



Trustees debate extra fees

Bleak budgetary times have become the norm for UF, and new financial solutions could mean out-of-pocket fees for students.

At committee meetings of UF's Board of Trustees on Thursday afternoon, trustees presented a plan to charge several extra fees for students.

The fees will not be included in tuition or covered by Bright Futures, a Legislature-funded program that pays for either 75 percent or 100 percent of tuition.

Under UF statutes, UF has always been allowed to charge the fees, but officials are still negotiating the details, UF Provost Janie Fouke said.

Students could now be charged \$10 to obtain a transcript copy starting in February 2008. But extra costs for UF students might not stop there.

A \$2-per-credit Distance Learning fee could be charged for students who take online classes.


The fee would also apply to any classes that use the e-Learning online system, even if the class takes place in a campus lecture hall.

Student Body President Ryan Moseley, also a UF trustee, said the fee wasn't fair in light of a newly approved 5 percent technology fee, which will be charged starting next fall.

Many classes are too large to offer anything but online sections, and students shouldn't be penalized, Moseley said. Other trustees agreed.

"If we're doing a lot of online classes because we don't have enough faculty, it's like double jeopardy," Mac McGriff, another trustee, said.

An equipment fee, used for upkeep like repairing science labs or tuning pianos for music class,

Gainesville to update traffic-light system

For anyone who's ever prayed for the light to change more quickly at 34th Street and Archer Road — your prayers may be answered.

The Florida Department of Transportation is putting up \$9.1 million to match funds from Gainesville, Alachua County and UF for an \$18.2 million project updating the timing of the traffic-light system.

The project will update every traffic light in the county in four phases, starting with the most congested areas.

The first phase should be completed by July 2008, and the entire project should be finished by 2012.

Around Gainesville The first phase will include Archer Road between 34th Street and Interstate 75 and portions of 34th Street, 13th Street, Newberry Road and University Avenue.

Gainesville, which controls all the traffic signals in Alachua County, will be heading the project and contributing up to \$5 million. Alachua County will spend \$2 million on the project, and UF will spend \$3.8 million.

Phil Mann, Gainesville Traffic Operations division manager, said the next phase will cover intersections expected to face bad congestion by 2025. Phases three and four will cover the rest of the traffic lights in the county.

"We're addressing what's bad today, then what's projected to be bad," he said.

Gina Hawkins, Gainesville Public Works Department spokeswoman, said Gainesville and Alachua County's traffic lights currently run on an MS-DOS system. The project will make them Windows-based.

"It means we're going from the 20th century to the 21st," she said.

The new system will allow emergency vehicles to change the light's color at any intersection, which is currently only possible at some, she said.

The project will also install cameras along major intersections so engineers can study traffic flow and create a Traffic Management Center to house the new system, she said.

The Traffic Management Center will be adjacent to the public works center at 403 NW 39th

through the Board of Trustees, then the Florida Legislature and then, possibly, the Florida Board of Governors before it is enacted.

Kelly Moosbrugger, an intern at UF's

Office of Sustainability, is spearheading efforts to get the fee enacted with Gators for a Sustainable Campus.

She is sending out a survey in the next few weeks to see how students would be most interested in using the money.

She said she hopes to present the fee at a Board of Trustees meeting early next spring.

Although the administration approved the fee, administrators want to make sure they know exactly how they will use the fee before they present it to

Toys for Tots is a Marine Corps organization that collects new, unwrapped gifts for underprivileged children each year.


Camp Kesem is a student-run summer camp for children whose parents have or have had cancer.


Based on the results of a Harris Poll of 1,052 U.S. adults surveyed by telephone between Oct. 16 and Oct. 23.

Electronics stolen from campus dorm

The University Police Department is investigating three burglary calls in a UF residence hall.

A news release stated that all three incidents occurred on the second floor of Trusler Hall between 2 p.m. and 3 p.m. Wednesday.

The incidents are being handled as related cases, the report stated.

Laptops and iPods were stolen from the three rooms, the report stated.

