Meyer happy despite sloppy second half

A car collided with Troy's defensive bus on its way to Florida Field on Saturday, and the bus kept on going up Interstate 75.

That was Troy's first mistake. The Trojans' defense would make many more by the end of the night.

Led by an unstoppable first-half offensive showcase, No. 4 UF trashed its non-conference foe 59-31 on Saturday.

The Gators scored touchdowns on all seven of their first-half possessions, as Troy's defense appeared to be suffering from whiplash.

The offense, led by sophomore quarterback Tim Tebow, looked unstoppable at its best and impressive at its worst. Six different UF players scored touchdowns in the first half.

It's that kind of production that won't be so easy to duplicate as the SEC season begins.

"That's very exciting," UF coach Urban Meyer said. "Obviously, that's going to change. Reality sets in."

Tebow completed 18-of-25 passes for 236 yards and three touchdowns.

Tight end Cornelius Ingram led the team with seven receptions for 105 yards and a touchdown.

It was a complete reversal in the second half, as Troy outscored UF 24-10 after the break. Meyer said he wasn't too bothered by the second-half meltdown.

"I'm not disappointed at all," Meyer said.

"We're 2-0, man. A lot of teams around the country aren't 2-0."

On special teams, the Gators blocked two punts.

Return specialist Brandon James, who was reportedly suspended for last week's game, shook off and side-stepped tacklers to huge gains.

Going into this week's highly anticipated showdown with Tennessee, UF (2-0) looks primed and prepared to defend The

Lynyrd Skynyrd announced as Growl's second act

Thanks in part to Gator Growl's corporate sponsorship, rock band Lynyrd Skynyrd has been booked to perform at this year's pep rally.

Shelley Meyer, wife of UF football coach Urban Meyer and host of Gator Growl, made the announcement during halftime at Saturday's Gators football game.

The 84th installment of Gator Growl, billed as the largest student-run pep rally in the world, will take place Nov. 2 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

Aron Weingard, Gator Growl producer, said his staff wanted to shift away from the two-comedian format the rally has used in

recent years.

The challenge was finding a musical act that held appeal across several generations, Weingard said.

"It's really hard to find a musical act for Gator Growl because you have 15-year-olds to 85-year-olds," Weingard said. "We believe we met that challenge with Lynyrd Skynyrd."

The band will receive \$150,000 for the performance. It will perform for about 40 minutes after headlining comedian Frank Caliendo, who is receiving \$50,000 for his act.

Weingard said talks with the band began about a month ago but were just finalized within the last week.

He said he expects ticket sales to pick up after the announcement.

When asked if he was a fan of Lynyrd Skynyrd, Weingard asked, "Who isn't?"

"They're timeless," he said.

The announcement came just days after Gator Growl producers introduced Verizon Wireless as its corporate sponsor for the 2007 and 2008 productions, giving Gator Growl \$112,500 over those two years.

Verizon has the option to continue its sponsorship in 2009 and 2010, which could give the

rally more than \$250,000 over four years.

Weingard said \$50,000 will be used this year.

A portion of that money will help pay for Lynyrd Skynyrd while the rest will go toward improved sound and lighting equipment.

Gator Growl has been pursuing corporate sponsorships for about four years, Weingard said, but the largest donation until now was \$5,000.

He said Verizon approached his staff with an offer in late June.

Aside from sponsorships, the rally makes money through ticket and T-shirt sales.

Weingard said the deal was unrelated to the rally's past financial troubles.

In 2002, Student Government had to give the rally nearly \$200,000 because students had not bought enough tickets.



UF starts leadership class

Despite universitywide budget cuts of \$30 million to \$34 million, UF is implementing a leadership training program for its employees that will cost \$1,000 per person, paid for by his or her department.

The yearlong class, which will consist of about 20 to 25 people, was created to give UF faculty and staff leadership skills to move up in UF's ranks, according to Kyle Cavanaugh, senior vice president for UF's administration.

"We do believe it's very important even with a lean budget," Cavanaugh said.

UF wants to make sure it has a qualified work force, he said.

UF Provost Janie Fouke could not be reached for com-

ment.

Cavanaugh said as far as he knows, none of UF's administrators are leaving any time soon.

He also said the program probably won't be completed in time for participants to be considered for the open dean position in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

"Even if you don't change positions, you'll work better in your own position," he said.

There will be four quarterly workshops, each lasting two days.

Cavanaugh said the partici-

pants would be interviewed to assess their leadership skills.

