



# Hunger strikers feeling effects of protest

■ TWO SDS MEMBERS SAID THEY HAVE FAINTED DURING STRIKE.

Six of 11 student protesters are still fasting until they can talk about UF's investment policy with UF President Bernie Machen, but

they're dropping fast. Two have already fainted after nearly a week, protesters said.

Members of Students for a Democratic Society have been on a hunger strike since April 9. Students met with Dean of Students Eugene Zdziarski on Wednesday asking for a forum to discuss releasing details of the university's \$1.2 billion endowment.

The group wants to make sure UF isn't investing in anything socially irresponsible.

Dianna Morgan, chairwoman of the Board of Trustees, sent the group a letter this week telling them not to put their health at risk for the administration's attention because UF is already

Student Government aware of the group's requests, UF spokeswoman Janine Sikes said. There are no current plans for meetings between Machen and SDS, who have met three times before, Sikes said.

Machen could not be reached for comment.

Student Body President Ryan Moseley said he met with the group on Tuesday and was still reviewing the proposals before taking a stance.

Richard Gutierrez, an English and history senior and SDS member, said he told friends and family that his part in the strike would end when he passed out. That day was

# Einstein's pulls class's notes

Einstein's Notes has temporarily stopped selling notes for a UF class after Faulkner Press, the software company used to supplement the course, sued the note-taking service.

However, Jim Sullivan, the Gainesville lawyer representing Faulkner Press, said students shouldn't worry about studying for their final exams in Wildlife Issues in a Changing World because the company will post audio files of the lec-

tures on its Web site today.

Faulkner Press' online lecture guides for UF professor Michael Moulton's class, usually \$25.99, will also be free starting in the summer, said Sullivan.

Faulkner Press filed the

lawsuit against Class Notes, the parent company of Einstein's Notes, on April 1. The suit alleges that Einstein's Notes sold Moulton's lecture notes without his permission.

Einstein's Notes has until the end of the month to formally respond to the lawsuit. In the meantime, Thomas Bean, the company's owner, said he decided to temporarily stop publishing Moulton's notes because he didn't want to "fuel the fire."

# Senate allots \$1M for groups Student org. budget \$16K less

UF student senators approved more than \$1 million for academic councils and student organizations to use over the 2008-2009 school year during Tuesday's Senate meeting that lasted until midnight.

The senators' decision, which was not made until after press time Tuesday, designates almost \$540,000 to the Board of College Councils, the body that oversees funds for academic groups in each college, and almost \$585,000 to Student Government-funded student organizations.

The Board of College Council budget changed little since last year, increasing by about \$100. However, the student-organization budget is almost \$16,000 less than last year's budget of \$600,559, said Sen. Jordan Johnson, chairman of

the Budget and Appropriations Committee, in a telephone interview Wednesday.

Johnson said the committee decreased funds for the upcoming year because some groups weren't spending all the money they requested.

The funding slash was meant to "cut out some of the fat" that could be used somewhere else, he said.

"If they weren't spending their money last year, we didn't give them everything they asked for this year,"

Johnson said.

Most groups were not given more funding than last year, but six groups demonstrating greater participation and financial need were



# House passes bill targeting textbook affordability

The Florida House of Representatives voted unanimously in favor of a bill Wednesday that aims to make buying textbooks more affordable. The bill, introduced by Rep. Anitere Flores, R-Miami, would require state colleges and universities to provide adequate textbook information to students at least 30 days before the first day of classes.

They would have to provide either the ISBN number or other identifying information, including the book's author, title,

edition, publisher, published date and copyright date, at the minimum.

If passed by the Senate and approved by Gov. Charlie Crist, the proposal would give students time to shop around for the cheapest textbooks available rather than having to rush to buy them in time for class.

Flores said she wasn't surprised the House voted 115-0 in favor of the bill.

In a phone interview Wednesday, she described her initial reaction to the news of the bill's passage as "incredible satisfaction."

"This is a step in trying to help students make their college career a little more affordable," she said. "It took three years to get this

great bill passed, and it was worth it."

Flores began combating the textbook affordability problem in 2005 with a proposal to exempt textbooks from sales tax, but her bill didn't make it onto the Legislature's agenda in 2006 or 2007.

Audie Rowell, president and co-founder of XBooks, a nonprofit, online bookstore that allows students to buy and sell books among themselves, helped Flores draft a bill that would more specifically ad-

dress the issue.

Rowell said he was ecstatic about the bill's passage through the House.

"This is historic for students," he said. "That's the only way I can describe it."

Considering the financial strains of recent tuition hikes, Rowell, a 40-year-old returning Florida State University student, said the bill would offer students some relief.

"Students will now be provided the information they have been denied for so many years," he said.

The proposal will go before the Florida Senate today. If it passes, it must also be approved by Crist before going into effect.

## Student Senate votes against restructuring Cabinet

■ SENATE PRESIDENT CITES INADEQUATE RESEARCH.

UF student senators voted against a bill Tuesday night that would have reduced the number of Student Body Cabinet positions by 30 members.

The current model, which allows 36 Cabinet directors and secretaries to govern areas such as Greek affairs, technology and

housing, is inefficient, said Sen. Mark McShera, the bill's sponsor, in a telephone interview Wednesday.

