



Student dies after Lake Wauburg barbecue

Friends met to remember UF classmate

A UF student died Saturday night after jumping into Lake Wauburg trying to catch a football.

UF sophomore Oscar

Ahumuza, 21, died at Shands at UF, according to a University Police Department press release.

However, according to Ahumuza's Facebook profile, he was 20 years old.

The cause of death could not be confirmed by press time.

Ahumuza was at a barbecue with Chi Alpha, an on-campus Christian fellowship group, at Lake Wauburg when he was taken to Shands.

Jon Lash, student president of Chi Alpha, said they were catching a football while jumping off

the dock.

The English senior said he was throwing the football when Ahumuza's turn came.

After Ahumuza jumped into the water, Lash said he initially thought Ahumuza was joking around, but when he didn't surface, others jumped in to find him.

He was found by a Lake Wauburg lifeguard, he said.

Lash said he had a hard time finding Ahumuza because the grass in the water made it hard to see.

The lifeguard that jumped in found Ahumuza right away, he said.

UF band marches on

Editor's note: This story is the first article in a series on the Fightin' Gator Marching Band.

New members of the "Pride of the Sunshine" Fightin' Gator Marching Band gathered in the UF music building and listened as their director spoke of the sacrifices they would make during their time with the group.

But Scarlet Basler needed no lecture on sacrifice. She had already volunteered to give up the comfort of her lightweight oboe for the good of the band. Instead, she chose to play the heavy sousaphone, a brass instrument that was modeled after a tuba but has a spiral stem which wraps around the player's upper body.

Now, she would begin a grueling, weeklong series of tests that would strain her playing ability and athleticism.

The band, which has about 100 new members, will rehearse less than

any other school in the Southeastern Conference, said John Watkins, the band director. But with that luxury comes a trade-off. The band camp rehearsals, which started Aug. 18 for most of the band and ended Sunday, are intense.

"Every Saturday afternoon when you come through that tunnel, there are 90,000 people waiting for you," Watkins said.

The band has enough music for about 10 halftime shows, Watkins continued. It is important that students begin learning most of that music now before classes cut into rehearsal time, he said. The goal is to provide the best entertainment and support for the athletes and fans at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium week after week.

In less than a week, they will need to march through that tunnel in the afternoon heat for their first summer game.

"We would all much rather be in the pool," Watkins said.

'Course shoppers' place stress on students, university

■ 'COURSE SHOPPERS' FREQUENTLY DROP AND ADD CLASSES.

It took Megan Fleming several days to add the basic statistics course she needs for her minor. The freshman theater major made three attempts to register with ISIS each day, but the class was full each time.

"It's really frustrating," said Fleming, who eventually got into the course. "We studied hard to get here, and we're here to get an education first and foremost."

Fleming is one of the students whose registration might have been complicated by the antics of "course shoppers."

Course shoppers are students who sample courses by dropping and adding right up to the last minute, according to a recent UF study. These course shoppers are taking

a toll on university resources as students scramble to register by the end of the drop-add period Wednesday night.

More than a third of college-level students qualify as course shoppers, according to the study.

Course shoppers come in two varieties. The "cyclic shopper" registers for a normal course load initially but changes their schedule repeatedly during drop-add

week. "Bulk shoppers" register for a course load far larger than they intend to take and drop the ones they like least at the end of the drop-add period.

Both are considered a detriment to the enrollment process. Course shoppers crowd other students out of courses and pose a financial burden on the university.

"Though there's nothing technically illegal about it, it's a piggy behavior" said





Tri-Delta blasts TV stereotypes

Sunday afternoon outside the immaculate Delta Delta Delta Sorority house, polished young women walked up and down the stairs in a practiced fashion.

Showing off perfect pearly whites, they walked with their hands folded neatly behind their backs, practicing for their final recruitment ceremonies.

Despite what ABC Family's TV show "GREEK" might suggest, there were no catfights, no keg stands and no togas.

Christine Bainer, president of the sorority known as Tri-Delta, wants to make sure viewers don't believe those stereotypes.

Bainer, a UF political campaigns senior, said it's important for outsiders to try to understand what sorority life is about without relying on gross exaggerations shown on TV.

Michelle Shimberg, international president of Tri-Delta Sorority

and a former member of the UF chapter from 1981 to 1984, recently issued a complaint about the show, which portrays fictional fraternities and sororities.

"I am particularly concerned with how ABC Family's 'GREEK' continues to use sex, drinking and scheming relationships to define its lead female characters and the sorority experience overall," Shimberg wrote in the statement.

Greek Life

In an interview, Shimberg said she doesn't intend to protest the show, but she'd like to work with ABC Family to realistically develop the female characters.

