





Senate approves new No. 2

At an eventful Student Senate meeting Tuesday night, senators unanimously approved a UF law student as Student Government's No. 2 official and were told students will vote by paper ballots in Fall's election.

Arturo Armand, a second-year law student, will take office as interim Student Body vice president until the Fall election, to be held Sept. 26 and 27.

He spoke briefly to senators about his experience in Student Government and other student organizations, and he shared stories with them about his leadership roles.

He said he once single-handedly organized a concert when he was president of the Hispanic Student Association. Though it was an unexpected responsibility, he said, he valued it nonetheless.

"It gave me a lot of gray hairs, some you may still see, but I enjoyed it," Armand said.

The vice president's office was vacated when former Student Body Vice President Lydia Washington stepped down from her post in July for academic reasons.

Armand was announced as Washington's replacement Sunday night — about six weeks after her resignation.

Since then, Boyles has taken on many of the vice president's duties, such as leading the SG Cabinet.

Armand stood unflinching as he was sworn in, reciting his oath flawlessly. Upon finishing the oath, he smiled slightly before resuming his seat in the front row of sena-

Weak storm spurs safety

As people worldwide mourn the anniversary of Hurricane Katrina's destruction, Gainesville residents are gearing up to face a storm of their own.

Tropical Storm Ernesto, which made land-fall in the Florida Keys yesterday after tearing through Cuba, is motivating residents to begin preparation.

Steve Letro, a meteorologist for the National Weather Service in Jacksonville, said Gainesville would begin to feel minor effects of the storm this afternoon.

Letro cautions Gainesville residents to "prepare for an unpleasant night," as gusty winds and heavy rain can blow down trees and power lines.

"Make sure you've got umbrellas," Letro said.

Although the center of the storm is not predicted to pass over Gainesville, fringe effects of the system are forecasted for the area between tonight and Thursday morning, Letro said.

During that time, Gainesville residents should expect winds as high as 25 to 30 mph and bands of rain, he said.

David Beaulieu, the assistant general manager for energy delivery at Gainesville Regional Utilities, said residents in the Gainesville area should be "better prepared rather than overly

MCNAIR BOSTICK, 30

Bicycle accident leads to death of UF grad student

An avid cyclist, UF graduate student McNair Bostick always wore his helmet after a department professor's leg was broken in a biking accident last month.

He was wearing it Sunday when a car fatally injured him on Williston Road as he headed home to his wife, Carmen, and 10-month-old son, Luca, who lived with him in University Village South.

The driver who hit him stopped, visibly disturbed. It was unknown by press time whether the driver faces any charges.

An acquaintance, Brian Roth, happened to be driving by and saw Bostick was laying in a ditch next to his bike. The driver's car had damage to its passenger side and headlight.

Blood was coming from Bostick's mouth, but he managed to tell bystanders his home phone number so they could contact his wife, said Roth, who still has the number memorized.

Roth had known Bostick for about a year but felt most connected to him as he stood

over him on the roadside.

"I would say I met him on the road," Roth said. "Our friendship was very short and very intense."

Roth touched Bostick's legs to check for injuries. Bostick said he couldn't feel Roth's fingers, but he hurt everywhere.

"I told him I was going to come and see him, I would visit him," Roth said. "When I went to the hospital he wasn't there anymore."

Bostick had a collapsed lung, a broken neck and massive internal bleeding, said Jawoo Koo, a doctoral student and close friend. He died early Monday morning in the emergency room at Shands at UF, Koo said.

His friends plan to write Bostick's son a letter, to be read when he's old enough to understand who his father was.

"We kept thinking what we can do for his son when he grew up," Koo said. "He won't remember McNair very well."


Bostick, 30, was an agricultural engineering

UF faculty given charge of researching housing fund

On Tuesday, Gov. Jeb Bush appointed a UF professor to a commission that works to promote affordable housing in Florida.

Kristin Larsen, a UF alumna and assistant professor in UF's College of Design, Construction and Planning, will bring more than 15 years of experience in urban planning to her role.

This year, the commission will investigate how the State Housing Trust Fund is implemented at the local level. The fund provides Florida's counties and large cities with money to subsidize affordable housing.

