Gators blow past Vols

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — One hundred thousand orange shirts, and they were all in the wrong hue.

No. 4 UF's game against Tennessee was a laugher 11 minutes in, and the crowd in a filled-to-the-rafters Neyland Stadium had nothing to cheer about after the player introductions.

It was 17-0 so fast, the fans didn't know what to do with themselves.

The Gators (3-0) carried early momentum with them for the rest of the game, claiming a 30-6 victory against the Volunteers (1-2).

After Brandon James' 78-yard touchdown punt return

late in the first quarter, no amount of singing "Rocky Top" was going to bring the Volunteers back into the game.

"It just kind of takes the crowd out of it," UF coach Urban Meyer said of the return.

Gators quarterback Tim Tebow spent time last week talking about how important momentum is in college football when explaining how Ohio State lost its game against Southern Cal. On Saturday, the impact of momentum was crystal clear, and the Gators should have no trouble carrying the effects of this giant victory into next week's home contest against Mississippi.

"I'm starting to like this team a little bit," Meyer said. "I'm not going to say a lot, but I like this team a little bit because they know how to practice and are acting very mature right now."

The deflation of Neyland was complete when Tennessee

Obama visits Jacksonville

At a rally in Jacksonville on Saturday, Democratic presidential nominee Barack Obama took aim at investment bankers, insurance companies and high-salaried citizens, declaring they could spare some change.

"The events of this week have shown that the stakes of this election could not be higher; they could not be clearer," Obama said. "We are in the midst of the most serious financial crisis in generations."

The Illinois senator addressed a crowd of about 20,000 on Saturday afternoon at downtown Jacksonville's Metropolitan Park.

About 12,000 people filled the park

to capacity, according to the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office.

About 8,000 more were turned away from the park more than half an hour before the speech was scheduled to begin.

Those denied entry gathered around loudspeakers placed on the outskirts of the park.

Two small planes circled overhead, dragging banners reading "Florida Is McCain & Palin Country" and "Raising Taxes Is Not Patriotic."

Obama seemed impressed by the turnout.

"I'm amazed we got such a big crowd," he said at the beginning of his address. "Are there any Gator fans in the house? ... I don't

Palin tour hits Florida

The 90-degree weather on Sunday forced people to find a spot in the shade as they stood and sweated in the heat waiting to hear from one of this election season's most controversial figures, Republican vice presidential candidate, Alaskan Gov. Sarah Palin.

At least a dozen were carted off by paramedics for heat stroke or exhaustion.

Still, that didn't deter the more

than 20,000 people who gathered at the town square stage of The Villages, a 72,000-resident retirement community near Lady Lake, Fla., around 4:30 p.m.





Supreme Court decision could increase construction

■ CITY CAN NOW FUND COMMERCIAL PROJECTS.

A reversed Florida Supreme Court decision could mean more construction projects around Gainesville.

The court reversed the decision Thursday on Strand v.

Escambia County, a case that had outlawed a common practice used to encourage developers to build in more expensive areas, such as Gainesville's downtown area.

The practice offers developers funds from property taxes over many years, without requiring a voter referendum.

Before they were declared illegal, the city was in the process of offering these long-term agree-

ments to luxury condo project University Corners and apartment complex University House.

Now that the case has been overturned, the city may decide to renew its offers.

Frank Darabi, a partner on University Corners, said he has not spoken to city officials but is excited to hear about the court decision.

"That's what we've been wait-

ing for," Darabi said.

Construction on University Corners, at the corner of 13th Street and West University Avenue, has been at a standstill.

Construction at University House has been completed, but developers are still awaiting funding.

The Community Redevelopment Agency proposed Monday that the city offer the developer a one-year funding

contract renewable over the next 15 years.

Since the reversal, city spokesman Bob Woods said Gainesville offered Friday to renegotiate a 15-year agreement but has not heard back from University House representatives.

Woods said officials were pleased to hear of the reversal.

