UF in Top 10 for patents

UF patented 64 inventions last year, making it the university with the seventh highest number of patents issued in 2005.

Among those inventions are a better refrigerator, a germ-proof grapevine and a road signal that warns drivers of upcoming traffic.

Patents earn UF millions of dollars in royalties, which range from 5 percent to 20 percent of the revenue an invention generates.

UF Academics Last year, licensed products brought in \$40 million. That number grows each year as UF accumulates more patented inventions.

Patents also advertise the university to corporations that buy UF's products — corporate partnerships are important to UF research.

Most UF inventions are medical devices and treatments devised by the College of Medicine, but other colleges contribute as well, said Jane Muir, associate director of the UF Office of Technology Licensing.

One invention patented in 2005 is a system that makes refrigerators and freezers more efficient by minimizing frost buildup on their coils.

To do so, it absorbs and traps airborne water molecules before they become frost.

Another innovation employs a series of sensors, measuring position and velocity, to be placed at intervals on

Cho takes on homosexuality

From re-enactments of events in her life to jokes about her mother and the Bush administration, Margaret Cho left to a standing ovation of more than 6,000 people Tuesday night.

Clad in a blue paisley skirt, leopard print leggings, black stilettos and a red-and-white striped shirt,

Cho entertained the crowd at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center as a part of Pride Awareness Month. Longtime friend and standup comedian Bruce Daniels opened for her.

Accent, Student Government speakers bureau, and Pride Student Union paid about \$26,000 to bring Cho to UF.

Cho performed new material and old material from her "I'm the

One That I Want" show, which discusses her personal struggles with self-acceptance.

Cho recreated her mother's long phone messages after her coming out as a bisexual in a stereotypical accent, saying, "Why don't you talk to mammy, they have gay all over the world, they have gay all over the world — but not Korean."

1980s saw sexual heat in bathrooms, fire in hall

Editor's note: This is the eighth in a series of stories commemorating the Independent Florida Alligator's 100th year of publication. The following covers UF events from 1980 to 1989. A new decade will be featured every Wednesday.

The decade of decadence wasn't so glorious at times for UF.

A series of stories that ran in the Independent Florida Alligator exposing sex in campus bathrooms created a concern for university administrators.

In 1989, the university did what it could to plug "glory holes" in campus bathrooms.

The holes, which were drilled into stall walls, were reportedly used by gay men for anonymous anal

and oral sex.

Joanne Auth, a UF health educator at the time, stressed in the Feb. 21, 1989 edition of the Alligator that irresponsible sexual behavior by anyone of any



sexual orientation could lead to serious risks.

"I encourage officials to fill the holes and do

whatever else to see that there is no message that this behavior is condoned by the task force," she said.

As promiscuous behavior by all orientations increased, so did cases of AIDS, which grew 25 percent faster in Alachua County compared to AIDS growth in the state of Florida.


The number of reported cases more than doubled from 24 in 1987 to 53 in 1989.

Hard times also struck Dec. 6, 1987, when 75-year-old Johnson Hall burned to the ground in a grease fire.

The hall, at the corner of Fletcher Drive and Union



UF opens the doors of Disability Resource Center

Students' vision now a reality

The determination of four UF students turned a dream into reality Tuesday as UF celebrated the grand opening of its Disability Resource Center, which provides learning accommodations to students with disabilities.

The center held a ribbon-cutting ceremony before opening its doors to students and faculty interested in touring the facility, learning about its accommodations and viewing its amenities.

Gene Zdziarski, dean of students, attended the ceremony and said it was great to see a campus community coming together to make something happen.

"The Disability Resource Center marks a major step forward in being able to provide accommodated services for any UF student with disabilities," Zdziarski said. "UF now has one of the true state-of-the-art facilities in the country for students with disabilities."

Bethany Stevens was one of the four students that originally began working toward the development of an accommodated testing center for students with disabilities. Stevens started a campaign in Fall 2003 and collected approximately 2,000 signatures in support of the building. She said it was rewarding to see the center after all of her hard work.

"It's beautiful, I mean, I feel alive," Stevens said. "We've made a hell of a center."

The center provides services such as one-on-one counseling, technology training, testing accommodations, sign language interpreters, time management skills, course substitutions and note-taking services, said James R. Faubel, learning specialist at the Disability Resource Center.

Stevens said students will benefit from a resource center that is centralized and provides quiet and separate testing spaces. Students used to shuffle around campus and ended up testing in dorm basements, but the Disability Resource Center prevents testing environments like that, she said.

"We dared to dream and look outside the box," Stevens said.

The center helps students understand available services and gives them the opportunity to receive

classroom accommodations that they need, said Valerie Pfister, learning specialist at the center.

"Our job is to let them know that registering at the center will help them," she said.

Susan Swiderski, learning specialist at the center, said the grand opening could not have gone better. She said she was also pleased that UF President Bernie Machen was able to attend the open house and ceremony.

"It was a big success," Swiderski said.

John Denny, director of the Disability Resource Center, said over 1,300 students are active and eligible for learning accommodations. He said 177 students at the center applied for graduation in May and that they are expecting

59 incoming freshmen for the 2006-2007 school year.

"I feel fortunate to be a part of this," Denny said. "And to think this started from a small group of students. It really was a student-driven effort."

