# Gonzales to speak at Phillips Center

Alberto Gonzales, the former U.S. attorney general who resigned in August, will speak at UF on Nov. 19.

Student Government records state Gonzales was paid \$40,000 for his speech at UF, which is the first college appearance since he resigned, said Steven Blank, Accent chairman. Accent, SG's speakers bureau, is sponsoring the appearance.

The speech will take place 7:15 p.m. at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts, stated a press release from Accent.

The event has been in the works for a few weeks, Blank said.

Free tickets will be available for students with Gator 1 cards on Nov. 14 and for the general public Nov. 15 at the Phillips Center and the University

Box Office, the release stated.

Blank said he expects a full house.

In 2005, Accent brought another former state attorney to UF — Janet Reno.

The show was so successful that the bureau jumped at the chance to host Gonzales, Blank said.

Gonzales was appointed the first Hispanic attorney general in February 2005 and later played a role in President Bush's fight in the war on terror after

Sept. 11.

Gonzales resigned in August after a controversial tenure.

Gonzales faced scrutiny over his leadership of the Department of Justice in 2006, after he dismissed nine U.S. attorneys.

# Fraternity accused of depriving members of sleep

## UF investigating allegations

A UF fraternity has been accused of hazing new members by depriving them of sleep, order-

ing them to clean older members' rooms and throwing them in a "mud pit."

UF's chapter of Alpha Tau Omega is suspended until further notice while UF's office of

Student Judicial Affairs investigates the accusations.

### Greek Life

Steve Orlando, UF's spokesman, said the sleep deprivation allegedly occurred when older members ordered new members to participate in "the lineup" during early hours of the

morning, where they had to recite certain fraternity passages.

If the new members did not deliver the messages perfectly, older members punished them by throwing them in a "mud pit" behind the fraternity house, Orlando said.

He said the accusations in-

clude requesting new members to clean rooms or serve as designated drivers for older members at any hour of the night.

Requiring new members to be designated drivers at all hours also causes sleep deprivation,

# Online ticket-distribution system may be in UF's future

Susan Budovsky, a UF anthropology junior, said she's never gotten tickets to a UF football or basketball game.

When she tries to call the Gator Athletic

Ticket Order Request System, known as G.A.T.O.R.S., she said she has never been able to get through.

"It was so frustrating because other freshman girls seemed to be getting tickets when I had been on the phone for hours," Budovsky said.

Student Sen. Jordan Johnson, who represents District B, said he's trying to find a solution to "ticket hassles and heartaches."

Johnson said he is collaborating with the University Athletic Association to update the ticket distribution system.

Student Government has received complaints from students frustrated with the ticketing system for UF's athletic events, he said.

Johnson, who chairs the Student Senate's UAA ticket distribution committee, met with the UAA on Tuesday to encourage creating a universal ticket Web site for sporting events.

In September, the Senate's research



# New Gators plates hit shelves

Avid Gators fans can add a new decorative plate to their collection of automotive accessories while helping UF raise money to cope with budget losses.

Dan Williams, UF's director of marketing, said new plates went on sale at local Gators shops and the UF Bookstore on Friday.

The plate, which features a Gators logo and the word "CHAMPS," resembles license plates from the Department of Motor Vehicles.

The price for a plate at the UF Bookstore is \$19.95, according to the bookstore's Web site.

Williams said proceeds from the sale would go back into the UF branding campaign's budget.

UF's Marketing Communications Web site states that the branding campaign aims to recruit students, staff, faculty and recognition by hurling itself into the public eye with advertising techniques such as The Gator Nation and Florida Tomorrow campaigns.

"Because of our budget challenges, we've been looking for ways to compensate," Williams said.

He said he hopes to have the plates available soon at Gators shops around Florida as well as at Wal-Mart stores in Gainesville, Jacksonville and several other Florida cities. They will also be available for Gators alumni clubs around the state to sell for fundraisers.

Williams said his office had been working on the idea for about eight months.

UF also worked with the DMV to make sure the plates were similar to those from the department, he said. The design changed several times before UF and the DMV were satisfied.

For legal reasons, the plates could not be too similar.

After UF and the department approved the design, Prison Rehabilitative Industries and Diversified Enterprises Inc., which works with prison inmates in Florida,

manufactured the plates.