"Sometimes it's hard to make the playing field level unless you have certain tools," he said.

Obama criticizes McCain's tax breaks

know if ya'll are aware there's football today."

During the 30-minute speech, which was delayed more than an hour because of traffic, Obama criticized Republican candidate John McCain's support for fewer financial regulations and tax breaks for those making more than \$250,000 a year.

He said such deregulation is the cause of recent investment bank collapses and could not be expected to hold up any better for health insurance companies.

"I will cut taxes for 95 percent of all working families," Obama said. "If you make less than a quarter-million dollars a year — is that you? — you will not see your taxes increase one dime."

Filip Molina, an English senior at UF who attended the rally, said he hoped that he could one day tell his children he not only voted for

Barack Obama, but saw him in person.

After waiting in the heat past Obama's scheduled appearance time, Molina said he was glad to see that the candidate jogged from his bus to the stage.

"I thought to myself, 'Here's a chance for him to show that he's not like the other people,'" Molina said. "That's just a very subtle sign to show people that he was hopeful and spirited even though people were passing out."

Florida remains a battleground state for McCain and Obama. Jacksonville was Obama's last stop in a whirlwind tour of Florida, in which he also spoke in Coral Gables and Daytona Beach.

"Florida is close, but Florida is always close," Florida Sen. Bill Nelson said before Obama took the stage in Jacksonville. "The person who wins Florida is going to win the presidency."

Party releases platform

■ STUDENTS CAN EDIT GOALS.

The Orange and Blue Party released its platform for public input Sunday, but some of the party's ideas could be modified by the time the Student Government election arrives.

Some of the platform points, which include switching UF's e-mail service provider to Gmail and implementing online voting in SG elections, will be familiar to students who voted in spring, but a few ideas are new.

The party's platform is available as a wiki, so students can edit the platform and share their ideas. The platform is linked to from the party's Web site: www.orangeandblueparty.com.

Orange and Blue Party President Sam Miorelli said a new idea that came up in the party's meeting last week was to make STD testing available to students for free.

Miorelli said there are a lot of resources in Alachua County that offer free and reduced-price STD testing, but student access to those places is limited because they are not on campus.

The party also supports creating a committee consisting of students, faculty and alumni to advise UF about where to invest its endowment. The party also wants UF to join the Worker Rights Consortium to ensure Gator and UF apparel is not pro-

duced by exploited workers. Miorelli said his party supports Universities Allied for Essential Medicines, which aims to make new drugs developed by UF affordable.

"These are things that Student Government needs to put a strong and official student voice behind," he said.

He said the party aims to cut down on wasteful spending by enlisting a third-party audit of SG's multi-million dollar budget, which is paid by students through Activity and Service fees.

"We don't feel like many students, including us, really trust how Student Government has been spending the money," Miorelli said.

Another initiative calls for the creation of a student committee to oversee entertainment selections for Gator Growl, which is billed as the world's largest student-run pep rally.

This year, comedian Jon Reep of NBC's "Last Comic Standing" and Steve Miller Band will perform.

Miorelli said he has not been impressed with the acts in the past few years, which last year included comedian Frank Caliendo of "MADtv."

"When we've got a bad impersonation of the president, and FSU has Stephen Colbert, you know that there's something wrong," he said.

Gator Party President Luis Nobriga said his party's platform would likely be released at the end of the week.

Band enters ESPN contest

Revisions satisfy Orange and Blue

■ TRUSTEES VOTE TODAY.

Members of the Orange and Blue Party, who have made controversial revisions to UF's Student Conduct Code a major part of its agenda in recent weeks, said they are happy with the final version of the changes, which were released Thursday.

The changes include a ban on common source containers, such as kegs and beer balls, and activities that encourage excessive, rapid consumption of alcohol, such as drinking games, "on campus, in the housing of

any University of Florida organization or group, or in connection with a University activity," according to the code revision.