"The relationships are not reflective of the values of our organization," she said. "They are not reflective of the friendships."

ABC Family has not responded to her statements, she said.

On past episodes of "GREEK," the characters prepared for midterms.

Members of a fictional fraternity, Kappa Tau, studied from 30 years

worth of tests collected from fellow Kappa Taus, according to a synopsis on ABC Family's Web site.

Previously, Casey, a fictional sorority member, ordered her arch-nemesis, who is a pledge, to go on a nearly impossible X-rated scavenger hunt. Campus police later picked up the pledge.

Bainer said though the show has presented an untrue picture of sorority life, it has not affected the number of women interested in joining UF's chapter of Tri Delta this year.

When asked what makes sorority life distinctive, she immediately answered.

"It's the sisterhood," she said matter-of-factly, as she sat in a pristine common room of Tri-Delta's sterile new house.

Bainer, a slender girl with manicured nails and a neatly pulled-back bun, said she has friends who are not in the sorority, but "my relationship with the Tri-Deltas is just a little closer."

The main purpose of the sorority is to develop high moral charac-

ter in its members, she said.

Of course, there's always time for fun, too, she added.

She said partying and alcohol are part of college life, not just Greek life, adding that Tri-Delta discourages binge drinking.

"There are women in every chapter who don't drink at all," Bainer said. "It's really damaging to stereotype an entire group of women who are very diverse."

Shimberg said she also under-

"They show none of their goals, achievements or leadership activities," she said.

"One of the early shows depicted preparation for the recruitment process, and much of what they were focused on was appearance and clothing," she said. "That's not reflective of what we are."

Students fill local religious centers

With the imminent flood of tests and class assignments affecting students' sanity, those who attend religious services can pray for some holy help.

Religious centers throughout Gainesville see their attendance increase once fall semester begins.

Kathleen Cole, the director of stewardship and development at St. Augustine Catholic Church, said the church witnesses a large attendance increase the first couple of weeks because of the influx of students.

Cole said visitors make up part of this increase, such as the parents and other relatives who visit or help their students move in.

The opening mass of the academic year was held on Sunday.

"We've asked students to bring a textbook to be blessed at the mass," Cole said.

St. Augustine offered a welcome week the same time that about 90 of its alumni visited. The week, also known as Blast Off Week, lasted from Aug. 19 to Aug. 26 and offered an ice cream social, a field day, a barbecue and a karaoke party.

"The new students could see the impact this faith community had on former students," Cole said.

It's easy for new students to feel homesick or stressed, and St. Augustine can be their home away from home, she said. University

Lutheran Church and Campus Center, which also saw an increase in new students, offers similar activities. The Rev. Michael Collins said the church has weekly Sunday morning gatherings and a breakfast brunch for students.

A March student mission trip is being planned to Eisleben, Germany, where students will do community service projects with townspeople and members of the local Lutheran church.

Last year they visited Costa Rica and lived with an indigenous tribe. It was interesting because they lived with no electricity and no running water, Collins said.

UF Hillel, 2020 W. University Ave., offers free kosher Shabbat dinners on Fridays. Hillel has seen dinner attendance jump from about 95 students during the summer to about 300 students during the fall, Rabbi Yoni Kaiser-Blueth said.

Kaiser-Blueth, the associate director of Jewish Student Life, said he enjoyed making connections with new students during the first week of classes.

"There were no barriers, no walls," he said.

This year Israel and UF Hillel are turning 60 years old. Kaiser-Blueth said it's an "awesome" coincidence. UF Hillel held a special event Thursday called "Israel: 60 & Sexy."

"To us, being 60 years old is still sexy. It's cause for celebration," he said.



Senate plans to expand projects in fall

While many UF students left Gainesville for the summer for internships or jobs, the Student Senate was still in session.

The Senate will carry on its duties Tuesday, said Senate President Robert Agrusa.

Agrusa said the Senate passed 30 laws during the summer. While most clarified past legislation, other Senate projects were more substantial, he said. For example, the Senate featured guest speakers such as UF President Bernie Machen and UF Provost Janie Fouke.

Agrusa said the line of speakers would continue Tuesday with Jeremy Foley, UF's athletics director.

Other projects included placing paper recycling bins around campus during exam weeks, working on a book-buyback Web site to release at the end of September and finalizing plans for a student memorial, he said.

Agrusa and other Student Government officials also took a July trip to West Palm Beach to revamp the Florida Student Association, which serves as the link between student interests and the Florida Legislature.

The association is made up of student government officials from Florida's 11 public universities.

As president of the association, UF Student Body President Ryan Moseley led the overhaul of the organization's budget and cut \$33,000.

Agrusa said he personally rewrote nearly 80 bylaws in FSA's constitution to streamline the organization's efforts.