Williams said the final plate, which is intended for the front of vehicles, complements Gators plates with "National Champs" or "Gator Nation" written on them that are already available for the rear of vehicles.

"It has a very official feel to it," Williams said. "The word 'champs' is something that really represents past, present and future championships, and people can keep it on their vehicles for a long time."



# Students give hair

SFCC communications specialist Julie Garrett said people were being turned away because there wasn't enough time to cut the hair of everyone who wanted to donate.


She said it was slow in the morning because of the cold, but as the day progressed, more people showed up.

# UF group talks to children about fighting bacteria

## ■ THE PRE-PHARMACY SOCIETY VISITS SCHOOLS.

Since his junior year of high school, UF sophomore Tyler Gums has been planning a way to combat the growing problem of antibiotic resistance.

Now, as president of the Pre-Pharmacy Society and after months of planning, Gums finally has the manpower and resources to put his plan into action.

However, his plan doesn't involve expensive, high-tech equipment. It doesn't even require a lab.

What it does need is a classroom full of eager fourth and fifth graders.

On Oct. 29, Gums, along with members of the Pre-Pharmacy Society, began visiting schools in Alachua County as part of an educational program called Antibiotics & You geared toward children.

While an exact date is not set, more presentations are planned for the future.

"These kids are smart," Gums said. "They know there is an issue, and they're going to be able to look out for it. We just want them to know what's going on."

The goals of the presentations

are to teach elementary and middle-school students the differences between a viral and bacterial infection, explain antibiotic resistance and inform them of how to protect against infection.

"That's where the most antibiotic resistance is — in children," Gums said. "We want to let them know that we want to try and protect the future, if that is at all possible."

The packets the club will use for the presentations come from the Michigan Antibiotic Resistance Reduction Coalition, a nonprofit coalition comprised of professional and community organizations concerned with the misuse and overuse of antibiotics.

To make the information more fun for the kids, the club has prepared songs, skits, games and hands-on activities to complement the packets and slides that are shown on a projector.

A pamphlet handed out to the kids has a word search, a rhyming song and a character called the Resistance Ranger.

One activity involves popping a balloon filled with glow-in-the-dark liquid to demonstrate the germ-spreading power of a sneeze, Gums said.

"Anything that makes the principle behind the project obvious to the kids, the more hands-on, the more you can get the kids doing and

interacting, the more they are going to learn about that experience," said Marilyn Waylen, a fifth-grade teacher at Brentwood Elementary School who hosted the first presentation.

Waylen, who once taught Gums when he was in elementary school, said it is rewarding to see one of her students giving back to the community and thinks Gums will inspire her students.

"It's a wonderful opportunity we have with the University of Florida," Waylen said. "The kids are just wowed by all [of it]. The idea that there are real-life things you can do with science and become something inside a field is hugely important to them."

While the club wants the kids to have fun during the presentations, the increase in antibiotic resistance is a serious problem in the medical community, Gums said.

Because bacteria are constantly evolving, pharmaceuticals have to develop new antibiotics to combat illnesses that were once easy to treat, such as a staph infection, Gums said.

Bacteria that survive antibiotics go on to reproduce more resistant bacteria, he said.

The problem is that the pharmaceuticals are not keeping up with the advancing bacteria.

Since bacteria can evolve, the antibiotics that fight them have a shelf life, Gums said.

Educating children and parents about the differences between viral and bacterial infections can help curb antibiotic resistance by helping to eliminate patient peer-pressure, Gums said.

Patient peer-pressure occurs when patients go to the doctor expecting medication, he said.

"They want to go in there and get a drug and come out because they think that is what will fix them," Gums said.

However, according to the informational packet, if a patient has a viral infection, an antibiotic will not

help them because antibiotics can treat only bacterial infections.

But because the patient has taken time out of his or her day to visit the doctor and is paying for the visit, the doctor is pressured to give the patient medication without testing to see whether he or she has a bacterial infection.

Gums said he would eventually like to see the program spread to other colleges in Florida. When the club has visited all the middle and elementary schools, he said the society may begin visiting high schools as well.

"I want to impact the community and members as positively as I can," Gums said.

## Bacteria Bits

-  Food-producing animals that are given antibiotics eventually make human sicknesses harder to treat.
-  If antibiotic continues to proliferate, bacterial diseases that were once treatable may become untreatable again.
-  About 70 percent of bacteria that cause infections in hospitals are resistant to at least one of the drugs most commonly used to treat infections.
-  Some research has shown that antibiotics are given to patients more often than guidelines set by federal and other health care organizations recommend.

