UF ends SEC run with bang

This is getting ridiculous. UF made opposing players look like they had just gotten out of bed and barely combed their hair — again.

Percy Harvin made scoring touchdowns look easier than cooking Ramen — again.

The Gators read the opponent's quarterback like a nursery rhyme and added to their interception total — again.

Perhaps what's even more ridiculous than anything is, as South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier put it, the Gators are a four-game winning streak away from their second national championship in three years. Of course, that's assuming the Gators make it past Florida State in two weeks and then a matchup with No. 1 Alabama in the Southeastern Conference Championship Game. If no other major upsets occur, then UF, No. 4 in the BCS, would probably play Texas Tech, Texas or Oklahoma in

the championship game.

The run this UF football team is on is one that the 1996 Gators title-winning team would give a standing ovation. That '96 team scored an absurd 376 points in conference play. This year's team scored 359. And that's with the majority of their second-string offense playing in the second half of many of those games.

In the stadium that Spurrier made famous, the biggest loss he had previously suffered — as a player or coach — was a 12-point defeat when he was manning the sidelines in 1993 against FSU.

That's until he and his now-dirt-covered visors came into Gainesville showcasing an offense with a colorblindness problem that made it unable to distinguish blue jerseys from white ones.

"We got royally beat," Spurrier said.

Beat. Throttled. Embarrassed. Pummeled. However you want to put it, Saturday was a bad day for South Carolina.

For the Gators (9-1, 7-1 SEC),

Court justice to visit UF

John Paul Stevens, the oldest and longest serving justice on the U.S. Supreme Court, will speak at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts on Monday.


Stevens, 88, will be the second U.S. Supreme Court justice to visit UF this semester and the fourth to visit since 2005.

Chief Justice John Roberts judged a moot court case between UF law students in September.

The event starts at 10 a.m.

Tickets, which were available to the UF law

school community first, are no longer being distributed.

Debra Amirin, Levin College of Law spokeswoman, said as of Wednesday, about 800 free tickets were distributed.

Stevens, who joined the court in 1975, will be joined by U.S. District Court Judge Jose A. Gonzalez Jr., UF law professors Sharon E. Rush and Michael Allan Wolf and Larry Dougherty, a third-year law student and editor-in-chief of

Crowd of 150 protests

Huddled under rainbow-colored umbrellas, Amendment 2 protestors met in the drizzling rain Saturday afternoon with a message: equal rights for everyone.

About 150 Gainesville residents rallied for an hour and a half at the corner of East First Street and University Avenue for the repeal of Amendment

2, which defined marriage as the union between one man and one woman and stripped state partner benefits — such

as hospital visitation, insurance sharing and Social Security benefits — from unmarried partners.

The Gainesville demonstration was part of a nationwide day of equal rights protests organized by



Fraternities, sororities battle for step title

■ **REIGNING STEP CHAMPIONS TOOK HOME TROPHIES.**

Incarnations of spacewomen, prisoners, Oompa-Loompas and Sean "Diddy" Combs pounded the stage of the Phillips Center for Performing Arts on Saturday night.

Four UF fraternities and four sororities from the National Panhellenic Council portrayed the characters as part of the annual Battle of the Greeks Step Show.

About 1,400 students piled into the center to watch the competition, sponsored by the nine-member greek council.

Although the Battle of the Greeks has only existed for four years, its predecessor, the Black Greek Expedition, has been around since the late 1990s, said John Foster, a member of the show's publicity committee.

Some of the themes included swash-buckling pirates, space expeditions, a spoof of MTV's "Making the Band" and a futuristic voyage.

Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity started off the night on the right foot — literally — when they performed their routine blindfolded and standing on one leg.

The uniqueness of the routine earned extra points with the nine judges.

Some of the performers took advan-

tage of special effects, such as fog and black lights, for their performances. Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, whose show was based on a journey to Mars, used strobe lights to simulate a feeling of low gravity.

Groups also made short video clips to help narrate their storylines.

Acrobatics and stunts were also used in routines. The pirates of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority made a human compass while spinning and lifting a girl, who posed as the needle.

Performers wove elements such as jump ropes and swords into some of the performances. Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority used canes in their routines, with one dancer banging her cane so hard against the stage that it broke into three pieces.

Once the organizations finished competing, UF's Apocalypse Dance Troupe performed and R&B artist Bobby Valentino put on a concert.

Audience members sang and danced along while waiting for the judges' results. Once the scores were tallied, the Philips Center became quiet as the audience awaited the news.

Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority — last year's reigning champions — took home a trophy and another year's worth of bragging rights.

Foster said he was pleased with the execution of this year's show.

"It was quite possibly the best one yet," he said.

\$14M stadium for women's lacrosse to open July 2009

UF is constructing a lacrosse stadium for the new women's lacrosse team that should be finished by July 2009.

The stadium, which cost almost \$14 million, is on Hull Road across from the Katie Seashole Pressly Softball Stadium.

The lacrosse stadium is solely funded by UF's University Athletic Association, or UAA, and will consist of about 1,400 seats and concession stands.

Bahar Armaghani, project manager for the stadium, said construction is running on time.

The stadium will also serve as a prac-

tice field for the UF soccer team.

