# Group demands more openness

Under the blazing mid-day sun Wednesday, about 50 members of Students for a Democratic Society marched from Turlington Plaza to Tigert Hall to give a letter to UF President Bernie Machen urging him to publicize UF's investments.

SDS, a protest group known for activism during the 1960s, wants proof UF isn't investing in companies that fund the Iraq war, members said.

Steve Orlando, UF spokesman, said UF is already trying to give the group what it wants — transparency — when it wants it — now.

The UF Foundation, a non-profit organization that raises funds for UF, collects money from private donors and in-

vests it to earn more. The UF Investment Corporation oversees the investments, which increased from \$585.7 million to \$1.2 billion in the past four years, UF records show.


Orlando said both organizations support UF and are exempt from public records, which are mandated by Florida's Government in the Sunshine Law.

"In Florida, under sunshine laws, all public finance should be open to scrutiny," said Richard Gutierrez, UF English and history senior and organizer of the protest. "It's our money. This is a public university."

But no tuition money or regular state allocation funds could be invested, Orlando said. Only state grant money or private donations can be used.

## GPD ups bar patrols

The Gainesville Police Department has increased patrols around bars on University Avenue to make sure students get home safely.

Harry Young, one of the officers who has patrolled the area, said they are stopping girls who are walking alone.

"Earlier this year there has been a rise in criminal acts," Young said. "It's a part of GPD's movement to promote student awareness and crime prevention."

While they mostly question women, officers also talk to male

students, Young said. "This is a problem for a lot of students across the board. It's not necessarily just the females. It's all students walking by themselves," Young said.

GPD spokesman Lt. Keith Kameg said that while Gainesville is safe, precautions are still needed.

"Society is changing. It's not a Norman Rockwell picture anymore," Kameg said.

He said even though GPD is there to help students, the students need to help themselves.

"We need people to be more responsible," Kameg said.

## CLAS edges closer to dean

■ THE COLLEGE HAS GRAPPLED WITH DEBT.

With a search committee created to find applicants for the position, there could be a new dean heading UF's College of Liberal Arts and Sciences in about a year.

UF Provost Janie Fouke announced the creation of the 10-person committee in a memo to UF's deans, directors and department chairs Tuesday.

In an interview, she said it only took about a week to put the group together.

Pramod Khargonekar, dean of the College of Engineering, will chair the committee.

The group includes four professors, two associate professors, the graduate school dean, an alumnus and a student.

The group will immediately begin formulating a job description and putting out advertisements, according to the memo.

The next few months will be spent collecting nominations and applications.

There could be about 50 to 100 candidates, Fouke said, but she didn't know for sure. By November or December, the committee should have narrowed the list to around a dozen people, she said.

Committee interviews with the nominees will probably begin in January, and Fouke will probably interview the four or five finalists after that, she said.

Joe Glover, CLAS interim dean, said he thinks it would have been better to create the committee last spring, but he's happy it's finally happening.

Glover said he didn't want to comment on whether

# SG parties register for fall

Today is the last day to register Student Government political parties, meaning the organization's fall election will soon kick into high gear.

Five parties — Gator, Swamp, Greek, Impact and Progress — have registered so far. This election determines who will represent on-campus residence areas and off-campus housing districts in the Student Senate.

Forty-seven seats, or half the Senate, will be up for grabs Oct. 2 to Oct. 3.

Yooni Yi, Gator Party president, said her party hopes to continue its spring success, when it won 44 of the 47 Student Senate seats.

Gator is not releasing its specific platform yet, but Yi said the party wants to continue its past focus on "tangible goals."

Greek Party President William Foster said his party also plans to run prospective senators for every seat.

Foster declined to comment on his party's platform but said, "The Greek Party looks forward to running a clean and vigorous campaign."

"I expect to have fun because this is my last semester here," he said.

During the spring election, Foster spurred a controversy that almost cost the Pants Party its sole seat by handing out "I Voted" stickers after appearing in a Pants video advertisement.

The case went to the SG Supreme Court, which allowed the sole Pants senator — Alan Passman — to keep his seat.

