## ■ PANHELLENIC SORORITIES GAVE OUT BIDS MONDAY.

For Kayla Griffin, the second time around is the charm. After quitting Panhellenic Recruitment last year, she came back to school this year with the confidence to go Greek.

Griffin was one of 1,200 girls who rushed to join one of UF's sorority chapters during the Panhellenic Council's recruitment program, or "rush week." The week began Aug. 18 and ended Monday with sororities making bids for the candidates.

As a sophomore, Griffin felt better prepared to tackle the intensity of rush week, which proved too stressful her freshman year.

"It was pouring the whole time, and I was moving in at the same time," said Griffin of her first attempt to rush. "I didn't know anything about sororities. I didn't see myself as a sorority girl."

As she discovered that most of the friends she made freshman year were in sororities, Griffin started to see herself as a Greek.

She was impressed to find sorority women who shared the same interests and values. Many of them were in the same clubs as her, such as Campus Crusade for Christ.

"I like the idea of having a large support system and somewhere to have a home away from home," Griffin said.

"They seem to have a lot of fun. You know, you go to watch 'Grey's Anatomy,' and 20 girls are with you. It's like a sleepover every night."

Griffin and other girls who rushed participated in four rounds of activities. Each round was more formal than the former.

The week started off with two days of visiting each sorority house. Recruitment counselors, known as Pi Chis, led the girls through Sorority Row. The counselors wore oversized orange or blue hats and tie-dyed shirts.

"Pi Chis really try hard to make it enjoyable," said sophomore Vibha Agarwala, who

walked to each house in a pair of flip-flops to avoid blisters. She switched into high-heeled shoes right before stepping into each house.


Pi Chis were equipped with

## UF dining facilities plan to accept credit cards



Hungry UF students without cash and with a low balance on their Gator 1 Cards have a new payment option for on-campus dining, according to Student Government officials.

All of the dining areas on campus will accept credit cards within the next two weeks, including restaurants at the Reitz Union and the Hub, said Student Sen. Kevin Reilly, a Gator senator who represents District B. Vending machines will not be included in the upgrade.

Students will not have to pay a surcharge for using credit cards, he added.

Credit cards are now accepted at four dining areas around campus: Capeesh, Little Hall Express, Graham Oasis and Beaty Market, Reilly said.


Student Body President Ryan Moseley said his administration began working on the project as soon as he took office.

Most of the credit, Moseley said, goes to Aramark, the company that provides UF's dining services. Aramark handled all technical issues, he said.

"We're really excited," Moseley said. "We want our projects to be geared toward making real differences and tangible benefits for students."




**DISCRIMINATION FRUSTRATION**

## New lounge area, other renovations in store for Reitz

By spring 2008, students looking for a place to chill in the Reitz Union will have more than the circular blue couch at the first floor entrance, according to one Reitz Union official.

Mike Mironack, director of operations for the Reitz Union, said the north side of the first floor would be undergoing renovation for the fall semester.

Mironack said the changes to the first floor include an open lounge area for students, much-needed administrative offices and updated restrooms.

The renovation is expected to cost about \$1.3 million. It will be paid for by the Capital Improvement Trust Fund, which uses student tuition money for non-academic improvements at UF.

The restrooms warrant renovation since they're some of the "most heavily used facilities on campus,"

Mironack said.

Though wood boards are blocking the north side of the building's first floor, Mironack said the entrance would not be closed down at any point during the semester.

The biggest nuisance students might face is a sign redirecting them to different commodes during the restrooms' updating, he said.

"Our goal is to minimize rerouting and inconvenience to our customers," Mironack said, specifying that everyone who comes into the Reitz Union is a customer.

He said the goal for renovating the sparsely used lounge areas is to give students a place where they can "come hang out and do what they need to do."

The new lounge will include two-seat couches and better lighting.

It will also feature tablet armchairs and more electrical outlets for laptop users, Mironack said.

Administrative offices on the first floor will include enough space to house about 24 Reitz Union offi-

cial from the administrative staff and event and catering services, he said.

For now, the three departments have been temporarily moved to the third floor, with multiple administrators sharing office space.

Mironack shares his office space, once a conference room, with three

other coworkers.

Christopher Dudley, a UF freshman, said he plans to use the new lounge facilities come spring.

Dudley said he has quite a long break between some of his classes and could use a lounge area with more electrical outlets.

"I haven't been around campus

too much, but I haven't seen too many places where you can really do that like the Reitz and the Hub," he said.

Lindsay Weaver, a UF journalism junior, expressed the same ideas, though she said she didn't think there was anything wrong with the women's restroom.



## City edges closer to homeless center

Gainesville city commissioners came another step closer Monday to establishing a center for homeless services.

In a 5-to-2 vote, the Commission approved a lease that may establish a one-stop center at 3335 N Main Terrace for local homeless people to receive food, showers, counseling and other services.

However, the lease will need to be approved by City Attorney Marion Radson. The City Plan Board will also need to rezone the area to before services can be offered to the homeless.

Commissioners Ed Braddy and Rick Bryant dissented.

Braddy suggested that a flaw in the design of the one-stop is requiring it to be near a Regional Transit System bus stop.

Bryant echoed Braddy's concerns and said it might be better if the center were far away from the city. The City of Madison, Wis., he said, has had positive results by putting its center for homeless services outside the city.

But Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan said putting it outside city limits and away from local RTS routes could make it difficult for homeless people to access the center.

