

# Moore or Less

*RB balances good, bad over career*

Opinions of Kestahn Moore couldn't be any different inside and outside of UF's program.

Inside, he's a respected veteran leader. Coaches adore him, and it's a rarity Urban Meyer will walk past the senior without giving him a pat on the back or a kind word.

Outside, fans ridicule him, picking out every misstep or flaw. They rip him on message boards, and many say they'd rather see any other running back in the backfield.

He even has a hate club on Facebook.

Moore has averaged more than five yards per carry during his career in Gainesville, and while that hasn't been enough to earn the adoration of Gator fans, he has won over his teammates and coaches with hard work and reliability on and off the field.

"He's one of my favorite people," Meyer said. "He has had a good career, probably not a great one in people's minds. He does a lot for a program. I love Kestahn Moore."

After three seasons filled with ups and downs, there are mixed opinions on Moore's performance, but, like it or not, he's still UF's starting running back.

With a little luck and some help from a former player who has been in his shoes, Moore says he's ready to turn the corner and establish his place among the beloved backs that have passed through The Swamp.

"I want to be remembered as that person who never gave up and always goes hard," Moore said. "I want to be remembered as a leader on and off the field, and I want to show people that I can go. People don't really see how fast I am or that I can break the long ones. I want to show them because I think I'm going to be a real player this year."

and looked like he had finally found his stride at LSU in October.

His 15-yard gain in Baton Rouge set up an early UF field goal, he caught a touchdown in the second quarter, and he added 22 more yards on another Gators touchdown drive.

The coaches' confidence in Moore grew as the game went on, and in the third quarter, leading by 10, they turned to him to keep the offense and clock moving.

He ripped off consecutive runs of eight, 11 and four yards to kick off a UF drive, but disaster was right around the corner.

He took a first-down handoff up the middle and fumbled near midfield.

The Tigers recovered, killing a promising drive, and the Gators wouldn't score again in the 28-24 loss.


The fumble spoiled an otherwise great game: 79 yards on 12 carries with a touchdown against the best defense in the nation. But that isn't Moore's most painful memory from the season.

Mention the Georgia game, and his infectious smile evaporates, replaced with disappointment.

"Last year's Georgia game was a low point for me," he said. "That fumble," then his voice trails off and he takes a deep breath. "That's it."

Moore picked up 20 yards on UF's opening drive but fumbled at the Georgia 33-yard line, starting a Bulldogs drive that ended with the entire team celebrating in the end zone.

Things didn't get much better for Moore as the contest wore on. A Gators drive stalled after the ball was snapped over his head for a 12-yard loss, and another bad snap bounced off his shoulder into enemy hands at the 11-yard line. It was a 10-0 lead at the time.

the team), Moore is frequently criticized for his mistakes. That's only from a fan's perspective.

"He fumbled in two games and everybody harps on that he's had problems fumbling," running backs coach Kenny Carter said. "He had two fumbles that were critical and really made a difference. You can't fumble, but we moved on from that. Everybody makes mistakes and has things happen, but if you keep harping on that, nothing ever goes on."

## The Ninja Turtle

It's hard to imagine a player could be perceived as differently as Moore is from the locker room to the bleachers.

Fans berate him for his lack of speed and untimely mistakes. Teammates laud him for his willingness to help them, and coaches fawn over his leadership.

"He's one of those guys you can count on," said...

■ PROTESTERS SAY AMENDMENT WOULD STRIP HUMAN RIGHTS.

People of all ages, colors and sexual orientations came to the steps of City Hall Thursday afternoon in support of Gainesville's anti-discrimination policy.

Members of the group Equality is Gainesville's Business spoke against a charter amendment that would nullify the city's anti-discrimination protections for gay and transgender people.

"All of us believe it is Gainesville's business to ensure equality for all residents," member Michelle Ott said.

The group was formed in opposition to the amendment, which has been pushed for by the organization Citizens for Good Public Policy.

Citizens for Good Public Policy has collected enough signatures to put the amendment on the ballot, though it remains uncertain when it will appear.

If the amendment passes, the city would be subject to the Florida Civil Rights Act instead of its current policy.

