



Air gun scares student

Just days after the Virginia Tech massacre, an air gun protruding from a UF student's pants pocket looked all too real, leading to his arrest Thursday, police said.

After a student spotted a nonlethal Airsoft gun on Travis R. Young, 19, in a Beaty Towers West elevator, the student called police at about 1:35 a.m., University Police Department spokesman Capt. Jeff Holcomb said.

"At no time did Mr. Young attempt to dispel the victim's fear about the authenticity of the weapon."

Though Young did not brandish the gun, he was charged with aggravated assault because it struck fear in the other student, Holcomb said.

In the arrest report, UPD officer Keith Smith, wrote, "At no time did Mr. Young attempt to dispel the victim's fear about the authenticity of the weapon."

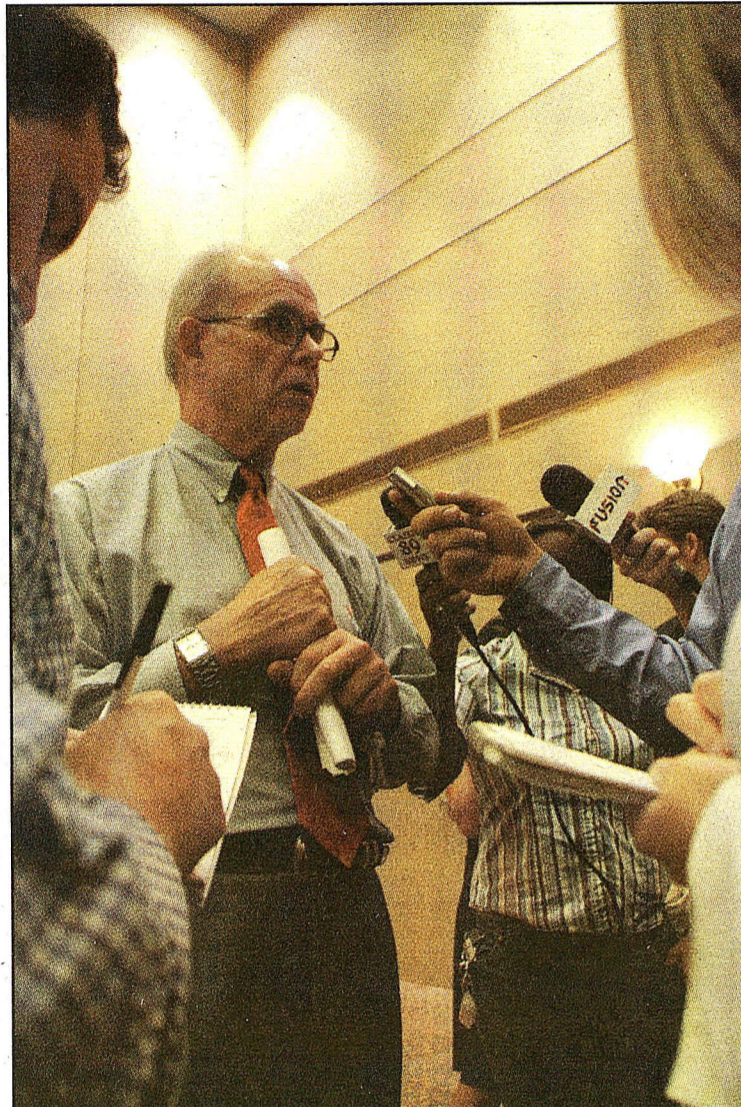
Airsoft guns fire small plastic pellets at nonlethal speeds, but they often look like real guns.

At a forum Thursday, UF President Bernie Machen addressed the incident and said at 3 a.m. Thursday that administrators were considering closing down campus if the suspect hadn't been caught by 6 a.m.

Officers arrested Young at Broward Hall, where he lives, according to a press release. He voluntarily accompanied officers to the UPD station, where he admitted to possessing the gun.

Machen talks of VT, tuition at forum

During a forum in the Reitz Union on Thursday, UF President Bernie Machen addressed more than 100 students regarding campus safety, the "Academic Enhancement Program" and the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences' \$4 million deficit.

Machen began by speaking about the Virginia Tech massacre.

"The events in Blacksburg have imprinted on all of us," Machen said. "We're all suffering the kind of suffering they're going through."

What makes UF's response system so effective, Machen said, is the chain of command among the police agencies.

 In an interview after the forum, Machen said communication is so fluid, the university and city and county police work as one unit.

"UF is a true college environment," he said. "We must preserve what makes UF great."

He also discussed the state Senate's roadblock of a bill that would allow UF to charge incoming students \$1,000 a year on top of tuition that would not be covered by Florida Bright Futures. But, he said, the bill is not dead.

Students on financial aid would be exempt from the charge, and the money generated would go toward hiring 200 faculty members and 100 academic advisers.

After the forum, Machen said he thinks if the program passes through the state House of Representatives, it will have gathered enough momentum to pass through the Senate.

Machen said his three children attended UF and all of them changed their majors at least once — one changed three times. He said advisers are important because they guide you through those experiments.

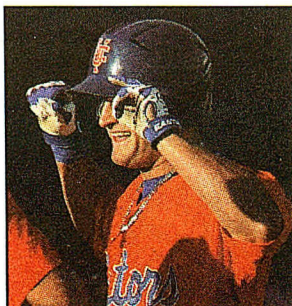

Professors win UF award

A journalism professor and a music professor were chosen as the university's top teachers at a banquet Monday.

Mike Foley, the master lecturer in the Department of Journalism, and Robert Langford, an assistant director of the School of Music and a professor of jazz history, were named the 2006-07 UF Teachers of the Year.

"I was stunned," Foley said.

He knew he was there to receive the award from the College of Journalism and Communications, but he didn't know what else was in store.

He's the college's first professor to be given the award.

Langford said the experience was "amazing," and although he had won the College of Fine Arts Teacher-of-the-Year distinction three times, this honor was a little different.






"This award is more special because it was given to me in my last semester as a full-time teacher," he said. "Next year I am not going to teach History of Jazz or be the assistant director."

He plans to stay on as an adjunct jazz-band teacher, he said.

Each nominee who won an award from their colleges had to put together a package of materials, including letters of recommendation, letters from students and a copy of their teaching philosophy, Foley said.

Black ribbons to unite

In the wake of a shooting massacre at Virginia Tech that left 33 dead Monday, one UF student is calling for unity.

J.D. Moises, a UF sociology junior, is asking students nationwide to wear black ribbons today in honor of the victims. He created a Facebook group to gather support for the idea.

Moises came up with the idea early Wednesday morning after he realized that, though colleges across the nation were holding memorials, none of the schools seemed to act in unison.

The black ribbons would show solidarity with the massacre's survivors and compassion for its victims, he said.

Membership in Moises' group, titled "Remembering VTech," swelled to 1,668 as of Thursday. Members include stu-

dents from a number of schools, including the University of San Francisco and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

"It just kept growing and growing," he said.

As the disaster relief coordinator for Red Cross Gators, Moises is attuned to the needs of people in this type of situation.

He said he would also like to arrange for flower deliveries to victims' families. He first came up with the idea after the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, and he'd like it to become a reality.

According to his plan, students would be able to purchase the flowers at a reduced price and send them to the grieving.

Moises hopes to find a flower delivery company willing to undertake the project and start collecting donations next week.



Abortion ban upheld by U.S. Supreme Court

The U.S. Supreme Court decided Wednesday to uphold a ban on certain types of abortions, leaving Americans to wonder if more restrictions are on the horizon.