Rosemarie Watson, a member of the local Lions Club, a community-service organization, said the one-stop center could have an adverse effect on her organization. Watson was one of several people who spoke out against the center's location because of the negative effect it could have on the neighborhood.

"I fear you're going to put us out of business," Watson told commissioners.

However, former City Commission can-

didate Rob Brinkman said he wanted to address the views some people have about the homeless.


"They don't bite," he said. "They're real people."

While some threatened to sue the city for the placement of the one-stop center, commissioner Scherwin Henry said the

money spent to hire a lawyer might be better spent by putting it into local homeless programs.

The one-stop center is part of a joint city and county project to end homelessness. Gainesville Regional / Alachua County Empowerment Marketplace, a collection of local homeless service providers that includes St. Francis House and the Salvation Army, will offer services at the proposed center.

The center, which includes two warehouse buildings, is expected to open May 1. However, it may open earlier if rezoning is completed before then.

## New minor created

■ THE MINOR FOCUSES ON AMERICAN INDIAN STUDIES.

Adam Recvlohe has waited a year for what he wanted, and now it's here. After lobbying Student Government and UF administrators, Recvlohe was able to make the American Indian and Indigenous Studies minor a reality at UF this semester.

The new minor is offered by the department of anthropology in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

Recvlohe, an indigenous Yuchi and Mvskoke, said his concern about the lack of programs for American Indians inspired him to push for the minor.

The minor requires the completion of courses Native American History to 1815 and Native American History Since 1806.

It also requires the completion of nine elective history hours.

The road to the minor has been long and frustrating.

Recvlohe sought SG's help in creating the minor in summer 2006. He found a senator who supported the creation, but no real help came for six months.

While waiting for SG to act, he found the help he needed from Sheila Dickison, associate dean

for academic affairs in the CLAS. Dickison was optimistic about the program's future. She said the college had enough classes related to Native American history to offer the minor without hiring additional faculty or adding courses.


"This minor provides diversity in our curriculum and allows students to investigate an important area in our own cultural heritage," Dickison said. "The minor will provide visibility for American Indian and Indigenous Studies on this campus in a way that has not existed before."

Recvlohe said he was disappointed that the university did not offer a minor when he first enrolled.

"I wish people had noticed before," said Recvlohe, a political science major. "The minor could have been there, but no one really wanted to organize it."

Recvlohe, president of the 500 Nations club, said his goal this year is to be supportive to incoming American Indian students. He said he hopes the minor will inspire UF to make a better effort to recruit more American Indian students.

Recvlohe describes the minor as eclectic and broad-ranged, teaching about the indigenous cultures of the Amazon and the Americas.

# State financial outlook could stay bleak for years

## Florida faces a shortfall in tax revenues

Florida's financial outlook remains bleak as the state faces a significant shortfall in tax revenues, according to a report released by the Florida Legislative Committee on Finance and Administration. The report indicates that the state's budget for fiscal year 2008 is projected to be \$10.5 billion, a decrease from the \$11.5 billion budget for 2007. This shortfall is primarily due to a decline in state income tax revenues, which are expected to drop by approximately \$1.5 billion. The report also notes that the state's general fund is projected to be \$1.5 billion in the red, a situation that has not occurred since the early 1990s. Governor Jeb Bush has proposed a series of budget cuts and tax increases to address the shortfall, but the report suggests that these measures may not be sufficient to balance the budget. The report also highlights the state's increasing reliance on federal aid, which is expected to decline in the coming years. Overall, the report paints a pessimistic picture of Florida's financial future, suggesting that the state may face a period of fiscal stress for several years to come.

## Chomp the Vote, swamp the polls

Finally, students can register to vote on campus. Well, let's back up. Students have always been able to register on campus. The forms have been available on campus for years. Chomp the Vote, a Student-Government funded organization, was created in 2004 and took voter registration even more seriously. That year, the organization registered 8,000 students that year.

But the organization dropped off the radar in 2005 and 2006 — and 2006 was an important year for national, state and local politics. Sadly, the number of 18- to 26-year-old Floridians who voted in 2006 went down from 2002.

Chomp's new director, Frank Bracco, hopes to turn things around. And he's off to a great start. While very few new voters were registered by Chomp last year, more than 300 students have been registered to vote in just the first three days of classes.

Great job, Frank. We're happy to hear that Chomp is once again functional because it is, without a doubt one, of the most important organizations on campus.



I think you're crazy if you're a guy at UF and you don't go Greek.


I recommend you join a fraternity — as long as you do your homework. I was Greek for two of the best years of my life, and I enjoyed every minute of it.




# Chomp the Vote returns to UF spotlight

Standing on Turlington Plaza with a plastic stars-and-stripes top hat on his head and a voter registration form in his hand, it's hard to tell if Frank Bracco is sweating from the blazing afternoon sun or the stress of so many excuses.

"I don't vote" is common, Bracco said.

So are "I don't have time" and "I'm not informed enough."

He said the strangest excuse for not registering to vote was "I'm planning to die soon."

As director of Chomp the

Vote, Bracco said he hopes to change UF students' views on voting.

Since the first day of classes, he has led a staff of about 30 in a voter registration drive that ends today.

Chomp the Vote is a Student Government program designed to increase student turnout at all types of elections, he said.

By 1:30 p.m. Monday, Chomp the Vote had registered more than 300 students to vote in Alachua County, he said.

Bracco said he was pleased with the results but hopes to register at least 400 students by the end of the drive.