Cain Norris, an Orange and Blue Party candidate for District B in the

upcoming election, said he the

UF Administration new regulation contains the university's jurisdiction to campus and university events. The Board of Trustees' Educational Policy and Strategy Committee will vote on the changes in a teleconference at 2 p.m. today. The full

board will vote on the changes in a Wednesday teleconference.

Orange and Blue Party President Sam Miorelli said his party has largely stopped collecting signatures for its petition, which opposed a previous version of the changes. The petition had over 200 signatures, he said.

But Miorelli said the fight's not over yet.

"We feel like it's important for us not to let our guard down on this until the final vote is cast," he said.

Plus Side

Minus grades not the end of the world



Students have stake in SG election

They're back. Equipped with new fliers, slogans, T-shirts and platforms, Student Government parties are back en masse and yearning for our votes. Every fall and spring semester, UF students are overwhelmed by party volunteers and ads trying to swing every Gator's vote.

Unfortunately, most of the time these pleas fall on deaf ears. Last spring, 8,129 total ballots were cast for student candidates and referendum questions.

This number may sound like an impressive amount of voters, but let's put it in context. The UF Office of Institutional Planning and Research reports that more than 51,000 students attend UF. This means about 16 percent of UF students use their right to vote for their student representatives.

As the state's flagship institution, this is simply unacceptable. Even if students feel disconnected in relation to the local, state or national legislative system, the same should not be true for how they feel about their school.

There are two reasons why you should go out to the polls on Oct. 7 and 8 to cast a ballot for your fellow Gators.

The first is the money. SG has a total budget of \$13.6 million that will be dished out next year.

You pay into this SG slush fund when you pay your student activities fee each semester, so you, too, have a stake in it.

This money gets directly funneled to us through several different mechanisms.

SG funds dozens of student groups — such as Accent — and divvies money out to the Reitz Union and the Recreational Sports Department.

The second reason everyone should vote is that SG's actions and policies affect us in concrete ways.

A strong Student Senate can stand up against unfair university policies, and the student body president sits on the Board of Trustees. SG helps plan transportation regulations and fund upkeep of the Reitz Union and Southwest Recreation Center. And remember those dreaded hand scanners that nobody wants? The election is the place to vote on a referendum against them.

Marine's courage, sacrifice deserve highest possible honor

Last week, Secretary of Defense Robert Gates decided that Sgt. Rafael Peralta would not be awarded the Medal of Honor. Instead, Gates decided that he should be awarded the Navy Cross.

For those who have never heard of Peralta, he was a Marine who took part in Operation Phantom Fury in the city of Fallujah, Iraq, during November 2004.

While leading a patrol into a house Nov. 15, he encountered a group of insurgents and was shot

several times in the face and chest.

During the fight, one of the attackers threw a grenade at the group of Marines, and, despite his wounds, Peralta was able to grab the grenade and pull it up to his chest before it exploded, saving the lives of his fellow Marines.

Both the Marine Corps and the Secretary of the Navy pushed for Peralta to be awarded the Medal of Honor. Gates decided the Navy Cross was more appropriate.

Many speculate the reason for this decision was that Peralta used

to be an illegal immigrant and, if awarded the medal, a political firestorm might ensue.

Whatever the reason, I think it is disgraceful that he was not awarded the medal. The Navy Cross is a great honor the Marine Corps does not bestow lightly. Peralta clearly met the criteria for the Medal of Honor.

Thankfully, Peralta's family and friends refused to accept that he be shortchanged for his bravery. They

are still trying to see that Peralta receives the honor he deserves — as are several members of Congress.

I knew Peralta. I was with him in Iraq, and I know firsthand that the tales of his bravery and courage are not exaggerated. If anything, they have been understated.

He didn't have to be in Fallujah leading the way on Nov. 15. He could have taken the easy route and sat behind a desk, and no one would have been the wiser. He volunteered to be there because he wanted to serve his country in the most dif-

ficult way possible.

He may not have been born in the United States, but Peralta loved his adopted country more than most native-born Americans do.