# Sorority leads 'green' efforts

# Hazing Horrors

Accusations are no joking matter

Your daily fun fact: In Florida, hazing is a third-degree felony if it results in serious injury or death. The "anti-hazing law" was passed in 2005, after lawmakers pushed for legislation following the death of a University of Miami student in 2001.

Why are we raising this point? Because the UF chapter of Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity was suspended after — you guessed it — hazing accusations.

A letter from Chris Loschiavo, director of Student Judicial Affairs, said the fraternity is suspended until further notice while allegations of hazing are investigated. ATO has been accused of forcing new members to clean rooms in the fraternity's house and serve as designated drivers at all times, including the middle of the night. ATO has also been accused of depriving new members of sleep.

Sleep deprivation, as college students know, has many adverse effects, including increased anxiety, delayed reaction time and sometimes even death. It is also considered a form of torture, according to the American Psychological Association.

These hazing allegations go against not only Florida law, but also the UF Student Conduct Code and the Office of Sorority and Fraternity Affairs' anti-hazing contract. Part of the contract is lifted straight from the Florida law, which specifically addresses sleep deprivation. "House clean-ups" are also a violation of the contract.

This is not just a UF issue. This is not just a moral issue. This is a legal issue.

Hazing is never acceptable, especially from people in organizations who try to portray themselves as leaders on campus and in the community. We're not so gullible as to believe ATO is the only group that might be hazing its members, but it is the group under investigation. If the allegations are true, any members found guilty of participating should be punished not only by UF but also by the state. The only way to deter future hazing is to make the punishment harsh enough.

Hazing should never be taken lightly. It should be completely unacceptable to the Greek community — not just on the surface in anti-hazing contracts, but in the halls of the houses, too.

## Accent Accolades



**Sport and fitness classes shouldn't be cut**



# Homeless people converge on plaza for 'night out'

■ WARM DINNERS AND CLOTHING WERE GIVEN OUT.

Bikes and backpacks scattered Downtown Community Plaza as people gathered around benches, eating meals of chicken and green beans.

Meanwhile, children played tag and dogs pulled on their leashes as the sun set. The temperature slowly dropped.

Gainesville's "Homeless Night Out and Service Fair" on Wednesday bustled with people looking for warm dinners, hand-me-downs, blankets or sound advice.

More than 30 service providers set up under white tents and formed an arc around the plaza.

Donated coats and shirts were given out to the homeless.

Donna Summerall, a local homeless woman, picked out a Gators shirt from the heap, saying that good things come to those who wait.

She said her monthly social security check pays for food stamps, medical bills and clothing.

Over the past 20 years, she has found herself sporadically homeless.

"Until you have to lay on cold concrete in freezing 20- to 30-

degree temperatures, you don't know," Summerall said.

Leonard Nimmons, 58, said he is homeless. He said people who hit brick walls in life tend to start using alcohol and drugs.

"There are only so many things before a guy turns back to crime," he said.

As people lined up for dinner, Nimmons said, "They don't know where their next meal is coming from."

He said homeless people in the plaza watch out for each other.

"Most of the people take care of each other because they're brothers in the fact that they're homeless," Nimmons said.

Ernest Brockington, who sat on the plaza and ate dinner, said he probably would have been homeless if he didn't have relatives and friends who helped.

"I would have been out here walking in the street," Brockington said.

Jim Wright, executive director of the Alachua County Coalition for the Homeless and Hungry, said the night out has evolved into a bigger event the past couple of years.

Maryann Longarzo, a volunteer with the Alachua County Victim Services and Rape Crisis Center, said it's the first time she's been at the service fair.

As a past rape victim, she said

she wanted to help others.

"You have to like people," Longarzo said.

Booths offered anything from free Bibles to shelter information.

Kent Vann, executive director

for St. Francis House, said people are often surprised to see how many services are geared toward the homeless.

"When they think of the homeless, they think of shelter and they don't think of services,"

Vann said.


Brockington said people need to learn to help their neighbors.

"If I were a millionaire, I'd be broke anyway because I would have built a big shelter," Brockington said.

