Wednesday reopening set

An expanded and renovated Library West will open its doors to the public Wednesday at 1 p.m. after nearly three years of work that cost UF \$30 million.

With an elated sigh of relief, Bill Covey, the interim director of library support services, made the announcement Friday afternoon to library staff after receiving word that the building was fit for use.

An official opening ceremony will not be held until late Fall.

On Friday, architects from Long & Associates and UF Facilities Planning & Construction officials completed their final walkthrough of the library, giving their stamp of approval to the UF Department of Environmental Health and Safety, which issued the certificate of occupancy.

An official from the health and safety department combed through the library Thursday himself, signing one of the last major approvals.

"I've been walking through this building for the better part of a year and a half — most of the time without elevators," Covey said.

The old library was 117,000 square feet, and 60,000 square feet were added in the expansion.

The old structure, which was renovated, is six floors high. The expansion was added to the north side of the building and is three floors.

Upon passing through the library's revolving doors, escalators lead to the second floor, where the walls are curved and paneled in hickory — a difficult design for the builders to achieve, Covey said.

Several new computers line the circulation desk, and a glance out the southern windows reveals a perfect panorama of Century Tower, the University Auditorium and the sea of green that is the Plaza of the Americas.

Back the other way, hallways head north and hundreds of shelves appear. Exposed pipes and vents decorate the ceiling.

Polycarbonate sheets are suspended above the shelves to diffuse the fluorescent light, a method that helps preserve the books.

West University Avenue comes into view, a sight that only gets better with each rising floor.

Spacesaver-brand shelves offer compact storage of books, and they are expanded and condensed with the touch of a button.

Floor integrity was an issue during the construction, Covey

said. In the old portion of the building, compact storage is only on the ground floor.

Books in the library put more stress on structure than do cars in a parking garage, Covey said.

About 55 tractor trailers of steel were brought in for the shelves, with two more trucks full of bookends alone.

With 855,000 books on the shelves, the space is only half full. A functional capacity is

about 80 percent, according to Covey, or 1.5 million books.




"It's never a finished project," Covey said. "We don't want to have it all full."

Desks and chairs populate the free space with their as-yet-untouched surfaces. Armchairs have cupholders and swiveling desks on either side. Computer stations also stand among the crowd, their keyboards waiting to be stroked by busy hands.

There are about three times as many computers as before the renovation and about four times as many seats than in the old library.

"We wanted it to look modern, not dusty and old like most people think of a library," Covey said. "We're trying to make this an inviting place that's comfortable and easy to use."

But Library West is still a work

### UAA, fans look ahead to future stadium expansion

With the June announcement of the Ben Hill Griffin Stadium expansion, UF students are welcoming the proposed addition.

Telly Concepcion, a Gators defensive back, said the expansion of the weight room will bring the football team closer together.

"Right now we have to split up into four different workout groups," he said. "With the new weight room, we'll have almost all the team together at one time, which will give us better team chemistry."

The \$12 million to \$15 million expansion will be funded mostly by the Gator Boosters, said Brian Barton, a University Athletic Association coordinator of operations.

Barton also said the project does not have an official contractor or start date because the UAA wants to raise more money.

The renovation will expand the stadium weight room, the football coaches' offices and the Gator Room, a space for recruiting athletes and for special events, Barton said.

The project will also create a visible entryway on the southwest side of the stadium, establishing a focal point at one of the main intersections on campus, Gale Lemerand Drive and Stadium Road, according to a UAA project report. It will also serve as the main entrance for the football program.

Barton said the project will make the stadium a first-class facility.

# Gator season to begin

Gator season starts Aug. 15 — and it has nothing to do with football.

Anyone with an alligator-trapping license and harvest permit is able to participate in the two-and-a-half month long statewide gator hunt this fall. The hunt ends Nov. 1.

Licenses cost \$250 and allow a hunter to take two alligators throughout the season.

"I think it'd be pretty cool," said SFCC student Max Goodman. "As long as I have my legs when it's over."

Hunters need to be more cautious dealing with alligators than other animals because of their size and biting capabilities, said Harry Dutton of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. He said the state has a very low record of serious injuries involving alligators.

"People do get nipped," Dutton said. "But no one has died or had their hand bit off. I've never even heard of someone losing a finger."

Dutton said the classes give potential hunters a chance to ask questions. They also are a good opportunity to teach legal techniques.

Hunting can be done in lakes and rivers all over Florida. The lakes must be labeled as designated alligator management units to legally hunt in them, Dutton said.

Dutton said pistols, rifles and other firearms are not legally allowed to be used on alligators. Any weapon that a person can attach manually to the alliga-

tor with a restraining line is legal, including harpoons and bows and arrows.

"You gotta let him wear himself out," said Steve Stiegler, assistant leader of Florida's Alligator Management Program. "Once he's exhausted you can drag him in."

After the alligator has fought and been pulled to the boat, a hunter is allowed to use a bang stick to kill it, Stiegler said. A bang stick is a spear-like weapon that shoots bullets from the end. It is used in the water, and the pressure, not the bullet, kills the alligator.

Male or female, young or retired, a variety of people hunt alligators and attend the training classes, Dutton said.

"We see grandfathers every year," Dutton said. "And we see new 18-year-old faces who are just old enough to hunt."

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission offers free alligator-harvest training and orientation classes throughout the summer. The next class will be held on Saturday at the Okeechobee County Agri-Civic Center.

The classes cover safety, handling and effective methods of hunting alligators.

## Locals prevail in pasta fight

# Gender gap widens at UF, universities nationwide

Studying for financial accounting in the Reitz Union earlier this month, Jess Clark was admittedly falling behind his female study partner, Danielle Thomas.