The Tuesday meeting lasted four hours and was not over by press time.

McShera's bill aimed to streamline the Cabinet by cutting the number of members to just six secretaries, a move that would make the roles of members more clear, he said. He said he was not surprised by the disapproving vote, but he intends to revise the bill to appease dissenters.

"I think it's just disappointing

because this was the fresh air that the Cabinet needed to best serve the Student Body," McShera said.

Senate President Kellie Dale said in a telephone interview that she voted against the bill because she didn't think enough research went into the proposed shuffle.

She said she was disappointed that Vanessa Goodwin, Student Body vice president, and Yooni Yi, incoming Student Body vice president, were not consulted about such a big change in Cabinet.

"I think the intentions were good," Dale said. "But I don't think it was the most effective way to restructure Cabinet."

Senators also approved a recommendation for Eric Wolf, an Orange and Blue Party senator, to replace a seat on the Senate Judiciary Committee. The committee seat was left vacant by former Sen. Sheldon Nagesh, who resigned last week after controversy over whether he could represent his district.

Wolf could not be reached for comment. His appointment brings the number of Orange

and Blue Party senators on a committee to two. The other is Sen. Ben Cavataro, the Orange and Blue Party leader who sits on the Replacement and Agenda Committee. Cavataro earned his committee spot as the leader of the Senate's minority party.

"We're still underrepresented, but I'm not complaining because at least we have him," Cavataro said in a phone interview, referring to Wolf.



The senators also passed a resolution to honor Carmen Peterson, a UF student who was killed in a bicycle accident last week.

# Proposed development still mired in complications

After being turned down by the city commission in October 2007, the developer of the proposed Hatchet Creek community in northeast Gainesville appealed the decision at Wednesday night's commission meeting.

The development, which Commissioner Rick Bryant called "Haile Plantation East," would be primarily for residents 55 and older and would contain commercial areas, 1,199 homes and 300 assisted-living facility beds.

Project supporters hope it would bring increased development to East Gainesville.

In order for developers to build at the proposed site, the city would

airport authority member

have to make changes to its land-use policy. Commissioners had not decided by press time what conditions, if any, to accept in changing the proposed site's land use to allow for construction.

Disagreement arose when the developer asked commissioners to change the land-use category for 200 more acres than the company had previously requested, allowing it to build on more land.

It also asked to be able to build in airport-noise zones, which are subject to 65 decibels of sound.

At press time, there were two motions on the floor — one restricting homes to the original 300 acres instead of the requested 500 acres, and another prohibiting them from being built in the noise area.

The issue was further complicated by the possibility that in the fall the commission may discuss changing its definition of an airport-noise zone to include lower decibel levels, which would make it even more unlikely that the developer would be able to build there.

Members of the Gainesville Regional Airport Authority announced at the meeting they had also commissioned a study into possible changes in airport-noise zones.

"I think not taking the time for the study to be completed would be a great mistake for the commission to decide tonight," said Peter Johnson of the airport authority.

The land-use change was originally turned down because of concerns over the development's proximity to the airport and the possible destruction of wetlands.


Developers and city officials agreed destroyed wetlands should be replaced by man-made ones.

"In general, I don't think any of us like to see wetlands destroyed," Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan said.

Developer Rob Simensky addresses the Gainesville City Commission at City Hall on Wednesday about his proposed Hatchet Creek development.



# Assault help goes online

Instant messaging could be the newest way for victims of sexual assault to find anonymous help.

A new online sexual assault hotline was officially released Monday by the Rape, Abuse & Incest National Network, or RAINN, known for its national phone hotline.

While the phone line is still available, victims of sexual assault and their friends and families can now also use an instant messaging service to connect with trained professionals.

Rita Lawrence, a victim advocate at Alachua County Victims Services & Rape Crisis Center, said her group has helped staff a pilot version of the hotline for about a year.

"People are definitely using it, and have been," Lawrence said.

About half of all assault victims are younger than 18, and 80 percent are younger than 30, said Katherine Hull, a spokeswoman for RAINN. In past years, these victims have increasingly turned to the Internet for help and information.

"People just prefer to communicate online," Hull said. "Unfortunately, that type of help is leaving them susceptible to unreliable advice."

Victims often depend on blogs and message boards for information, she said.

At the Alachua County center, Lawrence said, all hotline operators receive 30 hours of standard crisis center training and spend 10 additional hours learning the system.

In addition to being more reliable, the new hotline is also more anonymous than most Web sites, Hull said. It doesn't record transcripts or keep computers' IP addresses. The hotline also includes information on deleting a computer's history so other users won't be able to see what sites were visited.

"There is no evidence," Hull said. "There is no history."

Lawrence said she has helped victims work through a variety of different problems with the online hotline, including what to do immediately following assault and how to handle troubling flashbacks.

For some, typing is easier than talking, she said.

"If I weren't sure I could speak without breaking down, texting might be easier," she said.





# Strike Out

## Hunger strike won't advance SDS cause

Today marks the eighth day that the Students for a Democratic Society have been on a hunger strike to convince UF President Bernie Machen that the university should make its investment portfolio transparent.

In its latest quest for socially responsible investment, the SDS has disintegrated any possibility of reasoned debate with the administration on the issue for a number of reasons.