The drive is just the beginning

of a longer campaign, he said.

Other projects included sending 4,000 registration forms to about eight different apartment complexes and supplying 7,600 forms to residence halls, he said. Bracco said he also wants to supply forms to fraternity and sorority houses.

Chomp the Vote also plans to hold a local candidate forum at Emerson Hall and a mock online election in January, he added.

The forum will allow UF students to question potential Gainesville politicians. The mock election will let students see how their political beliefs match up against their peers, he said.

In addition, Bracco said he wants to change the program's image.

After a successful premiere in 2004, when Chomp the Vote registered 8,000 voters, the organiza-

tion practically disappeared for the next two years.

For the 2004 presidential election, the organization spent about \$30,000 on voting initiatives and incentives.

Now, the organization is limited to about \$1,500 for fall and a total budget of \$6,000.

Though Bracco said he expects to spend more for the upcoming primary election, he doesn't think Chomp the Vote's expenses will get anywhere near the \$6,000 cap.

Bracco said Student Body President Ryan Moseley has committed to reviving the organization.

"Before we can say that Chomp the Vote is revived, we need to reach at least 1,000 registrations," Bracco said. "I want that number to at least be between 3,000 and 5,000 by the end of the year."

The two biggest obstacles Bracco said he faces are a lack of political education and widespread student apathy, especially in Florida.

According to an article from

The Associated Press, 40,000 fewer 18- to 29-year-olds in Florida went to the polls in 2006 than in 2002.

Nationally, voter turnout in that age group had increased by 3 percent.

Only Texas, Utah and West Virginia had lower turnout.

Bracco said a major culprit is a weak political education in Florida high schools.

"A lot of students don't really want to pay attention, but a lot just aren't informed," he said.

For this reason, he said Chomp the Vote is working on several educational forums for the upcoming national primaries and local elections to combat the problem.

Student apathy may be harder to tackle.

"In the end, it's up to the students to take the time to educate themselves," he said.

Bracco said one strategy is to prove to students how quick and easy registering can be.

"It literally takes a minute and a half to register," Bracco said.

"If you register in Alachua, you can come to campus and vote in your PJs."

Another tactic is to show students their votes can have an impact, which is especially true in local elections, he said.

Though the exact numbers were not available, Bracco said there was a larger turnout for the spring SG elections than turnout for Gainesville's city election in the spring.

Only about 10 percent of the roughly 70,000 students at UF and SFCC are registered to vote in Alachua County, he said.


If the numbers mobilized, UF students could swing the vote on local elections and have a more significant say on issues like room towing, bar closing times and housing codes, he said.

"Real Gators vote," Bracco said. "If you're not involved in your community, you're not a real Gator."

Claressa Midgette, a UF sophomore, registered to vote Monday afternoon and echoed Bracco's sentiments.

Midgette said she registered because she believes her vote matters.

"If you don't vote, you better not complain," Midgette said.

# La Casita headed by interim director after resignation

■ THE FORMER DIRECTOR'S LAST DAY WAS AUG. 10.

If you pass the Institute of Hispanic-Latino Cultures, you might be under the impression that it's closed. Especially if you knew that its director, Leticia Martinez, recently resigned her position.

Although the institute known as La Casita is sharing a building with the Institute of Black Culture, it's not closed for business.

A graduate student was appointed interim director of the institute to compensate for Martinez's absence.

Desiree Zerquera, who has been with the center in various capacities since 2003, assumed the job at the beginning of the semester.

She will serve as interim director until a permanent director is hired.

Zerquera declined to talk about her new position at the center.

In a letter received by the Dean of Students Office July 20, Martinez said she was leaving UF to move back to Texas to be closer to her family.

She said she had also accepted an offer to serve as director of multicultural affairs at the University of Texas at Arlington.

"La Casita has been a home away from home for not only students, but for me as well," Martinez wrote in the letter. "As I prepare to move, I know that I will always hold a special place in my heart and countless memories of my time here."

Martinez's last day was Aug. 10, the end of the summer C session.

"Unfortunately we won't know when we are able to hire someone else because Leticia left after the hiring freeze was

in place," said Tamara Cohen, Dean of Student's Office director of multicultural and diversity affairs.

University administrators announced a

hiring freeze during the summer but are stilling faculty for 15 high-priority positions.

While students and staff said they are

sad to see her go, they are optimistic about the future of the center.

"Everything is running smoothly," Cohen said. "We are renovating the center. It's getting new paint and new carpet. All the programs are still in place."

Martinez reinvented the center to create a "home away from home" atmosphere, where all students are welcome to come and learn about Hispanic culture.

"She did an amazing job," said Edgardo Hernandez, a senior who has worked at the center for four years. "She always kept the future in mind. She brought in good student leaders and hired a lot of freshmen to ensure the future of La Casita would be in tact."

The Hispanic-Latino population is the university's largest minority population. The center organizes events for students like Gatormania and the Hispanic Student Assembly, Hernandez said. The center also served as a meeting place for Asian American students in lieu of a non-existent Institute for Asian and Asian American Cultures.

Hernandez said Martinez prepared the student staff for a time when she might leave the center.

"She taught us really well how to keep the center going and what to look for when it comes time to search for a new director," he said. "And with help from the Dean of Students Office, our secretary and Desiree, I have all the faith in the world that we will keep the center running."