This would remove protections based on sexual orientation and gender identity and prohibit the city from adding new categories, like pregnancy, socioeconomic status or party affiliation.

The state policy will still provide protection for groups based on race, color, religion, sex, national

# Trustees discuss money

In its first day of meetings, UF's Board of Trustees discussed revisions to the Student Conduct Code, incentives to get students to graduate faster and rumored budget cuts later this year.

UF President Bernie Machen, who has advocated for the state to dip into rainy-day reserves to cover future budget shortfalls, warned trustees that if more budget cuts are to be taken, he might need a new strategy to decide how they are met.

Steve Scott, a UF trustee, said because UF's \$47 million budget cut this summer already trimmed the fat of many programs, there may be no choice but to make targeted cuts to com-

pensate for potential losses.

The board's meeting continues today at Emerson Alumni Hall, with a report from Machen at 9:45 a.m. and the full board's meeting at 10:30 a.m.

### UF TO TAKE OUT LOAN FOR NEW BUILDINGS

Machen announced in the Committee on Resources that UF plans to take out a loan and move forward with two \$20 million construction projects stalled by the loss of state-matching funds this year.

The projects, William R. Hough Hall and an expansion to the Samuel P. Harn Museum of Art, are in the design phase of construction.

# Chief Justice visits UF

Chief Justice John Roberts of the U.S. Supreme Court will preside over a mock court case conducted by UF law students at 10 a.m. today at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts.

In the Justice Campbell Thornal Moot Court Final Four competition, four UF law students will be judged by their oral and written arguments in a hypothetical legal case.

Roberts will be one of four judges presiding over the competition.

Roberts joined the Supreme Court in 2005, and he is the first Supreme Court justice to judge the competition. Other judges are from the 11th Circuit of the U.S. Court of Appeals or graduates of UF's Levin College of Law.





# Local chapter of political club mixes banter, beer

Ray Willette casually sipped on his frothy beverage and described issues like Gainesville's labor unions and Florida's


Second Amendment. Across the table, Jacque Betz spoke of her days in the Everglades sugarcane fields, where she worked against the mistreatment of migrant workers.





# Local man takes iPhone

A woman walking alone was robbed of her iPhone Wednesday night on West University Avenue.

The man pushed her down and continued to run, the report stated.

Police arrested Tommy Scott, 51, an

unemployed Gainesville resident, four blocks away in the parking lot of the University Avenue Kangaroo Express at 12:30 a.m. Thursday.

He was charged with unarmed robbery, stated the report.

Two witnesses identified Scott.



## Scalping deserves harsher penalties

I've got some good news for students still looking for a ticket to tomorrow's football game against Miami: There are plenty available. It will only cost you \$150.

This hefty price tag, averaged from a number of advertisements posted yesterday on Craigslist.org, reflects a troubling practice at UF that needs to be rectified — students scalping their football tickets for exorbitant amounts of money.

Students fortunate enough to win the ticket lottery far too often abuse that right. With no intention of attending the games, profiteering students wrongfully convert their privilege into a moneymaking endeavor at the expense of fellow students who were not as lucky.

This, The Gator Nation cannot stand for.

I understand measures have already been taken to curb students scalping to non-students, such as requiring a Gator 1 be presented to enter with a student ticket. These changes have not affected the disgusting practice of selling tickets to fellow UF students at prices hundreds of dollars in excess of face value.

I am also aware that Gov. Jeb Bush decriminalized ticket scalping in 2006. But just because a practice is legal does not make it right. To the contrary, our moral compass tells us what these students are doing is unequivocally wrong.

To curb the student-to-student ticket-scalping epidemic, I have a proposal:

Students caught scalping tickets at a cost greater than face value should have their season tickets revoked for the remainder of the season and be permanently banned from buying season tickets in subsequent seasons. The tickets violators forfeit should be made available as

Willful ignorance of this problem is not the solution.

During the past week, more than 100 students posted advertisements on Craigslist seeking anywhere from \$100-\$200 a ticket for this week's game against Miami. Some ads explicitly provided the seller's UF e-mail address.

