

UF President Bernie Machen has decided Monday to postpone Dr. Jack Kevorkian's on-campus appearance, largely due to concerns

stemming from the Sept. 17 Taser of UF student Andrew Meyer.

Kevorkian, a controversial doctor who has assisted in patients' suicides, was originally scheduled to speak Oct. 11, but he will instead appear Jan. 15 at the O'Connell Center.

In an e-mail to UF students, faculty and staff, Machen said he met with representatives from the University Police Department, Student Government, Student Affairs and Accent — SG's speakers bureau — and de-

cidated more time is needed to assess UF's security and event-management policies.


"While we all would like to see these matters resolved sooner rather than later, I believe we should allow adequate time to make any policy or protocol changes needed to ensure a safe and civil

environment for full, free, diverse and lively discourse," Machen wrote in his e-mail.

Janine Sikes, a UF spokeswoman, said the administration didn't feel comfortable holding the event because it has yet to hear the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's independent review of UPD's actions.

Another reason for pushing the speech back is that UF has not announced who will

Some electives cut due to budget woes

UF students can keep jumping, jogging and judo-kicking next semester, but it might not count for class credit.

In light of recent budget cuts, UF will offer fewer sections of sports and fitness classes to allocate more money to courses that are mandatory for degree tracks.

Steve Dorman, dean of UF's College of Health and Human Performance, said course downsizing was proposed about a year ago to make the college more efficient, and the recent budget cuts made the idea more appealing.

UF plans to cut about \$34 million campuswide from its budget this year.

Dorman said classes like aerobics, jogging and swimming, which are mostly electives, use funds that could be channeled to-

ward more popular courses, like anatomy and physiology.

For now, he said, only the number of course sections would be reduced, but the college will look into cutting those classes altogether.

"Every semester, we're packed out in those classes."

"It just makes sense," he said. "As a student, you should want that."

It's important to provide enough resources for students to take classes that are required for their degrees, he said.

He added that several UF degrees require the same classes in

Football players speak to GPD about Sunday shooting

Players are not suspects, official says

Gainesville police have spoken to former and current UF football players about a shooting near campus Sunday, according to Gainesville Police Department officials.

Two people were shot in a white Crown Victoria near the Holiday Inn off West University Avenue at 2:20 a.m.

Keith Kameg, GPD spokesman, said Corey Tevon Smith, 28, was shot in the head and taken to Shands at UF. The injury is life threatening, he said. Justin Glass, 19, was shot in the right arm, but the injury is not life threatening,

Kameg said Sunday.

He said the players might have had contact with the victims before the shooting, but none of the players are suspects.

Local News Kameg said Monday evening he had not received an update on either victim's condition.

Kameg said the department has spoken to three current football players and one former


football player: Jacksonville Jaguars player Reggie Nelson. Kameg said the players approached GPD to speak about the incident.

The car was traveling west on University Avenue when it stopped because of traffic, and a man approached and shot several times into the car.

Motives are unknown, and no suspects have been named, Kameg said.

Research examines sports fans' loyalty

■ UF, FSU AND U-MIAMI ARE BEING SURVEYED.

It takes more than national titles to make Gators fans bleed orange and blue, according to researchers who believe the sense of community in college sports keeps fans loyal to their teams.

Market researchers from UF and Florida State University are surveying students at UF, FSU and the University of Miami to compare how their senses of team identity are influenced by identification with their state, cities and universities.

Yong Jae Ko, a UF researcher and assistant professor, said building a strong team identity

is the goal for sports marketers.

The research aims to prove how important it is for marketers to represent communities surrounding teams and to identify how fans develop and show their loyalty, said Bob Heere, a researcher and visiting assistant professor at FSU.

Heere developed the scale to measure team identity based on data collected from FSU students in 2005, which is used in the study.

He found the students who identified with the FSU football team had a strong affinity with the school and the state of Florida but did not identify with Tallahassee, he said.

"I think the same thing is going to happen with UF because it's in such a small town," Heere said.