In a 5-4 vote, the court legitimized the Partial Birth Abortion Ban Act. This marks the first time the Supreme Court has upheld a ban on a specific abortion procedure.

This development has left anti-abortion advocates rejoicing and abortion-rights supporters seething.

Amy Kennedy, director of external affairs at Planned Parenthood of North Central Florida, said she's afraid this decision could lead to legislation banning all abortions.

"This is a pivotal ruling for woman's health and safety," Kennedy said. "American women deserve the right to make personal health care decisions free of government intrusion."

The banned procedure, technically called "intact dilation and extraction," also known as a partial-birth abortion, would terminate second-trimester pregnancies by removing the fetus whole.

The procedure is performed when the fetus

is too large to be suctioned from the woman's body, as in most first-trimester abortions.

About 88 percent of abortions are performed within the first trimester of pregnancy. During the second trimester, abortions are usually performed because of health risks to the patient, Kennedy said.

Some speculate that the Supreme Court is taking a new course on the abortion issue. That assumption leads abortion rights activists to worry that Roe v. Wade, the case that established a woman's constitutional right to abortion, could be overturned.

The ban indicates a reversal in the Supreme Court's position on abortion since 2000, when the court declared it unconstitutional to restrict abortions without considering the patient's health. Under the new ban, the prohibited type of partial-birth abortion is illegal unless a woman's health risks are severe enough to endanger her life.

"The ban fails to safeguard women because it doesn't contain an exception to protect their health," Kennedy said.

Stephanie Ann Diaz, a member of Vox: Voices for Planned Parenthood, said people forget that choosing to have an abortion is a difficult decision that can scar women both physically and emotionally.

"Most people who are pro-choice want abortions to be rare, safe and legal," she said.

But anti-abortion activists say the fetus's health and safety should be considered equal to that of the mother.

Natalia Pedraza, the president of the Pro-Life Alliance and a UF economics senior, said the ban is a step in the right direction.

"It's a victory for the pro-life side," she said. "In general, abortion is a horrible thing for the baby and the mother."

Partial-birth abortions are more traumatic, she said.

"It's different than all the other abortion procedures, and people should be educated on the different types to really get an understanding of what this ban means," she said.

UF sophomore Steven Hoffstetter said he believes the procedure is "barbaric."

"I've always thought it was a terrible thing," he said. "When it was first banned, I couldn't even believe it was allowed before."

Hoffstetter's feelings echo those of President George W. Bush, who said in a press release that the new law reflects the "compas-

sion and humanity of America."

Bush also said he hoped the law would lead to more serious restrictions on abortion.

"The Supreme Court's decision is an affirmation of the progress we have made over the past six years in protecting human dignity and upholding the sanctity of life," he said. "We will continue to work for the day when every child is welcomed in life and protected in law."

Despite the controversy, UF constitutional law professor Sharon Rush said the implications might not be as serious as many expect.

"I don't see it as such a dramatic decision as everyone else is seeing," she said.

Rush pointed to the 1992 Roe v. Casey Supreme Court decision, which reaffirmed Roe v. Wade.

After researching the justices' majority and dissenting opinions on partial-birth abortions, Rush said she thinks the ban might not lead to more restrictions.

Chief Justice John G. Roberts and Associate Justice Samuel Alito Jr., the two justices appointed by Bush, are the most likely to vote against abortion if the issue arises again, Rush said.

But, she said, abortion rights are not likely to be overturned under the current justices.

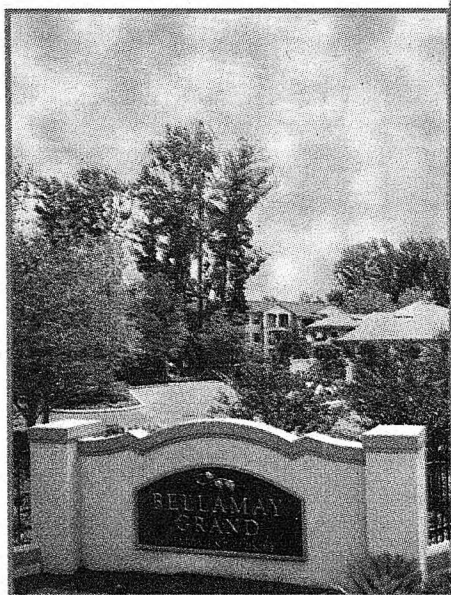

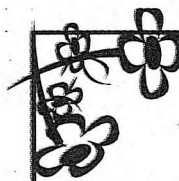

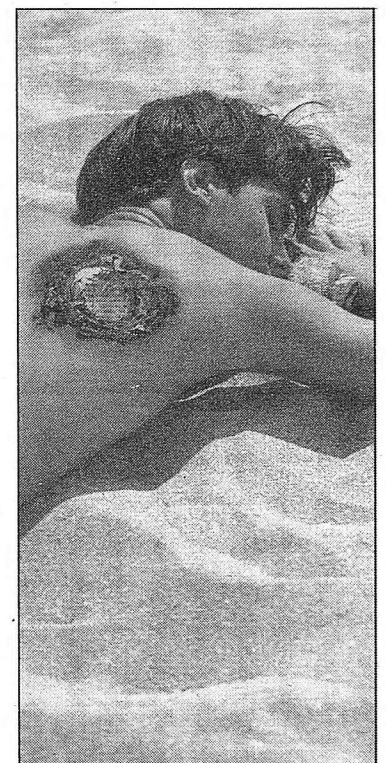

Israeli league drafts two UF students

Two UF students will be making sports history this summer while most others will be taking classes, working or interning.

Matt Comiter and Bryan Pinchuk will each be on the roster of one of six teams in the inaugural season of the Israel Baseball League this summer.

Israel's first national baseball league will boast players from the United States, Canada, Venezuela, the Dominican Republic, Australia, Europe and Israel, according to the IBL Web site.

Comiter and Pinchuk, who have been friends since their freshman year at UF, said they tried out in Miami over Winter Break at one of the league's five tryouts, which were hosted around the world.

"At first I wasn't really into the idea, but I definitely wanted to try out just for the sake of playing baseball for a day," Comiter said.

When they got to the tryout, Pinchuk said he was intimidated by the competition.

There were minor league players, college baseball players and others there who "just looked like they've been playing their entire lives," he said.

Neither Comiter nor Pinchuk play for UF's baseball team. Although both played in high school, professional

baseball was a dream — until January, when they received their contracts in the mail.

"I was speechless," said Comiter, who is putting off graduate school to pitch for the team.

The contracts cover flights to and from Israel, housing and a \$2,000 salary for the summer season.