In one room a laptop had its wires disconnected but was not taken because it was locked to the desk.

UPD spokesman Capt. Jeff Holcomb said it appears burglars checked each room to find unlocked ones because there was no forced entry.

The release stated there are two possible suspects believed to be college aged that were viewed on a Web cam by one of the laptops.

The first is a Hispanic male, about 5 feet 8 inches tall, wearing a dark colored shirt with "scruffy facial hair," the report stated. The other suspect is a black male wearing a white "hoody" with blue jeans.

Holcomb advised students to keep their doors locked to make sure this doesn't happen to them. He also said they should consider buying security cables for their laptops.

UF-developed steak grows popular

A steak developed at UF has become one of the most popular steaks in the nation.

Working with the National Cattlemen's Beef Association and the University of Nebraska, UF science researchers led a study to help evaluate undervalued portions of beef. The result was the flat iron: a new, inexpensive and fairly lean cut of steak.

The steak's sales almost doubled from 2005 to 2006, from 47 million pounds to about 92 million pounds per year, stated statistics compiled by Technomic Inc., a Chicago-based research firm. The steak has become the fifth most popular in the U.S.

Dwain Johnson, a meat science professor with UF's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, led the study in 1999 that produced the flat iron.

Johnson said some people even prefer the flat iron to the more expensive rib eye or New York strip steaks.

He classified the flat iron as "a diamond in the rough."

The study was triggered by declining sales of cuts of shoulder beef, known as the chuck.

"The cuts from the round and chuck had really fallen off and declined pretty significantly," Johnson said. "And that's over two-thirds of the carcass."

Johnson added that the meat from this area is traditionally cheaper and used to make ground beef or pot roast.

Johnson's study identified several muscles in these underused areas and determined which would be most appealing as a steak.

Johnson's team found the flat iron to be one of the tastiest, most tender and leanest cuts of steak.

The team developed a simple method for removing an undesirable area of tough tissue that runs through the cut. This method led to the mass production of the flat iron steak.

Johnson categorized the flat iron as not as fatty or expensive as a rib eye, but not so lean as tenderloin.

The tests to determine the quality of a piece of steak are extensive and intense, Johnson said.

When developing the flat iron, investigators were trained to rate steak on such qualities as juiciness, beef-flavor intensity and overall tenderness.

Johnson said the testers, many of whom were graduate students, tested

about 900 different steaks over the course of a year.

The success of the flat iron is a win-win situation for both the consumer and the cattle industry, Johnson said.

While cattle farmers are making money selling the shoulder cut for more, consumers save money by buying a quality steak for less than high-end rib eye or New York strip.

Johnson said that the flat iron steak is well suited for college students. The steak costs about \$6 per pound in Gainesville.

Johnson also said several restaurant chains, such as T.G.I. Friday's, have featured the flat iron on the menu.

In 1999, UF researchers helped pioneer a new cut of steak, and its popularity has quickly gone through the roof.




He's not lonely — he just wants to hear about your problems

Sitting across from an empty lawn chair, Michael Berry waits for someone, anyone, to talk to.

Since the beginning of October, Berry, a mechanical engineering junior at UF, has been sitting on the Plaza of Americas with a poster board with big black letters that reads, "My name is Mike. I want to sit and talk about life."

Berry isn't lonely. He wants to help.

"I just sit, put up my sign and wait for people to come and talk to me about life or anything they want," he said.

His goal, on the Tuesdays and Thursdays he sits on the plaza, is to talk about things that matter, such as family issues and everyday frustrations.

Berry began his peer-to-peer counseling when he noticed Christian preachers in Turlington trying to show students that God can help them through their struggles.

He said that Turlington preachers "talk to people," but his goal is "to talk to people and listen."

One of his hopes is that when people sit in the chair next to him and talk, they feel they can be real with him, he said.

Berry said he's found that many people are open and philosophical.

Passers-by often stop to vent to him, he said.

Berry remembered a girl walking briskly by who stopped, threw her hands in the air and screamed, "I just failed my calculus exam!"

