



Heartbreakers plan for UF homecoming

■ LEGENDARY ROCK BAND WILL RETURN TO GAINESVILLE ROOTS.

Gainesville rock band Tom Petty & the Heartbreakers will perform at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Sept. 21, according to a press release posted on the band's

Web site.

The group will be stopping in its hometown as part of the Highway Companion Tour, a concert series commemorating the band's 30th anniversary.

However, an official at the O'Connell Center said the show has not yet been confirmed.

"We're still in negotiations, but we're optimistic about it," said Lionel Dubay, the O'Connell Center's facility director.

If the band does make it to Gainesville this fall, alternative rock band The Strokes will open for them.

The groups are set to hit the road for the third leg of the Highway Companion Tour

this September in Chicago.

Tom Petty & the Heartbreakers have not performed in Gainesville since 1993, when they played at the O'Connell Center.

UF senior Juliann Giese said she expects the upcoming show to revive excitement about the group.

"At least 85 percent of the student body will want to go," Giese said. "Tom Petty is the epitome of Gainesville rock 'n' roll, and people respect him."

Clubs unfazed after downtown shooting

About a week after a downtown concert turned violent, club employees and police officers say they do not expect more safety threats anytime soon.

At least six bullets were fired into the audience at 238 West, a downtown nightclub, on July

Public Safety 2. Florida-based rapper Plies was performing when his microphone was cut off, upsetting him and his posse and spurring them to open fire on the crowd of about 1,000 people.

While there were no fatalities, five audience members were injured and taken to Shands at UF.

But Gainesville Police officers and nightclub employees agree that the shooting was an isolated incident and that Gainesville remains a safe place for all club-goers.

Although police said they heightened security over the past weekend, Lt. Wayne Ash of the Gainesville Police said he does not expect another shooting in the near future.

"That was a very unusual circumstance for downtown," Ash said.

Jason Rockhill, who owns the downtown concert venue Common Grounds, said he believes the incident was likely a result of mismanagement.

"If you look at the whole night and each step taken, the whole situation could have probably been prevented," Rockhill said. "It all comes down to how you run your shows."

Rockhill said security at Common Grounds is typically low-key, because aggressive security tactics tend to create problems.

"Security is there," Rockhill said

STATE UF student drowns in Gulf Coast swimming accident

A UF graduate student drowned after jumping into the Estero River on the west coast of Florida Thursday.

Michael John Solich, 22, was docking a boat with his friend at the Koreshan State Historic Site in Estero when he decided to jump into the water for a swim, said Elizabeth Yeager, one of Solich's former professors. When Solich

did not resurface, a friend of his jumped into the water to rescue him and later called for help, Yeager said.

Rescuers pronounced Solich dead on arrival after they found him, she said. An autopsy revealed Solich had a broken spinal cord.

A native of St. James City, Solich was a student in the College of Education's ProTeach master's degree program. He would have graduated from a social studies track in August and planned to begin his teaching

career at Ida S. Baker High School in Cape Coral.

Colleen Swain, associate director and professor in the School of Teaching and Learning, taught Solich in one of her classes. Swain said he was able to infuse his teaching with his love of social justice, sports and the outdoors. He enjoyed fishing and boating and

was a certified scuba instructor.

was a certified scuba instructor.

"Mike is a person everyone would like and one that you would want to be your friend," Swain said. "I don't think I ever saw him meet someone or encounter someone that he didn't like."

Yeager, who was also Solich's adviser, is helping students in Solich's ProTeach group cope with their friend's death. Students gathered last week to tell stories about their friend



Hot-blooded

Capote masterpiece is basis for marathon reading

At 11 a.m. Monday, Tom Miller prepared for a 17-hour reading marathon of Truman Capote's *In Cold Blood*.

The performance artist planned to read the

novel aloud from cover to cover, while business at The Shamrock Irish Restaurant & Pub would run as usual.

"Seventeen hours, give or take," he predicted. "If it takes until Thursday, I'm going to read it until Thursday."

Miller said he would not let anything get in

his way of completing his performance.

"People will be carrying on as usual. They will be playing the jukebox and socializing, but I will be in a trance. I'll either finish it or drop."

Miller wanted to bring an artistic aspect to the book and promote Capote to his audience, he said.