The Dean of Students, Student Government, Division of Housing and Residence Education, the Office of the Provost and the Americans With Disabilities Act Compliance Office were also large assets to the center's success, Denny said.

"UF has had a big year in 2006," he said. "We celebrated our first 100 years in Gainesville, won the NCAA championship for men's basketball, and now we have a Disability Resource Center."

Problems cloud first day of football ticket registration

Ben Porras picked up the phone and dialed again. He knew the number by heart now — he had dialed it 15 times before he finally got through.

He entered his information. The automated system accepted it, and he was registered for the lottery. He was one of the lucky ones.

About 1,300 students registered for the Gators football lottery and paid for their tickets Monday evening, but there were some students who weren't able to register.

High call volume, student ID numbers not working and busy signals prohibited some students from being able to register, swamped the ticket office with calls and sent employees scrambling to fix problems.

Eric Reinke, a ticket office intern, said the system rejected some students' ID numbers because students entered their ID num-

bers incorrectly or the University Athletic Association didn't have accurate account information on file.

"We've had people holding for us since 8:30 a.m.," Reinke said Tuesday at 10:30 a.m. "We're trying to solve everyone's problems today."

Porras, 22, said this was the first year he didn't have to wait on the phone for hours, but he's upset about the increase of ticket prices.

"It's ridiculously horrible," he said. "They hit us with this double whammy. They've hit us with time-consuming ticket ordering and then raised prices."

Students at Florida State University get their tickets for free, he said. He thought the \$42 price tag for tickets last year was acceptable, but he thinks \$70 is too much.

"I'd just like to know where the extra money is going," Porras said. "How is it going to benefit the school?"

Reinke said several factors caused the price

increase.

"Prices were raised across the board," he said. "Every couple of years, prices raise due to inflation and increased costs to the athletic association."

Students have enjoyed \$7 tickets per game for more than six years, Reinke said. The price increased because the Gators have seven home games this season, one more than last.

Despite an e-mail sent to students informing them of the price increase, Reinke said some students were caught off guard.

If students' ID numbers are rejected mul-

multiple times, they should call the ticket office.

The phone lines will be open from 8 a.m. to midnight every day until April 19, which will be another busy day, he said.

Reinke emphasized that students do not need to rush to register.

"You have the same chance if you order tickets today than if you order them next Wednesday at midnight," he said.

The athletic association will hold the lottery the week of April 24. Students who have more than 90 hours of UF credit have the best chance of winning, according to Gatorzone.com. The same system was used last year, and 1,500 tickets were not sold.

"We didn't even need the lottery," he said. He said he expects the same to happen this year.

Lottery winners will be notified by e-mail by April 28. Students who do not win the lottery will have the money refunded to their credit cards the week of May 8.



Passover meals abundant

Jewish students will adhere to a low-carb diet the next eight days as they celebrate Passover.

Passover is a Jewish holiday that represents the start of the harvest season in Israel and commemorates the Jews' liberation from Egypt. During Passover, Jews are not allowed to eat any form of leavened bread.

Three seders, or Passover feasts, will be offered at Hillel on Wednesday for the first night of Passover. The Gator Seder and Seder For Dummies will begin at 7:30 p.m., and an Israeli seder will begin at 8:30 p.m. Two seders will take place Thursday at 7:30 p.m. for the second night.

Rabbi Jonathan Siger, who will conduct The Gator Seder, expects 200 to 300 people to attend.

Jews in Greek Letter Organizations, a UF group, will hold another seder at Alpha Epsilon Pi on Wednesday night at 7:30 p.m.

Organization President Emily Panzer said the event is open to everyone but will probably be composed of mostly Greeks. She expects about 150 people to attend.

"It's going to be a fun seder with mostly students, and it's going to be on campus," Panzer said.

Stacy Levitt will host another seder by the pool at Campus Lodge. She said the event will be open to everyone regardless of whether they are residents of the apartment complex or not, and she expects about 30 to 60 people to attend. Levitt will use the seder grants she received from Hillel to conduct it.

"I'm excited about it," Levitt said. "I thought it would be fun to host a seder where a lot of people I know live."

Hillel offered seder grants to students who wanted to host their own seders. The idea was created by Hillel Executive Director Keith Dvorchik and the grant contains all the items needed for a Passover seder.

"The response has been overwhelming," Siger said. "We always have more requests than we can handle."

Siger and the rest of the Hillel staff began to prepare the seder grants Monday. They expect to feed about 800 people with the grants.

Students had to sign a contract and attend a session to learn how to host a seder. All grants were free with the funds coming from donations.

"Most Jews get pretty excited about Passover," Siger said. "The chance to host a free seder is an irresistible offer."

With this year's Passover seders occurring on weekdays, Siger said students should be allowed to get out of their academic responsibilities to celebrate the holiday. UF has a policy that allows students to be absent from a class because of a religious holiday. Siger said he has run into some problems with professors concerning the Jewish event.

For example, one professor wanted his student to take an exam on Passover morning, which would have prevented the student from flying to New York to be with his family.

"It's like someone taking an exam on Christmas Eve," Siger said.

He has been writing letters to help students get out of academic obligations that may interfere with their observance of Passover.

Wikipedia founder to give talk at UF

The founder and president of Wikipedia, Jimmy "Jimbo" Wales, will speak on free culture and its role in universities tonight in the banquet room of Emerson Alumni Hall.