Though the single course could be an aberration for Clark, a UF English major, and Thomas, a UF food and resource economics major, it is a sign of the times on college campuses nationwide.

Women first outnumbered men at UF in 1998, but women are now not only arriving at universities in greater numbers than men — they are also earning better grades and are more likely to get bachelor's degrees within four years, according to U.S. Department of Education statistics.

UF follows that national trend, said Jeanna Mastrodicasa, the junior associate director of the Honors Program at UF.

The average female grade point average for the Spring 2006 semester was 3.33, while the average male GPA was 3.14, according to university statistics.

Members of UF's Greek community have not been spared from the gender divide either.

The average fraternity member GPA was 3.271 while sorority member GPA was 3.402.

"If you look at leadership in student organizations, it's also predominantly women," Mastrodicasa said.

It is partly a maturity level issue and a matter of focus, she said. Traditionally, women mature earlier in high school and begin thinking about putting together resumes before men do.

Thomas, the food and resource economics major, said women are more attentive and answer more questions in her classes. Although she did not want to say women were trying to compete with men in academics, she said they do feel like they have something to prove.

"We definitely want to show them that we're individuals," she said.

UF Provost Janie Fouke knows the intimidating feeling of looking around a classroom and seeing only few members of her gender.

Fouke, who holds a graduate degree in biomedical mathematics and engineering from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, said, "I've been in many classes where there were 100 men and two women."

She could not apply to Ivy League schools such as Yale University and Dartmouth College because they were not admitting

undergraduate women before she graduated high school in 1969.

Because women did not have the same educational opportunities as men for so many years, they might feel they have to perform better, Fouke said.

Although, she added, "I think most high achievers compete with themselves more than they compete with others."

American history professor Steve Noll, who joined the UF faculty in 1992, has noticed the gender shift.

Reading off of the online roll for his Fall course on United States History Until 1877, Noll saw a lot more Gabrielles and Laurens and Rachels than he saw male names. In that and the other American history survey course, U.S. History Since 1877, which many students take to meet general education requirements,

about 60 percent of the students are women, he said.

But in the seminar for history majors that he taught in the Spring, there were only five women in the 22-student class, because there are more men who major in the subject, he said.

Men made up about 42.5 percent of the country's college students in the fall of 2004, according to Education Department statistics, the most recent available.

But in the Fall 2005 semester at UF, they made up about 47 percent, according to records on the UF Office of Institutional Planning and Research's Web site.


In areas where the majority is historically men like engineering, things have not changed much. Of the 6,635 College of Engineering students enrolled in Fall 2005, 5,294 were men — nearly 80 percent.

Also, men still make up the majority of Honors students, Mastrodicasa said.

Men perform better on standardized tests like the SAT and the ACT, a major factor in admittance, because, generally, men score higher on the math portions, she said.

According to officials in the UF Office of Admissions, the incoming freshmen class is expected to be about 60 percent female.

# Give thanks

## City approves much-needed towing laws

It may be difficult for us to admit, but sometimes the Gainesville City Commission gets things right.

Earlier this month, the commission approved a number of changes to local towing regulations. And as a group of people so familiar with the wonders of the local towing market, we couldn't be happier.

No longer will you have to pit your word against the towing companies' while they hold your car as collateral; towers will have to take photographs proving that a car was illegally parked before they can tow it.

And no longer will you have to face an additional fee for not having exact change when retrieving your vehicle; towing companies will be required to accept credit cards.

All the planned changes are scheduled to go into effect within the next few months.

But we expect that those changes will make a few towing company owners a little unhappy. When the issue of payment via credit cards was brought up last spring, it provoked a hostile response from Ultimate Towing President Stan Forron.

"If a company wants to go out of business, sure, they'll accept credit cards," he said.

We might call that an added bonus, but if towing companies are seriously in danger of going out of business because they accept credit cards, they should petition the city commissioner's to raise towing rates — simple as that.

Hopefully, the recent changes will prompt a more serious discussion of alternatives to towing. For a city so intent on revitalizing its downtown area, the commission should be seriously concerned about the ubiquitous "tow-away zone" signs along University Avenue and Main Street.

But, for all our gripes, the towing companies play an important role: keeping people off other people's property.

In the same interview last Spring, Forron, apparently determined to play the role of the angry towing-company guy out to the very end, said, "All these folks say 'you target the students,' but we target people who park illegally. ... We are contracted to do a job, and we're gonna do it."

Hats off to him. And remember: If you don't want your car towed, make your friends drive.

## A simple choice

Being college students, we understand procrastination.

The rationale for procrastination is at once both comfortingly familiar and brilliantly simple: Why do today what we could do tomorrow, when tonight we might die in our sleep?

But a crucial element of being a good procrastinator is knowing when to stop.

# Chicago makes right move with living wage

# Woman fends off early morning intruder in attack

A man attacked a woman living in Windsor Park apartments in her hallway early Friday morning.

The 20-year-old college student finished studying for a test and went to bed at about 1:30 a.m. Shortly after, she heard her apartment's alarm system beep, telling her that a door or window was open.

She got out of bed to see what it could be, as she knew no one else was home, according

to the Gainesville Police.

The suspect "bull-rushed" the woman, forcing her back into her bedroom, then tore her clothes off, GPD spokesman Sgt. Keith Kameg said.

"It appears his intent was only to rape the suspect," Kameg said.

The woman kicked, scratched and screamed at the suspect until he finally gave up and ran away.

She immediately locked her door and called the police department after she fought him off, Kameg said.

