Gators hang on to escape Mississippi upset

OXFORD, Miss. — With the game on the line, Tim Tebow walked up to his coach and got in his face. The baby-faced 20-year-old quarterback wasn't about to lose his first road start.

He made sure his 43-year-old coach knew that. "He's in my ear, 'Let me win the game,'" UF coach Urban Meyer said. "Okay, Tim, I'll let you win the game."

The sophomore star carried the No. 4 Gators (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) to a grind-it-out 30-24 win and destroyed a 40-year-old school record in the process.

He ran for a UF quarterback-high 166 yards on 27 carries and two touchdowns.

Larry Rentz previously set the program mark with 109 yards against Tulane in 1967.

Adding in a 20-for-34 throwing performance for 261 yards and another pair of scores, Tebow accounted for 427 yards on 61 touches.

"That was a four-quarter fight," Tebow said. "It was down to the last minute. I wasn't really thinking about how many carries I had or anything like that. I was just trying to get the first down, manage the offense."

UF called Tebow runs on five straight plays to burn the final three minutes of clock after Mississippi's final effort — a fake punt — failed.

He powered for a pair of first downs through the brunt of the Rebels' defense, allowing the Gators to kneel down and run out the clock.

"I have to commend Tim Tebow because he is like a brick wall," Mississippi defensive back Dustin Mouzon said. "I came up to hit him, and I kind of got hurt."

The Rebels deserved credit too.

They laughed at the 23-point spread and fell just short of victory in the fourth quarter, boldly going for the win.

After UF settled for a 25-yard field goal to take a 30-24 edge, the underdogs had 4:59 remaining to mount a touchdown drive to take the lead.

But they stuttered (two false starts) and stalled at their own 33-yard line with 3:09 left.

On a fourth-and-11, Coach Ed Orgeron tried a fake punt, and it almost worked.

Punter Justin Sparks completed a short pass to tight end Robert Lane, but defensive end Jermaine Cunningham converted an open-field tackle three yards shy of a first down.

UF took a timeout before the play and telegraphed it.

"I know him as a coach, and he's not going to punt that ball," Meyer said.

While Tebow's switch stayed on for 60 minutes, everybody else wearing white looked a little off at times.

A porous secondary and a weak pass rush allowed Mississippi to score on three straight drives in the third quarter. UF went up 27-9 and, all of a sudden, had that lead cut to three points five minutes later.

Rebels quarterback Seth Adams, a game-time decision with a sprained shoulder, wowed with a 77-yard touchdown pass to Mike Wallace with 7 seconds left in the third to really spook the Gators.

Wallace sped past freshmen Joe Haden and Major Wright on a deep sideline route, opening up a two-yard cushion.

"I've never been beat like that before," Haden

Health care worries grads

This semester marks the final stretch of a four-and-a-half-year journey for Adrianna Rodriguez, a UF history and journalism senior who will graduate in December.

Although she looks forward to a new chapter in her life, Rodriguez, 22, says she fears that when she is dropped from her parents' health insurance after graduation, she will join the ranks of young and uninsured Americans.

In the first half of 2006, nearly 35 percent of 19- to 24-year-olds were without health insurance, according to a June 2007 report from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality.

"My concern is that I've always been lucky and blessed to have health insurance," Rodriguez said. "But it's going to be really hard to pay for it by myself because it's difficult to find a job that offers health-insurance benefits anymore."





The Girls Next Door

UF students featured in Playboy magazine

In the name of school spirit, some students would give the shirts off their backs.

Seven UF women took off more than that in a 10-page pictorial of the "Girls of the SEC" October issue of Playboy.

The issue, which features "WILD SOUTHERN COLLEGE GIRLS," according to the cover, hit newsstands Sept. 7.

Jessica Macbeth, a pre-med UF psychology senior who posed with the other Gator gals in an orange, blow-up kiddie pool, said the number of fan e-mails she's received pushes triple digits.

Macbeth, a tall brunette who wore a white pullover sweater during an interview Friday, said she tried out for the magazine in April because her friends dared her.

But the joke was on them, she said.

Two days before the photo shoot April 13, she got the news that she was in.

So far, she said she's had positive responses from friends and family. She said she'd always be proud of her participation in the magazine.

"It's a fun thing I did when I was young and hot," she said with a wide smile.

Still, Macbeth said frequent recognition by strangers is hard to get used to.