This summer, the Senate gave SG's supervisor of elections and his designees sole power to distribute materials indicating a student has voted. This includes the stickers given to students after they cast their

votes.

It also allowed for the Elections Commission to determine party affiliations during election cycles or hearings.

The Swamp Party is the only other party to confirm its plans to run a campaign.

"The Swamp Party is a serious party," said Sam Miorelli, Swamp Party president. "We're in it to win."

Miorelli said the Swamp platform wasn't finalized, but the party plans to focus on "old values from past parties."

Miorelli was a part of the Pants Party. Pants advocated for issues such as free condoms, better busing for students and restructuring SG's legislative branch.

"One of our main goals is to be very upfront about what we're doing," he said. "We want the idea of Student Government as being open, not taking place in some smoke-filled rooms in phantom, hidden locations."


He said many people in SG encouraged him to start up the party again, but he would not specify whom.

The remaining two parties, Impact and Progress, didn't confirm whether they would be active.

Frank Bracco, treasurer of the Impact Party, said Impact was not offering any comments at this time. More information would be available when candidate qualifying begins on Friday, Bracco said.

Records from the Center for Student Involvement listed Joseph Trimboli as the Progress Party's president with Joshua Niederriter as treasurer.

Neither could be reached for comment.

# Growl nets sponsorship

UF's Gator Growl, billed as the world's largest student-run pep rally, will be backed by "the Network" this fall.

Aron Weingard, Gator Growl 2007's producer, said a sponsorship deal with Verizon Wireless was finalized Aug. 30. Verizon will be the title sponsor for the 2007 and 2008 productions, giving Gator Growl \$112,500 over those two years.

If the contract continues, Verizon will shell out more than \$250,000 over a four-year period.

Weingard said \$50,000 would be used this year. He said the money would be used in many ways but didn't offer any

specifics.

Verizon's sponsorship will bring several changes to Gator Growl, he said. The official title of the production, "Gator Growl 2007: Nation of Champions presented by Verizon Wireless," was changed to reflect the sponsorship.

**On Campus** Verizon was also incorporated into the Gator Growl logo and will be featured on fliers and billboards.

No commercials will be shown during Gator Growl, Weingard said.

"We wanted to be as tasteful as possible while giving them an opportunity to advertise," he said.

Shelley Meyer, wife of Gators football coach Urban Meyer, will be hosting the event.

# Students may apply for positions on local boards

Robert Agrusa, UF Student Senate president, said students have a voice that needs to be recognized.


"This can give student input and hopefully change policy to help benefit students," he said.







# Senate qualifying to begin

■ THE PROCESS LASTS THROUGH TUESDAY.

UF students who want to get involved with Student Government will have their shot Friday.

The qualifying interview round for students hoping to run for a Student Senate seat will continue on Monday and Tuesday, said Sarah Krantz, SG's supervisor of elections.

The qualifying will take place from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day in Room 284 of the Reitz Union.

Krantz said students could come within that time period on any of the three days. They also must bring their Gator 1 cards to confirm they are full-time students.

The qualifying process itself is left in the hands of students, she said.

Students tell election officials what party they would like to be a candidate for. Afterward an interview with the party is arranged.

Krantz said she didn't want parties to be present in the qualifying room.

"My biggest concern is ensuring that nobody harasses the students," Krantz said. "The parties shouldn't be seeking out students. Students should seek them."

# Moseley, other students meet with Crist

Student leaders from across the state, including UF Student Body President Ryan Moseley, talked shop on Tuesday with Florida Gov. Charlie Crist.

Moseley said he and the other 10 student body presidents from

Florida's public universities met with Crist for about an hour as part of Florida's College Savings Month in September.

Moseley described the meeting as a "polite conversation" at the Governor's Mansion. The group discussed issues including tuition hikes, Florida's budget woes, physical education and campus safety.

Moseley said it was his first time meeting Crist, adding that it was a good first impression.

"He was a smooth character," Moseley said. "He definitely seemed to

know his stuff."

Moseley also said he "definitely knew all about physical education and stuff."