"The fund is such a powerful source of housing assistance

here in the state of Florida," she said.

Students were invited to join a prince on a journey from Africa to the Gator Nation on Tuesday night, as the Institute of Black Culture showed hundreds of students how to make UF their home.


IBC's 18th annual Black Student Assembly, held in the Reitz Union Grand Ballroom, introduced black students at UF to the various clubs and other resources available to them.

To showcase UF's student resources, performers re-enacted scenes from the Eddie Murphy movie "Coming to America," which follows the adventures of a prince seeking a wife in America.

Spinning and stomping dancers from dance troupe Apocalypse ushered audience members into the fictional African country of Zamunda, where they met a prince called Akee and joined him on his journey to UF.

During the journey, the audience and Akee were introduced to UF's student leaders and administrators.

Black Student Union President Billy Holcombe played Akee's father, the king of Zamunda, and told him and the audi-

ence about BSU.

Student Body President John Boyles and Treasurer Ryan Moseley talked about how students can get involved in SG, while pretending to get their hair cut in a barbershop scene.

A member of the National Pan-Hellenic Council dressed up as the energetic preacher from "Coming to America" and ushered in performances from hip-hop

dance troupe Urban Essence and Greek organizations.

Sharon Burney, an office manager from the department of African-American studies, told students not give in to stereotypes presented in MTV shows and other forms of popular culture.

"None of the young women I see tonight look like the women from the Flava Flav show," she said, referring to the

popular VH1 program.

Mike Powell, an associate director of admissions, also advised students against following the crowd and showing off in front of their friends.

"I don't think I admitted one thug to the University of Florida," he said.

Dean of Students Gene Zdziarski and Dr. Anthony Greene, from the department of clinical and health psychology, told students about the academic and professional services offered at UF.

Freshman Travis Marine came to the assembly to learn more about the clubs and organizations at the university.

Marine said he might join the University Gospel Choir.

"It's very important to be surrounded by other African Americans so I can do well in school," he said.

Author Stephanie Evans, the event's keynote speaker, said black students should strive to strike a balance between peace and passion in their lives to succeed at UF.

Evans, an associate professor of women's studies and African-American studies, said she thought people should get angry when learning about injustices in black history.

However, she added, there is a difference between anger and bitterness.

"I get angry all the time," she said. "I am an angry black woman. But I love people and appreciate people as human beings."

Returning grad students say they're underpaid

■ WAGE DIFFERENCES LEAVE VETERAN ASSISTANTS SKEPTICAL.

UF's history department has increased the salary of new graduate assistants by \$3,000, leaving returning students with questions about how much the department values their work.

The returning assistants in the department — about 30 — will be paid \$9,000 a year, while the department's eight or so new students will earn \$12,000 a year.

Department Chairman Joseph Spillane said his department asked the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences to increase the salary of all graduate assistants, but college officials said they did not have enough money.

"The department is not happy about it, either," Spillane said, adding that the college left him with no choice but to raise salaries for new students. To do that, the department hired fewer students.

CLAS Dean Neil Sullivan said the history department increased salaries to compete with other universities, as well as to respond to a review that advised the department to increase graduate students' salaries.

Todd Reynolds, chief steward for Graduate Assistants United, said his organization con-

ducted a study that revealed that other institutions pay graduate assistants significantly more than UF does.

For example, he said, the University of Michigan pays its graduate assistants about \$21,492 a year.

"I agree that graduate assistants are underpaid, but this is a slap in the face to current workers," Reynolds said.

Jason Antley, a UF doctoral student who works as a teaching assistant in the history department, said he was disappointed at the way administrators handled the situation.

"The administration tried to hide it," he

said, adding he did not hear the news about the salary increase until Thursday, when students met the department's graduate student coordinator.

Sullivan said that although the circumstances are unfortunate, the college has to compete for new students every year.

Additionally, he said, returning graduate assistants are receiving a 3 percent salary increase this year.

But Reynolds said he felt the college is essentially telling returning students that their jobs are not as important as new students' jobs.

"When you are getting paid significantly less than the person you are training, it does not make you happy to be a Gator," Reynolds said.