Regardless of your views about the Iraq war, acts of selflessness like Peralta's must be properly acknowledged. I hope he receives the recognition he deserves and is able to take his place among the Medal of Honor recipients who have given their lives for their country.



GPD proposes security charges for visiting candidates


Gainesville officials are preparing for potential visits from political candidates by deciding on the most cost-efficient way to protect them.

At a City Commission meeting Thursday, Gainesville Police Chief Norman Botsford proposed a plan

to make security costs more consistent during visits from political or public figures during election season.

Botsford proposed that GPD charge important figures for security to and from events.

During each event, the owner of the facility would be responsible for paying for security, which could be provided by the police.

Security fees for GPD are currently set at \$49 per officer per hour, city documents stated.

The proposal was sent to the committee for

While one of them was not charged for security, the other was asked to pay, Mayor Peegen Hanrahan said at the meeting.

With another election approaching, Gainesville should be prepared

for visits from political figures, GPD Lt. Keith Kameg said.

It was brought up at the meeting that many cities don't have policies on political security.

Kameg said safety for political figures is an important issue.

"We live in a country of divided beliefs," Kameg said. "When beliefs are considered wrong, danger could be involved."



"Famous is famous, but being


famous for being a Gator would be pretty incredible."

Mills and other Gators will also have chances to film their stories at home football games against Louisiana State University, the University of Kentucky and The Citadel.



quarterback Jonathan Crompton botched a handoff attempt when it looked like the Volunteers were ready to score.

UF defensive end Carlos Dunlap jumped on the fumble, and the entire Gators' defense was off the field with the ball before all of Tennessee's players stood up.

"We shot ourselves in the foot," Crompton said. "We should have won the ball game, in my opinion. We gave up 14 points in the red zone and they scored 7 points off turnovers. We fumbled on the first drive, and that gave them 3 more. Those things change the whole momentum of the game."

Momentum stayed with the Gators on a 3rd-and-13 play midway through the second quarter.

When the Volunteers seemed to be figuring out the Gators' offense, Tebow called an audible at the line of scrimmage and hit Percy Harvin over the middle for a 34-yard pass.

A Tennessee facemask penalty tacked 15 yards onto the play, and the Gators found themselves with a 1st and 10 at the Volunteers' 25-yard line.

A field goal on the drive put UF up 20 before the end of the first half.

The boos rained down on Crompton and the Tennessee offense after UF cornerback Janoris Jenkins intercepted the ball in the end zone with two seconds left

in the first half on a fourth-down play.

This was not how Tennessee fans expected their team to perform.

By the time Percy Harvin caught his first touchdown pass of the season with 4:29 remaining in the third quarter, many Volunteers supporters were done watching the slaughter. They began pouring out of the stadium at every exit, disheartened with the performance

of their team.

"We try to get them out of those stands early," James said. "Our motto is, we always say it doesn't have to be close."

The crazy, wild, 100,000-fan environment had already been quieted, but with 20 minutes still left in the game, it was conquered. The home-field advantage was nowhere to be found.

"In the NFL, they say crowd noise is worth 7 points," UF coach Urban Meyer said. "I think it's worth more, probably, in college."

The referees even made it hard on the depleted crowd. In the waning moments of the third quarter, a pass to Tennessee tight end Luke Stocker was ruled a touchdown, but then reversed. The fans' loud-

est applause of the game was taken away from them.


When the Volunteers finally broke the plane of the end zone, the clapping was significantly quieter.

Tennessee had not lost a home game by this many points since the 34-10 defeat at the hands of No. 9 Auburn in 2004.

By the time it was all over, the swarm of orange had been replaced by an ugly gray shell, with a few dense pockets of blue celebrating the Gators' 24-point victory.

UF players celebrated by dancing and singing the fight song in one corner of the stadium while the Volunteers played a somber version of their alma mater in another.

The contrast could not have been starker.

her husband, Todd Palin, self-proclaimed Alaskan "first dude" — emerged on the stage to a roar of wild adulation.

