



UF discovers students' private info online

11,000 SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS WERE POSTED.

UF officials mailed letters to more than 11,000 current and former students of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences Tuesday to inform them that their private

information, including Social Security numbers, was posted online and may have been accessible to the public.

Computer forensics have determined with near certainty that no one had inappropriately accessed the information, said Steve Orlando, UF spokesman. Names and addresses were also collected and posted by two former student employees of the

Office for Academic Support and Institutional Service, or OASIS, on a Web page they created in the UF system.

off campus but did not secure it,

according to a Tuesday UF news release.

The data was collected from students who wanted to schedule tutoring. The page was used between 2003 and 2005 and was potentially accessible to anyone until it was discovered and removed in May.

Officials are trying to determine why Social Security numbers were collected, Orlando said. UF used Social Security numbers

to identify students until 2002, when students were given a UFID number. It's possible that there had been confusion over whether it was still appropriate, he said.

The UF Privacy Office would not comment to the media Wednesday.

The breach was discovered in an ongoing effort that began last year to audit all information on UF

Man found dead in canal

A naked body was found in a retention canal on Northeast 10th Avenue Wednesday morning.

A Gainesville Regional Utilities employee saw the body around 8:30 a.m. and called the Gainesville Police Department.

Police have been unable to find out the identity of the man, how he died or why he was in the canal.

GPD spokeswoman Summer Hallett said the man is 5 feet 6 inches tall and 121 pounds. He is white, with dark, almost black hair, brown eyes, a goatee and a beard, Hallett said.

The man also has three tattoos.

One tattoo is a skull and crossbones with eagle wings. There is a Harley-Davidson banner under the skull, and "Little Ray" is written underneath.

Another tattoo is a naked woman with angel wings. All three images are greenish black in color.

Delivery drivers feel gas hike

Skyrocketing fuel prices cut profits

Most people have to get oil changes every three months.

Sarah Griffin has to get them almost every month.

Griffin, 20, has been a delivery driver for Pizza Hut on Archer Road since November 2007.

"I needed a job where I could make cash every day," the SFCC nursing student said.

Until this summer, Griffin said she was satisfied with her job. During Gator football season, pizza orders were high, and the tips were more generous when the Gators won games.

Plus, when Griffin started in November, the average gallon of gas cost a little more than \$3.

Now, with many college students out of town and gas prices at a national average of more than \$4 per gallon, she has had to take a second job to make enough money.

Like Griffin, many local student delivery drivers and the delivery companies they work for have had to adjust to the effects of the increase in gas prices on their profits.

Tip money makes up a major part of a delivery driver's income — some of which goes

Prof. designs flying saucer

■ AIRCRAFT COULD BE USED BY NASA, AIR FORCE.

A UF professor is working toward developing the mothership of science-fiction aficionados' dreams: a real flying saucer.

Subrata Roy, a mechanical and aerospace engineering associate professor, has designed a disk-shaped aircraft that he calls the "wingless electromagnetic air vehicle," or WEAV. The patent for the aircraft, which will measure less than six inches across, is still pending.

Ideally, Roy's aircraft could be used to fly through other planets' atmospheres and explore extraterrestrial terrain. It could also be employed for more practical uses, such as surveillance and navigation purposes.

"This has nothing to do with aliens," Roy said. "This is more of science than fiction."

Put simply, the force that makes the aircraft hover is created when a magnetic field is passed through plasma, the force of which swirls the surrounding air and creates enough momentum to lift the craft, according to a Wednesday

UF news release. The disk will be capable of rotating, but it will not have to spin in order to fly.

In fact, there are no moving parts in the design, Roy said.

If the project gets off the ground, the design could be equipped with a camera for surveillance on Earth and in space.

However, there are still a few obstacles that could keep Roy's aircraft from taking off.

Researchers have attempted

to use plasma technology with conventional aircrafts in the past, but they have not been successful, Roy said.

The craft will also need a battery that is both powerful and light. Creating such a battery is not an impossible feat, he said, but it still needs to be developed.

NASA and the U.S. Air Force are interested in using the craft if Roy's disc is developed, according to the release.

"I don't see any limitation to what it can do, but we can only get that far when we develop the first craft," Roy said.

The next step in getting the WEAV off the ground is finding sponsors and getting a team together to create a model for testing, which Roy hopes to do by fall.

"Theory works, so hopefully it won't be a big challenge," he said. "But if it is a big challenge, we will find a way to solve it."

BOT to vote on tuition

The Board of Trustees, UF's highest governing body, will discuss and vote on a 15 percent tuition hike during its meetings today and Friday.

Steve Orlando, UF spokesman, said if the trustees approve the increase on Friday, about 9,400 UF students — incoming freshman and sophomores without Florida Prepaid — will be required to pay an extra 15 percent on their tuition, Orlando said.

The tuition increase is possible through the Differential Tuition Program, which allows UF to incrementally raise tuition 40 percent over four years, starting with this fall's incoming freshman class.

A 6 percent tuition boost from the state Legislature and the 9

percent boost from UF accounts for the 15 percent tuition hike.

UF President Bernie Machen wrote in an e-mail that no additional talks about UF's 2008-2009 budget would be discussed at the meetings.

The Trustees approved a plan to cut \$47 million from next year's budget during a telephone conference call May 14.

Because a substantial portion of the faculty is not in Gainesville during summer, Orlando said that the board tries not to tackle too many major issues in their absence.

"They don't want faculty to think they're trying to slip anything past them," he said.

Heavy storms expected to continue through weekend

■ LOCAL MAN HOSPITALIZED AFTER BEING HIT BY LIGHTNING TUESDAY.

And then there was rain.

The storms on Tuesday and Wednesday marked the beginning of the wet season in Gainesville, and though the rain will help abate dry conditions and wildfires, its effects on local electricity, traffic and safety are already being felt.