## Tea party celebrates 'Alice'

A smartly dressed white rabbit walked across the Plaza of the Americas and pulled out his gold pocket watch to check the time.

The rabbit, who sported square spectacles and a red polka-dotted necktie, was followed by Alice, who wore a blue-and-white dress trimmed with ruffles.

The famous "Alice in Wonderland" characters paraded on the plaza Wednesday and invited guests to join them for tea to promote "The Afterlife of Alice in Wonderland" exhibit at Smathers Library.

The two characters from Lewis Carroll's children's story were played by John Ingram, interim director of university libraries, and Cari Keebaugh, a UF doctoral candidate, respectively.

The storybook event featured the exhibit, a tea party reception and a performance in Smathers Library.

At the tea party, guests snacked on black-and-white petits fours, iced Danish pastries and cookies.

Guests also drank hot and cold teas as the people playing Alice, the Hatter, the Hare and the Dormouse performed the scene, "A Mad Tea Party" from Chapter 7 of "Alice in Wonderland."

"I love 'Alice in Wonderland' because the whole story is so unpredictable, and every bit of nonsense is fantastically written," Keebaugh said.

A silent auction of 12 posters with illustrations from "Alice" editions dating from 1866

through 1999 was held to benefit the Baldwin Library of Historical Children's Literature at UF.

The library owns 160 different editions of "Alice in Wonderland," making it one of the largest collections of its kind in the country.

Rita Smith, curator of the Baldwin Library, established the exhibit and event to promote the collection of children's literature in the library, which includes early editions of works such as "Pinocchio," "The Secret Garden," "Winnie The Pooh" and "The Wizard of Oz."

The centerpiece of the exhibit was a rare Salvador Dali-illustrated edition of "Alice in Wonderland."

"The story of Alice's fall into the rabbit hole into a place where nothing is quite as it should be is a perfect match for Dali's dreamlike images," Smith said.

The book has not been out of print since its first publication in the 1860s and is often considered to be one of the most significant works of children's literature, said Kenneth Kidd, a UF associate professor and speaker at the event.

"Alice has transcended our society, not just in literature but also in opera, music, symphonies, ballets, film and video games," Kidd said.

The exhibit will last through Dec. 15.

The White House administration said the dismissals were solely based on performance.

Gonzales called the issue “an overblown personnel matter.”

However, some officials have said that the Bush administration was trying to politicize the justice system.

Questions were raised about whether Gonzales testified truthfully about the National Security Agency’s abuse of surveillance programs.

Bush denied the accusations against Gonzales.

Meanwhile, Democrats cheered his resignation.

Bush appointed Peter Keisler as acting attorney gen-

eral Sept. 17.


Gonzales wasn’t the only high-level official to resign during Bush’s second term.

Gale Norton, Bush’s former secretary of the interior, resigned in March 2006. Andrew H. Card Jr., former chief of staff, resigned the same month.

## In a survey, more than half of students polled wanted current system removed

cabinet surveyed 120 students and found most would prefer to order tickets from one Web site and print them from home, Johnson said.

More than half of the students surveyed wanted the current

system for football ticket distribution removed, survey results showed.

For a universal ticketing Web site, Johnson said he’d like to implement a lottery system similar to the one used for football tickets. If students won the lottery, they would be able to log on to the Web site and reserve their

tickets.

Mark Gajda, UAA assistant athletic director for ticket operations, said an online ticketing system would n’t

replace current ticketing distribution but function as a supplement.

### Student Government

Gajda said he hopes the online ticket distribution system will be available within the next two years.

“We’re not looking to do this tomorrow,” Gajda said.

The UAA is looking into online ticketing systems used by other universities, especially in the SEC conference, Gajda said.

Gajda said the UAA has not looked at cost estimates for an online ticketing system.

The idea for an online ticketing distribution site came from requests of UF sports fans.

“It’s not really a criticism,” Gajda said. “It’s simply a request for us to get better, and that’s what we’re looking to do.”

## New-member activities are prohibited

he said.

The fraternity faces no allegations of violence or alcohol violations, Orlando added.

Alpha Tau Omega, known as ATO, is prohibited from all fraternity activities on or off campus until further notice, states a letter to Fletcher Rush, ATO president, from Chris Loschiavo, director of Student Judicial Affairs.

This includes chapter meetings, social events, service projects, philanthropy projects and alumni events, Loschiavo wrote.

