SG execs snag salary, perks

John Boyles was competing for more than control over \$12 million of student money — he was competing for some of the best seats in The Swamp.

As Student Body president, Boyles will sit beside UF royalty at this Fall's football games, schmoozing with such luminaries as wealthy donors and university trustees from his seat in the President's Box.

Privileges like choice football seating are par for the course for Student Government's No. 1 official, who receives a myriad of perks in exchange for his service.

The Student Body president automatically earns a spot on the university's Board of Trustees, which is how he or she nets the prime travel and game day seats.

"The Student Body president at UCF gets 20 grand a year, and we get like eight," said Student Body President Joe Goldberg, who holds his title until Boyles takes office May 1. The Student Body president's salary is \$8,196.

Despite a lower salary than his peers, Goldberg admitted that it's good to be the king.

"I got to fly a couple times on [UF's private jet] for a couple things, like going down to Miami," he said.

In order for him to stay in touch while cruising the Florida skies, Goldberg also owns a full-service BlackBerry device, which is funded through student money at a cost of about \$107 per month.

But the perks extend to more than just SG's kingpin. Thanks to the efforts of Accent, SG's speakers bureau, top student officials often dine with celebrity guests who are in town to give speeches.

Sometimes, conquering Gainesville is not enough.

UF reverses stance, allows student co-op to stay open

■ THE LAWSUIT TO DECIDE WHO IS CLO'S TRUSTEE WILL CONTINUE.

UF administrators decided Thursday they want the low-cost Collegiate Living Organization co-op to keep its doors open,

contrary to the university's previous stance.

"It's good to know they are moving in our direction and want to cooperate," former CLO President John Jasinski said.

The university changed its stance because of the steps CLO has made to improve its situation, said UF spokesman Steve Orlando. Since UF threatened to close CLO's doors in January, the co-op has created a CLO Alumni Foundation, which pledged \$100,000 for re-

pairs and legal fees.

"We like what we see with what they are doing," Orlando said. "We are impressed with


it. What they have done so far seems to be headed in the right direction."

UF Fire Safety Inspector Richard Graves gave the CLO 16 points in violations Monday. It received a much poorer score of 404 in January's inspection.

Orlando said UF is dropping the portion of its lawsuit against CLO that stated that the



Friends of Library book sale begins Saturday morning

Students relieved to put down their textbooks and finally pick up the novels of their choice will find thousands of options when scouring the semi-annual Friends of the Library book sale, which will begin Saturday at 9 a.m.

The sale is the largest of its kind in Florida, with more than 300,000 books, records, games, CDs, DVDs, audio, video, paintings, posters, prints, puzzles and magazines, according to the Friends of the Library Web site. A variety of classical and modern fiction books, textbooks, large-print books, first editions, rare books, cook books and hobby books will be available.

Most prices will range from 25 cents to \$3, and profits will be used for library support, library staff scholarships, special projects and county literacy projects.

The sale will be open Saturday through Wednesday, with different hours each day. Items will be 50 percent off Tuesday, and many items will cost 10 cents Wednesday, according to the Web site.

Volunteers play a large role in organizing the event, and donations for the sale are collected year-round. The event will be held at 430-B N. Main St.



Student noise irks residents

After two and a half hours of heated discussion, Gainesville officials and concerned residents were sure of one thing: Student rentals in local neighborhoods mean loud parties, packs of cars and too much beer.

The Public Safety Committee held a joint meeting Thursday with the Community Development Committee to talk about how to close loopholes in the city's policies dealing with parking, noise and over occupancy in single-family neighborhoods.

Former Mayor Mark Goldstein expressed dissatisfaction over the subject, which he and other residents said has been on the agenda for far too long.

"Are we dreaming?" Goldstein asked. "We've dreamt in this room for too many years."

Twenty-five years to be exact, Gainesville resident Kathy Meiss said. A resident of the Spring Tree neighborhood, Meiss told local officials their point system doesn't work and a "major attitude change" is needed.

Similar to points accumulated on a driver's license, the current system gives code violators one point for each violation. That point has traditionally stayed on record for

90 days. But on Thursday, city officials voted to propose lengthening the time period to one year and to increase fines for noise violations.

They hope the change will decrease the likelihood of students patiently waiting until the 91st day to throw their next party, which Community Development Director Tom Saunders said he's heard occurs.

Also, officials proposed to create a tracking system to determine if cars habitually parked on lots actually belong to property owners.

The proposals will be sent to the City Commission for approval.

Like many of the city meetings regarding student renters this year, no students were present to address the issue.

UF economics senior Jordan Siviglia, 22, who has lived in an off-campus house since August, said that students are the ones being run out.

"We have a neighbor that hates our guts for no reason," he said, explaining that the man wrote a letter to city officials in which he gave the students the title of "barbarians."

"We're all seniors, and we're really not wild," Siviglia said, "but every time it gets above a whisper, they call the police."

Wireless gets communal

After working a 12-hour shift as the head chef at a local Gainesville steakhouse, Bennett Depew returns home, logs onto the Internet and begins surfing the Web.

The 27-year-old doesn't pay for an Internet service. He uses the wireless signal being broadcast by his unsuspecting neighbors.

