



Fraternity suspended for 'ongoing hazing'

University Police bust into TEP house

A group of University Police officers entered the Tau Epsilon Phi Fraternity house Monday night to find 36 pledges kneeling shirtless on

the floor of the basement. The fraternity known as TEP was placed under interim suspension by the Dean of Students Office after the "ongoing hazing" was discovered, according to the UPD report released Wednesday. The following account of events

is taken from a UPD report written by detective Jacob Pruitt. Pruitt, interim Dean of Students Paige Crandall and other officers arrived at the TEP house at 8:45 p.m. after being called about pos-

sible hazing. In the large basement room, Pruitt identified the TEP pledge class kneeling shirtless on the floor, dressed in black gym shorts and shoes. Six TEP members stood in front of them, sitting in chairs and holding Coors bottles. As Pruitt instructed the pledges to sit down to take the pressure off their knees, one of the members in

the front of the room passed out and fell from his chair. The student was later taken to the hospital for unknown medical reasons. Pruitt found "baby diapers, diapers with duct tape attached, broken glass bottles, alcohol bottles, trash and a trash can that was half full of water and ice," the report stated.

Sen. analyzes election

After Florida's 27 electoral votes went to President-elect Barack Obama, contributing to his road to victory, some may wonder how the peninsula turned so blue.

Democratic Sen. Bill Nelson visited UF's Pugh Hall on Wednesday to provide post-election analysis of Tuesday's election and speak on Florida's role in the results.

Nelson said Obama's Florida victory was a combination of sweeping strategic counties, extensive ground operations, wise spending and an overlay of TV advertisements.

Nelson combed through the counties' individual results, saying he advised Obama to concentrate on the state's Interstate 4 corridor and the northeast triangle created by Jacksonville, Tallahassee and Gainesville.

Obama nailed "a huge swath" of Central Florida, including Orlando

and Tampa, which provides 45 percent of Florida's general election turnout, he said.

He pointed to the Democratic ticket's strategic surge of speeches across the state, which included a horse pasture in Ocala and a Miami hockey stadium.

"What you're seeing is a split along generational lines."



A shifting mind-set among voters, such as Cuban Americans in Miami, also helped swing the state in Obama's favor, he said.

"What you're seeing is a split along generational lines," Nelson said.

Nelson also spoke of the decisive gain by Democrats in the U.S. Senate, saying the increased representation would not widen the partisan divide because Americans want party squab-

UF alumnus' grandmother honored in Obama's speech

■ ANN NIXON COOPER'S GRANDSON GRADUATED UF IN 1986.

Ernest Hooper said the fondest part about hearing his 106-year-old grandmother's story immortalized in Barack Obama's victory speech did not come until morning.

About six hours after Obama's midnight

address, Hooper, a 44-year-old UF alumnus, woke his three children Wednesday and played the speech for them on a computer.

What his two teenage sons and 7-year-old daughter heard was the country's next president spend about two minutes describing how their great-grandmother, Ann Nixon Cooper — who was born when neither blacks nor women could vote — watched her country overcome economic hardship, homeland attacks and civil-rights disputes.

"To see the gleam in their eye when they heard President Obama say their great-grand-

mother's name, you know, it was an awesome moment for me," Hooper said. "I could see that they were inspired."

Hooper, a St. Petersburg Times columnist, graduated from UF in 1986 with a public relations degree and also worked for the Alligator.

He called his grandmother something of a celebrity in Atlanta. When she cast her vote for Obama about two weeks ago, local media

were there, and CNN did a story about how excited she was to get the chance to vote for Obama.

Obama called her home after the CNN story aired, but he left a voicemail because she was out with friends, Hooper said.

Hooper said the Obama campaign called Cooper on Tuesday and told her to watch the speech because she would be mentioned.

Never in his wildest dreams did he expect Obama to build his speech's conclusion

Man arrested after nine burglaries

A man was arrested Monday in connection with a string of nine burglaries in the Duck Pond area near downtown Gainesville.

Gainesville Police officers responded to a call from the 1100 block of Northeast Fourth Street saying someone was in the house next door, GPD spokeswoman Summer Hallett said.

When police arrived, a man who had been in the house took off running and jumped over a concrete wall to be met by police on Northeast Fifth Street, the report stated.

Samuel Holmes, 29, told police he was responsible for the nine break-ins, which all took place in a 24-hour period beginning Sunday at 10 a.m., according to GPD reports.

Holmes faces charges from all nine burglaries, Hallett said.

Police were able to recover some of the stolen property after Holmes told them he sold or traded some of it for crack cocaine, Hallett said.