Members are allowed to live in the house and eat meals there if they have a meal plan.

However, the only new members who

can be at the house for meals are those who have paid for meal plans, he wrote.

All new-member activities, including initiation events, are prohibited.


Ben Caswell, president of UF’s Interfraternity Council, said the council would likely leave punishment up to UF’s office of Student Judicial Affairs. Caswell declined to comment further.

Wynn Smiley, chief executive officer for ATO’s national office, said, “This has not been an issue that has plagued this chapter by any means of imagination.”

Smiley said ATO would conduct its own investigation and work closely with UF.

It’s too early to speculate about possible punishments, he said.

“The allegations are certainly serious,” Smiley said. “We have no tolerance for hazing, but at this point they’re only allegations.”






## New Jay-Z back to roots

Jay-Z may have left the Brooklyn underworld more than a decade ago to establish himself as one of the most successful figures in the music industry, but that didn't stop him from revisiting his dark past on "American Gangster," his 10th studio album in 12 years.

Inspired by the Ridley Scott film of the same name, Jay-Z weaves tales of a young drug dealer over '70s soul beats to mixed, but mostly positive, results.

It's when "American Gangster" sticks to its theme that Jay-Z is at his best.

The album's sequence follows a dope dealer's genesis ("Pray" and "American Dreamin'"), his peak of success ("Party Life") and inevitable

downfall ("Fallin'").

Unfortunately, songs like "Hello Brooklyn 2.0" and lead single "Blue Magic" share little musically or lyrically with the album's theme and dampen the overall concept. "Hello Brooklyn 2.0," featuring the grossly overrated Lil Wayne, is a sloppy and sparse ode to Jay-Z's hometown.

"American Gangster" mostly shines, though. The Nas-assisted "Success" is a gritty anthem chronicling the cocky climax of a crime lord, while the celebratory horn-driven "Roc Boys" is the funkier Jay-Z single in years.

The album may go over the heads of younger hip-hop fans, but longtime fans seeking a return to "Reasonable Doubt"-era Jay-Z will appreciate the mature themes and sheer musicality of "American Gangster."



## Chuck/Larry gives few laughs

After my first viewing of the trailer for "I Now Pronounce You Chuck and Larry," with its rampant homophobia and the sheer presence of Adam Sandler ("Punch Drunk Love" notwithstanding), I knew I was going to hate it and write a scathing review.

Much to my surprise, the movie, which came out to rent or own Tuesday, was not as bad as I expected. But not surprisingly, it wasn't particularly good, either.

"Chuck and Larry" tells the story of Larry, a widower who marries his best friend and fellow New York City firefighter, Chuck, in order to be able to transfer his pension to his kids if he dies in the line of duty. The two struggle with their homophobia as they try to fool everyone into thinking they're gay.


What starts out as your typical story of feigning homosexuality for the sake of insurance fraud soon turns into a story of friendship and acceptance, albeit with as few laughs as possible.

Adam Sandler as an "actor" hardly

works in roles where he's not playing a degenerate man-child. Consequently, when playing ladies' man/firefighter Chuck, he comes off like a punk kid who's pretending to be serious in front of the principal.

Kevin James, on the other hand, fares better as Larry, having had loads of practice playing a fairly normal guy on his sitcom, "King of Queens." He comes far closer to being sympathetic and likeable than his counterpart.

The worst part of "Chuck and Larry" is the lack of humor. Somehow, the small roles and cameos from other (mostly comedic) actors end up being funnier than the two stars themselves. When a David Spade cameo is funnier than the two stars of the entire movie, you're in trouble.

# Johnny Cash's former touring duo plays his hits tonight

Talking to Bob Wootton is almost like communicating with a ghost.

His deep voice and slow country drawl are eerily similar to the legendary Johnny Cash.

But, Wootton, the guitarist for Cash from 1968 until Cash's retirement in 1997, is very much alive.

He, along with original drummer W.S. Holland, is touring the world playing Cash songs under the name the Tennessee Three, which is playing at Common Grounds tonight.

Wootton, born and raised in the hills of Arkansas, began playing music when his father taught him how to play guitar.

As Wootton progressed, he discovered his voice was lower than most children's around him, and ... began emulating musicians with a lower register, such as Tennessee Ernie Ford and Ernest Tubbs.

His greatest breakthrough as a musician came when he was about 12, practicing on his back porch.