In *Cold Blood* is a nonfiction account of the murder of a Kansas farming family and the capture, trial and execution of the killers, who had no apparent motives and left few clues.

"Capote took five years to write this book and 10 years to go downhill getting involved in drinking and drugs," Miller said. "He never finished another novel again."

Miller condensed Capote's life into his show by creating a metaphor of a performance artist going through a similar experience of deterioration reading aloud hour after hour.

"Capote," the 2005 film about the author's life, and *Pride Week* inspired Miller to create the metaphor of the gay writer's life through the experience of his novel.

"It's weird," he said. "I don't know why I'm doing it. Capote is such a significant writer."

Miller said this would be his first time reading the book.

"That's why I'm doing it," he said. "I just wanted to read the book."

Miller approached his performance intending to transform himself into Capote and let the audience experience the book as if Capote was reading his masterpiece.

Miller abandoned his own character af-

ter making a stop for lunch at Taco Bell and changing his clothes into what he thought Capote might have worn. He set up a stage with a table and a simple lamp. Signs surrounded the stage asking customers not to interact with Miller during the reading.

A black tailcoat hung from his shoulders. He snapped the tag off his black sunglasses and dropped a handful of change into his donation bucket to prepare for his performance. To complete his transformation into the writer, Miller placed a black top hat on his head, checked his appearance in a mirror and took a seat. He crossed his legs and began to sip his mint julep — Capote's favorite drink.

"When he told me he wanted to read the entire novel, I thought he was crazy," Shamrock manager Aidan Brophy said. "I didn't think he could do it."

As the hours passed, Miller continued reading. People came and went all day Monday. Miller continued the act. The television was on and the music was playing, but Miller continued reading and sipping on mint juleps and gin.

Unable to pronounce a word in the book, he said, "Did I write that? I don't even know how to pronounce it, so I will be taking that out of the book."

By 8 p.m. Miller was about halfway through the book and still reading with the same enthusiasm in his Capote voice.

His sunglasses covered his face in the dark, green room, but he could still see the print with the light of the lamp. A few empty glasses lined the table.

Miller was in for a long night.

UF ADMINISTRATION 'Go Gators' picks up momentum

UF visitors can now say they have been welcomed into the Gator Nation with an award-winning film.

"The Undergraduate" and "The Making of the Undergraduate," a two-part film shown to prospective students in UF's Welcome Center, is one of the three public relations videos for which UF has won awards during the past six months.

The university has won seven awards total for three videos in its Gator Nation advertising campaign, which kicked off last September. "Boundaries," a Web advertisement featuring UF President Bernie Machen, and "Go Gators," a television commercial, also won awards.

"The Undergraduate" and its counterpart make up a recruitment video designed to resemble a movie trailer and making-of feature.

"Since last August, we've paid special attention to the quality of our communications, because we were

launching our Gator Nation theme," UF Marketing Director Karen Willis said.

"We want the people here on campus to be proud of what their university represents and how it is presented to the external world."

"The Undergraduate" earned four awards: the Florida Public Relations Association's Golden Image Award, the Bronze Anvil Award of Commendation from the Public Relations Society of America, a Telly Award and a gold medal from the Council for Advancement and Support of Education.

Willis said about 25,000 people see "The Undergraduate" and "The Making of the Undergraduate" each year.

"I think it's been a tremendous

boost for us to be able to compete on a national platform with our communications vehicles," she said.

"Boundaries," the Internet commercial that launched the Gator Nation campaign, won an ADDY award from the Gainesville Advertising Association. "Boundaries" shows Machen riding a motorcycle out of Gainesville and placing Gator Nation signs around the country and world, eventually going to the moon.

Quinten Eyman, a senior broadcast producer with the University Relations News Bureau, said the ad campaign's creators wanted to show how far the Gator Nation stretches.

"Go Gators," a television spot that often ran during football games last fall, won a Telly Award and a national ADDY Award. The commercial plays on the "Go Gators" mantra, featuring people encouraging one another to "go cure cancer" or "go to outer space."

"We want the people here on campus to be proud of what their university represents and how it is presented to the external world," Willis said.







Organization curbs feral cat populations with snip

■ ONE WOMAN ROUNDED UP 30 CATS FOR EVENT.