This is a call to the University Athletic Association to create a position for student scalping enforcement, along with a hot line and e-mail address used to report scalpers. The person designated to this important responsibility would monitor Craigslist, Ebay.com and other online ticket sites in the hopes of catching violators or even sending e-mails pretending to be a prospective purchaser to ascertain information about the seller's identity.

I do not believe this problem can be eradicated without substantial help from the group these measures are intended to protect — the student body.

Collectively, the UF student body must self-monitor scalping and report violators. Monday, a student posted a message on Craigslist justifying his actions by suggesting students who weren't selected in the lottery should spend less time complaining and more time working so they can afford to buy tickets.

This kind of logic needs to be corrected. The Gator Nation should not tolerate scalping. It reduces the quality of its students' college experience and threatens the integrity of UF as a whole.



As a swing state, we cannot let McCain win. So far, the worst criticism leveled at Obama is that he is ambitious and well-spoken.

# UF renews food contract

What do the next 10 years taste like?  
For UF students, Caribbean fast food and fruit smoothies.

UF signed a 10-year food service contract with Aramark, its food service provider since May 1995, last week.

Among several projects, the contract includes plans to add Pollo Tropical and Jamba Juice to the Reitz Union Food Court next year.

Pollo Tropical will replace Capeesh, and a scaled-down version of Jamba Juice will be added to the food court, said Bob Miller, UF's associate vice president of business affairs.

Over the course of the contract, Aramark will be required to invest almost \$9.5 million in new and existing food service locations at UF. The university will invest about \$7.2 million.

Although Aramark proposed UF receive a 10 percent commission on campus food sales, UF's commission will increase from 10.4 percent to 10.75 percent in the new contract, which means UF would receive about \$90,000 more a year at current food sale levels.

Aramark will also give UF almost \$1.4 million to make dining operations on campus more eco-friendly.

In 2010, Fresh Food Company at Broward Dining Center will receive a \$2 million eco-makeover.

Plans include solar panels, a living vegetable wall that will grow vegetables to be served in the dining hall and a rainwater storage tank that will collect water for irrigation.

Other plans include building a Starbucks

at the Health Science Center Library, which will be the fourth on campus, and convenience stores near Rawlings and Turlington halls.

Miller said none of the plans have been finalized, and changes may still occur.

The new contract also includes a clause, prompted by student concern, that obligates Aramark to work with UF to "reduce the number of unused student meal plan meals."

Currently, almost 40 percent of meal plan meals go unused at UF.

Student Sen. Benjamin Dictor, who pushed for the clause, said he is disappointed with it because the wording is too vague.

"It's nonsense, in all reality," Dictor said. "It's been put in there so that way they can say they've done something when, in fact, they've done absolutely nothing."

Student Senate President Kellie Dale, who was also in favor of the clause, said she is happy with it even if it is vague. Dale said there are many reasons why students don't use their meal plans, and the number of missed meals does not necessarily mean students are dissatisfied.

One of Aramark's other proposals was to institute a mandatory freshman meal plan, but UF rejected this idea.





# City dubs plaza after Diddley

Although she died before the site was finished, Crow said her success is due in large part to her mom.

"My mom inspired me so much in life because she gave

me tons of opportunities," Crow said. "She bought me my first snowboard. My mom never, ever said you can't do something."

Kara Church has been friends with Crow since they roomed together at UF and was one of the first to hear about her interactive idea.


"Courtney's a very big-picture person," Church said. "She completely sees it from beginning to end."

Crow said the Web site has 1,200 users, and four or five new members join every day.

Along with sports updates and celebrity interviews, the site's magazine features everyday women, including one who trekked from London to Africa on foot.



# Army ROTC shows off equipment to new members

Dressed in their Army blues, members of UF's Army ROTC drill team tossed and flipped their performance rifles to kick off this year's new member orientation.

Army ROTC members demonstrated some of their tactical skills and military equipment Thursday afternoon at Flavet Field in an effort to get new members interested in the program and raise awareness on campus.

contains three different clubs — Raiders, Ranger Challenge and Gator Guard, according to its Web site.