Almost two inches of rain fell over the

area, and wind gusts reached 47 miles per hour over the two-day period, according to the National Weather Service.

Such conditions always lead to more accidents, said Eugene Morris, acting spokesman for the Alachua County Sheriff's Office.

One man was struck by lightning during Tuesday's storm as he stood under a tree between Lowe's Home Improvement store and Regal Gainesville Cinema 14 near Archer Road.

Austin Lowe, 20, had burns on the lower half of his body, and the nearby tree was on fire when police arrived, said Gainesville

Police spokeswoman Summer Hallett. He was taken to Shands at UF for treatment.

Lowe was in serious condition around 5 p.m. Wednesday, according to Kim Jamerson, the media relations coordinator at Shands.

Besides the increased risk of injury from lightning, minor car accidents are also more common during thunderstorms.

"Drivers should slow down a bit," Morris said. "When roads get this way, it tends to increase our business."

The strong winds and rain led to a pow-

er outage for 2,000 Gainesville Regional Utilities customers Tuesday when a pine tree fell on a power line on the 37th block of Northwest 39th Avenue.

There were also scattered outages throughout Wednesday, and about 300 customers lost power for more than an hour.

Ludie Bond, a wildfire mitigation specialist at the Florida Division of Forestry, said she could not remember the last time this year that Gainesville had so much consistent rain.

Thunderstorms are expected to continue into the weekend, according to the National Weather Service.

Media rights activist, UF professor to retire after 43 years

After spending 43 years devoted to media rights, a prominent fighter for freedom of information

and longtime UF professor will retire on June 30.

Bill Chamberlin has been the UF Joseph L. Brechner Eminent Scholar in Mass Communications since 1987 and has won many ac-

colades for his work throughout his career.

Newspapers weren't hiring when Chamberlin graduated from the University of Washington as an aspiring journalist, so he accepted a teaching job at Central Washington State College to waive his eligibility for the Vietnam War draft.

Little did he know teaching and mentoring would become the passion of his life — not just a means of sparing it, as he originally intended.

"All I knew was that something just felt natural," Chamberlin said.

He went on to co-author a media law textbook used by several of the nation's top journalism colleges and played a key role in the curriculum developments of UF's mass media law graduate and doctoral programs.

Despite an illustrious teaching career, Chamberlin's contributions did not stop at guiding budding journalists.

Chamberlin remained focused on fighting for media rights for the rest of his career, and he said he hopes to leave behind a legacy of encouraging journalists and the public to utilize their right to freedom of information as much as he did.

"It's critical that the public understand that we have a right to know what government is doing," he said. "The way we learn is by taking advantage of the access we have to meetings and records and by supporting journalists who are

going to do the same."

Chamberlin established the Brechner Center for Freedom of Information, a non-profit educational center in the College of Journalism and Communications, where journalists, attorneys and the public can go to have questions about media law answered.

He also founded the Marion Brechner Citizen Access Project, which rates the open meetings and open records laws of all of the states.

He even co-founded the National Freedom of Information Coalition, a group that fosters and coordinates groups fighting for access to information in almost all 50 states.

Charles Davis, a University of Missouri professor and executive director of the National Freedom of Information Coalition, was one of Chamberlin's former students at UF.

"One of the wonderful things about academia is the ability to carry on beyond yourself through helping others," Davis said. "Bill has quite a genealogy of people out there, like myself, for whom he has erected successful academic careers."

Davis said despite Chamberlin's contributions to the fight for freedom of information, Chamberlin would probably say his greatest achievement was the progress of his students.

Davis' prediction was right.

Chamberlin said more than anything he feels most proud of the relationships he has developed with his students, some of who have gone on to teach at the best universities in the country.


Kim Walsh-Childers, now a UF journalism professor, was one of his students when he taught at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

"It's easy for faculty to get jaded and become frustrated with students," Walsh-Childers said, "but Bill has never taken that attitude."

When one student lost her family's home to a hurricane, Walsh-Childers said Chamberlin worked around the clock to gather donations and supplies to help the student get back on her feet.

Chamberlin and his wife, Jeanne, hosted Thanksgiving dinner at their home several years in a row for international students unable to make it home for the holidays, she added. And when Walsh-Childers saw Chamberlin and his wife sitting in the back of the room at her son's fifth grade graduation last week, she said she was not at all surprised.

"He is one of the most loyal people I have ever known," Walsh-Childers said. "I don't know who is going to fill his role."

Night construction temporarily closes parts of 34th Street

Gainesville drivers will experience temporary lane closures on Northwest 34th Street between Northwest Fifth Avenue and U.S. Highway 441. The closures will last from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Thursday until fall.

During this time, one lane will remain open, which will alternate northbound and southbound traffic, said Chip Skinner, a spokesman for the Florida Department of Transportation.

Construction company APAC-Southeast of Jacksonville will make improvements to the street, such as removing and replacing the existing pavement, replacing or extending existing drainage pipes

to meet current safety requirements and adding wheelchair-accessible ramps to the sidewalk at side street intersections.


"At the most, people may be delayed about 10 minutes," Skinner said.

The 4.5-mile project will cost an estimated \$2.3 million and should be completed by fall, according to a Department of Transportation news release.

The project is funded by the state through the gas tax, Skinner said.

He also said motorists should be aware of the direction of traffic during construction hours.

When turning onto the road from a side street, they should wait until traffic clears before turning in the same direction of traffic flow to avoid a head-on collision, he said.

Former UF professor, author leaves lasting legacy

■ SMITH KIRKPATRICK DIED OF LUNG CANCER FRIDAY.

Smith Kirkpatrick, a former UF professor, spent much of his childhood in awe of seashells he found while playing in the Arkansas mountains.

His daughter, Katie Kirkpatrick, said it was his early fascination with the natural world that spawned a desire to make his career revolve around writing and helping others, including UF students, hone their talents for the same craft.