UF center opens near Fla. coast

UF's newest research institute is located about 80 miles away from campus on the southern outskirts of St. Augustine in the town of Marineland.

During the Whitney Laboratory for Marine Bioscience's open house Saturday, lab tours and touch tanks were featured.

Peter Anderson, director of the institute, said there was a great turnout for the event, which he specified was not for fundraising but simply to increase awareness of the lab in the community.

Researchers at the Whitney Lab study marine life for human medical advances, Anderson said.

The open house emphasized the lab's newly built Center for Marine Studies, which was completed last March.

The rest of the lab's facilities date back to 1974.

Stacey Marsh, director of development for the institute, said the new building was a much-needed addition to the lab.

"With it comes the capacity to do everything we dreamed of doing," she said.

The open house gave visitors the opportunity to see various kinds of marine life up close and per-

sonal, including horseshoe crabs and spiny lobsters. Touch tanks were also popular.

Anderson, who studies jellyfish, said most people don't understand how studying aquatic animals can help humans because they think they're so physically different.

"They're actually not," he said. "That's the amazing thing."

Anderson added that humans and jellyfish have nearly identical nervous systems.

Marsh said the open house was a good opportunity for the public to see what goes on inside the lab.

"What the lab does is not easily understood," she said. "People think we're taking care of the dolphins, and we don't have anything to with it. We're a UF lab."

The lab had to put its annual open house event on hold for three years because of construction that limited parking, Anderson said.

Even with additional parking, there were hardly enough spaces to accommodate visitors eager to see what was behind the Whitney Lab's walls.

Although the Whitney Lab is well-known in scientific circles, Marsh said, a lot of people outside the St. Augustine area don't even know it exists.

Social Studies Inc., a local marketing company, put on the show. Nick Roses, vice president of media relations, said about 4,500 tickets were sold.


According to the O'Connell Center Web site, the main arena seats more than 9,000 during a concert, but Roses said he thought the event was a success.

Six finalists named

As the lights dimmed and the curtain rose, around 30 perfectly poised, high-heeled pairs of feet stood waiting. The dancing began.

At the UF homecoming pageant Monday night, called "A Red Carpet Affair," six UF students were appointed to the UF homecoming court.

Katie Darst, a health science senior, Jillian Yoerges, an anthropology senior, and Sarah Hartmann, a history senior, were named finalists for queen.

Nicholas Baragona, a marketing senior, Joshua Jackson, a political science senior, and Ryan Merkel, a marketing senior, were named finalists for the first-ever UF homecoming king.

The king and queen will be announced at Gator Growl 2007 on Nov. 2.

Contestants were interviewed by five judges before the pageant and submitted résumés and personal essays.

Each contestant was sponsored by a student organization at UF.

Elizabeth Davlantes, a UF genetics senior and homecoming chair, said it cost contestants more than \$200 to participate in the pageant.

Davlantes said she didn't know how many \$10 tickets were sold, but she was happy with the attendance. The Phillips Center was more than halfway filled to capacity.

The bulk of the judging was based on contestants' résumés and essays, she said, but the pageant activities and question-and-answer session factored in, too.

The king and queen will reign over UF for a year and will participate in UF functions and parties, Davlantes said.

Monday night, after the opening dance routine to "Razzle Dazzle" from the Broadway show "Chicago" and Fergie's "Glamorous," home-

coming-queen hopefuls modeled casual wear under a bright spotlight.

Michelle Schroeder, last year's queen, and Kevin Quinn, from KISS 105.3 FM, announced the contestants' names, awards and hobbies as they appeared on stage.

In addition to a slew of honor-society memberships, scholarships and awards, some of the most popular hobbies among the women included working out, spending time on the water, traveling and supporting the Gators sports teams.

After the contestants flaunted knee-length, pastel sundresses, crisp white blouses or slinky capri pants, it was time for formal wear.

Accompanied by one of 10 homecoming king contestants, each woman glided out in a floor-length ball gown.

