Twenty-six people gathered at the Reitz Union on Wednesday morning to play MONOPOLY and helped UF go down in the record books one more time.

They participated in an attempt to set a Guinness World Record for the most people playing MONOPOLY simultaneously worldwide and made history in the process.

The event, hosted by the Public Relations Student Society of America, celebrated the release of the new "MONOPOLY Here and Now: The World Edition" and gave UF students the chance to come together to share a favorite pastime.

"This is just another way that UF is putting its mark on the world," said Christina Baez, treasurer for the group and organizer of the event. "We're not just doing this in sports, academics and

partying. We're doing it in board games, too."

To be officially counted by Guinness, at least 25 people needed to play the game for an hour. UF just made the cut.

For Lindsay Dusi, an animal sciences junior, the event was an opportunity to play a game she enjoys, get free food and possibly add another dog game piece to her small collection.

Local leaders visit DNC

Alachua County was well-represented in Denver on Wednesday night as Barack Obama was named the presidential nominee at the Democratic National Convention.

Most county representatives came as delegates to the convention, which ends today.

Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan said this is the first time she's attended the convention as a Florida delegate, though she went to the 2004 convention as an honored guest.

She said Tuesday that one of the most inspiring moments of the convention so far was Michelle Obama's speech.

"I was completely galvanized by Michelle Obama," Hanrahan said. "She was so cool under pressure and just such a brilliant woman."

Michael Heaney, an assistant professor of political science at UF, is in Denver as an observer and researcher.

Heaney said he is conducting surveys to determine differences between the Democratic and Republican National Conventions.

Results in the survey comparing delegates for Hillary Clinton and delegates for Obama have shown a rift in the Democratic Party despite calls for party unity, he said.

Aside from meeting former Sen. George McGovern, Heaney said the most exciting part of the convention was people cooperating with his study.

Other delegates included Lizzie Jenkins, president of the Democratic Black Caucus

Third floor to expand

■ REITZ WILL EXPAND TO HOUSE MORE STUDENT GROUPS.

If there's one thing students and UF staff can agree on, it's that there isn't enough space in the Reitz Union.

"We're outgrowing the Reitz Union," said Jordan Johnson, chairman of the UF Student Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee.

"It is a central location for students, whether they want to grab a bite to eat or do business, and the No. 1 struggle that I have had in Student Government is being able to find sufficient office space for student organizations because we have so many," Johnson said.

So when the former Office of Student Activities was moved to the north side of the hallway, the prime, newly vacant space on the third floor of the Reitz Union caught Johnson's eye.

"I knew it was something we had to jump on," Johnson said.


By the beginning of the spring semester, about 20 student organizations will have brand-new office space in what was once the Office of Student Activities.

Johnson said construction began about a month ago and is underway. The student-government funded project will cost about \$40,000, he said.

The Office of Student Activities was moved and consolidated with the Student





One Less Car Challenge to kick off in October

■ THE CHALLENGE ENCOURAGES DRIVERS TO USE BICYCLES.

For some Gators, the days of a single-passenger commute are coming to a close.

UF is encouraging students, faculty and staff to pledge to take an alternative method of commuting to campus by participating in the One Less Car Challenge, which starts Oct. 17.

The day marks the start of a semester-long commitment by participants to limit their car use.

Those interested can make individual commitments, but Anna Prizzia, outreach coordinator of UF's Office of Sustainability, said she hopes student organizations will create teams.

Starting Oct. 17, participants can log in and track the average number of miles they and their teammates travel a day, a count that will continue until Dec. 17.

Aside from commuting to campus via a bicycle, Prizzia said alternative transportation includes scooters; GreenRide, a carpooling service; and Zipcar, a car-sharing program.

"We know that alternative transportation isn't one-size-fits-all," Prizzia said. "We're just hoping they find a mode that works for them."

Registration for the event is ongoing and will continue until Sept. 17, according to a UF news release.

An alternative transportation fair will kick off the low-fuel festivities on Oct. 16.

At the fair, RTS staff will be present to discuss routes and the new Gator Locator Global Positioning System. Prizzia said RTS may add more convenient routes for

UF staff and faculty soon.

Students can also seek tips and demonstrations from local bike organizations, including Kickstand and the Student Government Bike Repair station, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on the Reitz Union North Lawn, according to the release.

On Oct. 17, there will be a celebration from 10 a.m. to noon, which will feature drawings for door prizes, including a digital camera, Prizzia said.