Crist was also willing to listen, Moseley said, which was a "huge positive."

"Crist said, 'I could talk and tell you what's going on, but I want to hear more from you guys,'" Moseley said.

investments, he said.

Orlando said total openness could be problematic.

Money is moved to and from stocks every day, and it would be difficult to constantly update an investment list, Orlando said. Also, if UF listed its investments, many people might invest the same way, and UF's profits could go down.

The issue was discussed at the June meeting of the UF Board of Trustees and is already on the agenda for September's meeting.

It's not soon enough for the protesters, who said they would give Machen and UF administrators two weeks to respond to their demands.

"We want to put a fire under them," said Gutierrez, adding that there's no reason to believe UF doesn't invest in war-supporting companies.

Gutierrez, who wore a shirt with "BERNIE, SHOW US THE LIGHT" stenciled on the front, said students have a right to see where their university's money is going.

"Each one of us is blind," he said as protesters tied cloths over their eyes, symbolizing his point.

Protesters shuffled from Turlington past smirking spectators on the Plaza of the Americas, chanting, "Hey, hey, ho, ho, obscurity has got to go."

Many carried cardboard signs with statements such as "SHOW US THE CASH, B!" or "SHOW US THE NAKED TRUTH!" in bold letters. Others carried half-eaten Krishna

lunches or flags of red and black — the traditional colors of anarchy, protesters said.

"Where is my money?" screamed one protester.

They marched up the steps of Tigert Hall, where Gene Zdziarski, UF's dean of students; Brian Beach, Machen's assistant; and Jane Adams, vice president for UF relations, waited.

Machen was out for the day, they said.

As the protesters gathered on the steps, one asked, "How long will we stay here?" A few in the crowd laughed, answering, "One hour."

Wednesday's protest was a second attempt at urging Machen not to support the war. SDS staged an anti-war protest in March, but Gutierrez said their goals were too ambiguous then.

"We want something concrete," he said.

## Interim dean optimistic about CLAS, unsure of personal plans

he would be willing to fill the position if he's nominated.

He said that he would nominate anyone he thinks would make a good CLAS dean, but he didn't have any candidates in mind yet.

Things have been going well for CLAS lately, Glover said, "aside from the general financial problems of the whole university."

Though UF still struggles with cutting \$30 million to \$34 million, Glover said this would be CLAS' last year in debt.

In summer 2006, a \$6 mil-

lion debt was uncovered in the college.

UF immediately paid it off with its rainy-day funds.

### UF Academics

The college racked up another debt of \$4 million for 2007's expenses.

CLAS' former dean, Neil

Sullivan, announced his resignation in November 2006.

When Glover replaced him in January, he agreed to stay a year.

If the search committee hasn't found anyone by the time his term is over, Glover said he doesn't know what will happen.

## Electricity savings easier than you think

If electrical utility companies lower their costs by reducing expenses or adopting "green" technology, students will have a reason to rejoice. Less money for utilities means more for other things, right? Wrong.

Industry giant Florida Power & Light, also known as FPL, recently announced a drop in its rates due to improvements designed to increase efficiency at their plants. However, savings are estimated at less than \$1 for every \$100 of the average energy bill per month.

You could easily make up that cost by microwaving your food for a few more minutes or playing your Wii for an extra 30 seconds on the hour — hardly inspiring for off-campus students living on a tight budget. Even if your energy use stayed constant from month to month, it would still take a year to save enough money to buy a medium pizza from Gainesville's finest.

The key in this process is understanding how the company charges you the amount on the bill every month. Without getting too complicated, the kilowatt-hour is a measure of power over a period of time — a "calorie" of sorts for your home.

You are charged for all the calories that you "eat" in a month, regardless if you use lots of "low-calorie" appliances over a long period of time or a few "high-calorie" ones in short intervals. If you use less, you save more.

Electric companies have often relied on Big Oil to supply their plants and will continue to do so in the near future. We're in the middle of hurricane season, gas prices are unpredictable ... well, you get my drift.

Even with huge strides in the production of ethanol and nuclear power, such innovations will not become mainstream anytime soon.