Crowds of people at the gym have approached her, and each day she can count on more than 20 Facebook friend requests and messages, she said.

On Sept. 10, all seven girls participated in a magazine signing at The Swamp Restaurant. Hundreds

of people came for autographs, they said.

"It was weird when people had me signing for their dad or a little brother," Macbeth said.

She added that she signed one copy of the magazine for her own dad.

"He knows all about it," she said, laughing.

She said her grandma saw it as well. And Macbeth's boyfriend. And his parents.

"It's not like it's Hustler."

But Macbeth, who wore a bikini in the photo, said it doesn't matter to her.

"It's how they'd see me at the beach," she said.

Allison Creamer, a UF sophomore and self-proclaimed baby of the group, said her boyfriend, Pat Carroll, encouraged her to audition.

When Carroll saw his sweetheart's bare breasts in print, Creamer said he couldn't have been happier.

She said Carroll's fraternity brothers were also excited.

"He just told them, 'Whatever. She's beautiful,'" Creamer said.

Playboy's college pictorials have been some of the most popular features in the magazine over the past 31 years, according to a press release from Playboy.

The last time Playboy featured "Girls of the SEC" was in October 2001.

Monique Omura, a UF advertising senior who posed topless, said she has always loved Playboy. However, she said she never expected to be a part of it.

"You don't look at it as pornography," Omura said, flipping

through glossy pages of busty, naked women. "You look at it as these beautiful girls."

Between giggles, the freckled, dark-haired Omura explained she's proud to have posed but hasn't mustered the courage to break the news to her mom and dad.

"I don't think my parents really need to see me naked," she said.

Looking around the room at four of the other Playboy pinups from UF, she said the best part of the experience was bonding with her new buddies.

"You'll always have the magazine, but now we also all have these great friends," Omura said.

Natasha Combs, a UF sophomore, said she initially had concerns that participation in the pictorial could hinder her future career in telecommunication.

She said she ultimately decided if someone doesn't hire her because she posed, she wouldn't want to work for that company anyway.

Combs has a tattoo on her hip that says "Live Free," and she said she loves to predict personality traits based on astrological signs.


She was the only girl from UF with an individual shot, donning nothing but a green net.

"I was comfortable," she said of the shoot. "I was surprised."

However, Combs said she was disappointed when she saw the published product because her name below the picture was switched with another woman's.

"It was horrible," she said with her eyes wide. "You want to take credit for your own picture. That's a really big deal."

Combs said she denied her participation in the magazine to her parents for as long as she could. But when a check from Playboy

was mailed to her house, the secret was out.

The girls would not reveal how much they were paid for the shoot, but Combs said it was less than \$1,000.

She said her parents weren't thrilled about her participation at first, but she said they were happy she chose to be a part of "one of the classier adult magazines."

"It's not like it's Hustler," she said.

The girls said because they posed for the magazine, the doors of the Playboy Mansion in Beverly Hills, Calif., are open to them whenever they want to visit.

They will have to pay for travel expenses, but with one quick phone call, they have a ticket in-

side.

Anita Mae Rose, a UF finance senior, said she wasn't the least bit nervous posing topless.

The only other people in the room were the photographer, producer and lighting coordinator, Rose said.

She said she wasn't worried about dressing scantily.

So far, she hasn't had negative feedback about posing in the magazine.

Rose added that she thinks Americans in general are too prudish about showing skin. The others nodded in agreement.


"The female figure is something people shouldn't be ashamed of," Macbeth said. "It's empowering in a lot of ways."



Tasers used by UPD 17 times since '01

Tasers have been used 17 times in University Police Department incidents since summer 2001, according to UPD's spokesman.

As a result of the Sept. 17 Taser incident, though, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement will conduct an investigation of UPD's use of force.

UPD spokesman Capt. Jeff Holcomb said potential policy changes will not be made until investigation results are given.

UPD started using Tasers during summer 2001. They were issued first to sergeants and field training officers, Holcomb said.

UPD has not given Tasers to the entire staff. Some captains and majors do not have them, he said.

UPD uses the X26 and M26 models.

The newer model, X26, is 60 percent smaller and lighter than the M26, according to the Taser International Web site.

The X26 also has greater "stopping capabilities." Its energy can penetrate up to 2 inches of clothing, according to the Web site.

Officers are allowed to use Tasers when someone resists their attempts to control a situation, according to a UPD document titled "Use of Force."