Kirkpatrick, 85, died in his Gainesville home Friday with his two daughters, Anna Marie and Katie, grandchildren, friends and former students at his side. He battled lung cancer for several years.

Kirkpatrick came to UF in the 1950s as a fiction-writing student of Andrew Lytle, head of UF's Creative Writing Program. When Lytle left the program to become editor of *The Sewanee Review*, Kirkpatrick kept the program alive.

One of Kirkpatrick's significant UF contributions was founding the UF Writer's Conference, where famous writers, editors and agents

would come and help young writers get their big break. Katie said the day before he died, her father received a wooden plaque from UF thanking him for founding the conference.

He published his only novel based upon his experiences in the Navy, called "The Sun's Gold."

She said his liberal teaching style often clashed with those of administrators and other professors, but he found favor with his students, who

called him "Kirk."

One of his most renowned students, Harry Crews, dedicated his first novel, "The Gospel Singer," to Kirkpatrick.

"When people would take his class, it was unlike any other writing class they had taken," Katie said.

She said the family plans to scatter his ashes across the same Arkansas Mountains where he first fostered his desire to put his thoughts into words.

Dept. of State gives UF grant for foreign policy program

Academics from across the globe began a six-week program Monday to learn about U.S. foreign policy at UF with the help of a grant from the U.S. Department of State.

UF's political science department received \$250,000 from the State Department's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs to conduct the study program.

The State Department selects academics who are not accustomed to the U.S. in order to familiarize them with American society, said Ido Oren, UF political science professor and co-director of the program.

The program, which ends July 20, will consist of four weeks of study at UF and two weeks of tours in Miami, Chicago and Washington, D.C. This is UF's first time receiving the grant.

Oren said only about half of the pro-




gram's 18 participants had ever been to the U.S.

The participants are expected to apply what they learn in their classrooms at home. Robert Tambe-Ebot, a participant and lecturer from Cameroon, said it is a unique opportunity for him to combat ignorance of American foreign policy in his country, which he said breeds hostility toward the U.S.

"When I get back home, I can share new ideas with other academics," Tambe-Ebot said. "And with politicians. Why not?"



Gainesville's newfound preoccupation with precipitation has left us at the Department of Darts and Laurels running for cover. Don't get us wrong, we're all about "Singin' in the Rain" when the opportunity presents itself, but the ominous dark clouds and violent thunder storms of these past couple of days have left us singing "Gimme Shelter" instead. We hope you've been able to keep dry these last few days, but if not, don't fret, 'cause there's always "Sunshine After the Rain." But just in case this somber weather has got you down, we have a brand new, waterproof edition of Darts and Laurels for your enjoyment. Now "Who Do You Love?"

Darts & Laurels

First off, we send a way-to-give-us-one-more-excuse-to-not-go-to-the-gym **DART** to UF Department of Recreational Sports for instituting a new gym membership fee for students not enrolled in classes. What makes us so perturbed about the \$50 summer B fee and the \$100 summer C and fall fees is that the decision to start charging students for using campus gyms was not made out of economic necessity, but instead seems to have been made on a whim. RecSports reassures us the change has nothing to do with the menacing budget cuts or any other pecuniary shortfall. Indeed, they say they don't even know how they're going to use the new revenue. If there's no monetary emergency, why the hell are they bleeding dry those who want to get in — or stay in — shape?

Next up, we chuck a could-you-possibly-be-any-more-incompetent? **DART** to the UF administration and the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences for compromising the privacy of current and former students — some 12,000 of them — by posting personal information, including Social Security numbers, on the World Wide Web for all to see.

The breach occurred from 2003-2005 when former student employees posted the personal information of students who used the tutoring services of the CLAS-operated Office for Academic Support and Institutional Service. The information turned up during a system audit, which was reported Tuesday. In this age of rampant spamming, phishing and identity theft, we would like to believe the administration would have all the privacy bases covered. This week's revelation that sensitive student information has been online for some four years is more than disconcerting, it is a disgrace. We expect more from the suits at Tigert and Turlington halls.

Something weird is going on here. For the second straight week, we have something nice to say about our elected officials as we offer an at-least-you-tried-to-save-the-planet **LAUREL** to Sen. Bill Nelson and Sen. Mel Martinez for supporting a failed attempt at tackling what is arguably the most critically important issue facing the nation (and, for that matter, the world): climate change.

Floridians should be proud that both Nelson and Martinez stood up to combat global warming by supporting the Lieberman-Warner Climate Security Act. Unfortunately, advocates of the measure failed to break the 60-vote cloture threshold. Failing to reach the 60-vote plateau, proponents of the bill were forced to shelve what would have been the most sweeping climate change control measure to date. Nevertheless, we thank our senators for siding with science in an effort to reverse the harmful effects of global warming.

Lastly, we present a we-know-you-will-be-rocking-out-in-the-afterworld **LAUREL** to the supremely influential rock and blues legend **Bo Diddley**, who passed away last week in his Archer home at the age of 79. Diddley was known as "The Originator" for pioneering the soulful sounds that influenced the likes of rock gods The Rolling Stones, The Who, Tom Petty and Bruce Springsteen, among innumerable others. The UF Board of Trustees is expected to award Diddley with a posthumous honorary degree in recognition of his contributions to music and the arts — which we think is more than fitting.

The Rock and Roll Hall of Famer's gritty and innovative sound was often imitated, but never reproduced.

Candidates sing same song on Iran

Coming of age in the era of President George W. Bush has left me almost incapable of being surprised by politicians' audacious disregard for history and their adamant refusal to learn from past mistakes. But this week I found myself shocked and awed at Sen. John McCain's statements about Iran when addressing a pro-Israeli lobbying organization, the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC). In his speech, McCain proclaimed, "Tehran's pursuit of nuclear weapons poses an unacceptable risk, a danger we cannot allow" — as if it is a fact that Iran is currently pursuing nuclear weapons.