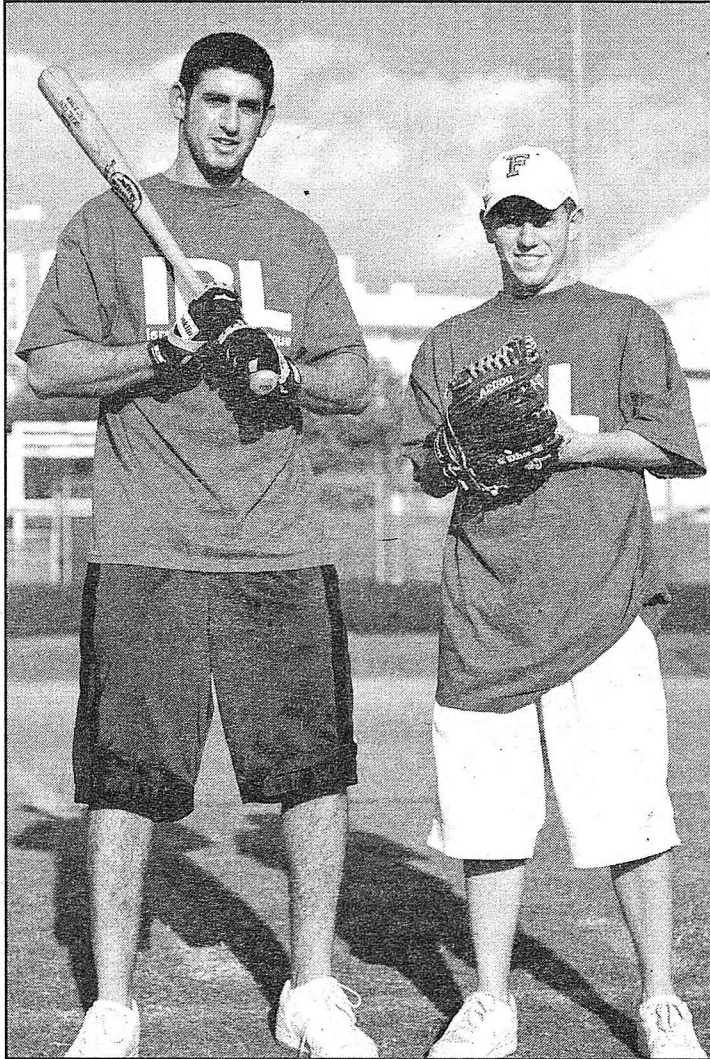
Pinchuk is excited to see Israel for the first time.

"I don't consider myself to be a professional athlete just yet," Comiter said. "But I joke about it with my friends and remind them every day that I am."

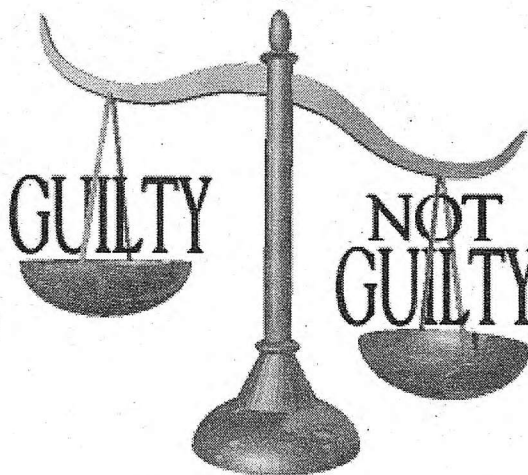

Burrito Bros.' second location closes

Don't mess with the guacamole.

"You make it out of California avocados, or you don't make it," said Randy Akerson, the longtime owner of Gainesville's Burrito Bros. Taco Co. "Half-packaged pulp? No. You can't."

He said trying to cut corners when it came to guacamole was one of the reasons that the second location of the Gainesville restaurant failed less than a year after it opened in North Tampa.

"It took a while for the beheaded chicken to finally fall," he said of the ill-fated restaurant, which opened April 2006 and closed in February.

Akerson said he was approached two years ago by Ryan McDonald, a UF alumnus and former Outback Steakhouse marketing executive who wanted to open another Burrito Bros. in the alumni-heavy city of Tampa.

After years of saying no to people

who asked for his permission to franchise the Burrito Bros. name, Akerson said he thought he had finally found someone who could preserve his vision.

"I thought his commitment to the concept would make it easy to succeed," Akerson said. But, he said, he was mistaken.

"Burrito Brothers is a very different certain kind of thing," he said. "It's quirky as hell, but it's been around for more than 30 years."

Akerson said McDonald got to use the store's name and recipes, and Akerson received royalties.

McDonald was also allowed to make some decisions on his own, like the restau-

rant décor and seating. But Akerson had a say in what went on the menu.

He was upset by some subtle changes McDonald made, he said, such as serving Tijuana Flats-style big tacos or peanut butter and jelly sandwiches for fussy kids.

A downfall of the Tampa restaurant was McDonald's attempt to turn it into the "Taj Mahal of Burrito Brothers," Akerson said. He said the gaudy decorations and "pointless" security cameras were a waste of money.

"He had to do everything bigger and better," Akerson said. "Small is beautiful."

McDonald could not be reached for comment by press time.

Despite the hassle, Akerson said he doesn't regret the experience.

"My reputation, I think, is good enough that it didn't take a hit from this," he said.

Akerson spent about five months in Tampa — away from his wife, cat, garden and friends — helping McDonald run the restaurant, he said.

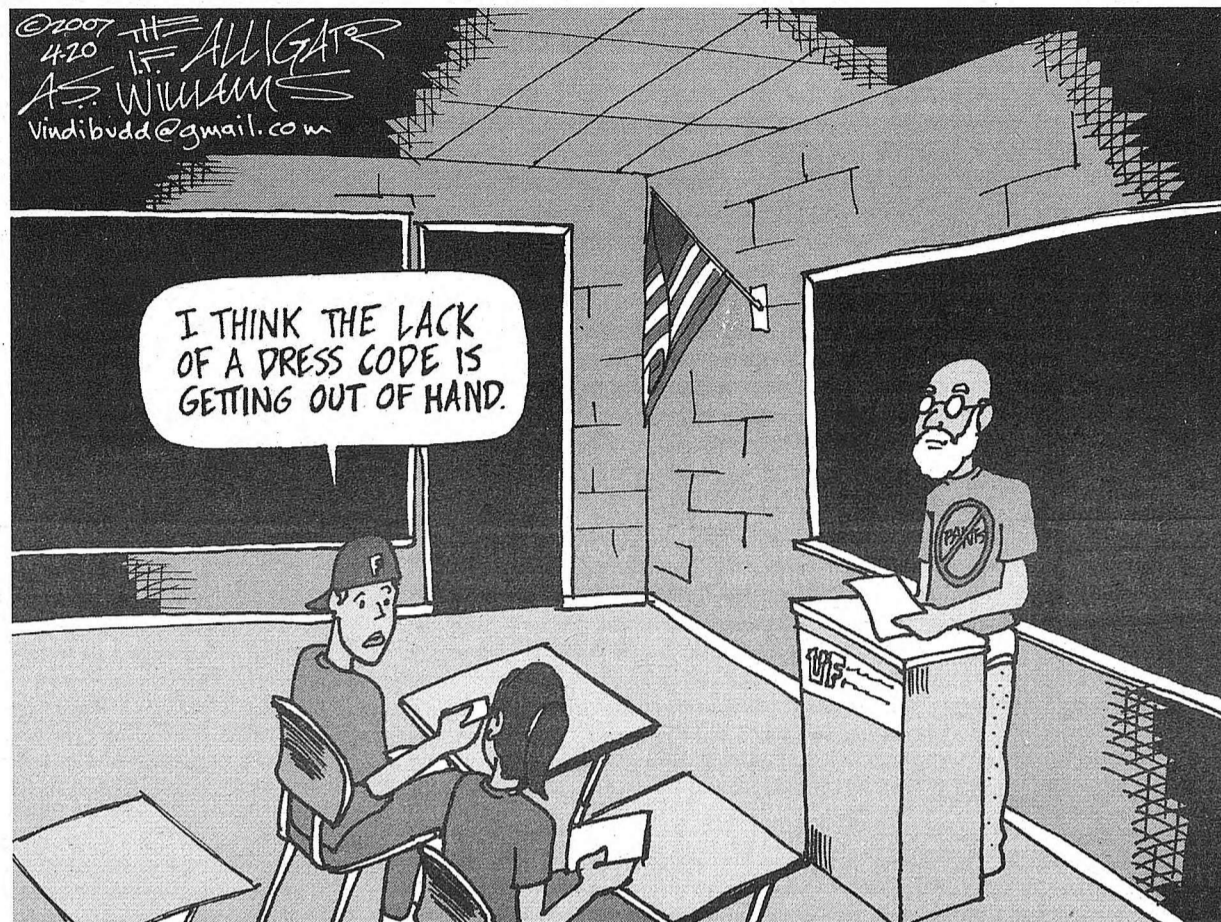

It's been a rough week in Gator Country, and it's easy to understand why.