Second Lt. Jessica Catob, who graduated from UF and was commissioned this summer, said Army ROTC has about 80 members this semester.

"ROTC is designed to take students at the University of Florida and commission them as officers in the Army."

At the event, each club performed a demonstration. The Ranger Challenge club members performed a rope-bridge demonstration, in which they tied a rope from one tree to another and pulled themselves horizontally across with their legs wrapped around the rope.

Chris Kell, a UF senior and the program's head tactical officer, said he hoped the event would end misconceptions about ROTC.

"When people think Army, they think guns," Kell said. "That's not all we do."

He said he thinks most UF students believe that participating in ROTC requires enlistment in the Army.

The first two years of the program don't require a commitment, he said. After that period, a member can decide whether to continue.

Natalia Alvarez, a new mem-

ber to Army ROTC and a UF freshman, performed in the demonstration and said she is already impressed with the program.

Alvarez said she joined the program because she wants to


become an Army doctor. The scholarships were also an incentive, she said.

"From what I can see, they are going to teach me a lot of important qualities," she said.

# Pipe bombs found by railroad crew

A railroad crew discovered two homemade pipe bombs while working on a train track in Newberry on Thursday morning.

"They weren't big enough that they would disrupt a train, but they were big enough they could have injured or killed one of the workers," said Art Forgey, a spokesman for the Alachua County Sheriff's Office.

A crew from Pinsky Railroad Company found the bombs around 9:30 a.m. while working on a track near the intersection of Northwest 78th Street and State Road 45, Forgey said.

After deputies confirmed that they were a threat, a bomb team was sent in to deactivate them, he said. The sheriff's office does not often deal with bombs, Forgey said.

The bombs, which were made of galvanized pipe, appeared to be homemade, Forgey said.

**Local News** Deputies have no leads on who may have left the bombs or why, partially because the track is in a rural area, he said.

"There's not a lot of people who could have seen who left them," he said.

# Dayglow partiers shut out

About 800 people were denied entrance to a Dayglow Tour paint party Wednesday night at Whiskey Lounge and Moon after more tickets were sold than capacity allowed.

A third nightclub, Privé, was scheduled to be open for the party, in which participants throw paint at each other while wearing white clothing under black lights. Planners were forced to shut down the club at the last

minute to decrease capacity, said Michael Oiknine, co-owner of Mentally Unstable Promotions, which helped put on the event.

Oiknine said 2,000 tickets had been presold. Without Privé open, only 1,200 people got in.

## Around Gainesville

"This has been the craziest night I've ever had to deal with because no one really knows what is happening and what to do," security guard Chad Smith said at the event.

Eitan Sisso, a UF freshman, said he tried to attend with a group of friends in celebration of his girlfriend's birthday.

"I was waiting outside of the club for two hours, and what frustrated me the most was that no one was answering any questions as to what was going on," Sisso said. "I want a refund."

Oiknine said the Dayglow Tour may offer ticket holders entrance to another party at a later date. The company is also creating an e-mail address to contact for refunds, he said.

origin, age, handicap and marital status.

Kim Emery, a UF English professor who spoke Thursday, said hearing about the charter amendment made her feel as if citizens of Gainesville thought it was acceptable to strip others of their human rights.

"It would make us something less than citizens," Emery said.

Cain Davis, chairman of Citizens for Good Public Policy, said the amendment is not about restricting rights, but protecting citizens.

"It's a public safety issue," Davis said. "For some reason, they keep missing that point."

Theoretically, he said, men could use women's restrooms and take advantage of the policy by claiming to be transgender.

The group believes that adding gender identity to the city's anti-discrimination policy in January was a mistake by the City Commission, he said.

"They ought to use common sense," Davis said.

Alachua County Commissioner Paula DeLaney said it's important to take the "high road" and realize the fight is over real

people.

"There is no excuse for discrimination," DeLaney said.

"Don't just hope it will get better.

Do something about it."

Dr. Glenn Dickinson, of the Westminster Presbyterian Church, said opposition to the city's policy has created unnecessary fear.

"I pray for a change of heart and mind," Dickinson said.