Holmes has one outstanding arrest in Georgia and one in Alachua County, Hallett said.



SFC student remembered

■ A MEMORIAL WAS HELD FOR ROBERT MCCOY, 21.

An SFC student who died following a car accident in Jacksonville early Saturday morning was remembered Wednesday at a memorial service at the First United Methodist Church of Ocala.

Robert McCoy, 21, was a liberal arts major from Ocala in his first semester at SFC. McCoy and four other passengers were leaving a Halloween party at 1 a.m. in a 2002 Honda when the car was struck by a car traveling in the wrong direction.

Matt Samra, 20, said he was McCoy's roommate their freshman year at the University of North Florida and had known McCoy since they were both 11 years old.

"He was always really nice and put everyone before himself," Samra said.

Samra had been driving the Honda back

to his house in Jacksonville when the accident occurred.

The other passengers in the Honda were UF students Hailey Zielinski, 19, and Laura Milton, 20, and SFC student Sabrina Shields, 19. Zielinski and Shields are in Shands at Jacksonville in stable condition, Samra said.

McCoy's Gainesville roommate, UF student Dante Sorrentino, 20, said Shields and McCoy had been dating.

"Their one-year anniversary was on Halloween," Sorrentino said. "They loved each other so much and were probably going to get married."

The two met when McCoy transferred from UNF to Auburn University for his sophomore year, Sorrentino said.

Sorrentino said he thought McCoy transferred to SFC to be closer to his family.

"He loved being around his family," he said. "He would come down every weekend to go hunting with his dad, even when he was going to Auburn."

Some face voting issues

For some students who registered to vote with a nonpartisan group on campus, the election isn't over.

UF's Student Public Interest Research Groups, or PIRGs, is working with elections officials after 10 or 12 students who tried to register with the group's New Voters Project did not show up on county records, Alachua County Supervisor of Elections Pam Carpenter said.

Some were required to vote using provisional ballots, giving them until 5 p.m. today to clear up any issues.

Student PIRGs members don't know what went wrong with the registration forms.

"As far as we know, we submitted the forms," said R.J. Raley, Student PIRGs' Florida campus organizer.

Sujatha Jahagirdar, program director with Student PIRGs' New Voters Project, said the problem was discovered when some students called to check on their voter status and were informed they were

not registered.

Once the calls began, she said the group started to contact those students who would potentially have a problem at the polls.

"There was a batch that the first calls had come from," she said. "Those students had registered on the third of October."

All those who had registered through the organization on Oct. 3 were contacted by phone or e-mail with warnings stating they may have trouble voting, she said.

Raley said students who had tried to change their addresses with the group were able to do so at the polls, but those who registered for the first time had to vote on provisional ballots.

He said 2,500 other students had been successfully registered through the New Voters Project.

"The whole purpose of what we do is to make sure students have a voice in politics," he said.

Duke hires UF official to oversee human resources

■ UF SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT FOR ADMINISTRATION WILL START FEB. 1.

Kyle Cavanaugh, UF senior vice president for administration, will leave in January to lead human resources at Duke University.

Duke officials and UF President Bernie Machen announced the move Wednesday.

Cavanaugh, 50, has been at UF since May 2005, when he became the university's first vice president for human resources. He was promoted in 2007 to senior vice president for administration.

He will start at Duke on Feb. 1.

Machen wrote in a message to deans, directors and department chairs Wednesday that Brian Beach, UF's special assistant to the president, will become the interim senior

vice president.

Machen wrote that additional budget cuts are anticipated following state revenue shortfalls, and they need to be targeted during the next three months and through the legislative session starting in March.

"In these challenging times the continuity in our leadership is critical and by appointing Brian to the interim position, that continuity is guaranteed," he wrote.

David Jarmul, associate vice president of Duke's News and Communications, said Cavanaugh interviewed for the position over the past several weeks. Cavanaugh's new position will be entirely focused on human resources instead of finances and other broad areas that he oversees at UF, Jarmul said.

"We're delighted that he's coming," Jarmul said.

He said Cavanaugh's salary is not disclosed because Duke is a private institution.

Before Cavanaugh came to UF, he worked as associate vice president for hu-

man resource services for five years at the University of Texas at Austin. He previously worked in human resources at Rice University and Vanderbilt University, both private institutions.

Cavanaugh said he took the opportunity at Duke, which he called one of the top five institutions in the nation, because of its employment base of about 30,000 people and the autonomy given to those who run its operations.

"The Duke opportunity is probably only one of those opportunities that comes along maybe once in a person's career," he said.