Police didn't find evidence that the suspect

used force to enter the apartment, but the suspect entered the apartment through a sliding-glass door that the woman may or may not have locked, Kameg said.

Officers are still investigating the case as attempted sexual battery and possibly attempted robbery.

Kameg said the woman fought back and put herself in a great position for the situation she was in. She was aware of her surroundings and knew something was wrong.

Windsor Park apartments, formerly Cambridge apartments, is located at 3705 SW 27th St.

Kameg said the apartments are located in a place where there is usually not a lot of crime.

He said that GPD has increased patrols, contacted surrounding communities and is asking for anyone with information to contact detectives at (352) 334-2470.

## UCF raise puts Machen in second

The University of Central Florida's president is becoming the highest-paid president of any public university in Florida after being granted a 40 percent raise Thursday.

UCF trustees granted John C. Hitt, 65, a new three-year contract that guarantees him \$450,000 in base pay and a \$100,000 bonus for the 2005-2006 academic year.

As UCF's fourth president, Hitt has conferred more than 103,000 degrees, about two-thirds of the university's total. He is readying the campus for a football stadium and a medical school, which is scheduled to be completed by 2009.

Since Hitt has been president, enrollment at UCF has doubled, research has tripled and doctoral graduates have quadrupled, said Linda Gray, assistant vice president for news and

information at UCF.

Hitt's sharp increase in salary could spark a salary race for the top among university presidents, Gray said.

The pay increase and new contract were based on a performance review by James Koch, former president of Old Dominion University. Koch has evaluated more than 40 college and university presidents over the past 10 years.

**State News** "Dr. Hitt ranks among the top two or three most effective presidents in this large group and, all things considered, may well be the most effective and productive president I ever have evaluated," Gray said that Koch wrote in his report.

With a base pay of \$405,000, UF President Bernie Machen's salary places him as the second-highest paid president in the state. Under Florida law, any president paid more than \$225,000 a year must be paid with non-public funds.

Machen has a very competitive salary package, said Manny Fernandez, the chairman of UF's Board of Trustees.

Presidents at UF and FSU receive around \$285,000 in bonuses for accomplishing their specific goals, Gray said.

Hitt's three-year goal bonus is \$210,000. He will receive it if he improves graduation rates, increases the quality of UCF's student body, improves the quality of the faculty, finishes the medical school by 2009, increases grants and contracts and helps with fund raising.

In order to keep Hitt at UCF and give him a salary that reflects his work of 14 years as president, Koch felt Hitt should be making a salary comparable to the top presidents in the country, Gray said.


Top presidents around the country make between \$400,000 and \$700,000, according to the report.

"He is worth every penny," Gray said.


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# UF program asks budding engineers to 'step up'


Everyone poops — Jason Mau and some lucky engineering freshmen know that firsthand.

As Mau passed around the book "Everyone Poops" and a jar containing dried pellets of waste products, he described his job as a wastewater process engineer at CH2M Hill to 47 UF engineering freshmen.

Rashad Hemphill, a computer engineering UF freshman, opened the jar. "It didn't smell very good at all," Hemphill said.

Mau and other employees at CH2M Hill, an engineering, construction and operations company, gave UF STEPUP students a tour of their Gainesville offices Friday. STEPUP, which stands for Successful Transition through Enhanced Preparation for Undergraduate Programs, is a program designed to promote academic success for minority freshman engineering students.

At least once a week, students listen to guest speakers or tour companies such as Gainesville Regional Utilities, The Walt Disney Co., and

Anheuser-Busch Cos. Inc. The speakers and tours give students the opportunity to see engineers in the field and form contacts, said

Stephen Roberts, assistant director for the Division of Student Affairs for the College of Engineering.

This is the first year CH2M Hill

has invited STEPUP students to its offices. Students visited about nine different professionals and attended two presentations in

three hours, said Ogechi Okpechi, an engineer at CH2M Hill who coordinated the tour and a former STEPUP mentor.

"It gives them the opportunity to see different industries," she said. "It also gives them a head start. It's good to see young people interested in this area."

With cookies and refreshments, Katie Riner, a lead technician at CH2M Hill, highlighted the students' career options in her presentation.

Through computer programs, Riner showed sketches of Bonita Springs utility buildings and the schematic phase of Gordon River, a current project in Naples.

"The possibilities are endless," she said. "Just like the STEPUP program."

At the end of the afternoon, STEPUP students seemed tired but happy as they took a bus back to campus.

"They're tired, but when Fall starts they're the ones helping themselves out," said Roberto Hernandez, an electrical engineering UF senior and STEPUP mentor. "They'll have a huge network, friends and know the campus. And they'll know where home is. It's Weil Hall."

# Generator could help UF prevent dinnertime disaster

If a monster hurricane heads toward Gainesville this year, UF officials need to be prepared.

That's why they're forking over about half a million dollars to build an emergency generator on the east side of the Gator Corner Dining Center.

"If electricity goes out [at the dining center],

there's a lot of food that's going to be wasted," said Michael L. Richarme, the project manager. "How would we feed people on campus?"

The generator will support the entire facility in order to provide meals for students and visitors who stay at the Southwest Recreation Center during a hurricane, Richarme said.

"The purpose of the project is for Gainesville's 'Katrina-type scenario,'" he said.

He said the generator would be strong enough to support refrigeration, air condition-

ing, electricity and some cooking. Most of the cooking at Gator Dining is done with natural gas, so cooking during a hurricane would con-

tinue as long as gas was provided, he said.

The generator will start on 40 hours' worth of diesel and then will be switched to natural gas, he said.

The project, which started in early July, is set to be done by Aug. 24, Richarme said.