First, while we understand that an open review of where our university places its billions is something more than 80 percent of students who voted in the spring election would like to see, we can't possibly understand why the SDS would choose to alienate the masses with their extreme tactics. The majority of the student body cannot identify with a small sect of students who choose not to nourish themselves especially right before final exams. To the reasonable among us, it's just absolutely ridiculous and woefully ineffective.

For those who remember the SDS protests of the past — calling for the firing of the University Police officers involved in the Taser debacle and then the short-lived "study-in" that was supposed to encourage Machen to speak with them — it's hard to view this latest attention scam as anything other than a cheap stunt.

Hunger strikes have been historically significant, as was the case when Mahatma Gandhi began such a strike to protest the British rule of India. Political prisoners at Guantánamo Bay have also used hunger strikes to protest what some believed to be their unfair imprisonment.

With the knowledge of these monumental causes, the SDS approach pales in comparison and cheapens the value of what it means to be on a hunger strike. It is hard to sympathize with the SDS strikers that have used the powerful tactic to essentially throw a temper tantrum rather than initiate real change.

It is also hard for us to take them seriously.

We're not buying that the SDS has no other choice but to not eat, as one protester stated. In fact, they have chosen the easy way out.

It is much harder to disrupt your schedule and adamantly protest outside Tigert every day, holding signs and garnering support for your cause from students outside your immediate social circle. The "hunger strikers" are still going about their daily lives, minus three meals a day. The institution of a real change would require actively lobbying Student Government to get behind the protests, or even continuing to sit in Machen's office every day to remind him of the cause. We're guessing this hunger strike is destined to go the way of other SDS demonstrations: failure.

And so it seems to us that the real reason the SDS strikers have chosen not to eat is to attract more attention to themselves rather than the issue at hand. Some have passed out in class. Even the debate over whether drinking fruit juice counts as a hunger strike has distracted from the purpose of the protest.

Their self-imposed fervor about the strike has diverted attention away from the issue and has placed their own members into the spotlight. If their goal is to highlight the need for socially responsible investing, why have they chosen to continuously discuss the strike instead of the reason for it? This sort of look-at-me-I'm-not-eating attitude they have adopted does nothing to advance their cause. The result? The strike has been easily dismissed — at least by us.





## STATE House race to pit upstart against 19-year incumbent

As the latest debate between Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama dominates headlines across the country, one local race for the November general elections is just beginning to heat up.

Ocala resident Tim Cunha, a Democrat and former attorney, recently announced his intention to run against 19-year incumbent Cliff Stearns, a Republican, for the local U.S. House of Representatives seat.

District 6 — spanning upward from south of Ocala, through Gainesville and up to the

Georgia border — has long been represented by Stearns, 67, who has won the seat in the last nine elections.


Yet Cunha, 57, said he hopes his background in law and his ideas for national policies will send voters to the polls with him in mind.

Since Stearns was elected to the House, he has backed mostly conservative ideals, and in recent years has supported almost all of the Bush administration's propositions.

According to The Washington Post's Congress Votes Database, 90.8 percent of his votes have followed the Republican majority.

But even though that track record may not fit Alachua County, which voted in the 2006

election for Stearns' Democratic opponent, Dave Bruderly, a press officer for Stearns said it's still too early for the congressman to begin his campaign.

Paul Flusche, Stearns' spokesman, said the congressman is focused on his job right now and has not yet thought about campaigning. Even so, Stearns has already built up an enviable election fund. According to campaign finance reports published by the Center for Responsive Politics, a non-partisan research group, he has about \$2.3 million in cash on

hand — the fifth most by a U.S. representative for this year's elections.

Yet Cunha said he thinks his views, which he described as "representative of the great middle majority of Americans," will trump those of Stearns' moneyed "ultra-conservative playbook."

The former attorney of 30 years and part-time Rutgers professor said he has begun campaigning full-time to voters of all leanings.

"There's not some radical left-wing solution, and there's not some radical right-wing solution," he said. "People aren't just voting straight party lines anymore. They're thinking."

# Festival of India displays Hindu philosophies on Plaza

■ **EVENT WILL LAST THROUGH FRIDAY.**

A giant fish in a lawn chair, a snake charmer and a gypsy bird lady are not typical Plaza of the Americas lawn-dwellers.

The unusual characters were props for the Festival of India, which opened Wednesday and will remain through Friday from 9 a.m.

to 5 p.m.

Five tents shelter informational panels explaining philosophies of the Bhagavad Gita, one of the central scriptures of Hinduism. Each tent addresses different topics such as vegetarianism, reincarnation and yoga with pictures and outside sources.

"Our mission is to enlighten people about the Vedic culture of India, primarily about the science of the Bhagavad Gita," said Madhuha Dasa, who runs the traveling festival. "We're not here to indoctrinate

people."

This year a new presentation called "A Journey of the Soul" was unveiled. Upon entering the enclosed tent, the ching-ching of Krishna music faded away and sunlight was replaced with a dim light bulbs warming the black in-

terior.

During the 10-minute show, a man's voice described reincarnation while a video of changing seasons played on a screen behind 17 small mannequins, each depicting the steps in a man's aging process, transitioning from embryo to a corpse.