Teri Darling spends her free time searching around trash bins, but she isn't looking for what you might think.

She searches for stray and feral cats.

Darling is one of Operation Catnip's regular trappers. The organization works to spay, neuter and vaccinate stray cats as a means of controlling their population.

Around Gainesville

Operation Catnip relies on local residents to trap and bring in stray cats to the UF veterinary school, where students and veterinarians spay or neuter the animals. On Sunday morning, Darling brought in 30 cats, which took her between one and two weeks to trap.

The organization, whose local chapter was founded in 1998, spays or neuters between 2,000 and 3,000 cats each year.

Chi Frost, from Columbia County, brought in 13 cats Sunday.

If she sees a group of cats moving at night or lurking near trash containers, then she assumes there is probably a colony of cats nearby.

There are four or five dedicated trappers who trap for Operation Catnip every month, Frost said.

"This county is committed to do whatever they can do to make it a no-kill county, and it is going to be the wave of the future," Frost said. "People are going to get sick and tired of taking tax payers' dollars to kill animals."

Operation Catnip spayed or neutered and vaccinated 211 stray or feral cats for free on Sunday.

The organization practices a program called Trap-Neuter-Return, which volunteers call a "humane" alternative to euthanasia and which returns animals to their original colonies.

Julie Levy, the president and founder of Operation Catnip in Alachua County, was among the veterinarians performing the sterilizing procedures Sunday.

Levy, who is also an associate professor at UF, is also working to develop a sterilization vaccine for cats.

"I would like not to have to do this the rest of my life," she said.

But for now, she is willing to do whatever she can to control animal populations.

"We don't like to see killing cats as a means to controlling them, so long-term we would like to make

this part of the campaign to end overpopulation," she said.

Levy said she thinks there are 36,000 stray and feral cats in Alachua County.


"I think a lot of people don't un-

derstand how big the problem is," Levy said. "So they are frustrated that the problem is still there, but obviously the problem is still there because they are breeding a lot faster than we're neutering."





Each Thursday night, UF students can stroll among tropical butterflies or admire Andy Warhol's art without ever leaving Gainesville.

The program also allows students to mingle while they munch on free food, listen to local musicians and browse art exhibits every Thursday from 5 to 10 p.m. at the Harn Museum.

"It's a great date night," Mica said.

This week, students can browse modern artwork by Andy Warhol, Frank

Stella and other contemporary artists at the "American Matrix: Contemporary Directions for the Harn Museum Collection Part II" exhibit at the Harn Museum.

Entry to the Harn Museum is free, though a donation is suggested.

Thursday, museum educator Brandi Breslin will host a talk about pop art and pop culture at 6 p.m. at the Harn.

"So often, students get wrapped up in school work," said Christine Hale, the museum's director of marketing and public relations. "It's a great diversion."

Last week, about 150 Student Life students attended Museum Nights, Mica said.

Local musician Scott Effman provided music for the program.

"He was amazing," she said. "He did some pop music with his own twist."

Mica said she encourages all students, especially freshmen, to take advantage of the cultural and social experiences Museum Nights offers.

"One of the things that makes UF a great school is its ability to bring students closer together," Mica said. "Going to small events is the best way to get to know fellow peers."

During the rest of the year, the program is funded by the UF Provost's Office with a \$250,000


budget. Events will be offered every Friday night during Fall and Spring.

Gatormania grows up to welcome UF's new class

The North Lawn crawled with people Saturday morning as representatives of more than 50 student organizations scurried to set up their booths with carnival-style attractions before the start of the Gatormania carnival.

The lawn was covered with signs, graffiti walls, balloons, snow cones, cotton candy, games and inflatable attractions. More than 800 people showed up for the festivities, soaking in information about the different organizations that UF has to offer.

Gatormania is a part of the monthlong program put on by the Dean of Students Office, designed to help new students transition to UF. The program is called Weeks of Welcome, commonly known as WOW.

The goal of Weeks of Welcome is to help students to make connections and get a chance to preview all of the doors that can be opened to them, Wibeto said.

"At Gatormania, the groups unite for one common purpose: to create a festive and celebratory atmosphere where the variety of organizations and talents is shared to help the new freshman develop a greater sense of pride in becoming part of the UF family," said Leticia Martinez, director of the Institute of Hispanic-Latino Cultures.

