realize that Thoreau was correct in saying "Power corrupts."


Senate President Boyles has lusted after the SG presidency and has sold his soul to get it.



change the law, go to Atlanta and become a lobbyist."

Closer to home, Florida State University has seen a 10 percent increase in spam since October 2005. About 75 percent of e-mail coming into its systems is considered spam.

Director of University Computing Services Mike Barker said spam increases seem to be the trend among universities nationwide.

"It's a continually evolving thing, trying to outsmart the spammers," he said.

"It does require baby-sitting," he added.

FSU recently changed its

policy, requiring a username and password to access student "directory information" online. Barker said this decision had nothing to do with spam problems.

The university experienced a 25 percent increase in total e-mail volume since October 2005, from 750,000 to 1.1 million.

UF, which does not require a login to access student information, has experienced a fourfold increase in unwanted e-mail over the last 18 months.

Like UF, FSU employs one full-time employee to oversee its student e-mail accounts.

Some speculate that

"bots" from spammers control other computers with fast Internet connections, Barker said.

FSU is connected to the UF-monitored Florida LambdaRail, a statewide fiber-optic network linking 10 state universities to the Internet and each others' research databases.

One university's computing issues, including slowdown due to excess spam, can affect the others, but Barker said he isn't concerned because of FSU's firewalls.

Despite any potential slowdown, the network is ideal because it offers a low-cost option for FSU, which, he said, "moves data at an unprecedented rate."



# Graphic novelists speak at comics conference

Scholars from across the world came to Gainesville this weekend to discuss the literary importance of overlooked comic books and children's books such as "The Cat in the Hat" and "Calvin and Hobbes."

The three-day-long fourth annual UF Conference on Comics addressed the issue of childhood and comics — giving validation of comics and animation as a concrete form of literature.

Molly Bang, an award-winning author of children's books, kicked off the event with her hour-long keynote, "Exploring Comics," to an audience of about 50 at the Alachua County District Library Headquarters on Thursday.

"We use comics to show life, death and life again," Bang said.

Bang provided an overview of comics as a

narrative art while also dissecting the strengths and weaknesses of two of her works, "Goose" and "Nobody Particular: One Woman's Fight to Save the Bays."

Many elements make comics a powerful avenue for expressing emotion, she said. The illustrations strip passions to their most basic elements, making them more robust than the printed word alone.

Sibet Grantham, a retired first grade teacher, said Bang and the conference's emphasis on childhood helped her better understand the artistic merit of comic books.

"I just never understood comics," Grantham said. "I guess I used to have a prejudice."

Grantham, who now provides support for terminally ill children in the last six weeks of

their life through a Shands at UF palliative medicine program, said Bang influenced her to share comics with the children.

"You'd think MTV is what they want, but they want substance," Grantham said.

Friday, the second day of the conference, was wracked with excitement and disappointment.

Philip Nel — dressed in a blue shirt and mustard-yellow, polka-dot tie — gave a speech titled "Annotated Anarchy: Under the Hats of Seuss and his Cats."

"Seuss is one of the best-selling authors in the world, but he isn't taken seriously," Nel said. "It's seen as educational material and not a literary work."

Unfortunately, guests were met at the door of Smathers Library on Friday night to

be informed keynote speaker Bill Willingham would no longer be attending.

Willingham's graphic novel, "Fables," incorporates childhood characters into a modern-day setting. The comic serves as an example of a work that blends childhood elements with adult themes.


"It's incredibly disappointing," conference coordinator Laurie Taylor said of his absence. "Fables" is huge with the uber-nerdy comic crowd and with non-comic readers."

Several panels at the Headquarters Library spanned Saturday, the third and final day of the conference.

The main event Saturday came from Nate Powell, who gave a live performance of scenes from his work. It was the most entertaining performance of the conference, coordinator Cathlena Martin said.

"For one scene, he laid on the table curled up with a pillow on his side," Martin said. "It was hilarious."

# Students decide fate of SG Internet voting this week

After years of controversy, students — not Student Government officials — will finally decide the future of Internet voting during this week's SG election.

Students will vote Tuesday and Wednesday on an initiative that will include Internet voting as an option for the Fall SG election.

Internet voting will allow students to vote from any computer connected to the Internet by using their GatorLink username and password.

"I am very excited," said Susan Henriques, independent candidate for Student Body treasurer, who wrote the initiative and worked to put it on the ballot. "I feel that it is going to pass."

