



# Library services temporarily disabled

## Computer workstations will stay up

Students looking to check out a laptop, request a document from the library catalog or activate a library card before the weekend should do so today.

Some UF library services will be unavailable while Aleph, the library's software, is being updated Friday through Monday, said Carol Turner, director for public services.

"Aleph does everything behind the scenes for the library," said Lori Driscoll, associate university librarian and chairwoman. "The upgrade will make utilizing library resources

easier for patrons and providing resources easier for staff."

For instance, after the update, people who request library documents will be able to get a notification of availability by e-mail. Driscoll said it will also allow new functions to be added, such as self-checkout and receipt printing.

The upgrade is being conducted this week-

end because fewer people use the library on the weekends during the summer — only about 200 people each weekend, Turner estimated.

Library computer workstations will still be available.

"While we understand the upgrade may inconvenience patrons, we still try and find a way to meet needs through other community and on-campus resources," Driscoll said.

# Tow rules to know

To tow companies, finding a car parked outside a visitor parking space, is now like finding a Kodak moment.

New roam-towing regulations approved by city commissioners Monday — one requiring tow drivers to take pictures of parking infractions — are set to smooth bumps in the road drivers, property owners and tow companies share.

Because the ordinances are new, the Gainesville Police Department has yet to hear any complaints connected to the approved rules, said GPD Lt. Sherry Scott.

Local tow companies have been aware of the upcoming changes because they were discussed for about 16 months, she said.



# SG to help buyback

Buyback for used textbooks might be a little easier in the fall for UF students with the addition a Web site associated with the UF Bookstore.

The Web site will offer multiple benefits to students, said MaryGrace Bell, a Swamp Senator representing District A. Bell and Thomas Cockriel, a Swamp Senator representing Rawlings, are co-chairs of the Student Senate committee in charge of developing the site.

### Student Government

One feature included will be buyback alerts sent to participating students via e-mail, she said. Students can put in a book's ISBN number and choose whether they want to receive alerts.


At the end of each semester, the bookstore will send out alerts to students with books available for buyback.

"This could save students the pain of lugging their books to the bookstore just to find out they're not being bought back," Bell said.

# Students reproduce art masterpieces for SFCC class

■ A GRID HELPS STUDENTS RECREATE THE PAINTINGS.

Art professor Blake Harrison doesn't get paid much to teach what he loves, but he's pretty sure he has the biggest classroom in town — the main campus of SFCC.

Students in Harrison's Art Fundamentals classes paint murals that grace the outside of many of the college's stark white buildings. Each semester, Harrison said, new students paint over the previous semester's murals with white paint in preparation for the art project.

He said the student mural projects, which he developed in 2001, help the community to better understand art and the process of making it.

"The artist's studio is turned inside out," he said. "The community gets to witness a process that is not often seen."

Alora Haynes, chairwoman for the college's visual and performing arts department, said seeing the process the students go through to create these murals is an important way for the community to identify with art.

"People get to become part of the magic," she said. "It's like getting to go behind 'The Wizard of Oz' curtain."

Harrison said the process begins with students selecting a masterpiece to reproduce. Once they've chosen, he said, they

begin a process of drawing the work onto a grid that has been sketched onto the surface of the wall.

The grid, which Harrison said enables the students to render the scaled-up reproductions with great accuracy, slowly becomes hidden beneath layers of vibrant color as the students recreate the masterpieces.

The last step is putting a label beneath the mural to inform people of the name of the original artist and the painting's title, he said.


"I try to make the students memorize facts about the artists so they can inform the curious," he said.

Jessica Davis, one of Harrison's students this semester, said she was a little nervous when she first heard about the upcoming mural project.

"This is the first art class I've ever taken," she said. "My mural is not going to be a masterpiece."

Harrison said most of his students feel nervous at first, but by the end, they come away with a sense of accomplishment and a greater understanding of how art is created. He thinks this is an especially good thing because many of his students are not art majors.

"Art rounds out education," he said, "and it's a way for each of us to share in other people's experience of life."

# Bathrooms between genders

Ursula Magdolan, 20, was born a boy, but she decided to start dressing like a female about four years ago.

Wearing a tightly laced corset and 2-inch heels, she sat with her legs crossed at a table downstairs in Gainesville's University Club, which attracts primarily gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people.

Today, Magdolan automatically uses the women's room, but it has not always been an easy decision.

Her eyebrows, drawn in a high arc above bright pink eye shadow, lowered as she recalled several instances when she was discriminated against just for trying to go to the bathroom.