The event will also include a car versus bicycle race by two UF employees who are sent to run errands around town.

"Every year that we've done it, the bike has won," Prizzia said. "The car needed almost double the time the bike took."

On Campus Prizzia said she hopes the participants' pledges become habits by the end of the challenge Dec. 17.

"It's an opportunity to practice, and practice makes perfect, you know?" she said.

Zeke Zylberberg, a UF anthropology and religion senior, has not yet committed to the program, but he already bicycles about three miles to campus for class anyway.

For Zylberberg, his commitment to biking began when he trained with friends for a 4,500-mile bicycle ride that stretched from Austin, Texas, to Anchorage, Alaska.

He said biking in a group gives new cyclists an advantage because they can learn from veterans.

He said students who think they lack the time to switch to bicycling may find bicycling to be more enjoyable and faster than driving a car.

Not everybody needs to bicycle, but everyone can make a difference, he said.

UPD focuses on escape for crises

■ POLICE CREATED VIDEO IN LIGHT OF CAMPUS SHOOTINGS.

Professor Liviu Librescu chose to stand up to the Virginia Tech gunman that went on a shooting rampage in one of the school's lecture halls in April 2007.

He blocked his classroom door, allowing time for students to escape.

In light of such campus shootings, universities are taking measures to prepare students and faculty for potential crisis situations.

About 500 universities have chosen to purchase "Shots Fired — When Lightning Strikes," a survival-training video created by former U.S. State Department officials and FBI agents, said Randy Spivey, executive director for the Center for Personal Protection and Safety.

The center is a national organization that teaches workplace violence prevention and travel safety.

The training video has been labeled controversial because "taking out the shooter" is one of the last-ditch methods taught, Spivey said.

"As a very last resort, you may be in a situation where you are face-to-face with the shooter and takeout is the only option," Spivey said.

In that case, he said people should use whatever tools they have available, be it a cell phone or a cup of hot coffee.

"You're not traumatizing people by providing training," he said.

While UF hasn't purchased the student version of "Shots Fired," the University Police Department does use a similar program titled "Active Shooter," said UPD Capt. Jeff Holcomb.

The presentation emphasizes escape methods as well as putting something between yourself and the shooter, he said.

"You don't seek the active aggressor out," Holcomb said, while stressing escape as the first priority for those in crisis situations.

While the presentation may not focus as much on confronting the shooter, it does include disarming tactics.

"If you are where the shooter starts firing, your best option may be to dis-

arm the shooter," Holcomb said.

Another aspect of "Active Shooter" that Holcomb said he likes is the question-and-answer session, which allows him to address various scenarios on a case-by-case basis.

Holcomb has been delivering the hour-long PowerPoint presentation to staff and groups such as Department of Recreational Sports and the Inter-Residence Hall Association for more than a year, he said.

The groups usually range in size from 120 to 150.

While the presentation hasn't been delivered to the general student body, Holcomb said that anyone is welcome to call and request it.

Lindsey Nix, facility manager at the Student Recreation and Fitness Center, underwent the "Active Shooter" program as part of her fall training about a year ago.

She said she thought the emphasis of the program is to move everyone to a secure location, but she didn't feel the video urged people to take a stance against an aggressor.

As for offering the presentation to the general student body, Nix said she thought it should be reserved for staff to combat ineffectiveness and a potential panic situation.

"I think they should show a select few people rather than everybody," she said. "If too many people know, it won't be effective."

UF scores high green grade

■ SIERRA CLUB RANKED SCHOOLS FOR ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY EFFORTS.

UF ranks No. 7 in a list of the country's "cool" schools.

Why the cool ranking? Being environmentally friendly.

The top 10 list of schools is in the latest issue of Sierra, the magazine of the Sierra Club, the largest environmental organization in the U.S.

Dedee DeLongpré-Johnston, director of UF's Office of Sustainability, said it's an honor for UF to be the only Florida school on the list.

Middlebury College in Vermont is No. 1.

In the rankings, UF is lauded for recovering 40 percent of its waste and its high volume of eco-friendly student organizations.

DeLongpré-Johnston said she's been working to bring down UF's \$40 million electric bill each year.

"Forty percent of it is turning off the lights and unplugging things at the end of the day," she said.

The Sierra Club knocked UF's score to 86 for a lack of open or sustainable investing policies.

Members of Students for a Democratic Society, or SDS, protested several times last year to make UF's investments public. The UF Foundation is a private entity that oversees UF's \$1.2 billion endowment fund.