Dasa said it was meant to explain the difference between the body, which ages and dies, and the soul, which lives on. The festival has been visiting UF during its cross-continental tour through the

U.S. and Canada for nearly a decade, he said. College students are receptive to the exhibits, especially now that vegetarianism and yoga are more popular.

But there were some skeptics. "It's interesting, but I don't think it's true," said sophomore Blake Tanase of the belief in reincarnation. Tanase stopped by the "Evolution of Consciousness" exhibit during a break in his classes.

"I eat Krishna lunch at least once a week so I thought I should at least see what it's about," he said.

given more money.

Dancin' Gators was given more than \$5,800 to rent the Phillips Center for performances, and Islam on Campus received almost \$20,900 — about \$6,500 more than last year — to accommodate growing interest in its Ramadan Fast-A-Thon.

The senators also approved a \$100,000 transfer from SG Operations to Recreational Sports to renovate the pavilion at Lake Wauburg.

The Wauburg-project transfer does not come from students' Activity and Service Fees like the rest of the budget, Johnson said, but from a \$500,000 loan to the Reitz

**Student Government** Union in 2005 to refurbish hotel rooms. The Reitz repays \$100,000 each year to SG. SG's budget totals about \$13 million.

The rest of the funds go toward other programs, such as Recreational Sports, Accent, Student Government Productions and other SG expenditures.





# Political writers visit UF

## ■ TALK WILL FOCUS ON MEDIA'S RELATIONSHIP WITH PRESIDENCY.

Two political journalists will discuss the media's effect on the U.S. presidency at UF's Graham Center for Public Service in Pugh Hall at 7 p.m. as part of the center's Presidential Lecture Series.

Matt Bai, a political writer for The New York Times Magazine, and Joe Trippi, a Democratic campaign worker and author of "The Revolution Will Not Be Televised: Democracy, the Internet and the Overthrow of Everything," were chosen by former U.S. Sen. Bob Graham to participate in the series. Graham will also attend the forum, which will be moderated by Tom Fiedler, former executive editor of The Miami Herald.

Michael Bowen, assistant director of the Graham Center, said Bai and Trippi would compare old and new forms of

media and how they could impact the upcoming presidency.

"These are two guys who are very much in the front lines of both," Bowen said.

Although Bai has his own news blog, he represents traditional media as a print journalist, Bowen said. Trippi, who served as Howard Dean's presidential campaign manager in 2004, will represent new media at the event, Bowen added.

He said the event would be a good opportunity for people interested in politics or the media to ask questions and get expert analysis that they wouldn't normally have available to them in a classroom.

"Trippi is an amazing political strategist, and Bai is a very, very well-respected journalist," he said.

Once he was home, he gave in for health's sake and had a strawberry yogurt.


Changing UF's endowment policy to be more transparent is something Machen couldn't do alone, but his word would have a big influence, Gutierrez said.

UF's Investment Corporation, a nonprofit organization that handles UF's investments, keeps its records private. SDS has demanded a policy change as well as a student-and-faculty committee appointed to advise the

Board of Trustees on socially responsible investments.

SDS member Skeet Surrency, an organic and sustainable agriculture junior, said the group would send Machen a letter inviting him to discuss the issue over lunch Friday. Surrency, who is only drinking juice while on strike, said he doesn't expect Machen to show, but the group would be in the Reitz Union waiting.

"If he was really concerned about our health, he would show up with an open mind and perhaps with an apology for the way things have been handled this past year," Surrency said.



The band just played the Langerado Music Festival to crowds that surpassed ten thousand, but Pond doesn't mind playing small venues.

"We've played on a few unattended tours — and I really don't want to sound like a hippie — but it's all about how much the people connect with the music," he said.

With eight records under his belt and a slew of ex-band members, it's hard to know who or what to

expect of a Matt Pond PA live performance.

He isn't bringing his cellist or violinist on this tour because he doesn't want it to come off as gimmicky, but sound will still sound full, he said.

It's hard to describe the band as gimmicky or niche-fitting when they've toured with acts as diverse

as Liz Phair, Youth Group, Ted Leo, Straylight Run and Guster.

The only staple of the band is Pond himself, although he wants people to realize that the band doesn't only consist of him.

"The ones who stay around the longest, their personalities and them helping you write parts, they all become your friends and then not your friends," he said.

In the past, he has talked about changing the name of his band from its current moniker to "The Dark Leaves" before releasing the follow-up to "Last Light," which is already in the works.

"Whether we do something our not is delirious conjecture," Pond said. "I like to make jokes, and sometimes I'm serious, and some-

times I retract my jokes."

He suddenly became much more verbose if not more comprehensible when the conversation turned away from himself and onto other acts.

"I absolutely love Be Your Own Pet," Pond said.

He also chatted about Neutral Milk Hotel, whose "In the Aeroplane Over the Sea," he received death threats for covering.

"We didn't do it to make it better, because we can't, but to honor it," he said.

He said it was a strange reaction to get threatening letters though.

"Kids send me covers of our songs and it makes me very uncomfortable because I can't listen to or talk about myself," he said, "but I recognize it as an honor."

# Florida acoustic pop group making national waves

It is not every day that you walk into your first period class as an aspiring musician and walk out with a manager, but that is exactly what happened for members of the Florida pop group Mark & James.