All of this does not include fluctuations in other utili-

ties, insurance and the like. But that's for another article.

There are other ways to save money on your bill that do not require you to become a meter-reader. FPL offers a "Home Energy Survey" on its Web site that provides personalized tips to help you save money through less usage. There is a registration

process, but it is free and confidential.

The increase in savings you get from the process lasts for as long as you use any electrical devices, much like diet and exercise help you lose more weight than merely eating less fast food.

Energy Star appliances are also great for lowering energy bills. These devices save you money by adhering to a minimum efficiency rating as mandated by the federal government. They have the same power output and do the same jobs as traditional appliances, but they use less power and cost less to operate.

Depending on the cost of the device and the amount of energy it saves, it might even pay for itself in the cost of power saved in a matter of months. If you need a new coffee machine or blender, take heart.

This principle also applies to the water bill and even the gas bill — except consumption is measured by volume, not energy.

Taking your new savings and compounding them over several months should fatten your wallet even more.

They offer several sandwich and entree combinations that are an exquisite blend of seasonings, featuring a ropa vieja dish that tastes just like your grandma's cooking. But while the fare is flavorful with portions large enough to feed two, the restaurant has a bland, tan interior and hours that are a real drawback — they're only open Monday through Friday, 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.

**NA'GUARA LATIN CORNER**

This cozy, Venezuelan-Cuban restaurant quickly whips up a variety of large and small bites for breakfast and lunch for less than \$8. The diverse menu has tame entrees, such as the delectable coreana arepa with roast pork, grilled onions and cheese on a fluffy corn pancake, and also exotic dishes, such as the cazon arepa, which has shark meat. This snack spot's staff chatters in Spanish while VH1 Uno broadcasts on a flat-screen TV in the background. But due to its location, Na'Guara caters more to the SFCC crowd.

Wednesday tapas nights showcase the broad range their dishes offer, but if you're looking for authentically Cuban or Central American food, this isn't the place — Emiliano's is more Latin fusion than anything else.



They even have hard-to-find items such as Salvadoran pupusas, a corn-flour tortilla stuffed with cheese, or gallo pinto, a unique blend of spices and red beans and rice known to Nicaraguan cuisine.




The one satisfying part of the movie is the wardrobe selection for Christopher Walken, who is entertaining and does what he can with an underdeveloped mess.

# No 'Doubt' about Hipp's new play

In the post-Sept. 11 society we live in, there is one underlying emotion that connects all Americans: doubt.

That idea is what inspired playwright John Patrick Shanley to write "Doubt," a play set in a Bronx Catholic school in 1964.

"Doubt," a Pulitzer Prize- and Tony Award-winning play, is opening at the Hippodrome State Theatre on Friday. The play addresses the gray area between certainty and uncertainty as a strong-minded woman struggles with her conscience when she is faced with concerns about one of her male colleagues.

While the play is set in the '60s, the issues it raises are entirely relevant to today's society.

The play is directed by Mary Hausch, a UF alumna who has directed more than 100 productions at the Hippodrome.

"This play has some of the best writing I've ever directed," Hausch said. "We've been waiting on the edge of our seats to do this piece."

"Doubt" opened on Broadway in 2005 and has since gone on to win numerous awards and become the fifth-longest running Broadway play in the past 10 years. Its high acclaim suggests that something very special has come to Gainesville. Students and locals alike now have the chance to see a drama straight from the Broadway stage in the intimate setting of the Hippodrome Theatre.

Alecia Robinson, who plays Mrs. Muller, encourages students to take advantage of the opportunity.

"You get to see an incredibly well-written play for only \$10," Robinson said.

The play is left open-ended, without a certainty or conclusion, leaving you with many questions and a lot to talk about.

"There is no last word," Shanley wrote in the play's preface. "That's the silence under the chatter of our time."

"Doubt" runs at the Hippodrome State Theatre from Sept. 7 to Sept. 30. Tickets are \$10 for students, \$20 for seniors and \$25 to \$30 for general admission.