James B. Morgan, director of UF's Business Services Division, first contacted Richarme about the project in January. Morgan said UF's Business Services Division is funding the project.

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# Officials: Library expansion four decades overdue

■ LIBRARY OFFICIALS HAVE NEEDED MORE SPACE SINCE OPENING.

As anti-war rallies raged on the Plaza of the Americas during the late '60s, UF library officials were worried about one thing — the security of the card catalogs.

When student protesters rallied against the Vietnam War near Library East and the then-new Library West, built in 1967, the university converted its card catalog system to microfilm in case it was destroyed, said Carl Van Ness, university archivist.

"There was some concern that some radicals might do something to the card catalogs," he said. "Needless to say, nothing happened."

During its nearly four-decade history, Library West has survived student protests, a growing student population and seemingly endless renovation projects

aimed at addressing the library's need for more space.

As a growing research institution during the 1960s, university officials recognized a need for a new facility to house its expanding research collections, said John Ingram, deputy director of university libraries.

"We had no space," he said. "We knew we would be acquiring more material to support our graduate and undergraduate populations."

The library closed for construction on the addition in December 2003 after a series of smaller renovations and the movement of materials to Library East, the Marston Science Library and an off-campus storage facility.

In 1963, university officials planned the \$2.2 million library, which included a proposed 80,000 square-foot future addition, according to a Library West PowerPoint presentation created for UF in 2003.

"When Library West was built, they planned on having a second phase," said

Vernon Kisling, science librarian and creator of the library PowerPoint presentation. "What we just finished doing was what they wanted to do in 1967."

On April 21, 1967, Library West opened with shelf space for 600,000 volumes, according to the presentation.

Today, the newly renovated library will use a "compact shelving" system to house nearly 1.7 million volumes, Ingram said.

"If you lay each shelf from end to end, you can go from here to Ocala," he said.

Although Ingram said Library West has space for a certain amount of growth, he said he is unable to predict how many

years it may be until the library may need more space because it depends on the size and number of future collections.


As growth continues to be an issue, the use of electronic journals and books has become a popular alternative to print materials in order to conserve space, Ingram said.

"Most of our user groups want to get their information at home or in an office," he said. "I think there will be an ever-increasing shift toward electronic resources."

The library will also continue to use an off-campus storage site to house less popular collections of books, Ingram said.

"A patron can request off-site material and it will be brought to campus and made accessible to them within 24 hours," he said.

Since the library closed in 2003, students and other library patrons have used the UF Libraries Web site to order books, which were then delivered to the Marston Science Library for pickup.

## SG searches for No. 2

Two Student Government executives interviewed candidates for SG's No. 2 spot Sunday, but neither official said he knew when a new Student Body vice president would be instated.

Student Body President John Boyles and Student Body Treasurer Ryan Moseley interviewed 14 candidates who responded to an e-mail Boyles sent to UF students last week. The e-mail offered students a chance to interview for the Student Body vice presidency, which was vacated by Lydia Washington in July when she resigned for academic reasons.

Three of Sunday's 14 interviews were conducted via speakerphone for candidates who were not in Gainesville because of study abroad programs or Summer internships.

But UF rules say those candidates are not qualified to hold the vice presidency.

The rules mandate that an interim vice president must take at least one credit hour during the Summer term of his or her appointment to the position.

Boyles said that about five candidates did not meet that requirement, but he is willing to overlook it.

He said he is just as likely to choose someone who does not meet the Summer credit requirement as he is to pick someone who does.

**Student Government** He is willing to lobby UF's administration to waive the rule. However, this may affect how long it will take for him to select a new vice president, although Boyles did not give a definite time frame for his decision.

"[The decision] depends on what's given to us by the administration," Boyles said Monday.

Moseley said he and Boyles would start narrowing the list of applicants after the administration makes its decision about Summer credit requirements.

## Grad students look ahead

It has been almost three years since graduate assistant Todd Reynolds last browsed the bookshelves of Library West. He said he misses the feeling of looking for a specific Herman Melville book in the library and finding another useful book on the next shelf.

"When it shut down, I was up in arms," said Reynolds, the chief steward and former president of UF's Graduate Assistants United group.

Reynolds and other UF graduate students will again be able to browse through Library West's collections when the building reopens Wednesday.

Interim Director of Support Services Bill Covey said the new building's sixth floor will have an area with study carrels and other resources exclusively for graduate students.

The floor will only be open for a general presentation Wednesday but is targeted to be ready for use in the Fall, Covey said.

The organization did not file a formal complaint with the university administration, but members were concerned about how the library's closing would affect research and projects.

Reynolds said the renovations delayed research for graduate students and upperclassmen.

Students had to wait an extra day or two to retrieve books with the library's file retrieval system, and they could not personally enter the off-campus warehouse where the books were stored, he said.

"I think it's important for a research institution to have a library on-site," Reynolds said.

Bret Seferian, one of the two current presidents of the organization, said he also missed the days when he could freely browse the library's collection. Sometimes, he said, he would accidentally order materials he didn't need.

"I would just order a bunch of books and return some of them," said Seferian, who is a doctoral candidate in history.


Some graduate students who used to attend Florida State University would drive all the way back to Tallahassee to use the university's library, he said.

Now, those students will be able to do their research in Gainesville, but the reopening of Library West may also bring about some unwelcome changes.

Reynolds said he opposes building a Starbucks in the new building. He said the cafe could take up space needed for books and might attract pests and other book-eating animals to the new building.

The Starbucks will be operated by UF's food services contractor, Aramark.

"It's not supposed to make a profit," Reynolds said. "It's supposed to be for the books."