Mark Russell and James Friedman met their manager when she was a guest speaker in Russell's entertainment marketing class at the University of Central Florida, Russel said.

Following her speech, the two gave her a copy of their CD and about two weeks later, after playing a game of cat and mouse, she became their manager.

But this isn't the only odd yet fortunate coincidence in the group's career.

Russell and Friedman met at a hurricane shelter in 2004 at UCF. Friedman brought his guitar with him "just to jam," he said.

Russell, who played the acoustic guitar too, approached Friedman and they shared an instant bond, Friedman said.

"Every musician has the desire to get together and play," he said.

Soon after meeting, Friedman started opening for an acoustic band Russell played in. Eventually the two got together and Mark & James emerged.

The band, which Friedman describes as "two friends having a good time," has a sound of pop, rock and a touch of acoustic-soul

all held together with strong lyrics and melodious lead vocals contributed by both Friedman and Russell.

"If you took John Mayer and Ryan Cabrera and they had a kid and he played in The Fray, that would describe us," Friedman said.

Since June 2007, they have played with national acts such as Matchbox Twenty and Alanis Morissette, Aly & AJ and the Jonas

Brothers to name a few.

They will be opening for Avril Lavigne in Tampa, Fla., on April 19 and in West Palm Beach, Fla., on April 20.

Music and touring aren't the only things on the duo's minds. Both Russell and Friedman are 22 year-old students at UCF who balance school and their careers.

"It's pretty tough," Friedman said. "We play certain shows and are out until the early morning. It's not easy but we handle it pretty well."

Either way, the reward of performing in front of and pleasing thousands of fans is worth it, Russell said.

They recently won the NBC/

CW Best Central Florida Band competition, but having other people relate to their songs means the most to them, Russell said.

In addition to other dates, they are hosting the "Bandemonium tour," which is a 16 date national tour starting in Las Vegas on May 1.

"We're excited but pretty nervous because we've never been on tour," Russell said. "The thought is awesome, but you never think about what is behind the scenes with it."

They are also the first act added to the already-scheduled Bandemonium 2 tour, which will be an all pop/rock show launching in late summer 2008.

As though the summer isn't already busy enough, Mark & James is releasing an acoustic album, "Hello, I Love You & Goodbye," on June 10 at the Virgin Megastore in Orlando.

Their first single is called "Letting Go".

Both Friedman and Russell write songs, and the inspiration behind the first single was Russell's breakup with his girlfriend of four and a half years, he said.

"People love 'Letting Go' because anybody can identify with it," Russell said.

Although they are two "radically different" people, Friedman said, they are two opposites that attract.

"We are constantly contradict-



# Guitar weapon of choice on Massacre's 'Underground'

Anton Newcombe isn't your run-of-the-mill cult figure.

Fact is, he's not very adept at keeping a following — just ask one of the several dozen would-be disciples to play in, and summarily quit, his '60s revivalist collective The Brian Jonestown Massacre.

Those who've seen the death-by-psychedelia "DiG!" documentary know that this guy simply spends too much time threatening violence to lull anyone into a false sense of

security.

His songs are a different matter. The Massacre's 13th studio album, "My Bloody Underground," thrives on a straightforward formula: lay down a devastatingly hypnotic groove. Sustain groove. Repeat.


It's a simple ploy, but oh-so-effective.

Opener "Dropping Bombs on the Whitehouse" introduces the main ingredients — four or five

chords, an Eastern tinge, obscenely offensive mumbling. A mesmerizing slab of musical genius, it will unfortunately land Newcombe on the FBI watch list.

The belly of the album — more groove, a little piano — plays like a stroll through the streets of Haight-Ashbury. It's a mellow high crashed only by the jarring riffs of the dangerously intense "Golden Frost." The spiritual sibling to Primal Scream's "Accelerator," the

tune is so good that Newcombe could shout Icelandic insults throughout its flawlessly rocking duration and still not ruin it.

It's a good thing, too, because that's exactly what he does.

"Auto-Matic... for the People" nearly matches this track in terms of sheer sinister force. The noise-jam's drowned out screaming only enhances the menacing rhythm. When the apoca-

lypse nears, this is the song that will herald its coming.

And for many that's a disconcerting notion, which brings us back to Newcombe's dilemma.

He and his band exist in an unsettling parallel universe, one without boundaries, governed only by sound and guitar.

To those who concern themselves with worldly matters, reality in particular, Newcombe's cultish appeal isn't especially attractive.

The tunes, on the other hand, will have you slurping Kool-Aid.



# 'Sex and the City' star writes of his life after cancer

Many of actor Evan Handler's fans know him best as Harry Goldenblatt from "Sex and the City": the balding husband to WASP-turned-yenta Charlotte York.

What most of them may not know is that his signature cue-ball look is not genetic.

It's a side effect from invasive medical treatments he underwent in his 20s for acute myeloid leukemia, a supposedly unbeatable cancer.

"It's not like I'm the only cancer survivor running around," Handler said, "but a lot of the renowned ones are not such young people and didn't have their illnesses at such a young age [as I had mine]."

Diagnosed at 24, He wasn't supposed to live to see his 30s. Now 47,


the television, film and Broadway veteran will release his second memoir, "It's Only Temporary: The Good News and the Bad News of Being Alive," on May 1.