Action platform advocates slide, shuns spending

With Fall's Student Government election less than a month away, the Action Party became the first SG political group to release an official platform Tuesday afternoon.

The party's nine-point platform includes goals to fund a student road trip to the Gators football game against Georgia in Jacksonville, build a waterslide at Lake Wauburg and provide free printing across campus. The party also hopes to pass a bill of rights, which would guarantee "leaders that listen" and "an environment that celebrates diversity."

In order to turn Action's plans into reality, party President Thomas Jardon said the group would reallocate about \$105,000 of SG's budget by cutting frivolous spending.

"Every year SG has a banquet that they allocate \$4,000 for," Jardon said. "No SG-funded organization can spend SG funds on awards, so why can SG do it themselves?"

The Action Party also wants to stop paying for trips to a leadership conference in Orlando, which three SG officials attended earlier this month at a cost of \$2,000 per person.

But the most savings would come from the SG advertising budget, which is set at almost \$50,000, Jardon said.

UF students will vote for a new vice president and about half the members of the Student Senate during the Fall election, to be held Sept. 26 and 27.

The Swamp Party is waiting to create a platform until its election candidates are finalized, party leader Keith Hardwick said. The party also plans to organize forums for students to voice their concerns to Swamp.

"We're going to have great candidates," Hardwick said. "They're open, accessible and accountable to students, and they want to hear their feedback."

Once the Swamp Party creates its platform, Hardwick said, party officials will publicize it with signs, fliers, a Web site and T-shirts.

"But the paramount thing that gets a platform out and that gets the students' imaginations and truly captures everyone is our candidates doing face-to-face talking," Hardwick said.

Bruce Haupt, the Pants Party vice presidential candidate, said his party's platform is not really policy-oriented and instead focuses on adding more fun to SG.

"Truly and honestly, the reason we're here is that SG takes itself way too seriously," he said. "People go to the meetings in suits, all dressed up, call each other 'Senator' — we're here to have fun and have a Pants Cabinet."

Police target rowdy riders as cars crank up music

Stacy Fiehn has trouble studying with all the noise.

The 20-year-old history major has been tortured for months by thumping bass from a vehicle parked near her apartment.

"He's got a little, tiny PT Cruiser, and the entire back of the car is filled with speakers," she said.

The music is so loud she can hear the bass over her headphones, and sometimes feels her walls shaking.

Fiehn isn't the only person in town aggravated by loud music.

Gainesville Police spokesman Sgt. Keith Kameg said the department receives many complaints about loud car stereos.

"We are stressing to our officers that we want loud-car-stereo tickets," he said. "We want to write as many citations as humanly possible."

A driver will receive a \$77.50 citation if an officer can hear the stereo from 25 feet away, according to Florida law.

Ryan Faraci, 18, can't count on both hands the number of noise violations he's received.

He said he cranks his 2,000-watt stereo system to "show off."

"I'll be driving down the street, and I'll hear someone with their music up really loud, but they don't have as good of a system as me, so I just crank mine up to just to be like, 'Yeah, I'm better than you.'"

Faraci said he invested \$4,500 worth of audio equipment into his Ford F-150. His car stereo can reach volumes louder than a military jet takeoff.

Although he sometimes violates the noise restrictions on main roads, Faraci believes there should be rules against drivers blasting loud music in residential neighborhoods, especially after dark.

"It's really disrespectful," he said. "I would blast my music outside of the neighborhood, but the second I got in the neighborhood I would turn it down to where you could barely hear it."

Citizen classes help residents understand government

City classes are open to anyone interested

The class is not held on UF's campus, and it's not for credit, but city officials believe the course contains vital information for Gainesville residents.

Students and other residents will have the opportunity to learn more about their city government starting next week at the Gainesville Citizens' Academy.

The weekly academy meetings, sponsored by the city, will begin on Wednesday with a lesson on community and economic development. Now in its second year, the Citizens' Academy was created to help citizens understand how the departments of city government operate.

"There was no program that would allow citizens to learn about every facet of city government," said city spokesman

Bob Woods.