Once when she was entering the female restroom in a nightclub, a man spit on her and told her she was going into the wrong stall.

She has also had a bottle thrown at her head, but she said she usually just receives offensive stares.

"They just don't understand," she said.

The issue of gender-neutral bathrooms has been gaining attention across the nation and is now growing in the South as well, said Bob Karp, who is on the board of directors for the Human Rights Council of North Central Florida.

According to the Minnesota Department of Human Rights' Web site, New Jersey, California, Illinois, Maine, Minnesota, New Mexico, Hawaii, Rhode Island and Washington provide legislative protection for gender identity and expression. More than 70 cities nationwide have also adopted this protection.

Karp said unisex bathrooms could allow transgender individuals to feel safe from harassment, but Gainesville does not require public facilities to install these restrooms.

"Transgender" is an umbrella term that in-

cludes transsexuals, cross-dressers and those who do not consider themselves completely male or female.

Gainesville is considered a tolerant place to live, but the law does not protect gender identity and expression, said Karp, who is gay.

He said if Gainesville does not give transgender individuals full rights, then "all you can do is cross your fingers and hope nothing bad happens."

Under the Americans with Disabilities Act, UF provides separate, unisex stalls on campus where people can enjoy more solitude, said Nora Spencer, the director of the Office of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs.

She said she thinks UF is working hard to become more progressive and safe, but she would like to see gender identity and expression included under its nondiscrimination clause.

In the spring semester, 68 percent of students voted to add gender expression and identity to the Student Government's nondiscrimination clause, said Student Body Vice President Vanessa Goodwin.

Karp said the Human Rights Council of North Central Florida is hopeful there will be some movement in the next couple of months to include gender identity and expression in Gainesville's nondiscrimination code.

More unisex bathrooms would be a step in the right direction.

"I think there should be unisex bathrooms everywhere," Magdolan said. "If there is a bathroom for both genders, I'll use that one because I don't consider myself truly man or a woman."

# GRU preps for fall rush

It was all over a mini-fridge.

UF psychology junior Jill Welsh waited for what she said seemed like an eternity on hold listening to a Gainesville Regional Utilities customer service recording.

Welsh was waiting to learn if the barely knee-high mini-fridge that kept her Mountain Dew icy cold was the cause of the \$50 overage in her electricity bill.

She had just gotten into a fight with her roommate over the bill. The argument lasted about 15 minutes, and she was on hold for 30.

But that was before Monday.

GRU extended its customer service hours Monday in anticipation of the rush of students heading back into Gainesville for fall classes.

The extended hours, which will run through Aug. 18, help GRU serve people like Welsh, who need to set the record straight on their electricity bills.

Welsh's roommate had refused to split the \$50 fee because she was convinced the mini-fridge was the reason their bill was so high. She said she heard mini-fridges cost that much a month.

Katherine Weitekamp, spokeswoman for GRU, said the energy provider receives about 10,000 more calls than usual during this time of

the year. The customer service line's new, extended hours will be from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekdays and from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturdays.

She said most calls are from students trying to figure out why their bills are so high.

Weitekamp said the best explanation for a higher electricity bill is the summer heat. She

**Around Gainesville** said people don't realize the cost associated with lowering their thermostat settings.

She said the ideal setting to maximize energy efficiency is 78 degrees. Electricity bills can increase by 4 percent with every degree below that setting during the summertime.

Additionally, Weitekamp said one of the most underrated energy savers is changing out an air conditioning filter monthly.

Changing all incandescent bulbs to compact fluorescent lights can also make a significant difference, she said.

The bulbs use about two-thirds less energy than a standard incandescent bulb and last about 10 times longer. Roughly \$30 can be saved in energy costs over a bulb's lifetime.

Welsh's roommate eventually split the charge with her.

"I'm really not that worried about it," Welsh said. "I'm moving out next month, and I'm taking my mini-fridge with me."

# Sour summer job experience makes student wary

UF student Forrest Eddleton said he knew he wanted to quit his summer job when he saw the shotgun.

But for Eddleton, a UF political science and history senior, the gun was just another sign he should quit the problematic job he secured with the help of UF's Career Resource Center.

Eddleton, who worked only a few days as a field manager-in-training for an organization called the Campaign to Save the Environment, said in taking the position he was promised he would be working to "engage citizens, work with the media, build coalitions and engage in grassroots advocacy."