"It's not as though I'm walking around the neighborhood with one of those Wi-Fi signals trying to pirate people's Internet," Depew said. "I turn on my computer and 15 signals come up."

And Depew's behavior is far from uncommon.

Using a neighbor's wireless Internet signal is a common practice known as "piggybacking." It can slow the speed of someone's Internet connection, as well as leave the victim vulnerable to Internet crimes.

Gerald Haskins, senior lecturer of the Department of Computer and Information Science and Engineering at UF, said there is no statute that specifically makes piggybacking illegal, but a prosecutor could deem the behavior an invasion of privacy or trespassing.

"The problem is most people that this happens to don't know it's happening, so it never gets reported to anyone," Haskins said.

Haskins first began teaching classes about the Internet in the early 1990s. In recent years, he has taught his students about activities such as "war driving," which is when people drive around with their laptops looking for a wireless signal. Some people even fly single-engine airplanes over cities to search for a signal, he said.

But most piggybackers aren't quite as extreme.

When Barrett Hollis needs to take a quiz for one of his classes or complete a traffic course online, he finds it hard to rely on his old Internet router. The 22-year-old UF student uses his own signal when he wants to surf the Internet or talk to his friends, but he

uses his neighbors' signals when he needs an uninterrupted online session.

"Technically, it's their fault for leaving [the Internet connection] open," said Hollis, who has been tapping into wireless signals since Fall 2005. "It's kinda like if you leave your house and leave all the doors open."

Hollis said whoever does not want people logging onto their network should encrypt and make it impossible to do so.

Rick Mulligan, director of public affairs for Cox Communications, said his primary concern is that the piggybacker could leave a victim open to police speculation if an illegal act is committed.

"I don't think people believe it's going to happen to them," Mulligan said. "They think the threat is not real, but there are millions of people doing this."

Detective Joseph Mayo of the Gainesville Police works in the Internet Crimes Division, which has been around for about three years. He said he personally receives about five reports of Internet crimes a week, including Internet fraud, hackers and theft or destruction of intellectual property.

Of these crimes, a few are investigated each week, and usually one case leads to an arrest.

"I've heard the worst stories in the world, you know," Mayo said. "And they get away with it. It's really a sad state of affairs."

The only way to ensure that one's computer is protected from piggybacking is to encrypt it so a password is required to log online.

Mulligan said Cox Internet subscribers agree to an Acceptable Use Policy that requires the encryption signal to be activated. However, Mulligan recognizes that most customers do not encrypt.

Top 10 plan under review


UF President Machen has spent two months drafting the university's newest plan to become a Top 10 public research university. But most faculty members will have to wait an additional two weeks before the president seeks their opinions on the crucial document.

At Thursday's Faculty Senate meeting, Chairwoman Kim Tanzer offered senators a chance to adopt the plan without seeing it or wait until a May meeting to review the document and weigh in.

"This leads us to kind of a conundrum," Tanzer said.

Thus far, faculty input on the plan has been limited to the Senate's Academic Policy Council, a six-member group. Three council members have worked with Machen to make recommendations for the plan, Tanzer said.

Machen's effort, known as the Strategic Work Plan, was unveiled to the Board of Trustees at a February retreat.

College deans saw the plan and had the opportunity to survey faculty members, but some professors say they never heard about the plan until it was publicized.

Senators will be allowed to see the revised document beginning today and will have two weeks to review the plan before the Senate's May 4 meeting.

"This is an opportunity for faculty to be much more involved in policy making," said Richard Yost, a chemistry professor and faculty senator.

Also at Thursday's meeting, Yost was elected to the Senate's No. 2 position. He will serve under Danaya Wright, who will take over for Tanzer on May 15.

Activist addresses racism

■ **JACKIE BROWN HAS OVERCOME RACISM TO RUN FOR MAYOR.**

Jackie Brown was one of two pupils in her third-grade class who didn't receive an invitation to a classmate's birthday party.

When they asked the girl why the two weren't invited, she replied, "My father doesn't want any n****rs at the party."

This was one of many experiences with racism Brown, a Jacksonville activist and mayoral candidate for the 2007 election, shared with anthropology instructor Scott Catey's Race and Racism class Thursday.

Brown opened up to the class of about 65 about how racism affected her life and how she ultimately overcame it to run for mayor of Jacksonville.

The first in her family to graduate high school, Brown became pregnant her sophomore year of college and dropped out to live in public housing while raising her son.

Brown explained one of the lowest points in her life was when she didn't

get a job at a bank despite achieving the highest score on the aptitude test. She said that at the time, she didn't seem to fit the part at the interview — standing out in a bright yellow jacket with matching high heels.

"My hope was shattered," Brown said. "I wouldn't even look at myself in the mirror because all I saw was failure."

Brown faced another blow after she got her business degree and turned her father's business into a \$5 million company.

White contractors held their earnings and put the company out of business, she said.

Brown said she felt powerless — until her life took a dramatic turn.

After a newly elected mayor fired Jacksonville's black fire chief in 2003, Brown vowed to fight him.

"That was when a political star was born," she said of her newfound activism. "I have not shut my mouth since then."