Sequins glistened, ribbons bounced and white teeth sparkled from unmoving smiles as the queen contestants sauntered around the stage, stopping at each corner to pose or flip their hair.

"You gotta love the formal wear," said Tricia Outzen, a UF elementary education junior who attended the event.

Outzen said she had three friends in this year's pageant, and she has considered participating next year.

Freshman runs solo in Senate race

Competing alone in a Student Government election against political parties with thousands of dollars in funding might seem like a daunting

task.

But Marcus Dixon said he feels confident about his chances.

Dixon is a 19-year-old UF freshman and independent candidate running for the Beaty Towers seat in the Student Senate. He is one of two students vying for a Senate seat without the backing of

a party.

He said he didn't decide to run independently for the sake of opposition.

"I kind of did it to challenge myself," Dixon said. "Pretty much all of us are going toward the same goal of a better university."

With the help of several friends and the advantage of only focusing his campaign on Beaty, he said competing independently is feasible.

Dixon said he decided to become involved with SG while visiting UF this summer with the Outstanding High School Scholars Program. Running for the Senate is just one step in his final goal of becoming Florida's governor, he added.

Dixon was quick to add that serving as a senator was not just a way to pad his résumé.

He said his platform, which he created by talking to students in Beaty, would "create a better university."

"I sat back and listened before I made any decisions," Dixon said. "If you ask, you can make more people happy."


One goal is improving crowded conditions on RTS buses, though Dixon did not offer any specifics.

Others include adding more wireless-access points around campus and linking students' Gator 1 Cards to their 250 pages of free printing that is provided by SG each semester.

Students would not have to wait in long lines at SG's printing lab in the Reitz Union if they could use their Gator 1 to access free printing in libraries, Dixon said.

Dixon participated in Harvard University's Model Congress in Boston and graduated high school with about 1,400 hours of community service, he said.

Dixon is also an aspiring motivational speaker and has spoken to various youth groups on four or five occasions. One topic he speaks on is "choices and consequences," which he said would guide him in the Senate.

Get extra amenities when UF can afford them

Ah, a gentle breeze, the toll of the bells of Century Tower — and stacks of handbills shoved down your throat. It's that time of year again. Yes, the Student Government election begins today. If you're one of the 100 or so people who can hardly contain their excitement and were first in line at the polls at 8 a.m., well, this editorial probably comes too late.

But if you haven't voted, go get in line and read this during your short wait.

Yesterday we wrote about voting for the best candidates instead of blindly voting for a party. If you missed it Monday, you can still check it out online.

Today we bring you our opinions on the two ballot referenda. Of course, even if one or both passes, that doesn't mean anything will happen with either of them.

But we don't think either should pass.

One referendum asks if UF should provide funds for a student-run homeless shelter. We aren't saying Gainesville doesn't need more homeless shelters. But the city is hard at work on this issue already. And frankly, UF does not have the funds for this project.

The referendum's supporters say giving students a place to gain experience is another reason for the shelter. Here's a news flash: Nothing is stopping you from volunteering at one of the shelters around town.

As for the student-run cafe, it's a good idea in theory. Maybe one day when UF has surplus funding, it will become a reality. But once again, UF doesn't have the money to commit to the start-up costs of a dining facility. Why do you think all these chain stores have invaded our campus? It's cheaper. That doesn't mean they're better — hell, most of us enjoy our meals from non-chain restaurants near campus, and some of us even make it a point to.

It's unfortunate that money is always such a huge factor in what are sometimes good ideas. But we think it's more important to fund our educations at this university than to fund luxury amenities.

Talk Balk

By now, you've probably seen the e-mail sent by UF President Bernie Machen about the slight delay for Dr. Jack Kevorkian's Accent-sponsored speech, which has been moved to Jan. 15.

Machen & Co. claim this is for the safety of students because many students have already protested Kevorkian's appearance.

Ever since the infamous Taser at Sen. John Kerry's forum, everyone seems to be on edge. But the key difference between the Kevorkian speech and Kerry's is that Kevorkian's is not set up as a forum, and no question-and-answer session was planned.