However, Eddleton said most of his time on the job was spent going door-to-door asking for donations, also known as "canvassing."

The job proved to be a dangerous one. In his three days of canvassing for the organization's Tallahassee office, Eddleton said he was met at a door by a man holding a shotgun, and he was bitten by a dog.

Eddleton said he suggested to the organi-

zation, which he found through a campus-wide advertisement, that sending pairs on canvassing assignments would be safer.

However, Adam Rivera, former director for the Tallahassee office, said the organization does not send people out in pairs because incidents such as Eddleton's are uncommon.

"It just goes with the territory," he said, adding that safety is his organization's biggest priority.

Eddleton said he was also discouraged from trying to change people's minds or from answering questions while he was canvassing.

He added he had to memorize a script he was to stick to.

However, Rivera responded that isn't the case. Employees are free to answer questions, he said, and it wouldn't make sense for the organization to suggest otherwise.

According to Saranette Williams, senior assistant director of employer relations for the Career Resource Center, a complaint was filed against the organization in June, alleging it provided an unsafe working environment. Williams said she could not specify who filed the complaint.

The investigation of the claim against Campaign to Save the Environment has since been closed, Williams said, adding the organization would not be offered any of the center's resources until it provides more detailed information about the accusation.

It is not recruiting on campus, she said. Isaac Bloom, Florida regional director for Campaign to Save the Environment, said he disagrees with the accusation.

"We make sure our jobs are really safe," he said.

Eddleton said one of the main reasons he believed Campaign to Save the Environment was an upright organization was because of its association with the Reitz Union.

Williams said the Career Resource Center does background checks before organizations such as Campaign to Save the Environment are allowed to use the facilities the Reitz Union can provide, including rooms within the building.

Williams said the background check usually involves checking the employer's Web site and verifying that the job description is legitimate.

Political science internship coordinator Daniel A. Smith said what Campaign to Save the Environment may have asked Eddleton to do might not be out of the ordinary.

Often when people do canvassing, Smith said, they are told to stick to certain talking points to help convince people to vote or donate to a certain person or project.

However, Smith warned canvassers to watch out for the effects of doing it for too long.

"Canvassers get burnt out," he said.

## SG's Tallahassee lobbyists hopeful about Bright Futures

Student Government's Tallahassee-based lobbyists gave UF's Student Senate a progress report and a warning of more budget cuts at the Senate's Tuesday night meeting.

Nick Iarossi and Ron LaFace of Capital

City Consulting, the company that represents SG in the Florida Legislature, described 2007 as successful.

LaFace said the main achievements were the full funding of Bright Futures for another year and approval of the Tuition Differential Program.

But Iarossi warned the Senate about a Sept. 18 legislative session aimed at slashing the state budget by \$1 billion to \$1.5

With temperatures consistently in the 90s, the last thing most people want to do is stand around in the heat. But students are being forced to do just that when they have to wait for buses that are regularly late, and they're getting fed up.

UF senior Tom Crosby said the Regional Transit System is his main mode of transportation to and from campus five days a week. He said the service is more unreliable during the summer semesters.

"They don't stick to a consistent schedule," Crosby said. "Sometimes it's easier to get a bus than it is on other days. Most of the time, it has been very difficult to get a bus during the last six weeks."

Amanda Rosenblatt, a UF graduate student, also thinks the bus system is not as efficient during the summer as it usually is during the fall and spring.

"They don't run as much during the summer," she said. "It's not good. You're waiting at the bus stop longer. It seems like they are not sticking to their schedules."

Both students said they ride the 9 and 35 routes.

RTS Marketing and Communications Specialist Theresa Harrison said there are 12 campus shuttle buses during the summer, down from 19 during the fall and spring semesters. There are 55 buses running during the summer versus the usual 77 the rest of the year.

Harrison said the decisions to cut buses are made by the UF Transportation Access Fee Committee, which deals with student transportation issues concerning the university.

"We are told by this committee about UF's need for the upcoming semester," Harrison said. "The University of Florida tells us what they need, and we provide that service."

She said buses are only a few minutes off schedule, but some students think otherwise.

"During summertime, you can be waiting anywhere from the normal time to 15 to 20 minutes," Crosby said. "It's very inconsistent."

However, students are not voicing their concerns to RTS officials, Harrison said.

"I have yet to hear a complaint," she said.



# Rising milk costs cause Starbucks to charge more

Self-proclaimed coffee addicts will have to put their money where their mouths are starting Tuesday.