Some of the Senate's activities drew more controversy than budget cuts.

In May, the Senate had a rough start when two out of 14 senators facing expulsion resigned.

The senators were up for expulsion after failing to hold enough required meetings with the groups they represent.

Senators ultimately voted not to expel anyone. Agrusa declined to comment on the issue.

Controversy also arose in July when the Senate removed UF's Tower Yearbook as a part of SG.

Yearbook staffers were angry, complaining that they were unaware of the bill until the day it passed.

Agrusa said he supported the Senate's decision because "nobody was really using the service." About 80 yearbooks were sold in 2006.

The use of "I Voted" stickers during SG elections was also a sticky issue for the Senate after it gave SG's supervisor of elections sole power to hand them out.


The Senate gave SG's Elections Commission the power to determine an individual's SG party affiliation based on his or her actions.

Overall, Agrusa said the summer session might have been slower than previous years, but it was still successful.

"We had 44 replacement senators, which required a lot of training," he said. "It did take longer to get the ball rolling."

He said the fall semester would be dedicated to completing any unfinished summer projects and starting several new ones.

These include making video recordings of Senate meetings available online, expanding UF WebMail and investigating the possible use of biodiesel fuel on Regional Transit System buses, he said.



Fla.: Screwing up elections since 2000

After spending the summer interning in Washington, D.C., I've learned that politics are about as useful as hanging chads, and congressional interns are more stuck up than their do-nothing bosses on Capitol Hill.

In Florida, we're all too familiar with political foolery.

It all began in 2000 when Al Gore was elected president by Florida voters. But the U.S. Supreme Court stepped in and stopped the ballot recount and gave the presidency to George W. Bush.

In 2004, the nation watched to see if Florida voters could get this election right, and according to the voting machines, they did, and Bush stayed in office.

Corn-based ethanol not cure-all for gasoline, energy woes

As we've all realized, perhaps too late, summer is ending, and the summer driving season is coming to a complete stop.

Considering the price of gas, that's probably a good thing.

But long after our collective finances have recovered from the petrol outlays of summer 2007, we'll be hearing about gas and other energy issues from a host of Democratic and Republican presidential candidates.

It seems that one can't tune into any of the early presidential debates without hearing the phrase "energy independence."

As if shooting a magic bullet, a candidate usually mentions ethanol produced from corn.

Even though it might seem that I'm skeptical of the usefulness of a string of debates well over a year before the 2008 elections and the promise of renewable substitutes for petroleum, I'm not.

I still hope that over the course of the candidates' verbal wrangling we can glimpse snippets of truth and insight. And

it's obvious that we can't go on as we are with regard to energy policy.

Something must change.

As loosely related as these two topics seem, I think an examination of the rhetoric surrounding ethanol may shed light on some deficiencies of, and things to be desired from, the positions advanced by presidential hopefuls.

Let's look first at how the claims for ethanol are framed and how credible such claims might be.

At the beginning of any discussion about the use of ethanol or ethanol blends as substitutes for gasoline, we're struck by the overwhelming desirability of such a solution to our current problem.

The vast interior Midwest is perfectly suited to grow corn, from which ethanol can be produced.

Plus, ethanol is a carbon-neutral fuel: All the carbon dioxide that is given off when ethanol is burned was captured by corn during its growth, resulting in zero new carbon emissions.

It sounds like a politician's dream come true — an abundant domestic crop we can

Jesse Butler put into our gas tanks that may ease the climate-change crisis in the process.

Even though presidential candidates set up ethanol from corn as a win-win, this isn't the case.

According to an Aug. 19 Newsweek article, half of Brazil's yearly production of ethanol — which is much more than the U.S.'s — would be required to replace just 1 percent of the gasoline used in the United States, said Marcos Jank, head of Única, the Brazilian sugar and alcohol producers association.

Plus, using more corn to produce ethanol would lead indirectly to higher food prices.

The dream of homegrown ethanol-supplied energy independence is little more than a fantasy because the U.S. will need more fuel than we could produce.

American voters want Democratic and Republican presidential candidates who are creative but also realistic about solutions to complex problems, including our energy problems.

Given the impossibility of ethanol's replacement of traditional oil-based fuels, why do so many of the presidential candidates speak as if ethanol could solve our complex energy problems?

It's downright troubling that much of our time and mental energy is spent considering a solution that won't work.


Presidential candidates are supposed to demonstrate their capacity for leadership as part of their campaigns.

A large part of leadership involves discarding initially attractive, yet ultimately mistaken, ideas.

The candidates have already damaged their credentials by failing to correctly identify the problems that most likely doom an ethanol solution to our petroleum addiction.

As the debates continue, perhaps a few candidates will come to their senses and realize that ethanol is not a quick fix. We need a thoughtful, comprehensive energy strategy, and candidates who can help our country see that strategy through.