She sat down for a few minutes and talked about her classes while he just listened, and then she thanked him for letting her vent.

"For some people, it's just a release to get things out," Berry said.

While his intent was to help others, Berry said he's also gained from the experience by learning through differences and opinions of others.

He is willing to talk about anything, but Berry is not a licensed counselor. He doesn't

promise to be the best but will certainly sit and listen, he said.

Shari Robinson, a licensed mental health counselor at UF's Counseling Center, said many people alleviate stress by expressing themselves emotionally and verbally.

"It can be very therapeutic to talk to someone who isn't in a person's inner circle because the person doesn't feel judged," Robinson said.



Berry knows when a problem is beyond his abilities. Although he hasn't been approached with severe issues, such as suicidal thoughts or an eating disorder, he said he would advise people with those kinds of problems to contact one of UF's mental health facilities.

Dominique LeCao, a UF criminology junior, has seen Berry talking to other students. LeCao hasn't had the chance to talk to him yet but said he has thought about it.

LeCao says he's not sure if he would go completely in-depth with Berry about his personal issues but is considering it because of the different perspective it could provide.

"I would talk to him because strangers have a whole different point of view of things that are going on," he said.

Former slave discusses experiences in Hillel speech

Courage, hope and faith.

These are values that abolitionist and former slave Beatrice Fernando spoke about at Hillel at UF on Thursday night.

Fernando was tricked into slavery in 1980 through an agency that claimed it would get her work as a housekeeper.

She grew up poor. She lived with her family in Sri Lanka in a home the size of a bedroom.

"That night I found the courage within me to do whatever I had to do to get out of there. It was up to me to survive."

The walls were made of strips of fabric, and the roof was made of coconut husks her mother put together.

The only thing that was solid was the cement floor, she said.

She only completed 12th grade because she said she was in a hurry to grow up.

"My mother said education was the only way to get out of poverty," Fernando said. "But did I listen? No."

At 23, she was still living at home and now had to take care of her son. Her husband left shortly after he was born.

In order to support her son and her parents, she decided she should find a job.

She found an agency in Lebanon that said it would get her a job as a housekeeper.

She was required to work for two years in Lebanon and then would return home with "a bag full of money," she said.

She ended up being selected to work for a woman who she said gave her a bad feeling. She begged her agent to let her work for someone else, but he told her the woman was very rich and she was lucky.

She worked hard as a housekeeper. At first, she was fed table scraps, but then she was fed nothing at all.

"After the family was asleep, I would go through the trash and eat that," Fernando said.

She was beaten every day. Her head was repeatedly slammed into the wall. She was beaten so badly she lost consciousness.

"I woke up in a pool of my own blood," she said. "That night I found the courage within me to do whatever I had to do to get out of there. It was up to me to survive."

She decided to either escape or die trying. She launched herself off the fourth floor balcony and 21 days later woke up

from a coma, paralyzed.

Three years later she was able to walk and came to America. She said it is up to college students to help eliminate slavery

by standing up against it.

"This is our country," she said. "These are our children. You are the future. You take the stand and say no."


Beatrice Fernando, originally from Sri Lanka, speaks about her experience as a slave in Lebanon.

the Board of Trustees.

"The students want to do this to improve the environment at UF and to make a statement of its importance," said UF President Bernie Machen. "If it comes to me with their support, I will endorse it."

After the students voted in favor of the fee last spring, it was taken to the Student Senate, which passed a resolution in support of the fee this semester.

Ryan Moseley, Student Body president and a member of the Board of Trustees, said the road to getting the fee enacted will be a long one.

While waiting for the fee to make its way up the chain of command, SG is not "sitting on their laurels," he said.

The university has already contracted with RTS to get buses to switch to biodiesel fuel, which will start the next school year, Moseley said.

They have discussed putting solar panels up to light the various fields on campus, he said.

After students vote through the survey on the best uses of the money, Moosbrugger said they will go back to the administration with the results.