The impact of UF's future budget cuts is still uncertain, but Cavanaugh said he said he plans to work with Beach as much as possible up to the day he leaves UF to prepare him for the cuts.

"This institution, as grand as it is, is going to be here for some time," Cavanaugh said.

Steve Dorman, dean of the College of Health and Human Performance, said he will miss Cavanaugh for his thoughtfulness and seasoned leadership and advice.

"I certainly think our university is better off for having him as a leader," Dorman said. "For me, it's a personal loss because he's a friend of mine."

Robert Jerry, dean of the Levin College of Law, agreed.

Jerry said he met Cavanaugh for dinner shortly before he decided to come to UF from the University of Texas at Austin in 2005. Cavanaugh improved a lot of UF operations during his four-year UF career, he said.

Jerry said he would be concerned about Cavanaugh's decision to leave even if it wasn't made with the prognosis of more budget cuts.

"Anytime Kyle leaves, I'll worry about the time he's leaving," Jerry said.

Eight TEP pledges said activities were voluntary

A few pledge brothers wore wet shoes, and one of them shivered on the floor, saying he was cold, though Pruitt wrote the room was warm. His socks were soaked as well as the pair of shoes placed next to him.

Sixteen members of the fraternity's pledge class were interviewed at the TEP house, 9 Frat Row, Monday night after the incident.

Eight of those interviewed provided pertinent details. Their names are not being published to protect their identities.

One interviewee said the

pledge brothers were made to sit on their knees for an hour and a half because there were only four chairs in the basement. If their knees hurt, they were allowed to sit, he said.

Another pledge said he had water poured on him, but it was a cup of water from the water fountain and only done as a joke.

A third pledge told Pruitt he had food poured on him, but it was also a joke, and he wasn't injured.

Another pledge said he heard that food and eggs were thrown at people.

The pledge also said a bowl of chocolate was passed around, but the pledges were

told the chocolates were actually laxatives.

No one interviewed showed signs of injury.

UF spokesman Steve Orlando confirmed the suspension Wednesday night.

"We take hazing very seriously, and that's why the UPD and Student Judicial Affairs are involved," Orlando said. No arrests had been made as of Wednesday night.

Eight fraternity members declined to comment on the story when reached by phone.

Orlando said police investigations of the men involved in the incident would continue.

around his grandmother, Hooper said.

"I got a little teary-eyed, certainly," he said. "She has been the matriarch of her family for such a long time. She means so much to all of us."

Cooper gave birth to four children, one of whom is alive, and has 14 living grandchildren. Hooper said he has lost count of the great-grandchildren.

National News Hooper wrote in a Wednesday column that television crews from

India, Britain and Japan planned to visit his grandmother since the speech.

Now that his family has been propelled to international fame, Hooper said he would follow his grandmother's example and stay humble about the attention.

Hooper said he thinks his grandmother will be invited to Obama's inauguration in January and imagines there will be some discussion among her 14 grandchildren about who will take her to the ceremony.

Hooper said he doesn't plan to fight to be the one who takes her to the White House.

"I'm fine just being able to call her my grandmother," he said.


bling to stop.






Abortion rhetoric not main problem



The legendary reggae-punk band Sublime may have collapsed in 1996, but their legacy is far from dead.

Crammed into Nick Greene's

DB: Jay-Z, T.I. Andre 3000 is about
one of the sickest MCs I've ever heard
in my life. Lil Wayne's hot. He's on
some lizard shit. He's like slithering

rhymes, he just sounds like that.





Lucas decides to transfer from UF

UF coach Billy Donovan announced Wednesday that sophomore point guard Jai Lucas will be transferring from the program.

Donovan and Lucas met to discuss his transfer around 1 p.m. Wednesday. At the time of the meeting, the rest of the team had not been informed of Lucas' decision.

"I feel bad because Jai's a great kid," Donovan said. "Any time a player leaves your program, you're always disappointed."

No players were made available for comment on Wednesday.

Senior Walter Hodge, who scored 12 points off the bench in the Gators' first exhibition against Warner on Monday, will replace Lucas in the starting lineup tonight when UF takes on Rollins College at 7 in the O'Connell Center.

Donovan said Lucas did not feel comfortable at UF, and his departure is not an issue of playing time.

"Part of it was being far away from home and not feeling like it was the best fit for him," Donovan said. "That's the way he put it."

According to Donovan, Lucas wrestled with the idea of splitting time with reigning Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year Nick Calathes at the point, and Lucas did not feel comfortable playing so many minutes off the ball.

Lucas is still free to use the basketball facilities at UF until he leaves, which Donovan said would likely be at the end of the semester.