A retrospective glimpse at where life has taken him since his recovery, "It's Only Temporary" picks up where his first book "Time On Fire: My Chronicle of Terrors," an account of his five-year battle with cancer, left off.

"It was really the illness that got me writing," he said. "Even after I hadn't written for a while after the first book, the way I got started again was to say to myself, 'Stop making the rule that you have to wait for something in the illness to write about. Write about how it's

informed your life since.'"

He began writing portions of the book "some years ago." The pieces came together as a collection of provocative essays in which

Handler deftly balances existential musings with lighthearted anecdotes covering everything from junior high gym class to intercontinental romance.

He makes life's little absurdities seem simultaneously epic and trifling, infusing his already rich prose with a tension that mirrors his "ironic struggle to find contentment in the life he's lucky to be living."

The ending to Handler's story is a happy one, culminating in marriage and the birth of his daughter.

Although the bulk of Handler's romantic and professional experiences are for the most part universal, he said the book appeals largely to 20-something readers because it's filled with dating and relationship stories similar to those featured in shows like "Sex and the City," except "lived and told by a man."

"The book to me is about a guy living through his 20s in his 30s, because his 20s were spent kind of like as a dying old man," he said. "It's kind of a life lived backwards, in a certain way."

Today, Handler is moving swiftly forward, keeping busy filming the Showtime series "Californication"

and promoting the upcoming "Sex and the City" movie release.

He also doesn't plan to shelve his literary aspirations any time soon.

"Writing is the area where I don't have as much recognition, so I certainly would like that to come," he said. "I'd like to expand the repertoire of what kind of books I write."

Fiction is a genre he's considered exploring, but non-fiction is the area where he feels his ability to inspire has proven to be most valuable.

"I don't think there are so many very high-profile people who had such intense experiences at such a young age as I did," he noted. "I think it's really cool to send the message, 'Here's what I was told was impossible, and here I am existing and doing this stuff.'"

## No. 3 Gators sweep 'Noles on road

When an offense is as explosive as the Gators', a sub-.320 batting average will land you in

the seventh spot of the lineup.

Freshman Tiffany DeFelice has been slumping lately after being moved into the heart of UF's batting order.

"I'm pretty hard on myself about that kind of stuff, when it comes to not hitting," DeFelice said. "I was a little disappointed with myself over the past few weeks."

After being moved to seventh for the first game of Wednesday's doubleheader sweep over FSU (32-21, 8-7 Atlantic Coast Conference), she showed why she is still one of the No. 3 Gators' (48-2, 18-1 Southeastern Conference) biggest offensive weapons.

Against FSU ace Tiffany McDonald, DeFelice went 2 for

3 with an RBI double over the left fielder's head.

"I'm not really sure (what I was doing differently)," she said. "I went up with a little bit of a clearer head."

In the second game, she was moved to sixth in the order and responded by stuffing the stat sheet in Nick Calathes-like fashion.

Her final line read 1 for 2 with a walk, two runs scored and a team-high four RBI.

After the game, she was quick to say she didn't mind being moved down in the order.

"I'm totally cool with batting down there," DeFelice said. "I don't care where I'm hitting."

The tremendous performance by DeFelice raised her average to .330 on the season — fourth among everyday Gators players — and helped set the tone for two UF wins.

In the first game, junior Stacey Nelson was lights out as she outdueled McDonald in a 6-1 decision.

After striking out just one hitter in her last outing against Georgia, Nelson struck out nine FSU batters while allowing one run in a complete game performance.

"I was able to use my screwball today, especially against the lefties," she said.

Nelson got a rare game off in the nightcap when the Gators' offense exploded inside JoAnne

### Hudson fades in Braves' loss to Marlins

MIAMI — Tim Hudson threw as hard as he could, and for the Atlanta Braves, the result was doubly troublesome.

Hudson's fastball hit only 85 mph. And Mike Jacobs hit it over the wall.

With Hudson unable to generate his normal velocity, the Florida Marlins took advantage and beat the struggling Atlanta Braves 6-5 Wednesday night.

Hudson departed after only three innings trailing 4-1.

"I felt all right physically," he said. "I just couldn't get anything behind the ball. It was a weird feeling. My heater's usually a lot better than that."

Hudson (2-1) endured his first poor start of the season, allowing six hits. Manager Bobby Cox pulled the right-hander after only 58 pitches.

"I thought it might be a good time to give (Hudson) a break."

"It was just one of those nights when his arm was kind of dead," Cox said. "I thought it might be a good time to give him a break."

The Braves lost their third in a row and fell to 0-7 in one-run games. They're 2-7 on the road.

"How does the saying go? 'You can't win the division in April, but you can lose it,'" left fielder Matt Diaz said. "We have to make sure we don't do that."

Mark Hendrickson (3-1) won his third start in a row for surprising Florida. Jacobs hit his sixth home run, and Luis Gonzalez added a two-run pinch-hit homer, his first since 1992.

The Marlins are last in the NL in ERA but 9-0 when scoring at least four runs. They lead the NL East despite the lowest payroll in the majors.

"It's a good win for us," Gonzalez said. "It keeps us rolling. We beat a pretty good pitcher tonight."