## Starbucks will make late library arrival

Library West is finally opening its doors Wednesday, but students hoping to enjoy a latte in the new facility will have to wait until the middle of Fall.

Construction of the library's Starbucks cafe started Monday, said Bahar Armaghani, the project manager and quality assurance coordinator.

"If everything goes right, we should have it done by the first week of October," she said.

She said both Starbucks and the university have held up the project, as Starbucks has been working to meet UF codes as well as making sure the library's cafe fits the company's own standards.

The contractor constructing the coffee shop also had to get permits for demolishing the existing space. Then, the contractor had to obtain permits to remodel it into a Starbucks.

Armaghani said project managers are attempting to accelerate the cafe's opening.

"We are trying to beat the schedule by one week and have it done by the end of September," she said.

But Bill Covey, interim director for library support services, said he thinks that goal may be tough to meet.

"I think that might be a little premature in terms of how fast it can be done," he said.

He said he expects the construction to last until at least October.

in progress.

Covey said that the library is 90 percent complete, and many little things will be "appearing" over the course of the Fall semester.

Construction of an Aramark-operated Starbucks on the ground floor started Monday and will continue until October. Aramark is the contractor that provides UF's food services.

During a Friday meeting, construction officials assured that the Starbucks work would not interfere with library operation.

But Covey said there is no budget to fund the 24-hour study area that would accompany the cafe.

Minor installations of wiring, window glass and shelving in various places around the building are expected over the next few weeks.

The library's new booth seating areas have yet to be outfitted with their DVD players and monitors, and the library's three large plasma screens have not been installed yet.

Also, the study carrels are not ready and will be locked until the final adjustments are made.

But parking at Library West is virtually nonexistent.

UF transportation officials said Friday that parking for library patrons will not be an option, save for a few handicap spaces.

Allison Nitsch, a UF civil engineering major, has worked for UF's libraries since December 2004.

She had been to the old library only once before it closed and said she doesn't quite remember what it looked like.

Until June, she worked in Marston Science Library retrieving books for students. Since then, Nitsch has been in Library West preparing for the opening.

She dusted empty shelves before all the books were brought in by a professional moving service.

Now she and other staff members are busy shelf reading, where they scan call numbers to make sure the books are in order.

"I'm a little shelf read-out," she said.

Nitsch said she listens to indie and folk music while working.

When the library opens, she is slated to

work at the circulation desk.

UF journalism student Rene Perez said he's excited about the opening because the library has been closed since before he was a freshman.

"We wanted it to look modern, not dusty and old like most people think of a library. We're trying to make this an inviting place that's comfortable and easy to use."

He said he hopes the new library has a "modern feel."

"Marston tended to be somewhat sleep-inducing," he said. "It's some good sleep, but it doesn't help when I need to study."

And Perez said he's not worried that the library still has work to be done.

"We'll take whatever we can get now — as long as it's functional," he said.

UF librarian Jana Ronan is the program director for outreach instruction and undergraduate library services and has been working for the university since 1994. She and her co-workers moved into Library

West's new offices in May.

"We work on the front lines with people," she said, going on to describe that she teaches students about library research at the request of professors.

Ronan said she's looking forward to more room for the collections, a better work environment and the "clean, fresh design."

Ronan said she's especially excited about new microfilm technology that will make the process completely digital.

Before the library closed in 2003, librarians at the building's main circulation desk checked out an average of 1,000 books per day. During the closing, the number of books students could check out was increased to 100 for undergraduates and 250 for graduate students.

Ronan said she and the other librarians have the challenge of relearning the library to prepare for student questions.

"Nothing's better than a good question," she said.

After working with book retrievals, she said she misses the serendipity offered by a physical library.

"It's good to see people lose themselves in the shelves."



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
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

# Study: Good night's rest leads to better workdays

A recent UF study highlighted the importance of a good night's sleep for American workers and discovered that rest affects women especially.

The results of the study, set for publication in the October issue of the *Journal of Management*, suggest that a lack of sleep can decrease employees' job satisfaction, with female workers being particularly susceptible.

Brent Scott, a graduate student in management, conducted the study with management professor Timothy Judge over a three-week period in February 2005.

During the study, 45 participants visited a Web site to rate their job satisfaction, emotional well-being and difficulty sleeping at the end of each workday.

The results of the survey suggest a strong correlation between sleep problems and worker disgruntlement, something that caught Scott off guard.

"It's intuitive that one might feel a little irritable, but to experience emotional spillover to the point of actually feeling less satisfied with work is a little surprising," he said in a press release.

The study also suggests that women suffer more than men in the workplace when sleep-deprived, citing more complaints from female workers than from males.

In the press release, Scott suggested that sociological factors are to blame for the difference across gender lines.

"Women are encouraged to be nurturing and more emotionally expressive than men, who have been taught to remain stoic and restrain their emotions," he said.

Steve Arnett, clinical coordinator of the Sleep Disorder Center at Shands Hospital, was unsurprised by the findings

and said that the gender discrepancy was already well-known.

Women, Arnett attested, are naturally afflicted with more sleep problems than men.

"Women generally have more responsibility at home," he said, "which causes problems in general sleep patterns."

He also said that women are more likely to suffer from problems like restless legs syndrome and primary snoring, or snoring without sleep apnea, which prevent them from sleeping soundly.

He also noted that the study's reports of fatigue, irritability and job dissatisfaction due to lack of sleep are consistent with what sleep researchers had priorly established.

"Sleep is the time when your muscles heal; it's the time that your mind mends," he said.