The event is free and open to the public, and doors will open at 6:30 p.m., said Gavin Baker, president of Florida Free Culture, which is co-sponsoring the event.

The event cost UF \$2,175, which includes Wales' hotel stay.

Wikimedia Foundation, a nonprofit organization that operates Wikipedia.com, is a free, online encyclopedia compiled from user-edited articles. Internet users can edit content and post their own material on the Web site.

Baker said many college students use Wikipedia to casually look things up or to do research for a class. Students are also interested in the Web site's technology.

Baker said there is a funny interaction between academia and organizations like Wikipedia.

"Universities have been the gatekeepers of knowledge," he said. "Now, Wikipedia and other online resources are democratizing that and making information more accessible."

Wales will discuss how universities promote access to information and technological change, Baker said.

In addition to Florida Free Culture, the event is sponsored by Accent, Student Government's speakers bureau, and the Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation.

Sweating Iran

Diplomatic solutions may be hard to come by

Sometimes, you just have to have faith in President Bush.

Amid news that Iran has successfully enriched uranium for the first time, Bush administration officials are reiterating that they remain committed to a diplomatic solution to the crisis of a nuclear Iran.

We hope they can do it.

Because with all the rhetoric coming out of Iran these days, we're starting to wonder whether a backyard bomb shelter is such a bad idea after all.

Hard-line Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, no stranger to controversy, has frequently and vocally challenged both the Western world and our allies in Israel, going so far as to call for the Jewish state to be "wiped off the map."

Imagine our chagrin when we discovered Iran's sudden progress in uranium enrichment, along with Ahmadinejad's claim that "Iran will soon join the club of countries that have nuclear technology."

Iran's enrichment comes over the stern objections of the U.N. Security Council, which, on March 29, demanded that Iran suspend its uranium program. Ahmadinejad blew it off, saying, "The enemies must know that they cannot hinder the nation's progress..."

Of course, it's entirely possible that Iran just wants nuclear energy like the rest of the developed world, which they should be able to get. But therein lies the rub. The same uranium enrichment techniques used to make fuel for nuclear reactors can also be used to make material for nuclear weapons. It's a dangerous game.

And given Iran's recent actions, we're not exactly optimistic at the prospects that diplomacy will win the day.

Yet the Bush administration remains upbeat, saying that diplomatic solutions are still available and that alleged plans of an imminent attack against Iran are "just wild speculation."

"I know here in Washington, prevention means force," Bush said. "It doesn't mean force necessarily. In this case, it means diplomacy."

And maybe that counts for something. But with the stakes so high, it's difficult to know just how many concessions the U.S. is willing to make to diplomatically prevent Iran from getting the bomb. How far can we reasonably expect to go before a military attack is the only option left on the table?

News of Iran's enrichment success couldn't come at a worse time for Bush, whose approval ratings recently hit a new low of 38 percent, according to a new Washington Post-ABC News poll. The president's political capital is simply overtaxed.

But the same could also be said of the U.S. military. Following the costly, dismal invasions of Iraq and Afghanistan, it's easy to wonder how much juice our military has left to prevent nuclear proliferation in Iran.

It's the military scenario that everyone feared. Iraq, a relatively small potato once ruled by a tyrannical yet stable dictator, has sapped both the resources and the morale of the most powerful military in the world. We now find ourselves bogged down in a conflict without clear goals or exit strategies.

But who knows? Mohamed ElBaradei, the head of the U.N.'s nuclear watchdog, the International Atomic Energy Agency, heads to Iran later this week. Maybe we'll get lucky. Maybe ElBaradei will find that we have nothing to worry about. Or maybe Iran's leaders will spontaneously decide that uranium enrichment just isn't for them.

But we're not holding our breath.

Delay's career a reflection of politics

Hammers or screwdrivers don't possess moral qualities; they're only good or evil to the extent that their owner uses them for good or evil means.

DeLay did no more than was asked of him during his time in politics. He was unable to do more than was asked of him. That he entered into a toxic, venomous political climate so in tune with his own sensibilities was his great stroke of fortune.

And that's the key. When looking at DeLay's career, the details of his various unfortunate acts distract us from the larger point.

Great men shape their eras. But mediocrities like Tom DeLay don't. They are the flotsam and jetsam of the times. DeLay gained his power because he proved willing to adapt to a bitter and bilious atmosphere. If Tom DeLay never existed, Washington would have invented him. He's an interchangeable part, a cog in a machine.

No, the real story is that our political atmosphere has degenerated to a level where blank slates like DeLay identify a hateful attitude as the popular one.

It's probably unfair to place the blame for the state of things on any one individual or political party. Maybe it's the GOP's fault for treating Bill Clinton as more of a Satanic caricature than a political opponent. Maybe it's Clinton's and James Carville's fault for responding to vitriol with vitriol.

And maybe the death knell for civility was the 2000 South Carolina Republican Primary, where certain operatives called up Republican photos and implied that John McCain had an illegitimate, black child.

There are no easily identifiable villains. There are no easy solutions. And those thinking that they are rid of DeLay are fooling themselves. Without a change in culture, DeLay will return in another guise, perhaps even in a different party.

But there will always be another Tom DeLay.

Flames ravage historic hall
Johnson Hall consumed by grease fire

What started as a small grease fire grew into an inferno Sunday night, reducing one of UF's oldest buildings to a pile of charred timbers and crumbled walls within four hours.