Pushing the event back three months to allow the

Florida Department of Law Enforcement more time to conduct its investigation of the Taser incident seems like quite a long time.

Many students will graduate by then. Andrew Meyer's YouTube videos will probably be out of the "most viewed" lists. By pushing Kevorkian's speech back, is UF trying to get us to forget about what happened last month?

Sorry guys, but protesters will still be out there hardcore whether Kevorkian doesn't come for one week, one month or one year.





UF medical duo rebuilds faces with prosthetics

Josh Ghogan was shot in the right eye while rabbit hunting about 20 years ago.

He went to his local Veterans Affairs hospital in Tennessee to get an artificial replacement, but he hasn't replaced it since.

Artificial eyes should be replaced every five years, said Robert Mann, a medical artist with UF's College of Dentistry.

Ghogan is one of many who solicit the artistic and medical expertise of Mann and his partner, Dr. Glenn Turner, director of UF's department of prosthodontics.

The duo creates facial prosthetics for about 80 patients a year.

Ghogan's new eye was long overdue, Mann said.

The 80-year-old veteran spent about two days in Mann's office as his eye was fashioned and placed in its socket.

At the end of the second day, Ghogan walked out with a brand-new eye.

Most of Mann and Turner's patients are elderly people who have lost a nose or an eye during surgery for an illness.

While Mann works, his patients look into the mirrors on the wall, making sure

every stroke of acrylic paint is just right.

"We get their reaction to the shape and color as we build them," Mann said.

One recent example of the benefits of Mann and Turner's services was the Flowers family.

Jorden Flowers, the 5-year-old son of Olympic bobsled champion VONETTA Flowers, had two ears created by Mann at the beginning of September.



The ears, which were molded to match his mother's, were the last step in Jorden's journey from silence to sound.

Jorden was born with bilateral microtia, a condition that left him without ears.

After undergoing surgery in Italy about two years ago and receiving new ears from Mann, Jorden can hear.

Shortly after receiving his new ears, Mann said, Jorden went to Chuck E. Cheese's for his birthday.

be on the nine-member task force that will recommend revisions to UF's security and event-management policies.

Sikes said UF would announce the members of the task force later this week.

She said the administration came to a mutual agreement with Kevorkian and his attorney. UF will pay a \$7,500 "inconvenience fee" with

private money from the UF Foundation.

The administration has not considered delaying any other speakers or events, she added.

Steven Blank, Accent chairman, said the decision was out of his hands, but he said he agreed with Machen's assessment.

"While we're disappointed with the university's decision to reschedule the event, we ultimately have the same goals," Blank said. "We want to provide a safe environment for the free exchange of ideas."

Some students have complained

the college, and they fill up quickly.

"Every semester, we're packed out in those classes," he said. "If we offer more of those, students could progress quicker."

He said many students welcome more sections of degree-track courses, but he has heard some complaints.

"Anytime you make a decision, there are people on both sides of the spectrum," he said.

Dorman said UF's student recre-

ation centers offer some of the activities the college is cutting, such as group fitness or intramural sports.

Classes at the recreation centers on campus are paid for by students' Activity & Service Fee, which is included in **On Campus** tuition costs.

Students don't lose anything with the cuts, he said, except credits.

"There's aerobics on campus. There are pools on campus," he said. "It's not like we're the only venue that would provide for students."

Gators fail to spread ball on offense

The Tim Tebow and Percy Harvin Show may be going an act too long.

While Harvin and Tebow are filling up the stat sheet lately, UF has not spread the ball around like it did during the first few weeks of the season.

Running back Kestahn Moore had just three carries for 7 yards in Saturday's 20-17 loss against Auburn.

Tight end Cornelius Ingram — who was the Gators' second-leading receiver against the Tigers — had just 37 yards.

UF's usually powerful offense was finally tamed.

"They haven't been giving a lot of deep balls like we had earlier in the year. Teams are just doing a great job against us, getting around the other weapons we've got on offense and limiting us to two players."