All Starbucks stores will raise prices on their frothy commodities by about 9 cents because of the rising price of milk and whipped cream, according to an article in The Seattle Times.

Ceren Bacinoglu, a UF graduate student, said even though it gets expensive, drinking a Grande Toffee-Nut Latte in a cushy chair at the Hub's Starbucks is her daily luxury.

"I don't like the idea that they're going to change their prices, but that won't stop me from drinking it every day," she said with a laugh.

On Wednesday, her drink cost \$3.78.

She said she recently cut back to buying just one a day.

"I don't feel guilty," Bacinoglu

added quickly.

Laura Zdziarski, a Starbucks employee at The Hub, said she believes the price increase is warranted.

"From a consumer's stand point, yeah, it's going to suck," she said. "But from a corporate standpoint, I understand."

Zdziarski, a student at F.W. Buchholz High School, said the quality of Starbucks coffee makes it worth every penny.

"Maxwell House is just not the same," she added with a smile.

Coffee-cost hikes, like the **National News** costs of most other commodities, aren't necessarily unusual.

Starbucks last raised its prices by a nickel 10 months ago, according to The Times.

Before that, there was an 11-cent increase in 2004.

UF gets a 10.4 percent commission off all food sales.

About half of that goes to the Reitz Union, and the rest goes to the finance and administration department that oversees food-service contracts.

Jill Rodriguez, marketing program manager for Gator Dining Services, refused to comment.

# Alligators mate, lay eggs, attack more often in summer

Albert the Alligator may like to romp in The Swamp at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium during the fall and spring, but the summertime is when real alligators come out to play.

Perran Ross, a wildlife biologist with UF's Department of Wildlife Ecology and Conservation, said late spring and summer are the times when most alligator attacks occur.

From May to September, alligators mate and their eggs hatch, Ross said.

This means favorite summer hangouts among students such as lakes and rivers are also popular with the potentially dangerous reptiles.

In May 2006, three fatal alligator attacks occurred within a week.

UF history senior Annie Brown lived by a canal in Pinellas County where Judy W. Cooper's body was found during that week.

"It was the biggest deal for every housewife in that area," she said.

It was an area that was well known for having alligators, and signs had been posted to prevent people from feeding them.

"People know not to go near the water because there's a good chance you'll end up as a gator's next meal," Brown said.

According to a St. Petersburg Times article published in June, Tennessee resident Bruce Burger was attacked while trying to retrieve a golf ball from a pond on the sixth hole of Lake Venice Golf Club in Venice, Fla.

Burger escaped the gator's jaws with some puncture wounds on his right forearm and a strained groin. Ross said the incident exemplifies one of the two main types of instances that trigger alligator attacks.

The first type of attack is accidental contact between a human and an alligator. In situations where an alligator is surprised, it will attack in a defensive manner.

"The other kind of attack is quite the opposite," he said. "An alligator will say, 'Mmm, that's a tasty little morsel right there. I think I'll eat it.'"


Ross said the best option for anyone attacked by an alligator is to fight back. The alligator will usually just give up.

Despite the danger during these summer months, the likelihood of being attacked by an alligator is still very small, he said.

"The chances of being attacked by a cow or a dog are much higher," Ross said.

He said alligators are most active in the early morning and at dusk, which are their primary feeding times.

"Don't put yourself in harm's way," Ross said. "Don't walk down the freeway with a blindfold on."






## Money will push UF in to the Top 10

Florida is one of the fastest growing states in the nation. Warm weather, beautiful beaches and a vibrant economy have encouraged staggering migration over the past thirty years. Favorable taxes have attracted businesses, especially entrepreneurial startups, which have expanded economic and intellectual capacity throughout the state. State gross domestic product has grown at above-average rates, and today, Florida is considered an excellent place to work and an even better place to raise a family.

Considering the state's extraordinary prospects, one would think Florida boasts a public university that academically ranks in line with the University of Michigan, University of California at Berkeley and the University of Virginia. One would think UF, located in the fourth most populated U.S. state, would be viewed as a national flagship — one of the premier public institutions for higher education and academic research.

U.S. News & World Report, the most respected judge for college rankings, thinks otherwise. Its August 2007 survey of public universities ranks UF as one of five universities tied for the No. 13 spot (47, if you include the privates). While 13 is nothing to snuff at, in a state as large and politically significant as Florida, UF should fare much better.