She offered little new information in her speech, but reminded Florida voters of their ability to swing the election.

"Florida, with your vote, we're going to win, and we're going to Washington to shake things up."

However, some in attendance said it was a small price to pay to see and hear the woman who they hope will be victorious in what was called one of the most important elections of their lives.

"Romney, Giuliani, even George Bush in 2004, none of them got a crowd this big or this excited when they visited," said Jeanne Holliday, an event volunteer and resident of The Villages. "There's something special about Sarah."

Retired naval officer Terry Marshal equated the massive speech's energy to a

football game.

"I'm here," Marshal said, "and I've never been to a political rally before in my life."

For Marshal, it's all about the international issues, such as keeping nuclear weapons out of Iran and holding a hard line with a resurgent Russia.

Others support Palin for her anti-arbor-tion views, including about 20 UF students with the campus chapter of the Pro-Life Alliance who left for the event from the Reitz Union at 6:45

a.m. to get a prime viewing spot.

Amid shouts of "We love you Sarah," Palin's speech dipped into friendly banter as well as party-line policy. The Alaska governor also took jabs at Democratic presidential candidate Barack Obama, who spoke in Jacksonville on Saturday.

"Truly there is only one man of wisdom to fix our government and economy: John McCain," she said.

Gators dominate Volunteers early with big plays

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — It's fair to say the rivalry between UF and Tennessee has become lackluster.

With Saturday's 30-6 demolition of the Volunteers (1-2), the No. 4 Gators (3-0) earned their fourth consecutive victory against Tennessee.

It was also the 12th win in the last 16 games against Tennessee for UF.

The Gators wasted little time in sucking the air out of Neyland Stadium as they opened the game with a nine-play, 56-yard touchdown drive in which Tim Tebow brought his patented jump pass out of retirement with a 2-yard loft to tight end Aaron Hernandez.

UF took a 10-0 lead after a Montario Hardesty fumble on Tennessee's next drive resulting in a Jonathan Phillips field goal.

Junior kick returner Brandon James made the play of the game later in the first quarter after Tennessee's stagnant offense was forced to punt the ball.

James, who returned an 83-yard punt for a touchdown against Tennessee last season, brought back a 78-yard punt for a touchdown.

"Usually on most of my returns guys do a great job blocking, and I don't have to go and make people miss," James said.

Tennessee did as good of a job losing the game as the Gators did in winning it.

The Volunteers turned the ball over at the 1-yard line on two different occasions.



The first came at the tail end of a 14-play, 71-yard drive that would have cut the lead to 17-7.

Tennessee running back Arian Foster mishandled a handoff from quarterback Jonathan Crompton, and the ball was recovered by sophomore defensive end Carlos Dunlap.

The second turnover came at the end of the first half on what was an

Timid playcalling hides team's talent

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Man, you're such a frigging stud. You've got the prettiest gal in school walking arm in arm with you almost 24/7. You drive up every day in a sleek Mercedes. Your Abercrombie and Hollister shirts are always neatly pressed. You've got Division-I coaches texting you every day, saying how you're their final piece in a national championship run.

Except nobody knows it. You keep your best attributes hidden and play it safe.

Doesn't make sense? Don't worry, I don't get it either.

That's exactly why UF's offense was so perplexing Saturday. Yes, the Gators embarrassed one of their biggest rivals and probably cost Phil Fulmer his job. And yes, they should've scored at least three more touchdowns than they did.

Nothing personal, Timmy Tebow, but you don't need to be running up the middle 12 times like you did against Tennessee. Not when you've got Chris Rainey, Emmanuel Moody, Percy Harvin and Jeff Demps. What you should be doing instead, Tim, is actually reeling back and using your cannon arm to throw the ball

downfield. Can we please get a chance to see this speed and explosiveness that's been talked about since the spring? Let's actually see if Carl Moore can be a threat downfield rather than labeling him a bust — like some have

already done. How about using the wide receivers' athleticism to stretch the field so defenses don't just line up in the box waiting for Tebow to come bowling through the offensive line?