Three student employees were working in the Rathskeller kitchen about 3:30 Sunday afternoon, preparing for the dinnertime rush. One of the employees, UF junior Darryl Smith, said a deep-dish grease pan "blew up in flames" after his manager turned it on.

One student employee emptied three fire extinguishers trying to douse the blaze. "It just didn't work. I guess it wouldn't put out a grease fire," said the manager, who would not give his name.

Meanwhile, another worker, UF sophomore Sherri Christopher, raced to call the fire department. Gainesville firefighters arrived four minutes later.

All of the employees got out in time, said Gainesville Fire Department spokeswoman Sheila Hayes. Gainesville firefighter Jimmy Durden suffered the only injuries. Although officials did not say how badly he was hurt, Durden was treated and released from Shands Hospital the same night. Hayes would

only say that Durden hurt his foot moving equipment. Before the evening was over, more than two dozen firefighters and five of Gainesville's 11 fire engines were summoned in a vain attempt to save the 75-year-old building.


As more of Gainesville's firefighters were called in to douse the blaze, fire trucks from nearby towns of Alachua, Jonesville, Windsor and Micanopy stood by. The backups waited at Gainesville's city limits to handle any other fires in the city, according to Alachua County Fire Department spokeswoman Jean Lemile.

Gainesville firefighters first tried to fight the fire from inside the hall. But they had to retreat when the roof began collapsing.

"The building was falling down all around us," said firefighter David Howton. "At that point it's not a matter of a decision of whether to get out. You either get out or you get killed."

After firefighters saw no way to save Johnson Hall, they concentrated on saving the adjoining Arts and Sciences Building.

"When the roof started falling in on us, there was nothing we could do. This was one we didn't get to in time," Howton said.

Road, across from the infirmary, caught fire when an overheated deep fat fryer exploded at about 3:40 p.m. that Sunday.

The land has since been turned into a parking lot.

Despite tough times, the '80s saw UF improve in both academia and sports.

"Academically, the faculty was never better and the colleges were getting bigger," said Carl Van Ness, university archivist.

"We were attracting better students, and there was a major capital campaign."

The men's basketball team made its first NCAA appearance in 1987, and won an SEC title in 1989.

The Gators football team showed a great deal of promise, featuring stars such as Emmitt Smith and Lomas Brown.

"I was lucky to be a low-level intern at the time in the athletic department's sports information department," said UF alumnus of '84, Alex Vergara.

"I got to see some amazing players of the time."

The team captured the SEC title in 1984 and 1985. However, those titles were stripped due to NCAA rule violations by head coach Charley Pell, leaving accolades for the team out of reach.

"The football team was finally making a statement," Van Ness said, "But there were all those nasty NCAA investigations."

As UF gained prominence, the Alligator was also gaining attention, expanding its coverage and doing more investigative stories.

One major focus for the paper was race and gender issues at UF during the '80s as both blacks and women gained footing within the administration and student body.

A program in women's studies added a new dimension to the university's curriculum.

UF hired more women faculty members, and several women became high-level deans.

Students elected Charlotte Mather, the first female Student Body president in 1983, and the first black female-president, Pamela Bingham, in 1986.

Politics were cutthroat in the '80s Student Government, one alumnus said.

"There was always some kind of rift going on with Florida Blue Key as it was so political," said Terri Parnell, UF alumna of 1988. "It just

taught me about real-life politics early."

Growth also came to UF in the '80s through funding, which saw a large increase, allowing the university to hire more faculty and construct new buildings.

In 1980, the university built the Stephen C. O'Connell Center for basketball, swimming, commencements, banquets and public lectures.

Its waterproof fabric top, resembling to a large balloon, made the O'Dome one of the most recognized buildings on campus.

New world-class facilities weren't the only convenience offered to the student body: Students no longer had to wait in line for their financial aid checks. For the first time, the university sent them by mail.

But for UF, the best was still to come.

"We were waiting for the 1990s, but we didn't know we were waiting at the time," Van Ness said. "We were heading in the right direction, but we were still on the cusp of greatness."

Congressman secures \$250K for SFCC fine arts

■ THE MONEY WILL HELP BUILD A FINE ARTS FACILITY.

SFCC received a hefty \$250,000 endowment Tuesday, which it will use to plant the seed for a high-tech fine arts facility.

U.S. Congressman Cliff Stearns, the Gainesville Republican whose district encompasses SFCC and UF, secured the funding, adding to the \$115,000 he donated for the building last year.

SFCC President Jackson Sasser said the college will combine Stearns' financial support with private and state funding to meet with architects to set plans for the building.

Sasser said the college hopes to break ground for the state-of-the-art performing arts center in early 2007.

"To have a college like this without a really good performing arts center just didn't make sense," Sasser said.

SFCC envisions a digitally enhanced, 499-seat facility, which will resemble UF's Phillips Center

for the Performing Arts on a smaller scale, he said.

Tari Kendall, co-director of the Dance Theater of Santa Fe, SFCC's dance company, said she was pleased Stearns recognized the importance of a fine arts building.

Students in the fine arts department, which include the dance company and the theater department, outgrew SFCC's small auditorium and have been performing at the Phillips Center, Kendall said.

"All these people need a venue to be highlighted in to do them justice for all the work that they do," Kendall said.