Popular criticism suggests the rankings are nothing more than predetermined hogwash, influenced more by university politics than impartial analysis. Some argue they are random, and university presidents have little influence over where their schools end up in the rankings. Though there is probably some truth to these arguments, I think these criticisms are mostly exaggerated. In my opinion, UF has some fundamental problems, which are reflected in the rankings.

For one, there are far too many students and not enough classes. When comparing UF's student-to-faculty ratio to

that of any Top 10 public university, the disparity is clear. For undergraduate students, it is absurdly difficult to sign up for live classes, let alone meet with an adviser without waiting in a line for hours. Online classes are convenient and practical, but they also force students to take less active roles in the learning environment. I'm sure U.S.

News has taken notice.

There is a possible solution. The Florida Board of Governors' intention to increase tuition is probably the most rational choice for additional funding. Though some students would have to take out loans, this short-term consequence would be outweighed with a more highly valued degree down the road.

Though rankings aren't everything, potential employers certainly weigh these numbers. UF is perfectly capable of attaining a spot among the elite Top 10 public schools listed in U.S. News & World Report. However, the university is not deserving of such a ranking if it cannot produce the results and provide the resources those public schools included in the Top 10 consistently show. As the old saying goes, you have to spend money to make money. Top schools sell.

This August, U.S. News will publish its 2008 rankings. Who knows where UF will wind up. My guess is UF will probably remain in the low teens. The resistance to these tuition increases only slows UF's advancement. Substantial progress calls for fundamental changes, and it's going to take a whole lot of money to make the changes a reality.

# Accurate UF expert database available from A to D

In addition to her regular duties, Kay Howell is updating an online account with the names and details of more than 1,200 UF em-

ployees — Alone.

Howell, an executive secretary at UF's News Bureau, is working on organizing the information on the experts.ufl.edu Web site, which allows people to search for experts at UF in a number of fields.

"I'm going from the beginning and starting with the A's," said Howell, who began the task in March.

Howell said she tries to work on the list at least once or twice a week. So far in the alphabet, she has gotten up to the D's.

**Local News** She said reporters have called from time to time to say that one of the experts listed on the site is no longer at UF.

All the experts are supposed to

be affiliated with the university. It is up to the professors on the site to notify someone at the News Bureau of any changes, said UF spokesman Steve Orlando.

Orlando said the site relies on the experts' professional integrity to determine what topics they are comfortable speaking about.

"Experts is a really subjective word," he said. "In fact, a lot of the

faculty members are really uncomfortable with that word."

Howell said UF had a print version of the experts list beginning in 1986, and the list went online in 1999.

"We do add people to the list all the time," she said. "Right now what I'm trying to do is go back and get rid of the incorrect and out-of-date information."

## Local tow companies supportive of rules

makes tow companies accept payment from debit cards as well as Visa and MasterCard credit cards.

Other credit cards are still not accepted, however, because cards such as American Express have higher transaction fees, which can put a strain on small businesses, Mastrodicasa said.

That doesn't mean the City Commission is completely ruling out other forms of payment.

If the majority of the community became American Express card-carriers in the future, Mastrodicasa said, the City Commission would modify the regulations.

Another new change calls for tow companies to take pictures of the car in question before towing.

Scott said picture type and quality don't matter as long as the image is good enough to show vehicle location and the infraction.

Tow companies are required to keep photos on file for one year, she said.

Ryan Williams, manager of Watson's Towing, said pictures are going to make towing a lot easier because they provide evidence.

Superior Towing owner Mike Weber said his company has kept digital cameras in all of its tow trucks for the last three years. If a picture isn't clear, he said, he is able to download it onto the computer and clean it up.

"When you have nothing to hide," Weber said, "you shouldn't have a problem taking a picture of it."

As for other regulations, Scott said many people are unaware they have the right to inspect their towed car for theft or damages before they pay for it. She said if drivers can't pay for the vehicle right away, they have the right to pick up their personal property, such as purses or laptops, that may be stored inside.

Penalties for tow companies that disregard regulations include "a warning or possibly losing a license to do roam towing," Mastrodicasa said.

classifieds section, she said. With this, students can put their books up for sale on the site or search for other students selling books they need.

Senate President Robert Agrusa said he hopes to have the Web site up by the first day of fall to use the exchange section. If that's not possible, the site would definitely be up by the end of the term, Agrusa said.

Though the Web site is associated with UF Bookstore, students can also sell books bought at other stores to other students, Bell said.

Since students will use their GatorLink usernames and passwords to log on to the site, it will make it different from sites such as Half.com, she said. The Web site is being developed by the UF Business Services Division and won't take a dime of students' money, she said.