La Casita, located on West University Avenue, was founded in 1994 and was the first center of its kind in the Southeast. The students are proud of how much it has grown over the past years under Martinez's direction and are ready for the challenges this next year, he said.

"We're really focused on keeping La Casita running," Hernandez said.

# Students should stock up early for hurricane threat

As students continue to move in to new homes in Gainesville, some forget to put hurricane preparedness on their to-do lists.

"After Katrina we learned how certain storms could prevent or delay emergency response," said Danny Hinson, emergency management planner for Alachua County Fire Rescue.

"That's when having taken the time to prepare for the storm becomes the most important," he said.

According to a recently released statewide poll by Florida International University's Metropolitan Center, less than 25 percent of

Florida residents have supplies that will last three days.

While less than a quarter of residents surveyed have some supplies on hand in the event of a storm, 54.4 percent of respondents feel "extremely" or "somewhat vulnerable" to hurricanes.

However, some students don't share the feeling of vulnerability.

"Relative to other parts of the state, I don't think a hurricane making landfall is that serious of a threat to us here," said John Hunt, a UF history senior.

"We would probably just get the remnants of a storm if anything," he said.

UF political science senior Anne Lesser shares Hunt's sentiments. She said

Gainesville's location in the middle of the state is why she doesn't worry during the hurricane season.

"I've never worried about hurricanes in Gainesville, and I'm not worried about them now," she said.

Both said it would take a hurricane to make landfall in Gainesville for apartment complexes to actively encourage hurricane preparedness.

Jack Ryals, an employee of the local hardware store Jackson Industries Stoneworks, said students like Hunt and Lesser should be mindful of Hurricane Katrina.

"They should think that had they been in Katrina and didn't have food for three days, what would they have done," he said. "It

doesn't take much to get prepared, so why not do it?"

Hinson said he and other emergency management planners actively encourage residents who feel vulnerable to be proactive and adequately prepare for the hurricane season.

Alachua County Fire Rescue organizes its yearly Get Ready campaign in June at the Oaks Mall to accomplish this.

At this year's campaign, Hinson said he ran his own small survey of Gainesville residents to understand the level of preparedness among them.

He said of the 12 people he talked to, 90 percent felt they knew what to do if a hurricane threatened their home. Most of the people he talked to were students.

"We set up 20 to 30 booths with pamphlets of information to educate the population on hurricane safety," Hinson said.

Hinson said these responses are encouraging. UF's emergency management is also helping educate students about hurricane preparedness, Hinson said. The amount of information the county and university provide is sufficient enough so that all students know what to do in the event of a hurricane.

"A responsible student would take this information to heart," he said.

Kenneth Allen, UF's Environmental Health and Safety Office emergency management coordinator, said on- and off-campus students should make preparations.

"The first things students should look into is insurance to cover their belongings," Allen said.



# Plan B celebrates first year of over-the-counter sales

While many have had the option for over a year, some students still don't know about Plan B.

Or how it works.

Plan B, a birth control drug that can be used after unprotected sex or sexual assault, celebrated its one-year anniversary of being available over the counter.

The Food and Drug Administration approved the over-the-counter sale of the drug on Aug. 24, 2006, to people 18 and over.

Previously, the medication was only available to women by prescription.

After the initial over-the-counter approval by the FDA, Staci Fox, president and CEO of

Planned Parenthood of North Central Florida Inc., said there was a huge demand for the pill that has since subsided. She said she hopes the anniversary will call attention to the drug.

However, females under 18 still need a prescription from their health care provider.

Fox said Plan B is sometimes confused with the abortion pill RU-486, which can be used to terminate an existing pregnancy.

In addition to being confused about what the product does, some students are confused about its name.

Some call it Plan B while others call it the "morning-after pill." Both refer to the same drug.

"Plan B is actually the product name," Fox said. "'Emergency contraception' and 'morning-after pill' are just references to the actual

product."

Plan B is a series of two pills that should be taken as soon as possible within the first 72 hours of unprotected sex. If taken properly, Plan B is 89 percent effective in preventing a pregnancy, according to the pill's Web site.

Currently, Plan B is the only packaged

brand of emergency contraception approved by the FDA to be available over the counter.

"Plan B is still on patent, so that should be the product they receive," Fox said. "There is no generic product available."

According to the Plan B Web site, the drug contains a chemical found in other forms of birth control. The chemical mainly works to stop the release of an egg from the ovary.

If the chemical fails at that, Plan B can also work by preventing fertilization or by preventing the egg from attaching to the uterus.

Plan B, however will not affect a fertilized egg already attached to the uterus.

"It's important that all women have access to emergency contraception so they have a second chance to prevent pregnancy," Fox said.







## UF Voices

### Staying Optimistic

The start of the school year is always as exciting as it is hectic. I hope all students, faculty and staff were able to take some time off during the summer, and that you are refreshed, reenergized and ready to make the most of the months ahead.

As many of you are aware, we face some unique financial challenges. Budget cuts affecting every state institution have forced us to seek reductions of at least \$30 million to UF's budget. We have already implemented a universitywide hiring freeze. A task force I appointed early this month is looking at many other options, including streamlining current processes, cutting UF functions and increasing revenue streams.

Whatever belt-tightening lies ahead, our priority is to maintain high standards in our core missions of teaching, research and service.

With that in mind, I think we do have some reasons for optimism.

Last year's twin national championships meant a banner year for the University Athletic Association, and the UAA has donated \$6 million to the university to help cover our budget shortfall. We will use the money in part to continue the Florida Opportunity Scholars program, an important scholarship that targets students who are the first in their families to attend college. We anticipate 400 new students in the program this year.