Despite new hires, more faculty members on way

The 15 new faculty positions announced by UF President Bernie Machen on Thursday will not affect UF's decision to hire more professors and academic advisers through the Tuition Differential Program, said a UF official.

UF Provost Janie Fouke said administrators cannot begin the search for applicants because UF doesn't know the exact amount of

money the program will bring.

UF spokesman Steve Orlando said UF would eventually hire 200 faculty members and 100 advisers over the duration of the program.

"That was our goal initially — to hire more faculty and advisers so students could get a better overall experience," Orlando said.

The Tuition Differential Program will allow UFNew to incrementally raise tuition up to 40 percent over four years, so long as it does not exceed 15 percent, a little more than \$500, per year.

The 15 new hires would fill positions for high-demand courses, such as chemistry, botany, physiology and English, Orlando said.

Fouke said after UF analyzes how much money the program will bring

UF Administration in, professors will be hired for the courses with the worst teacher-to-student ratios.

UF has just recently begun looking at those demands, she said, and it could take six months

to a year to fill the positions.

Though Fouke said the promise of more money from the Tuition Differential Program is exciting, it won't solve all UF's problems. She said the program would only replace about half of what UF had to cut from its budget this year.

The Cost Reduction Efficiency Task Force proposed a budget reduction of \$30 million to \$34 million. Fouke said the Tuition Differential Program would probably only bring in about \$17 million.

"We're not getting ahead here," she said with a laugh.

In terms of tuition costs, Florida is at the bottom, Fouke said, and that affects the quality of education.


UF ranked as having the lowest in-state tuition on USA Today's 2006 College and Tuition Fees Survey.

Fouke said she wants to make sure people realize UF isn't simply adding 200 new professors. It's only replacing some who have left or have been cut.

Ahumuza remembered for 'bright smile'



CPR was performed on Ahumuza as he was loaded for transport to Shands at UF where he was pronounced dead at 11 p.m., according to the release.

Greg Travassos, a UF electrical engineering senior, said he met Ahumuza through Chi Alpha, and Ahumuza was always kind.

"He was a great friend," he said.

Word spread quickly about Ahumuza's death.

Friends and classmates met in Graham Hall on Sunday evening to remember Ahumuza.

In attendance was Pramod Khargonekar, dean of the College of Engineering, who had taught Ahumuza.

"He was a very bright student," Khargonekar said. "I have the fondest memories of him. He would ask the most insightful questions. He had

one of the brightest smiles I've ever seen."

Also in attendance was Roberto Hernandez, a former engineering student and Ahumuza's mentor in Successful Transition through Enhanced Preparation for Undergraduate Programs, also known as STEPUP.

Student struggles with sousaphone for Gators band

was restricted to playing percussion on the sidelines as other band members marched. On that first day of college practice, she said she planned to rely on her experience pushing the heavy percussion equipment to adapt to the weight of the sousaphone. She said her background in gymnastics would also help with the intensity of the marching rehearsals.

As the other members of the sousaphone section unpacked and assembled the horns, Basler and another new sousaphone player, Lalaine Papel, were given their own instruments. They were in worse condition than the others, and Basler's mouthpiece needed to be boiled in water before it was safe to play.

"How am I supposed to carry this thing?" Papel, a veteran band member who has switched instruments before, asked as she examined the case that held her new instrument. New band members often open their first sousaphone case after band camp starts.

THE WEIGHT ON HER SHOULDERS

It is common for students to switch to the sousaphone to fill gaps in the section, said Chad Mizelle, sousaphone section leader. But most who make the change are accustomed to playing other brass instruments.

Basler and Papel were shown how to lift the instruments onto their shoulders, and they followed Mizelle outside while the rest of the section remained to practice together.

The large instruments looked out of place on the women's small bodies. Basler, who is 5-foot-1-inch tall and weighs 105 pounds, carried a sousaphone that was more than 50 inches tall. Mizelle estimated that the instrument weighed 45 pounds.

As an oboe player, Basler did not do much marching in high school. Oboists traditionally play on the sidelines. She

said she will rely on her experience pushing that heavy equipment and her background in gymnastics to adapt to the weight of the sousaphone and the intensity of the marching rehearsals.

The first week of wearing the horn is not fun, Mizelle admitted, but it gets easier. Those who give their all can improve by 300 to 400 percent over the course of camp, he said before the lesson.

"They don't even look like the same person," he said. "It's pretty amazing."

They loaded their cases onto a trailer while Stanley Figaro, a staff member working with the section, gave the orders.

"Quickly, quickly. We are not going down as the slowest section again," he said, as the occasional part or two fell from one of the instruments.