Flight, not fight

UF says we make better runners than fighters

Throughout our precious years of existence, we have learned to appreciate the concept of self-preservation. Pain sucks, and that's that. There's no reason why protecting ourselves shouldn't be at the top of our list of personal priorities.

That's why the Editorial Board is torn on today's issue.

Former officials from the U.S. Department of State and FBI created an if-something-goes-down-then-here's-what-you-do video for students and faculty who find themselves in the line of fire on campus. The instructional video is available to universities for purchase, and 500 universities nationwide have already picked up a copy.

UF is not on that list.

The difference is that the federally distributed video teaches tactics for a face-to-face confrontation with an assailant, whereas UPD prefers that we choose our flight reflex rather than give into our urge to fight, except as a last resort.

Here's where we can't quite make up our minds.

We would like to think that, when presented with a deadly situation, we would have a primary option besides desperately searching for an escape route because that may not be the best reaction given the circumstances.

Instead, the video recommends that we employ a physical defense only when given an opportunity to disarm the shooter.

Well, that sounds all fine and dandy, but there are holes in that kind of logic. How the hell would we disarm the gunman?

Obviously, if some maniac busts down a classroom door wielding a rifle straight from Rainbow Six, we aren't about to try to disarm him. We're jumping lecterns and sliding between desks to get the hell out of the nearest window.

The video instructs us to utilize our surroundings. If we're backed into a corner and staring down a gun barrel, a hot cup of coffee is the last thing that we would think to use as a weapon.

Students' safety should always be a top priority, so we're happy that UPD has some sort of plan for us, but it isn't hard to doubt the effectiveness of random classroom items against a crazy with a gun.



Nine-year-old pitcher unfairly ousted

A musician may win an award, an academic receives a grant and an athlete finds him or herself glorified by fans and the media. Jericho Scott, undoubtedly the best pitcher in his New Haven, Conn., league, received his accolades in the form of banishment from the sport of baseball for being "too good."

Scott is 9-years-old.

Accused of throwing the ball "too hard" and "frightening" opponents with his 40-mph fastball, league officials requested Scott move to another position other than pitcher. Giving second base a try for one game, Scott found himself longing to return to the place on the field where he had led his team to an 8-0 record, on pace for the playoffs.

Who can blame the child for wanting back the success he had found through pitching?

Failing to heed the warning of league officials, Scott took the mound in the subsequent game, leading to the opposing team's vacating the field and forfeiting the game.

As a result of Scott returning to his natural position, officials informed Scott's team that they could no longer participate in the league and would be disbanded.

Let me make this clear: Scott has never hit another batter while pitching this season. He may be fast, but he was throwing the ball accurately.

Furthermore, Scott is not another Danny Almonte, a kid with a forged birth certificate who tried to beat the Little League system in 2001. Scott is simply a 9-year-old boy in an 8- to 10-year-old league.

Why must adults deny this young boy the opportunity to play baseball because he was blessed with natural ability?

While at first glance Scott's targeting by league offi-



Woman charged for throwing plates, food at car

A car was assaulted early Wednesday morning by "missiles," including a duffel bag, spaghetti sauce and shards of plates.

Crystal McCook, 29, was charged with throwing a "deadly missile" into a vehicle for pelting a car with a variety of objects, according to a Gainesville Police arrest report.

Local News Debris and spaghetti sauce were left on the hood of the car.

Police found a bowl of spaghetti in McCook's apartment and plates in her sink matching the broken

pieces, according to the report.

Mercer and his two passengers were unharmed, but \$3,000 in damage was done to the car.

The duffel bag left two dents and various scratches on the hood. The kitchenware left a 5- to 7-inch crack in the front windshield.

McCook denied throwing the objects.


Bankruptcy filing rate soars among senior citizens

Hearing for online voting moved up

■ UF WAS SUED ON FEB. 22.

Developments in the lawsuit between a student group and UF about online voting in Student Government elections may bring a hearing date closer.

Students for Online Voting, or SOLVe, sued UF on Feb. 22 after the UF Supreme Court ruled that putting an online-voting amendment on the SG ballot would be unconstitutional. The student court said online voting could interfere

with SG's ability to prevent voter coercion. The First District Court of Appeal in Tallahassee granted SOLVe's request to expedite the case in July.

Student Government

Joe Little, a UF adjunct law professor and lawyer for SOLVe, said though the request was granted, it does not offer a time frame for the final decision.