The congressman arrived at the SFCC campus after a stop at Gainesville Regional Airport, where he presented airport officials with more federal money.

Stearns said he embraced the idea of a fine arts facility because it would improve curriculum and boost prestige.

"Within the community, it would be a bit of cachet," he said.

Stearns' admiration for 88-year-old Alberto Alonzo, the revered Cuban choreographer who Sasser named SFCC's "Master

Artist in Residence" further motivated Stearns to find funding for the facility.

"Two hundred fifty thousand dollars — that is a quarter of a million!" Sasser exclaimed, ad-

miring the 3-by-2 foot check. "He just raised a lot of money today, I gotta say."

Eviction of fire rescue team may slow response times

Alachua County's busiest fire rescue unit could be evicted from Northwest Gainesville later this month, increasing response times for the city's other Emergency Medical Service teams, a

county official said Tuesday.

Rescue One, the county ambulance currently stationed about a mile northwest of UF at 1904 NW Sixth St., could be forced to find a new home because it is stationed in a neighborhood zoned for office or residential use.

"They're removing our busiest unit," said Megan Crandall, Alachua County Fire Rescue's spokeswoman. "The impact

on residents would be unfortunate. It will be harder to save people."

Crandall said for the past three years, Rescue One was housed in a residentially zoned neighborhood without any problems.

In 2006, she said someone complained about the ambulance station's zoning violation, which ignores city code that requires rescue units to be housed in

areas zoned as either warehouse or industrial.

In 2005, Rescue One responded to more than 2,500 calls, Crandall said.

Saul Silber, a Gainesville landlord who owned the property where Rescue One used to be located, said the county should apply to the city for rezoning.

City officials could not be reached for comment.

Off-campus stores are also rapidly selling the popular shirts, said Michelle Cross, a manager at the Florida Book Store.

"We cannot keep them in stock," Cross said. "We will get a shipment in, and by the end of the day it is gone."

Cross said that being off campus has not really affected sales. She said many of their orders have been placed online by faithful customers and alumni of the university from all over the country. So far, Cross said they have sold more than 2,500 shirts.

"I think people want everything they can get their hands on, which is great," she said.

The Florida Book Store is expecting another huge hike in sales the day of the Orange and Blue Debut on April 22, which is the spring practice game for the football team. They have many styles of polo and children's shirts that they expect visiting fans to buy up quickly, Cross said.

New ISIS allows better searches, easier registration

At first, students were hesitant about the new ISIS. They felt the process of finding their advance registration times was time consuming. Even when registration time finally came around last week, they were still not too convinced or satisfied with the new ISIS format.

But after several days of registration, students began to see the benefits.

The new and improved information system has more features that specialize the program and make it easier to search for courses that will fit students' schedules.

Pamela Morrow, an accounting sophomore, said she likes to have some days without classes during the week.

"I try to plan my schedule so that I do not have class every day and I can work during

my days off," she said. "The new ISIS makes it so easy for me to only find those courses that will allow me to do that."

When searching for a course, certain options allow students to include days of the week and times such as morning, afternoon or evening in order to narrow the search.

In addition, the new ISIS allows students to log on just once, without having to enter their usernames and passwords every time they want to register for a different semester.

"It's so much easier to register for all semesters at once because you just click on the column located on the left side and change from Summer to Fall semesters without having to sign on and off," Morrow said. "It makes the process much faster."

The old ISIS required students to log on and off every step of the way. Even if students just wanted to see their schedules or check

out textbook requirements, they had to click on another link and once again enter their passwords.

Elise Nelson, a political science sophomore, likes another advantage of the new program.

She said that even though she was a little confused about why she had to go through

her degree audit when she first checked her registration time, she realized it was only a helpful way to make sure she chose the right classes and fulfilled all her requirements.

"While going through my degree audit, I realized what classes I am still required to take and how many credits I should be taking each semester in order to graduate in time," Nelson said. "I think it saves up a lot of time, and this way people don't need to go see an academic adviser just to see what courses they need."

Students were also satisfied with the new appearance of the program.

Aubrey Parsley, a civil and coastal engineering junior, said that ISIS looks much more sophisticated.

"The program looked outdated before," Parsley said. "It was time to revamp it and make it look a little bit more modern, which is exactly how it looks now."

Gainesville airport gets \$2M from Congress for upgrade

THE MONEY WILL FUND NEW LIGHTS FOR A TAXIWAY.

A U.S. congressman has secured a multimillion-dollar slice from the big pie of federal transportation funds for the Gainesville Regional Airport.

New lights will replace aging ones along the airport's 5,000-foot main taxiway after the airport received a \$2 million grant, which Congressman Cliff Stearns present-

ed Tuesday.

"You think, '\$2 million for just lighting?'" said Michelle Danisovsky, the airport's government affairs representative. "But this is such a big deal."

The grant was awarded more than a year after the airport's chief executive, Rick Crider, applied for the funds, which are part of a transportation treasury bill.

Airport officials said the old light system needed to be replaced for safety reasons.

"Without the grant, it would have been a bad situation," said Jim Stringfellow, chairman of the Airport Authority Board. "You need

lights for safety."

Crider said it would have been only a matter of time before a problem arose.

The grant will also pay for an electrical station to accommodate the extra power the new taxiway lights will require.

Construction will begin in June, following several renovations that were completed in 2005.