# Cohen put off a promising professional career to join Gators

pecking order is a favorite pastime for the Cohens. Julia teams up with Richard in mixed doubles, and they take on Josh and Nancy, Julia's mother.

"In that, anyone can win," Richard Cohen said. "But it's extremely competitive and for bragging rights. It's a lot of fun."

Julia and Josh keep things competitive between themselves as well.

"They have such fierce battles on the court," Richard Cohen said. "It's very interesting to watch. Off the ground they really go at each other."

During her spring break just a few weeks ago, Cohen traveled with her father to South Barrington, Ill., a suburb of Chicago, to play in the USTA Senior National Father-Daughter Indoor Doubles Championships.

Cohen came away with her 15th career Gold Ball, a token symbolic of a national title.

"It was wonderful to win a national championship and get a Gold Ball," 61-year-old Richard Cohen said. "Especially when you win it with your daughter, it's really amazing. I won the National Father and Son (Championships) with Josh, and to win it with Julia was just amazing."

The Cohens entered the match as the No. 2 seed, facing the No. 1 seed and leaving with a thrilling 7-6 (4), 2-6, 7-6 (6) victory. Down 6-5 and match point in the third-set tiebreak, Julia hit a backhand winner down the line to save the match and give her and her dad the push they needed to win.

"I was so happy because any time I can win for my dad it means

a lot to me," Cohen said. "I'd prefer to win with him than other stuff because it means so much to him."

Richard added, "It was about the best experience of my life to win a national championship with my kid. I didn't expect it. To see Julia that happy and play that well was just fantastic."

### College or Pro?

Cohen knew a little bit about UF through another Philadelphia native and former Gator, UF Hall of Famer and Grand Slam doubles champion Lisa Raymond.

Cohen said. "She came to Florida, and she told me that it'd be a good choice for me."

Raymond, whose highest WTA singles ranking was No. 15, told Cohen about her experience at UF while the two were practicing together in Philadelphia.

"She told me that they treat the athletes really well, and it's a great atmosphere and the tennis program will help my game a lot," Cohen said.

Cohen watched Raymond play when she was growing up and even played with her at a young age.

"She plays a lot differently from me," Cohen said. "But I still look up to her a lot."

Cohen was one of the top recruits in the U.S., but many thought she was just going to turn pro.

Her father said about 200

schools called him and he told them the same thing.

The plans changed about five months ago. UF head coach Roland Thornqvist had followed Cohen since she was about 12 years old, when she started playing junior events in Florida.

"We were trying to get her to come in the fall, but she wanted to continue to play (pro tournaments)," Thornqvist said. "And then she called us in November, December maybe, and said, 'Hey, I'm thinking about going to school.'"

Cohen visited UF in December for the first time and made her choice between school and a pro career a bit easier.

"At the last second, she visited Florida and fell in love with it," Richard said. "Roland came up to Philadelphia. We had a great visit. We spent a lot of time together, and I thought he was a super coach. So we made the decision for her to go to Florida right now and put off the pro career."

She enrolled in January and missed the first week of class to play in a professional tournament.

When she finally arrived, she wasn't used to being in classes with a large number of people, as she had been home-schooled since third grade.

Cohen's teammates helped her adjust to college life right away, but it didn't take much for her to fit right in.

"I took the same classes as she's taking right now, so I said something about those classes," sophomore Csilla Borsanyi said. "But basically that's it, because she's very (mature) on the court, so she doesn't really need advice on the court."

"She's very nice but she's really,

really shy. Then she just opened up, and she's just so funny that we have to laugh at her all the time."

### Spark Plug

Cohen's presence changed the dynamics of this year's team right away.

She came in and started playing at the No. 1 position, something very rare for a freshman to do in college tennis.

"Even though she is playing (Court No.) 1, she's handled herself perfectly," Thornqvist said. "She's allowed the seniors to lead."

"There's never been any feathers ruffled by her coming in playing one. She's been very respectful to the others, and she's followed along with their leadership, which has allowed the chemistry of this team to be maybe the best it's been in years."

Cohen has used her speed and defense along with her ability to exploit opponents' weaknesses en route to a 13-3 singles record. She has teamed up with sophomore Anastasia Revzina in doubles, and the duo is unbeaten on the year.

"We started to play doubles, and we really got to know each other," Revzina said. "I couldn't wish for a better doubles partner. We're still undefeated, and we're so proud of it."

Cohen has already been named SEC Freshman of the Year by the

league's coaches and her squad is a favorite to win the conference tournament, but she has her sights on another prize.

"I'd like to win a national championship," Cohen said. "That'd mean a lot to me."

After the season ends, Cohen will be pressed to make a decision to remain in college for at least another year or turn pro.

"We've talked loosely about it," Thornqvist said. "I think she's on the two-year program here. She'll play two years. Maybe she'll play a lot of WTA events this coming fall. Maybe a very small number of college events. And then play another season next spring and maybe see where that takes it."

Richard agrees. "She'll probably stay in college another year," he said. "Then we'll see where she's at, re-evaluate things and possibly go pro after that if her game's ready for it."

And as for her limit in the professional world, her father has high hopes.

"I think she's got the potential to be top 25 in the world if she develops her transition game and her serve," Richard said.

Until then, it's the college way for Cohen.