During the classes, members will hear speeches and meet some of the higher-up administrators.

"It's a combination of networking and exposure to many who already have advanced leadership skills," Cavanaugh said.

The program is an expansion of an existing training program in UF's Office of Finance and Administration called the UF Academy.

The academy has been successfully used since 2002, he said.

The expanded part of the program will be called Next Level Leadership and will be available for UF employees in all departments.

It's aimed at individuals who want to move up from associate director positions.

GPD kiosk designed to help prevent crime

The Gainesville Police Department recently received a grant for a new kiosk to patrol midtown bars.

The Gators/Saints Mobile Safe Assistance and Education Team, called SAFE-T, kiosk was funded by a grant of more than \$18,500.

There are two primary goals of the GPD SAFE-T kiosk, Book said.

The first goal is to present more messages dealing with issues such as date rape and drunk driving, he said.

"Goal No. 2 is to provide a safe place after the bars close to help someone get what they need in order to get home safely," he said.

With this kiosk, GPD hopes

to prevent late-night crimes from occurring because of risky alcohol-related behaviors.

The kiosk officer on duty may be seen handing out brochures related to crime prevention, the importance of guarding drinks at the bars and making sure the "buddy system" is used when walking home from the bars at night.

The kiosk began in limited trial last spring in the midtown bar area, which includes places like Gator City, he said.

The kiosk may be expanded into the downtown area in the future, he said.

But for now, it will be wherever the officer parks his patrol car, Book said.

Qualifying for Student Government political parties was off to a slow start Friday.

Supervisor of Elections Sarah Krantz said about 57 UF students filled out paperwork and qualified to run with SG parties,

which she said was an average number for the first day.

"Traditionally, the first day is the slowest," Krantz said in phone interview Sunday. "I'm happy with the number."

Krantz said she suspects the first day is typically slowest because of student procrastination.

"It's just like anything in life," she said. "People who are very active come the first day because they want to beat the rush."

Although five parties registered for the fall election, only the Gator and Progress parties participated in qualifying.

Progress Party President Joseph Trimboli said Friday that so far, the candidates he interviewed were excellent.

He placed emphasis on working with candidates to build the party's platform.

Student Government He said that's why the only question asked during interviews was, "During your time at UF, what could be changed in the realm of SG?"

"We could've brought out a platform and put it on the table for people to look at, but we don't want to make people feel

like they don't have a say," he said during qualifying Friday.

Robert Yeh, a UF sophomore, said he interviewed with the Progress Party because the party is "kind of the underdogs."

The Gator Party declined to comment. Krantz said she expects people to line up out the door on Tuesday, which is scheduled as the last day of qualifying.


That date, however, is still up in the air because of a name conflict between SG political parties.

Scooter accidents rising

When Guillermo Moratorio's motor scooter collided with a black Saab earlier this semester, he was flung headfirst toward it in a front-flip that landed him sideways on the pavement.

The UF senior was traveling at the 35-mile-per-hour speed limit on Southwest Second Avenue when the woman driving the car pulled out past the stop sign.

Moratorio, who was not wearing a helmet, could not swerve to avoid the car and collided with the rear of the vehicle.

Moratorio's accident left him with both his ankles fractured and a destroyed scooter.

"It was pretty intense," said Moratorio, who has been on crutches since the accident. "My scooter was completely obliterated."

Reported motorcycle and scooter accidents have increased from five to 18 incidents between 2005 and 2006, said University Police Department Lt. Robert Wagner.

Most reported incidents involved scooters, Wagner said. This year, the trend shows no sign of stopping.

Eleven accidents have been reported so far, a number that already exceeds the total count for 2005, Wagner said.

"There may be more crashes due to there being more scooters," he said.

Students had purchased 1,265 scooter and motorcycle decals as of Aug. 1. Faculty and staff have purchased 441 scooter and motorcycle decals since April.

Ron Fuller, of UF Transportation and Parking Services, noted that the number of scooter and motorcycle decals purchased is increasing.

"Each year we have more and more scooters, so we have to find ways to accommodate them," he said.

In past years, when student and staff motorcycle and scooter decals were recorded together, there were consistent increases in the number purchased.

Decal purchases rose by about 24 percent between the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 school years.

However, Fuller is not convinced that more scooters on the road lead to more accidents. He said it is based on the riders.

Collin Austin, the owner of a local store called New Scooters 4 Less, said riders can stay safe by wearing helmets, riding a bright-colored scooter or putting both feet down to stay stable when stopped.