"We haven't talked about schools or anything like that yet," Donovan said. "He's going to look at his options, and we are going to try and help him pursue whatever opportunities he may have going forward."

Donovan said he was surprised by the news, but

season would be an overstatement. To say it won't affect Calathes, the Gators' best player, would be an understatement.

Putting Walter Hodge at point guard is like Percy Harvin taking snaps out of the shotgun. Hodge, like Harvin, still has significant value. He'll spot up for that 3-pointer, and he'll even help out on the occasional press on both sides of the ball.

Just keep in mind that when Harvin is under center, he's running the ball. And when Hodge starts at point guard, he's not going to be running the offense. It's predictable.

Calathes was still the primary catalyst for UF's offense no matter what, but he had Lucas as his wingman. Now those wings have been clipped.

The Lucas-and-Calathes combination gave fans something to be excited for, something to hope for.

The duo was being talked about as one of the top 15-20 backcourt combinations in the nation. Now it's up to Calathes to be one of the top 15-20 players in the nation.

If the Gators want to make it back to the NCAA Tournament, he doesn't have a choice. With Lucas around, some of the blame comes off Calathes

UF backup quarterback Cameron Newton is in a neck brace after his car was rear-ended by a truck on Tuesday, coach Urban Meyer said.


Meyer did not know the severity of Newton's injury until Wednesday, but it was serious enough to keep Newton out of Wednesday's practice.

Moody led the team in rushing yards against Georgia with 71, but he did not see the field until late.

Vandy needs best game vs. UF

With No. 4 UF coming to Nashville on Saturday, Vanderbilt will take any help it can get.

Most betting services have the Gators as 24-point favorites, but Commodores coach Bobby Johnson had a different idea of how to level the playing field.

"If they want to play with 10, we'll allow them to do it. We'll take any advantage we can get," he jokingly said earlier this week. "We'll try to sneak 13 in there and have an odd number so the officials won't see it."

Johnson's sentiment may be surprising, considering a win Saturday would bump Vanderbilt into a tie atop the Southeastern Conference East.

The Commodores (5-3, 3-2 SEC) opened the season with five straight wins, earning national praise as they became the darlings of college football fans across the nation.

Vanderbilt is the SEC's only private school and has the league's smallest enrollment at 6,402 students, compared to UF's 51,520 students.

But a recent three-game slide has kept the Commodores one win away from becoming bowl eligible for the first time since 1982.

"Hopefully, we can play as well as we possibly can play," Johnson said Wednesday, "because I think that's what it's going to take to win."

Now, Vanderbilt comes off a bye week to face a UF team that has played some of its most complete games the past few weeks. The Gators (7-1, 5-1 SEC) lead the league in scoring offense (42.9

per game) and points allowed (11.6), and they are the only team in the league to score more than 300 points this season.

Johnson said UF's recent blowouts — it has won its last three games by an average of 42.3 points — doesn't make life easy.

The Gators won 49-22 in Gainesville last season.

"You don't want to be on the bad end of (a blowout) like we were last year against them," Johnson said.

"It motivates your guys to get out and learn the game plan."

One of the keys to Saturday's game will be the play of Vanderbilt quarterback Mackenzi Adams.


The junior came off the bench to lead a fourth-quarter comeback against Auburn and has started the last two games.

Adams is completing only 51 percent of his passes this season but poses a dual threat with his running ability. He has 137 yards on the ground this year.

"You could tell that he's a good emotional quarterback who plays with passion," UF linebacker Ryan Stamper said. "They were fired up when he came in (against Auburn)."


Johnson said the key will be not giving up big plays early.

"You do all you can to stay close and have a chance to win in the fourth quarter," he said. "That's how every game for us has played out (this season). ... I hope it can be close in the fourth quarter."

Boonstra finds success after eligibility issues in fall 2007

■ SHE IS THE ONLY GATOR TO QUALIFY FOR THE ITA NATIONAL INDOORS.

She arrived on a new campus, in a new country, surrounded by strangers and not allowed to play the sport she has played since her early teens.

Last fall was rough for Marrit Boonstra.

She came to Gainesville by way of the Netherlands, where she trained at the Dutch Tennis Federation for five years and was nationally ranked in the under-18 circuit.

Yet she was restricted to merely practicing with the Gators last year after the NCAA ruled her academically ineligible until the spring.

In an ironic twist, No. 67 Boonstra is the only Gator competing today at the ITA National Indoor Championships — the second ITA Grand Slam event of the season — in Charlottesville, Va.