Julie Miller, an assistant editor for Chicago-based legal magazine *Inside Counsel*, is intimately familiar with the toll a lack of sleep can exert on performance at work. Miller often copes with insomnia, which sometimes adversely affects her job.

"It's much more difficult to focus when I'm sleep-deprived," she said. It also makes her "a lot more irritable," and it effectively ruins her workday when she hasn't slept properly.

Arnett explained that mental and emotional issues like job dissatisfaction are bound to crop up in sleep-deprived Americans, especially in a culture taxed by too much work and

too little sleep.

Forty percent of Americans, he said, suffer from some sort of sleep problem, which likely has a major effect on their job performance.

According to a 2005 study by the National Sleep Foundation, 20 percent of men and 26 percent of women in America get less sleep than they need each night, with 50 percent feeling tired and fatigued at least one to two days a week.

"Americans will stop at 40 hours for the most part, but that's still too much," Arnett said, praising many European countries' shorter workweeks and less-pronounced sleep problems.

He acknowledged, however, that the United States still leads those countries in worker productivity, and cited means other than cutting their hours by which Americans can beat sleep deficits.

He pointed to "our hunger for entertainment and lack of self-discipline" as a major cause of sleep-related problems, and said that people are often more concerned with catching their favorite TV show than retiring early enough to get their optimal seven to nine hours of sleep.

It is becoming increasingly difficult for workers to juggle their work, family and recreational lives, he said, leading people to shave precious hours from their sleep — a biological process "just as important as eating."

The stress caused by Americans' busy lives also causes sleep deprivation. Being sleep-deprived can worsen stress, which may also increase job dissatisfaction.

"When you're not performing at your optimal potential, you're not likely to be satisfied by what you're doing," he said in reference to the study's conclusions.

In addition to sacrificing waking activities in favor of more sleep, Arnett gave other advice for workers looking to get more rest. The key, he said, is setting a regular sleep schedule.

## Gay issues on RA agenda

■ RESIDENTIAL ADVISERS TOLD TO PUT ASIDE PERSONAL BELIEFS.

They were all sinners to her, so she made a point not to be seen in public with one.

Then, last Summer, she challenged her beliefs and went to a Pride Student Union meeting.

"I was really scared and didn't know what to expect," said UF senior and Hume Hall residential adviser Gaellissa Francis. "I kept thinking, 'They're all gay people.'"

Being around and talking to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender students completely changed her perspective, Francis said.

This Fall's RAs will receive new, more interactive training about LGBT issues, said Julie A. McMahon, an assistant director at UF's Department of Housing and Residence Education.

"These are more powerful, more firsthand exercises," she said. "They're going to be eye-opening experiences for RAs."

Though RA training has always included a diversity program, it used to gloss over sexual orientation issues, McMahon said. Over the last year, a diversity committee has been working to introduce more innovative and exercises about LGBT acceptance.

One of the newest exercises involves RAs eating "Diversity Beans," which are jelly beans that taste differently than their colors suggest.

"You'll have a red jelly bean that tastes like a banana instead of a cherry," McMahon said. "We want to show that just because you look at somebody, that doesn't mean you know what's on the inside."

Reactions to the new training exercises have been positive so far.

"This last year we've had some of our best staff evaluations," she said. "Second-year RAs noticed the difference, and we're going to keep building on that."

Not only does McMahon hope to educate staff, she hopes to change RAs' perspectives.

"I know that there are folks out there who, if someone came to them, would open up their Bibles and spout off why being gay is wrong," she said. "When we're hiring, it's a red flag when we see someone who can't tolerate alternate views or lifestyles."

As a freshman at Florida State University, Paul Natiw had to put up with a lot more than dirty looks for being gay. Men on his dorm floor would hump each other whenever he walked by, and once, they covered his door in wet toilet paper.


"I respect other people's beliefs because I want them to respect mine," said Natiw, now a senior at UF majoring in linguistics. "It's wrong to reject a gay person just because they're different or because you think they're gross."

As for Francis, attending a Pride Student Union meeting changed her outlook but not her beliefs.

"I am a Christian, and I do believe homosexuality is a sin," she said. "I believe that all sins are equal, so being gay is just as bad as being a murderer."

But that's not what a resident would hear if he came out to Francis.

"I wouldn't tell him he's going to hell, but I would tell him what I believe," she said. "I'd also give him the resources to talk to someone about it. I know how to put aside my beliefs and do my job."

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
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



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# Leak denies report that alleges UF fans have racially insulted him

Pierre-Louis.

"Will they play? Sheer numbers tell you 'yes,'" Meyer said. "Now, are they mature enough, tough enough? I'll let you know. Talent-wise, they're fast. [They have] good size — good, athletic-looking people. They're qualified; they're intelligent.

"All indications are they're going to play this year for us."

Regardless, the Gators have something special in Nelson. As a junior transfer last season, he wowed coaches, players and fans alike with his speed and innate ability to always find the football. Now, with a safety position as deep as any on the team, moving Nelson is a no-brainer. At a short 6-foot-1, Nelson is better geared to become a professional cornerback anyway.

**LEAK DENIES RACISM:** UF quarterback Chris Leak denied a report that he has been heckled with racist comments by UF fans. A recent CBS SportsLine.com article quoted Leak's father, Curtis, as saying:

"There are fans who don't want Chris to break Danny [Wuerffel's] records because Chris is black. ... You have to

be blind to [not] see it is still tough for blacks in general in that conference."

The article also suggested fans at The Swamp have verbally attacked Leak because of his color.

"I really don't listen to things outside of me getting my education and me leading my team," Leak responded. "I really haven't listened to any outside things."