LOCAL Crist in Gainesville for NAACP

At the Florida Conference of the NAACP on Saturday, Gov. Charlie Crist praised the organization as a leader in fairness and described several civil rights leaders who inspired him.

Crist was the keynote speaker at the closing banquet of the NAACP's convention, where he addressed a crowd of a little more than 500 at Gainesville's Mount Carmel Baptist Church.

He was the first Florida governor in 64 years to speak at the conference.

It took Crist about 10 minutes to enter the church because he was shaking so many hands.

During his speech, he described the impact several civil rights leaders had on his life, including Verle Davis, his high school principal and the first black principal at St. Petersburg High School.

"Because of his influence, I am who I am today," Crist said, referring to Davis as a "great American."

"I haven't reached as high as he has yet, but I'm trying."

Crist also mentioned his father, a member of the Pinellas County School Board who served as team doctor for St. Petersburg's Gibbs High

School all-black football team in the 1960s.

His father insisted on bringing him to the games, where Crist said he sat in on locker-room pep talks and prayed with the team before the game.

"It taught me a lot at a very early age that we're all the same," Crist said. "We all have the same hopes, the same dreams, the same aspirations."

Crist also praised the NAACP as a leader in "doing unto others," a rule he said drives his administration.

"Civil rights and simple human justice and doing what's right for your fellow man, being kind, being gracious, being decent. These things are important. These things matter," Crist said.

During his address and while answering media questions afterward, he mentioned Florida's high property taxes, his efforts to attract black voters and the Florida Parole Commission's new regulations for restoring civil rights to ex-criminal offenders.

Family struggles with aftermath of student's death

Even before his adult teeth grew in, Andrew Enriquez smiled.

His cousin, Danny Enriquez, a law student at Georgetown University, said Andy wasn't embarrassed by how long it took for those teeth to grow in. Grinning always came naturally.

But now, his smile is forever frozen in pictures and memories.

Andy Enriquez, a 20-year-old UF history junior who hoped to become a lawyer, died Sept. 14 in a single-vehicle accident on Southwest 13th Street.

"I miss him so much," said his mother, Sue Enriquez, between bursts of sobs. "I have a pain in my heart like there's something missing."

From grieving to giving

The Enriquez family has set up a memorial fund with the UF Foundation in Andrew Enriquez's name to raise money for a UF scholarship.

"I hope his death leads to some student being able to fulfill their dreams," Sue said. "So he didn't die totally in vain."

So far, the family has not requested a memorial service from UF.

Enriquez was the middle child. His sister, Amanda, is 21, and his brother, Timothy, is 15.

Family was everything to Enriquez, Sue said. His siblings and cousins were his best friends and his support system.

Andy's friends were his family, too.

About 2,000 people were at Enriquez's funeral Sept. 17 in Key Biscayne, Danny Enriquez said.

For love and history

Enriquez loved spending time on the fami-

ly's boat, said his father, Tim Enriquez.

"He would fish all day if you let him," he added.

He loved history, weightlifting and running. Tim said Enriquez worked hard to become a Gator.

He spent one year at Tallahassee Community College and one year at SFCC before getting accepted at UF.

He liked music — mostly "that rap stuff," Tim said.

The 5-foot-11-inch Enriquez was a ladies'

man, his dad said.

"He had really pretty girls around here," he said with a laugh.

"So many best friends"

In everything he did, Enriquez celebrated his life, Tim said. He loved everyone he met.

Tim said he doesn't think Andy's death has fully hit him yet, but Sue is struggling in the meantime.

Sue said Enriquez would call her every day.

"All his friends would say to me, 'I was his best friend,'" Sue said. "I never knew anybody in the world who had so many best friends. I feel like he was my best friend, too."

Sue said she had already started saving her pennies for Enriquez's law school tuition.

"He and his cousins used to joke about having a firm called Enriquez, Enriquez, Enriquez and Enriquez," she said.

In a few weeks, Sue said she and Tim will go to Gainesville to clean out Enriquez's apartment.

Lessons learned

UF President Bernie Machen said Andrew Enriquez died with an armband from a bar on his wrist and a forged ID in his pocket.

Machen said cases like this encourage him to continue his fight against underage drinking.

Tim said he hasn't seen Andy's toxicology reports, which aren't yet available. He's not sure he wants to see the reports.

One thing he does know is students need to take care of themselves. Whether they have been drinking or are just tired, they should be careful behind the wheel, he said.