Court files show that UF is represented by David M. Delaney and Elizabeth S. McKillop, of Dell Graham, a local firm concentrated in

defense of civil lawsuits, along with attorneys from UF's Office of the General Counsel.

Tommy Jardon, SOLVe president and UF law student, said Patricia Telles-Irvin, vice president for Student Affairs, asked him to consider creating another committee to look into the online-voting issue.

"A very small and very idealistic side of me thinks something still may, may come out of it," Jardon said.

The organization found out


about the Guinness World Record attempt from its former treasurer, who now has a job with a public relations firm working with Hasbro, the makers of MONOPOLY, Baez said.

Students still waiting for tickets with online system

■ STUDENTS HAVE TO WAIT IN VIRTUAL LINE.

Students looking to obtain tickets to Saturday's football season opener against Hawaii will hang up their old method tonight in favor of waiting online.

Unlike in years past, when students called the Gator Athletic Ticket Order Request System, known as G.A.T.O.R.S., new Ticketmaster software purchased by the University

Athletic Association will allow students to log on to a Web site to purchase any additional tickets.

However, don't expect to be rid of those long waits on hold just yet.

The system still has some kinks after it was first used Aug. 18 when student tickets went on sale for the Tennessee, Arkansas and Vanderbilt away games.

Student Sen. Jordan Johnson, who chaired the UAA ticket distribution committee last fall, said he sat and watched as his roommates, who logged on 20 minutes after he did, scored tickets.

Johnson said he quit trying to get tickets of his own after waiting for

an hour and a half.

"That was probably the most common occurrence I had heard from other people, too," he said.

Nic Fischer, a UF mechanical engineering senior, went online to buy away game tickets and didn't even know if he had gotten them or not because an error message popped up after he entered his billing information.

Fischer said he called the UAA customer service phone number listed on the Web site but only got recorded messages that it was past business hours.

He called the next day, however, and was notified he received

a ticket.

Fischer's biggest concern is the fact that students who are waiting in the queue have no idea where they stand in line.

"As far as reducing the wait times, it's shorter, but it's still not as great as it could be because you could be potentially waiting forever and not know about it," he said.

Mark Gajda, UAA assistant athletic director for ticket operations, said there will be live operators available tonight to help students that have problems with the online system,

Johnson's committee made the recommendation for a universal ticketing Web site to the UAA last fall, but Gajda said the UAA had been considering the option for four or five years.

UAA staff took visits to numerous places around Florida, including Disney's Wide World of Sports, with the most important visit being Pennsylvania State University, which was one of the first to implement Ticketmaster technology, Gajda said.

Bud Meredith, PSU's director of ticket operations, said his school has used the system for seven years now, and he couldn't be happier.

New Reitz offices to reduce need for student-funded storage space

Activities Center to become the new Center for Student Activities and Involvement, said Mike Mironack, director of operations for the Reitz Union.

"The goal was to concentrate where staff were so students wouldn't have to go between offices trying to figure out who's where," Mironack said.

The space measures about 1,800 square feet, Mironack said.

The Reitz Union Board of Managers will choose the organizations that will stake a

claim in the newly available spaces, he added.

"Usually at the start or early part of spring semester, we will let folks know through notices and advertisements that applications for space are being accepted from the board," said Mironack, who is an adviser to the Reitz Union Board of Managers.

On the applications, groups must state their purpose, membership numbers and why they need office space or a storage facility, Mironack said.

The Space Committee reviews the applications and interviews the organizations before space is allocated each year.

Groups that already have space are gener-

ally allowed to keep it, unless they fail to turn in office logs about hours spent in the office or fail to use it sufficiently as deemed by the committee, Mironack said.

When complete, the new offices will be equipped with desks, chairs and storage space large enough to hold poster boards and other materials.

"Organizations will actually be able to use that to store anything for the big-to-small items that their group uses, and it will alleviate a lot of the student

money that goes to renting off-campus storage spaces," Johnson said.

The organizations will also receive computers that have been used for 1.5 years, he said.

The computers were previously used at the Student Government computer lab, which will be removed after a fall technology upgrade.

The new offices will help fulfill a constant goal of SG — to provide for students and student organizations, which, if registered, receive SG funding, said Kevin Reilly, Student Body president.

"We have almost 800 organizations, so the organizations always need more space," Reilly said.

Orchestra regroups after summer tour

Their venue burned down in Boone, N.C., They played to a crowd of more than 100. They played to a crowd of less than 10. They were greeted by a shotgun-wielding man in the mountains while attempting to find another venue, a house party thrown by people on house arrest.