Who cares if a 2007 National Intelligence Estimate, a compilation of opinions and findings from our 16 intelligence agencies, reported with "high confidence" that Iran stopped all attempts to develop nuclear weapons in 2003 due to international pressure and scrutiny? Pay no mind to the fact that Iran has been increasingly cooperative with the International Atomic Energy Agency, who has also reported there is no information to suggest Iran is seeking to develop nuclear arms. So what if the only evidence the world has of a nuclear weapons program in Iran is an unverifiable U.S.-provided document, which the U.S. refuses to fully release to the IAEA or Iran, showing loose plans to develop a nuclear missile prior to 2004?

Luckily, we have the Democratic Party to remind us of these facts and to serve as a rebuttal to McCain's truth twisting. Or is there really much of a difference?

Sen. Hillary Clinton, in an attempt to show her toughness on foreign policy, took it a step further than McCain, saying she would "totally obliterate" Iran and its 70 million inhabitants if Iran attacked Israel with nuclear weapons. Clinton conveniently bypassed the whole development part of the nuclear arms equation and went straight for the sort of war mongering that makes McCain, Bush and the rest of the neo-conservative contingent salivate with anticipation.

Sen. Barack Obama, on the other hand, has been outspoken on this issue, even in the face of incessant Republican

attacks. He has continually pressed for increased diplomacy and unconditional talks with the Iranian regime in order to avoid an armed confrontation.

That is, until last week. In a speech to AIPAC on June 4, Obama repeatedly reassured the audience he would do "everything" in his power to "prevent Iran from obtaining a nuclear weapon" — obviously hinting at the use of force. In his speech, Obama joined McCain and Clinton in assuming Iran is actively pursuing nuclear weapons. This assumption has dangerous implications.

Obama has also backed off his previous "unconditional talks" position and is now equivocating on what "unconditional" means.

Perhaps even he has already forgotten the run-up to the Iraq war when, despite the lack of a true consensus in the U.S. intelligence community, the Bush administration relentlessly spoke of the threat of nuclear capabilities falling into the hands of a "terrorist state."

Obama should have the courage, just as he did in 2002 before the invasion of Iraq, to point out the fallacies of the Republican propaganda machine — where any half-truth or bold faced lie can become fact if its simply repeated enough. Unfortunately, he and most of the American people have fallen into the same fear trap that has led to the deaths of over 4,000 American soldiers and 600,000 to 1.2 million Iraqis.

Sen. Obama, we have heard this story before. Let's not get duped twice in one generation. For as the old saying goes, "Fool me once, shame on — shame on you. Fool me — you can't get fooled again." Or something like that.





Most stores counter fuel prices with delivery charges; little goes to drivers

to paying for gas to make deliveries.

Griffin's average tip per delivery now ranges from loose change to \$2.

"Sometimes you go out to somewhere, and you lose money because you're paying for the gas to get there, and they don't tip you," she said.

Griffin, who usually spends \$25 on gas every day she works, said she sometimes delivers all the way to Haile Plantation, which is at least six miles away.

In her opinion, the minimum tip should be the price of a gallon of gas to help delivery drivers cover their expenses.

Jimmy Green, general manager at Papa John's on Archer Road, said despite gas prices, he has more applications than ever for delivery driver positions.

College students make up eighty percent of his staff.

"I would actually say it's easier now to staff my store than in the past," said Green, a 22-year-old UF economics junior.

He said there are 17 delivery drivers working at his location, most between the ages of 18 and 23. Drivers are paid \$5.15 an hour, plus \$1.10 per delivery and whatever tips they collect.

Green said a good driver can easily make at least \$10 to \$15 per hour.

The average number of deliveries per day for the Papa John's last week was 125, he said. So far this summer, sales for the store have been an average of 8 to 15 percent higher than last year.

Still, the rise in the price of fuel has caused the cost of food supplies and other goods to increase.

To help cover additional expenses, Green said most delivery companies have added a delivery charge, which does not go directly to the drivers.

Stores also deal with the new operating costs by sending drivers out with more than one delivery order at a time, Green said.

Jim Dewey, program director of the economic analysis program at UF's Bureau of Economic and Business Research, said strong international demand for fuel has sent prices

soaring, which forces businesses like Papa John's to find ways to adjust.

"Fuel is a major component of production costs, and when fuel prices increase, eventually it has to be reflected in price increases one way or another," Dewey said.

Businesses have to figure out how to adapt to increased expenses while not charging the customers too much extra money, he said.

Griffin said she has not expressed her own financial concerns to her managers because there's little they can do at the local level to help.

She feels lucky she has a fuel-efficient car, a 2001 Chevrolet Cavalier, she said.

Edward Coker, a SFCC sophomore and part-time Papa John's delivery driver, said he spends more money on gas when he works on the busier weekend days — sometimes up to \$50 a day.

Coker, 29, said paying for gas and maintaining his truck, a 2003 GMC Sonoma, are two of the most difficult parts of being a delivery driver.

Coker didn't have many complaints, though.

"The money is pretty good for a part-time job," he said.

He earns an average of about \$3 in tips per delivery and is content with the money in his pocket when he leaves work.

Like Griffin, he also has a second income, only his comes from his years spent in the Army.

Griffin said she never understood the importance of tips before she became a delivery driver.

"It's hard because when you deliver pizzas to somebody, and they don't tip you, you have to be able to hold your tongue," she said. "You just want to say to them, 'Do you realize gas is four dollars?' Some people just don't care though."





Student Senate joins effort to support earthquake victims

■ SENS. JOINED CHINESE STUDENTS IN RAISING MONEY FOR VICTIMS.

The UF Student Senate unanimously passed a bill at Tuesday's meeting extending the full support of the student body to the victims of the earthquake that occurred one month ago today in Sichuan, China.

While the impact of the natural disaster and a death toll nearing 80,000 continue to plague survivors, some senators chipped in for the country's rebuilding efforts.