In November, the airport finished the first phase of a \$10 million renovation project, which included three new boarding bridges.

Around Gainesville

"Before, passengers had to go outside. Now we have these jet ways," Danisovsky said.

By June, airport officials expect to begin the second phase of its renovations, which may take 18 months to complete.

The new taxiway lights are part of this phase.


Stearns, a Republican from Florida's District 6, which includes parts of Gainesville and Alachua, also helped the airport gain a \$300,000 grant in 2005 for ground transportation improvements.

Before handing over the check, Stearns explained his role in bringing the money to the airport.

"It's part of a big pie and your congressman got it — if I didn't get it, someone else in Indiana would have taken it," Stearns said. "I had to convince appropriators why this is important."

And he defended his actions, saying this grant is not pork barreling — when government officials push changes that will exclusively help their constituents in order to get their votes.

"It's gone through a huge process to get here," Stearns said. "Is this taking advantage of Congress to get this money here? No. This is not for a specific constituency. This is broad."

Hackers target traffic lights

Imagine if you could change traffic lights at the snap of a finger or, in this case, the push of a button.

Security devices, called traffic signal preemption transmitters, owned by the Alachua County Fire and Rescue Department, do just that — legally.

Web sites across the nation, however, such as www.themirt.com and www.i-hacked.com brag of creating and using duplicate devices just as easily and effectively.

But people buying and selling the devices hit a roadblock in August 2005 when President Bush passed the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act.

It established a minimum sentence of six months in prison for anyone who uses the device illegally. The act also said those selling the device illegally could serve a year in prison, according to the U.S. Department of Transportation Web site.

The devices used in counties across the nation, including Alachua for the past 3 to 4 years, are coded. When either a legal or illegal device is used, the control box of the intersection records both the date and time used, said Megan Crandall, public information officer for Alachua County Fire and Rescue.

"When you turn it on, it will recognize that that vehicle turned it on — date, time, everything," Crandall said. "It essentially provides accountability."

In the U.S., two major companies, 3M and Tomar Electronics Inc., competitively sell differently coded preemption devices.

Like the "IBM-Microsoft, Pepsi-Coke" relationship, the two companies will only go through specific distributors, said Stuart Johnston, the Southeastern region sales representative for Tomar Electronics Inc.

"Everybody has a heightened sense of security," Johnston said.

Besides being very immoral, using a "rogue emitter," or a generic version of the preemption transmitter, is not effective, Johnston said.

Even though he did not sell transmitters to Gainesville, the city has nothing to worry about, he said.

"I can tell you right now, the systems in place in most cities are capable of knocking 95 percent of [generic transmitters] out," Johnston said.

Blake Temple, president of Temple Inc. and distributor the 3M versions of Gainesville's preemption devices, said cost of the device — \$5,000 — is an incentive for hackers to illegally create a homemade alternative.

"Anything can be stolen or acquired illegally and be utilized," Temple said.

Nobel winner tells UF about proteins

Nobel Prize laureate Dr. Peter Agre knows how peeing in your bed and Christian Dior makeup are related.

Aquaporins, naturally occurring proteins he helped discover in 1992, are to blame. The proteins are responsible for many human processes including tears, sweat and bladder problems. They also moisturize skin — an asset in beauty care.

"For anyone who had a Starbucks venti coffee before the lecture, by the end of my lecture you'll have a full bladder and know what I'm talking about," Agre said.

Agre spoke Tuesday to a crowd of about 450 in UF's Health Professions,

Nursing and Pharmacy auditorium for the College of Medicine's Faculty Research Day's 50th Anniversary.

"Since we are dealing with our 50th anniversary, we were looking for a speaker with a high profile and prominence," said

Dr. C. Craig Tisher, dean of the College of Medicine.

Agre's speech talked about how the absence or mutation of genes that produce the aquaporins can influence fluid reten-

tion, obesity and cataracts since the proteins act as water channels in the body.

Christian Dior developed a cream called HydrAction based on his discovery. The cream contains aquaporins that aid in moisturizing the skin.

Agre, now at Duke's medical school, shared the 2003 Nobel Prize in Chemistry with Roderick MacKinnon of Rockefeller University.

Agre, who worked at Johns Hopkins University at the time of the discovery, said he always had anxiety when it came to chemistry.

"There could not have been a less prepared individual to do these studies," Agre said. "I had a D in high school chemistry."

ties, up from No. 13 in 2004.

UF spokesman Steve Orlando said the recent ranking affords a prestigious association to UF. Other top-inventing universities include the University of California system at No. 1, Massachusetts Institute of Technology at No. 2 and Stanford



when someone goes down."

With players limited like Moore, Manson and early enrollee Chevon Walker, a freshman slowed by a sprained ankle, senior DeShawn Wynn alternated between the first and second team offense, splitting carries with walk-on Anthony Gay and fullback Billy Latsko at times.

Wynn, the Gators' leading rusher in 2005 with 621 yards, finished the season with seven touchdowns, but coaches are looking for consistency from him in his final spring at UF.

"DeShawn, for the most part, has had a productive camp, but he has to find a way to bring his work hat every day," Drayton said. "As far as being in the doghouse, the whole group is in the doghouse, including the coach. So we just have to improve with a sense of urgency."

NEW GOAL LINE LOOK: The Gators have implemented the Maryland-I formation into their goal line package during the spring. As opposed to the traditional three tight ends, UF has been using a stacked backfield of two fullbacks and a halfback in an I-formation to punch the ball through in short yardage situations.