"Your body can only handle so much," he said. "Studying is very hard, and students are under a lot of pressure. You can drink, but, my gosh, you've got to get your rest."


Twenty full years

Enriquez's cousin, Danny Enriquez, said remembering Andy's good qualities brings comfort, but it doesn't bring him back.

Still, despite tragedy, Danny said he thinks Enriquez led a fulfilling life.

"It's the worst thing that's ever happened to any of us, but the way he lived his life brought a lot of peace," he said.


"If he had known he'd only have 20 years to live, he probably wouldn't have done anything differently."



UF nutritional sciences junior Akeelah Ammons said it was great to see so many people come together to repaint.

"With freedom of speech comes responsibility to the public," Ammons said. "It's an unwritten rule to be respectful."

Freshman Jocelyn Velazquez was one of the volunteers who touched up the U.S. flag of a memorial for soldiers.

As red, white and blue paint was slathered onto the surface, the blue graffiti vanished, and a flag reappeared.

"There are so many other ways you can express yourself," Velazquez said.

Keep Alachua County Beautiful is responsible for keeping up the appearance of the wall.

Mark Cline takes care of graffiti problems for Keep Alachua County Beautiful.

He takes pictures of graffiti before he paints over it. The main concern on the 34th Street Wall is profanity.

"It's a shame I have to come down here and babysit college students," he said.

Kharyssa Rhodes, program director for Keep Alachua County Beautiful, said while some parts of the wall change, it is an unspoken rule that the memorials remain untouched.

Rhodes might try to instill a city permitting system for wall painting. The group may also ask the city to install video cameras to monitor wall activity, she said.

"DONT TASE ME BRO" was also marked three times over Gainesville Police Department Lt. Corey Dahlem's memorial.

Dahlem was hit by a drunken driver after the spring basketball championship.

Katie Dahlem, his daughter, helped volunteers paint on Saturday. Her father's memorial was touched up on Thursday.

Katie, an SFCC criminal justice sophomore, said it hurt when she found out someone vandalized her father's memorial. She said the memorial serves an important purpose.

"I like having it," Katie said. "I like people to drive by, remembering it."

Options available for post-graduate health insurance

Health-insurance dilemma

The cutting-edge technology that has produced life-saving medical advances and top-of-the-line pharmaceuticals has contributed to soaring health care costs. And new graduates are among the workers shouldering the costs as they enter the workforce.

Employers, hard-pressed to cover rising health insurance premiums, have shifted the burden of the cost to their employees, said W. Bruce Vogel, a health-care economist and associate professor in the department of epidemiology and health policy research at UF's College of Medicine. Some companies, especially smaller ones, are dropping coverage all together.

Many young people, who typically have smaller salaries, are unable to afford their portion of the cost and go without, Vogel said. Those who aren't offered employee-based coverage are left to shop for policies in the pricey individual market, he said.

Opting out of insurance

The rising cost of health insurance may not be the only reason why so many young Americans are uninsured.

Many choose to forego health insurance benefits in favor of higher wages because they are younger and thought to be healthier, Vogel said.

"Going without health insurance at a young age is running a risk, but it's not the same risk as if you were 45," he said.

Wayne Wallace, director of the Career Resource Center at UF, said the students he sees are typically more concerned with salary, location and job satisfaction than whether they are offered health benefits. He said young people would often rather spend the money on other things.

"It's just not something they think about at age 23," Wallace said. "They don't think about how important it is until something happens, and it's too late."

Going without health insurance post-graduation may be nothing new for some UF students.

Roughly 20 percent of UF students reported not having health insurance when a survey was taken a few years ago, said Dr. Phillip Barkley, director of the Student Health Care Center.

Barkley said that number might

have decreased since UF introduced GatorGradCare, a health plan that covers graduate students on teaching, research and graduate assistantships.

The plan was started in January, according to the UF Human Resource Services Web site.

It is common for younger students to be on their parents' plans, but as they get older they are more likely to be dropped, Barkley said.

UF students are not required to carry health insurance, though it is available for purchase through Scarborough Company Insurance Inc.

Risky business

Opting out of health insurance may pose major risks for young Americans.

Young adulthood is a high-risk period for unintended pregnancy, sexually transmitted infections, substance abuse and injuries, according to a report from

the American Academy of Pediatrics. Additionally, an increasing number of young adults have chronic medical conditions, the report states.