"You're definitely the smallest thing on the road. You want to make sure you're the most visible," he said.

Additionally, Wagner said, wearing helmets is crucial.

"I don't think people realize that 20 miles per hour is enough to kill," he said.

Cancer inspires journey

■ **MATT GREGORY HAS WALKED MORE THAN 4,500 MILES.**

He arrived in Gainesville on day 369 of his trek.

The journey started in Bellingham, Wash. He said it should end in Key West. With trekking poles in hand, he's walked. And walked.

He carries with him a 40-pound backpack and the memory of his mother.

Today is day 375 of Matt Gregory's walking adventure for cancer awareness. His mother, Carolyn Gregory, gave birth to him prematurely when she had leukemia.

Melanoma took her life in 1999.

"My mom's life inspired me," Gregory said. "I needed something to really motivate myself."

Gregory, 28, is on his eighth pair of shoes. With more than 4,500 miles under his belt, he's met countless people.

"People in Florida seem to be more willing to bend over backwards to help me out," Gregory said.

He arrived in Gainesville on Sept. 4. Gregory said he enjoyed taking pictures of the "French fries" on UF's campus, eating Satchel's pizza in a van and visiting Tim and Terry's music store.

The friends he made in Gainesville took him to the UF football game against Troy University.

Once out of Gainesville, Gregory will continue his trip to Key West. He expects to finish in October.

"Right now I don't exactly know where I'll cut over to the coast," he said.

Around Gainesville So far, he's raised about \$7,500 for the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle, the center that helped treat his mother's cancer.

The total amount of donations is made up of small contributions he's received from strangers during the trip.

"The whole story in general is how hospitable people have been," Gregory said. He's stayed with about 85 different households.

"You don't see your friends that you've had for a while," he said. "It's just nice to have a spot that's comfortable."



Battle over 'Swamp' persists

Two UF students, each vying to be called Swamp Party president, are still playing a name game after bickering over which of them has the right to the Student Government party's name.

In a second hearing at 8 a.m. Friday, SG's Elections Commission ruled that naming a party "The Party Formerly Known as Swamp" might confuse voters.

The name was deemed too similar to the Swamp Party's name.

"It's a play off the name of Prince," said Sam Miorelli, president of The Party Formerly Known as Swamp, at the hearing. "I don't see how anyone could be confused at all."

The commission asked Miorelli to change its name. He chose the Florida Students Party.

But the decision was nullified Friday when officials from the Center for Student Involvement revoked their Thursday decision to strip then-Swamp Party President Miorelli of the name.


Miorelli said CSI officials told him they decided to leave their earlier decision up to the commission.

"As of right now, I am asserting that I am Swamp Party president," Miorelli said.

The decision gave the Swamp Party name to Keith Hardwick. Hardwick, who was registered as the Swamp Party president in the spring, had the first shot to register the name again, according to CSI elections rules.

"I want to protect the party name that I served under, the party name that is near and dear to my heart," Hardwick said Thursday.

Miorelli responded by changing his party's name to The Party

Formerly Known as Swamp, prompting Hardwick to file a complaint about the similarities between the two party names.

The complaint led to the commission's Friday morning decision.

Miorelli said the commission would give the party name to either him or Hardwick at a 5 p.m. commission hearing today.

In the meantime, Miorelli said he has asked the Student Body Supreme Court to cancel

qualification for prospective candidates today, since students won't know what parties they're applying for due to the name confusion.

"How can we expect students to come out and slate when they don't know and we don't know what the names of these parties are?" Miorelli asked.

Jessica Gavrich, chief justice of the Supreme Court, said a decision would be made at a meeting Monday morning.

Police see fewer game-day violations

■ EJECTIONS AND ARRESTS ARE DOWN.

Hordes of orange-and-blue-clad Gators fans marched toward Ben Hill Griffin Stadium armed with an arsenal of Solo cups and beer cans. It was just another Saturday in the Swamp.

Police patrolled the streets, munched on tailgate food and nabbed violators of the city's open container ordinance.

But despite appearances, Gators fans — especially UF students — have been behaving better. Arrests and ejections are down, as is game-day violence.

In 2006, there were 131 ejections from the stadium and 30 arrests, 17 of which were UF students, after the first two games. In 2007, there have been only 80 ejections and 19 arrests, six of which were students, after the first two games, according to press releases from the University Police Department Web site.

On Sept. 1, the date of the Western Kentucky game, the Gainesville Police Department issued 31 open-container citations — three of which were to UF students, said GPD Lt. Keith Kameg.