Some citizens who attended the press

conference said they were concerned about what the amendment would mean for their lives.

Amanda Bisson said the amendment was just another way of taking away rights from people.

"I think it's a disgrace," Bisson said. "I'm very worried."

Her domestic partner, Angela Downs, said she thought the amendment was based on fear and lack of education.

"It's not intended to hurt anyone," Downs said.

But both Bisson and Downs said action is important.

# Trustees discuss incentives to increase UF students' graduation rates

UF already received a \$10 million gift from each donor, which will allow for construction to begin while UF officials investigate the loan, said Paul Robell, vice president for development and alumni affairs.

UF was supposed to earn about \$27 million in matching funds this year from the state's fund-matching program for buildings but received \$160,000, Robell said. UF is also missing \$47 million in its endowment match program.

After a loan, Robell said UF is counting on the Legislature to reimburse it for the cost of the buildings when the matching-gifts program is reinstated.

The decision to move forward with the projects resulted from pressure from the donors, who didn't want to wait to see the "results of their philanthropy," Robell said.

He said he's not optimistic that the program will be included in next year's budget.

Construction on Hough Hall, a 59,000-square foot business graduate building, will begin in January, said Ed Poppell, vice president of business affairs. Before the five-month setback, the building was supposed to be ready by spring 2010.

Construction on the Asian art wing at the Harn Museum of Art will begin by March, Poppell said.

### TRUSTEES TALK ABOUT FLAT-TUITION MODEL, GRADUATION RATE

Trustees in the board's Committee on Governance discussed possible incentives to get UF students to graduate faster, but Machen said it is hard to find a solution when students don't feel pressured to graduate on time.

Machen said 55 percent of UF's under-

graduates graduate in four years, a figure that UF Provost Joe Glover said is an excellent rate by national norms.

A flat-rate tuition model has been discussed by the trustees as a way to entice students to take more classes at the same cost as someone with a lighter full-time schedule. In the model, students could take 12 to 18 credits for the same rate instead of paying by credit hour.

Machen said because most students have Bright Futures scholarships, they might not find the offer appealing.

"What does it matter for a student here who doesn't pay anything for their tuition?" Machen said.

Glover said students aren't pressured to take full loads at UF because they come in with several college credits from advanced high school courses. Freshmen come in with junior standing and still want the four-

year college experience, Glover said.

### TRUSTEES DISCUSS CODE REVISIONS

Trustees in the Educational Policy and Strategy Committee discussed controversial changes to the Student Conduct Code but were not ready to vote on the changes.

The revisions include eliminating the Student Honor Court's ability to hear academic honesty cases, and banning drinking games and common-source alcohol containers, such as beer balls and kegs.

Patricia Telles-Irvin, vice president of Student Affairs, said the goal of the revisions is to clarify the code's language and make it available to students in one document.

Mac McGriff, a trustee, called for a final draft of the regulations to be submitted. He said the committee would discuss it via con-

ference call the week of Sept. 22.

Student Body President Kevin Reilly said he thought the revised draft had adequately taken into account opinions from a diverse group of students and gone through extensive revisions.

Sam Miorelli, UF engineering senior, wasn't convinced his opinion was considered.

Miorelli said administration wouldn't be asking for more power over students' social life if they didn't intend to use it.

"We have a problem with you coming in and saying it's against the rules for students to

play beer pong," Miorelli said.

### RENEWABLE ENERGY FEE PASSED

A renewable energy fee that would charge students 50 cents per credit hour was unanimously approved by the board's Educational Policy and Strategy Committee.

The revenue would be spent on projects that conserve energy, such as adding solar panels, and would be allocated by a committee of students, faculty and staff.

The fee must be approved by the rest of the board and the Board of Governors.




Patricia Telles-Irvin, UF vice president for Student Affairs, listens to UF trustees speak during a Board of Trustees committee meeting Thursday afternoon.





more than white noise to him. "It's a little strange but you kind of have to go with the roll," he said. "It's not that big of a deal. Six is the length of Miami's current winning streak over UF, but it's not something he's hanging his hat on.