Initiatives, if approved, become SG law.

A year ago, the Impact and Progress parties tried to put a similar initiative on the ballot, but the SG Supreme Court blocked them because the initiative was improv-

erly written.

Last Summer, a temporary committee researched whether Internet or intranet voting — voting from designated computers on campus — would be more secure.

The security of Internet voting has been an issue for about five years. In recent years, various SG committees have been created to research the feasibility of Internet voting.

The Summer committee recommended using intranet voting and deemed Internet voting insecure because, in the committee's opinion, it could be more susceptible to fraud.

After the committee's findings, Henriques, then a student senator, wrote an amendment to allow Internet voting, but the Student Senate blocked it.

As a result of the committee's findings, during the Fall election intranet voting debuted with widespread glitches, including lack of available computers and students

voting for incorrect candidates.

However, the voter turnout during that election increased by about 2,000 voters.

"[Intranet voting] was a step in the right direction," Henriques said. "It was helpful — but not what the students want."

Under the current system, the SG supervisor of elections can select one of three ways for students to cast a ballot: paper ballots, electronic voting and intranet voting — none of which allow students to vote from home.

Supervisor of Elections Erika Kane said she would be happy to have the option to use Internet voting, but she would not use it if she were re-nominated to hold her position again in the Fall.

"[Internet voting] takes away from the security of the polling locations where you are by yourself," she said.

Kane said in her opinion, Internet voting was not secure enough.

"Yeah, you are not allowed to (share your GatorLink username and password), but people do," she said.

However, Henriques said the initiative also allows the supervisor of elections to choose one polling location on campus where students can cast their votes.

Adam Roberts, Unite Party leader, and Amanda Kane, the Unite spokeswoman, both helped write the Internet voting initiative.

"This is an issue important for the students," Roberts said. "And it was brought straight to them."

Although Unite is advocating online voting in its platform, Roberts

said the initiative is nonpartisan.

Henriques said she appreciates Unite endorsing the issue in its platform so that more students get to hear about it.

"As long as [the initiative] passes, I don't care who endorses it as long as the students get to vote and decide on the issue," Henriques said.

Swamp Party spokesman Josh Weiss said his party does not have an official stand, but it will support whatever the students decide Tuesday and Wednesday.

# Gators struggle at plate in shutout loss to Wake

## ■ NO. 1 UF DROPPED TWO DURING A THREE-GAME TOURNAMENT AT HOME.

The Gators' bats, their pre-season strength, their high-powered weapons that drove in 40 runs in three games during opening weekend, all went AWOL Sunday.

The No. 1, but not for long, UF baseball team (8-3) fell to unranked Wake Forest 4-0 and was out-hit almost three to one in its third and final game of the 2006 Pepsi Baseball Classic.

The tournament was an overall disappointment for the host Gators, as they were hammered 14-5 by Missouri on Friday before their loss to the Demon Deacons.

UF defeated Ohio State 10-3 on Saturday to prevent its first three-game losing skid since May.

"Our approach [from the plate] just hasn't been what it needs to be," junior shortstop Adam Davis said. "We need to just do the little things right. ... We have some guys who are trying to do too much."

Missouri's All-American ace Max Scherzer surprised no one in frustrating UF at the plate Friday, but a complete-game shutout by Wake Forest's Charlie Mellies was a bit more unexpected.

"I think [Mellies] pitched extremely well, but we've got to swing the bats better," UF coach Pat McMahon said. "The work effort is there, but we've got to put

the ball in play."

On Sunday, the Gators simply struggled to build momentum at the plate.

Brian LeClerc singled in the seventh inning to end a 0-for-9 UF drought from the plate.

The crowd awoke, the "charge" chant blasted from the loudspeakers and Gavin Dickey promptly hit into a double play.

In the eighth, the Gators placed runners on first and second after

a fielding blooper that saw the Demon Deacons' shortstop and second baseman attempt to simultaneously tag UF's Austin Pride at second.

Again, UF came up empty as Chris Petrie struck out and Pride was caught attempting to reach third base.

And Sunday wasn't an anomaly. After starting off with a .333 team batting average in opening-weekend play against Cincinnati,

the Gators have slumped by a hundred points down to .233 in the following games.

Power from the plate has also waned sharply, with UF picking up more home runs in its first three games of the season than in the last eight combined.