The final name for the Web site is still in the works, but links for the site will be available through ISIS, the Student Government Web site and the Gator1 Central site, Bell said.

Other schools have similar sites, and the feedback has been positive, he said.

"This is a great service that we're not paying for," Agrusa said.

# 10 BEATLES IMPERSONATORS *twist and shout*

hundreds of new bands pop up around the world every day with the hope of tasting a bit of the phenomenon status the Beatles achieved in their musical lifetime.

"In reality, we will probably never see a band as revolutionary as the Beatles," said Carl Carrillo, 62. "It was like the world changed when the Beatles came around. Musically and culturally, everything changed, and every time the Beatles changed, so did we."

It isn't likely that a band will emerge now that can motivate society to follow a psychedelic or Hare Krishna lifestyle as the Beatles did, but that does not stop cover bands from trying to provide current generations with a taste of those times.

Perhaps fueled by a desire to be a part of something bigger or just curiosity, cover bands and their fans have been recreating

musical scenes for decades.

"I think it is great that people try to imitate music and experience what they did not get to experience in their lifetime," said Jonathan Shupert, a UF packaging sciences senior. "It might not be as good as the real thing, but it gives us a taste."

On Sunday, Gainesville residents have a chance to go back in time with one of the most successful Beatles cover bands, which will perform at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts.

## Come together

Beatles cover bands were one of the first types of imitation groups to emerge, and, to this day, hundreds of foursomes strive to entertain audiences with their best Lennon, Starr, Harrison and McCartney

impersonations.

Bands that can represent the Beatles well reap the benefit of a strong fan base lured by the nostalgia of being able to hear the live sound of the revolutionary '60s.

The Fab Four, a group of Beatles impersonators, has attracted fans worldwide.

Using the surname most popularly used to refer to the Beatles, Ardy Sarraf, Ron McNeil, Michael Amador and Rolo Sandoval tour year-round, awing audiences with their uncanny Beatles renditions.

After years of unsuccessfully playing original music individually, the guys decided they would opt for playing Beatles music.

For the past decade, the four have worked together to deliver a production that leaves no detail unmarked.

The Fab Four is the only Beatles cover band in the world that does everything live on stage — there are no back-up tapes or fifth Beatle for reinforcement.

"It is a produced theatrical show with dialogue, solos and costume changes," said Jerry Ross, one of the group's agents.

During performances, the Fab Four undergo three costume changes tracing the Beatles career from the early Beatles to the "Sgt. Pepper" era and finally to "Abbey Road."

"They really fall into the characters," said Tammi Sharp, who handles accommodations for the group. "There is dialogue mainly between John and Paul, and of course Ringo is very quiet. George chimes in too."

Ed Sullivan, known for airing breakthrough performances of the Beatles on his television show, also appears in the production, played by Florida-native George Trullinger — he takes the stage to introduce the Fab Four as the real Ed Sullivan did on his

February 9, 1964 segment.

When Ardy Sarraf plays the role of Paul McCartney, audience members are stunned.

"When I heard him sing, the hairs on the back of my neck literally stood up," McNeil said. "I couldn't believe how amazing he was, how much he sounded like Paul McCartney."

## personification Perfected

Although the four are not performing groundbreaking hits they have written themselves, playing Beatles songs note-for-note is no easy feat.

"The most difficult thing is working so hard at playing the music exactly as it should be, doing it justice," technical director Nick McCoy said.

Ron McNeil, who plays John Lennon, said turning into the Fab Four is a meticulous process. Everything from mannerisms to dialect must be considered to produce and write the show.

"You can't just give someone a Beatle pill and turn them into The Beatles," McNeil said.

Prospective show-goers don't seem to mind they won't be seeing the actual Beatles at the Phillips Center on Sunday night.

Three days before the Fab Four are set to hit the Gainesville stage, the event is nearly sold out. When the group performed in Gainesville last year, there were about 1,200 spectators.

These numbers are nothing new to the Fab Four, who constantly play to nearly sold-out crowds. Though they are mere mortals attempting to portray the Beatles, the numbers show that a glimpse of a well-done recreation is better than no Beatles at all.

Famous 19th-century humorist Josh Billings once said, "about the most originality that any writer can hope to achieve honestly is to steal with good judgment."

If imitation is really a fact of life, why not go all-out and impersonate the often-titled "greatest musical group of all time"?