UF senators announced that they raised \$71 at meetings to help the Friendship Association of Chinese Students and Scholars, or FACSS, provide relief to the earthquake's victims.

"The \$71 is probably insignificant compared to the amounts FACSS has raised," said Sen. Bowie Stephens.

But an FACSS official said every dollar counts.

Jiawei Zhang, UF electrical engineering junior and FACSS vice president, said more than \$20,000 has been donated by students to the FACSS relief fund since the group started tabling around campus May 13.

Sen. Tom Cockriel, judiciary chairman, said FACSS plans to use the donations to reconstruct an elementary school. Cockriel said Student Government does not transfer money from its reserves into donations for such causes because the money is allotted elsewhere.

Zhang said FACSS will send the money to the Red Cross Society of China within the next couple days. But this is only a starting point for the group's fundraising efforts, he added.

"It is going to take a long time to rebuild what was destroyed," he said.

Columbia University also discovered a similar breach Wednesday

systems. Orlando said it is likely that more breaches will be discovered as the audit continues.

This is the largest privacy breach discovered at UF, he said. By Wednesday afternoon, UF officials had received about

170 phone calls, and the Privacy Office Web site had 2,700 hits.

Officials could not find contact information for about 570 students who may have been affected.

Johann Arias, a spring CLAS graduate, had not heard about the breach Wednesday and said UF should be doing more to notify those affected.

"They always make information very prominent when you have a hold or owe them money," Arias said.


The privacy breach is not unique to UF. In a similar situation Wednesday, the Columbia Daily

Spectator reported that the Social Security numbers of 5,000 current and former Columbia University students had been posted online. Columbia arranged two-year subscriptions to a credit-monitoring service for the affected students, the paper reported.

Orlando said UF officials discussed a similar offer, but it

was shot down because research shows identity theft is unlikely in a situation like this, and it would cost about \$32 per subscription.

Students who do not receive a letter but suspect that their information may have been compromised should visit privacy.ufl.edu and call UF's Privacy Office Hotline at 866-876-HIPA.

UF students join protest of South Korean president

■ **KOREAN-U.S. BEEF TRADE SPARKED ONGOING PROTEST.**

South Korean students and families gathered on campus for an unconventional demonstration Tuesday night to show support for a national movement aiming to spark a change in the South Korean government.

About 20 people, mostly students and their families, met on the Reitz Union Colonnade with candles in hand to discuss ongoing protests in Seoul, South Korea's capital, against the country's new president, Lee Myung-bak.

As they sat in a circle, the UF demonstrators mirrored the peaceful protesting methods used by 100,000 in South Korea and held signs calling for Myung-bak's resignation.

"Most of us are people who want to be there in spirit," said Sungho Oh, a UF doctoral student who has lived in the United States for six years.

The Tuesday demonstration was the group's second meeting in response to the massive movement in Seoul.

The Seoul protest started May

2 as a result of Myung-bak's decision to reopen beef trade with the U.S. after a five-year ban following a confirmed 2003 case of mad cow disease in the U.S.

The agreement, made April 18, angered many South Koreans who worry about the safety of American beef after the 2003 case, even though the World Organisation for Animal Health has since found American beef to be safe, according to a recent New York Times article.

The protesters have used the beef issue as a platform to express other grievances against the president, who was elected in December.

The South Korean community that gathered at the Reitz Union, however, is focused on supporting their people's efforts and not on creating a united political voice, said Yongseok Jang, a UF graduate student.

"We haven't reached any kind of collective opinion," Jang said. "We just decided to move along with what's happening in Korea."

Jang said the president has acknowledged the protesters' complaints but has not offered a solution to the plight.

"He made a public statement

to apologize a week ago, but he didn't address anything he can do," he said.

"It was empty."

Jang, who was a student in the

first generation of a democratized Korea, said the peaceful demonstrations in South Korea are different from the pivotal 1987 protest, when thousands rioted in

the streets against the country's then military dictatorship.

"I haven't seen any demonstration like this," he said. "It's really kind of new."

Battling for bike safety

Band, organization work to keep cyclists safe

James Brown was pacing back and forth nervously waiting for the second call. It was late in the evening on May 5, 2007. He had just finished playing a show in Miami with his band, Battle!, of Gainesville. He was hoping she would be OK.

The first call came from his friend Bill in Boston. He said Kelly Wallace, Brown's ex-girlfriend, had been struck by a car while riding her bicycle without

wearing a helmet. Bill said he would call Brown back to let him know what was going on.

The second call finally came. Wallace had died. Brown waited for him to say that it was just a joke, and nothing had really happened. But then reality hit. His ex-girlfriend — someone he had loved and cared so much about — was gone.

"It was like my heart stopped, and I had so many mixed emotions hit me all at once, so I didn't really know what to do," Brown said.

But during the last year, Brown and his band members decided what they wanted to do.

"I think because we are a hardcore punk band, we are really speaking to the right people."

They wanted to help.

A mutual friend of Brown and Wallace, Zack Smith, started the organization Helping Everyone Live Longer, or HELL, after both Wallace and another friend of

Smith's were killed in bicycle accidents within one month of each other.

The Boston-based organization raises money and distributes free helmets to cyclists.

Smith takes collection jars to various locations around Boston, like record stores and coffee shops. With the jars, he leaves a stack of business cards with information about HELL and his phone number for those interested in learning more about the organization.

— One woman who read about Wallace's accident bought about 20 helmets and donated about \$2,000, Brown said.

He said the organization has grown a lot since it began almost one year ago.

"When I was up there hanging out with [Smith] in his apartment there were just stacks of helmets, almost like a warehouse," Brown said.

The organization has handed out more than 300 helmets since its start.

Brown's band plays an active role in spreading the word locally about HELL. At each of the band's shows, the merchandise table has a collection cup and

Juneteenth Festival showcases African-American heritage The event celebrates its second year in Gainesville

A late flight into the wrong airport did not keep Kenneth Ogungbemi from attending the Juneteenth Festival & Juried Art Show last year. It did, however, keep him from competing.