Once outside, Mizelle began the lesson. He advised the new students to use Bengay on their shoulders. The constant pressure from the weight of their instruments can be painful, he said. He also suggested folding beach towels and laying them over their shoulders.

Now he asked his students to play their first note, a B-flat. They raised their mouthpieces to their lips and blew — the sousaphones spluttered weakly like a car with an engine problem.

He asked them to play again, this time while allowing their lips to flap together loosely inside the mouthpiece. Instantly Basler produced a strong, steady B-flat.

Success, although by the end of the day, their lips tingled.

"Yay, Scarlet, we're not dead yet," Papel joked. "That comes tomorrow."

MASTERING THE MARCH

About 300 new and returning band members, including the color guard and Gatoettes, assembled on Norman Field the next day for their first outdoor rehearsal. At 6 p.m., the sun was still hours away from setting, and it glared at them from above the tree line without a cloud to block its rays. A mock football field had been painted on the grass, and six five-gallon water coolers sat on the sideline. Dozens of smaller thermoses dotted every end of the practice surface.

Armed with a folded beach towel draped over her left shoulder, Basler listened with her section as section leaders demonstrated the correct vocal and physical responses to commands.

She had learned how to stand with her instrument when called to attention. Now it was time to march with it. At times, her director slowed her movements down purposefully, making balance difficult, but she maintained her footing through a series of forward and backward marches. Her horn shook from time to time as she traversed the uneven field, but she managed to keep pace with the other freshmen.

The band was then ordered to march while playing the F, one of the notes Basler had trouble playing with her section earlier that day. She stepped in time with the group but was too tired to produce a sound.

After rehearsal, Basler was visibly upset as she left rehearsal. She walked while others ran. She said nothing while others cheered. She picked at the grass as the band members gathered around their director's podium.

She later explained her thoughts. She had wondered why she had she not been able to play the same notes as the others, she said. She had questioned whether being in marching band was really worth adjusting her class schedule.

But she was her own harshest critic, and her superiors had kinder words about her performance.

"She's a soldier," he said.

Perfect schedule may be impossible

Albert Matheny, director of the Academic Advising Center at UF's College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

Real damage is done when course shoppers hold courses until the last minute. By the time they drop the classes, other students have already confirmed their schedules and are unable to add the class.

When sections are added during drop-add because of a course's apparent demand, the university must pay for additional instructors, Matheny said. But when course shoppers drop the class at the last minute, instructors are left teaching classes with empty seats.

"The problem is that when you're in a situation of tight resources like we are and the courses don't fill up, it's inefficient," he said.

The university is strapped for funds to hire new instructors due to a previously announced hiring freeze. Administrators are still hiring faculty for high-priority positions.

A colleague told Matheny that it's not uncommon for a high-demand, introductory-level English course to have 200 empty seats at the end of drop-add due to course shopping.

Matheny added that course shopping also reflects badly on the university by making it appear that an adequate number of sections aren't being offered.

Course shopping has become a greater issue in recent years as budgets have dwindled, said Linda Serra Hagedorn, lead author on the study.

The study, titled "Transfer and Retention of Urban Community College Students," is a multiyear, comprehensive study of the college transcripts and educational outcomes of more than 5,000 students within the community college system in Los Angeles. Of that sample, 38 percent of students practiced at least some form of course shopping.

Students who have academic problems are more likely to course shop by swapping harder classes for easier ones during the drop-add period, Hagedorn said. The study found these students had lower grade point averages than non-shoppers 30 percent of the time.

"If students are looking for this technique as a way to get a leg up, that did not seem to be a very prudent action to take," Hagedorn said.

Hagedorn stressed that this study was conducted at a community college, where the student-adviser relationship isn't as established as at UF. She said she thinks UF students may be less likely to course shop.

Still, Matheny recognizes the problems associated with UF's population of shoppers.

He suggests that students be more considerate when registering for classes. They should read the course's syllabus or contact the professor to prepare for enrollment. He also urges students to begin the drop-add process as soon as possible and to lose the notion of having a perfect schedule.

"The bottom line is students need a certain amount of flexibility and freedom in figuring out their schedules, but it could be more efficient if students practiced better behaviors," he said.

With the season-opening football game against Western Kentucky University set for an unusually early and dangerously hot 12:30 p.m. Saturday, the University Athletic Association has urged fans to find ways to cool down. The game time was the result of

a conflict over television coverage, according to a press release from John Hines, assistant director of UF's sports information department.

Lincoln Financial Sports, a television partner of the Southeastern Conference, chooses games after CBS and ESPN make their selections, according to the release. Each SEC school is required to appear twice on Lincoln Financial Sports in the 2006 and 2007 seasons.