"It's something we definitely pride ourselves on but at the same time we are worried about this game coming up Saturday," he said. "The past is the past."

they might not be able to hear you through the cotton balls crammed in their ears.

Junior starter Greg Alexander and replacement Brent Rausch, playing in their first Football Bowl Subdivision game, combined for a measly 71 yards and two interceptions.

Hawaii's best quarterback, Inoke Funaki, tallied 110 and a touchdown, but

did so against UF non-starters and without the pressure to win the game.

And they were playing in the afternoon without a national audience looking on from home.

"I can only imagine what (the crowd) is going to be like," UF coach Urban Meyer said.

Meyer followed by saying Marve will be composed, that the atmosphere won't impact him and that he won't be as bad as Hawaii's quarterbacks. I disagree.

The prospect of making your first

career start is exciting for someone like Tebow. Tebow said starting in a game like that would be "awesome."

But Robert Marve isn't Tim Tebow.

Going to The Swamp at night is not just a game. It's being surrounded by the jeers of more fans than can technically be there, many of them drunk since the early afternoon. It's hands-over-your-ears-just-to-hear-yourself-think chaos. It's an experience.

And for Robert Marve, it's going to be hell.

## Redshirt freshman set to make debut

Making your first career start at quarterback is a daunting task for anyone. Making that first start in arguably the most raucous stadium in the country in front of fans who wouldn't mind seeing your head on a pole takes it to another level.

This is the situation Miami redshirt freshman quarterback Robert Marve faces coming to Gainesville.

Marve was forced to redshirt last season after he injured his hand during a car accident in July 2007.

Things didn't get easier for him as he was arrested later that year for punching and breaking a car mirror and resisting arrest.

The arrest led to Marve being suspended for the Hurricane's season opener against Charleston Southern, a game Miami won 52-7.

Maybe it's the adversity he's faced in his short time at Coral Gables or maybe it's being the son of a former NFL linebacker, but Marve, who broke UF quarterback Tim Tebow's state records for passing and yards in high school, appears unafraid of the situation before him.

"I need to keep watching film and keep my head on straight ... just go out there and have fun," he said.

"You've got to realize you are playing a game and you've been doing this since you were real little. Yeah, the crowd is going to be bigger, the stadium is going to be bigger."

After all he's been through, from redshirting to the car accident to the arrest, those screaming fans may seem like nothing

**R**obert Marve is in trouble. Big trouble.

The Hurricanes' redshirt freshman quarterback is coming into Gainesville for Saturday's UF-Miami game with exactly zero college passing yards, zero passing attempts, zero touchdowns and a quarterback rating of — you guessed it — zero.

# Middle blocker Johnson returns strong after injury

An attacker, a defender and an orange-and-blue striped volleyball hang in mid-air.

Within a split second, all three are back on the freshly polished court, finished with their momentary defiance of gravity.

The hitter was unable to find an alley for the would-be kill, and the defender, middle blocker Kristina Johnson, pumps a fist and lifts her surgically repaired knee before welcoming high-fives from her teammates.

When Jacksonville comes to town for a 7 p.m. showdown with UF in the Campus USA Credit Union Invitational today, a healthy Johnson will be looking to build on her team-leading nine blocks in the first two matches.

"I haven't actually tested my vertical to see what it is, but it's fine," she said.

Last season, in the Gators' NCAA regional semifinal match with Texas, Johnson landed on the foot of then-teammate Janine Williams, tearing her ACL.

A surgery and seven months of rehab later, she was cleared to play two days before the team's first practice.

"Prior to this August, the last time Kristina Johnson had even swung at a volleyball was

in December," coach Mary Wise said.

With preseason All-Southeastern Conference middle blocker Kelsey Bowers unable to play full time with a back injury, the junior is being relied upon to provide a stable force in the middle of the floor.

SEC Freshman of the Week Kristy Jaekel echoed Wise's emphasis on the importance of strong play from the "middles."

"The more involved we can get them, the better we're going to be," she said.

And the more reps Johnson gets, the better she will be at blocking and killing balls for UF.

Because of her knee injury and a shoulder injury the previous year, Johnson missed out on training the last two springs.