Brown told the class that racism is still a major issue that will depend on today's generation for improvement.

"This is the 'now' generation," she said. "You all have the power to make great changes."

Complaint forces removal of busy ambulance unit

A county ambulance housed in the wrong zone is now out of options and will soon be out of town.

Alachua County Fire Rescue's busiest unit, Rescue One, is being forced to move from its station in Northwest Gainesville because it is in an area zoned for only office or residential use.

"They absolutely have to be out of that location by the end of April," said AFR spokeswoman Megan Crandall.

The rescue unit must move because the city received a complaint, which AFR officials speculate might be from a neighbor.

"Somebody had to complain — code enforcement told us so," said Edwin Bailey, Alachua County's deputy fire chief. "Code enforcement is a complaint-driven business."

But Alachua County emergency officials said the complaint could mean trouble for Gainesville residents.

"If we move that truck out of the area, the call load would be shifted to other units," Bailey said. "We're having to move a unit that has considerable need in the city."

In 2005, Rescue One responded to more than 3,500 calls, which is "ten calls every 24-hour period," Bailey said.

When moved, the ambulance could end up at another station near the intersection of Northwest 34th Street and U.S. Highway 441, which is about three miles north of its current location at 1904 NW Sixth St.

Between 2002 and early 2006, Rescue One leased a building at 1031 NW Sixth St. — an address also zoned for residential use, said Saul Silber, the property's owner.

Crandall said they operated at that location without any

complaints. In February, the rescue unit moved to its current location because the county's lease with Silber had run out.

Bailey said that's when somebody complained, but he was not sure Monday why the complaint was filed.

"Our crews are very sensitive to areas like that. They wouldn't go out and blow their lights and sirens when it isn't necessary," he said.

AFR is not fighting the decision.

UF Men's Ultimate Frisbee team wins championship

They came. They threw. They conquered.

The UF Men's Ultimate Frisbee team brought home the Sectional Championship from Athens, Ga., last weekend.

"We were excited to go to the tournament, play well and continue to improve with each game," said Bill MacQueen, team co-captain and third-year law student. "We're happy to finally take home a Sectional Championship."

The championship gave UF a bid in the regional tournament in North Carolina on April 29 and 30. Of the seven participating teams, Florida will be seated No. 1.

The team has been ranked No. 1 this season by the Ultimate Players Association, the governing body of Ultimate Frisbee, and currently has a record of 39-1 this season, MacQueen said.

The top two teams from the regional tournament will win a bid for the national tournament in Columbus, Ohio.

For those not familiar in the realm of the disc, the sport may surprise you.

"Ultimate requires a lot of the athletic ability and physical endurance of soccer, combined with the passing skills of football," said Cyle Van Auken, co-captain and English senior. "You're constantly moving and making cuts for the disc."

He added that Ultimate Frisbee

is the most physically demanding sport he has played. The team has been working vigorously to prepare for the competition.

"We have three two-hour practices combined with two track workouts weekly," Van Auken said. "We normally do a number of sprinting exercises followed by a stadium

workout."

After remaining undefeated through two days and six games at the sectionals tournament, Florida met with one of its biggest rivals, the University of Georgia Bulldogs, for the championship game.

"We knew we would be playing Georgia in the finals and that it would be a great game," MacQueen said.

It was a match-up that proved to be challenging.

"We were down two goals late in the game to a team as talented as Georgia," MacQueen said. "In a situation like that you really have to step up the intensity at a point when you're most tired."

After an hour and a half of play, the intensity paid off with Florida

finishing the game with a score of 11 to 10.

"This is my fifth year playing, and we have never won a Sectional title so it feels really good to get that monkey off our backs," said Timothy Gehret, team co-captain and materials engineering graduate student.

Florida will likely play rival Georgia once again in the tournament. If the team makes it to the national tournament, it will be the first time since mid-1980.

A national title would be the first in the history of Ultimate Frisbee at UF.

"We've eaten, slept and bled frisbee," Van Auken said. "The pay-off will be winning the game to go to nationals. We won't settle for less."

Many executives don't deserve their pay

Earlier this week, the bankrupt Delta Air Lines asked employees nationwide to clean the company's airplanes at night without being paid. However, the employees will not go without any compensation. The airline plans to reward their eight-hour shifts of cleaning floors, windows and bathrooms with free T-shirts. Furthermore, the company states that employees choosing to work for free are extended the lucrative opportunity to show pride in their company.

That offer was actually accepted by some of the airline's employees. But the vast majority appropriately viewed it as a ridiculous request that appealed to the sensibilities of a bygone era. Nowhere is the disappearance of corporate morale more evident than in the airline industry, where hard times and bankruptcy have been a way of life for years. These economically harsh times have been further exacerbated by strained relations between airlines' management and its employees.

This animosity spurs from one primary source: the grossly incompetent and oblivious behavior of these companies' upper-level administrators.

With the increase in oil prices and the threat of terrorism in recent years, airlines have naturally hit on hard times. However, instead of reacting appropriately, the management teams of companies such as United, Delta and Northwest airlines saw the hard times as a reason to begin securing their own pensions while looting those of the functional employees. Management teams are confronted with neither personal nor corporate culpability for the airlines' failures. Indeed, bonuses and raises have been awarded to chief executive officers, chief financial officers and other managerial prima donnas even in the face of corporate financial ruin.