"[Struggling at the plate] is really frustrating, but it gives the guys a reason to come back out the next day," Davis said. "It makes you want to gain the respect back

that we've earned.

"It encourages us to get back out here and get a win the next day."

Reigning NCAA home-run leader Matt LaPorta's absence from the lineup due to an injured rib cage seems an obvious explanation for the Gators' offensive woes, but Davis isn't buying it.

"Obviously it's hard ... but that shouldn't be a factor," he said. "When a guy comes out of the lineup, that's a guy on the bench's chance to come up and do his thing."

McMahon said LaPorta was still day-to-day and would not speculate on his possible return for Tuesday night's showdown with visiting Florida State.


**PITCHER'S MOUND MERRY-GO-ROUND:** The Gators fielded five pitchers Sunday to Wake Forest's one.

"I'm so proud of the effort this team put in over the weekend," Briles-Hinton said. "They really grew a lot throughout this tournament. They got some quality experience and went head-to-head with some of the top teams in the nation."

The Gators will try to utilize that experience when they compete at the University Golf Course at the Lady Gator Invitational beginning March 11.

### Women suffer season's first loss

It was just the ninth loss in five seasons for UF coach Roland Thornqvist (106-9), a North Carolina alumnus and former Tarheels coach from 1999-2001.

The near-freezing temperatures forced the matches inside, where the Gators are not as accustomed to playing.

The clinching match for the Tarheels came against UF sophomore Diana Srebrovic, the reigning ITA National Indoor Singles Champion.


Srebrovic was bumped to No. 2 in the lineup partly because of recent inconsistent play and partly due to the dominating play of teammate Alexis Gordon.

The Gators made strides in doubles last week but returned to their previously shaky play on Sunday.

Benik and Gordon never could get in rhythm, falling 8-4 in No. 1 doubles.

Freshman Keri Robison and Suvak lost their No. 3 doubles match 8-5 to clinch the doubles point for the Tar Heels.

Only Srebrovic and Frangulyan were able to salvage a doubles win for the Gators, winning their match 8-6.

# Zick busts out of slump

THE UF JUNIOR SET A SCHOOL RECORD WITH SEVEN RBI.

If Melissa Zick was in a slump, nobody would have known it from her performance this weekend.

Zick set a school and NFCA Leadoff classic record with seven RBI in an 11-, nine-inning win against Illinois on Friday afternoon.

Before that, the UF junior first baseman, who was second on the team in batting average and RBI last year, was hitting just over .250 and ranked fifth on the team in RBI.

Leading off the bottom of the seventh inning, UF senior catcher Kristen Butler hit her team-leading eighth home run to bring the Gators within one. Zick then singled for her fourth hit. She would later steal second and then take third off a groundout by junior Lauren Roussell. Junior Lacy Howard then drilled the game-tying hit down the left field line to tie the game.

After a scoreless eighth inning, Illinois managed to scrape a run in the top of the ninth. To start off the bottom of the ninth,

UF freshman Kim Waleszonia took second base due to international tie-breaker rules. After senior Lindsey Cameron reached on a base hit to advance Waleszonia, a Butler sacrifice fly scored her, tying the game at 10-10. Illinois then walked Zick, and UF's hopes rested on Roussell. She responded with a hit to right field, scoring Cameron for the winning run.

Later, UF extended its four-game winning streak, defeating Florida Atlantic 9-1.

While the Gators had struggled to score runs in early innings thus far, that was not an issue this game.

UF plated seven runs in the first inning alone. Four of which came from the improving bat of freshman third baseman Brooke Johnson, who hit her first career home run in style with a grand slam.

Those runs would be all UF pitcher Stacey Stevens would need. The junior threw a complete game while not giving up an earned run with nine strikeouts.

But the Gators could not try to continue their winning streak, as the remaining games were cancelled due to rain.



# Morrison puts on show at SEC meet

When UF junior Mike Morrison was asked to describe his previous experiences at the Southeastern Conference Indoor Championships, he simply responded, "plagued."

But when asked to describe his experience at this weekend's conference meet, his word of choice was "focused."

The 10-time All-American showed he had good reason to feel that way.

During the weekend, Morrison defended his SEC title in the high jump and earned a championship in the long jump, a title that eluded him in last year's SEC meet.