The cheers from the orange-and-blue-clad mobs no longer ring free on University Avenue, and the national championship trophies are stored safely in their display cases. There is a somber mask on campus, covering up the year of the Gator.

Sure, exams are coming up, and a sobering exam week looms over the horizon. But this week, the Gator Nation was delivered the biggest party foul in the middle of its well-deserved success.

Earlier this week we received a stark reminder of the horror of the 1990 Gainesville student murders. Except this time it was different. The police sirens were quiet in Gainesville for the most part, and it was a different campus that the reporters stormed.

On Monday, shots were fired. Sleeping students at a Virginia Tech dorm awoke from their beds to the sounds of their neighbors being shot. A few hours later and on the other side of campus, classmates and professors cowered to avoid more shots from the same gunman. The horror was over by 10:30 a.m.

Thirty-two victims and their killer were dead.

In Gainesville, the emotions seemed somewhat removed. It felt like we had seen it all before, even though most UF students were in elementary school when Danny Rolling came to town.

So Tuesday, we all packed up our orange and blue gear, even if only temporarily.

Every time I log onto Facebook, it seems like more of my friends have replaced their profile pictures with ones declaring, "Today we are all Hokies." But perhaps they should read, "This week we are all Hokies." As the days go on, more and more students join groups to honor those who died Monday.

And maybe, just maybe, we have packed up some of our Gator spirit and sent it to Blacksburg, Va. — we know

they need it there.

That's one of the great things about being a Gator: Even if we're enemies on the field, we're still friends in the classroom. Those students and professors who lost their lives Monday were no different from the rest of us. They had families. They had friends. They had dreams.

But their lives were cut tragically short.

Now it's Friday, and this horrific week is finally coming to a close. It's time to move past mourning and enter this next week celebrating life.

We've all heard of Ernest Hemingway's novel "For Whom the Bell Tolls," but few realize he borrowed that title from John Donne's metaphysical poem "Meditation XVII."

In it, Donne wrote, "No man is an island, entire of itself; every man is a piece of the continent, a part of the main."

OK, so they weren't Gators — they were Hokies. But they were a part of the student population.

Donne continued: "Any man's death diminishes me, because I am involved in mankind."

To close out a week of mourning, I think our bells should toll Friday at 3:30 p.m. the Century Tower bell should chime 33 times, once for each of the 33 people killed. To show respect and honor their memory, students and faculty should observe a moment of silence — or at least 33 seconds.

We can send all the school spirit and emotions we want via Facebook, but the real way to show our mourning is to honor the legacy these people left behind. By chiming our bells, we can show we are there in spirit.

In 2002, when the sniper shootings took place around Washington, D.C., and Maryland, a lot of people were shocked to find out that the shooters were black.


Many people, including criminal experts, assumed the person behind the 10 shooting deaths would be a middle-aged white male.

Book helps students record traditions

After Stacy Colon leaves UF this semester, she will miss walking around campus.

"I'm going to miss seeing the Century Tower, Turlington — just being here every day," the graduate student said. "It's going to be pretty surreal not being here anymore."

She was able to document all her favorite experiences in the revived "F Book," started last summer by the Florida Cicerones and the Student Alumni Association.

The book is a combination guidebook and scrapbook. It provides information on dining, activities and UF history, and it contains places to put pictures and ticket stubs students used to mark UF "traditions."

These include eating at The Swamp Restaurant and getting your photograph taken in front of the Albert and Alberta statue on West University Avenue.

The F Book was originally passed out to all freshmen from the 1920s to 1960s as a rule book, said Laura Lentz, assistant

director of membership and marketing for the alumni association.

All freshmen received the book free during the summer 2006 Preview, and it will be used in First-Year Florida classes, Lentz said. The one-credit First-Year Florida classes are designed to help students with their transition to UF.

The first edition of the book sold all 2,000 copies by Christmas, and the second will be at the UF Bookstore, she added.

Members of the association receive a lapel pin for every 10 traditions they complete. Once 40 are completed, the student becomes a "Tradition Keeper" and is awarded a medallion to wear at graduation. Lentz said about 20 to 25 graduating students will be awarded the medal — including Colon.

Lentz, who has been contacted by other

universities about starting a tradition program, said she would like to see everyone on campus complete the traditions.

"I think once people start seeing their friends with medals, they're going to start wanting one," she said.

For Colon, who has completed 42 of the 50 activities, the best part was being able to start off the F Book with a picture of her UF undergraduate graduation in 2005.

"I was able to start the way most people end," she said.

She said the book gave her a second chance to go back and complete all the traditions she had completed the first time around, but hadn't documented.

In 10 or 20 years, when she reflects on her college experience, the book will be something she can show her kids, she said.

The book is like a photo album, something for her to remember all the special moments, she added.

"It'll remind me of the great times I had in college and make me sad that I can't go back," Colon said. "I would love nothing more than to see it become a tradition itself."

Machen: CLAS on good path

When it came to the CLAS deficit, Machen called it a "tremendous budget problem." But he said the college is on a path to solve the problem and to return CLAS to the hands of the faculty.

"We're on a good trajectory with good leadership," he said.


While he said he didn't know of any changes to the five-year plan to get CLAS out of the red, he said UF is planning to continue channeling unbudgeted money to the college and to reduce the debt to \$3 million by next year.

After his speech, Machen addressed questions from students, including one regarding UF's Gator Nation campaign.

"When you hear 'Gator,' we want you to think of Gainesville and the college," Machen said. "We want to be a brand university."

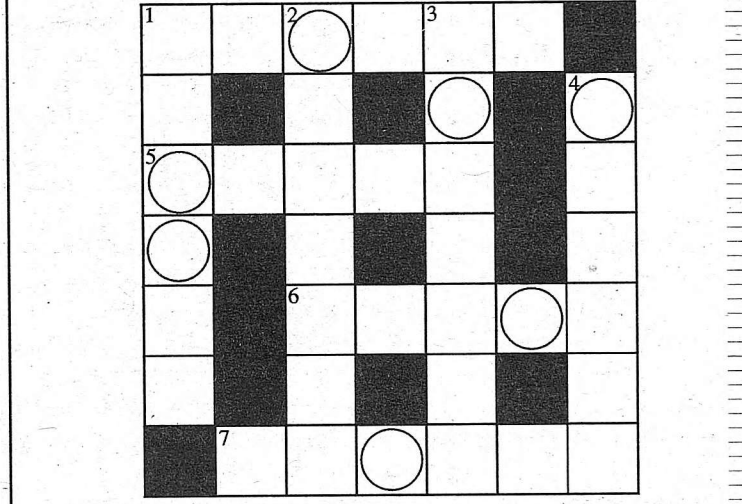

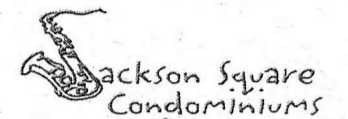

Willis nurses Achilles injury

■ THE JUNIOR MIGHT MISS ONE DAY OF NCAAS.