Woods said the program helps people become better citizens and credits City Manager Russ Blackburn for providing the direction, focus and leadership needed to start Citizens' Academy.

"We view this as an opportunity for a dynamic exchange," said Woods, adding that other cities have similar programs.

Last year about 12 people regularly attended the academy meetings, but Woods said they hope to double attendance this year.

To draw more people, the sessions have been scheduled to run each week until Oct. 25, rather than once a month.

Over the course of eight weeks, staff from different departments of the city will instruct citizens on topics ranging from transportation to recreational facilities.

As part of a session on the city's emergency response sys-

tem, citizens will view a live demonstration by Gainesville Fire Rescue. The final session will include information on the city's finance and budget.

"People can better understand how the city is utilizing their tax dollars," said Woods, adding that the cost of the program will be minimal.

UF study spotlights manatees

They're fat, they're slow — and a UF researcher says they may be smarter than you think.

Manatees are surprisingly well adapted to their murky coastal environments, according to recent research led by UF professor Roger Reep.

Reep, who works at the university's College of Veterinary Medicine, co-authored a book that says the thick hairs coating manatees' wrinkled skin gives them an acute sense of touch and allows them to detect changes in water movement.

Reep could not be reached for comment Tuesday, but UF researchers who work with him stressed the importance of manatee research.

"If we understand how they perceive their environments, it will help us to preserve them as a species overall," said Diana Sarko, a senior graduate student who researches manatees with Reep.

The study on manatees' mental complexity, which Reep worked on with researchers from two other Florida universities, was featured in an article on the front page of The New York Times' science section Tuesday.

Reep has studied manatees for the past 15 years, and in his book "The Florida Manatee: Biology and Conservation," he argues that the small size of manatee brains has nothing to do with their intelligence.

Iske Larkin, an assistant scientist at UF who also studies manatee physiology with Reep, said the endangered species uses a tactile system to grab onto things and interact with environments.

UF Research "All of that gives them a very sensitive sense of touch, and that provides them a very good idea of what's going on around them," Larkin said.

Reep and Larkin coordinate UF's 6-year-old aquatic animal health program, in which researchers study the health of sea mammals.

Sarko, one of the program's graduate students, said the researchers partner with a St. Petersburg-based manatee-salvage program to recover sick and strangled manatees and examine them.

"It's a greater awareness of an endangered species, and the more we learn, the better we can help them and manage them," Larkin said. "I think it's critical that the largest research university in the state is a major player in that."

Election fraud SG picks paper ballots for upcoming SG vote

Last spring, four out of five UF students said they wanted true online voting for Student Government elections. Apparently, that pesky fifth guy was a member of the Swamp Party.

At Tuesday's Student Senate meeting, SG Supervisor of Elections Brian Aungst announced that optical-scan paper ballots will be used in next month's SG elections. Scantrons, Aungst says they're more reliable than online voting and cheaper than on-campus, secured-site voting — just what the doctor ordered to restore credibility to the electoral process.

We beg to differ.

If SG wants us to believe our votes will actually mean something, ignoring the wishes of an overwhelming majority of the student body is a weird way of showing it. But that's exactly what they've done. Again.

Of course, true online voting has problems of its own. Not everyone has a computer. Hackers and system failures can compromise the integrity of the process. Online, it's difficult to know if voters really are who they say they are.

But that's small potatoes compared to the problems paper ballots don't solve — inconvenience, pathetically low turnout and massive overrepresentation of fraternities and sororities. These issues damage SG's credibility more than a hacker ever could.

So let's face facts, shall we? In the eyes of most students, SG isn't much more than a well-funded club for people in Florida Blue Key and Kappa Phi Whatever. Sure, the elections are fun. Everyone gets T-shirts, signs and bumper stickers. But the end result is always the same.

That's why UF students don't vote. That's why it's hard for us to take SG seriously. And that's why UF needs true online voting — to bring new voters, new parties and even (gasp!) new candidates into the electoral process. Without it, we'll just see more of the same. But then, maybe that's the whole idea.

City targets rent

For broke college students, living in Gainesville can be tough. There's the loud neighbors, the bugs and the undependable hot water. And now, thanks to the Gainesville City Commission, UF students living off campus will probably see their rent go up.