"My mother called me in one day and said, 'You know, there's someone on the radio that sounds a little bit like you do,'" Wootton said. "And it was John doing 'I Walk the Line,' and I just fell in love with the song and have been a fan ever since."

When he got older, he started a band, naturally playing "some of John's stuff." Wootton played bars, clubs and rodeos throughout the Midwest, which is just what he was doing when Cash happened to stop in Arkansas on tour in 1968.

Cash's lead guitarist, Luther Perkins, had died recently, and the replacement guitarist had missed his flight to the show in Arkansas.

"This girl I was with went to ask June [Carter] and said, 'I know somebody that can play John's songs if you want somebody to play for him tonight,'" Wootton said. "And John came off and handed me his guitar and told me to tune it. He told me what song he was going to

do. I didn't ask what key it was in — I just kicked the song off, and it just floored him."

At the time, Cash was seriously considering quitting or having to change his style because no one could play like Perkins, Wootton said.

"But evidently, I did," he said.

He joined the band, which Cash called the Tennessee Three, at a seminal time in Cash's career when he was kicking his addiction to amphetamines.

When Cash married Carter, she would watch over him and flush any pills down the toilet if she found them, Wootton said.

"She straightened him out enough," he said.

Wootton not only witnessed Cash's redemption of character, but

the rebirth of his career as well.

Wootton joined the band just in time to play the string of prison shows, including San Quentin State Prison in California.

"The first prison I played with him after I came to work with him was the Tennessee State Prison, and it didn't seem like that big a deal,"

he said. "But when we went to San Quentin, they shut those big ol' iron gates behind you — it makes the hair stand up on the back of your neck a little bit.

You gotta think, 'Boy, what if they can't get the gate open?'"

Wootton continued to record and perform with the band until Cash went into semi-retirement in 1997. When Cash died in 2003, the Tennessee Three had a new purpose.

"So many people die," Wootton

said. "One of my favorites was Marty Roberts. You never hear of him anymore, and I didn't want that to happen to John."

Wootton and Holland, the only two of the original Tennessee Three, now tour the world playing the songs they played with the Man in Black.

Wootton said many people are amazed that his voice is so similar to Cash's.

"We're both from Arkansas, we're both Cherokee Indian, and we just had this parallel life together — we're like brothers," he said. "But like I say, we just do what we did when we played for John. It's the same music."

Wootton said he's flabbergasted by the response people have to the band, which is selling out shows almost everywhere it goes, he said.

But Wootton doesn't take credit for the success or the cheers.

"Sometimes I feel like he's standing on the stage with me," he said.

# Professional recording can be expensive for local bands

Recording and releasing albums is no longer just for bigwigs in the music industry. Gainesville bands are also heading to the studios in order to give fans souvenirs, to get their songs heard and of course, to make some extra money.

But the cost of a recording session, master compact disc and the art and graphics that make it look legitimate come with a big price tag.

At Skylab Studios, a recording

studio that has been in Gainesville for about 16 years, it could cost a band more than \$5,000 just to reserve studio time to record and use the equipment.

Once the studio fee is paid for, CDs, which usually cost around \$2 per disc, must be ordered. The average local band that records at Skylab will order anywhere from 500 to 1,000 CDs, said Gerry King, owner and chief engineer at Skylab Studios.

"A band could have to sell 20,000 to 30,000 CDs just to make a profit,"

King said.

Michael Pedron, bassist for local funk band Umoja Orchestra, said the band professionally recorded their first studio album last year.

But for practice, the band uses Pro Tools, a popular at-home digital audio workstation that provides CD-quality production. Pedron said it was their "big buy," setting them back

about \$1,000.

Sweet City Action, another local band, finished recording its first studio album Oct. 1 with Goldentone Records, another label located in Gainesville.

Hunter Stanford, the band's guitarist, estimated the entire project cost the band about \$1,400.

From entrance fees, T-shirt sales

and selling CDs, Umoja Orchestra made back all the money it spent on album production on the night of its CD release party.

"When someone buys a CD, they are essentially paying us back for five CDs," Pedron said.

But there are a lot of perks to a band having its own CD that matter more than the money.

"I'm not too worried about making the money back," Stanford said. "It was a lot of fun to do, and now we have something to show people. It all comes back around."

