



# Moseley selects online voting committee

Members of a committee formed to investigate the possibility for online voting in Student

Government elections were chosen last week and should provide recommendations by May 1.

Students for Online Voting, a student group known as SOLVe, filed a lawsuit against UF on Feb. 22 after the UF Supreme

Court ruled that an online-voting amendment would be unconstitutional.

## Student Government

The court said online voting could interfere with SG's ability to prevent

voter coercion.

Ryan Moseley, Student Body president, wrote in an executive order last week that the committee is expected to provide an independent report on the "feasibility" of online voting for SG

elections, specifically concerning security and privacy.

The committee is also charged with looking at how online-voting systems have worked at other

# Students go on hunger strike for investment protest

GROUP WANTS TO UF TO CHANGE INVESTMENT POLICY.


Until they eat with Bernie, they won't eat at all.

Eleven members of a student-protest

group urging UF to make its investments transparent dug into a vegetarian meal they said could be their last of the semester outside Tigert Hall on Wednesday.

The students said they plan to strike, or starve, until UF President Bernie Machen agrees to meet with them over lunch to discuss socially responsible investment plans for UF's \$1.2 billion endowment. The meal Wednesday — steamed cabbage, fried plantains, rice and beans, and

tempeh curry — was eaten after an 11 a.m. news conference outside Tigert, the building that houses Machen's office.





Members of the protest group, Students for a Democratic Society, have been pushing for disclosure of UF's investments for nearly a year. The group wants to create a commit-

tee of students and faculty to advise the Board of Trustees, UF's highest governing body, on socially responsible investing of UF's endowments.

The group's aim is a challenge to UF's current endowment policy, which leaves investment decisions up to UF's Investment Corporation, a non-profit organization exempt from open public-

Specifies of the campus menus for both restaurants are still being worked on, Rodriguez wrote.


She wrote that she didn't know exactly when the dining center would be closed for construction or for how long, but it would remain open the rest of this semester.





# UF sophomore remembered at candlelight vigil

■ CARMEN PETERSON WAS STRUCK BY A VAN WHILE RIDING HER BICYCLE.

Carmen "Cita" Peterson had a passion to explore. When she arrived on campus in 2006, she wanted to see it all: the campus landmarks, the city hot spots, the local charm.

It was all part of her zest for life, said Cory Myers, a UF engineering sophomore who met

Peterson freshman year.

It's one of the qualities Myers said he would miss most about Peterson, who died Tuesday evening after she was hit by a van while riding her bicycle.

"Whenever she was out, she just had a good time," Myers said. "She really did embody living with no regrets."

Peterson was a UF recreation sports and tourism sophomore from Fort Lauderdale. She was one of the first people Myers, of Atlanta, met when he arrived on campus.

"She brought a lot of life to my first days at UF," he said.

After two years of knowing each other, Myers said Peterson's propensity to have fun continued to rub off on him.

He said her enthusiasm for Alpha Phi Omega, a co-ed fraternity of which she was a member, convinced him to pledge.

**Local News** "Cita was passionate about the things that she liked and the things that she did," Myers said. "She sort of showed me what it was like to really mean what you do."

About 100 friends of Peterson's, many of whom are also members of Alpha Phi Omega,

held a candlelit vigil for her Wednesday night at Keys Residential Complex on campus, where Peterson lived.

Peterson's parents and roommate declined to comment.

Charges against Charles Skeen, the 55-year-old driver of the van that hit Peterson, are pending further investigation, according to a report from the Florida Highway Patrol. Peterson was attempting to cross County Road 325 on the Hawthorne Bicycle Trail when she was struck at around 5 p.m.

She was wearing a helmet and died at the scene, according to the report.

# UF entrepreneurs break into the business world early

Andre Smith has a staff of eight, a Samsung BlackJack that constantly rings and the responsibility of handling dollar figures most college students have never imagined.

And he manages everything from his two-bedroom apartment.

In spring 2006, Smith, a fifth-year industrial engineering student, set up Tropical Connection, LLC. He was inspired to start the vacation traveling company after he successfully organized a trip to Jamaica for 20 of his friends.