"In the last three years, I don't think we have responded to a single significant fight," Kameg said. "Alcohol consumption we want to address, but we don't want to see fights."

According to the Gainesville City Ordinances, it is unlawful for any person to consume or be in possession of any alcoholic

beverage in an open container on any public street, sidewalk or publicly owned parking facility in the city.

It is legal for those over 21 to drink within a tailgate area on campus, said UPD officer W.C. Sasser. Violations occur once alcohol leaves the tailgate area.

UPD, which works with GPD, started a push last year to crack down on excessive drinking. The goal was to eliminate tailgates with multiple kegs and liquor bottles, said UPD Capt. Jeff Holcomb.

"This year I think folks know what the rules are and are abiding by them," he said. "It makes us feel like we are

getting our job done and getting it done well."

This fall marks the third year of UF President Bernie Machen's presidency, which has featured a campaign to crack down on binge drinking.

UF alumnus Ben Bryant, who graduated in 2005, noticed how enforcement has tightened.

Bryant was issued an open-container citation for his clear, plastic water bottle filled with liquor and Coke before the Western Kentucky game. Bryant was never issued a citation while he was a student.

Regardless of numbers, Bryant feels the enforcement is a game-day buzz kill.

"I think it takes away from it," Bryant said. "That's why people come out here. It's for the camaraderie and the tailgating, which wouldn't be the same without alcohol."

Volunteers sterilize cats

About 60 volunteers showed up Sunday morning to spay, neuter and vaccinate roughly 200 stray and wild cats from Alachua County.

The program, called Operation Catnip, was held in honor of World Rabies Day, which was Saturday.

John Friary, a veterinarian with Operation Catnip, said while rabies is a big concern for the program, there are more than 35,000 stray and wild cats in Alachua County.

"We're making people aware of what a big problem pet overpopulation is," Friary said.

Each cat that passes through Operation Catnip has three-eighths of its left ear taken off as a universal symbol that the cat has been sterilized.

CJ Bahakti, 26, a Gainesville resident, brought in four cats that were living under his porch. He said he felt obligated to take care of the mother and her three kittens.

"I've got no money. I don't consider them my pets," he said. "But you know, they're part of the family."

The volunteers, veterinarians and pre-vet students worked in an assembly-line checking cats in, providing anesthesia, giving shots and performing sterilizations.

After the cats made their rounds and began to wake up, they were placed in wire cages under

heat lamps to be monitored for any side effects from surgery or anesthesia.

The program has a few members who return consistently to help Friary and his crew.

Pat Baum, 75, lives about 40 miles outside of Gainesville. She always shows up once a month to help out by cleaning scalpels or checking in cats.

"If I didn't like it, I wouldn't keep coming," Baum said.

Friary said his volunteers are some of the kindest people he knows.

"If they care that much about cats, unless they are freaks, they care that much about people," he said.

Operation Catnip is a trap, neuter and return program. Each person who brought a cat in for services released the cat where it was found.

Animal services used to capture all stray and wild cats and euthanize them. But the remaining cats would always repopulate.

Friary said the group's strategy is better than the former policy for pet overpopulation in the county.

Operation Catnip's strategy is less expensive and more humane, he said.

Laundry prices rise

UF students who moved back to campus this August returned to a semester of new professors, new classes and a new laundry system.

Students living on campus during the last academic year paid only 75 cents to wash or dry their clothes. This semester, students are paying an extra 50 cents every time they use the machines.

The reason for the increase is new energy-efficient machines placed in 25 laundry rooms throughout campus, according to Sharon Blansett, assistant director of housing for marketing, public relations and research.

The new machines are designed to hold 20 pounds of laundry and use 15 gallons of water per wash, versus the older machines that only held 12 pounds of laundry and used 30 gallons of water per wash.

Even though it costs \$1.25 for each cycle, students are only paying more because they are able to wash more with the increase in size of the

machines. Students are still being charged 13 cents a pound to do laundry as they were before.

"When we looked around town, the new laundry prices are fairly standard," Blansett said.

Another difference students may notice is that the new machines appear to be smaller than the older ones, since they are loaded from the front rather than the top.

Blansett said the key to making water-efficient machines is to compact them in size so that not much water is needed.

So far, the machines are running well throughout campus with the exception of a few glitches.

"We were having some of the dryers not running in the time they were supposed to run," said Heidi Lee, program assistant for maintenance service.

The new dryers should run for about 54 minutes before turning off, but some students have complained that machines have shut off early, Lee said.