## Butler follows in mentor's footsteps

Their relationship has changed many times over.

Coach and player. Co-workers. Friends.

One spent 12 years as the UF women's basketball coach, stepping down in March 2002 with the most wins in program history.

The other played on some of those teams that put the Gators on the map.

Though their relationship is ever-changing, Carol Ross and Amanda Butler will always share a bond tied to UF.

### Rookies Together

The pair both first arrived in Gainesville in 1990, Ross' first season as UF's coach and Butler's freshman year at point guard.

Butler quickly impressed Ross with the way she carried herself.

"You could tell immediately that she had an aura, a presence, a command," Ross said. "Had I not known...that she was a freshman, I probably would've thought she was a senior captain."

Butler would start at point guard for the next four years, making an immediate impact, finishing third in assists in the Southeastern Conference her freshman year.

"You always hope your point guard is going to be an extension of your personality and your philosophy, and we are a lot alike," Ross said. "We expect good things to happen."

The 5-foot-8 guard learned toughness from her coach, who stressed there was no justification for sitting out a game.

"Injuries were, to me, not a factor," Butler said. "If I was conscious and could still walk around, I didn't see any reason why I shouldn't be able to play."

That mentality would be tested during her junior year, when she broke her nose in practice, just before a game against Florida State.

The face mask Butler was supposed to wear did not arrive in time.

She reluctantly agreed to Ross' recommendation that she sit the first half and see how the game progressed.

"At halftime, I was walking to the locker room, and I was looking at her and she was looking at me," Butler said. "She goes, 'Well you ready to go

in?' and I said, 'Well yeah.'"

The possibility of further injury didn't limit her aggressive style of play.

"She took charges, she drove to the rim," Ross said. "She played the same fearless way she's always played."

The Gators defeated the Seminoles, and four days later, Butler would become the first collegiate women's basketball player to wear the Bill Laimbeer-style face mask in a game against South Carolina.

While her toughness was never in question, her future profession wasn't as easily determined.

Butler considered becoming a physical therapist or even possibly attending law school.

Ross knew differently.

"I could always tell which ones were going to coach before they could," Ross said. "And she goes, 'No, no, I'm going to be a physical therapist,' and I said, 'No, you'll be a coach.'"

Her interactions with her teammates generated nothing but mutual respect.

"She had a magnetic personality — her teammates gravitated to her," Ross said. "She had their respect not by what she said but by example."

That leadership capability paid off as Butler brought out the best in her teammates.

It was under her floor leadership that the Gators made the NCAA Tournament in 1993 and 1994, the program's first-ever appearances.

"She could get other people to do what she needed them to do," Ross said. "That's what coaching is. If you can do that as a teammate, as a player, with your peers, you've got head coach written all over you. It's just when and where."

### Quick Transition

When Butler graduated, Ross hired her as an assistant coach. It was a rare occurrence for Ross, who couldn't recall another time she had ever asked a player to immediately join her staff.

"I didn't want to hire my own players because then you had to pick and choose, and I felt like they would grow if they went away," Ross said. "She was just so good and so talented, and I wanted her to be in the coaching profession. I thought she had a great gift. I thought it would be a win-win. I knew she would help us, and I thought we could

## UF revisits Moss' block

Of all the great plays that led to UF's national championship win against No. 1 Ohio State last year, the greatest came two months before that game was even played.

Before defensive end Jarvis Moss' fingers were covered in championship rings, they made one of the most critical plays in Gators history.

In UF's final regular-season Southeastern Conference game, Moss blocked South Carolina kicker Ryan Succop's 48-yard field goal attempt as time expired to seal a 17-16 win and send the Gators toward Glendale.


"That was the biggest play," said defensive end Derrick Harvey, who was clearing space for Moss to jump on the final play. "That's what got us to the national championship."

What made the feat even more improbable was that the Gators had already blocked two kicks in the game. Moss had rejected a fourth-quarter extra point, and earlier Ray McDonald had got a hand on a third-quarter attempt from 47 yards.

"I had never had a kick blocked before that game, so that was a tough thing," Succop said. "Jarvis Moss just made a heck of a play. There's not too much you can do about that."

Had Succop's kick been good, the Gators still would have traveled to the SEC

## Gators blank UK, advance to face LSU

"It was really important," said Coach Becky Burleigh of scoring the first goal. "Every other game we've played against Kentucky has been a struggle, so for us to go in there and get an early goal set a great tone."