Fullbacks Eric Rutledge, Latsko and Kyle Pupello have been alternating at the two fullback spots, while Wynn has carried the ball as the bruiser running back.

"It brings an attitude down in that part of the field, and we feel we have the personnel when we are healthy to get in that set and just go downhill at some people," Drayton said.

explanations have been offered while fans have been wringing their hands and scratching their heads.

The result was a changed approach, conscious or unconscious, by players who all had good intentions and a strong work ethic. With the confidence that each player could be the one to make a game-changing play, hit the big home run or strikeout every batter he faced,

the Gators collectively started to press. When failure was the result, confidence became a casualty.

Despite committing five errors last night, for the second time this season, the Gators were able to score eight runs without the benefit of a home run.

Chris Petrie batted 3 for 4 against B-CC and admitted that the Gators are now starting to relax.

Stephen Porter, a career LOOGY (Lefty One Out Guy), was left in to pitch for three hitless innings last night. After the game, he conceded that the team

feels a sense of urgency.

Pat McMahon is still an excellent game coach. He has somehow managed to remain optimistic in the face of a season that has fallen short of expectations so far, trusting in his philosophy and the people around him.

It might cause McMahon to lose more sleep than he already has, but if he can start to assert himself more and follow his own feelings about the players who trust in him, the recent upswing in momentum and confidence can continue toward another postseason run.

plenty of action on the base paths. But UF reliever Steven Porter (1-0) earned the win in relief, shutting down B-CC in three hitless innings.

Porter, a situational lefty, rarely pitches for three straight batters, let alone three innings.

"I needed work," Porter said. "It's been hard pitching recently because it just hasn't been the right situations. I feel a lot better now."

B-CC senior Raphael Kyles was tagged with the loss. He went three innings, surrendering three earned runs on five hits.

UF second baseman Adam Davis and center fielder Gavin Dickey extended their hitting streaks to six games, but Matt LaPorta's home run streak came to an end after three games.

He went 0 for 4, and Davis was picked off with LaPorta on deck in the eighth, preventing him from making another plate appearance. The Gators, not known for their aggressiveness on the base paths, tied a season high with three stolen bases, two from Dickey and one from Davis.

"I thought they did a wonderful job holding runners, but I thought our guys did a little better job picking pitches to run on," UF coach Pat McMahon said. "That is a big part of our arsenal. I would like to be much more aggressive on the bases and run a lot more, but you don't want to run yourself into outs."

In a sense, it was a breakout game for the Gators, who put together strings of clutch hits and whose bullpen hurled six scoreless innings.

"I thought we pitched extremely well," McMahon said. "That was as quality an outing as Steven Porter has had this year."

But the Gators performance was far from flawless, as UF committed five errors, tying a season high. Surprisingly, two of the errors came from catcher Brian Jeroloman, who had only committed three errors the entire season. UF's tough day in the field further cements the Gators' last-place fielding percentage in the SEC.

"I am always concerned about errors. I don't sleep well anyway, and those can create more [worries]," McMahon said. "You have got to complete plays. You can't give away outs. That is inexcusable."





No. 3 Gators finish runners-up to No. 15 Clemson

The No. 3 UF men's golf team held on to its second-place standing on Tuesday but couldn't overcome first-day leader No. 15 Clemson, finishing three strokes behind the tournament champion Tigers in the United States Collegiate Championship.

"We played solidly again," UF coach Buddy Alexander said. "It was a little disappointing placing second again. You get to a point

where playing solidly is not good enough."

The Gators have now finished second in their last two tournaments for a total of three runner-up finishes during the spring season. UF did manage to outplay No. 1 Georgia by nine strokes, but Alexander said that it didn't really matter.

"It's not about them," Alexander said. "It's about us. We beat everybody but Clemson. That's what it's really all about — beating everyone there."

UF senior Matt Every's score

fluctuated throughout the third round as he bogeyed six holes but responded with five birdies to finish with a 1-over 73 and 3 under at 213 overall, landing him in a tie for fourth place.

Earning his third top-10 finish of the spring, freshman Billy Horschel tied for seventh and led the team with a steady performance by paring 15 holes en route to a 1-under-par 71 and an even par overall.

Senior Brett Stegmaier could not capitalize off of the momentum from his 5-under-par second round.

He triple-bogeyed consecutive holes and double-bogeyed another to shoot an 8-over-par 80. After tying for fourth place on Monday, he dropped 15 spots to finish tied for 19th at 221 (5 over).

After posting a 10-over-par 154 on Monday, freshman Toby Ragland

rebounded with four birdies in the third round to card a 1-over-par 73.

Senior James Vargas improved on his 5-over-par second round to shoot a 3-over-par 75 third round and an 8-over 224 overall.

Redshirt sophomore Manuel Villegas, who competed as an individual for the first time since the Gator Invitational on Feb. 19, finished with a 19-over-par 235.

The Gators return to action April 21 when they play in the Southeastern Conference Tournament.


While UF has only been ranked as high as No. 19 in the preseason, Walton hopes the series win against the Volunteers can help push the Gators over the proverbial hump.

UF looks to replace Engel, Collymore

After UF volleyball star outside hitter Jane Collymore and libero Rachel Engel graduated at the end of last season, Coach Mary Wise said she knew she'd have to look elsewhere for points.