Also, Florida lawmakers approved the state's first-ever tuition differential bill last spring. Starting in 2008-09, UF can raise its tuition as much as 40 percent, at a maximum rate of 15 percent per year above whatever the statewide increase is. With lean economic times likely extending beyond this year, the tuition differential will guarantee we can continue to hire new faculty and student advisers, which in turn will give students the top-tier educational experience they truly deserve.

There's other important good news.

Our faculty research awards for the most recent fiscal year are up to \$583 million, an impressive 12.5 percent more than last year. In fundraising, our 3-year-old Faculty Challenge Initiative has netted \$207 million, far eclipsing the original goal of \$150 million. And UF this past year was Florida's only university to receive two statewide Center of Excellence grants, as well as \$20 million for a pilot plant for the production of cellulosic ethanol.

There's no question we would prefer a sunnier budget situation, but I have full faith we will continue to improve and grow despite the challenges. Let's make the coming academic year a productive and memorable one.

### Memorial service is somber reminder of bicycle/vehicle safety

All it takes is just a moment to answer a cell phone call, change the radio station, turn to face a passenger or let your mind wander.

All it takes is just a moment to end a life while behind the wheel of a car.

UF graduate student Welch McNair Bostick III was a semester away from receiving his doctoral degree from the agricultural and biological engineering department when he was struck by a car while riding his bicycle along Williston Road on Aug. 27. Bostick died on Aug. 28, leaving behind his wife, Carmen, and a 10-month-old son, Luca.

An informal memorial service for Bostick will be held today at 9 a.m., near the west entrance of Rogers Hall. His family, including his wife, son, father, mother and sister, will attend.

Bostick's death has prompted increased

awareness of bicycle safety for those who knew him.

"It has helped make everyone in the department more aware of the reality of dangers that we face when we ride bicycles," said James Jones, a distinguished professor in agricultural and biological engineering, and a teacher of Bostick.

Jawoo Koo, a fellow student and friend of Bostick, said the accident has changed his view on bike safety.

"I saw a car driving through bike lanes and I wanted to call a cop right away to ticket it," Koo said.

James Leary, a member of Bostick's department, has been involved in two vehicle-bicycle crashes. The undergraduate adviser says both resulted in broken bones, surgery and extensive rehabilitation.

Leary is convinced the first driver who hit him just didn't see him.

Leary is a lucky one. In the past year, Bostick was not the only student bicyclist killed. Henry Crane, 21, died after being struck by a vehicle at the intersection of Archer Road and SW 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue.


Jon Lizaso, a post-doctoral associate in agricultural and biological engineering, and friend of Bostick's family, said he thinks people just don't see bicyclists, even in the daylight.

"The cruise control of your brain is looking for cars, trucks, buses," he said.

Lizaso is the coordinator of today's memorial service, and has been instrumental in promoting bicycle safety in Gainesville.

Laura Hallam, executive director of the Florida Bicycle Association, said most students are not aware that bicycles are considered vehicles.

"As a bicyclist on a roadway, you are the driver of a vehicle

and are responsible for complying with all traffic laws," she said.


The University Police Web site reports that in 2003, 17 bicycle accidents were reported on campus - 11 of those involved injury. This number was up from 2002, which saw 11 accidents reported, with nine injuries.

UPD Lt. Robert Wagner said the most important information he can give to bicyclists is to be aware of the Florida traffic laws for bicyclists. He also urged them not to assume that a car will see them, to always use bike lanes and wear helmets. "They can make a huge difference," he said.

As for motorists, Wagner cautioned them to be extra watchful for bicyclists.

## Buckman and Thomas Halls home to cool students

Sophomore Erika Manion of Kissimmee thought she could survive a school year without air conditioning. After all, she accepted a position as resident adviser in Buckman Hall with full knowledge of the building's lack of air conditioning.

"I was surprised to arrive at school (this year) and hear portable air conditioners were allowed," said Manion. "I thought I could make it without, but my mom stayed in here one night without it and said she couldn't survive."

Manion said her mom made a quick trip to Target the next day, and paid more than \$500 for the portable machine.

"I'm glad my mom did it," the resident adviser admitted. "I've always had air conditioning."

Sharon Blansett, assistant director of Housing, said that UF has been exploring AC options for the historic Buckman and Thomas Halls for years. They are the only residence halls without air conditioning provided.

The two buildings are listed on the National Historic Register, and in 1906, housed the entire campus.

"We have addressed previous road-blocks," said Blansett. "Electrical service to these buildings has been upgraded and portable air conditioners are available that will not compromise the historic architecture of the buildings."

To participate in the program, residents provide their own portable unit that must meet or exceed health and safety specifications. No additional utility charges will be assessed this year, but housing staff anticipates additional charges to residents participating in the program in the future.

According to Manion, about 50 percent of the residents in her building have purchased AC units.

"I told one of the residents that she can come watch TV with me, since she doesn't have air conditioning."

## UAA gives \$6 million to academic programs

The University of Florida Athletic Association donated \$6 million to the university to support several academic programs threatened by state budget cuts. President Bernie Machen made the announcement at the Joint Civic Club Luncheon at the Hilton University Conference Center on Aug. 15.

The money will be used in part to pay for the continuation of the Florida Opportunity Scholars program. Offered for the second year, the scholarships pay tuition and room and board for qualified students who are the first in their family to attend a four-year university and have family income less than \$40,000.