Only a dedicated individual will voluntarily immerse herself in frigid water for 10 minutes for the chance to compete.

This is a normal occurrence for junior Nicola Willis after she finishes practice with UF's No. 1 gymnastics team (21-0-1) to calm down inflammation in her Achilles.

"I'll do anything to make it feel better," Willis said.

Willis suffered the injury before Christmas but thought it would just go away.

When it didn't heal, she figured it was time to tell someone.

Athletic trainer Stacey Roller designed a treatment plan for Willis that focused on tendonitis.

"She's doing really well," Roller said. "If she was a normal person following this program, and she did not exercise, she would probably be

just fine.

"But because she is a gymnast, and she continues to land on it — it's going to hurt."

On Thursday in the NCAA Championships, Willis will be tumbling on the floor that took her out of her favorite event.

During UF's dual competition at Utah on March 9, Willis fell during her first pass.

Willis was able to complete the routine, but all she was thinking about was getting off the floor.

Willis competed in uneven bars the next two meets.

But she stayed off the floor for more than a month after ag-

gravating the injury.

At the NCAA Northeast Region Championships, she finally made her return.

Even though her 9.875 score on floor exercise was not her best, it was enough to get her confidence back.

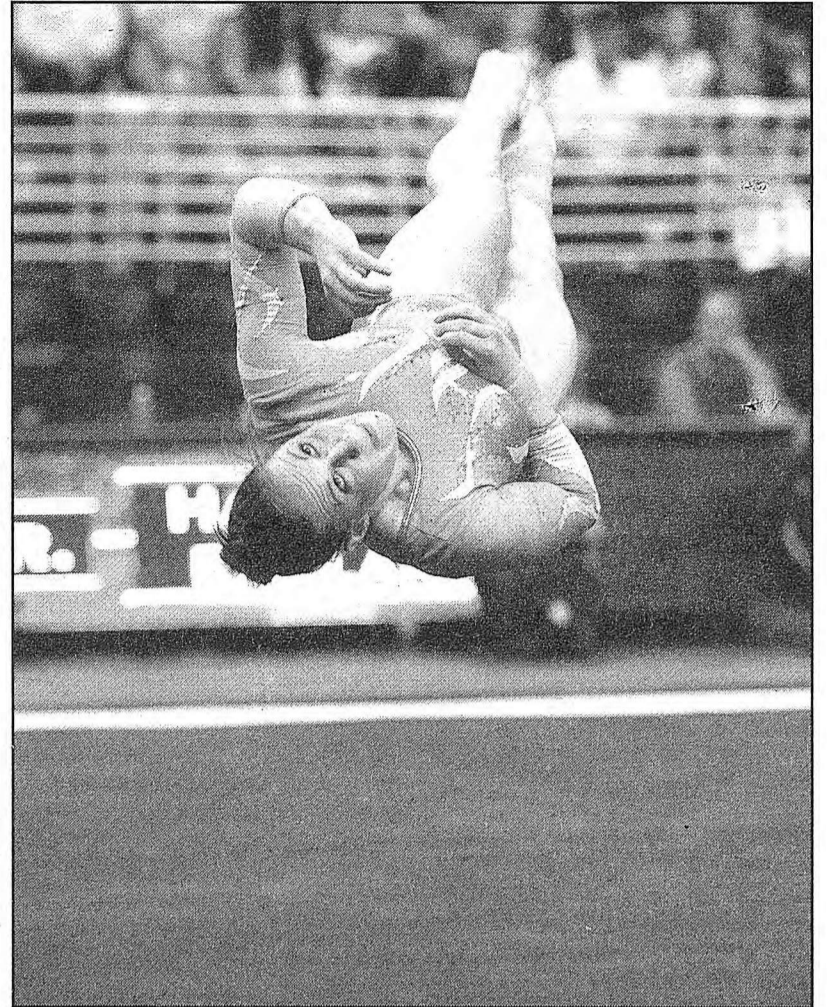
To prepare, Willis practiced the maneuvers by herself over and over again.

Faehn still hasn't decided what she'll do with Willis at NCAAs.

"I don't think her (injury) will hold up for two days at nationals," Faehn said. "We are tentatively leaning toward using Sam (Lutz) on the first day and using Nic the second day, so that Nic won't take the hit both days."

Willis has come back, but her injury has produced frustration for the England native.

"Injuries are probably one of the most frustrating thing when you are an athlete," Willis said. "You have so much passion and you really want to compete and do the best for your team. It's really hard to sit back and watch and just think what you can do to help the team."

Gators get another shot at Alabama

■ THE CRIMSON TIDE DEFEATED UF IN MARCH.

UF coach Andy Jackson got the matchup he wanted.

The No. 3 seed Gators (12-6, 7-4 Southeastern Conference) will face No. 6 seed Alabama (20-6, 8-4 SEC) at 8 a.m. CDT in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament in Baton Rouge, La. The Crimson Tide defeated No. 11 seed South Carolina 4-1 in the first round Thursday.

Jackson knows despite the seeding UF likely enters today's match as an underdog. The No. 20 Gators are facing No. 16 Alabama, who has won five straight.

"Frankly, I am happy (Alabama) won," Jackson said. "It would be easier to beat South Carolina. We've already lost to Alabama, (but) the point of the SEC Tournament is to try and secure a NCAA first and second round (site)."

The Crimson Tide defeated UF 5-2 in Tuscaloosa on March 30. The Gators' points came from singles victories by freshman Jesse Levine and junior Greg Ouellette. Levine and Ouellette, No. 6 in the country in doubles, defeated then-No. 28 Dan Buikema and Mathieu Thibaudeau 8-6 in the No. 1 doubles match. UF lost the other two doubles matches 8-3.

Jackson feels today's rematch will be different than the teams' first meeting, especially because of the neutral location.

"No question that (home court) is a factor in tennis matches," he said. "We're a little bit more experienced,

more confident."

Both teams' lineups have undergone changes during the last month.

Jackson will keep most of the lineup the same, but expects to make a few changes to try and edge the momentum to the Gators.

Levine, Ouellette and junior Nestor Briceno will play in their normal singles positions of No. 1, 2 and 3, respectively. Junior Billy Mulligan will stay in the No. 4 slot, with senior Jordan Dolberg playing on court five.

The No. 6 position is something Jackson will decide this morning before the match. Freshman Geoffrey Barton has played there the last three matches and has won all three. Freshman Dan Cash and sophomore Shaun Young are also possibilities.

Jackson is also toying with the idea of substituting Dolberg into one of the bottom two doubles pairings. Dolberg played No. 3 doubles with Mulligan Sunday at Auburn. The match against the Tigers was a special case, however, because UF was resuming a match that had been suspended due to rain. Dolberg has suffered from a sore shoulder all season, but had completed his singles match before rain halted play on April 1. Therefore, when the Auburn match came down to the doubles point, Jackson could play Dolberg in doubles, without overworking his arm.