"They've been taking away a lot of our weapons," said receiver Andre Caldwell, who should be back this week after a right knee sprain. "They haven't been giving a lot of deep balls like we had earlier in the year. Teams are just doing a great job against us, getting around the other weapons we've got on offense and limiting us to two players."

The Gators scored a season-low 17 points Saturday. Even in the win against Mississippi the week prior, nobody except Harvin had more than two catches. UF put up 30 points against the Rebels, but the Gators still value the importance of spreading the ball around.


On Monday, UF coach Urban Meyer

said he wants to get the ball into Moore's hands more often. Besides Tebow and Harvin, only Moore and Jarred Fayson had any rushing attempts Saturday, and even they only had five attempts com-

bined.

Meanwhile, Tebow has carried the ball 46 times the past two games.

Caldwell healthy, eager to play LSU

Andre Caldwell is back, and so is his swagger.

"This is my time, also my team's time to show the world," he said.

Caldwell, UF's standout senior wide receiver, played sparingly last week against Auburn due to a sprained MCL.

But he won't be kept off the field Saturday when the No. 9 Gators (4-1, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) face freshly minted No. 1 LSU (5-0, 3-0 SEC).

Caldwell deemed himself 90 percent healthy after Monday night's practice.

He said he would be back to full strength by the end of the week.

"It's written in stone," Caldwell said. "It's a done deal. I wouldn't let them sit me out

this game. I'm going regardless. This is one of those games, whatever is wrong with you,

you're going to get over it."

Caldwell caught four passes for 111 yards in the first two games.

He then sat out wins against Tennessee and Ole Miss, but surprisingly caught passes in warm-ups and started against Auburn.

He only got his feet wet — failing to touch the ball in

Move aside, FSU, here comes USF

At the rate things are going, I've come to the conclusion that South Florida has the potential to become UF's next Florida State.

The Gators won't meet the Bulls until 2010, but, by that time, USF could surpass FSU as UF's best in-state rival.

It's time to face the facts: USF is hot and FSU is not.

The Bulls are currently the No. 6 team in the nation — a bit premature if you ask me — but their success is not a flash in the pan, either.

Two years ago they beat No. 9

Louisville in their Big East debut.

Last season they upset No. 7 West Virginia. This year they've already

racked up two big wins against Auburn and the Mountaineers.

Not too shabby

for a program that started just 11 years ago.

The Bulls have continuously climbed the polls since this season started, and deservedly so.

Meanwhile, the Seminoles haven't been ranked since the preseason, as they dropped their opener to Clemson.

In 2004 and 2005, FSU managed eight-win seasons. The Seminoles needed a victory in the Emerald Bowl last year just to secure a 7-6 season — turning in Bobby Bowden's worst record since he jumped in his Model T and headed for Tallahassee.

Bowden may be the man who put FSU on the map, but he's pretty much overstayed his welcome, and, as a result, the team has lost its luster.

If USF continues on its road to prosperity and FSU continues on its slope of mediocrity, I wouldn't be surprised if recruits started seriously considering green and gold instead of garnet and gold.


USF's latest win against West Virginia was huge for the program and gives Bulls coach Jim Leavitt some leverage with up-and-comers.

Right now, only nine members of USF's 109-man roster are from out of

Gators take second place

Whitney Myers couldn't keep up her whirlwind pace.

But with her fellow Gators staying low, it really didn't matter.

Led Monday by freshman Jessica Yadloczky's even-par 72, UF's fifth-ranked women's golf squad finished second to Southeastern Conference foe Alabama at the Wildcat Fall Invitational in Lexington, Ky.

"We had some really good play and we had some hiccups," UF coach Jill Briles-Hinton said. "It was a growing experience."

The Gators entered the final round only five strokes behind the Crimson Tide but slipped Monday, finishing eleven shots behind.

A spate of double bogeys down the stretch from seniors Myers, Tiffany Chudy and Eleanor Tucker was particularly painful.