Even more callously, when its airline publicly hits the rocks, management turns to the employees — requesting drastic salary cuts and other severe concessions. These

requests are accompanied by ultimatums and appeals to company pride. Any rational individual would naturally choke on the concept of company pride, especially when those using it to persuade them have bled the company dry through poor business decisions and selfish acts.

The media often details an airline's troubles as being a result of pilots, flight attendants and other workers going on strike. These workers are portrayed as stubborn and self-centered, willing to destroy their company in a childish fit. However, nothing could be farther from the truth. These employees merely refuse to legitimize the hypocrisies of the managerial class and resist the disgusting national trend of glorifying upper-level managers.

In some ways, the airline industry may be prophetic of the future of business in America. CEOs who have failed abjectly on many levels are rewarded through lateral promotion or at the very least are given financially profitable farewells for their attempts.

In reality, these charlatans should be run out of their industries on a rail, if for no other reason than corporate self-preservation.

Many CEOs are wise and intelligent businesspeople, leading their corporations to success through excellent tactics and foresight. Many others, however, are bumbling fools or crooks, propelled to a position far beyond their abilities by a combination of privilege and dumb luck.

They succeed through the fact that many companies are so strongly established and entrenched that things are nearly impossible to foul up.

Women should band together to help protect their rights

Last month, South Dakota Gov. Michael Rounds signed into law a bill banning abortion in virtually all cases. About ten additional states, including Florida's neighbors — Mississippi, Alabama, and Georgia — are currently in the process of passing similar bills. How does this affect women in Florida? Proponents of these bills hope to challenge and eventually overturn Roe v. Wade, which would put abortion in jeopardy in everywhere.

Ever since we won the right to abortion in 1973, our rights have been restricted at a steady pace. Lack of clinics, waiting periods, high costs, parental notification, insufficient providers and mandatory counseling sessions all contribute to a mounting wall that obstructs a woman's right to an abortion.

The freedom to decide when and if we

bear children is critical to our liberation as women. We can't be on equal footing with men if we can't make life-altering decisions, like whether to carry a pregnancy to term. Childbearing is physically dangerous and hard work, and we should be able to decide whether or not we want to do it.

These attacks on abortion are part of a larger attack on birth control. The Food and Drug Administration continues to delay its decision to make the morning-after pill available for over-the-counter use, and some states are introducing "conscience clauses" into law, which allow pharmacists to refuse to distribute birth control. Also, the South

Dakota bill contains dangerous language declaring that life begins when an egg is fertilized. This language puts methods of birth control that can work after fertilization in jeopardy — like regular birth control pills and the morning-after pill.

How can we prevent these attacks on our rights? History has shown us that when women get together they are capable of outstanding victories. In 1989, after the Supreme Court's Webster decision that allowed states to restrict abortion, then-Florida Gov. Robert Martinez called a special legislative session to be the first state to impose restrictions on abortion. Over 10,000 women showed up at the capitol demanding abortion rights not be touched. No restrictions were passed, and Martinez was defeated in the next election. States around the country that were watch-

ing Florida before imposing their own restrictions on abortion held off.

The way we won the right to an abortion in the first place was by women getting organized. Together we have been able to beat back some of the restrictions and efforts to take away our hard won rights, and together we will push forward for more. We demand complete control in making the decision whether to have a child, as well as programs that make raising a child easier, like paid parental leave and universal child care. We can go forward again. If you want to get involved in winning more rights for women, come to Gainesville Women's Liberation's speak-out for abortion and birth control on April 25 at noon in the Plaza of the Americas.

A man was found bound at the feet with a gunshot wound to the head Thursday morning at the Red

Roof Inn.

John Edward Curtis, 36, was taken to Shands at UF in critical condition after a maid found him, Alachua County Sheriff's Office Sgt. Stephen Maynard said.

The maid at the Red Roof Inn at 3500 SW 42nd St. found the man and called 911 at 11:19 a.m.,

Maynard said.

Deputies on scene found Curtis lying on the floor with an apparent gunshot wound to the head, said Maynard. The material used to bind his feet has not yet been released.

When the deputies arrived,

they found the room in a "state of disarray," Maynard said.

He said the shooting appears to be suspicious, but no suspects have yet been identified.

Curtis checked into the hotel Wednesday around 9:30 p.m. Maynard said Curtis had a residence in Gainesville in 1997, al-

though it was unknown Thursday where Curtis' current residence is.

The sheriff's office is currently investigating the scene and questioning potential witnesses.

Boyles, who will be inaugurated this evening at a private banquet, said his term as Student Body president will focus solely on student needs.


"I don't feel like I'm better than anyone or need to be better than everyone," he said.

Judge has yet to decide CLO trustee

university wanted the Northwest 15th Street location shut down.

An Alachua judge made UF's Board of Trustees the CLO's trustee last month but repealed the judgment this month. Because of that, UF does not have the authority to close the CLO, said Scott Krueger, the co-op's attorney.