He became the first athlete in 36 years to win both jump events at the meet, as the No. 12 UF men's team took third at the O'Connell Center. No. 1 Arkansas won the meet.

Morrison, who finished the meet with 22 points, also took home the SEC Commissioner's Trophy, awarded to the athlete with the most points in the meet.

"I knew I was going to come in here and win my two events," Morrison said. "Hopefully, I can come back next year and try and defend both titles."

Morrison set a personal record in the high jump with a

jump of 7 feet, 5 ¼ inches and helped the 400-meter relay team finish second.

The only event in which Morrison competed that he didn't excel was the 55-meter dash, where he failed to qualify for the finals. In the long jump, he hit a mark of 25 feet, 9 ¼ inches, one-half inch better than the second-place finisher.

"He's a junior, and he's been through a few of these now," UF field coach Dan Pfaff said. "He executed very well today. When you come in and win the Commissioner's Trophy, it is a pretty special accomplishment."


The men's team finished with 100 points, including eight hard-earned points from senior Shane Stroup, who nearly won the mile run in an exciting final lap dash.

"I was very pleased with our ability to show up and compete in a big meet," UF men's coach Mike Holloway said. "I was very pleased Mike could win the Commissioner's Trophy. Mike's an electric performer."

Senior All-American Rachel Longfors, who finished second in the weight throw, led the UF women's team. The distance medley team added 8 points after finishing second.

"Given the circumstances, I'd say our kids competed well," UF women's coach Tom Jones said. "We had a great performance by our weight throwers, and our distance medley relay team ran well."



## 'Bama loss marks UF's third straight

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Capping the Southeastern Conference's throwback week on Sunday, the Gators might want to run their circa-1970 jerseys through a shredder and burn the remains.

After suffering losses to Arkansas last weekend and Tennessee on Wednesday, UF left Alabama with its first three-game losing streak since 2003, and the Gators are 5-6 since starting the season on a school-record 17-game winning streak.

Alabama (16-10, 9-5 SEC) had five scorers in double figures and never trailed while keeping No. 12 UF (22-6, 8-6 SEC) at bay through a series of second-half runs to come out with an 82-77 victory at home.

"Teams are just playing us different," sophomore Corey Brewer said. "They're throwing different things at us. We've just got to adjust. It's getting late. It's get-

ting real late, so we've got to learn quick."

UF remains tied with Kentucky for second place in the SEC East, and the season's final two games against the Wildcats and Georgia will determine whether the Gators will be able to secure a first-round bye in the conference tournament.

The Gators found themselves trailing from the opening tip, falling behind by 11 at three separate occasions during the first half and as many as 12 in the second.


UF closed the gap to 3 points on three different occasions during the second half and trailed by 4 at 75-71 with 1 minute, 17 seconds remaining after guard Lee Humphrey, who started for the first time since Jan. 28, connected his fifth 3-pointer of the half.

But the Gators wouldn't get the ball back for almost a minute.

Alabama forward Jean Felix missed the second of two free throws with 1 minute, 1 second remaining, but UF forward Joakim Noah fumbled the rebound out of bounds.

The Crimson Tide's ensuing possession resulted in more free

throws, but Alabama grabbed another offensive rebound — one of 14 in the game — after a miss and called a timeout.

Alabama point guard Ronald Steele then hit two foul shots to give the Crimson Tide a 78-71 lead and effectively put the game out of reach.

"We've been getting outrebounded every game, it seems like," Brewer said. "We've got to get tougher."

After seeming unable to hit anything in the first half, the Gators' offense awoke in the second.

UF shot 57.7 percent after intermission as opposed to 25.7 percent in the first half.

"We finally got our offense where

it needed to be, but defensively we just broke down in every aspect of the game," Brewer said. "They rebounded the ball, and they made shots."

But every time the Gators were able to make a run, Alabama was right there to answer.

The Crimson Tide were able to hold off UF's repeated runs despite scoring just one basket, a Felix 3-pointer to take a 72-64 lead, outside of the paint the entire second half.

And despite their best second-half offensive efforts this season, the Gators came up on the short end yet again.

"We hate losing. Everybody on our team hates losing," Taurean Green said. "We've just got to learn from this game, watch film, learn from it and move on to Georgia."

Was it under the Knoxville basket where Corey Brewer sprained his ankle?


Was it in Renaldo Balkman's hair? Was it in Dane Bradshaw's '70s 'do, or was it in his stickum hands?