"A catastrophic medical event can be financially devastating for young people without insurance," Barkley said.

Plans still available

There might be light at the end of the tunnel for uninsured students and recent graduates.

Low-risk policies called catastrophic health insurance plans are available for people in good health.

These plans might not cover doctors' visits but provide coverage in the event of a major medical procedure.


A healthy young person could find a plan for as low as \$60 to \$80 dollars a month with a \$1,000 to \$2,000 deductible, said Howard Shapiro, executive vice president of Brown & Brown Insurance in Tallahassee.

Shapiro also said short-term major medical plans are available at a low cost for young people who are between jobs.

Shapiro said lack of insurance is more often due to irresponsibility in young people rather than unavailability.

"If something happens and you are uninsured, you will pay it off for the rest of your life," Shapiro said.

Firefighters from 38 departments around the region gathered in the southeast corner of The Oaks Mall parking lot Saturday and Sunday.

UF FOOTBALL Free safety position a problem for Gators

Four weeks into the season, the UF football team is still working out its starting free safety.

Senior Kyle Jackson — who has struggled for much of the season and has been pulled from games due to poor play — is still the starter but continues to lose ground to freshman Major Wright.

Whoever is back there, the job comes with lots of pressure.

"That's the quarterback (of the defense), regardless of if it's fair or not," UF coach Urban Meyer said during his Sunday teleconference. "If you miss a tackle and you're a defensive end, the tackle or someone else helps you. That's part of the position you play. You miss a

tackle in the backend, and that's a home run. Our free safety position has to be much better than it is right now."

After watching Reggie Nelson patrol the backfield last season and lay punishing hits, fans want to see Wright, who is also known for his hitting ability. But Meyer won't increase the freshman's role until the coach feels he's ready.

"There's a lot of people that say throw them out there and see how they do," Meyer said. "That's absolutely not the case. It's simply week-to-week. See how Major and Kyle played and compare the two."

In defense of the secondary, the defensive line has struggled all season to get any pressure on

Running Tebow wild poses risks

On Saturday, Tim Tebow picked up the Gators, placed them on his back and carried them to a win against Mississippi six yards at a time.

With the clock winding down and UF clinging to a slim lead over the Rebels, Tebow rushed 11 times on the final two drives for five first downs.

Tebow's runs up the middle led to a field goal, and he single-handedly ran off the last three minutes with straight-ahead plows.

He finished with 166 yards on 27 carries, and both of those numbers set UF single-game records for a quarterback.

I've watched Tebow break plenty of records at Nease High, and that's one that I'd rather not see. The sophomore accounted for more than half of the Gators' total rushing attempts, and he is their leading runner this season.

Urban Meyer and the rest of the coaching staff have spent the better part of the last two years trying to persuade Tebow to abandon his reckless running style to prevent an injury, but what they are doing with him now may be even worse than letting him run over a linebacker on his way out of bounds.

His upper body is much better equipped to handle contact than his legs are.

Sending Tebow through the middle of opposing defenses on more than a quarter of the team's offensive plays is a dangerous gamble,

and sooner or later UF's luck will run out.

Every time he goes spinning through a jumble of linebackers and defensive linemen, Tebow's knees and ankles are very susceptible to injury, and believe it or not, he isn't invincible.

Ponte Vedra Beach Nease High's coaching staff learned that quickly, as Tebow missed time in two seasons due to injury.

During his senior year, Tebow suffered an ankle sprain after a quarterback sneak and missed three starts, playing sparingly off the bench in the third. He barely made it back in time to guide the Panthers to a state championship, something they couldn't have accomplished without him.

In college, Tebow means even more to his team than he did in high school. If there is one part of the Gators' offense that can't be lost, even for one game, it's Tebow.

Meyer knows this, and he acknowledged the danger of the play-calling after the game, saying that a quarterback should never have

Rebels shred secondary

OXFORD, Miss. — UF's inconsistency on defense was glaring Saturday against Mississippi, and Coach Urban Meyer has become concerned.

The third-year coach said the unit's deficiencies start with the pass rush, and correcting the issue has become an urgent priority.

"That's going to cost us a game," Meyer said. "I never see their quarterback get hit, and that's a problem."

At times, the UF defense dominated the Rebels the way it expected to.

But with the pass rush disappearing for much of the game, Mississippi took advantage of an inexperienced defensive backfield.