"We have had so much fun," UF freshman Meghan Sipula said. "I knew there would be activities, but this is much better than I thought it would be."

Sipula attended Gatormania with friends as part her First-Year Florida class. This is the first year that teachers of the class required students to attend Gatormania. The class is designed by the New Student Programs branch of the Dean of Students Office to ease new students' acclimation to the university.

Gatormania cost more than \$5,000 this year, Martinez said. A number of different organizations split the funding, with the

Dean of Students Office and the Institute of Hispanic-Latino Cultures ranking as the two main contributors.

The money is spent on marketing, food, raffle prizes and games. A large portion of the money goes to the inflatable attractions, which included water slides, obstacle courses and a giant Twister board.

Gatormania attendees received "passports" at the first booth they visited. As the students inquired about the various organizations, they received a stamp on their passports at each booth. After filling them up with six stamps, students turned them in and were eligible for different raffle prizes. Some of the grand prizes were one year of free Ben & Jerry's ice cream and a Princeton Review test-prep course.

Highlights of the event included a fashion show and two talent shows. One, Gator Get Down, included Latino folk dancing, salsa dancing and lip-synching.

Martinez glowed as she talked about the event that she has watched grow into a celebration of diversity.

"Gatormania has become a campus-wide celebration for all Gators, young and old," she said.



Howdy, sheriff: Five candidates ready for campaign

Alachua County Sheriff Steve Oelrich announced Thursday that he will resign Sept. 29 to run for a state Senate seat.

An interim sheriff will be appointed by the governor to serve after Oelrich leaves, and in November, a new sheriff will be elected to serve a two-year term.

Oelrich said Monday in a telephone interview that he's grateful to UF students for their support over the years, even though he graduated from FSU.

"All in all, I think the sheriff's office has a good relationship with University of Florida

students," he said.

All of the five candidates running to replace Oelrich have similar ideas for the office's student-centered policies.

Sadie Darnell, a Democrat, described the student population in Alachua County as its "lifeblood" and stressed that an open dialogue between the community and its law enforcement is vital.

Emery Gainey, a Republican endorsed by Oelrich, said he wants to protect the "student experience."

Democrat Bill Davis said, "Students are just as important as any other resident in Alachua County."

The candidates are concerned with the

conflict that tends to arise when students and long-term residents live in the same neighborhoods, and they recognize the need to bring balance to these areas.

The candidates agreed that law enforcement's primary role is to enforce the law and maintain safety.

However, educating citizens about the sheriff's office also ranks as an important priority.

Democrat Lonnie Scott said he thinks education is lacking.

He said he wants to work with students to solve common problems, adding that law enforcement alone cannot resolve the issues.

"I want to open up dialogue," he said. "I don't think citizens want just a monologue."

Gainey said, "Law enforcement and students not communicating is a recipe for disaster."

He said he plans to continue the policy of working with student organizations, adding that he wants the voice of the sheriff's office to be present in student communities.

Darnell said that she will work to make students less vulnerable to victimization and, in turn, more responsible.

Meanwhile, Democrat Butch Jones plans to make structural changes that the other candidates aren't talking about.

If elected, he said he hopes to unify the sheriff's office with the Gainesville Police Department to save money and make the county's operations more efficient.

Also, he said he plans to decentralize the agency into a number of substations in different county communities.

He said he thinks this will help the office reach out to specific problems.

"Everybody has a unique issue," he said. "Whatever the unique issue is for the students, we're going to be there to address it."

Republican Jeff McAdams, who is listed among the other candidates on the Alachua County Supervisor of Elections Web site, said Monday that he is no longer running for sheriff due to other commitments. However, he said he has a great rapport with UF students, citing his work with Student Government over the years. He said that prefers education to confrontation. But McAdams said he is not satisfied with the status quo or what the candidates are proposing.

He expressed his concern that students sometimes feel like outcasts.

"Are we really a college town?" he asked. "Or just a town with a college in it?"

If it weren't for students, the community wouldn't be what it is, he said.

"I want to bring vision to Alachua County," he said. "I'm going to do it one day."