Briles-Hinton attributed them to the stress of contending for a title.

"They've got to learn how to control themselves in that situation," she said, emphasizing the importance of patience on the back nine. "They had too much time to think about it."

But there were positives. Their 10-over 298 on Monday lengthens their streak of sub-300 rounds to six.

And the Gators were honing their touch.

"[Myers] got a great deal of education," Briles-Hinton said.

Myers, who began Monday as the tournament's individual leader at seven under and tied the UF record with a 67 on Sunday, carded just two birdies on an eight-over 80 pockmarked by three double bogeys en route to fifth place.

The other Gators picked up the slack nicely.

Yadloczky recorded three birdies and three bogeys for her third par-or-better round in six collegiate tries, and wound up tied for sixth at six over for the Invitational, her first collegiate top-ten.

Junior Ornella Jouven and Chudy both fired two-over 74s and netted ties for eighth and 11th place, respectively, at seven and nine over.

Tucker shot the best round of her rough tournament Monday with a 78 that tied her for 48th at twenty-three over overall.

Junior Brittany Nelson, competing as an individual, turned in a one-over 73 that lifted her to a tie for 23rd.

"We just never got ourselves in a rhythm," running backs coach Stan Drayton said of the Auburn loss. "We went to our safety net, which was running our quarterback and trying to put the ball in the receivers' hands. We just got behind schedule and were unable to [put the ball in the tailbacks'

Now as you spread the field out, [Caldwell] goes back to his position, now you're looking at Louis Murphy playing out to the field again with Riley Cooper," UF offensive coordinator Dan Mullen said. "The ideal way is when we're 100 percent healthy.

Put the guys out there and the defense dictates where it goes, and usually they'll get spread around equally."

But at the very least, if you're going to have one main option, it's good to have someone like Harvin.

"A lot of people misunderstand what's really going on," Ingram said. "The reason why Percy is getting the ball out there on the screen play is because he's the kind of guy who can take it 90 yards at any time."

state. Luckily, Florida boasts some of the best raw talent in the country, and the system seems to be working for Leavitt.

Throw in some decent out-of-state recruits looking to play for a respectable program while catching some sunshine, and you've got yourself another top contender.

Look, I know there's a lot of history to the UF-FSU rivalry, and I concede that it will never completely disappear.

But in my past three years at UF, the Gators have failed to lose to the Seminoles. As the Gators continue to secure highly

regarded recruiting classes, I also see it staying that way.

The same goes for UF when it plays Florida's other "powerhouse" — Miami.

The Gators signed a two-year deal to play the Hurricanes beginning in 2008, which at the time stirred up some excitement, but even the Hurricanes aren't what they used to be.

They've continued a steady decline since their 2001 national championship season and have fallen from the AP Top 25 in 2006 for the first time in 10 seasons.

In a couple years, it's not going to be the Gator chomp versus the Tomahawk chop or the U.

Get ready, UF fans. The Gators are going to be grabbing the Bulls by the horns.

the game — and spent most of the night on UF's sideline.

"I told Coach (Urban Meyer) I thought I was good enough to go," Caldwell said. "But he was looking out for my future."

Caldwell's return should give a stagnant offense more versatility.

He provides a third option to complement Tim Tebow and Percy Harvin, the only players who are consistently receiving touches.

"It helps because he's such a threat over there and the trickle-down effect [benefits other receivers]," Gators offensive coordinator Dan Mullen said.


Caldwell broke his leg in 2005 against Tennessee, forcing him to miss the final nine games of his junior year and take a medical redshirt.

But missing two games this year — his final year — provided much more pain.

"I've only got a couple more games at UF," Caldwell said. "So this hurt a little more than the first time, when I had a couple more years left."

TRAUTWEIN OUT FOR SEASON: Meyer confirmed the inevitable Monday, announcing that senior offensive tackle Phil Trautwein would miss the rest of the season with a stress fracture in his right foot.

Trautwein, a preseason All-SEC second-team selection, can apply for a medical redshirt to come back for one more season.