Smith is a successful college entrepreneur — one in a growing trend of college students across the nation setting up companies.

Instead of waiting for the perfect opportunity, these young entrepreneurs invest a little money on a big idea using the Internet as a launching pad.

Students are starting businesses more often than in the past, said Bill Rossi, associate director of the Center for Entrepreneurship & Innovation at UF.

The Internet has helped college entrepreneurs by making the uptake easier, quicker and cheaper, Rossi said.

Fewer assets means fewer risks, so many students don't want to wait to finish their schooling to launch a business.

"You have very little to lose. Tomorrow it will be more," Rossi said. "The best time to start is now."

### Getting Started

Not many have money to play with in college, but three UF student entrepreneurs borrowed money to transform their concept into a money-making reality.


Smith's initial investment on the travel agency was about \$15,000, mostly contributed by family and friends. The money went to arranging contracts with airlines and hotels.

"I felt pretty overwhelmed," the 22-year-old said. "I'd never written a check for \$10,000 before."

Tyler Callahan, a UF advertising alumnus, and Brett Frierson, a UF management alumnus, became Smith's business partners.

In their first year, the three made enough revenue to expand the travel company, opening up more trip options for customers, he said.

And while Smith sunk more than \$10,000 to get his business running, Nick Moskowicz started an online

humorous T-shirt business with about \$700 from student loans and borrowed money.

In the summer of 2004, Moskowicz, a UF computer engineering student at the time, and a friend, David Baummer, launched ThreadPit.com from their makeshift office in a bedroom.

"We did nothing but eat and sleep ThreadPit," 29-year-old Moskowicz said, reminiscing about his beginnings.

When the business took off that summer, Moskowicz dropped his classes to focus on the Web site full time.

But his business partner, Baummer, left ThreadPit to continue his studies at SFCC.

Almost four years into the business, orders come in from around the world at all times of the day and night, making enough money for him and his wife to live comfortably, he said. Moskowicz is now back at UF studying sociology.

Suzanne Delica aspires to be equally successful as Smith and Moskowicz.

In late January, the UF sophomore introduced an e-business, where she sells high-fashion clothes at affordable prices, named Simply Delicious Fashions.

The trademark is registered un-

der her parents' company, Delica Enterprises Inc.

Now Delica is pursuing her own business with the moral and financial support of her parents. The 20-year-old raised an initial capital of about \$5,000.

She purchases items wholesale in fashion meccas like New York and Miami from designers like BCBG and Michael Antonio to sell on her site.

Though she has yet to see a profit, Delica has big plans and believes it's her mission to bring high fashion to Gainesville. "I really want people to understand what clothing means," she said about her vision for the virtual boutique. "Your clothes shouldn't make you; you should make your clothes."

### Virtually Savvy

Smith, Moskowicz and Delica may have invested in different business ventures, but all three used a college student obsession — the

Internet.

"(Students) are on the Internet all the time anyway," Rossi said, "so it's natural that students would start businesses on the Internet."

For example, Moskowicz designed the entire Web site and the computer software for the T-shirt company.

And for Delica, the ideal option of opening a boutique is not feasible, so the Internet seemed like the perfect vehicle to get her business rolling.

However, for Smith, a Web site alone was not enough to make his business a success.

By October 2006, just four months before their first scheduled spring break, they still hadn't booked a single trip. Smith realized the agency needed more local exposure.

Smith and his partners started promoting the travel agency by handing out fliers around Gainesville and visiting clients' apartments to close the sale.

"We made it more personal," he said. "People like face-to-face interaction."

After the intensive promotion, the agency ended up booking 80 percent on their first trip.

Smith said now he is using the Web site to reach college students from other states and aims to reach

the \$1 million mark in sales this year.

### Risky Business

Entrepreneurs start off with big plans, but often overlook potential roadblocks.

"There are lots of risks out there," Rossi said, "but the entrepreneur doesn't see them as risks but rather obstacles to overcome."

Almost four years later, Moskowicz faces a trademark dispute with one of his entrepreneur idols, Ralph Lauren.