Candidates, party supporters chew fat at barbecue

■ DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATES EMPHASIZE AGENDAS.

More than 1,000 people ate barbecue, showed their support for Democrats and even soaked the president at the first We the People Rally & Barbecue on Sunday evening.

Candidates and organizers said the rally, which was held at the Alachua County Fairgrounds, was a great way for politicians and voters to meet, discuss issues and generate interest in the upcoming elections.

"I think it's incredible — just the kind of event the Democrats need to get set for this primary," said state Rep. Ed Jennings Jr.


The highlights of the event, which was hosted by the Alachua County Democratic Executive Committee, were speeches by Jim Davis and Rod Smith. Both men are seeking the Democratic nomination for governor.

Smith, a state senator, already has strong ties to Gainesville. The UF law school graduate prosecuted Danny Rolling when he was on trial for the murder of five Gainesville students.

Smith said he appreciated the rally's response to him.

"I think it's wonderful," he said. "We've always had great support from the area."

Smith spoke about the growing

shortage of teachers, election reform and rising insurance rates for homeowners.

He said he expects people will be upset when they discover how much their insurance rates have risen.

"If you're a Baptist, take Maalox,"

he said. "The rest of you are going to need a drink."

Smith also added that no matter how the election turns out, he will always remain a die-hard Gators fan.

Davis, a congressman from Tampa, emphasized the importance

of student voices in the upcoming elections.

"Students have more at stake in this than anybody," he said. "It's their future."

He spoke about health care, environmental protection, and the rising cost of living and home ownership.

Marcela Pineros, a 31-year-old singer-songwriter who attended the event, said the speeches convinced her to support Davis. She also said she enjoyed the rally and meeting the candidates in person.

"Getting to meet the candidates is so rare," she said. "You can ask a direct question that pertains to you."

Attendees had the chance to soak a volunteer wearing a George W. Bush mask, if they could hit the dunk-tank target.

Allan Guthier, 23, said he felt that the event could have been much larger and attracted more Democratic students who might have become disillusioned by the 2004 election.

"I would have expected to see a huge crowd here," Guthier said.

Democratic Executive Committee Chairman Jon Reiskind agreed that there were few students. He speculated that the timing of the DEC's event promotion could have affected the number of students in attendance.

Still, Reiskind called the rally a unique event and a learning experience.

"It's just a good feeling here with lots of Democratic primary elections coming up," he said.

Joe Rock, 27, said that he liked the speeches and enjoyed the petting zoo, but joked that he was slightly disappointed about the lack of alcohol.

"If they want me here in the future, they better have beer," he said.

of Common Grounds. "But it's not an intrusive part of your night."

Other downtown locales such as The Market Street Pub and Side Bar also have more relaxed security policies.

"We check IDs and look them over," said Jorge Fors, the main security guard at Side Bar. "As long as they're not too intoxicated or too aggressive, they can come in. You just use your best judgment."

Market Street security guard Jordan "Gooch" Gross said that in the eight months he has been working at the club, he has never encountered a problem with customers.

"I've never seen a real punch thrown," Gross said. "We usually just ask disorderly people to leave."

However, if a problem ever occurs at Market Street, Gross said there is almost always a police officer within shouting distance.

Fors, the Side Bar security guard, added that performers do not get any special security treatment at the bar.

"We don't treat the bands any differently than the customers," Fors said.

In case of a threatening incident, Common Grounds has plenty of emergency exits around the building, Rockhill

said.

Common Grounds has a steady flow of "regulars," who are usually well-behaved, Rockhill said.

"We've called the police maybe twice since we've been here. If a problem did occur, it wouldn't be security against the crowd," Rockhill said. "It would be the crowd and security against the problem."

Ash said that to ensure that police and club owners work together effectively, GPD holds orientations to go over nightclub responsibilities and safety procedures.

He added that Gainesville residents have no reason to be scared but that they should always be aware of their surroundings.

Rockhill said he agrees that security can only go so far. "The chances of a gun being pulled here are the same as the chances of a gun being pulled in Wal-Mart," Rockhill said. "You can't metal-detect the world; you can't make it idiot-proof."

Ida S. Baker High School plans to establish a scholarship in his honor. Yeager hopes to set up a UF scholarship for ProTeach students who follow in Solich's footsteps.