UAA has given nearly \$40 million back to the university since 1990.

## New George Steinbrenner Band Building

President Bernie Machen recently joined the College of Fine Arts in celebrating the construction of the new state-of-the-art George Steinbrenner Band Building. President Machen, along with members of the UF Gator Band, sports officials, and College of Fine Arts and School of Music deans and directors, helped raise the roof by laying bricks in the wall of the new building at the construction site on Newell

Road. The ceremony was held on Aug. 21.

The new 19,000-square-foot band facility, located adjacent to the School of Music, will provide a 5,600-square-foot rehearsal space for 10 to 12 band ensembles, a band library, instrument and uniform storage, administrative offices, a conference room and two large lobby areas.

The building — constructed with generous donations from New York Yankees owner George Steinbrenner, Stephen Stills of Crosby, Stills and Nash, the University Athletic Association and numerous friends of music — represents the first phase of an ongoing project to install state-of-the-art facilities at the School of Music to serve UF students, faculty and local community.

## Nursing researcher to study depression in Latin women

University of Florida College of Nursing assistant professor Jeanne Marie Stacciarini has received a \$202,113 supplementary

grant from the National Institutes of Health to study depression in Latinas and promote diversity in health-related research.

The supplement was awarded under the NIH study which associate professor Shawn Kneipp is conducting to determine ways of reducing women's health disparities through an approach called community-based participatory research.

A goal of the study is to determine cultural barriers to treatment and examine possible community-based approaches to intervention.

## L'Oreal fellowships offered

L'Oreal USA recently announced that applications are being accepted for the L'Oreal USA Fellowships for Women in Science program. The national program annually recognizes, rewards and supports five female postdoctoral researchers who are pursuing careers in the life and physical/material sciences, as well as mathematics, engineering and computer science. 

## "Fill The Swamp" - with laundry?

A total renovation of 25 laundry facilities in residence halls and graduate and family housing now provides students with new energy-efficient and lower-water-use machines, as well as folding tables, study areas, fresh paint and new flooring. In addition, students earn a chance to obtain scholarship monies through a promotion, "Fill The Swamp."

Gator Wash Campus Laundry Program, sponsor of the Fill The Swamp promotion, will donate scholarship monies to UF if campus residents save at least 8 million gallons of water per year, through use of the new machines.

"The new machines support the university's sustainability goals by using 15 gallons of water per load versus the 30 gallons previously used," said Sharon Blansett, assistant director of housing.

Gator Wash Campus Laundry named the promotion "Fill The Swamp" after estimating that 40 million gallons of water would fill The Swamp. Saving 8 million gallons of water per year for five years theoretically would be enough to "fill The Swamp" — or more appropriately, provide scholarship money to the university.

"The bottom line is to save water by doing laundry on campus with the new machines, and the university can earn scholarship money in the process," said Blansett.

Expect another exceptional year from the Razorbacks. The rushing game is looking good with juniors Darren McFadden and Felix Jones leading the way. Arkansas led the league in rushing yardage in both 2005 and 2006, as the duo combined to average 201.07 yards per game. The Razorbacks also ranked second nationally in yards per carry with 5.94. Wide receiver Marcus Monk has proven to be an unstoppable force. He averaged 19.2 yards per catch last season and ranked second-best in the SEC. With 24 career touchdown receptions, the senior only needs eight more to break the league's career mark, currently held by UF's Chris Doering. Claiming the record could be a challenge, however, because Monk is expected to miss four to six weeks after undergoing knee surgery Aug. 13.

### On Defense

Arkansas will struggle somewhat this year after losing four major players. The Razorbacks look to replace leader Sam Olajubutu, a semi-finalist for the Butkus Award. They must also replace last season's leading sacker, Jamaal Anderson, tackles Keith Jackson and Chris Houston, who all left for the NFL. The coaching staff expects big things from sophomore defensive tackle Malcolm Sheppard, who finished last season with 10 tackles and two hurries in a limited role behind Anderson. Senior Weston Dacus anchors the linebacker core, which welcomes back Freddie Fairchild, who should make more of an impact this season now he has recovered from an ACL injury that sidelined him almost all of last season.



Arkansas will GET ROLLED if the team can't stay healthy. Wide receiver Marcus Monk suffered a knee injury Aug. 9, and could be out for the first game. Starting defensive tackle Marcus Harrison is already missing the first game because he is still recovering from major knee surgery.

### Darren McFadden



At 6-foot-2, 215 pounds, Darren McFadden proved that no one is ever too big to trick-or-treat. The All-American running back dressed up as a clown for Halloween last year and wore the costume to campus for the day. It was a side of McFadden most people fail to see when they're watching the junior's roadrunner speed on gameday — most people, that is, except for his teammates.

"Darren has always been easygoing, joking since he was a freshman," linebacker Weston Dacus said. "We talk about this with each other, how he hasn't changed a bit since he's gotten here."

The only thing that may have surprised the Razorbacks was the way McFadden rose to his superstar status.

Initially fellow running back Felix Jones was the better player, with his breakaway speed and polished moves, Dacus said.

"He was ahead of Darren for a while," Dacus said. "I don't know what got into Darren, but the coaches realized that he was special."

Now, after a remarkable sophomore season in which McFadden placed second to Ohio State's Troy Smith for the Heisman Trophy, Arkansas is excited about the possibility of sending McFadden to New York again.