The design in dispute is one of the most popular shirts he sells, and the one he is most proud of, the "Tragically Hip Polo Shirt." The polo pokes fun at designer brands — it shows a jockey falling off a horse. Although Smith and Delica haven't encountered anything quite as challenging, both find it demanding to balance running their companies and earning their engineering degrees.

Smith stretches his time between Tropical Connection and 17 credits, so he schedules his week on a spreadsheet.

For Delica, starting a business is still not as hard as some of her electrical engineering classes.

"I feel like I use both sides of my brain," she said. "When I'm kind of stressed out with school, I focus on SDF (her online store)."

### What's Next

For these business-savvy students, their new company is not the end-all, but the beginning of self-made opportunities.

Delica hopes that in about two years she'll raise enough money to open a small boutique in Gainesville, she said.

But Delica's not getting her degree in vain. She intends to work as an electrical engineer and hire employees to run her stores.

"It's going to be a challenge," Delica said, "but I'm up for it."

Moskowicz said he doesn't plan on keeping the Web store forever. He is considering getting a master's in business management, so he can learn how to operate on a larger scale.

Unlike his peers, Smith just hopes to take his island travel agency in new directions, such as corporate vacations.

Thousands of dollars later, Smith has his eyes set on millions more.

"I'm excited for the future," he said. "I'm excited to see what I can do."

# Residents sue rapper Plies for 2006 club shooting

## Rapper's bodyguards shot five locals

Five Gainesville residents are suing a Florida rapper, his record label and a local club after they were shot during a 2006 concert.

Billy Dee Williams, Michael Lamar Daymon, Edwin Devasco Faircloth, Steve Ruben Jean-Jacques and Dorian Shannel Johnson are suing rapper Plies, whose real name is Algernod Lanier Washington. They are also suing night club 238 West and

Washington's record label, Slip-N-Slide Records Inc., for compensatory damages.

Washington is best known for his 2007 single "Shawty" featuring T-Pain.

According to the suit, after Washington's microphone was cut off during his show at the West University Avenue establishment, he "became enraged and a fistfight ensued."

Tory Denard Carnegie and Ronnell Lawrence Lavatte, Washington's security guards, then pulled out guns and began

firing, the suit stated. The victims were each shot in different places, including the foot, neck, arm, abdomen and cheek.

According to court records, both Lavatte and Carnegie pleaded no contest to criminal charges and received prison sentences.

Washington pleaded no contest to possession of a concealed firearm but was not sent to prison, the records stated.

But Christopher Chestnut, the attorney representing the five shooting victims, said Washington is also to blame.

"Plies is unequivocally responsible for his entourage," Chestnut said. "They shot on his behalf."

Washington knew or should have known that guns were not allowed in the club, and knew or should have known that his employees had them, Chestnut said.

### Local Courts

Chestnut said that while he is not trying to control what Washington says, Washington's lyrics promoted violence toward his clients that night.

"What we're saying is, 'Leave that on the record and don't bring

that into the club,'" Chestnut said.

Messages left at Slip-N-Slide were not returned by press time.

Chestnut said his clients deserve to be compensated for medical bills, loss of pay while they were recovering and other psychological damages they suffered because of the shootings that night.

"Some of these people were staring down the barrel of a gun just before it was fired," he said.

Chestnut said he is also trying to send a message to Washington and his label.

"It is not cool to go into a club and shoot up everyone," he said.

# Christian students assemble reverse confessional

A loosely constructed booth, made of PVC pipe and covered by maroon cloth, sat quietly on the Plaza of the Americas on Wednesday. A small, white sign invited perplexed looks and slowed paces of passers-by with its one-word label: "Confessions."

But there was no priest inside the box. No offer of absolution or suggestions for penance.

Instead, a group of Christian students sought to invite the other side — a listener. They wanted to apologize for what they

deemed their own moral shortfalls in not living how Jesus intended. They're sorry for the bad image Christians might have on campus.

Russell McMullen, a UF sophomore involved in Campus Crusade for Christ, organized the reverse confessional.

"We used this to try and let people take a fair look at Christ and not just prejudge and write it off as a hateful and intolerant religion," McMullen said.