Solich is survived by his parents, Gary and Cathy, and his brother Mark, all of Cape Coral. They are holding a visitation at Coral Ridge Funeral Home in Cape Coral today from 2 to 4 p.m. and 6 to 8 p.m. There will be a funeral Mass 11 a.m. Wednesday at St. Katharine Drexel Catholic Church, also in Cape Coral.

New UF hall filled with firsts

■ RENOVATION WAS POSSIBLE DUE TO PAIR OF ALUMNI DONATIONS.

UF students will soon be able to take courses with titles like Masculinity and Suburbia in a renovated building that will be the first of its kind on campus — and in the nation.

The first building to be named after a woman at UF will open Monday. Kathryn Chicone Ustler Hall is also the first building dedicated to women's studies on a college campus in the United States, said the dean of the new women's studies center.

Dean Angel Kwolek-Folland, Center for Women's Studies and Gender Research director, said the faculty members highly anticipate the move into the building, which is located off Fletcher Drive near the Racquet Club. The renovation cost \$4.5 million.

For the past 27 years, the professors' offices and students' classes were scattered across campus.

"To actually have a program like women's studies on the main campus," Kwolek-Folland said, "it's a very big statement about the administration of the college (and UF's) support for the idea of women's and gender studies."

In the Fall, the center will offer various courses, including Transnational Feminism, Women and Poverty, Ecofeminism, and Women and Modern Hebrew Fiction.

She said the hall is not necessarily as elegant as Anderson and Keene-Flint halls — two of UF's restored historic buildings — but instead retains the feeling of an airy gymnasium due to the building's many windows.

The hall has a unique setup with an open lounge for studying on the gym's original floor. Foreign language classes will also be held in the classrooms.

Kathryn Chicone Ustler donated about half of

the building's \$4.5 million renovation cost, and the state of Florida matched the remainder of the construction budget, Kwolek-Folland said.

Ustler is a 1961 alumna who majored in sociology and a native of Orlando. Her father was one of the organizers of the Gator Boosters program in the 1950s.

In December 2003, Ajax Building Corp. was hired to renovate the 1919 brick structure, which is on the National Register of Historic Places. A serious termite problem caused some delays in reconstruction. When the old Women's Gym closed, officials predicted the renovation would be completed in 2005.

"Restoring a historic building takes extra work and extra care, and a lot of people have been involved in making it happen," Kwolek-Folland said.

A separate donor, Herbert Yardley, gave \$500,000 toward the Catherine A. and Mary E. Yardley Garden, which will be a formal garden in front of the hall. The garden will be finished late September and will feature red oaks, palm trees, blue plumbago and dozens of other shrubs. UF President Bernie Machen, the donors' friends and families, and other guests will attend a dedication ceremony for the garden on Sept. 29.

Chelsea Moore, a women's studies major, said she is excited about having classes in the hall, because of the location on the main part of campus.

"There's a lot of majors that people don't know about, and women's studies is one of them," Moore said. "I was lucky enough to find it."

Design dean ready

He's only one man, but his vision has the potential to change a UF college.

The College of Design, Construction and Planning has a new dean who aspires to unite the college, UF Provost Janie Fouke said.

Christopher Silver, who will take the position in the Fall,

serves as dean of the department of urban and regional planning at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. "He's definitely someone who can be energizing and provide a focus for the college," Fouke said. "We're all excited at the opportunity we have to work with him."

Silver, 55, succeeds interim dean Anthony Dasta and former dean Jay Stein, who stepped down last Summer after serving for six years.

"There are too many times when each department acts thinking only of itself," Fouke said. "He wants to integrate the

departments so that they're more of a team."

Silver will earn \$185,000 in his new position.







UF women's sports plans supercede men's soccer

Sports must match gender ratio

Funny how men's soccer thrives on a campus that lacks a men's soccer team.

"The UF club soccer team could definitely be competitive against Stetson," said Jon Petrie, the 23-year-old goalie of UF's men's club soccer squad.

Unfortunately for Petrie and his teammates, they can only ask, "What if?"

Despite the World Cup mania that has swept the world and much of the United States, don't expect to see men's college soccer played at UF anytime soon.