"We have a young secondary that got exposed today," Meyer said.

Mississippi quarterback Seth Adams torched the Gators for 302

yards through the air, including two touchdowns.

The third quarter was particularly troubling.

Sophomore cornerback Wondy Pierre-Louis got beat on a 51-yard reception by Mississippi receiver Michael Hicks, which brought the Rebels to the UF five-yard line, setting up a field goal.

On the Rebels' next possession, Adams connected with receiver

Shay Hodge on three-straight plays totaling 48 yards. On the third reception, UF free safety

Kyle Jackson made an ill-advised attempt to jump the route and intercept the pass. Jackson's lunge didn't even come close, and Hodge walked into the end zone.

One drive later, receiver Mike Wallace got behind the secondary and Adams found him for a 77-yard

Volleyball rallies to seal win against LSU

UF REMAINS UNDEFEATED AFTER ROAD TRIP.

Trailing No. 22 LSU 24-21, in danger of going to a decisive fifth game, the Gators turned to what they know best — outside hitter Marcie Hampton.

The senior responded, tallying five of her 20 kills as UF scored nine straight points to win the match 3-1 (30-25, 30-24, 27-30, 30-24).

The Tigers (11-2, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) looked poised to push the match to the limit after making an 8-0 run in game four. A pair of 4-0 runs helped close the gap before the No. 6 Gators (11-0, 4-0 SEC) went on their deciding streak to finish off a weekend road sweep.

In a match filled with highly contested calls, UF coach Mary Wise didn't mind two disputable LSU double hits during the match-ending run.

"You're not supposed to get breaks on the road," Wise said. "I think we did get two big-time breaks late in game four. I'm not sure that either of those calls should've gone our way and they did."

Sunday's match featured both SEC division leaders, and the Gators looked to both old and new to carry them.

Senior middle blocker Kisya Killingsworth had a big day, totaling 14 kills and four blocks with a team-high .385 hitting efficiency.

Killingsworth scored her 1,000th career kill, and it couldn't have come at a better time. LSU had taken a 20-19 lead late in game one, when Killingsworth reached

the millennium mark, evening the score. UF would not trail again en route to taking the first game.

Wise made a key lineup change late in game one, substituting freshman Callie Rivers, daughter of Boston Celtics coach Doc Rivers, for a struggling Janine Williams. Williams had no kills and one error on four attacks and would not re-enter the match.

Rivers made an immediate impact, scoring a kill and a block by the end of the game and would stay in the rotation for the rest of the match, starting the remaining three games.

She tallied nine kills along the way, one off her career high. Before Sunday, Rivers had seen

action in only 15 of 34 games, most of which was for short periods.

"Callie's a competitor," Wise said. "You could just look in her eyes, before this match — she wanted to play. She's taken the best use of this opportunity."

Wise's decision may have been foreshadowed in Friday's match against Mississippi (12-3, 2-2 SEC) when Rivers played in all three games and recorded four kills in the victory.

UF swept Mississippi for the 17th-straight time. Hampton led the team with 13 kills, but it was Killingsworth who stormed out of the gate, tallying five of her eight kills in game one.

"It was almost as if the student section kind of kicked Kisya into another gear," Wise said. "The look on her face — she came to play."

said.

With the lead cut to 27-24, the returning national championship players — led by Tebow — would come to the rescue.

Senior safety Tony Joiner had a key fourth-quarter interception and sophomore wideout Percy Harvin had a game-high 11 catches for 121 yards.

Mississippi played eight and nine men in pass coverage, shutting off deep passes and forcing Tebow to throw dinks and dunks and pull it down and run.

Meyer said Tebow would ideally take about 10 carries per game, and he worried about overusing his prized quarterback.

"We have to be very careful with the Tebow thing," Meyer said. "That's a crutch."

If the Gators thought Saturday was tough,

what's coming could be downright scary.

UF, now the sole leader of the SEC East Division, hosts Auburn next week and then travels to LSU and Kentucky before ending October with Georgia.

First, it's back to Gainesville. "I'm anxious to get on a plane," Meyer said, "and get the hell out of here."



UF nets ties against unranked foes

At this point, the UF soccer team's problems are becoming trends, and games that should be wins are turning into missed opportunities.

On Sunday, the No. 12 Gators (4-2-2) finished the weekend the same way they started it, with a tie to an unranked team.