This year, Ogungbemi, a Nigerian-born artist from Brazil, has arrived early in order to compete at the 2nd Annual Juneteenth Festival this weekend.

His work has been chosen for the festival's poster art and will be featured alongside 60 other local and international artists, including landscape artists the Florida Highwaymen.

Although a lot of them have passed

away, there will be nine in town for the festival.

Vivian Filer has lived in Gainesville for 63 years and considers herself to be one of the original "freedom fighters."

Filer, chair of the board of directors for the Cotton Club Museum and Cultural Center, Inc. said Juneteenth is a celebration of the freedom of enslaved people in the United States after the Emancipation Proclamation was passed on Jan. 1, 1863.

The celebration began in Galveston, Texas, where on June 19, 1865, enslaved people first heard that they were free.

Over the years, other states have formed their own traditions of celebration. The Gainesville Juneteenth Festival is the largest in North Central Florida, Filer said.

She said the goal of the festival is "to explore and celebrate and enjoy the rich history of African-American people and United States history in general."



Isaacs

It is hosted by the Cotton Club Museum and Cultural Center and is funded in part by a Tourism Product Development Grant to promote cultural activity in the area during non-peak times, said Donna Isaacs, executive director of the Cotton Club Museum.

"When they found out they were free, it was a fun time with music and celebrating," Isaacs said. "This festival recreates that cultural festivity."

The festival has been downsized from two stages to one and will provide a more intimate atmosphere for vendors, Isaacs said. The stage will feature performances headlined by blues guitarist Lurrie Bell.

Despite the changes, Isaacs expects 7,500 people to attend the festival. Last year 5,000 people attended.

The festival will feature food, music, an art competition, children's activities and a youth talent competition.

"This gives the children an alternative venue to learn about their history," Isaacs said.

Filer said everyone who wants a cultural experience is welcome, not just African-Americans.

The festival will run from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Saturday and Sunday at Lincoln Park, located off Southeast 15th Street near Lincoln Middle School. Admission is free.



Handler's book a summer must-read

Chelsea Handler began telling wild and eccentric lies at the age of 9. Since then, she has not stopped, and neither have the bizarre situations her untruths get her into.

The humorous "Are You There Vodka? It's Me, Chelsea" chronicles the adventures and mishaps of Chelsea Handler.

The host of E!'s late night talk show "Chelsea Lately" writes various short stories describing her life, ranging from childhood humiliation to drunken adult debauchery.

Let's face it. It's not Dostoevsky. No large, life-changing lessons will be learned from this book, and it will not make you weep because of the bravery its heroine displays in trials and tribulations.

But if you're looking for a leisurely read or a good laugh, you might want to consider Handler's latest book.

The book is well-written and

are similar to those in Tucker Max's novel "I Hope They Serve Beer in Hell."

One perk is that Handler is able to laugh at herself. Many of the stories focus on the odd predicaments that arise due to her intoxicated, compulsive lying.

In one story she describes an incident where a large Japanese woman throws her out of a shady massage parlor because she wrongly assumes Handler wants a "happy ending" with her appointment.

Handler writes candidly about her love life, describing the ascent and collapse of her relationships with two men.

Though few can say they've experienced the same far-fetched situations she writes about, it is easy to connect with her and laugh out loud at her spitfire dialogue.

This probably isn't the book you would mention in a job interview or intellectual conversation, but it's perfectly suited for a poolside read.



Old shtick on 'Weezer'

Not many guitar heroes make it through their high school years without getting slapped with the dropout tag, so it's even more impressive that Weezer frontman Rivers Cuomo gets to flaunt a bachelor's degree in English from Harvard University. A decade-long stint with the Ivy League's finest must afford one all kinds of vital knowledge, and yet Cuomo still can't wrap his horn-rimmed head around the law of diminishing returns.

Which brings us to "Weezer" — the band's third album in an endless saga of rainbow-spanning eponymous records. Following the masterfully quirky power pop of "Blue" and the obnoxiously quirky power pop of "Green," the band's newest self-titled LP, known as "The Red Album" because of its association with shame and embarrassment, revisits a gimmick that will only appeal to fans and toddlers learning their colors.

Opener "Troublemaker," with its crowd-pleasing, crunching guitar and rousing chorus combo is something of a misleading false start, as it is in fact, entirely listenable. From here, this collection nosedives a la Oceanic Flight 815.

"The Greatest Man That Ever Lived"

laces Quaker reverence with a cappella rhyming and a healthy dose of police siren in hopes that the whole will trump the sum of its parts. The whole is a miscarried rock opera that makes Cuomo's mustachioed cowboy image on the record's cover seem positively respectable by comparison.

Following the admittedly catchy "Pork and Beans," "Heart Songs" features a ludicrous lyric that holds the dubious distinction of being the first to rhyme Debbie Gibson with Michael Jackson. It's hard to tell who wrote this one.

Moving on, "Everybody Get Dangerous" recalls The Breeders' "Cannonball" (notice the guitar effects in the chorus) but regrettably finds our frontman aping Anthony Kiedis' surfer dude rapping delivery in the verse. It sounds like a radio disappointment, but if "Beverly Hills" can get airplay, all bets are off.

The fact that Cuomo gets to subsist on this overplayed hobby he tries to pass off as a career might strike a future college graduate as unfair, but maybe now that he has a diploma, he'll finally do what the rest of us must: find a real job.







The Home Stretch

Ealey's storied career comes to an end at NCAAs

The sun hangs high in the hot summer sky, and Lakecia Ealey steps into the blocks — just as she has done so many times before. But this time is different somehow. Maybe it's because of the sweltering Florida heat. Or maybe it's because she doesn't know how

many more times she will be able to do this. She looks down at the dark orange surface and closes her eyes for a brief moment before racing down the track.