Associate Athletics Director Lynda Tealer, said the university must maintain equal athletic opportunities for men and women.

Tealer said the UF student body is made up

of more than 53 percent women. Although UF women's sports outnumber men's sports 11 to eight, the focus must remain on expanding women's sports, she said.

"Regarding men's sports, focus is devoted to making sure that the sports offered are well-funded and competing at the highest level," Tealer said.

Title IX requires equal athletic and educational opportunities for women at UF, meaning that sports opportunities must match the male-female student body population ratio.

But despite the fact that the Gators probably will not add a men's soccer team, the UF men's soccer club remains popular.

According to the UF Department of Recreational Sports, the men's soccer club, founded in 1953, is the oldest collegiate soccer club in the nation. The competitive club

plays other university or college club teams throughout the southeastern United States.

Club Vice President Josh Brandsdorfer, 19, recalled trying out for the team last fall, when 85 students vied for just seven spots.

"At no point are you under the impression that [UF] wouldn't have a men's soccer team."

"University of Florida — that's an enormous school with an enormous amount of students, so at no point are you under the impression that they wouldn't have a men's soccer team, which I didn't know until I got there," said Brandsdorfer, who grew up in New Jersey.

Unlike Brandsdorfer, Petrie started his

college career at Stetson, where he played on the school's official team for two years before deciding to transfer to a bigger school.

His leading choices were South Florida and Central Florida, which both have Division I soccer teams. But league rules and his personal situation meant he would have had to sit out two years, he said. Only then did he consider going to UF.

Kyle Lokuta, 20, president of the club, described the team as the one to beat in the area. Two years ago, the team qualified for the national tournament but lost early, he said.

Patti Atchison, who sends her 12-year-old son to Duke's soccer camp every year, believed that too much money, time and resources are being spent on financially driven sports like football and basketball.

"We are lucky to have any men's sports that aren't big basketball or football," Atchison said. "I don't know if we'll ever have soccer

Sports bar gives Gainesville World Cup atmosphere

It wasn't the Super Bowl or the Final Four. But sports bar Gator's Dockside was packed with people shouting, cheering, drinking and jumping on chairs Sunday afternoon.

Georgia Bianchi, an Italian UF student, was not alone in celebrating Italy's win against France in the FIFA World Cup final match. More than 100 people packed into the sports bar to cheer when Fabio Grosso scored the winning penalty kick for Italy.

"It was a tough game, and France played pretty well," Bianchi said. "But I'm so happy that we became the world champion for the fourth time."

Bianchi, who was wrapped in Italy's flag, watched the game with her Jamaican, Iranian and American friends.

"I feel much more at home watching the game in a setting where you can yell and scream," she said. "That's what we always do back home, so I felt really good that I could do the same here."

When Italy scored the first goal, Bianchi's friend jumped on a table, draping Italy's flag around his head. Italy's fans, who outnumbered France's, banged on their tables, while the supporters of France chanted captain Zinedine Zidane's nickname, "Zizou."

When Zidane was ejected from the game after head-butting Marco Materazzi in the chest, Italian fans booed him, while France's fans fell into a prolonged silence.

When the match ended, Bianchi's friends snatched the flag and circled the bar, shouting "Viva Italia!" Bianchi hopped ecstatically, hugging anyone who would congratulate her.

Many American soccer fans also gathered for the event, and nearly all applauded while the nine big TV screens showed Bill Clinton at Berlin's Olympic Stadium.

All members of the Gainesville's Royal Knights soccer team were at


the bar because Gator's Dockside sponsors the team, said Andrew Sloan, one of the players.

Sloan said soccer is not very popular in the United States because the country has too many established sports. He added that big corporations spend too much money on those sports.

If the U.S. soccer team performed better in international games, the game would gain popularity among Americans, Sloan said.

"Soccer is the best sport in the world," Sloan said. "There's no stoppage and no second-guessing in this game."

He said one of the reasons soccer is not being welcomed by U.S. TV stations is because the game goes on with no stoppage. That does not give TV stations a chance to show commercials.

Mark Young, a Jamaican information technology analyst, said increasing Americans' interest in soccer is all about marketing.

"If you're not exposed to it, it," Young said.