Asked specifically if he had ever heard racist comments at the Swamp, Leak replied: "Not that I know of."

**HARRIS STILL M.I.A.:** Meyer still doesn't know when or if defensive tackle Steven Harris will rejoin the team. Harris missed most of spring camp because of personal issues.

"I wish I could say he's back at full speed, ready to go," Meyer said. "I can't say that. I can say that at times it's there. ... However, there are a lot of issues still remaining there. At the appropriate time, I'll let you know."

When active, Harris is considered a starter at tackle.

During the week leading up to LSU's first scheduled game, players and staff volunteered at Carl Maddox Field House as the track venue was transformed from a shelter into a hospital.

The opener against Louisiana-Lafayette was postponed.

The Tigers' equipment staff washed 10,000 pounds of linens to be used at shelters.

Players visited evacuees while signing autographs and taking photographs with displaced families.

One player, quarterback JaMarcus Russell, housed music legend Fats Domino, his girlfriend's grandfather.

"We had to deal with the loss of homes, people couldn't call their parents and things like that, the electricity — but it made us bond as a team to really get together and love one another," Bowe said. "It was kind of a good thing and a bad

thing, the Katrina issue, but taught us how to cope with disasters."

Rita — another hurricane — ultimately hit and four games were rescheduled.

Miles said the team did not have a regular week until it played Vanderbilt on Oct. 8.

Nearly a year later, an 11-2 record and a 40-3 thrashing of Miami at the Peach Bowl are afterthoughts.

"What this football team had been through, the change in schedule, two hurricanes, in my opinion, gave great example to overcoming obstacles and really coming together," Miles said. "I think the best thing you can say about the '05 team is it was selfless and unselfish. They had great leadership and great character."

Miles made it clear that he would not choose to experience the ordeal again. The events, however, helped his players appreciate what they do have; it helped them put everything into perspective.

"I'll cherish this last year," Miles said, "as difficult as it was, I promise you."

Oh, I'm sorry; tell me which part of this equation is incorrect: 50 passing touchdowns = 350 points (assuming kicks are converted); 350 points/14 games (assuming the Gators make the Southeastern Conference title game) = 25 points /game; 25 points/game + 3 (assuming one field goal/game) + 7 (assuming one rushing touchdown/game) = 35 points/game.

If the Gators had scored 35 points in every 2005 game, they would have lost just one game.

In football, a quarterback's production is directly proportional with that team's success. It is possible to take a great arm, throw in a terrible defense and put it all to waste. UF's defense, however, is legitimately prolific — if there is such a thing for a defense. It's only perceived weakness — cornerback — has already been somewhat eliminated with the Reggie Nelson switch.

So Leak's proclamation is his way of saying: "I'm going to be kicking ass, taking names and finishing this year in Atlanta with a trophy hoisted above my head."

Meyer must not understand that logic at work here. We're not talking about Ricky Davis missing a layup on the wrong end of the court so he can rebound the ball

and nab a cheap triple-double.

In football, touchdowns equal wins. That's it. End of story.

But this is beside the point. There is so much more at stake here than team-first ideologies. Leak's sanity, for instance.

Here is a football player who has caught more flak for his public speaking than Charlie Chaplin. Leak is a man who keeps to himself; he clearly does not flout the Rev. Jesse Jackson's loquacious genes.

This reality has driven at least 11 to 12 sports writers into alcoholism. In turn, we keep bombarding him with scores of probing questions. It's a miracle Leak has yet to snap.

Instead, with his 50-touchdown admission, he has finally given us a glimpse into his soul. After all the Josh Portis gibberish, after all the Tim Tebow aggravation, after whispers of racism within the UF fan base, Leak lashes back with a worthy goal.

This is Kevin McAllister busting from under the bed, feeling his sac drop and taking on Joe Pesci with a blowtorch.

This is Napoleon Dynamite shedding his introvert-self for a Michael Jackson-like dance performance.

This is Viktor Navorski discovering himself in "The Terminal" and improving the lives of everyone around him in the

process.

Except Leak is not being given the chance to take on phase two.

Can you imagine Shaquille O'Neal vowing to shoot 75 percent from the free-throw line next season only to have Pat Riley scold him?

Can you picture Claudio Reyna promising to return for one more World Cup and record five assists there only to have the United States Soccer Federation admonish him as selfish?

Leak might never be the same, not with his very own coach's failing to understand his motives, his selflessness. He is being kicked back into his shell.

Just minutes after saying he wanted 50 touchdowns, a reporter asked Leak if he would be OK handing the ball off every play if that would get him an SEC title.

"I'd do it," Leak answered. "No question."

Apparently, Meyer wasn't listening. If Leak does somehow still pass for 50 touchdowns, it will give him 115 career touchdowns, one more than UF-record holder Danny Wuerffel.

But after Meyer's recent comments and other steady unwarranted criticism, we'll be lucky if Leak doesn't explode like a frozen soda can first.

"Our objective is very simple: You win, and that may mean handing off to the tailback."

What? Did I miss something?

Well, I suppose you can say Meyer wasn't here when Leak, an underclassman, vowed to stay single until he won a national championship.

I suppose Meyer closed his eyes when Alabama crushed Leak's shoulder last season and the starter took several pain-killing injections in the following weeks to stay on the field.

Perhaps Meyer hired a professional hologram to man the sidelines at the LSU game; that way he can say he never saw the Tigers sack Leak enough times to make finely ground human ice.

## Nelson turns corner

### Safety fills void left by Atkins

HOOVER, Ala. — UF coach Urban Meyer has the cornerback position covered.

Friday, Meyer announced he has moved safety Reggie Nelson to cornerback. The switch will alleviate pressure in a secondary reeling from the release of former Mainland standout Avery Atkins.