UF finishes non-conference schedule undefeated

■ THE GATORS DOWNED UTAH 3-1 ON THE ROAD.

The No. 6 UF volleyball team will enter Southeastern Conference play undefeated for only the second time in Coach Mary Wise's 17 seasons.

The Gators (7-0) got one last road test Sunday as they defeated Utah 3-1 (30-28, 28-30, 30-18, 30-26).

Opposite hitter Amber McCray led the team with 18 kills, while middle blocker Kelsey Bowers anchored the defense with 10 blocks.

Utah opened with a quick 7-2

lead behind three kills by Whitney Webb, the Utes' kills leader coming into the match.

UF got its first lead of the night at 19-18 after back-to-back blocks, causing Utah to call a timeout.

The Gators opened the lead up to 27-23 after kills by McCray and outside hitter Marcie Hampton (15 kills, 19 digs) and a double block by Hampton and Bowers.

Three straight Utah kills cut UF's lead to 28-27, leading to a Gators timeout. Hampton came out of the break with a kill, forcing a game point.

After a kill by Utah's Kathryn Haynie, Bowers would spike the ball to win game one.

"Game one, we did not serve

aggressively as I would've hoped, and we weren't in a great passing rhythm," Wise said. "We were very fortunate to win game one."

Utah came out strong again in game two, opening a 3-0 advantage. The Gators gained the lead at 6-5 after two straight blocks by Angie McGinnis and Bowers.

Utah took a 13-9 lead after two kills sandwiched around a Lauren Bledsoe attack error.

UF then rattled off five straight points behind three kills by McCray and freshman Erin Fleming's first

kill. The Utes took the lead again at 17-15 after a Christina Diaz service error and a Utah ace.

The Gators then rattled off four straight points, but Utah would tie the game at 19 after two Gators errors.

With the score tied at 28, a kill by Haynie coupled with a Hampton service error gave the game to the Utes.

Wise was surprised the Utes didn't win game two by more considering the Gators' 13 unforced errors.

"We got impatient," Wise said.

Two attack errors by the Utes in addition to a double block by Kisy Killingsworth (13 kills, 6 blocks) and McCray led to a 5-0

advantage early in game three.

A Utah timeout did not stop the momentum as the Gators rolled to a 30-18 victory.

Game four started close, as the teams went back and forth to a 12-12 tie.

A Hampton kill and Utah attack error opened the UF lead to 22-17, resulting in a Utah timeout.

The Utes later scored five-straight points assisted by three blocks to tie the game at 24.

With the score tied at 26, the Gators made a run behind a kill by Killingsworth and two attack errors by Utah's Haynie. A McGinnis ace sealed the win for the Gators.

Gators open with victories

The UF men's and women's cross country teams opened the 2007 season with victories Friday night in the Mountain Dew Invitational.

The annual event, held at the University of Florida Golf Course, featured 1,500 runners from high schools and colleges around Florida.

The men's team finished first out of 16 teams in the 8K run with a total time of 2:06:06.42, while the women also took top honors in the 5K run with a total time of 1:30:19.72.

UF coach Jeff Pigg was pleased with both teams' performances, but he expects a lot more to come this season, especially from the men's side.

Senior Enoch Nadler led the UF men's squad, finishing first overall in 24:48.73 and with a comfortable 23-second margin. Nadler finished second in the event last year.

"To run this well and still be working this hard, it's definitely a good sign for things to come," Nadler said.

Nadler has high expectations for this year's team, and he hopes that the hard work and preparation will pay off.

"This is my fourth year being here, and I feel like what we're doing this year is the best we've ever done," he said. "We've got a lot of depth this year. It's definitely going to be a great year and hopefully the best team we've had in a long time."

Senior Lindsay Sundell led the women's team, finishing second overall in 17:41.88, five seconds off the lead. Sundell won the race a year ago.

She said the goal this year was to stay together as a pack, something the team did really well as 12 Gators finished in the top 22.

Sundell believes this race should help set the tone for the rest of the season, especially since she thinks this might be one of UF's best women's teams in recent memory.

"We're really good this year," she said. "I think we should win SECs. I think as a team we're as good as we've ever been since I've been here."

Sundell said that the team has a good mixture of upper- and lower-classmen, and the younger talent showed immediately with two freshmen finishing in the top five overall.

and prepared to defend The Swamp.

Well, except for that young, athletic defense that gave up 336 yards, but even Meyer was quick to defend the team's perceived weak link.