He said some students who saw the booth were confused at first and thought they were being invited to confess their own sins. They were quickly assured that McMullen and his

friends would be the ones giving the face-to-face confessions in the tent.

"Otherwise, I don't think we would have gotten anybody to talk to," McMullen said.

Judging, hurting and not showing love to people were named as the Christian group's transgressions, offered on behalf of the whole church.

McMullen didn't get more than 20 students inside in the booth today, which stood under the shade of trees on the Plaza, but he expects more throughout the week. He'll man the operation until Friday.

Graham Wigle, a UF freshman, took over the booth while McMullen went to class. Wigle said students walking across campus often get inaccurate representations of Christianity from sign-wielding preachers on Turlington Plaza.

The confessional is also meant to encourage Christians to be more humble, he said.

"We're imperfect. We stink," Wigle said. "We want to point people to the real Jesus."

## Commission should hold off on major votes

On Tuesday night, Gainesville City Commissioner Jeanna Mastrodicasa, chairwoman of the Public Safety Committee and UF's assistant vice president of student affairs, held a forum on campus to discuss proposed changes before the commission that may change the face of Gainesville's nightlife.

These include an attempt to solve downtown and midtown problems of violence, overcrowding and underage drinking.

Mastrodicasa sought to give students a chance to voice their opinions and concerns, which were recorded for the commissioners to refer to when they make their votes on proposed ordinances — this summer.

So, while most of UF's full-time students are off spending their summers out of town, the city commission will be discussing changes to the city's regulations that may greet students come fall.

While Mastrodicasa was gracious enough to hold the forum so that students would feel like they were a part of the decision-making process, it's hard to believe the timing of these meetings to discuss issues directly related to the university is accidental.

This is not the first time the city commission has made choices without a major part of its constituency — UF students — in mind.

Last May, the Public Safety Committee continued the discussion of changes to the roam towing regulations ordinance and discussed the concerns brought forward by an attorney representing Ultimate and Elite towing companies.

In July 2006, the commission discussed how to deal with underage drinking in the context of Gainesville neighborhoods, where one citizen informed the commission that more underage drinkers would be caught if police arrived in unmarked cars.

And two years ago in June, the city commission decided to make no changes to an ordinance that would maintain the bar closing hours at 2 a.m., and removed the topic from the public safety committee's pending referral list.

Though we can't expect the commission to stop business as usual when spring semester ends, it seems to be that more controversial student issues are brought up at times when little alternative opinion would be expressed.

We understand that many students don't vote in local elections and even fewer attend city commission meetings regularly, but that doesn't give the commission the right to completely — or giving them the benefit of the doubt, unintentionally — disregard a generous portion of Gainesville residents.

Many of us are only here for the four or so years we have to complete a degree, but to deny our impact on the Gainesville community would be ignorant and unfair.

The University of Florida as an institution spends an additional \$283 million annually on goods and services, and the university employs 16 percent of the Gainesville work force.

Because of this large student population, the close to 50,000 students in Gainesville were vital in helping a UF administrator, Jeanna Mastrodicasa, win a seat on the city commission in spring 2006.

While Mastrodicasa clearly understands the need for students to have a voice in city politics, as evidenced by her hosting the forum and record for working closely with the university, we wish that concern were extended to the rest of the commission when deciding what gets onto the agenda during the summer.

We think it would be better to hold off on something and wait to make an informed decision, rather than act on something that may not be the best solution for all residents.



**GPS system will improve RTS service**

In Wednesday's Alligator, Greg Perry asked if there was any true value gained from installing GPS on RTS buses. Mr. Perry appears to assume that the only benefit from GPS is providing knowledge about wait times to students and the community. Knowledge of wait times for students is merely an ancillary public benefit that comes with the system.

The GPS's primary functions are facilitating efficient route design when coupled with ridership information and to maintain more accurate route timing through the spacing of multiple buses on the same route.

Students will not only be able to tell when buses are coming, but should experience a more streamlined transit system as well.

The funding for this project is coming from the Student Traffic Court's reserve account, which is primarily used for capital improvements to parking and transportation on campus.