"They want to make sure we have everything covered," she said. "That's why we're doing the survey. That's why we did the forum. All these things are really helpful."

Moosbrugger said they want to see how students think the money from the fee could best be used. There are five areas on the survey that students can vote for.


The first area it could be used for is solar technology.

With solar technology, the university could thermally heat its water, use solar panels on the roofs of buildings to generate heat or use solar panels on the parking garages and fields to provide energy for lighting.

The money can also be used to convert waste to energy.

Ann Wilkie, an associate professor in the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences, is working with an anaerobic digester — a living organism which digests material — to turn sludge and trash on campus into methane gas, which can be converted into electricity.

Retrofitting the buildings, changing out old windows, lighting and air conditioning units to make them more efficient, is another option.

Moosbrugger said the fee could also be used to increase biodiesel production on campus.

The final use of the money could be to simply purchase renewable energy from Progress Energy, which provides the campus with energy.

In October, Moosbrugger met with other schools in the state to help universities to become more environmentally friendly.

She said UF is ahead of most schools, which are still getting petitions signed by students.

UF needed 500 students to sign a pe-

tion to get the fee on the SG electoral ballot in spring, whereas the University of Central Florida needs 5,000 signatures before it can move forward.

Still, it is farther behind other schools in the nation that have already successfully adopted and implemented renewable energy fees of their own.

In 2004, 82 percent of Harvard University students voted in favor of a \$10-per-student-per-term tuition increase that would pay for wind power, stated the Harvard Crimson, the student paper.

In 2005, the Board of Trustees at Western Washington University voted in favor of a student fee allowing its university to purchase energy from renewable sources.

That fee called for a \$19-per-student-per-quarter tuition increase and was approved by almost 85 percent of students, stated an article from Western Washington University's University Communications.


Meanwhile, Moseley said UF is continuing to develop its resources.

"Any time you try to enact a fee in the state of Florida, especially with this conservative government, you have to be patient," Moseley said.

A UF renewable-energy survey will ask students where money from a fee should go toward.

Trustee: Federal gov't. an untapped resource

could also be charged, Fouke said.

The fee's cost will be determined by the cost of the needed equipment. But fees aren't the only way to reach financial recovery.

Carlos Alfonso, a trustee and chairman of the External Relations Committee, said UF has always utilized the federal government for funds when available. He said he still considers it an untapped resource.

In an interview after the meeting, Alfonso said UF brought in about \$450 million from the federal government last year, a sum that has increased steadily each year, and he said there's still room for improvement.

"We're successful at bringing in a lot of money, but we're successful in spending a lot of money, too," he said.

Alfonso said UF is "way too dependent on the state," which has its own financial troubles.

Jane Adams, UF's vice president of university relations, told trustees the Florida Legislature expects a \$1 billion shortfall this year and a \$1.5 billion shortfall in 2008-2009.

UF's share of this year's \$1 billion Legislature cut was \$22.1 million. In addition to the cut state funds, UF decided to cut nearly \$12 million more to set aside funds for other programs, bringing the total cuts to about \$34 million.

UF created Cost Reduction and Efficiency Task Force to find ways to trim expenditures and bring in extra revenue.

In a report to the Committee on Resources, Kyle Cavanaugh, UF's senior vice president for administration, presented the task force's initial recommendations, which could earn as much as \$4 million a year and save about \$2.5 million annually.

The task force also had suggestions for one-time savings of \$3 million to \$4 million.

The recommendations include the transcript fee, requiring non-Florida-resident graduate students to become residents, and selling underused UF vehicles.

The ideas could be implemented in a few months.

The committee is also preparing a second set of recommendations, and the total savings from both sets could range from \$12 million to \$20 million over several years, he said.

The second round of proposals included charging UF applicants a fee to review their immunization status and selling the WRUF radio station.

Manny Fernandez, a trustee and chairman of the resources committee, said most of the proposals deal with a small section of UF's \$4.5 billion budget.

"It's a good start, but we need to look at the other \$4 billion, or the whole pie," Fernandez said. "We're picking some of the low-hanging fruit."