Listening to Johnson talk, it's hard to tell she's only been full speed for a month now.

"It's been interesting coming back with new setters," she said. "That's been the biggest transition."

That's right, the biggest transition wasn't the surgery. She said she put that out of her mind after the first week of practice.


Friday marks the beginning of a rigorous stretch that includes five games in eight days for UF and for the 6-foot-2 middle blocker they call "KJ."

Wise expects her to get better with more playing time, and if that's true, fans should keep their eyes on No. 15 when it comes time for a big play at the net.



Yadloczky also said that, as a sophomore, she now knows how to manage her time and that will help her focus this weekend.


She certainly is thinking positive about the tournament.



## Peaks and Valleys

With 16 starts, 1,137 yards and nine touchdowns in his college career, Moore has achieved plenty of positives during his time in Gainesville. Most fans, however, recall just four plays — three fumbles and a bad snap — from losses to LSU and Georgia last season.

In 2007, Moore got off to a promising start, ruffling for 169 yards and four touchdowns in blowout wins against Western Kentucky and Troy.

He had double-digit carries in six games

Georgia won the game 42-30, and those crucial mistakes erased any good memories of Moore for UF fans.

"In this offense, you already know you ain't getting the ball after that," Moore said. "I was frustrated, like, 'Damn, no ball for me anymore.' When you fumble, even in practice, we do a thing where you go 100 yards with two footballs in your hands and you fall on your forearms every five yards."

Although those were his only two fumbles on the season (the bad snap was credited to

being accountable within the system and in the program and being a guy to hang your hat on. That's what Kestahn is. That's how you win championships and games, when you have guys like that.

"You try to make everybody else in your program look at that example and continue to do those kinds of things to get us where we need to be."

Moore is his team's unsung hero, a player whose contributions can't all be found on the stat sheet.

Perhaps his most respected role on the team is that of lead blocker on kickoff returns.

Moore starts next to returner Brandon James, and once the kick is received, he dashes 30 yards to meet his blocking assignment head-on at full speed.

"He does a phenomenal job," James said. "I wouldn't want to have anyone else back there with me. He sets it all up. People don't realize it, but I follow him. Really, if I return one it's a credit to him because I follow wherever he's going and follow his blocks."

Moore started blocking in high school when opposing teams stopped kicking to him. He grew to like the job and told coaches in Gainesville he was up for the task.

In fact, Moore might be hard-wired for the position.

His thick, broad shoulders make him a solid blocker, and that physical trait has earned him a nickname.

"I always say he's built like a Ninja Turtle," defensive end Duke Lemmens said. "He just brings toughness, he's a great blocker and he's so accountable. Every kid on this team trusts him with the utmost respect."

### 'Little Ran'

Before the Ninja Turtle nickname, Moore had another moniker. In his first season, teammates called him "Little Ran" for his

resemblance to a previous UF running back, Ran Carthon.

Moore wore the same number — 33 — and was just an inch and a few pounds away from being the exact size as Carthon.

It was coincidence at first, but Moore had much more in common with Carthon than he ever knew.

During the offseason, many scoffed at Meyer's insistence that Moore would remain the starting tailback.

Chris Rainey gained 20 pounds of muscle, Emmanuel Moody was healthy, and both had the potential big-play ability UF had lacked from the running back position. Freshman Jeff Demps was well-known for his blinding speed, and much more excitement surrounded the speedy trio. It seemed few fans wanted to see Moore line up beside or behind quarterback Tim Tebow.

Carthon faced a similar situation in his senior season, when DeShawn Wynn and Ciatrick Fason — younger, more dynamic players — were pushing him for playing time.

Last spring, Carthon enrolled at UF to finish a sociology degree, and he and Moore crossed paths while using the same academic adviser.

"The media was ready to replace me with three talented young guys, and it's basically the same thing Kestahn is going through," said Carthon, now a scout with the Atlanta Falcons. "I just reached out to him and told him I've been there before. It's just a matter of how you deal with it."

Both players say they welcomed the competition as a way to get better.

"It's not frustrating to me," Moore said. "I like it. I tell them to go out there and race to see who's the fastest. I'm not a jealous person.