Because other college games on Saturday are already scheduled to

air at later times on several other channels, the release stated, UF is stuck with the early game time.

The same problem occurred last year, but according to the release, UF had other options.

On Campus

"This year, they had no other alternatives other than to ask us to move our game time, and we are contractually obligated to do so," Hines wrote.

The UAA sent an e-mail to students this week offering sugges-

tions for staying cool while under the hot sun at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

Steve McClain, the UAA's spokesman, wrote that fans should drink plenty of fluids, wear loose clothing and sunscreen and take advantage of the misting tents set up around the stadium.

Alcohol could worsen heat problems, so fans should only drink in moderation, if at all.

Police officers will look for heat-distressed fans and direct them to first-aid stations.

Signs of heat exhaustion include dizziness, muscle cramps and nausea. Heat exhaustion occurs after the body loses fluids through sweating and overheats.

Heat stroke is a life-threatening condition that occurs when the body's temperature rises above 105 degrees Fahrenheit, and organs may begin to shut down.

Ticket holders driven out of The Swamp by the heat can watch the game on the big-screen TVs in the O'Connell Center, according to the e-mail.



Sorority members also present at unregistered party

At the Pi Kappa Alpha barbecue and party nearly a year ago that spurred the fraternity's suspension from UF, 60 Pi Beta Phi sorority sisters celebrated alongside the Pikes.

Patrick Duffey, the fraternity's acting president, said the party was unregistered because it was not a formal event.

However, Duffey said the standards for what UF deemed as an official Pi Kappa Alpha party were not equally applied to Pi Beta Phi guests.

"I think the standards we were held to in terms of how formal of an organization can be called an event were extremely low," he said.

The fraternity, known as Pike, was found guilty at every level of UF's judicial system for holding an unregistered party and for disregarding the possible endangerment of an individual or group.

A history of unregistered parties also contributed to the verdict.

UF spokesman Steve Orlando said Chris Bullins, UF's director of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs, did not see it fit to involve the sorority known as Pi Phi.

The burden of hosting and registering the party fell mostly on the shoulders of the Pike fraternity, Orlando said on behalf of Bullins.

Stephanie Gurlay-Thomas, spokeswoman for the international Pi Beta Phi organization, said the UF chapter of Pi Phi had nothing to do with the organization or execution of the party.

"Our girls were in attendance, but they did not purchase or serve alcohol," Gurlay-Thomas said in a phone interview Friday. "It's unfortunate that this circumstance has cast a negative light on anyone involved."

However, Duffey said, "Sixty girls do not show up by accident."

"I'm disappointed that Pi Phi would chose to shirk responsibility in that way, both nationally and locally."

"I'm disappointed that Pi Phi would chose to shirk responsibility in that way, both nationally and locally," he added.

While Gurlay-Thomas said the Pi Phi sorority was only invited to the party, Duffey said it was "pretty clear to anyone who was present that day who was hosting that party."

Cara Costa, president of the UF chapter of Pi Phi, could not be reached for comment.

This is not the first time a sorority's involvement in a troublesome fraternity party has been an issue.

According to Alligator archives and UF records, the Delta Delta Delta sorority was held partially accountable for violations at Sigma Alpha Epsilon's off-campus "Pimps and Prostitutes" party in 2000.

Then-sorority president Heather Willyard later said the theme had been changed to Mardi Gras.

The fraternity was placed on an interim suspension "normally reserved for fraternities unable to control their members."

Meanwhile, the sorority, known as Tri-Delta, was also charged with violating UF's alcohol policy and holding an unregistered social event.

Tri-Delta was also not allowed to have alcohol at any social events for the semester.

Several members of Tri-Delta who attended an after party at the Sigma Alpha Epsilon house were not allowed to attend any social events for the rest of the semester.

Similarly, in 1999, the Alpha Chi Omega sorority was found guilty of violating UF policy at an off-campus Kappa Alpha Order party, according to records from UF Judicial Affairs.

Alpha Chi Omega was charged

with failing to comply with UF's alcohol policy, disregard to the possible harm of an individual or group and holding an unregistered party, even though the sorority did not co-host the party.

The list doesn't end there.

Other sororities in the past, including Chi Omega and Zeta Tau Alpha, have also been given the same consequences as fraternities attending the same parties.

UF opens play with exhibition win against Texas A&M

■ THE TWO TEAMS COMBINED FOR 19 FOULS.

As midfielder Ameera Abdullah dribbled into the box on a muggy Saturday evening, she heard Keleigh Hudson call her name and instinctively launched a cross to the senior. Hudson delivered a swift kick from 8 yards out that Texas A&M goalie Kristin Arnold couldn't handle, giving UF a 1-0 lead in the 35th minute.

That play was a microcosm of the game, as the Gators out-hustled the Aggies en route to a 3-1 exhibition victory.