Why, you ask? This week, the City Commission voted to increase the price of landlord rental permits by \$93. Gainesville landlords, being landlords, will duly pass this cost on to their student renters. That's you.

The ostensible purpose of the price increase is to crack down on sloppy renters who break city codes. You know the type: un-

mowed lawn, trash everywhere, a broken-down car parked on the front lawn. Maybe you are that type.

But to the Alligator, this seems like the latest effort in a campaign to pull UF students out of Gainesville's rental homes and stick them in big apartment complexes on Archer Road. And don't get us wrong — those complexes are nice, but they're not for everybody.

We understand the city's desire to quarantine UF students. We're noisy, messy credit risks. But without UF, Gainesville wouldn't be much of a city at all. So here's our advice to the City Commission: Learn to live with us, because you can't live without us.



Higher tuition hurts working families

I disagree with UF President Bernie Machen's wrongheaded desire to continually raise our tuition.

Days off unlikely in wake of storm

Even as Tropical Storm Ernesto brews north of Cuba, the only upcoming day off UF students should expect is Labor Day.

UF spokesman Steve Orlando said he is "optimistic" that UF won't need to cancel school due to the storm.

Tuesday evening, Alachua County was not within the storm's path, Orlando said.


UF administrators are monitoring the situation, he said. They will have a conference call with the National Weather Service this morn-

ing to discuss the situation, and if necessary, they will hold another one in the afternoon.

As of Tuesday afternoon, administrators had no plans to open UF's two on-campus shelters at the Reitz Union and the Southwest Recreation Center.

UF had a hurricane day this past June when Tropical Storm Alberto came through the area, but Alachua County experienced minimal damage.

"Right now, we're on the good side of [Tropical Storm Ernesto]," Orlando said Tuesday afternoon. "But if it shifts a degree or two to the west, it could be a different story."

tors.

Supervisor of Elections Brian Aungst also announced Tuesday night that optical scan paper ballots would be used in the upcoming election — despite the fact that 89 percent of student voters expressed support for

online voting during the Spring election.

"I completely understand if people are disappointed, but I believe that if they took time to talk to me, they would understand that [online voting is] not a viable option," Aungst said in an interview before the meeting.

Optical scan paper ballots are similar to regular ones, but they are tallied

by a computer instead of a poll worker. Several senators asked questions about polling locations and voting eligibility.

During a slideshow presentation, Aungst reviewed the positive and negative aspects of paper ballots with senators.

The ballots will ensure access to a paper trail, Aungst said, in addition to decreasing the chances of system

optimistic."

Beaulieu said that GRU has taken steps to update their electronics systems, maximize their fleet and ensure normal utilities distribution.

Beaulieu has also said GRU has checked its supply inventory and is prepared with standby workers if the storm hits Gainesville hard.

GRU is expecting possible power outages similar to a severe thunderstorm, Beaulieu said.

Lowe's Store Manager Forrest Carver said his store has had a "moderate increase" in shoppers who are preparing for the storm.

However, Carver said there were fewer people in the store than in prior years, possibly because people have already ac-

cumulated a surplus of preparation items.

Batteries, water, gas cans and battery-operated cell phone chargers have been the top items sold, Carver said.

Sgt. Keith Kameg, spokesman for the Gainesville Police Department, said they are watching the storm.

Kameg said Gainesville police expect the storm to have a minimal impact toward law enforcement.

"But if the storm makes a turn towards us, we're ready to go," Kameg said.

GPD has gone through several preliminary staffing meetings and briefings and are waiting to see if the storm will pass over Gainesville before they implement any further storm plans.

Alachua County has also activated an emergency information line, 3-1-1. Residents can call the number to hear a pre-recorded message about the location of the storm, its projected path and the county's preparations.

"I made a lot of presents for my boyfriend, and my cats have their own personal bowls now," Galbraith said.





Latsko, Casey lead way for unique 'P' position

Dallas Baker. Andre Caldwell. Jemalle Cornelius. Billy Latsko.

That is a possible box score rundown of UF's top receivers following the Gators' opener against Southern Miss.