UF officials still want to be the CLO's trustee, Orlando said, despite the judge's ruling.

"We do because we feel that those are our students," he said. "We feel we would still like to look out for their welfare."

A date has not been set for an Alachua

judge to state who the rightful trustee is.

"Trusteeship is in limbo right now," CLO Alumni Foundation Executive Director Don Liguori said.

He said the foundation would be the best trustee for the CLO because they "need an entity that doesn't stand to gain from CLO's demise."

If the CLO were to close, the money made from the public sale of the property would go toward student loans in the UF College of Education.

Liguori said the North American Students of Cooperation, which has also expressed interest in becoming the trustee, charges a fee for the service. The CLO recently paid \$600 to join the organization.





Transfer of Power

Virginia dismissal leads Canadian to UF

She was unhappy with her undefeated record.

Despite how much individual glory she had, she couldn't meet her goals, athletically or academically.

Her coaches weren't what she expected and neither was her school.

It was time for a change.

Diana Srebrovic, a freshman tennis sensation at Virginia, no longer wanted to be a Cavalier. She kept her intentions a secret, all while looking for a new place to call home.

"I wanted to get out of Virginia because I felt I wasn't reaching my tennis goal there," she said. "I was looking for a school where I thought I could reach my maximum potential in tennis."

That school was UF.

But when Srebrovic opted to leave Virginia for UF in February 2005, she couldn't have predicted what would follow.

The tennis star was ranked No. 34, and although she knew Virginia wouldn't exactly approve of her decision, she thought the school would respect it.

Instead, the team dismissed her immediately, despite the fact that she was the Cavaliers' best player, undefeated in dual-match play and the team leader.

"It wasn't something I expected that would happen," she said. "I played No. 1 for them. I had won every match for them. I think I helped the team a lot, not only tennis-wise. I felt I helped the team emotionally — them knowing I was there."

Srebrovic said she didn't always agree with Virginia coach Phil Rogers but had a "pretty good relationship" with him before her decision to transfer.

Still, the two had their share of disagreements, she said.

"I guess I didn't completely understand his way of coaching," Srebrovic said. "I wish him all the best, but I still don't understand why he didn't want me on the team after my decision to transfer."

Virginia went into a tailspin after Srebrovic left, going 3-10 in its

final 13 matches. After 23 years at Virginia, Rogers retired at the end of the season.

Messages were left on Rogers' phone, but none were returned.

While one team cast out Srebrovic, another anticipated her arrival.

UF coach Roland Thornqvist had recruited Srebrovic since her days in junior tennis.

Thornqvist tried to recruit her out of high school, but a scholarship was not available at that time.

"I told her when one opened she would get it," Thornqvist said. "But a player of her caliber isn't going to play without a scholarship. Not when the Harvards, the Dukes and the Virginias are offering them."

Srebrovic ultimately chose Virginia over other schools because of its strong academics.

When Virginia released Srebrovic in February of 2005, Thornqvist pounced on the chance to sign the nine-time Canadian national champion. He brought Srebrovic to UF for a campus visit.

That was all it took. Srebrovic said she planned to go to Georgia after UF but never made the trip.

"After I came to visit, I made my decision," Srebrovic said. "I knew this was the school for me."

She said the players, coaches and facilities are top-notch at UF, so there was no need to look elsewhere.

And because Virginia had released her, she didn't have to sit out a year. She enrolled at UF in the fall. But things didn't get any easier.

From fitness workouts to the cone drill in practice, Srebrovic had never been challenged this hard by her coaches in Virginia.

But the hard work would pay off sooner than anybody thought.

Srebrovic entered the National Indoor Singles Tournament in November as one of the top players in the country, but by no means the favorite. By the end of the Tournament, she would stand as the champion.

"It felt great," she said. "I felt like all the hard work had paid off."

With the victory, Srebrovic figured she would be ranked in the top 10, but when the rankings came out, she was a little surprised to see her name at No. 1. Although UF senior Alexis Gordon had previously held a No. 1 ranking, Srebrovic started at No. 1 singles when team play began.

"She has added a ton of experience and firepower to the lineup," Thornqvist said. "We're a scary team with her and Alexis at the top."

Early in the season, Srebrovic had tendonitis problems in her right Achilles. She also had to cope with a blister on her foot and a cold. While suffering some early losses due to the health problems, she bounced back to finish with a regular-season record of 13-5, all coming at the No. 1 and No. 2 singles positions.

But Srebrovic has meant more to UF than just her play on the court.

Sophomore Whitney Benik, UF's No. 3 singles player, had trained with Srebrovic at the International Tennis Academy in Delray Beach when they were teenagers.

Benik said Srebrovic's emotional support to the team has helped just as much as her play.

"She is so important to the team," Benik said. "She is one of my best friends here. It helps me so much for her to be here. It would be a different team without her."

Srebrovic said she has enjoyed her time at UF more than her time spent in Virginia. It was nice, just not the right place for her.

"It's way, way different here," Srebrovic said. "The people, the environment, everything is a lot different. I feel I'm playing way better and getting way better coaching here. It's exceeded my expectations. I love it here."