The only good thing that came from Saturday's play calling was that Kestahn Moore didn't get a carry. Moore deserves every accolade he receives for his leadership off the field, but what he does on the field can be replicated — and bettered — by every other running back on UF's roster.

Last week, Urban Meyer told Percy Harvin he was going to "let him loose." Two catches

James gets his kicks

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — There's just something about Tennessee that makes Brandon James go.

"I don't know what it is," James said. "I think I just get up for the rivalry and just try to bring my best game."

The UF running back and kick returner had another breathtaking return on Saturday, taking a punt for a 78-yard touchdown late in the first quarter.

The touchdown was the fourth in James' career, tying a UF record. UF went up 17-0 at that point, and it was all but over for Tennessee.

"That one felt like I was doing too much juking and jiving, but it worked out in the end," James said.

James also said that might have

been the best punt return of his career. He stopped in a crowd of Tennessee players, then sped up in an instant and found a hole.

The diminutive junior only touched the ball twice in the first half — the punt-return touchdown being the second — but he earned 130 yards for UF.

Those 130 yards were 90 more than the Gators' offense tallied in the first quarter and 22 more than UF got in the entire half.

"If you can hold a block for one second with a good punt returner, it's 10 yards," UF coach Urban Meyer said. "With Brandon James? Hold it for one second, and it might be more than that."

Scoring against Tennessee is not unusual for James.

In last season's contest, James kicked off the Gators' 59-20 rout with

Bowers back in action, helps team to first SEC wins

LSU was supposed to be the team that could put an end to UF's dominance of the Southeastern Conference.

With three preseason All-Conference selections, it would appear this could be the year the Tigers could bring down a young Gators squad.

UF coach Mary Wise insisted before the match it would be one of her team's biggest challenges of the season.

But apparently, the more things change, the more they stay the same.

The No. 11 Gators' 3-1 (25-12, 25-22, 21-25, 25-19) drubbing of the

Tigers (5-4, 0-2 SEC) makes it seem like the rest of the conference is still as far away as ever from knocking off the juggernaut Wise has built in Gainesville.

The win came on the heels of UF's (8-1, 2-0 SEC) Friday-night 3-0 (25-18, 25-16, 25-16) beatdown of eastern conference rival Georgia — a team that the Gators have never lost to.

"We're Florida. We're a really good team. A lot of people are going to try and put a target on our backs," middle blocker Kelsey Bowers said.

Bowers saw extensive action for the first time all season in the Gators' last two games.

Her match-high seven blocks led the way defensively for UF against LSU. But the senior showed that she still has her offensive touch as well,

racking up five kills on only eight swings and finishing with a team-high .625 hitting percentage.

"This was the match where Kelsey Bowers returned," Wise said. "(She) was a difference-maker out there."

It was the return to the lineup that Bowers had been itching to make.

"My back is finally starting to feel better," she said. "I feel strong."

Wise said she hopes that with Bowers back on the court, her team will be able to shore up the blocking that has been a weak point for the Gators this season.

"Ten blocks is good, but I think that we can be so much better," Wise said.

Wise continues to praise the play of junior libero Elyse Cusack.

Her match-high 21 digs and consistent defensive play have helped bring stability to the young team.

But it's not just Cusack who has stepped up defensively for the Gators.

Wise pointed out the improvement of freshman setter Cindy Bathelt (eight digs), who is now making an impact after being relied on solely to distribute the ball early in the season.

"We're beginning to pick up balls in the back row that we should be picking up all the time," Wise said.

Offensively, the story of the weekend was the emergence of freshman

outside hitter Colleen Ward.

Her career-high 15 kills against LSU and 10 in the win over Georgia have given an already loaded UF arsenal a new weapon.