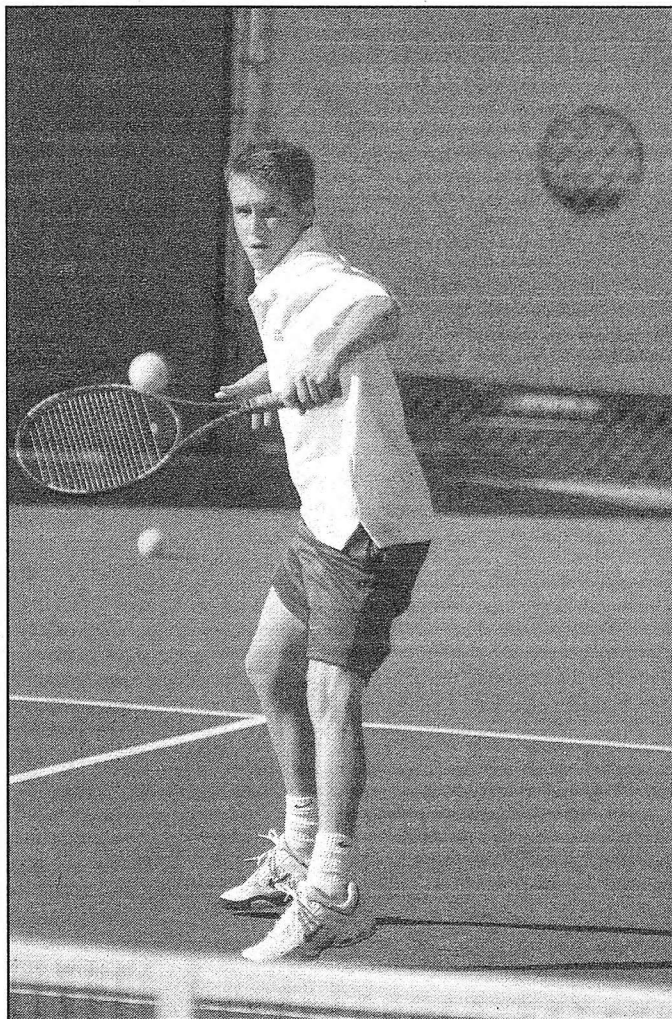
"Jordan Dolberg is somebody that's really valuable to us because we don't have a lot of depth," Jackson said. "He's somebody who has got a whole lot of experience, but he's had an arm problem. He's one of our better doubles play-

ers. I haven't been playing him in doubles all year because I didn't want to waste a singles point chasing a doubles point we may or may not get."

The lineup change almost earned the Gators a win against Auburn. The match came down to court three, where Dolberg and Mulligan had a match point but eventually lost in a tiebreaker 9-8 (5).

On Monday, Jackson said UF would probably stick with what it has done all season, despite the success Dolberg and Mulligan had Sunday. By Thursday night, however, Jackson still had not made up his mind and said he might play Dolberg and Mulligan at the No. 2 doubles position to-

UF to take on Tigers in quarters

The UF women's tennis team doesn't expect a big test today, but the same can't be said for the team's No. 1 singles player, junior Diana Srebrovic.

The No. 2 seed Gators (19-1, 10-1 Southeastern Conference) begin play at the SEC Tournament in Lexington, Ky., at 10 a.m. today, taking on No. 7 seed LSU in the quarterfinals.

The Tigers (16-8, 6-6 SEC) defeated No. 10 seed Mississippi 4-0 in first round action Thursday.

UF and LSU met on March 25 and the Gators defeated the Tigers 6-1 in Baton Rouge, La., but Srebrovic lost to LSU's No. 2-ranked Megan Falcon 7-5, 6-2. Falcon was named SEC Player of the Year as the only LSU player to receive All-SEC honors. Undefeated in SEC play this season, Falcon holds a 22-match winning streak coming into today. No. 18 Srebrovic actually led 4-0 in the first set back in March but didn't have the stamina to keep up the pressure. She has gone 5-1 since.

"I thought (Srebrovic) was clearly the better player at that time," Thornqvist said. "She got fatigued in the second set, (but) I don't think that's going to happen tomorrow. Diana's in much better shape (and) playing better now."

Freshman Megan Alexander did not play in that match due to injury.

"We beat them fairly handily without Megan," UF coach Roland Thornqvist said. "With Megan, I think we do match up pretty well. We're fit and we're playing really good doubles. We're going to try and continue the good streak we've been on."

Freshman Anastasia Revzina will be making her first career appearance at the No. 2 singles position today. She has

day. Besides the match against Auburn, the pair had only played one other time together, an 8-6 loss against Central Florida on Jan. 31.

Jackson must weigh the possibilities of three back-to-back days of playing on Dolberg's shoulder with the fact that the Gators won't keep playing unless they keep winning.

"(The Crimson Tide) do present some problems for us that we weren't able to solve at Alabama," Jackson said. "We are trying to make a couple adjustments where we lost matches before."

If the lineup Alabama used against South Carolina on Thursday is any indication, the Crimson Tide have shuffled their own since facing UF as well.

Alabama used the same doubles pairings at No. 1 and No. 2 but used Billy Mertz and Javier Bes at No. 3 against the Gamecocks. Mertz did not play doubles against UF in March.

No. 76-ranked Mertz played No. 3 singles against the Gators, but has jumped to the No. 1 slot since then, shifting Joseph Jung and Sammy Struyf down to No. 2 and 3, respectively.

Mathieu Thibaudeau has moved up to the No. 4 slot, while Bes moved down to No. 5.

Another possible concern for UF is No. 10-ranked Ouellette's lackluster performance in his last singles match, a 6-2, 6-1 loss

to No. 115 Pedros Campos from South Carolina. The Gators have to hope Ouellette simply didn't bring his best, and that's what Jackson believes.

"I certainly hope it was a bad day," Jackson said. "He was a little bit sick (and) also was not prepared as he could've been."

That being said, Jackson was quick to point out that everyone makes mistakes, and Ouellette has performed at a very high level for his team this season.

"Now he's got about 10 more (mistakes) to go before he's still averaging less than some of the guys," Jackson said.

Jackson isn't worried about his team being ready to play in the earliest match of the day today.

"We like the 8 a.m. match because there's only one site, and tennis doesn't have a time limit," Jackson said. "(The kids) don't like to get up early, (but) after they see the 5 o'clock (p.m.) match starting at 9 o'clock, then they start getting a lot happier at getting up at 5:30 or 6. We run a lot of early-morning practices, particularly the guys at Nos. 4, 5 and 6."

When it comes down to it, Jackson feels his team is ready to give a big effort today against the Tide and feels his morale is high.

"We had a nice practice (Wednesday night) and (Thursday)," Jackson said. "We're eager to play."

"Anastasia's been on a tear ever since she lost to North Carolina in the beginning of the year," Thornqvist said. "She has played really good tennis and is getting better every week. I had to move her up — her play has dictated it."

Thornqvist knows Alexander will be a key part to the team's success the rest of the season.

"It's tough to play when you come back from an injury and get beat up by some good players at No. 2," Thornqvist said. "She's playing a lot better. I'm trying to get her a win today that will give her confidence for the rest of the tournament."

Senior Nina Suvak will play in the No. 4 slot. Freshman Csilla Borsanyi, winner of five straight, will play on court five. Junior Whitney Benik will fill the No. 6 position. Thornqvist doesn't worry about his team looking past the overmatched Tigers.

"The older players have been around and they know you can't take anything for granted," he said. "We respect LSU for what they are, and they're certainly going to try hard, since they have nothing to lose."

UF hopes to defeat the Tigers quickly because the match will be stopped once it has been clinched, and this would keep the team rested for the weekend.