Still, Srebrovic said she has no regrets about choosing Virginia.

"I think everything happens for a reason," she said. "I think my year at Virginia has ultimately made me a better person."

Currently ranked No. 5 in the country, Srebrovic is looking forward to competing in her first-ever NCAA Tournament in May.


But despite her meteoric rise up the collegiate ranks, she will not be joining the professional tour anytime soon.

"One-hundred percent — I'm coming back," she said. "I'll be here until I'm done with my four years."

Thornqvist said the "sky's the limit" for Srebrovic, and she can be a great professional tennis player whenever her heart desires.

With the help of Srebrovic, the No. 4 UF women's tennis team has only lost one match this season. And with an undefeated Southeastern Conference record, the host Gators should be the favorite to win the SEC Tournament this weekend.

"Everything has fallen into place so nicely," she said. "I couldn't imagine things going better than they are right now."

The No. 4 UF women's tennis team (18-1, 11-0 Southeastern Conference) seems to have everything going for it heading into the SEC Tournament.

The Gators are 131-1 all-time at home against SEC opponents. They are perfect this season against the SEC. And they have the hot Florida weather on their side as they head into today's quarterfinal match against South Carolina at the Ring Tennis Complex at 10 a.m.

"I feel like the team has definitely forgotten about what happened and moved on," Ouellette said. "We've accepted the fact that we're not going to have Ryan and that we can still win it all."

Former UK star Hayes sued

LEXINGTON, Ky. — A woman, whose claim that she was raped last year at a Kentucky campus residence hall went unpursued by prosecutors, has sued former Wildcats basketball star Chuck Hayes for damages.

A suspect was not publicly named. However, an agent for Hayes confirmed at the time that Hayes had been notified of the investigation.

Cynthia W. Smithers is asking for \$75,000 and unspecified punitive damages for her "pain and suffering, embarrassment and damage to reputation," according to the lawsuit filed Wednesday in the U.S. District Court in Lexington. Fayette County Commonwealth's Attorney Ray Larson announced in November he would not pursue charges because he had "serious doubts about the complainant's credibility and great concern about the lack of corroboration account."

Smithers claimed she was drugged and raped April 20, 2005, at Wildcat Lodge, where some Kentucky men's basketball players reside. Assistant Police Chief Ken Hall said the suspect

told police that he and the woman had consensual sex.

DRIVER PICKED UP SUSPECT: DURHAM, N.C. — A cab driver who picked up a Duke lacrosse player the night he was accused of raping a stripper appeared to reinforce a timeline the defense said supports the player's innocence but also casts doubt on claims that nothing happened at a team party.

When he returned to the off-campus party to pick up a second fare after dropping off suspect Reade Seligmann, Moez Mostafa said he saw a woman leaving the party in anger and overheard someone say, "She just a stripper. She's going to call the police." Mostafa said Seligmann appeared to be calm and jovial during the cab ride. After dropping off Seligmann, he said, he returned to the house to pick up another fare. When he arrived, it looked like a party was breaking up, with people crowded on both sides of the street.

While waiting on the four passengers whom he would later drive to a nearby gas station, he saw a woman walking through a crowd of men toward a car. Mostafa said the woman appeared to exchange words with some people in the crowd before getting into the driver's side of a car.

"She looked, like, mad," he said. "In her face, the way she walked, the way she talked, she looked, like, mad."

The Gators certainly made a quick transition.

After shutting out Central Florida 3-0 on Wednesday night,

it didn't take long to switch their attention toward a series with Kentucky this weekend.

After winning five consecutive Southeastern Conference series, the No. 24 UF softball team (34-18, 12-9 SEC) struggled last



Leak leads with louder attitude

High school lore compels them. An ESPN documentary commands them.

Thousands of UF football fans will flock to Saturday's Orange and Blue game to catch a glimpse of freshman quarterback Tim Tebow in action.

They'll see the arm that owns the career and single-season state high school records for passing yards.

They'll see the legs that helped make Tebow the No. 1 dual-threat quarterback prospect in the country.

They'll also see the other one, the one before the "Chosen One," the high school prodigy who arrived in Gainesville nearly three years ago with slightly less fanfare. And if coaches and players are correct, fans should like what they're watching when No. 12, not No. 15, is in the game.

Returning to the same offensive system and the same offensive coordinator for the first time in his UF career, Chris Leak will take the field Saturday with a peace of mind and an authority that his teammates have never witnessed from the senior signal caller.

"I can't say exactly what did it, but Chris has a different attitude," junior linebacker Brandon Siler said. "I've seen him yelling at people and getting people in line. That just wasn't the Chris that we had before."

A lack of vocal leadership was Coach Urban Meyer's main criticism of Leak before the coach's inaugural season at UF. After last year's spring scrimmage game, Leak said he was trying to grow into a more vocal leader, but his coaches and teammates didn't start noticing a difference until late in the season.

Offensive coordinator Dan Mullen attributes much of Leak's timidity to the fact that the quarterback was grappling with learning his third offensive system in as many years at UF.