While Baker, Caldwell and Cornelius enter the season with extensive experience catching the ball, Latsko, a fullback, could see his blocking role expanded.

Second-year coach Urban Meyer has combined the fullback and tight end spots into the "P position," which includes packages for block-

ing, carrying the ball, lining up at tight end and splitting out wide.

While each player possesses different skills, Latsko, fellow fullback Eric Rutledge and tight ends Tate Casey and Cornelius Ingram have all practiced at the P.


Latsko and Casey, the top preseason players at their respective positions, could see the most plays.

"They have very different builds, but they'll be using a lot of the same plays because both of them are good blockers and both of them have really good hands," UF offensive coordinator Dan Mullen said. "We kind of use them interchangeably."

Latsko will be the primary player in fullback packages in the P, backed

up by Rutledge.

But the Buchholz High graduate spent more of spring practice with the ball than he did blocking for a smaller, quicker back.

"That was to see what I could do with the ball, to test my skills a little bit," Latsko said. "They know what I can do with the ball now. Maybe every now and then I'm going to get the ball on a hand-off, maybe on a 4-and-1."

Casey is just happy to have a role in the offense.

A surprise standout as a freshman, Casey didn't know what to think when Meyer replaced former coach Ron Zook.

"There were times when I was frustrated," Casey said. "I wouldn't necessarily say I was thinking about transferring. It was always on my mind last year before the season."

He didn't start in UF's first eight games last year but broke out with three catches and a touchdown in a 14-10 win against Georgia.

"The Georgia game just reminded me what I could do for this team," Casey said.

After two seasons buried on the quarterback depth chart, it's now time to see what Ingram can do for

this team.

The converted quarterback and former part-time basketball player said he would rather line up at receiver to avoid blocking.

"I see [Ingram] more at wide receiver," Meyer said. "C.I. has not played a lot of football. He is just extremely talented and athletic. We will have a nice package for him."

Though he has yet to register a passing attempt or a catch in a regular-season game, the 6-foot-4, 225-pound Hawthorne native has joined the fray for the No. 4 receiver.

"After sitting two years, playing quarterback, I've got a lot built up in me," Ingram said. "I just want to get out there and play."

That leaves Crum as the successor to Todd McCullough on the strong side.

The converted tight end recorded 13 tackles in 10 games last year.

But if the senior plays as well as coaches have hyped he will, then UF will have a trio that rivals any school.

UF co-defensive coordinator Charlie Strong called Crum the most improved player on the defense at the beginning of preseason practice.

"When you look at him, he has everything you look for skill-wise — just height and speed," Strong said. "You just feel like hey, now it's time for Brian Crum to step up. There's always a guy in your program that it's time for them step up. I think that's

Brian Crum."

Crum's returning competition, sophomore Jon Demps, decided to redshirt and undergo surgery for a torn knee ligament.

Meyer said Demps, who tore the same ligament last season, will redshirt and have three years of eligibility remaining.

Then there's the latest problem: Freshman A.J. Jones has broken his foot and will redshirt as well. That leaves the door open for the two other freshmen — Brandon Spikes and Dustin Doe — to catch and pass by returnees like Ryan Stamper and Eric Sledge.

"They're guys that can run," Strong said. "You want that at the linebacker position. Then you want a solid guy in the middle like Spikes is, where he can set it down like Siler can."




Offensive Outlook

With Coach Steve Spurrier at the helm, it's no secret that South Carolina will try to feature a potent passing attack. Look for the passing game to improve in year two under Spurrier, but it might ultimately be the running game that is the key to success for the Gamecocks this season. Sophomore Mike Davis will return as the starting tailback after a successful debut season. Cory Boyd — the team's leading rusher in 2004 — returns from a suspension that forced him to miss all of last season and will take carries away from Davis. Expect steady improvement out of junior quarterback Blake Mitchell — if he can get any help out of his terrible offensive line — and a repeat performance from superstar wide receiver Sidney Rice.