"(Co-defensive coordinators) Charlie Strong and Greg Mattison were ready to pull their hair out," Meyer said. "I'm not disappointed in the defense at all. I thought they played hard. ... The secondary is still a concern."

Troy marched down the field for most of the second half, outscoring UF 24-3 before a late Gators score.

A lack of push from the defensive tackles and miscues in the secondary — problems Meyer mentioned after last week's match — appeared again.

But the offense and special teams deserve some blame, too.

Up 49-7 at the half, UF stumbled and gave up two touchdowns in the

third quarter.

Normally sure-handed receiver Andre Caldwell fumbled on UF's first play of the second half for the Gators' first turnover.

Caldwell hurt his MCL late in the game and went in for an MRI.

Freshman Chris Rainey committed the second turnover, losing the ball on a kickoff return after

Troy had cut the deficit to 49-17. The Trojans made Rainey pay by marching 57 yards on nine plays for their third touchdown.

After the amazing first half, the Gators went scoreless on the first five possessions of the second half.

"I don't think anybody was letting up or worried about what they were going to do after the game," Tebow said of the drop off. "It was mostly my fault. I'm the quarterback, and I've got to manage the offense and find a way to make first downs. I didn't do that."

Looks like I thought wrong.

Go back two weeks. Did you really think the Gators would total just five sacks and one interception combined against Troy and Western Kentucky? Plus, that one interception wasn't even from the secondary, but a tipped pass by Trattou, a defensive end.

Then just one sack Saturday?

I would've thought Haugabook would be having Derrick Harvey nightmares by halftime.

The good news is that these young 'uns will work their rears into the ground to get this right.

Meyer has never once questioned the effort of this team, and he's done that more than enough since he first arrived in Gainesville. So he's not afraid to publicly criticize players when warranted.

But the bottom line is there's nothing these young players can do to prepare for The Swamp's atmosphere — especially in an SEC game. It wouldn't matter if Meyer put megaphones in the players' ears at practices to imitate the noise. There's only one way to overcome inexperience, and that's by getting experience.

The defense does have its bright spots. Brandon Spikes is ready and has been fairly impressive through two games. Tony Joiner has stepped up as a leader, and Harvey can still be sack master. Even Dustin Doe has looked decent. But more than this handful of players need to come ready to play.

At least this defense is lucky: the offense and special teams were outstanding against Troy. If the return game and Brandon James can continue to give the Gators the field-position advantage they had Saturday and Tim Tebow keeps playing like the Golden Child, the defense will only have to be average to pull out a win this week.

But average may still be a good bit away.

and he was not confident about pulling the starters in the second half against Troy's capable passing game.

UF was outscored 17-0 in the third quarter, and the Gators' young defense gave up 118 yards.

Meyer said he has a great deal of work ahead of him this week to prepare his team for Tennessee on Saturday.

He said the Gators will have to approach Saturday's game a little different.

"It has to be different when you walk into the facility on Monday," Meyer said. "The biggest thing is getting the team ready for this week. We cannot play this game on Tuesday or Wednesday. They need to understand that the intensity of everything involved is a lot different. ... You want to hit your peak on Saturday afternoon."



UF battles injuries after thumping Troy

After an upset-filled first two weeks of the college football season, the Gators are pretty happy to be sitting at 2-0.

But with several players suffering injuries during UF's 59-31 victory against Troy on Saturday, the Gators may not be as unscathed as their record indicates.

Wide receiver Andre Caldwell and safety Bryan Thomas both suffered MCL sprains, and running back Brandon James sprained his ankle.

Meyer said after the game that Caldwell would undergo an MRI to find out the severity of the injury, but as of Sunday morning, Meyer still wasn't sure about the status of either Caldwell or Thomas.

"I don't have final word on them, but obviously there's some concern there," Meyer said. "I don't ever comment until I hear it right out of the doctor's mouth."

Meyer had yet to learn the specifics of James' injury as of Sunday morning.

Wide receiver Jarred Fayson had to be helped off the field after he hurt his knee late in the third quarter, but he returned to the game in the fourth, and Meyer said he thinks the sophomore is fine to play.

If Caldwell and James are forced to miss some playing time, Meyer said he is not sure he would rely on freshmen Chris Rainey and Deonte Thompson to help out next week against Tennessee.

"I'd say they're not ready," Meyer said.

In addition to Rainey, who played a minimal role, and Thompson, who didn't play a down against the Trojans, the Gators barely utilized their offensive reserves Saturday.

Meyer said his first priority is always to win the game,