"I think he's at the top, the front-runner," Arkansas coach Houston Nutt said. "There's no question about it, or he wouldn't be on every magazine. I think everybody knows that."

As for McFadden, the pressure to perform isn't really pressure at all, but more of a challenge.

"It's something that motivates me," McFadden said of his potential candidacy for the Heisman Trophy. "I know that I will have to come with my A-game when I'm out there and not slack around. I must come out for every game."

### On Offense

The primary offensive problem the Rebels face heading into the season is their quarterback. Former walk-on Seth Adams was finally named as the starter Friday, after the position opened up for competition in the spring. Adams beat out last season's starting QB Brent Schaeffer and redshirt freshman Michael Herrick. Other than that major question mark, the offense is pretty much set with nine returning starters. The Rebels will rely heavily on standout running back BenJarvus Green-Ellis, who rushed for over 1,000 yards last season. The return of Dexter McCluster will significantly boost the wide receiver group. The sophomore compiled 574 all-purpose yards in the first six games before being sidelined for the rest of the season with head and shoulder injuries.

### On Defense

To dub this season a rebuilding year is a major understatement. The linebacker position is completely depleted. After losing stars Rory Johnson and All-American Patrick Willis to the NFL, the projected starting linebackers have recorded a whopping seven tackles. The Rebels are hoping newcomer Chris Strong, ranked the No. 3 defensive end by Rivals.com, can make an immediate impact as middle linebacker. Coach Ed Orgeron said it remains to be seen if Kendrick Lewis can remain consistent at free safety, and the coach is optimistic about Dustin Mouzon and Terrell Jackson at corner. The Rebels also expect to see some production out of defensive tackle Peria Jerry, who was limited last season with injuries.

### BenJarvus Green-Ellis



BenJarvus Green-Ellis knows exactly who to thank for his success at running back. Without his offensive line, the senior admitted it would have been difficult to rush for 1,000 yards last season.

To show his appreciation, Green-Ellis takes the offensive line out to dinner every Monday night to one of the few places in Oxford — Chili's, Ajax or Applebee's — but the bill

doesn't always go on his tab.

"I pay sometimes," Green-Ellis said. "I can't afford treating guys who are 350 pounds all the time."

And after the senior's summer workouts, don't be so sure that his friends on the line will offer to pick up the check.

During the offseason, Green-Ellis refused to take a break. He said he put himself in the best shape of his life by lifting weights and conditioning.

He increased his 5-foot-11 frame to 225 pounds and said he increased his bench 30 pounds to 435.

Last year, Green-Ellis rushed 234 times, averaged 83.3 yards per game and scored seven touchdowns.

The Rebels are expecting another stellar year from the running back, and Green-Ellis is more than ready to take on the responsibility.

"If my team requires me to go out and carry the ball 30-35 times (per game) then that's what I have to do," Green-Ellis said.

"There's no set number that I'm setting up for myself."

A year ago at this time, Woodson fiercely fought Curtis Pulley for the starting quarterback job. And it seemed nobody wanted him to win it. Many thought Woodson, who struggled as a sophomore starter the year before, would lose out to the younger Pulley, the athletically hyped 2004 Kentucky Mr. Football.

Woodson proved them wrong with 3,515

passing yards and 31 touchdowns.

Now, Pulley is redshirting to fix academic problems that forced him to withdraw from school in the spring.

If Woodson studies, he'll see that many rate him as the No. 2 senior quarterback in the country behind Louisville's Brian Brohm. "I came to this university to help turn things around," said Woodson, who ended up throwing passes to Pulley last year. "We'd been a doormat for so many years, and now, we want people and teams to know that we are a contender and want to be a contender year in year out."

Woodson has done so much for the Wildcats program, from leading the team to its first bowl in win since 1984 to saving Coach Rich Brooks' job.

"It's maybe one of the biggest transitions from production, leadership, accountability that I've seen a young man make from one year to the next in my coaching career," said Brooks, a former coach at Oregon and with the St. Louis Rams. "And thank God he did because I'm back here."

"It's tough for a true freshman to come in and get a grip on the offense like that," center Fernando Velasco said. "Now he's got a year under his belt. He's been in the system for quite a while now. I expect a great season out of him this year."

In 2006, Stafford was the only one of the trio to gain a starting job and keep it through the end of the season.

Along the way, Stafford took his lumps, including throwing three interceptions in three different games.

But he found his groove late with wins at Auburn, against rival Georgia Tech and in the Chick-fil-A bowl against Virginia Tech.

Stafford's stats weren't impressive — 7 TDs, 13 INTs — but he got the job done.

This year, he's expected to do a lot more.

Stafford leads an experienced offense that will likely have to match opposing teams score for score.

He has two solid running backs and two solid wide receivers at his disposal.

"Instead of trying to fit in, he's now leading our program," Coach Mark Richt said. "He's come so far. ... He's so much better than a year ago. I hope it shows on the field."

# Gators nab former USC running back

The UF football team's practice squad just got a lot better.

Former USC running back Emmanuel Moody announced Monday that he will transfer to UF, a decision that almost instantly solidifies the Gators' ground attack for next year.

Due to NCAA transfer rules, the sophomore will have to sit out this season.

"From the campus down to the coaches, I just really felt that Florida was a good fit for me," Moody said.

Moody made his choice on Saturday after visiting North Carolina and UF, and he canceled trips to Oklahoma State and Texas after coming to Gainesville.