"What is a better job than getting to play as the Beatles?" McNeil said. "It is pretty much every band's dream to be the Beatles."

The Fab Four will perform at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts on Sunday at 7:30 p.m. Tickets can be purchased by calling the Phillips Center Box Office at (352) 392-ARTS or (800) 905-ARTS, or by visiting [www.ticketmaster.com](http://www.ticketmaster.com).


In her final installment, Rowling ties her themes of the wonders of love, the dangers of power and greed, and the importance of our choices into one teaching.





## Ratatouille: a tasty treat

Pixar has become an unstoppable force. With one hit after another, you would expect the steam to run out — but it hasn't.

"Ratatouille" is a masterful movie and deserving heir to the "Finding Nemo" empire.

The film follows the tale of Remy, a French rat with an uncanny ability and desire to cook, who is impeccably voiced by Patton Oswalt. He shuns the conventions of the human and rat world on his path to chefdom.

A love story buds between his human friend Linguini, voiced by Lou Romano, and a rival chef, Colette, voiced by Janeane Garofalo. One of the best performances comes from a devilishly entertaining Peter O'Toole voicing Anton Ego, the razor-tongued critic whose mission is to demolish Gusteau's, the restaurant where Remy and Linguini cook.

"Ratatouille" features more slapstick comedy than previous Disney films but is a credit to the form. There are several

tremendously funny scenes, and seeing the world from a Rat's eye view is engaging and lively, making the film one giant visual effect.

For the adults, there are references to great culinary forms. In particular, the wines in the film would make any wine aficionado salivate (a '61 Chateau Latour or Chateau Lafite).

The film's only downfall is the beginning, which was underwhelming. The movie takes a while to reel in the audience, but it ends with such gusto that the slow pace of the first few minutes is almost completely forgotten.

"Ratatouille" was an excellent film that should not be labeled as a mere "kid's movie." It celebrates not only the joy of dining but also the classic Disney theme of embracing your true self.







**10** Bobby Johnson (Vanderbilt): It almost isn't fair to put Johnson so far down in the rankings, because he doesn't exactly have the same opportunity for success as the other coaches in the conference. In fact, I think the coach has done a pretty good job considering that Vandy doesn't have an athletic department (literally), and they probably have lecture classes that are more highly attended than football games. But you can't argue with results, and Johnson's Commodores have yet to make a bowl game during his tenure.

**9** Rich Brooks (Kentucky): Rich Brooks' opening statement at last year's SEC Media Days was something to the effect of "I bet you guys didn't expect to see me here." We didn't. But despite the efforts of FireRichBrooks.com, he stuck around long enough to have his most successful season with Kentucky. Brooks' Wildcats shocked the country with their high-powered offense and a Music City Bowl victory, and Kentucky made sure Brooks would make a few more Media Days appearances, locking him up to a four-year contract extension worth roughly \$1 million per year.

**8** Houston Nutt (Arkansas): It's highly unusual for a coach to be in the hot seat directly following his most successful season, but that's exactly what's happening. Nutt wooed several top recruits from Arkansas Springdale High by hiring the school's coach, Gus Malzahn, as offensive coordinator last season. One tumultuous year later, Malzahn, along with highly touted quarterback Mitch Mustain and wide receiver Damian Williams, has decided to jump ship despite a 10-win season in 2006. If the Razorbacks struggle, Nutt may be forced to follow them out the door.

**7** Les Miles (LSU): It isn't easy claiming a guy who is 22-4 the past two seasons is only the seventh best coach in his own conference, but I just can't rank him any higher. Miles has yet to prove he isn't living off Nick Saban's recruiting classes, and you can even make a case that LSU has underachieved the past two years. I won't go that far, because you could easily blame Hurricane Katrina in 2005 and a brutal schedule in 2006 for a couple of those losses, but there is something about Miles that just doesn't seem quite right, and that is enough to put him just a slight notch behind the SEC's elite coaches.

**6** Mark Richt (Georgia): If you can say anything about Richt, it's that he is consistent. The Bulldogs are always competing for the

SEC title; they are never quite good enough to play for a national title and they can never beat the Gators. Even with a horrendous situation at quarterback last season, Richt's Bulldogs still managed to win nine games.

**5** Philip Fulmer (Tennessee): A few years ago, you could make a case that Fulmer deserves to be No. 1. After all, the guy won a national title. But with so many great coaches in the SEC, it's a "what-have-you-done-for-me-lately league," and all Fulmer has done lately is underachieve. The national title is enough to keep him in front of Richt, but the fact that he had to publicly apologize for the Volunteers' 2005 season keeps him from moving up any further.