# Kanye album top of its class



## Gainesville-based AAFL team to feature former Gators

Come April, the Gators will share The Swamp with the All American Football League.

The AAFL, a professional league advertising a college atmosphere, opens its inaugural season this spring with Ben Hill Griffin Stadium as one of six team sites based in college towns.

The other teams are affiliated with Alabama, Arkansas, Tennessee, Texas and Michigan.

The league hopes to attract fans by offering minor-league rosters packed with former area-college standouts. The only catch: They must have graduated.

For example, Gainesville's team signed former Gators receivers Willie Jackson, Chris Doering and Travis McGriff on Wednesday.

"The initial concept in this league is what's so intriguing for a player," said McGriff, a player spokesman for the AAFL. "It is an extension of college football. It will mirror that, not the NFL."

Former UF quarterback Shane Matthews was announced as Team

Florida's coach at a press conference Wednesday.

The league does not have team names, but Team Florida's colors are orange and blue.

Florida plays three of five home games in Gainesville and practices there, too.

The team is talking with Jacksonville, Orlando and Tampa to host the other two games.

Unlike defunct leagues like the USFL and XFL, Matthews

believes the special nature of the AAFL, which emphasizes college rivalries and uses college rules, will keep it running.

"We're carrying on the passion of college football," Matthews said. "The fans are going to be able to relate to the players on these teams. They're going to be players they have seen and rooted for over their college careers."

AAFL CEO Marcus Katz, who made millions in the student loan business, bankrolled the league.

Katz, a Georgia fan, remembers wondering whatever happened to this ex-Bulldog or that ex-Gator.

## UF knocks off FSU in four

After surviving an early scare, the No. 6 UF volleyball team defeated Florida State 3-1 (24-30, 30-11 30-21, 30-21), extending the Gators' streak of consecutive victories against the Seminoles to 16 matches.

UF won the match in the fourth game off a kill from redshirt freshman outside hitter Janine Williams, but the story of the match was the difference between the first and second games.

"We knew that FSU is a really good team, a great serving team with some good hitters," senior outside hitter Marcie Hampton said. "We completely did a no-show. Didn't show up to play."

FSU got off to a great start in game one, causing UF to call a timeout after the Gators fell behind 13-8. FSU was blocking attacks and serving the ball hard.

"I don't know where our heads were," Hampton said. "We kind of snapped out of it between games one and two. We

talked to each other and said we've got to get better or else we're going to lose on our home court, and that's unacceptable."

After game one, it appeared the teams were playing a completely different match.

Senior opposite hitter Amber McCray scored three quick kills in game two, and

sophomore libero Elyse Cusack and junior defensive specialist Christina Diaz served aces as UF took a 9-2 lead.

UF (6-0) ended the match with 16 blocks — a season high — and also had 24 kills from its middle blockers.

"We played well when we started blocking balls," Coach Mary Wise said. "We thought we had a matchup advantage in the middle, and tonight it was Kisya (Killingsworth) and Kelsey's (Bowers) turn."

The Gators had a .650 hitting percent-

## Anderson to return against Troy

UF cornerback Markihe Anderson practiced Wednesday and should play Saturday against Troy, Coach Urban Meyer said.


Meyer said Anderson, who is recovering from a sprained right knee, was "tentative" but able to practice fully.

Anderson did not play in UF's opener against Western Kentucky.

The Gators need to get Anderson back, not only for some playing time before the team's matchup with Tennessee next week, but for depth as well. Fellow cornerback Markus Manson will sit out Saturday's

game with a sprained ankle.

Anderson's return should drop sophomore Wondy Pierre-Louis out of the starting lineup.

On offense, wide receiver Percy Harvin is dealing with tendinitis in his Achilles tendon, but he should be OK for Saturday.

Meyer said Harvin practiced "on and off" Wednesday, but the coach doesn't plan to hold him back against Troy.

"Not if he can go," Meyer said. "He'll be able to go."

Though Meyer talked Monday

about using Harvin on kickoff returns this season, the coach said he does not plan to use the speedy sophomore in that role against Troy.