"If the media stations pay more attention to soccer, it will increase the popularity of soccer in the U.S."

Frank Bandiera, a graduate student studying public health, said Americans see soccer as a distant sport.

"It's not just a game. It's a culture. It's like life," he countered.

Bandiera, who was born in Miami and has an Argentinean father and a Cuban mother, said immigrants are bringing the culture of soccer to the United States.

He said Miami has a lot of soccer-friendly bars now because many immigrants live there.

"But you can't watch that much soccer in Gainesville unless you buy cable," he said.

He was thrilled that a popular sports bar like Gator's Dockside showed bucked that trend by showing all the World Cup matches.

Gail Young, a doctorate student, suggested soccer is becoming more popular in the United States.

Pointing at her table where she was sitting with friends from several nations, she said the World Cup is bringing different cultures together.

"But don't forget, the game is really called 'football' in the world, not 'soccer,'" Young said.

Gators recruit released, former coach cries foul

■ **DONEAL MACK'S PREP COACH CLAIMS UF STAFF BROKE PROMISES.**

UF has lost a crucial piece of its 2006 recruiting class, as guard Doneal Mack (Statesville Christian, Statesville, N.C.) has been given a release due to academic reasons.

"Doneal did not meet enrollment requirements at the University of Florida and was thus released from his letter of intent," University Athletic Association spokesman Fred Demarest said in an e-mail.

Mack's high school coach, John Jordan, suggested differently.

Jordan claimed that UF's coaches turned their backs on the freshman-to-be.

Mack originally scored a 23 on his ACT but testing officials asked him to retake the test, possibly because he had scored much lower on his SAT in comparison, Jordan said.

Mack scored an 18 on the second try, which, according to Jordan, should have gotten him into UF.

"Coach [Billy] Donovan and Coach [Larry] Shyatt had told me and the family that if he got an 18 or a 19 that he was going to be OK — that they would go to bat for him," Jordan said. "So we felt good when he got the 18."

What happened next, Jordan said, was the following: Donovan and the coaching staff began to lose interest in Mack. Donovan asked Mack's father, Greg, to fight ACT over the Original test score. That was not a financially feasible proposition, considering that Mack could attend another premier program without the hassle. Greg did not return several phone calls.

"The difference between making an 18, a 19 or a 20 is not that much — certainly not enough to deprive the young man of anything at all," Jordan said. "We went on the word of UF's coaching staff. I feel like we trusted the coaching staff at Florida. We did our part, but they didn't do theirs."

"My personal opinion is that they over-recruited the position, and it was their chance to unload somebody and make room for another big."

UF cannot comment on the situation because Mack has become a recruit all over again.

According to the NCAA Clearinghouse, the ACT score a prep-student-athlete must post for entry into a Division I college depends on that student's GPA.

The buzz last Friday was that Southeastern Conference rival Kentucky was looking to sign Mack — perhaps to remove the bitter taste from losing a coveted recruit to UF in June.

The Gators wooed 6-foot-7 New Jersey power forward Dan Werner away from the Wildcats.

But Kentucky's courting of Mack might not

be anything more than a rumor.

"When I talked to him on Friday, they were working on getting him into summer school at Memphis," Jordan said. "That's what he's leaning toward. He's had offers from Tennessee, Kentucky and Virginia Tech, but he's leaning toward Memphis."

Jordan said that Memphis coach John Calipari has made an impression on Mack.

"When he's talking to Doneal, he's talking about a personal plan for Doneal," Jordan said. "He really likes that because he wants to be a pro."

Scout.com lists Mack as the 19th-best

shooting guard in the nation, as he averaged 21 points his senior season.

"Doneal's a great player, a scoring whiz," Jordan said. "He's a strong defender. He could play multiple positions, probably one through three."

That's the kind of player who could have made an immediate impact for UF.

With guard David Huertas already leaving the Gators for Mississippi and Brandon Powell becoming the lone incoming freshman guard, UF could face backcourt issues next season.

The situation could turn even murkier next off-season when Corey Brewer and Taurean Green will have professional prospects to consider. Also factor in that Lee Humphrey will be graduating.

Demarest said UF will probably remain content with its roster for the time being.

This marks the second consecutive summer that an incoming recruit failed to meet UF's academic criteria.