Heading to Nebraska in a rare home-away split weekend, the Gators and the Cornhuskers (3-2-3) took 110 minutes to put a 1-1 tie in the books.

UF started the weekend with a draw against Florida Atlantic in a scoreless match Friday night.

The Gators and Owls agreed to call the game following regulation due to poor weather conditions.

The double-overtime tie in Lincoln, Neb., came in front of a crowd of 465 and

represented the Gators' first overtime contest of the season.

The Cornhuskers applied pressure early on, out-shooting the Gators 10-3 in the opening 45 minutes.

The second half began on a sour note for the Gators, when a free kick from 35 yards out by Nebraska's Selenia Iacchelli slipped through UF goalkeeper Katie Fraine's hands for a goal.

"It was just a misplayed goal," UF coach Becky Burleigh said. "It's not like we were doing anything poor on defense, it was only a minute into the half. But I don't think anyone put their head down. We just recovered and began to put all sorts of pressure on them."

touchdown that brought the Rebels to within three points at 27-24.

"It was pretty good coverage," said UF cornerback Joe Haden, who was defending Wallace on the play. "It was just, when the ball went in the air, he accelerated."

"He's one of the fastest kids I've ever seen."

With inexperience and injuries plaguing the UF secondary, Meyer said he doesn't have the depth to make full-scale lineup changes when players aren't performing well.

"There are no choices right now," Meyer said. "You've got what you got."

Jackson, a senior, was benched in the first half against Tennessee and his struggles forced Meyer to consider pulling his starting job in favor of true freshman Major Wright.

Strong safety Tony Joiner, Jackson's best friend, was visibly upset when asked about Jackson's confidence following the game.

"I think his confidence is still the same," Joiner said. "There's not really anything I see for his confidence to be lower. I'm going to talk to him again on the bus, and that's about it."

But while the Gators were

burned by the Rebels' passing attack, they contained All-Southeastern Conference running back BenJarvus Green-Ellis and the run game.

They allowed 80 yards and no touchdowns on the ground, holding Green-Ellis to just 37 yards.

"Our linebackers and our D-linemen are playing phenomenal (against the run) right now," Joiner said. "When everything is put together, we are going to have a great defense."

Meyer and his staff can and will do whatever they have to in order to win, and with games against top Southeastern Conference foes looming, they'll want the ball in safe hands.

No matter what, every time Tebow goes to the ground, the collective breath of Gator Nation will be held.

Perhaps the day will never come when Tebow hobbles off the field to polite applause, but I think Meyer and his fans would agree that they have to minimize the chances of that happening.

The easiest way to do this is to let the running backs do some running.

the opponent's quarterback. The Gators have seven sacks through four games.

"They're tied together," said

Meyer of the coverage and pass rush struggles. "When your defensive backs are playing well, it's usually correlating with a great pass rush. I think it's somewhat tied, but you can't use that as an excuse."

SHARE THE LOVE: Standout sophomore Percy Harvin stole the show Saturday with 121 receiving yards and a touchdown — and he had several runs called back due to penalties — but Meyer knows he has more than just Harvin at his disposal.

"[Jarred] Fayson was wide open and we didn't get him the ball," Meyer said. "[Cornelius Ingram] is very involved in our offense and had a couple catches. I think we went a little conservative."

GAME TIME: UF announced that this weekend's home game against Auburn will start at 8 p.m. and be televised on ESPN.

ETC: Meyer said running back Kestahn Moore's shoulder was a little "dinged up," but that he would be fine for this weekend... He also said wideout Riley Cooper should return, and he also hopes to have Andre Caldwell back.

as many carries in a game as Tebow had.

The problem is that Meyer hasn't been given a reason not to run Tebow. He almost never fails to pick up the necessary yards, and he seems to be the most reliable option.

What baffles me is the reluctance to hand the ball to Kestahn Moore, the starting running back whom Meyer has repeatedly called a trustworthy player.

Moore struggled to hold on to the ball last year, prompting me to name him

Kestahn "nobody fumbles" Moore.

He has since shed that moniker and become a consistent performer, averaging more than five yards per carry with no fumbles on 53 attempts.

However, with the game in jeopardy, Tebow seizes control of the running duties.

Whether this is because Meyer doesn't actually trust his backs or because Tebow insists upon it, it carries a risk that could end UF's title hopes in a snap, crackle or pop.

This isn't to say that they should play scared. The moment they begin calling plays just to avoid an injury, the offense will become less productive.