I'm always for the team, so if you have people like that who are fortunate and gifted to run a 4.2 (40-yard dash) — I wish I could run that, but they can help the team, and that's why we recruit them."

Moore is fine with his teammates receiving the hype, and the negative talk doesn't bother him since he doesn't read newspapers or message boards. But Carthon knows from experience that bad vibes can trickle in.

"It definitely gets frustrating, because you're like, 'Damn, I've broken my back for all these years to get where I'm at, and now I'm being written off and people don't want me here,'" he said.

"I could tell when I told him that it kind of reached home. I don't know if he has expressed his feelings to anybody, but I could just look in his eyes and tell that what I told him hit home."

There has been talk of moving Moore into a full-back or tailback role where his Ninja Turtle frame can be

utilized more for blocking, but he will still get carries.

While he knows touches will be hard to come by, Moore still hopes to grind out 1,000 yards this season.

Doing so would make him the first 1,000-yard back since Fason in 2004, and it would be a big increase from his 578 yards in 2007.

But Moore has learned something from his understudies — it doesn't take a lot of carries to earn a lot of yards.

"That's my personal goal, and if I can pop some big ones like Demps and get 76 yards on two carries (Demps' stats from last week's game), it'll be a lot easier," Moore said with a laugh.

"If I can get seven carries and pop a couple, I'll be good."

# Gators renew rivalry with Hurricanes, hope to avenge 2004 defeat

It has been a while since these teams last met, but don't tell the Gators it's not a rivalry.

When Miami (1-0) and No. 5 UF (1-0) face off at 8 p.m. in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium on Saturday, it will be like the four-year break in the series never happened.

"It's a huge rivalry game," UF quarterback Tim Tebow said. "They're a huge powerhouse program, and they're in the state of Florida. And they've been beating up on Florida a lot lately.

"It's just like Florida State, except we don't play them as often."

Miami took that last meeting, 27-10, in the 2004 Peach Bowl on New Year's Day as well as the contests in 2003, 2002 and 2000.

In fact, it's been 22 years since a Gators victory over

the Hurricanes. Way back in 1985, when Tebow was two years from being born and the oldest Gator, Butch Rowley, was a young lad of six months, the Gators beat the Hurricanes 35-23.

Tebow was not alive when UF last won against Miami, but that doesn't stop him from feeling the competition.

"I do remember watching the Peach Bowl (2004), and that wasn't very pretty," Tebow said. "I was pretty upset watching that game."

The fact that both teams call the state of Florida home means the game also brings together old high school teammates and rivals.

Tebow's competition at quarterback on Saturday will be the man who snatched the state single-season records for passing yards and touchdowns from Tebow's fingers.

Robert Marve, a redshirt freshman, will be making his college football debut in the game. Marve won

Florida's Mr. Football award in 2006, one year after Tebow earned the honor.

Marve's final game as a high school player for Plant High came against Nease, Tebow's school. Plant won that game for the state championship.

"Rub it in, alright," Tebow said.

It's not just Tebow who has Miami connections.

Defensive lineman Matt Patchan's father is a former Miami offensive lineman who won a national championship with the Hurricanes in 1987.

Wide receiver Deonte Thompson attended the same high school as three current Hurricanes, one of them his cousin, Damien Berry.

Sophomore safety Major Wright of Miramar was inundated with Miami talk during the summer.

"That's basically what I heard every day," Wright

said. "Miami, Miami, Miami this, Miami that. I would just look forward to a good game."

It's a different story for sophomore cornerback Joe Haden, who is originally from Fort Washington, Md., and did not grow up around the UF-Miami rivalry. Instead, his Florida-bred teammates have been filling him in on the intensity.

"They just really don't like 'The U,'" Haden said. "It's not as bad as Florida State, but they don't like 'The U.'"

The Gators will be able to unleash two weapons against Miami that they could not in week one against Hawaii.

Junior wide receiver Percy Harvin and junior linebacker Brandon Spikes will suit up for the home team, ready to go after their absences from the season opener.

"I've just been itching to get on the field so bad," Harvin said. "I kind of was itching to pad up."