Meanwhile, the rest of UF's team did not qualify for the National Indoors and are dealing with a cold-like sickness that has affected the team since

August.

While she originally was the only UF player unable to compete, it seems fitting Boonstra has not been infected by the illness.

Ever since she got word she was eligible to play last December, she has seemed untouchable.

Once the spring began, Boonstra played the No. 5 position and overmatched her opponents, compiling a 15-3 record.

In doubles play, she teamed with then-sophomore Megan Alexander to form a dominant duo.

Alexander and Boonstra made their presence felt early by downing then-No. 5 Melissa Mang and Amanda Granson of Duke 8-5 on Feb. 15 and ending the 2007 season in the nation's top 25.

While her first year with the Gators opened some eyes in the

college tennis world, coaches Roland Thornqvist and Dave Balogh saw ways to improve their internationally tested newcomer.

The UF staff began to strengthen Boonstra's backhand, and she worked on it while in the Netherlands after the spring season.

"She did a great job this summer when she was home practicing," Thornqvist said. "When she got back here, she had made big strides."

The European Gator has used those strides en route to an eventful fall.

Her play in singles matches has stood out, and she owns an 8-3 record, including four wins against top-100 players.

Prior to today's National Indoors, Boonstra's biggest tournament was the ITA All-American.

Although she failed to reach the main draw at the All-American, she played 6 1/2 hours of matches on Sept. 30 and won two matches.

One of those victories came against No. 38 Gabriela Niculescu of Southern Cal.

Having played many matches this fall, Boonstra has felt fatigued at times.

Never has exhaustion been so rewarding.

Gators advance to SEC Tourney second round with win

Going to overtime never crossed Becky Burleigh's mind.

Even when there were two minutes left and the game was tied at 1, the UF coach had no thoughts of extra minutes.

She must have known some-

thing everyone else didn't. With just more than a minute to play in regulation, junior Ashlee Elliott found a rebound in the box and put it in the back of the net to give No. 7 UF a 2-1 victory against Alabama — a very different outcome from their first meeting, which ended 6-1. The win allows UF to advance to the next round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament.

"We were ready to cross that bridge if we came to it, but we felt we were getting chances," Burleigh said. "Had it gone to overtime, we

wouldn't have panicked. But to finish it in regulation was great."

Even while the Gators were down a goal in the second half, panicking was never an issue.



It was the sixth time this season they were forced to win in come-from-behind fashion.

"(Having that experience) makes it a lot easier at halftime when you are saying, 'Hey, we've been here before, we're going to be fine,'"

Burleigh said. "That's a feeling our team has."

Burleigh said the biggest problem in the first half was her team not making the most of its chances.

Even with most of the Crimson Tide falling back to prevent the equalizer in the second period, the Gators still manufactured opportunities.

First-Team All-SEC member Megan Kerns was finally able to take advantage of one of the scoring chances and tie the game at 1 off a cross from Nicky Kit in the 67th

minute.

"We felt like (a goal) was coming, whereas some teams might just go, 'Oh, it's just not our night,'" Burleigh said.

Scoring the second goal before regulation ended was vital to allowing the Gators to be ready for their next match against Georgia on Friday.

"We needed to get that last goal so we didn't have to go into overtime," Elliott said. "I feel like overtime in this tournament is a big factor on everyone's bodies."

understood Lucas' desire to leave if he did not feel at home in Gainesville.

"I'm sure it's something that he's been thinking about for a while," Donovan said. "As a coach, you realize that these guys only have a certain length of time to play in college, and the last thing that you want is for him to be unhappy."

Donovan agreed to release Lucas after speaking to him and his mother.

"I hate to see him go, but I want to see him happy," Donovan said. "There's no reason to go through your career and say, 'Hey, I'm unhappy every day coming to practice.' That's no way to live."

The Bellaire, Texas, native is a former McDonald's All-American and averaged 8.5 points per game for the Gators as a freshman last year, starting all 36 games.

Lucas' transfer means freshman point

guard Erving Walker will likely become a major contributor in the backcourt this season.

Walker, who scored 13 points and dished out six assists against the Royals on Tuesday, outplayed Lucas, who went 1 for 9 from the field in his final game for UF.

"Erving has proved at least he can be a formidable backup backcourt

player for us, someone we can hopefully rely on," Donovan said.

The recovery of Adam Allen has suddenly become more urgent for the Gators.

Allen has been sidelined with a strained MCL in his left knee for the last two weeks and will be held out of tonight's final exhibition game.

The 6-foot-8 sophomore averaged 4 points per game in limited playing time last season.

"We need to get Adam Allen healthy," Donovan said.