Saying Goodbye

For Ealey, every race is one step closer to saying goodbye.

Goodbye to UF and goodbye to the sport that she loves.

She will compete in the final meet of

her collegiate career this weekend at the NCAA Track and Field Championships in Des Moines, Iowa.

But the senior has already had to say her hardest goodbye — the one to the man who helped get her to where she is today.

Ealey lost a coach, a friend and a mentor when former women's track and field coach Tom Jones passed away in March 2007 at 62 years old after a long battle with cancer. Jones led the Gators to six Southeastern Conference titles, 23 school records and coached the women's track program for 15 of its 35-year history.

"To lose him was like losing a second father," Ealey said. "If it wasn't for him, I wouldn't be at the University of Florida."

In June 2007, Mike Holloway was named the head coach of the women's track and field program after spending five years leading the men. It was the first time in school history that the same coach had led the men's and women's programs.

"It's been hard to adjust," Ealey said. "(Coach Jones) meant a lot to me. All you can do is take it one day at a time."

Since taking over the women's program, Holloway has done his best to help Ealey and the rest of the team deal with the loss.

"We don't talk about it a lot. She kind of internalizes most of that stuff," he said. "It hasn't been easy for her. It hasn't been easy on any of us. We talk a lot about the kind of guy he was and the kind of work ethic he had. He had a passion for this school, and that is something that I have tried to pass on to the girls."


That passion isn't something they have forgotten.

"We're all out there running for him," Ealey said.

A New Beginning

Though Holloway had great success with the men's program, Ealey found the transition to her new coach to be a difficult one.

"His style of training was just completely different than I was used to," Ealey said. "It was definitely an adjustment."

Worse than my limited recognition of the player pool was my limited understanding of the proceedings and rules.

I can best compare it to watching a rugby match. You can tell it's something you should like, and you can tell who the badasses are, but if asked to explain it to a friend, you'd have no shot.

With UF sophomore shortstop Cole Figueroa going in the sixth round to the San Diego Padres and the taste of the first round selection of former first baseman Matt LaPorta still fresh on the palate of Gators fans, the draft has become something to watch in Gainesville. Even if it holds no more clarity than a bunch of Aussies giving each other what can only be described as piggy-back rides and getting into "scrumms." Figueroa alone represents an educational talking piece for casual fans attempting to immerse themselves in the complexities of the draft.

A player is draft eligible right out of high school, at any point in a junior college career or after three years at a four-year university.

I know what you're thinking, Figueroa did, in fact, play for the Gators. Not only that, but UF is handing out more than AA degrees and he just completed his sophomore year. Put all those observations together and Cole doesn't seem to meet draft criteria.

Except for the fact that he's turning 21 in June. If a player turns 21 before the signing period ends, he becomes draft eligible regardless of the other conditions, making Figueroa a "draft-eligible sophomore" as my draft-savvy friend put it.

The Texas Rangers also wanted to select him in the third round, but didn't based on something those in the biz call "signability." Since Figueroa has ample leverage in shunning a contract he deems unattractive and returning to school to raise his stock (and potentially his signing bonus), teams are wary of drafting a player of that sort.

No team wants to throw away a pick they have no chance of signing, which explains why he fell to the sixth round.

If the draft is California, then signability has a thick Austrian accent, because it is that concept which governs the draft itself.

It explains why teams often draft players they don't have at the top of their boards.

They think they might have trouble signing them, so they play it safe with a player they know they can get into their farm system.

Another contributing factor to the head-scratching theory that teams don't take the player they perceive to be the best available is the fact that picks cannot be traded.

Teams are locked into their slots (determined by worst-to-best records of the previous season and a few other convoluted stipulations) whether it makes sense to take the player they want at that spot or not.

Imagine if the Dallas Cowboys had the fifth pick right after the Oakland Raiders in this year's NFL Draft. Jerry Jones knew for sure that he wanted a running back and nothing else, but there clearly wasn't another running back to be taken with the fifth pick after Darren McFadden was selected. Now had it been the MLB Draft he would've been powerless to trade that pick, inevitably reaching for Jonathan Stewart — or his guy Felix Jones — with the fifth pick.

In basketball and football, organizations don't have to worry about signability, and they have the freedom to trade their picks. In baseball, you draft where you're designated to draft and you like it.

The anonymity of the players, inability of the organizations to select the top talent and mind-numbing length make baseball's version of the draft look like the ugly red-headed sister of professional sports' drafts.

Furthermore, fans want star power at the top of the draft, and baseball largely fails to deliver in that category.

Since the first draft in 1965, not one No. 1 overall pick has made his way to Cooperstown. By comparison, the NBA inducted No. 1 overall picks David Thompson, Bill Walton, James Worthy and two guys named Kareem and Magic over that same time span. You may have heard of O.J. Simpson, Terry Bradshaw, Earl Campbell and John Elway — the football equivalents.

Ken Griffey Jr., Alex Rodriguez and Chipper Jones have all punched their tickets to the Hall of Fame, so that trend won't last much longer, but while Dwight Howard and Carson Palmer were the first players off the board in their respective sports in 2004, the Padres took some guy named Matt Bush.

If baseball can offer one thing through its draft that the other sports cannot, it's a true Cinderella story.

Mike Piazza, a 62nd rounder, just retired as the best hitting catcher of all-time. The fact that he made the impossible journey from hearing more than 1,500 names called before his to being called "the best" at anything is a testament to the system that makes every last round of the marathon count. So here's to hoping Avery Barnes (40th round) is the next Mike Piazza.

And here's to not being disappointed if shortstop Tim Beckham (first overall) isn't the next Alex Rodriguez. Draftees make names for themselves with their play, not their hype.

The Wildcats at one time lost 34 straight games. That's more than two seasons worth.


In 2006, Northwestern led Michigan State 38-3 with 9:54 left in the third quarter. They lost 41-38.