As a freshman, Leak started the fifth game of the

Atkins strives to fill void at cornerback

Avery Atkins believes in freedom of speech. So if you want to call UF's revised corps of cornerbacks inexperienced and not quite ready for primetime, the new starting corner will gladly listen to your qualm.

Then he'll knock the apprehension right out of you.

"The coaches know I love to hit. I've been that way since I started playing football," Atkins said. "I can go in and lay a hit on you, and I can go out and cover you. Coming into spring, a lot of people said the cornerback position was

going to be the toughest spot to fill. But we're one of the hardest working groups. Cornerback is far from the weakest position on the team."

Atkins has been labeled a future superstar since a standout high school career in Daytona. But because Vernell Brown has graduated and Dee Webb is forgoing his senior year

for the NFL Draft, the future is now. After arguably outperforming everyone else on the football field this spring, Atkins strives to become one of the top corners in the SEC, if not the nation, this season.

"I feel very confident about it," he

said. "Not that I'm getting a big head or anything, but coach always told me when you work hard, you're going to be a great player. I work my butt off. I work hard in the weight room, hard in the classroom and hard out on the field. I'm working hard everywhere."

Even in his Pop Warner days, Atkins gained a reputation as a reliable player that could execute like no one else on the field.

That's when he earned the nickname "Execution," and at least one teammate believes he's ready to reclaim the title.

"It fits his description," said redshirt senior Reggie Lewis, UF's other start-

This will be a good team next year, better than the learning process that was the 2005 squad.

Meyer's calling card before arriving in Gainesville was making magic happen in year two, just as he did in Bowling Green and Utah.

But in order for the Gators to make it to the Southeastern Conference Championship and beyond, UF will need a Vernell Brown-esque awakening from some key players.

Here's a look at some candidates:

•DeShawn Wynn: For all the attitude problems and inconsistency that still plague him, Wynn needs to run like the fifth-year senior he's labeled as in the media guide.

There's absolutely no valid reason for Wynn, arguably the running back with the most potential, to be splitting carries with walk-on Anthony Gay and Billy Latsko for much of the spring.

But for one odd reason or another, he's deeper in the doghouse than Vito Spatafore.

•Kyle Jackson and Tony Joiner: Both are where they need to be physically and in terms of experience, but the key for UF's safeties will be getting their minds right in the film room during the summer.

Jackson's struggles last year caught everyone off-guard, but when he was replaced by Joiner to start the LSU game, the result was a Tigers touchdown.

Gators get confidence boost after defeating FSU

The UF baseball team may still be last in the Southeastern Conference, but it just didn't seem like it when the Gators handled No. 5 Florida State 8-3 on Wednesday night.

Gone was the team that fell

16-2 at home to Vanderbilt and 21-4 at South Carolina on consecutive Sundays in late March and early April. Gone was a squad that dropped two of three to then-SEC cellar-dweller Tennessee.

In its place: a squad that won its last two matches by a combined score of 23-7, a team that rode to those victories on solid starts from a pair of freshmen, a struggling

ball club seemingly reinvigorated for a home conference series against Auburn (18-22, 6-9 SEC) this weekend.

But forget about any sudden signs of excitement or unbridled confidence from UF coach Pat McMahon or his squad.

While he admitted the win in Tallahassee was significant, McMahon said no major shift in

attitude would result from it.

"[Wednesday] night's game was a good sign in a lot of different ways," a less-than-exuberant McMahon said simply.

Maybe it was, as he noted, the 3:30 a.m. arrival in Gainesville on Thursday after a game twice-delayed by rain and lightning or his second-inning ejection that zapped McMahon's excitement.

Or could it simply be that a coach who has often stressed the importance of quickly putting tough losses in the past does the same for big wins?

When asked about a boost in the team's swagger after the rivalry win, McMahon downplayed the notion.

"That's an interesting word, 'swagger,' and it relates to me as a confidence issue," he said. "I think that's relative to each and every individual performer."

So would his players feel any differently? Touting UF's top batting average among players with significant plate appearances, right fielder Chris Petrie said the win was, in fact, a confidence-booster for a slumping team.

"It's awesome to beat FSU," Petrie said. "It's great for our confidence and getting the second half of the SEC season turned around."

But Petrie also rejected the idea that the win would be a major factor in the team's overall attitude.

"We have a two-game winning streak over some good teams, but we have to keep going and not just be happy with this," he said. "We have a very talented team

and have always known we had the ability to turn it around at any time," he said. "We knew it was hopefully a matter of time before we got things turned around."

If the team has truly turned things around, it certainly did so at an opportune time.

Stuck at the bottom of the SEC standings, the Gators (23-18, 5-10 SEC) find themselves still just one game out of the eighth and final spot for the SEC Tournament beginning May 24.

The No. 3 UF men's golf team will compete in the Southeastern Conference Championships this weekend at Sea Island, Ga. For three UF seniors — Matt Every, Brett Stegmaier and James Vargas — the tournament marks the beginning of their last three tournaments together.

Every isn't planning anything special to commemorate the occasion, but that didn't

stop him from speculating about Vargas' pre-tournament agenda.

"James might take a shower before we play," said Every, receiving a glaring look from Vargas.

When they aren't throwing jabs at one another, the seniors display a kind of brotherly love.