Some other projects that are commonly tackled with traffic court reserves are the construction of more covered bus shelters or repaving parking lots throughout campus.

This money comes from parking tickets and does not involve money from student tuition and fees or the state legislator.

As to the "real problems" Mr. Perry addresses in his letter, Student Government has been among the fiercest advocates for differential tuition, opposing state budget cuts, and for supporting the right of the Florida Board of Governors to make decisions about the future of higher education in Florida.

And new things were plentiful at the Mexicans In Gainesville booth. Not only did the


booth feature dried fish, but it also boasted a Pay Azteca, a vegetarian casserole made with Nopales cactus.





universities and listening to "known student interests and concerns."

Moseley said out of about 30 applicants, he chose nine students, including Tommy Jardon, SOLVe's president; MaryGrace Bell, Student Senate president pro-tempore; and other student senators.

He also chose three faculty members, who cannot vote on a decision regarding online voting.


Though some members have already expressed opinions from both sides of the online-voting debate, Moseley said he chose "respectful, rational people" who would investigate the option while keeping an open mind.

Sam Miorelli, a UF mechanical engineering junior and SOLVe executive director, said he remains "unconvinced" of the need for the committee and expects the ongoing lawsuit against UF to resolve the issue first.

"We never should've gotten to this point in the first place," Miorelli said.

Alachua County Circuit Judge Frederick Smith rescheduled the suit's hearing to April 24 at 2 p.m. to decide if the suit is valid following UF's request to evaluate its legitimacy.

record requirements.

In November, Machen responded to a few of the protesters in a letter, writing that he could not endorse the group's suggestions because he believes in the trustees' current policies.

Richard Gutierrez, one of the protesters, said Machen's response patronizes students who worked to create the proposal, approved by more than 80 percent of students as a referendum question during spring Student Government elections.

## Shifting Gears

### SFCC student changing bike community

Ani Previc, 21, stands 4 feet 10 inches tall, but has not let her size or age stop her from seeing her goals to fruition.

Previc, an SFCC student, has changed the face of Gainesville's bike community by being a key founder of the Gainesville Community Bicycling Project, also known as The Kickstand.

The Kickstand is a free bicycle-

repair shop, which offers free bike maintenance to the Gainesville community.

The warehouse, located on 722 S. Main St., is split into three sections: The Kickstand Thrift Shop, which opened two weeks ago and is used to earn money for rent, a stage for live music performances and the bicycle repair shop itself.

The process of getting the shop started was not a quick one though.

Previc first learned how to repair her own bike in a friend's garage only two years ago, but after that

she was hooked.

Along with a few friends, she started her quest to begin a work-

ing bicycle collective in Gainesville that would offer free bike repair to everyone.

The small group began working on the street corner of Northwest Third Street, while Previc looked for a more permanent and professional working space.

It took Previc and her friends two years to find the space inside the HIFI Stereo shop, and all the while, she had to keep people interested in the movement.

"I would call people and be like, 'Hey do you want to come volunteer on Third Street?' or 'Do you

want to come to a volunteer meeting?' and everyone was like, 'Oh, I just don't see where this is going,'" she said. "I refused to give up and this is going to happen because I've seen it happen other places and I've seen it transform communities in other cities."

When The Kickstand moved to Main Street in December, the space was used primarily as a music venue to raise money for the shop with a suggested admission donation of \$5.

# Britain's Estelle glimmers on sophomore long player

You have probably never heard of Estelle, but you will shortly.

The British singer and rapper, who is signed to John Legend's Homeschool Records, blends neo soul, hip-hop and dance music sensibilities without sacrificing her cultural roots on her sophomore album, "Shine."

Instead of pandering to the increasingly dumbed-down American hip-hop archetype,

Estelle brings a refreshing take to the genre, British vernacular, using the words "bloke," "wags" and "rubbish" for the first time in one of his verses.

In fact, her guest artists are the ones that cater to the British sensibility.