"The question I get asked is, 'How do you graduate your starting primary passer and where are the points going to come from in the absence of Jane Collymore?'" Wise said. "I don't know, and I don't know, but I've got a few months to answer that."

Collymore, a two-time Southeastern Conference player of the year, accounted for more than a quarter of the Gators' 1,979 kills last year, and Engel led the team with 599 digs on the season.

But the Gators' spring season has shown that Wise may have found the key to filling those gaps.

Starting the preseason 10-0, the 15-time defending Southeastern Conference champions have defeated 2004 NCAA finalist Minnesota, rival Miami and 2004 Division II champions Barry University.

In Saturday's matches with Virginia and Minnesota, junior middle blocker Kisya Killingsworth had 11 kills in one game against Virginia and eight in a match against the Gophers.

Junior outside hitter Marcie Hampton led UF in its morning game against Minnesota with 10 kills and a block.

And All-America Angie McGinnis isn't exactly green at the setter position.

Often dumping the ball over the net, the 5-foot-11 junior was an offensive threat a season ago, and during the spring she has more than doubled her kills-per-game average of 1.21 from last year.

"If I can give you an analogy of last year, it was give the ball to Jane [Collymore] and let Jane create," Wise said. "But without Jane, we have to be more diverse offen-

sively, and so we're going to take advantage of Angie McGinnis, one of the best college setters there are."

Wise said she's even placed pressure on freshmen Elyse Cusack and Janine Williams to compete with their more experienced teammates for playing time and said she was confident of their ability to post points after seeing them play during the spring.

LOCHTE HONORED: After breaking three world records at the Short Course World Championships in China, UF senior Ryan Lochte was named Southeastern Conference Male Swimmer of the Year on Tuesday.

Lochte was named NCAA Swimmer of the Year last month after breaking NCAA records in the 200-yard individual medley, 400 IM, 100 backstroke and 200 back at the national championship meet.

"It's certainly well deserved," UF coach Gregg Troy said of Lochte's award. "He had another phenomenal year."

"If you look at the results from the NCAA and the SEC meet, he is probably the best swimmer in the SEC ever."

Lochte's teammate Bradley Ally was honored as SEC Freshman of the Year while six additional Florida swimmers earned All-SEC honors.

After earning four All-America honors at the NCAA meet, senior Brian Hartley joined sophomore Darian Townsend and freshman Lucas Salatta on the All-SEC First Team.

Sophomores Luca DeMatteis and Daniel Penniman earned second-team honors.

For the women's team, Vipa Bernhardt was named SEC Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

UF blazes past Bethune-Cookman

It was probably just coincidence when two Gainesville Fire Department trucks roared up to McKethan Stadium, but the vehicles seemed to arrive right on time for UF.

As the sirens blared from behind the right field fence, the Gators' bats caught fire for a four-run sixth inning that broke

the game open for an 8-2 UF victory against Bethune-Cookman on Tuesday night.

UF left fielder Chris Petrie went 3 for 4 with two RBI and two runs scored.

"It was awesome," Petrie said. "I was just trying to stay back and hit everything the other way, and I was fortunate enough to get some good pitches to hit."

It was unranked UF's 19th all-time win against the Wildcats, who have never defeated the Gators.

The Wildcats (18-21, 6-0 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference) are having one of their better seasons in recent history and are currently ranked No. 1 in the Black College Baseball Poll. With the win, UF (21-16, 4-8 Southeastern Conference) improved its record to 6-4 in midweek games.

UF starting pitcher Kris Gawriluk was able to limit the damage in his three innings of work, despite the Wildcats seeing

Familiar underdog role may propel Gators to much-needed wins

When the UF baseball team defeated Bethune-Cookman last night, the players were smiling and relaxed, seemingly for the first time since being swept at South Carolina in the last weekend of March.

And why shouldn't they be enjoying themselves?

Plenty of detractors on the Internet message boards are calling for the heads of hitting coach Tim Parenton and pitching coach Ross Jones. The team is unranked in three of the four college baseball polls. The Gators are at the bottom of the

Southeastern Conference in batting, fielding and pitching. At 21-16 overall and 4-8 in the SEC, UF wouldn't qualify for its own conference tournament if the season ended today.

Those same reasons for doom and gloom have placed the Gators in a familiar underdog role.

Maybe the Gators need some sort of extra incentive to play well.

In the College World Series last season, Tennessee provided such a spark, announcing that a freshman would be the starting pitcher against the Gators. Three hours before game time, Volunteers coach Rod

team with the No. 1 ranking and the expectations that come with it, they can regain the 'why not us?' attitude that propelled them to the best season in school history last year.

It's just a matter of time before the law of averages rules in favor of UF. Statisticians would apply the law of large numbers by using a player's career batting average as a theoretical mean, and their current average as a sample mean to project future probability.

Adam Davis, a .313 career hitter, is batting .265 so far this year. Probability should influence him to

have an average more than .500 during the remainder of the season.

The same observations can be made about catcher Brian Jeroloman, a .306 career batter, and Matt LaPorta, a .314 career batter, who are both hitting .250 this year.

While the Gators have lost 10 of their last 15 games, the players and coaches have echoed the same sentiments about possible reasons for the decline.

"The ball isn't falling our way, we just can't catch a break," and similar