Panel discusses Islam

Students and faculty gathered Thursday for a panel discussion about misconceptions of Islam in response to the controversial promotion of a movie about "Radical Islam."

The panel, sponsored by the Council on American-Islamic Relations and Islam On Campus, addressed the controversy that arose when students hung posters advertising the movie, "Obsession: Radical Islam's War Against the West."

Posters promoting the movie, shown on campus Nov. 13, had the phrase "Radical Islam Wants You Dead!"

Matt Klein, a justice on the Student Government Supreme Court, sent out an e-mail before the movie was shown accusing students of removing the fliers and identified them with "Radical Islam." He later apologized when students took offense to the e-mail.

Before the discussion, Yaser Ali, president of Islam On Campus, said the accusations in the movie posters and e-mails used "sensational language" and could threaten students' safety.

"It insinuated that our organization promotes terrorist ideologies or condoned terrorist ideolo-

gies," Ali said. "That couldn't be further from the truth."

Dave Kratzer, associate vice president for student affairs, said the discussion was a small step toward the UF community becoming united.

"I think we have gone through some trauma this past week in which some hurtful things were said," Kratzer said. "This is not about freedom of speech. This is about civility."

Parvez Ahmed, chairman of the Council on American-Islamic Relations Board, said discussion was a positive way to handle the recent negative situation on campus.

Ahmed said that after Sept. 11, U.S. policies have been driven by fear and have created a vicious cycle.

"Part of this cycle are American Muslims, or Muslims in general, whose faith has been blamed for everything," Ahmed said.







Documenting the Documentary

Students trail Mark Lunsford

Boaz Dvir and his partner Rebecca Goldman, both students in The Documentary Institute, are working on finishing up their first documentary.

The film, which also serves as their thesis, follows the life of Mark Lunsford, whose daughter Jessica was abducted on Feb. 23, 2005, and later raped and killed.

Lunsford, who became an activist after his daughter's death,

started a foundation in her name.

Dvir used to live in Homosassa, where Jessica was killed. He was writing a story on Lunsford for the St. Petersburg Times when he was thinking about entering the documentary institute.

"So that idea popped immediately into my head. Wow, this could be a documentary," Dvir said





"The custody exchange is the most anxious activity I do all week," she said.






After switching religions, Abramowich is not on speaking terms with her family, so a normal network of support is missing from her life.

Freshman running back Bo Williams will seek a transfer from the UF football team this week, and backup quarterback Bryan Waggener is also contemplating leaving as well.

"I feel I'm not the best back here in the situation," Williams said. "I'm more comfortable in a power offense."

Because he was redshirted this season, Williams will have four years of eligibility at the school of his choice.

"Once I get my release, I'm going to talk to my family and then take my visits," he said. "Right now I don't have a clue. I'm just taking it slow and focusing on my grades."

Williams attended Oakland Park Northeast High, where he was rated the 19th-best back in the 2007 recruiting class, according to Scout.com.

He thrived as a power runner, which isn't as valued in the Gators' spread offense.

The depth chart at the position looks crowded for next season, with Southern California transfer

Emmanuel Moody, Mon Williams, Kestahn Moore, Brandon James, Markus Manson and Chris Rainey all in the mix.

"I've been doing good for the past five weeks," Bo Williams said. "Urban Meyer pulled me to the side and said I was going to be the guy here, but I want to go back to the old-school power game, where I can touch the ball 20 to 25 times a game."

"There's more people this year, way more," Speights said. "It's going to be real exciting. It's going to feel different, but I just have to go out there and play ball."



Vermont (2-4) may be best known for its upset win against Syracuse in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in 2005. In overtime, the 13th-seeded Vermont team defeated fourth-seeded Syracuse 60-57.

Gators look to improve road record at Louisville

It's only seven games into the season, but a disturbing trend has emerged for the UF women's basketball team.

The Gators (4-3) have a habit of fading down the stretch on the road. UF will look to pick up its first win away from home when it travels to Louisville on Sunday at 2 p.m. after disappointing losses at Nebraska and Jacksonville.