"Not only can she score points for us, but she can be low-error too," Wise said. "Sometimes you have players that can get you points, but then they give just as many to the other team. Colleen doesn't make those mistakes."

Trying to get the always humble Wise to talk about her run of the SEC — she's won 17 consecutive conference championships — is nearly impossible, but needless to say it appears that the road to the title still runs through Gainesville.

"Two and 0 at home is the right place to start, but it's a long season," Wise said.

11-play, 60-yard drive. Facing 4th and 1 with six seconds remaining in the half, Crompton threw a pick to cornerback Janoris Jenkins.

UF entered the half with a 20-0 lead.

Game. Set. Match.

"That wasn't us," coach Phil Fulmer said. "The penalties, the red-zone efforts ... we've been outstanding in those areas (in our previous games). We never gave our defense a

chance."

One year ago, it was Tebow's defense that never gave him a chance.

For the second time this season, the reigning Heisman Trophy winner had less than spectacular stats — he finished 8-of-15 for 96 yards and two touchdowns — but once again the Gators came away with an easy victory.

"You can really count on (the defense)," Tebow said. "You don't have to force anything. It's a great thing. They're out there, and they're playing hard and making plays."

And just when it appeared that UF was still

a team without a workhorse running back, Emmanuel Moody finally had the game Gators fans have waited years for. Moody led UF with 55 yards on nine carries.

"All I want to do is have a role," Moody said. "That doesn't mean I have to be the key guy in carries, but I just feel like the whole team has meshed together well and whatever part I play, I'm going to keep going hard."

While this is Tennessee's first 1-2 start since 1994, the Gators still feel like this win is as im-

portant as any other they have enjoyed over the years.

UF remembers how quickly fortunes can change. Last season, UF manhandled Tennessee, but the Volunteers still played in the Southeastern Conference Championship Game.

"It was a huge step for us," Tebow said. "For the last 12 to 15 years, the winner of this game has had a lot of success in the SEC, and it gives you a lot of momentum. That surge going into SEC play, you can really feed off of and get focused."

an 82-yard punt return for a touchdown.

Neyland Stadium is also where James made his premiere starting appearance for the Gators.

Earlier this week, Meyer relayed a story about how James first earned the starting punt-returner job one hour before the Tennessee game in 2006.

Meyer was impressed with James' composure while fans were hurling obscenities the Gators way before that game two years ago.

"I look at him, and he starts doing the Gator chomp," Meyer

said. "That kid is not intimidated by anything, so I grabbed him and I said, 'You're the punt returner today.'"

James racked up 65 return yards on four punts including a long of 35 in that game.

After James' reputation for the big play was reaffirmed early on Saturday, he didn't get a touch until the third quarter.

The Gators, expecting Tennessee to punt away from James, put James and wide

receiver Percy Harvin deep to catch the punt.

James made the catch, then he and Harvin ran to the center of the field. James faked a pitch to Harvin and took the ball for 14 yards to the Volunteers' 47.

"We'll probably do a bit more of that," Meyer said. "Those two back there can be lethal."

During James' postgame interview, Meyer wedged his arm through a media crowd and doused James with water. The pride on Meyer's face was evident, and James laughed.

"Something's wrong with coach, man," said James with a smile, water running down his face. "I'm going to get him after this."

It's understandable to have a conservative offense when you have Chris Leak under center, and DeShawn Wynn plodding along behind him. It's not understandable when you have the only sophomore to ever win the Heisman Trophy and more than a handful of guys who run faster than a 4.3 40-yard dash.

Why putt along in a Volvo

when you have a Porsche? Why eat at McDonald's when you can be served filet mignon? Why be the church choir director if you've got the pipes of Aretha Franklin?

Bottom line: Why play it safe?

There's one thing that's clear so far in UF's season: This team has national championship potential. The defense has won games for this team, and that's after a year where they lost games and played like they were still at their high school proms.

Wouldn't you have a sick feeling in your stomach if, at the end of the year, the Gators could've made it farther if they had opened up their playbook just a tad more?