"American Boy," which is currently the No. 1 song on the UK music charts, is a delicious international dance anthem in which Estelle expresses her need for an American lover, name checking American landmarks and cities. Conversely, guest Kanye West raps in a

with cheery background vocals punctuating a

Jamaican/Canadian rapper Kardinal Offishall assists on the dancehall-tinged "Magnificent," while Gnarls Barkley singer Cee-Lo performs on "Pretty Please (Love Me)," which is pure Motown soul,

snappy bass line and upbeat piano melodies.

Estelle doesn't need superstar assistance on "Shine," though.

She's equally comfortable on poppy dance songs like "Wait A Minute (Just a Touch)" and the title track as she is on personal ballads such as "More Than Friends" and "Back In Love."

All of the songs show her solid songwriting abilities too.

Combined with top-notch production, Estelle is the best UK import to hit American shores since Amy Winehouse.

## 'Walk It Off' never finds its legs

Blame it on the blogs. Blame it on the fickle keyboard elitists who promised us that Tapes 'n Tapes was the second coming of Pavement, the perfectly refined seed of Frank Black and Kim Deal, the revolution that would reclaim the Minneapolis post-punk high ground long abandoned by the Replacements.

They lied, and now they know it.

If Tapes' debut, "The Loon," merely suspended the flow of MySpace-induced propaganda, then "Walk It Off" threatens to bury this band under a pile of message board fodder and neglected bandwidth.

"Anvil," "Say Back Something" and "Time of Songs" shoot a needle through the expectations bubble with a big dose of hipster-by-numbers shoegaze laziness. "Conquest" reproduces "Doolittle" guitar chime, but lacks the Pixies' jittery electricity.


While these songs might not reach mainstream FM, they're bound to get some love from Starbucks radio. Low-key, tuneful and devoid of any semblance of attention-grabbing ability, half of "Walk" crawls along with the same looped white-noise resonance that contemplative latte enthusiasts impassively soak up for hours on end.

Elsewhere, the band's self-conscious drum 'n' bass showmanship on opener "Le Ruse" and particularly "Hang Them All" portends a coming era in which indie's Joy Division fetish collectively lulls the music community into a rhythm-induced coma.

Some groups possess the melodic pedigree to thrive on bass lines and choppy percussion, but Tapes isn't one of them.

Maybe the propulsive onslaught of the eighth track benefits from the building lethargy that precedes it. Or maybe "Blunt" is just a really great song. Tight and explosive, it's the kind of three minutes that made these guys such Pitchfork darlings in the first place. Best case scenario, though, it's a time-buying stop gap. Worst case, it's a last grasp at relevance.

In the end, Web hype resembles the data on a crashed hard drive, so "Walk It Off" sounds like the kind of momentum-squashing effort that could forever banish Tapes 'n Tapes into the cyberspace ether, or worse, back to Minnesota.

But Previc said the focus is finally moving from live shows back to bicycles.

Now, the shop is open for repairs four days a week with different volunteers working every day. The most common repair is flat tires, she said.

There are about 20 to 30 core volunteers who attend meetings regularly, she said, but the store's hours depend on if volunteers actually show up.

It's not all about service

though. There are teaching sessions as well. Brian Erickson teaches basic and advanced bicycle repair and Previc hopes to lead a workshop for women and transgenders, she said.

For anyone interested in voicing their opinions and suggestion for the shop, weekly meetings are held at 7 p.m. on Thursdays and repair workshops are every other week.

Previc identifies herself as more of a social leader at The Kickstand while Vyki Englert is more the tasks leader, keeping the topics on point and follow-

ing the agenda.

"For me it's important to mediate during the meeting, to make sure everyone has a fair amount of time to spend, that their voice is heard," Previc said. "I think because of that everyone feels included and that is something that's really important to me — that everyone feels included in the group."

She said although she is the director and a key founder of The Kickstand, no one person holds all of the power and it is a collective because everyone has a voice.

"Leadership is a very fluid thing and it's whoever wants to take responsibility for a certain position," she said. "I think it works best that way because no one feels as though they are being forced to do anything or that they are working under anyone else."

She said a community is built when everyone feels included, adding that making everyone feel useful is a skill she can take wherever the future takes her.