Moody didn't have long to pick a new home after filing a transfer request on Aug. 15, and his time to visit schools was limited since classes at most of his choices began the next week.

"Time was definitely a factor, but I just knew Florida was a perfect fit," he said. "I enrolled already, and I'll be there on Wednesday."


"Everything is all set up. Now I just have to go through the NCAA Clearinghouse."

A native of Coppell, Texas, Moody was rated the No. 11 running back out of high school by Scout.com, and he signed with the Trojans after making a verbal commitment to Texas.

As a freshman at USC, Moody rushed for 459 yards on 79 attempts in nine games before an ankle injury sidelined him for the last four contests.

His performance was good enough for The Sporting News to name him Pac-10 Offensive Freshman of the Year, and he was also featured on a regional cover of

## Starting corner questionable for opener

UF may be without one of its starting cornerbacks for the season opener.

Anderson and converted running back Markus Manson were the projected starters after spring practice, but Haden and Pierre-Louis have both since passed Manson on the depth chart.

After a stint on special teams last year, Pierre-Louis may be one of the most improved players on the team.

"Physically he made some strides and improved some areas he needed to improve to function as a corner," Heater said. "He's playing more consistently, and he's more focused now."

While they won't start, Manson and Jacques Rickerson should play.

## Southern Cal could regret letting Moody transfer to UF

USC should never have let Emmanuel Moody transfer to UF.

At first glance, it seems like an OK deal for the Trojans. They never play the Gators and Gainesville is almost as far away from Southern California as you can get in Division I college football.

But USC failed to look at the big picture.

We sometimes refer to Southern Cal as USC West, so as not to confuse the school with South Carolina, aka USC East.

But the real USC East isn't in Columbia, S.C., it's in Gainesville.

Urban Meyer's Gators are right on the heels of USC as King of the Hill in college football.

Moody won't suit up for UF until 2008, but he provides the Gators with a reliable all-purpose running back, the one thing that has eluded them in recent years.

The fact that he went from USC to UF because of playing time tells you all you need to know about Moody's opinion of Kestahn Moore.

So while I realize the Trojans will hardly realize Moody is gone — their depth chart at running back is more jammed than a Los Angeles freeway during rush hour — the tailback's transfer provides a shift of power in UF's favor.

Even if the Gators do have a down year this season — which for them would still likely mean a bowl game on New Year's Day — they will probably be one of the favorites to win it all in 2008.

In the coming years, USC and UF will be the teams to watch in college football, an East-West rivalry of bragging rights.

Because while the two squads may

Sports Illustrated's college football preview along with two other Trojans backs.

After a hamstring injury in spring practice, Moody fell into a 10-player competition for field time, and he told the Los Angeles Times that he felt "forgotten."

Now, he will have to watch a season unfold from the sidelines and will function only in practice.

"It'll build my mind up," he said. "Sitting out a year, everyone sees it as 'Oh man, you're not playing football this year,' and there's a lot of negative energy towards that. I feel like there are a lot of positives in this. A few of them are that I can really just sit back and be a spectator, really just get the feel of everything and also learn the offense."

After his trip to Gainesville last Thursday, Moody summed up the area with one word: country.


But he says he didn't mean it as a bad thing.

"When I say country I mean that it reminds me of home. Texas is considered country too."

"I lived in (Los Angeles) for a year and kind of got the mindset that anything that's not the city is the country."

Gainesville is the suburbs, so there's no transition from Texas to Florida. I feel like the south is the south, and it's all just kind of the same. It's just like home."

not meet on the field barring a national championship clash or at least a major bowl game, they are going to be competing for high-profile recruits, and more importantly, BCS berths.

Remember who almost kept UF out of the national title game last year? USC had to implode against UCLA or else it would have been the one-loss Trojans, not the one-loss Gators basking in the desert glory.

It's not like the Trojans have a policy of letting potential transfers go wherever they want. Numerous sources have reported that USC will not grant a release to Jamere Holland, who is also transferring from USC, should he choose to go to another Pac-10 school. With Moody, the issue was moot because he wasn't considering other Pac-10 schools, but I can only assume the same stipulation would have been in order.

What effect would Moody or Holland have on USC if they transferred to another Pac-10 school? USC would defeat Oregon 50-28 instead of 50-17?

Ask Meyer and Pete Carroll what the key to success in college football is, and I guarantee you'll get the same answer: recruiting.

The two schools may be thousands of miles apart geographically, but they often

meet up along the recruiting trail. Here are just a few of the names UF and USC have competed for in the past two years: Percy Harvin, Tim Tebow, Stafon Johnson, Vidal Hazelton, James Wilson, Deonte Thompson.

This list of players is enough to make recruiting junkies salivate. Obviously these guys were looking at other schools as well, but the point is that UF and USC often compete for the same players.

The last two years, USC and UF have sat atop the recruiting rankings, with everyone else a distant third.

In terms of the long run, that isn't likely to change anytime soon.

While Meyer's last two classes have surpassed Carroll's in terms of quantity, USC has, by popular opinion, brought in better quality.

But take Moody out of USC's 2006 class and add him to UF's, and things begin to get just a tiny bit hazier.

The Trojans have to remember that only one team can win a national title in a given season. If you are going to be a national title contender, why give another contender the ability to improve itself?

If Moody is as good as people think, he could turn out to be the missing piece that takes Meyer's offense to a scary level.

If that happens, USC might wish Moody had just transferred to a Pac-10 school.