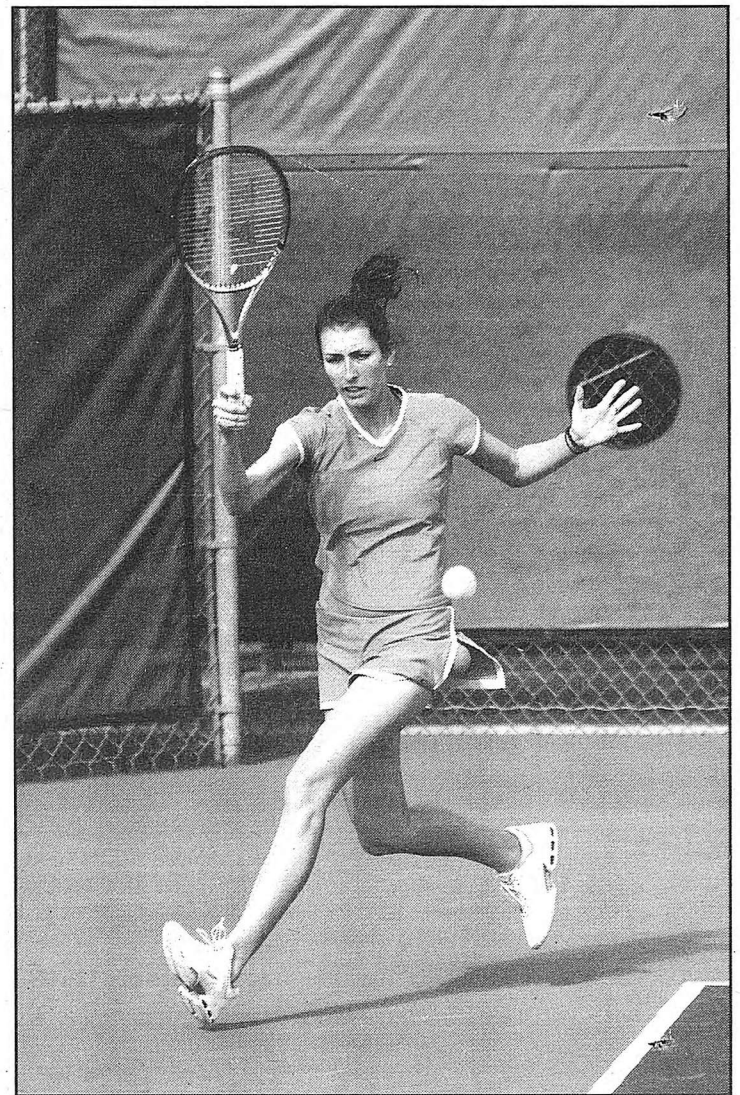
"If you take care of business and come out focused, you end up playing a shorter amount of time,

and that helps you out the rest of the tournament," Thornqvist said.

The Gators practiced an hour on Wednesday and Thursday. Having been here before, Thornqvist knows it's important to keep his team fresh for three days of play, both mentally and physi-

"Two very good players are going to go at it," Thornqvist said. "That's going to be the match to watch."

UF takes on top-ranked teams in SEC Tournament

As the UF women's golf team gears up for the Southeastern Conference Championships, one

thing is certain: This is not the same group of girls from last fall.

After failing to finish in the top-five in any of its matches in the fall season, the team headed into the spring ranked No. 21.

Getting healthy and hot at the right time, the Gators have reeled off five consecutive top-five finishes, taking second at the Northrop Grumman Regional and Bryan National Collegiate while winning

the Gator Invitational.

The team is focused heading into today's SEC Tournament, which takes place at the Old Waverly Golf Club in West Point, Miss.

Redshirt sophomore Ornella Jouven will round out the lineup, where she hopes to improve on a tie for 47th.

The Gators are at full strength and seem ready to make a postseason push.

"Every player in our lineup is working hard on both their mental and physical games as we head into the postseason," Briles-Hinton said. "Competition is only going to get more difficult from here, and we have to keep improving if we want to keep pace."

A series win against the Wildcats would keep the Gators in good position before heading out to Vanderbilt.



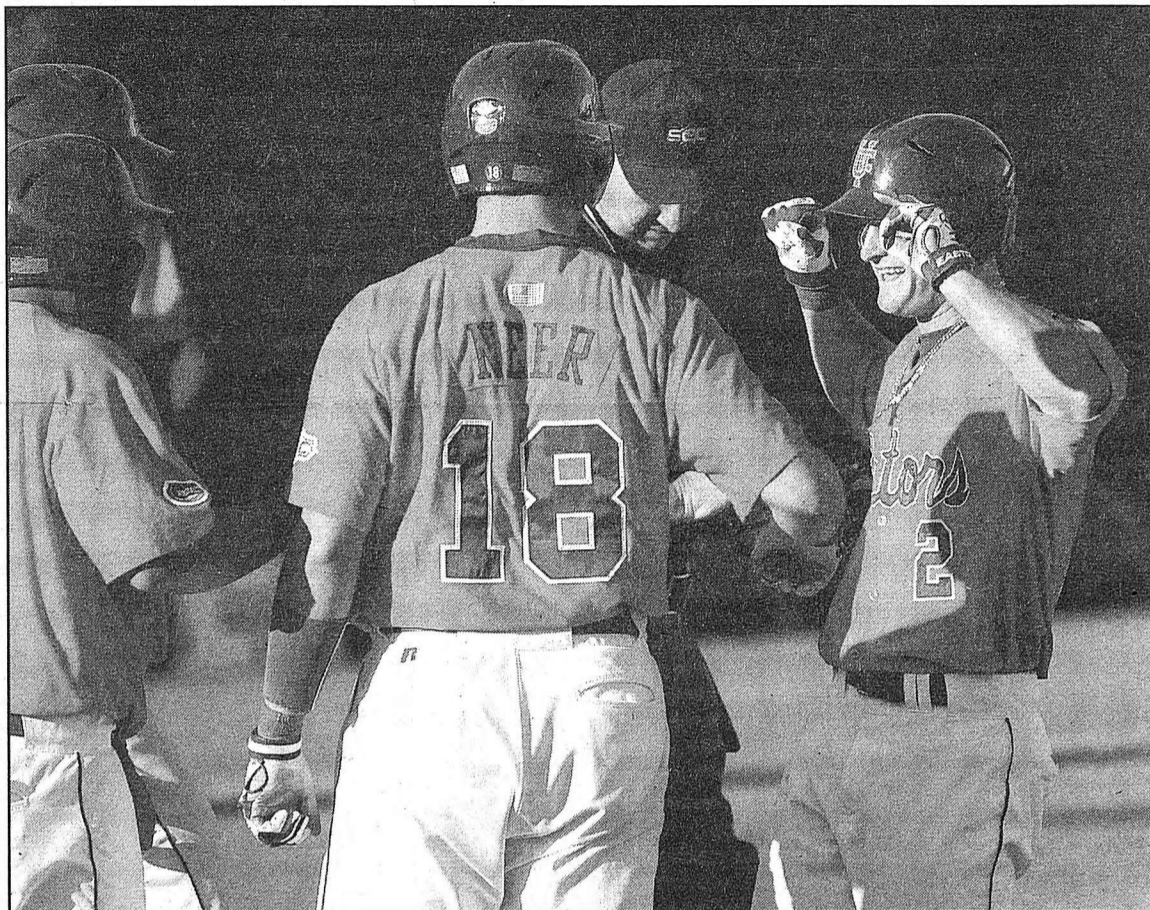

After up-and-down spring, Gators head to SEC tourney

Golfers will face three top-25 teams

It's clear that they're capable. It's obvious they can play with the best. But for the UF men's golf team there are still plenty of questions and no time left for answers.

After a season comparable to a high-speed roller-coaster ride, the No. 5 Gators will clean the slate and aim for their 15th Southeastern Conference title in school history.