**4** Nick Saban (Alabama): Nobody seems to like Saban, but that doesn't stop him from recruiting talented players and winning college football games. Saban won a national title in 2003 and helped turn LSU into a powerhouse before leaving for the NFL. As long as Saban can repeat that success at Alabama, Crimson Tide fans won't care if he is kind of a jerk.

**3** Tommy Tuberville (Auburn): Tuberville didn't technically win a national title in 2004, but anytime an SEC team goes 13-0, they are national champs in my book. Tuberville

doesn't have the name value of some of the other coaches in the SEC, but the fact that he has defeated archrival Alabama five straight times and has made Auburn the premiere football school in the state of Alabama speaks volumes. So does the fact that the Tigers consistently find themselves near the top of the SEC West standings these days.

**2** Steve Spurrier (South Carolina): Lou Holtz left the Gamecocks in absolute shambles, but somehow Spurrier has managed to make a decent team out of South Carolina. The Gamecocks are only going to get better under Spurrier's tutelage, which is bad news for the rest of the conference. South Carolina could make a huge splash as early as this season. Couple the tremendous job he has done at South Carolina with his previous success at UF, and Spurrier deserves the No. 2 ranking.

**1** Urban Meyer (UF): It took two years for Meyer to make Bowling Green extremely successful, two years to take Utah to a BCS bowl victory and two years to win a national title at UF. That's impressive. Besides, when a guy is coming off a national title, it is hard to argue that he doesn't deserve to be ranked No. 1. As long as Meyer continues to win the recruiting wars, his teams are going to be tough to beat. Something tells me last year's national title won't be his last.





## Spurrier aims to top Gators

HOOVER, Ala. — Steve Spurrier will always be remembered for his dominating 12-year run at UF.

Seven Southeastern Conference titles and the 1996 national championship are responsible for that.

Spurrier, entering his third year at South Carolina, would like his Gamecocks to be mentioned in the same breath as the Gators, too.

"We've raised our goals this year," Spurrier said in his opening address at SEC Media Days at the Wynfrey Hotel on Wednesday. "We're going to try to win the conference. We felt like we've really increased our talent level at South Carolina. We've added a lot of players that we think are at a pretty close level with Florida, Georgia and Tennessee."

Spurrier has a 15-10 record at South Carolina and won the school's first bowl game since 2002, the Liberty Bowl.

"The first couple of years we felt like, with our team, our goal was to win more than we lose, and to win the bowl games would be a pretty good year for us," Spurrier said. "We did that."

There's no comparison to the mighty Gators, who have gone 22-4 in Urban Meyer's first two seasons and won a slightly more prestigious postseason game six months ago in Arizona.

But Spurrier feels the numbers do not tell the whole story.

And he's right.

He spanked Meyer in 2005, sending the Gators from the SEC Championship Game to the Outback Bowl.

In 2006, he nearly outdid himself.

If not for three blocked kicks in the second half, Spurrier could have reigned in his return to Gainesville.

This year, Spurrier hosts the Gators on Nov. 10.

To fulfill his goals, he might need to top his alma mater again.

"I know it will be a huge assignment, but I believe

Since becoming the conference's first black head coach in 2004, Croom has done nothing but lose, compiling a 9-25 overall record with the Bulldogs, including a 4-20 mark in conference play.

What kind of clown?


"A big one," McFadden said.

our players, our team, we need to come to the ballpark feeling we're just as good as Florida, Georgia, Tennessee, and that we can play with those guys to see what happens," Spurrier said.

Spurrier continued to embrace his UF roots during Wednesday's media session.

He compared his current starting quarterback, Blake Mitchell, to his last starter at UF, Rex Grossman.

Spurrier benched Grossman in 2000 for games against Georgia and South Carolina.

Grossman responded by reclaiming the starting job and leading the Gators to an SEC championship.

Mitchell similarly sat after two games last season. Like Grossman, he got his job back and led the Gamecocks to a three-game winning streak to end the season.

Slive said Wednesday he is considering more comprehensive background checks for league referees and will meet with league officials tonight to discuss the matter.

Currently, the NCAA ran-

domly checks referees who work bowl games.

"I think because of what happened in the NBA, this will really heighten all the security and checking on guys' backgrounds all the time," South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier said.

"Referees really need to be scrutinized, probably more so than us coaches are scrutinized."