The Kickstand has existed solely by word of mouth thus far, but she said volunteers are currently working on distributing pamphlets throughout different neighborhoods in Gainesville with the hopes of inviting more families with children.

"We want to make them feel as if they can send their kids to us after school," she said. "Or they feel comfortable coming to our shop and they know when we are open, and they don't feel excluded from anything."

Previc said she feels solid about where The Kickstand is today and she is happy it has finally taken off.

She said the shop is still a work in progress and needs more organization and better volunteer coordination, but it has come a long way.

"I feel like the people I am working with now have a good idea of how to run a bike shop and it will be around for a long time after I am gone."



# Anti-academia finds outlets in television, music

I'm tired.  
I'm tired of snooty literature discussions, of modern art, of dissection of simplicity, of professors masturbating their egos with the knowledge they spent large portions of their lives learning.

I'm tired of academia.

And why not? I've been living in an academia-dominated world for almost my entire life and I'm positive I'm not alone.

I've never known a life of real work or problems. Think about it. What's the last thing you worried or complained about?

"Ugh, this class is ruining my life!" or "F\*\*\*, I have to get up early tomorrow."

I'm not saying I am not grateful to have such petty problems or that I'm going to start watching the Blue Collar Comedy tour, but, at this point in my life, coming down off the high horse from the stables of the ivory tower feels way more real.

But I don't even do that. I just experience that lifestyle from different media and then I write columns dissecting it.

O Irony, you win again!

Anyway, "King of the Hill" is one of my favorite programs on television.

"Man, that show is boring," a lot of people tell me. But they don't get it. If they think it's

boring, they think real life is boring, because that's what it is. It's a show about Hank Hill — a high-school graduate who works at propane store in a small town in Texas and then drinks beers with his buddies in a back alley.

That's it and it's real.

Take, for instance, this Sunday's new episode in which Hank and his cohorts pass a locally renowned housing inspector in a store. The inspector is treated like a celebrity, eventually bringing one of the men to comment on the strangeness that the inspector is actually a mortal being of flesh and blood. To reiterate, they're praising a "god-like" housing inspector.

But the show isn't oblivious to what it is doing. There are quite a few clear jabs at academia and the people who are wrapped up in it.

Professors, students, artists and many other pseudo-elitist intellectuals are portrayed with a very realistic arrogance and pretentiousness that is not seen many other places on TV.

One other show that does pick up on rampant academic elitism though, is "The Simpsons."

Many shows in the long series of "Simpsons" seasons have been based around the college experience and almost all of them have that one professor who's just an all-

around cerebral douchebag.

For example, this Sunday's episode, the "90s episode," found Marge Simpson in the '90s going to college, where one such professor takes her fancy.

Among other pretentious things, his worse offenses are pretending to like whale songs instead of regular music and garishly calling attention to all of the things he knows or has read.

Admittedly, "The Simpsons" portrayal of these kinds of situations and people are more heavy-handed than "King of the Hill," but both get their messages across.

TV doesn't have a stranglehold on anti-academia sentiments though.

There's plenty of music out there too.

Now, maybe "anti-academia" is not the best choice of words to describe music, since there are few songs that are as blatant about the topic as those shows.

No, music doesn't try to be for or against academia — there's just a feeling. It's a feeling of realness that is indescribable until heard.

For me, the realest band I've heard in a long while is Creedence Clearwater Revival.

First of all, John Fogerty's voice is so utterly raw and sincere in everything he sings that you have no choice but to truly believe him.

You believe the first-hand stories about salt-of-the-earth, hand-to-mouth, working-class people, from poor towns of the South.

To top it all off, the music is muscular and simple. There are no frills. No bridges, no crazy tempo or key shifts and barely any drum fills.

"Born on the Bayou," "Green River," "Proud Mary" and so many other songs make me want to give up all I know now for the kind of simplicity only living in the wild can bring.

The mixture of academic-ennui with these kind of media influences have left saying lately, "Man, I just want to do some real work with my hands. I need to chop some wood or something."

But the truth is if I really wanted that change, I definitely have the resources to make it happen.

It's not going to.

So what does that make me, or anyone in the same situation? A closet-academic? A hypocrite? A phony? I honestly don't know.