"It's James' and Brett's last SEC too," Every said. "So I think we all probably want to win it for each other more than ourselves."

When Vargas was in the lineup this year, the Gators earned three tournament wins, four second-place finishes and one fourth-place finish.

UF placed seventh in the two tournaments in which he didn't compete.

Stegmaier is also no stranger to success, especially at the Seaside Course, where he won the SEC individual title as a freshman in 2003.

"I'd like nothing more than for Brett to win again this year," UF coach Buddy Alexander said. "I think he's at a point where he really would like to win a second collegiate tournament before it's all over for him. He should have some good feelings about going back to Seaside."

Freshmen Toby Ragland and Billy

Horschel will accompany the seniors on the road.

A win could mean more than a championship for the Gators, as UF will try to improve its 2-2 season record against SEC rival No. 1 Georgia.

"We've been chasing the Bulldogs all year long," Alexander said. "They're ranked No. 1. We're ranked number three. We played four times on the year. We're 2-2. ... It should make for an exciting SEC Tournament coming up this weekend."

Meanwhile, the No. 14 UF women's golf team will tee up Saturday at the Scarlet Golf Course in Columbus, Ohio, for the Lady Buckeye Tournament.



ing cornerback. "He likes to execute things the right way. He's got a thing about himself; I don't know what it is. He just has something about him."

It's an aura of confidence that even has UF coach Urban Meyer, typically an infamous pessimist this time of year, praising Atkins.

"He's having a really good spring," Meyer said. "He's aggressive and he's a contact player. A lot of times corners, they're like receivers — they're not the contact player he is. He can be a special player."

Last year, Brown and Webb were a very formidable duo, helping the Gators transform into one of the top defensive teams in the nation.

But Atkins said he hasn't felt pressure to duplicate last year's success, believing that will occur simply based on talent and ability.

He felt a much greater pressure to prove to Meyer and cornerbacks coach Chuck Heater that he's a capable No. 1 corner.

"The main pressure here was that the coaches don't give you anything," Atkins said. "Coming out here, no one was a starter. Once I got out here, the main thing was staying focused and working hard."

"The coaches told me to just keep coming to play, and you'll be a great player."

Performing well in practice doesn't always translate to success in

game situations, but Atkins already had his one shot on the field. He more than lived up to the hype.

In the regular-season finale against Florida State last year, an injury to Brown became an opportunity for Atkins. He responded with four tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery. He also made two key breakups that prevented the Seminoles from getting in the end zone in UF's 34-7 victory.


"It was all on me," Atkins said. "Coach told me before the game, 'It's your time to step up and play.' That's basically what I was waiting on all year to hear. When he told me that, I just went out in the game and kind of did what I'm doing now, which is get on the field and feel very confident about myself."

Now, Atkins believes he's ready to join the nation's upper echelon of cornerbacks. While he said it will take a ton of hard work, he thinks All-American accolades aren't out of the question.

"If he keeps doing what he's doing," Lewis said, "he might not be here all four years."

But Atkins has plenty of time to worry about his future. For now, he just wants to hit.

"When you're out on the field, there's just a lot of trash talk," he said. "I like to be out there on the corner, everyone thinking I'm just a little small guy. When they come my way, I like to just show them I'm nothing to play with."

2003 season under then-offensive coordinator Ed Zaunbrecher in his precision-passing offense. Larry Fedora replaced Zaunbrecher in 2004, installing more of a downfield passing game. Fedora left UF as part of Ron Zook's ousted coaching staff, and last season Leak had to adjust to Meyer and Mullen's spread offense, one that is predicated on the quarterback reading the defense and making snap decisions at the line of scrimmage.

Mullen said it takes time for any player

to pick up all the nuances of the offense, but he expects Leak to hold an advantage with a year's worth of experience.

"This is his first chance to really sink his teeth into an offense and be ready to go," Mullen said. "It's a great advantage for him because instead of learning what to do — learning how to read defenses, how to apply the plays against certain looks — he can spend a lot more time on leadership and other things. It takes a lot of time to learn all that stuff."

Now, Leak rarely misses a read, Mullen said. If he does, the quarterback reacts with specific questions rather than wondering if he ran the correct play.

"You're just more comfortable and able to anticipate things better," Leak said. "That's the major thing about the second year."

Gators Quarterbacks

Some might speculate that Tebow also might have played a role in Leak's new attitude. Even Meyer said he can't wait to see his top two quarterbacks compete head-to-head.

"Tim Tebow is a freshman — actually [he should be] a senior in high school right now — and that's what he is," Meyer said. "But we're going to protect him and let him look like the quarterback at the University of Florida. It's great for him, and he's one guy that I think

can handle it."

When the "T" word comes up, Leak just explains how he has tried to assist the freshman.

"Everybody who comes in is highly rated, highly talented," Leak said. "So the best thing you can do is give advice to a young guy."

Mullen believes it's just that kind of relationship that will improve both quarterbacks.

"It's more of a working relationship," Mullen said. "You have another quarterback that really studies the game and pays attention to things, who [Leak] can really talk to about what's going on out there on the field."

"That kind of working relationship is going to make them both better."