The Cornhuskers thrashed them 90-63 on Nov. 17, and the Dolphins followed it up with an 11-point win

Wednesday.

Players and coaches cited the mental aspect of the game as the culprit for the lack of success on the road.

In both games, the Gators allowed their opponents to go on game-changing runs and seemed helpless to stop them.

Against the Cornhuskers, UF closed the gap to 38-34 early in the second half. But then the Gators allowed Nebraska to score 9 straight points, later followed by a 22-4 run that put the game out of reach.

Jacksonville broke a tie with 6:13 left by pouring in 8 points in a row, and the Gators never recovered

from that run, either.

"We've got to just stay composed when things aren't going our way," senior guard Depree

Bowden said after Wednesday's loss. "That's the biggest part of it."

Bowden, the lone senior on the team, had similar comments after the

Nebraska game.

As of Wednesday night, she had no idea what to do to change things before facing the Cardinals this

weekend.

"I'm not sure," Bowden said. "We've got to figure it out by Sunday. I know that. Louisville is a good team, and we need to figure it out before that."

UF coach Amanda Butler said she hates to use clichés, but she couldn't help but fall back on them to describe her team's mental focus.

"We've just got to be willing to sacrifice, we've got to be willing to play through adversity, we've got to be willing to do what it takes," she said. "It doesn't necessarily have to do with score more points, get more rebounds, make offensive

change. We've got the tools to be a very good ballclub. It's the intangibles that come and go for us right now."

Team works to fill Hampton's role as UF advances

Marcie Hampton stood the entire time.

Despite rupturing her Achilles tendon in Saturday night's match, the senior outside hitter preferred to lean on her crutches rather than sit down during UF's opening-round match of the NCAA Tournament.

The Gators, playing without Hampton for the first time all season, gave her something to cheer about as they defeated College of Charleston 3-0 (30-22, 30-28, 30-14) on Thursday night.

The No. 10 Gators (28-2) move on to the second round of the Tournament, where they

will play No. 23 Oklahoma tonight at 7:00.

Oklahoma defeated Florida A&M 3-1 in the early match Thursday (30-25, 32-30, 29-31, 30-14). UF's match stayed close at first, but the Gators finished strong.

Charleston's season came to an end on an attack error in Game 3.

Every UF player chipped in for Hampton, and the Gators were even wearing Hampton's No. 12 on the tips of their shoes.

Three Gators finished in double-digits for kills.

Seniors Amber McCray and Kisya Killingsworth had 16 and 13 kills, respectively. Freshman outside hitter Callie Rivers turned in a double-double with 18 kills and 11 digs.

"I think that everyone on our team stepped up, because not only one person can fill (Hampton's) shoes," Rivers said.

"Obviously she was a really big part of our team. I think everyone did something extra to make up for her not being there."

Freshman middle blocker Lauren Bledsoe and junior Christina Diaz, rarely used players when Hampton is healthy, saw plenty of time on the court.

Bledsoe had five kills and Diaz added five digs. Even though Hampton was not directly involved in the action, she played a large role in the Gators' victory.

She helped out Bledsoe with strategy and pointed out weaknesses in Charleston's defense, Wise said.

"Marcie Hampton is 24 hours removed from a major surgery, and she's on the bench," UF coach Mary Wise said. "That

tells you a little bit about Marcie and how much she's given to this program and how invested she is in our success."

Game 3 began well for the Gators when they jumped out to a 7-3 edge following a Kelsey Bowers solo block.

Charleston called a timeout to stop the bleeding, but freshman defensive specialist Erin Fleming continued to serve as the Gators scored nine straight points to take the lead to 12-4. It was 19-6 before Charleston decided to use its second timeout, but by then it was already too late.

Charleston played relatively error free in the first two games, and Wise noticed.

"Usually in a 30-point game, you can expect a team is going to give you anywhere between 7 and 10 points in unforced errors," Wise said. "They played very disciplined."