**GOOD NEWS FOR BROWN:** Meyer said the NCAA Clearinghouse is closer to academically qualifying freshman defensive tackle John Brown.

"It's getting positive," Meyer said. "We should hear something real soon. It's positive from the feedback we're getting right now."

Brown last practiced on Aug. 20, taking advantage of a two-week grace period granted by the NCAA.

The questions eventually led to the birth of his brainchild in the summer of 2006. He knows about the failures of past upstart leagues, and he also knows what it will take to keep this venture alive.

"It's really up to the fans," Katz said. "If the fans come to the games and if they care who wins, it will be successful. Nobody will know for sure until it happens."

The league mandates at least 10 players on the 42-man roster must be former Gators and another 10 must have played college football at other Florida schools.

On Wednesday, nine former Gators signed contracts that will pay them \$50,000 to play 10 games this season.

Those included Tony George, Fred Weary, Ran Carthon, Eli Williams, Judd Davis, Steve Rissler, Jackson, Doering and McGriff.

Team Florida will likely look to Florida State and Miami alumni to fill its roster.

Carthon, who spent the last two seasons with the Indianapolis Colts and the Detroit Lions, came back to Gainesville to earn his degree this semester. The sociology major is six credits short of graduating.

"It was just real weird coming back," Carthon said. "Just getting on campus, I felt old. ... I'm 26 years old, but it made me feel like I was 96."

age, while FSU hit a lowly .043 in the second game.

In the middle of the game, FSU decreased the 13-point lead to five while junior outside hitter Mira

Djuric was serving. The Gators finally stopped the Seminoles after six-straight points and won the game on a Killingsworth kill.

Hampton exploded in the game with eight kills. The fourth game was tied nine times by the time the score was 10-10.

UF was able to grab a three-point lead at 15-12 and increased the margin to five when Bowers blocked two attacks on the same point.

Hampton led the team with 16 kills, one of four Gators to reach double figures.

singing "The Victors" for a few years — but is it really fair that one bad game can ruin a season?

Imagine if the NFL played by these rules. After Week 1, half of the league would already be out of the hunt for a championship. Tonight's game between playoff favorites Indianapolis and New Orleans would literally be do or die.

In baseball, the Boston Red Sox would be done after dropping a series to the bottom-dwelling Texas Rangers in April.

The concept is ridiculous, and by the end of the year, we aren't even rewarded with an undisputed champion.

Just like any scam, it's all driven by the almighty dollar. Too many TV networks, corporate sponsors and BCS proponents don't want to risk losing the fat profits they reap from the current format.

For example, in Arizona alone, last year's Insight Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, BCS Championship and Fiesta Bowl National Band Championship had a combined economic impact of nearly \$402 million.

Some argue that college football is a year-long playoff. That would almost make sense if there weren't such large discrepancies between the schedules of different teams.

No. 3 West Virginia faces a soft Big East schedule while hosting non-conference titans such as Marshall and East Carolina. Meanwhile, No. 2 LSU must navigate through the Southeastern Conference unscathed, top the Hokies this weekend and prevail over another conference foe in the SEC Championship. Please, remind me how this is fair.

Another argument against change is that a playoff isn't possible because the athletes will miss too much school. If Division I-AA can manage a 16-team playoff with eight conference champs and eight at-larges, why can't Division I-A?

Has the smaller division figured out a magical formula to fit in 11 regular season games and a playoff without ruining its players' educations? I doubt it. It just isn't as driven by money.

The NCAA recently renamed the two divisions, with I-A becoming the Football Bowl Subdivision and I-AA now the Football Championship Subdivision. The names alone make it pretty clear which system is better for determining a winner. As far as I'm concerned, they should be named "wrong" and "right."

With such an obviously skewed system, why has college football been able to exist in this way for so long?

The only answer I can think of is because of the pageantry.

College sports have the advantage of alumni as well as unusual traditions. The fight songs, stadiums, chants, mascots and other distractions have us hooked, and it's hard to find anything awry on a Saturday filled with exciting games.

That's the beauty of a good scam. It always looks good until it falls apart.