"I think in the first 10 minutes, they took it to us a little bit, but then after that I felt like we settled down," UF coach Becky Burleigh said. "After we settled down, it's just a matter of completing passes. When we complete passes, we're a very dangerous team."

Despite the wide-open offense the Gators displayed, the game wasn't pretty. After a physical

scrimmage between the two in the spring, Saturday's game was more of the same. Everyone who

entered the game seemed to hit the ground as UF and Texas A&M committed a combined 19 fouls.

UF's starters played limited minutes, as Burleigh opted to remove the first team at the start of

the second half.

Though the Gators will take the victory, Burleigh is more concerned with playing at a high level.

Goalkeeper Katie Fraine distinguished herself as the obvious choice to replace the departed Brittini Goodwin.

After the game, Burleigh named Fraine the starter.

"I feel like it's my job, and it's my job to lose," Fraine said. "I feel like as long as I play the way I know how to play, and play strong, then it's going to be my spot. But I also feel like Meghan (Berlingo) is going to be on my heels."

The Aggies' lone goal came against Berlingo in the 51st minute. Texas A&M forward Elisabeth Jones scored from 12 yards out, though it had more to do with defensive errors than Berlingo.

With the Gators leading 2-1 in the 80th minute, Alyshah Smith's goal from 7 yards out cemented a UF win.

"They came out hard," Fraine said. "They really wanted to win it. But not as much as us, obviously."





On Offense

After losing some of their top playmakers, the Volunteers will need quarterback Erik Ainge to duplicate his 2006 season, when he was one of the most improved passers in the nation. The catch is, well, there's no one to catch his passes. The Vols lost their top three receivers from 2006, most notably Robert Meachem, who accounted for more than one-third of Ainge's passing yardage. Coach Phil Fulmer brought in a solid recruiting class, and junior college transfer Kenny O'Neal should make an impact. Explosive running back LaMarcus Coker was expected to start until he was suspended indefinitely for personal problems. The suspension was recently lifted, so he will compete with Adrian Foster for carries behind a decent offensive line.

On Defense

Tennessee brings back five starters on a squad that finished 50th-best in the country in total defense last year — not exactly a cause for celebration in Knoxville. In addition, they may be using a new scheme this season. With depth issues on the defensive line, the Vols have been experimenting with a 3-4 lineup instead of the 4-3 that they have used in the past. Middle linebacker Jerod Mayo returns and will lead the defense with preseason All-Southeastern Conference free safety Jonathan Hefney. Other than Hefney, the secondary is inexperienced. The rest of the starting unit has amassed a combined one start prior to this season.





Impact Player Spotlight

QB Erik Ainge



Tennessee coach Phil Fulmer believes senior quarterback Erik Ainge has what it takes to emulate another Tennessee star. After trying to live up to former Volunteers signal-caller Peyton Manning's legacy for years, it would be a huge relief for Ainge to know that his coach thinks so highly of him, but Manning isn't the player Fulmer had in mind.

So who is Ainge's role model?

Women's basketball star Candace Parker, who led her team to a national title last year. Some would scoff at such a comparison, but for Ainge, being compared to a woman is no insult.

"Hey, she can dunk better than I can," he said.

"You need your big-time players to step up and play big-time roles, and play their best against the best teams in the best conference, so I understand what (Fulmer) is saying."

All humor aside, Ainge knows that this year will define the way he is remembered in Knoxville.

"An average quarterback on a great team that wins a lot of games is remembered as a great quarterback," he said.

"It's all about W's and L's, and winning football games is what will define me as a quarterback."

After two sub-par years, the Vols want Ainge to lead them back to prominence, and he is poised to do so.

He threw for nearly 3,000 yards in 2006 and completed 67 percent of his passes with 19 touchdowns and nine interceptions.

"I'm ready, and I'm excited about where our football team is," he said. "It always comes down to a couple of plays that are going to make or break your year."

Impact Player Spotlight

QB Michael Henig



Down in the trenches in Starkville, Miss., Michael Henig has endured pain and punishment. In three seasons at Mississippi State, Henig suffered a broken toe, a separated shoulder, a broken collarbone and another broken collarbone. On the first play of the 2006 season against South Carolina, he suffered a concussion and thankfully doesn't remember much of the rest of the game, as Steve Spurrier shut out his offense.

Most football players would tell you those injuries are part of the physical game.

But not for quarterbacks.

Henig, a junior with nine starts over the last two seasons, is the human pincushion of a starting quarterback for Sylvester Croom.

"Injuries are part of the game, part of life," Croom said. "We sure don't need one to happen to him."

Mississippi State's running game is far more potent than its passing attack, but the Bulldogs' top two runners are a sophomore and a freshman.