"He's going to start at corner," Meyer said. "... I think he'll answer the challenge. We made that move back several weeks ago. He's been responding."

After missing several spring practices to deal with personal issues, Atkins ran into legal trouble midway through June. Benarah Sanford, the mother of his child, accused Atkins of repeatedly punching her and trapping her in

his car for 20 minutes. Though no arrests were made, Atkins asked for and was granted a release.

It is believed that the Gators will also add Utah cornerback Ryan Smith, a freshman All-American in 2004. Two and a half weeks ago, Smith's father, Lance, told publications his son was on the verge of receiving a bachelor's degree in sociology and transferring to UF in time to play this fall. Meyer initially refused to comment on Smith per NCAA policy regarding unsigned players. However, he



later added:

"Something might be happening, but we'll worry about that when it happens."

Senior Reggie Lewis will probably battle with Smith — should he transfer — for the starting spot opposite Nelson. Otherwise, the Gators will look for three freshmen to contribute.

Meyer had positive things to say about Jacques Rickerson, Markihe Anderson and Wondy

### Tigers recall Katrina

HOOVER, Ala. — On two pages that could have been devoted to a conference, or even a national, championship, the 2006 Louisiana State football media guide instead features a timeline marking the team's involvement with Hurricane Katrina relief efforts.

Last August, when players usually run and hit, Tigers players spent their days picking up trash, inserting food into feeding tubes and even housing an aged celebrity. Their facilities became shelters and hospitals.

When the Tigers did hit the field, games meant that much more.

"Coach [Les Miles] just told us to go out there and win and change the whole attitude of the state," receiver Dwayne Bowe said. "Just go out there and win, let the state know ... that we're going to try and erase it out of their minds by winning games. It felt like we were helping out the whole state, not

just the LSU program."

After practices, affected players spoke about their situations. Sometimes a player would announce that his family had been found.

Applause, hugging and prayer would follow.

"We would become that person's brother," safety LaRon Landry said. "We really had to lift those players up because sometimes they had family trapped in New Orleans. We just motivated them and said prayers with them and really just let God take care of things."

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# Auburn coach defends school's academic practices

HOOVER, Ala. — Auburn coach Tommy Tuberville said he doesn't expect anything to come of the school's recent academic scandal.

The New York Times originally reported that 18 members of the 2004 undefeated Auburn team took a combined 97 hours of questionable courses.

The implicated players allegedly overwhelmed professor Thomas Petee with a desire to take sociology courses, resulting in classes with a lax attendance and requiring minimal work. Auburn is investigating the issue.

"If we're doing something wrong, please look at us and tell us," Tuberville said on the final day of the Southeastern Conference Media Days. "I promise you, we'll change it."

"We're going to do things right. I don't see anything happening. I really can't say anything about it 'til we get done."

Auburn Interim President Ed Richardson has already outlined several proposals to prevent any future troubles. In a speech given a week and a half ago, Richardson discussed the possibilities of limiting individual-based, directed-reading courses, ensuring their academic valor and refining the university's ability to oversee these classes.

Some believe the problem be-

gins with the number of players wanting to major in sociology. Tuberville disagrees.

"We've graduated 98 players in the last three years, and I think we had 15 in sociology. I don't think that's major," he said. "... But you want them to get a degree in what they want to get one in. We don't pick [the degrees] for them."

**ALL-SEC SELECTIONS:** Auburn was selected to win the SEC in preseason voting conducted by a record 104 members of the media. UF was picked to win the SEC East. The media, however, hasn't picked the correct champion since 1995.

The Gators also landed several players on All-SEC teams: Senior quarterback Chris Leak (first-team offense), wide receiver Dallas Baker (second-team offense), Marcus Thomas (first-team defense), Brandon Siler (first-team defense), Reggie Nelson (second-team defense), Jarvis Moss (third-team defense), Ray McDonald (third-team defense) and Earl Everett (third-team defense).

**SEC RULE CHANGES:** Hoping to give underdogs a bit of a boost, the SEC has announced two rule changes to speed games along.

The game clock will now start on an initial kickoff rather than when the first player touches the kicked ball.

Also, referees will no longer wait for a snap to start the game clock after a dead ball. Instead, they will start the clock after placing the ball down and granting the ready-for-play signal. There are two exceptions: following a

timeout or if the play ends the quarter.

"This is going to be a challenge for the coaches and players in terms of time management," said Rogers Redding, the SEC's newly appointed coordinator of officials.

Also, coaches will have one instant replay challenge per game for the first time. Should the standing call be upheld, that coach's team will be penalized a timeout.

**VANDY'S BITTER PILL:** Don't ask Vanderbilt coach Bobby Johnson how he feels about last season's UF game. The Commodores lost the Nov. 5 meeting 49-42 in double overtime. However, Vanderbilt never had a chance to attempt a two-point conversion and win the game in regulation because of a controversial penalty. Wide receiver Earl Bennett was flagged for an excessive celebration penalty after his late score. Replays showed Bennett hardly did anything flamboyant.

"This little lady ... said, 'Coach, the Southern Baptists allow more dancing than what Earl did,'" Johnson recalled.

Johnson called the league office to complain about the flag. "I'm not telling you what I called them," he said.

**SABAN LIVES ON:** Nick Saban left the SEC a year and a half ago. Then again, his spirit continues to permeate the conference. Just ask Auburn linebacker Will Herring.

Herring and the Tigers' defense regularly watches Saban's Miami Dolphins defense. Auburn also watches footage of Saban's Louisiana State defense.



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
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