Sup, existential crisis.

Whatever. I'll just take comfort in knowing Fogerty is actually from San Francisco.



## Rainey turns corner in spring practice

■ URBAN MEYER TABS THE FRESHMAN AS ONE OF UF'S MOST IMPROVED PLAYERS.

For a person known for his fast starts, Chris Rainey had a pretty slow first year at UF.

He tallied one carry, one punt return, a fumble and shoulder surgery in his first season for the Gators, a disappointing follow-up to a high school career that yielded three state titles and plenty of highlights.

He had trouble learning the offense and showing up on time and was criticized for being too small to play running back in the Southeastern Conference.

When he fumbled against Troy, it put him on UF football coach Urban Meyer's naughty list and made his chances of seeing the field even slimmer.

"When I fumbled, (Meyer) was just so mad," Rainey said. "Forever."

Skip ahead a few months, and Meyer describes Rainey as one of the team's most improved players, adding that he's destined for playing time in the fall as a running back.

The credit for the turnaround should probably be sent to an unlikely place: Knoxville, Tenn., where former running backs coach Stan Drayton is now employed with Tennessee.

In October, Drayton confronted Rainey in his dorm about being late to meetings, and he made the freshman come to his office every morning at 6:30 to study the playbook and learn some discipline.

"(Drayton) knew I could do better, and he wanted me to learn the offense because I had some little problems with it," Rainey said. "I hate those morning things. It helped me get up early, which

# No. 4 UF sweeps Stetson for second time this year

The UF women's tennis team finished its non-conference season Wednesday against the same team that kicked off its schedule, and it did so in similar fashion.

About the only difference from the first meeting was that this match was away from the friendly confines of Linder Stadium.

The No. 4 Gators (17-1, 10-0 Southeastern Conference) swept Stetson once again, this time 6-0,

in a match that UF was able to schedule after some of its matches early in the season were canceled or postponed due to inclement weather.

"We really needed to play another match, I think, at a few spots, and we got that done," UF coach Roland Thornqvist said. "There's a couple of our players, I think, who really benefit from playing a lot of points and a lot of matches."

"We certainly got that done today."

UF was dominant in doubles, surrendering just four total games and sweeping all three courts from the Hatters.

Sophomore Megan Alexander and senior Lolita Frangulyan

teamed up for an 8-1 victory.

Senior Whitney Benik and sophomore Csilla Borsanyi won 8-2, and the No. 39 duo of freshman Julia Cohen and sophomore Anastasia Revzina scored an 8-1 rout.

UF didn't have much trouble showing its depth on the singles courts either. The Gators now have five singles players ranked in the

Intercollegiate Tennis Association top 125.

Five players posted straight-set wins, similar to the teams' first meeting on Jan. 23.

The No. 1 singles match, featur-

ing Cohen, did not finish play.

Benik performed a shutout within a shutout, winning 6-0, 6-0 to capture her 14th straight singles win this season.

Meanwhile, Frangulyan won her 17th straight singles match in a 6-1, 6-2 victory.

"Playing a match is certainly different than practice," Thornqvist said. "We got a relatively easy match in, but still it was a good one for us at this point in the season."

"For a couple of our players, I think it is crucial to continue doing some things in match situations that we've been practicing or talking about. It was just another opportunity to play."

The Gators, who won their 13th consecutive dual match, will now attempt to finish their SEC regular-season schedule unblemished when they travel to No. 32 South Carolina on Saturday.

UF defeated the Gamecocks 4-1 in Gainesville last season.

"Anytime you can go undefeated in a league, certainly that's a tremendous accomplishment," Thornqvist said. "I don't know that there are that many teams that have done that in the years past."

"It doesn't happen that often because this is, after all, one of the most competitive leagues in the country. If we were able to do it, it certainly speaks a lot about this team."

Just as he has for most of the spring, Rainey seemed to turn another corner a few days ago after Carter called to make sure he would be on time for an early-morning workout.

"The next day we had early meetings, and at 6:30 my phone rings and (Rainey) says, 'Good morning, sunshine,'" Carter said. "I see the development in him."