That leaves Henig as the experienced leader of an offense that will constantly have to work from behind in conference games.

With Croom's job on the line, he has taken extra precautions to keep his thrower healthy.

Henig worked overtime in the weight room and spent time training with the Mississippi State ROTC program's teams to learn "how to take a fall," Croom said.

Henig's career statistics are more disappointing than flattering with a career completion percentage of 44.1 percent, 14 interceptions and just nine touchdowns.

But Henig has the Tim Tebow factor going for him.

"Hard-nose football is my style," Henig said. "If I have to get a first down, then I am going to try to get it, but I was not being a smart quarterback last year. I need to slide a lot more."

making some good choices," Wise said. "We knew that Notre Dame historically had liked to take chances blocking, and if we can stay in system, we'll get our hitters some good looks one-on-one."

Friday night's match started twenty minutes late, but that did not stop the Gators from getting off to a fast start.

Sophomore libero Elyse Cusack began the match by serving for six straight points, including three service aces. She had four on the night.

The Gators' lead never dropped below 5 points again in the first game.

In the second and third games of the match, the team looked sloppy, hitting serves into the net, mistiming kills and setting inaccurately.

"Game one we didn't make many unforced errors at all," Wise said. "And then we got a little sloppy with some service errors, and I think you can expect that early on."

Game three was tied 16 times, including at 27-27, with UF never holding a lead larger than four points.

The tight game then ended rather anticlimactically when Illinois State hit the ball wide on the final three points after long volleys each time.

Outside hitter Marcie Hampton had a double-double in both matches, leading the team with 15 kills and tallying 11 digs Friday. She notched a match-high 20 kills with 16 digs Sunday.

"The great thing about our team is we really can get points from a lot of different places at a lot of different times," associate coach Nick Cheronis said. "Sometimes our middles are going to carry us, sometimes our outsides are going to carry us, sometimes Amber (McCray) is going to carry us, sometimes Angie is going to carry us with her jumping ability."

Senior Kisya Killingsworth also appeared very comfortable in her natural position as a middle blocker. She tallied four block assists and seven kills against Illinois State.

majority of the Volunteers' games since his freshman year. He knows what to expect from a full SEC schedule, and Tebow doesn't — not yet at least.

Tebow may end up with better career numbers than Ainge and Woodson, and almost certainly more career wins, but you still must give the edge to seniority at this point.

This isn't to say your loveable and rosy-cheeked quarterback won't make spectacular plays this season. He will. There's too much talent around him not to do so. Just don't go bad-mouthing Tebow when he — GASP — throws more than one interception in a game. Or when he — GASP — fumbles on a key drive. Or when he — GASP — misses an open receiver.

With the speed and talent around him in combination with his work ethic, Tebow will actually be deserving of this praise you're giving him.

Oh, and if you need further convincing, just remember the last time UF fans did this. Chris Leak strolled on to campus and everyone thought he'd take this program to new heights. Initially, Leak didn't live up to the hype and was criticized.

Now you could call it a hunch, but I think that shiny ring he has on his finger made up for anything he did before.



Freshman Newton to back up Tebow at quarterback

Freshman Cameron Newton will back up starting quarterback Tim Tebow this season, Coach Urban Meyer announced Saturday.

Newton was in a battle with freshman John Brantley for the spot, but Meyer said Newton's time during spring practice gave him the edge to claim the role.

Meyer said the Gators aren't planning to redshirt Brantley, but if Newton is successful, it's likely Brantley will redshirt.

Still, Meyer insisted Brantley will not be forgotten about, and UF already has plans in mind for the freshman's future.

"We're preparing him to be a starting quarterback at Florida," Meyer said. "We don't just say you're redshirting. I know some people might want to hear that, but he's got to be ready to play, as well. We won't play Johnny in a mop-up role."

Junior college transfer Bryan Waggener was also in contention but dropped out of the running last week. Meyer said Waggener will

still be out for three to four more weeks with an injured meniscus.

CAPTAINS NAMED: Offensive tackle Phil Trautwein, center Drew Miller, wide receiver Andre Caldwell, defensive end Derrick Harvey and safety Tony Joiner will act as the Gators' captains this year, Meyer said.

The team voted Thursday, and Caldwell received the most votes.

"That tells you how far he's come, and I'm awful proud of those guys," Meyer said. "Well deserved. Great mix of offense, defense ... I'm excited about those guys."

ETC: True freshman Joe Haden will be starting at corner Saturday.

Meyer said Haden secured the role because of his quickness and competitive nature.

Meanwhile, defensive tackle John Brown is still awaiting word about his academic eligibility from the NCAA Clearinghouse, but Meyer said Brown isn't ready to play anyway.

QB saddled with silly expectations