Still reeling from their summer experiences, members of local Afro-Latin band Umoja Orchestra recounted just a few memorable moments in their first-ever three-week summer tour throughout

the East Coast.

"I mean, it was our first tour. We mainly went on tour just for the fun of traveling," said Evan Garfield, Umoja drummer.

Garfield, a UF senior, said he volunteered to book most of the 12-member band's nine shows, and bass player Michael Pedron, a UF senior, recorded the revenue from the concerts and merchandise sales.

"Next time around, I would probably just be a little more selective about booking shows,"

Garfield said.

For transportation, the band used a seven-passenger "soccer mom" mini-van, a five-passenger green Volkswagen Passat belonging to Pedron, and a rented U-

Haul trailer to hold instruments.

The band lodged with friends, relatives, godparents, friends of family □ anyone who would lend floor space. It financed the trip through profits made from its past local shows.

Umoja singer and UF senior Natalia Perez said through the entire cramped adventure, the band got along fine, even when five members sat through a 20-hour trip in Pedron's car to make it home from Boston without stopping overnight.

Despite the tribulations and mountain-like bumps along the way, Garfield said he and his bandmates thought the tour went

well.

He said Umoja played a sold-out show at the Knitting Factory in New York City, which more than made up for the money spent on the tour.

Yet Perez and Garfield agreed that the best show for the band had to be Boone, N.C.

"I think the Boone show was most like a Gainesville show because everybody was really dancing, and that's kind of what happens here," he said. "So I think that felt the most at home to us, which is unexpected because it's the most small, little, remote

"So I get this call from this restaurant called The Calypso II, and this lady's like, 'We're not normally opened on Wednesdays, but we want you guys to play here it's an African-Caribbean restaurant,' which seemed right up our alley," Garfield said. "Little did we know, it was really weird."

Perez said the woman described an "incident" that oc-

curred a year ago and caused a decrease in the restaurant's once steady business flow.

"So I Googled it, and somebody was shot and murdered there like a year prior to this," Garfield said.

Saxophonist and UF senior David Borenstein said the owner of the Calypso also almost refused to let Umoja's friends in because of the venue's 30-and-over age restriction.

"In an effort to curb violence in their club, they made it a 30-and-up club!" Borenstein laughed.


Despite the slaying, Garfield said the band decided to play at the Calypso.

The three also explained Umoja's encounter with a nearly trigger-happy "mountain man" and a lackluster jam session for random people living in a trailer on house arrest in Asheville.

Perez said the members got lost on their way to a house party they were invited to play at, barely escaping a crazed man defending his land against trespassing.

"Most of the good stuff happened in between shows," he said. "That's just hanging out, you know, in other states. That's just what's fun."

Most of the band members were present at all the concerts, with Sebastian Lopez on vocals and guitar, Natalia Perez on vocals, Michael Pedron on bass guitar, Evan Hegarty on key-

board, David Borenstein on saxophone, Adam Finkelman, Michael Claytor, Scott Bihorel and Evan Garfield on percussion and Micah Shalom, Jason Prover, Keegan Jerabek on trumpets. Former band member Doug Fischer joined the band on trombone for its New York City show.

After the tour, the band members split for the summer and reunited within the past week.

"Going on tour is very humbling because you learn to enjoy yourself, even without the audi-

ence there," he said. "Even if there's five people there because those five people haven't heard you, so it's still important for us to make a good impression on those people because that's the only time they'll hear our band, at least for a really long time."

Soon, Umoja will start composing new music for a new album and play in the Real Big Deal Festival on Sept. 13. But Garfield said the memories and lessons from this first tour, such as making a good impression,

even if you're just playing for yourselves, will stick with the members.

"Nobody is banking on this band for a career or anything, but I think a lot of people in the band have the mentality that if something arises because it's a good opportunity, people are kind of willing to maybe enjoy this while it lasts and try to like just go with the flow of it," he said. "We're not trying to get signed or anything like that: We're just trying to move with it."

Dandy Warhols' new album under new label not so dandy



"Hamlet 2": A B movie or not a B movie?

While watching "Hamlet 2," you may be bombarded by a number of questions that seem important. "Who is Steve Coogan?" you might find yourself thinking. "How did a barrage of misfits in Tucson magically learn to act and sing?" and "Why is the funniest joke about Elizabeth Shue, an actress who has been a blip on the blockbuster radar since the late 1990s?" Though these questions may seem minor, they'll consistently make you question the validity and overall merit of the movie at large.