She described a typical day as tennis in the morning, then class, more tennis in the afternoon, running on her own, sleeping, waking up and playing more tennis.

It's hard to get Cohen off the court, but when it happens, she always reverts back to the game she loves most.

"I like to go running, shopping," she said. "I really like to play tennis every day though. It's hard for me to stay away from it."

After all, did she ever really have a choice?

## Exiles may attempt to steal or put out Olympic flame

shirts and fly Tibetan flags.

"By speaking out when the Chinese government brings the Olympic torch to India, you will send a strong message to Tibetans, to the Chinese government, and to the world that Indians support the Dalai Lama and the Tibetan people's nonviolent struggle for freedom and justice," according to Students for a Free Tibet, a strident exile group.

Some exiles have said they plan to make a more dramatic statement, possibly trying to douse or steal the Olympic flame, although activists were sketchy about their plans.

Tenzin Tsundue, a Tibetan activist with a reputation for publicity stunts, said he didn't want to talk about specific plans in a telephone interview Wednesday because he fears his phone is tapped, a not uncommon practice in this part of the world.

"But be at India Gate tomorrow," he said, referring to a monument in New

Delhi that the torch will pass.

In Pakistan, runners carried the Olympic flame around the outside of the Jinnah Stadium in the capital of Islamabad on Wednesday, an invitation-only event in front of a sparse crowd with heavy security.

President Pervez Musharraf handed the torch to the first runner and later said the Pakistani people stood with China "in this glorious event you host for the entire world."

The Pakistan Olympic Association urged broadcasters using state TV coverage of the torch to avoid "negative comments" and to make "no mention" of the Tibet disturbances.

India and China are forging their closest ties since they fought a 1962 border war. Last year, two-way trade

reached \$37 billion.

Both countries, with their billion-plus populations, are seeking a greater role on the world stage, spurred by rapidly growing economies. However, India is still wary of China, whose economic, diplomatic and military clout in has grown in recent years.

But public sympathy in India lies with the Tibetans, who have sought refuge in the country since the Dalai Lama fled Tibet after a failed uprising against Beijing in 1959, setting up his government-in-exile in the northern town of Dharamsala.

While India needs to bow to popular sentiment and allow some Tibetan protests, it must ensure it does not jeopardize its important relations with China, analysts say.

"This is a fine balance that is being maintained," said New Delhi-based analyst C. Uday Bhaskar. "It is about seeing the big picture. Indo-Sino relations have a depth and implications for both countries, policy review cannot be done on an emotive issue."

Hudson usually throws in the low 90s, but his fastball stayed in the 84- to 86-mph range. Cox and his staff, already dealing with a wave of injuries, kept asking Hudson if something was wrong.

Hudson said his problem may have been a recent bout with the flu. He lost for the first time in seven career starts in Miami,

where he had been 4-0. His ERA rose from 2.14 to 3.38.

# Born to Serve

## Top freshman Cohen uses tennis background to lead UF into SEC Tourney

Before she even set foot in this world, Julia Cohen didn't have much of a choice.

Even if she had, it probably would have been the easiest decision of her life.

"My dad played [tennis] for the University of Pennsylvania and my mom plays as well," Cohen said. "So before I was born I was going to be a tennis player."

Now, it seems pretty clear to the UF freshman that this was the right path to take — or be forced into, for that matter.

Cohen started hitting tennis balls when she was just 2 years old. She began playing in tournaments when she was 5, and at 6 she was ranked No. 1 in 18-and-under doubles in the United States Tennis Association Middle States region, which includes Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware.

"When I was 8, I was pretty good," she said. "I won like eight internationals, so we knew I was pretty good when I was younger."

Next, Cohen was a national champion in the 9-and-under division, and at 11 she was the top-ranked 12-and-under singles player in the U.S.

She played her first professional event when she was just 14, and she reached No. 6 in the International Tennis Federation Junior Rankings when she was 15.

As a member of the UF women's ten-

nis team, Cohen has skyrocketed up the Intercollegiate Tennis Association rankings this season to No. 27.

She currently has a professional ranking of No. 398 in the Women's Tennis Association Tour singles rankings and was

once as high as No. 360 in the world.

Cohen will help lead the No. 5 Gators (18-1, 11-0 Southeastern Conference) in the upcoming postseason stretch, beginning with the SEC Tournament in Auburn, Ala., on Friday.

While her accomplishments continue to snowball, Cohen remembers that it all started with her family's love for the game.

### Keeping the Tradition

Cohen has lived in Philadelphia her entire life, just five minutes from the University of Pennsylvania, where she played tennis every day growing up.

The City of Brotherly Love could hardly measure up to the passion her family had for tennis.

Her father, Richard, was captain of the tennis team while he was at Penn. He pursued a professional tennis career for two years after college before going to medical school.

"I wasn't good enough to do it consistently, and I wasn't earning my expenses," said Richard Cohen, a board-certified psychiatrist for more than 30 years. "So although my love was tennis, I decided to go to med school."

Cohen's 23-year-old brother, Josh, graduated from Miami last year as an All-American on the men's tennis team. He is now the men's tennis assistant coach at Penn.

"Josh is probably the best player in the family," Richard Cohen said. "Julia's a close second, and I'm a far third. My wife's a pretty good player, and she's fourth."