Starting today, the team heads to Sea Island, Ga., to play in the SEC Tournament, which includes top-ranked Georgia, No. 3 Alabama and No. 17 Tennessee.

"We have a terrific conference in terms of team strength and depth," UF coach Buddy Alexander said. "Nothing will come easy out here this weekend. Our guys are prepared to battle with every shot. It will come down to who can make the most shots and stay out of trouble."

After a fall season when the team finished in the top five in all of its matches, the Gators headed into the spring with high expectations and a No. 1 ranking.

"We can and will play better than what we've shown recently," Alexander said. "We've got our work cut out for us this weekend, and we're doing everything possible to be ready to go."

Among those who have run out of time is junior Manuel Villegas.

Villegas was a staple of the Gators' success in the fall, and after winning the Gator Invitational in February, he looked poised to become a star.

However, the junior began to falter and for

the rest of the season, finished no higher than a tie for 58th.

The junior will not participate this weekend and will be absent from the lineup for the first time this season.

UF will feature a revamped squad due in part to drawing a place in the first group of tee times for today's opening round.

Sophomore Billy Horschel, who was recently named to the U.S. Palmer Cup team, will play in the fifth spot but tee off first.

Horschel is currently ranked as the top player in the country and will look to lead the young Gators in Georgia.

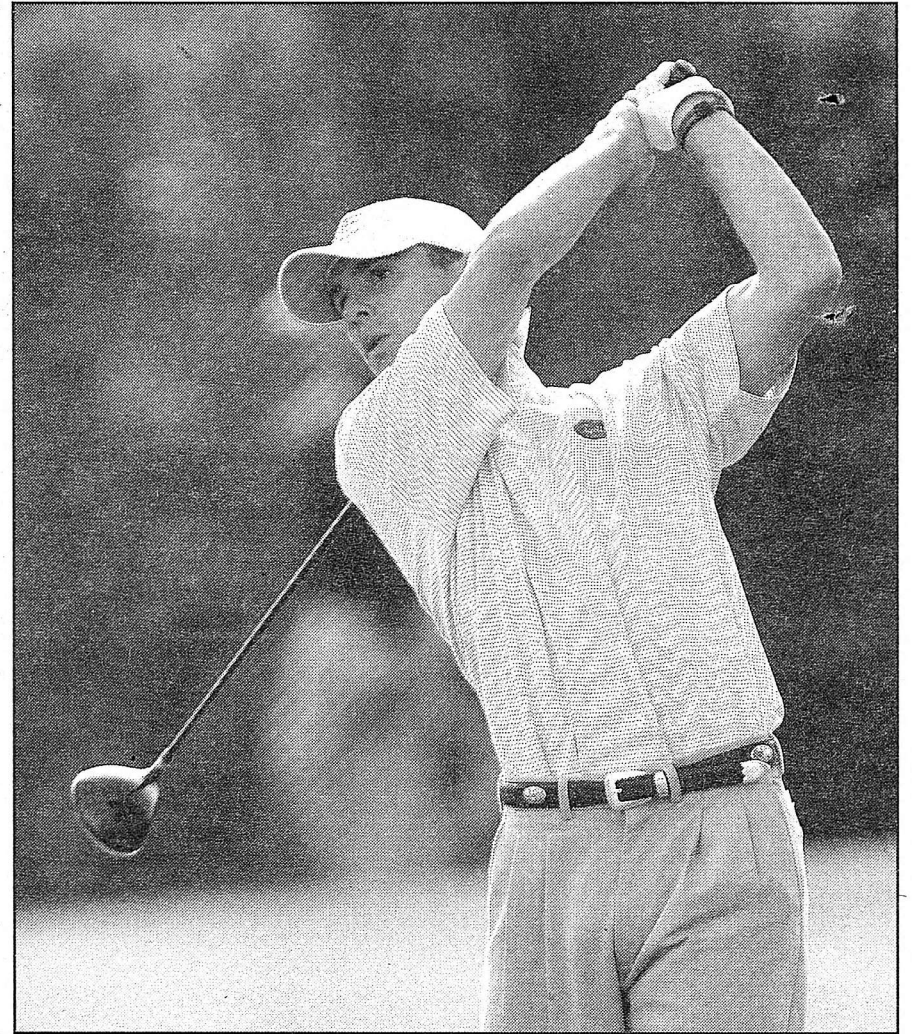
for 20th overall.

Rounding out the lineup will be freshman Tyson Alexander, who last saw action on March 11th, when he finished in a tie for 61st.

"This is a very capable team, and they're anxious to get on the course right now," Alexander said. "There will be some ups and downs this weekend, but that's what you get with a young team. We'll be looking for guys to cover for their teammates when things are going tough, but the key is to be able to count four low numbers each round."

Prior to this 19-game stretch, UF had lost seven of their last nine games and were concerned about where it fit into a tough Southeastern Conference.



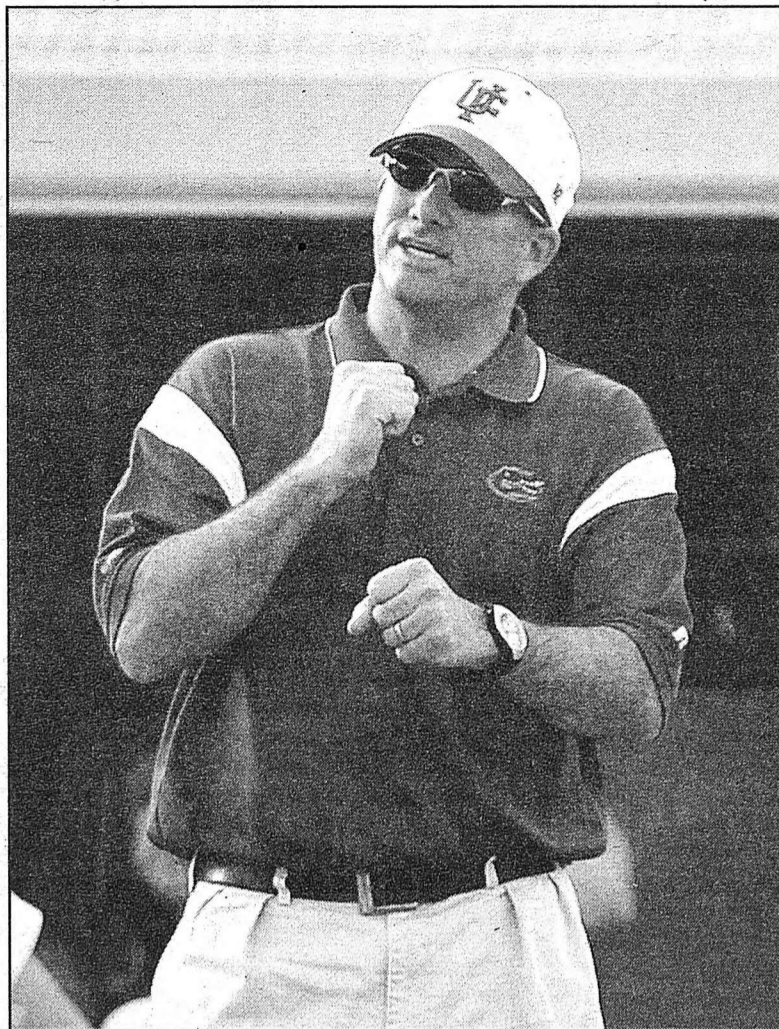
Softball

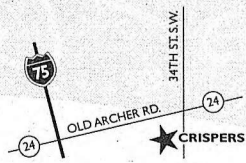