Track and Field advances 10 of 13 athletes on Day 1

■ THE WOMEN WON THE 4X100-METER RELAY.

The Gators raced their way to an impressive opening day at the NCAA Track and Field Championships.

UF advanced 10 of 13 athletes in the opening round of competition.

"When you send 13 athletes out and get 10 of them advance, that's an unbelievable day," coach Mike Holloway said. "Today was about

qualifying and advancing. If you don't take care of business today, there's not tomorrow. We're going to try and do the same thing tomorrow."

The women's 4x100-meter relay team cruised to an opening day win and a season-best time clocking in at 43.65 seconds.

They produced the third-fastest qualifying time of the meet, coming in just behind Texas A&M and LSU.

Lakecia Ealey posted the fastest 100-meter time of the day on the women's side with a mark of 11.53 seconds.

Ealey hopes to become the Gators' first All-American in the women's 100-meter dash since Kisha Jett in 1998.

The men's 4x100 team also started the meet strong with a second-place finish. Their time of 39.49 was the fifth fastest of the day.

Freshman Terrell Wilks ran the meet's fastest 100-meter qualifying time, stopping watches at 10.49 seconds.

After anchoring the 4x100 relay, Calvin Smith ran his way to a qualifying time of 46.21 seconds in the 400-meter dash.

Carlos Phillips joined the list of Gators who qualified for the next round of competition with a 1:50.05 in the 800-meter event.

Freshman Rebecca Lowe posted the third-fastest time of the day in the women's 5,000-meter event.

Lowe kept pace with the lead group of eight runners that eventually broke away from the rest of the pack.

Her time of 16:47.09 easily

moved her into the next round of competition.

Adam Montague moved on to the javelin final with a throw of 229 feet, 7 inches. Wes Stockbarger advanced in the discus with a throw of 182-11" on his last attempt of the day. Shara Proctor leaped her way to the next round with a wind-aided jump of 21-8" in the long jump.

After the first day of competition, Stefan Hommel is in 10th place in the decathlon. With a strong performance on Thursday, Hommel could become UF's first ever All-American in the event.

That transition went both ways. While Ealey had found success throughout her career at UF, Holloway thought that she had much more to offer.

"It didn't take long for me to realize that she was a very talented young lady," Holloway said.

Despite her talents, he could tell she was lacking one very important attribute.

"It was evident to me right away that she didn't believe that she was one of the top sprinters in the country," he said. "We've

done a lot of work trying to get her to believe that she can be a top-level sprinter."

Record Breaker

Ealey, a four time All-American, has had a banner year in 2008. The senior has racked up four event wins so far during the outdoor season and will look to add her first national title in the 100-meter dash this weekend.

This came after an indoor season that saw her break the school record in the 60-meter dash on four different occasions. She bettered the mark on consecutive days at the NCAA Indoor Championships before finally establishing her new time of 7.23 seconds.

"She has stuck out in every meet that she

has competed in," Holloway said.

Take one look at Ealey, and it's easy to see why Holloway calls her the leader of the team.

"The other girls see how hard she works, and it inspires them to do the same," Holloway said.

But Ealey doesn't see herself as the leader. "I just come out here and try and leave everything on the track," she said.

A Different Track

Despite her success, the senior has cho-

sen to end her track and field career.

"She wants to graduate and move on with her life," Holloway said. "I respect that. A lot of times, athletes will hold on to track and field because they don't know what else to do with their lives."

Though she has had offers to run professionally, Ealey plans on becoming a social worker. She hopes to work with teens.

"I just love kids, and I want to do something to help them," Ealey said.

As the sun sets on her collegiate career, the senior reflects on her time spent at UF.

"I've worked three years to get to this point and to be almost done is just an awesome thing," she said.

Speights still has decision to make before Monday deadline

■ HE HAS WORKED OUT FOR SEVEN TEAMS SO FAR.

The Marreese Speights watch is down to five days.

On Monday, Speights will have to either decide to come back to UF or officially have his name entered in the NBA Draft.

So there certainly won't be much relaxing done this weekend for the, perhaps, former center. Matt Ramker, Speights' former AAU coach, who is helping guide him through this process with Billy Donovan, said he is scheduled for workouts with the Minnesota Timberwolves, Houston Rockets and Golden State Warriors.

He has already worked out for the Orlando Magic, Cleveland Cavaliers, Washington Wizards, New Jersey Nets, Phoenix Suns, Seattle SuperSonics and Indiana Pacers.

While the likes of Derrick Rose and Michael Beasley don't have to go from city to city, as only a few teams with the top picks will

look at them, Speights is racking up the frequent flyer miles. And he soon may have the paycheck to easily afford it all.

Most mock draft Web sites have Speights going in the middle of the first round.

"They fly in, work out, have a meeting, eat with the team and then fly right back out to the next city. It's been a grind. He's been mentally tough through the whole thing."

While Ramker called those sites "crap," it could be worse for the 6-foot-10 big man.

"The biggest decision for him is finding a spot he's most comfortable with in the first round," Ramker said. "A team he'll have playing time with and have a chance to develop. But he loves UF. He isn't taking this decision lightly. He loves Donovan and the staff."

Speights may love Donovan even more if UF's coach can get some good news.

Ramker said Donovan will speak to NBA general managers and officials that he knows to get a sense of where Speights will be picked instead of using the speculation of Web sites.

The information that Donovan gets will be a major part of whether Speights decides to stay in the draft or come back for his junior year.

"Nobody that has a mock draft Web site is making a pick on June 26," Ramker said.


"It's coming down to the NBA general managers. If he feels he's not in a good situation, he'll come back. He's not in a rush to leave."

While Speights showed sprinkles of dominant play while at UF, he still struggled with conditioning.

But Ramker said he's in excellent physical shape. And after all those individual workouts and jet lag, he'd have to be.




Marreese Speights passes the ball in the second half of the Gators' 82-54 second-round NIT win against Creighton on March 21.