Defensive Outlook

The Gamecocks simply lack experience on defense. USC returns only four starters and will be without all three starting linebackers from 2005. Senior Fred Bennett is a talented playmaker at the cornerback position, but he can't cover the whole field. Opposing teams won't throw Bennett's way unless someone else in the secondary steps up. Hefty nose tackle Stanley Doughty (6-foot-1, 331 pounds) anchors the Gamecocks' defensive line but needs to be in better physical shape than last season if he expects to make a major impact.



South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier has seen plenty of talented receivers, but after just one season of collegiate football, sophomore Sidney Rice is already drawing comparisons to some of the great wideouts Spurrier coached at UF.

"Sidney is one of the best," Spurrier said.

"He's a little taller than Ike Hilliard and Reidel Anthony. Probably not as fast, but he's improved his speed this off-season."

With the kind of freshman season the 6-foot-3, 200-pound receiver had in 2005, he seems worthy of the comparisons.

How about this for a rookie year: 70 catches for 1,143 yards and 13 touchdowns. And he did all that despite missing the season opener against Central Florida due to a broken finger.

This year, the Freshman All-American is a known commodity and won't be sneaking up on anybody.

"Everybody knows about Sidney now," Spurrier said. "He needs to prove he can do it year after year, which I think he knows that."

"He's a big-time talent."

Jones out for season

Freshman linebacker A.J. Jones has broken his foot and will redshirt, providing a significant blow to his position's depth.

"That's a pretty big sting for us because he was going to have some game reps," Coach Urban Meyer said. "He's a great kid and a great young man."

Jones, a former Middleton High (Tampa) standout, suffered a small crack in an outside bone of his foot. The injury occurred Monday during a non-contact drill. He will undergo surgery within the next two days and spend seven weeks in a boot.

Jones would have backed up strong-side linebacker Brian Crum in what was already a thin linebacking unit.



Most importantly, Jones' injury leaves the Gators one additional injury away from disaster.

In any case, Meyer will rely upon a host of inexperienced linebackers at one point or another.

"That's the dilemma we're in right now," Meyer said. "You have [freshman Brandon] Spikes, you have [freshman] Dustin Doe and you have [redshirt freshman Ryan] Stamper as the three backups right now."

Spikes is a natural middle linebacker and Brandon Siler's backup.

Doe was slated to backup Earl Everett on the outside but would make a logical replacement for Jones. Stamper has yet to play one snap.

GATORS DISAPPOINT MEYER: UF's players put forth a lackadaisical effort at Monday's practice, frustrating Meyer as the season opener against Southern Miss continues to inch closer.

"[The other day] was a bloody Monday," Meyer said. "Today was a pretty good day, though. [Monday] was disappointing with a lot of things during practice. I wasn't pleased. Today was one of our better practices, but we're not ready to play a game. There's no excuses. You just have to be game-ready."

Explained linebacker Earl Everett: "You just weren't seeing the guys flying around like you need them to. You can't have that."

Gators linebacking corps lacks depth

The Gators are one breakout performance away from having what could be the best linebacking corps in the country.

But they're one injury away from having one of the least experienced units.

Whereas the defensive line looks to be the strength of the Gators' defense and the backfield could be a work-in-progress, the linebackers need to stay healthy.

Outside of UF's three starters — Brandon Siler, Earl Everett and Brian Crum — the Gators return a total of one game played and zero tackles from last season.

Even with the lack of experienced depth, Coach Urban Meyer likes what he has seen.

"The linebacker position's looking a little better than it did a year ago," Meyer said. "Earl [Everett] and Brandon [Siler] are solid. Brian Crum is having excellent [practices]."

At middle linebacker, Siler, a junior, could have plenty of room to roam if the touted defensive line can frustrate opposing linemen.


If Siler impresses enough, Gators fans may not see him back for his senior season.

A first-team All-Southeastern Conference preseason pick, Siler may jet for the NFL after checking his draft status following last year.

"You play football from a little kid because you want to play in the NFL," Siler said. "So it's not something that you just don't think about."

Everett won't be back next season. The senior returns to his starting spot on the weak side after registering a team-leading 72 tackles in 2005.

"Everett's doing tremendous," Meyer said. "He's a leader, and he's playing extremely well right now. Him and Siler — we feel good with those two guys."