"Kentucky generally has a very strong defense, and for us to come in and play that well is great."

The Gators defense held strong, recording its 13th shutout of the season and ninth in 10 matches. UF outshot the Wildcats 11-0 in the half and kept them from establishing a rhythm on offense. The defensive dominance continued, as the Wildcats were limited to just one shot in the second half.

"I thought our team did a good job of playing with confidence," Burleigh said. "We played strong, aggressive defense, and we were able to keep them from getting the ball in position to score the ball."

Keleigh Hudson scored the second

help her."

Butler remains thankful for that first opportunity.

"There's no question that she has been the most prevalent influence on my coaching career," she said. "Besides me playing for her, she gave me my first opportunity. That's something I think you never take lightly professionally — someone who takes a chance on you, and she did that with me. She opened the door to coaching for me."

Butler spent two seasons on staff, then left to become an assistant coach at Austin Peay State for four years.

A six-year stint followed at North Carolina-Charlotte.

After two years as an assistant coach and two years as associate head coach, Butler earned the top job in 2005 when previous head coach Katie Meier left.

In her first season at the helm, she led the 49ers to a share of the Atlantic-10 regular-season title and a berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. She was named A-10 Coach of the Year. A second WNIT berth followed the next season.

Butler and Ross stayed in close contact throughout the years, as Butler often turned to her former coach for advice.

"She's just rarely wrong," Butler said. "When someone's rarely wrong, you need to keep going back to the well to get those answers."

Then, this past April an offer came that Butler could have never imagined.

"I realized as I'm sitting in (UF Athletics Director) Jeremy (Foley's) office that I was

going to be the next coach here," she said.

### Reunited Again

Now Butler's back in the town where she got her start as a player, and she brought back — if only for a moment — the coach who gave her the opportunity.

Ross came to Gainesville the last weekend in October as a team consultant to spend a few days observing practice and offer tips to both coaches and players.

The new coach enjoyed introducing her players to her old coach and mentor.

"She put UF as a women's basketball program on the map," Butler said. "It's important for them to know. I think that having a sense of history is very important."

Ross expects similar success during Butler's tenure, since her former player never fears a challenge, whether it's playing with a broken nose or winning a recruit.

"It's not a surprise that in our first trip to the NCAA tournament that she would be in a uniform," Ross said. "It won't be a surprise to me when this team gets to a Final Four at some point and she's going to be the head coach in charge. She's not scared of what has not been done."

Butler knows she wouldn't be the person and coach she is today without Ross' guidance.

"Her success is undeniable," Butler said. "I just feel very fortunate to have her as a person in my life, professionally as a resource and personally as a friend."

Now Ross gets to sit back and watch as her former player works to bring her alma mater back to relevancy.

"When you coach, you always want your players to dream big and then to be able to live it," Ross said. "To sit and watch knowing that she's the head coach at UF, I still see an 18-year-old kid who loved every moment of being a Florida Gator. She knew what it meant to have Florida strapped across her chest competing. She's living her dream."

championship game, but any hopes of a national title would have been dashed.

"That was a great day in Florida football history," Coach Urban Meyer said. "It propelled us to Glendale, Arizona. The SEC East was already won, but that got us a chance to keep going on the national level."

A loss to former UF coach Steve Spurrier would have altered the perception of Meyer as well.

Meyer was hailed as one of the top college football coaches after he finished his second year in Gainesville with a perfect home record and a national title — two things that would never have happened without the block.

Succop had only missed one kick prior to the game, a 51-yarder that hit the upright in the Gamecocks' second game of the year. When the reliable kicker lined up for his attempt in The Swamp,

the entire stadium was on edge, except for a few players.

"We already knew he was going to block it," Harvey said. "We just had to get a push, and he was going to get up and block it. ... That's what first-round picks do."

Succop was convinced his kick was headed through the uprights until Moss' left hand got in the way.

"When I hit it, it felt great," Succop said. "I was just real excited because I thought it was going in, and when he got a finger on it, it was pretty disappointing."

UF quarterback Tim Tebow hopes the kick was heading awry anyway, but he's fully appreciative of Moss' impact.

"Hopefully it would've gone wide left, but that was a pretty good field-goal kicker, so he might've made it," Tebow said. "The season would've been a lot different."