Not to say the film is bad, though in fact, quite the contrary. As far as being entertaining, this movie succeeds to a point, managing to stay interesting despite its "Sister Act" formula. Another plus is that it only lasts a gloriously short 90 minutes, a feat which seems too rare amid

the plethora of self-indulgent three-hour crap-fests, which lack any editing whatsoever. The movie's real failure is in the way it was advertised and executed as a whole.

If you've seen the previews or heard the buzz, you're expecting an irreverent comedy, a "Waiting For Guffman" meets "Anchorman." However, seeing it with these preconceptions will cause severe disappointment.

The first hour, despite a few forced jokes, is rather somber. The movie opens with a detailed portrayal of the awful life of Coogan's character, Dana Marschz, who suffers abuse as a child, failure as an actor, low-income employment, a deteriorating marriage and to top it off, the news that due to financial problems, acting will be cut from the high school curriculum.

The plot follows Marschz as he enlists a ragtag group of "gangstah" Latino students to help put on his "revolutionary" musical sequel to Hamlet in a last-ditch effort to save drama.


Playing the character in a relatable and likeable way, Coogan makes Marschz rather pitiable. Unlike Ron Burgundy of "Anchorman" or Corcky St. Clair of "Guffman," Marschz is not a vain, self-confident caricature but rather a human to whose problems we can actually relate, and that just isn't funny.

If viewed as a comedy, the film parodies two types of movies. One is the "inspiring teacher" genre "Mr. Holland's Opus," "Sister Act," "Take the Lead" and two is the "lets-put-on-a-show" genre, reminiscent of the cheesy Broadway productions of old. A few times the parody comes through, but for the

most part, the writers break the cardinal rule of parody becoming serious. There are points at which I wondered whether the movie was poking fun at these genres or taking part in them. Even when the movie spoofs, the jokes are hardly strong enough to stand alone and manifest through the mostly slapstick humor you've seen before. The comedy really doesn't improve until the last 30 minutes, when the movie completely changes.

The actual production of the play, "Hamlet 2," within the movie makes watching it completely worthwhile. I'll limit spoilers. Suffice it to say it somehow manages to mix Hamlet, Jesus, light sabers and a time machine into one incredibly funny and strangely profound musical. More than that, it manages to fit in the movie as a sunflower blossoming from a sad manure.

In short, the movie isn't what



you'd expect. It's not something you'll find on T-shirts and bumper stickers or quoted by your roommates for years to come. But it's also not a vain, preachy message. It's just nice, short and simple the perfect combination for a lazy Sunday afternoon.

You could say Ryan Stamper is ready for his close-up.





Former Gator Green signs with Spanish club

Taurean Green doesn't speak much Spanish, and that may be a problem.

The former UF point guard confirmed Wednesday that he has agreed to play for the Spanish club CAI Zaragoza.

Green is in the process of negotiating what is believed to be a one-year deal with the team.

He would not confirm the specifics of the contract.

"I feel like this is the best move for me right now," he said in a phone interview.

Green said he is excited to spend some time overseas, and he views the move as a positive step for his career.

"The competition is tough. The guys playing in this league are good players," he said.

Green points to Spain's recent Olympic success as proof of the league's talent level.

CAI Zaragoza was promoted to the top flight of Spanish basketball after winning the second-division title last season.

Zaragoza will now face off with well-known clubs such as Barcelona and Real Madrid in Spanish basketball's premier

league.

Green said he is not worried about his inability to speak the native language, and that he doesn't think he will have a hard time adjusting to life in Spain.

"I love Spanish food," he said. "So I'm excited about that."

Green slipped to the second round of the 2007 NBA Draft, where he was selected No. 52 overall by the Portland Trailblazers, after leaving UF early along with former teammates Corey Brewer, Al

Horford and Joakim Noah.

While the rest of his UF teammates contributed heavily in their rookie years, Green spent most of his at the end of the bench. Actually, several different benches.

Since draft day, the 6-foot guard has spent time with the Blazers' Development League team, the Idaho Stampede, the Denver Nuggets and most recently the New York Knicks.


Despite making more than \$400,000 in his rookie year, Green only averaged 1.6 points per game and struggled to make it off the bench in both Portland and Denver.

Green, who was cut by the Knicks on July 28, said he hopes a year overseas will help showcase his talent for NBA teams.

And that is the reason why he was voted a team captain.