A contract between the UAA and UF states that the land the soccer team uses for a practice field is needed for an intramural sports field, Associate Athletic Director Chip Howard said.

He added that the soccer team would continue to play in their stadium because it holds more people.

Soccer games average about 4,000 people a game.

The stadium will be equipped with locker rooms, concessions, additional parking and a sidewalk.

When construction is done, Hull Road will have a sidewalk on both sides of the street.

The construction will adhere to UF's environmentally friendly efforts. Trees that were originally in the area are being replanted or replaced by new trees elsewhere.

The land previously belonged to the Institute for Food and Agricultural Science.

While construction continues, the UAA has signed three coaches and 24 players for the team.

The coaches are head coach Amanda O'Leary and assistant coaches Jennifer Ulehla and Erica LaGrow.

LaGrow was recently invited to be part of the U.S. Lacrosse World Cup Training Team.

When the stadium is complete, the UF lacrosse team will begin practice in June 2009 and compete in Division I of the NCAA in spring 2010.

UF becomes first campus to honor World Diabetes Day**■ EVENT FEATURED LIGHTS, SPEAKERS, BUBBLES.**

Beneath bubbles and blue light, Gainesville Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan and others spoke at UF's Century Tower for World Diabetes Day, an event raising diabetes awareness and hope for a cure.

The ceremony drew more than 200 Friday night and made UF the first campus to commemorate the day.

"Together as a community we can do so much to reduce incidents of diabetes," Hanrahan said. "I have hope for the future."

She said there have been national and local increases of Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes.

However, she added that because awareness is spreading through events such as World Diabetes Day, those numbers could drop.

Hanrahan recognized and con-

gratulated programs such as UF's department of pathology and the Diabetes Center of Excellence at

Shands at UF for their contributions to diabetic research and prevention.

Desmond Schatz, a UF professor of medicine and diabetic research, spoke after the mayor

and said 23 million Americans have diabetes and 53 million are predisposed to develop it.

Schatz said awareness is critical because if more people understand diabetes, support for research and accessible health care will grow.


"Not only do we need money," he said. "We need you."

Rep. Charles Chestnut described diabetes as a silent killer. As a diabetic, he said he has had to change his entire lifestyle to stay healthy.

At the end of the ceremony, attendants formed a circle and blew bubbles around Century Tower, which was illuminated by blue spotlights.

Kathryn Parker, education coordinator for the Diabetes Center of Excellence, said the bubbles symbolized hope for the 236 million people living with diabetes worldwide.

Parker said blue lights also lit fountains near Tigert Hall, University Gallery and the Cultural Plaza, all in an effort to raise awareness.

Homeless Services Fair gives necessities to needy

Although Tony James of Gainesville has been out on the streets for about a week, he said it lifts his spirit to know that others are trying to help.

James was one of about 300 people who gathered at the Bo Diddley Community Plaza downtown Friday for the 10th annual Homeless Services Fair.

About two dozen organizations offered free services including haircuts, bike repairs, identification card services and even five-minute chair massages. Donated blankets and clothes were stacked on tables

that lined the plaza stage.

Fire of God Ministries and the Alachua County Coalition for the Homeless and Hungry partnered to serve a hot meal to all attendees.

After getting his hair cut, James pulled off his baseball cap to reveal his bare scalp.

"I didn't have a lot of hair to cut off anyway," he said with a laugh.

Others at the plaza sat around picnic tables sharing meals or sprawled on the grass, picking at banjos and playing harmonicas.

"The main thing about any organization here is to help the people, the citizens of Alachua County," said Marie Small of Choices, a health services provider for the uninsured.

One volunteer, Tony Morales, of Tampa, repaired bicycles for anyone who brought one over. Morales said it wasn't long ago that he was homeless too.

"I've been on the other side needing to get my bike fixed," he

said.

Another man, Danny Gryggs, said he rides his bike 23 miles from Hawthorne to volunteer every week with Arupa's Home Van, an organization that provides food for people downtown.

"You do not go hungry in this town," Gryggs said.

Norris Martin balanced a plate full of goulash, salad and a pre-packaged cherry pie as he sat down on a bench at the plaza.

"I ain't complaining," Martin said, as he covered his goulash in ranch dressing.

Along with the food provided Friday, many were able to pick up Regional Transit System bus

vouchers or find information about affordable housing and health care.

The Department of Motor Vehicles' mobile unit provided identification cards, which are often necessary to sign up for services, said Barbara Satterthwaite, DMV examiner specialist.

"You have to have an ID to get your foot in the door for anything," Satterthwaite said.

James said that's all most people want — an opportunity. But it's not easy to come by.

"A lot of us just can't get that one break," he said. "People need to take off their judgment and realize we're all in this together."

UF organizations are banding together to make students more aware of the hunger and homelessness around them.

Hunger and Homelessness Week begins its 14th year today, sponsored primarily by ACTIONS!, a service organization housed under the Center

for Leadership and Service that is assisted by the Black Student Union, SISTUHS, the Service Ambassadors and the Inter-Residence Hall Association.

The week's events kick off with the Hunger and Homelessness Organization Fair today on the Reitz Union Colonnade from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

"The purpose is to have students become more involved in helping those in the community by joining other student organizations that work for that cause on a year-round basis," said Shantelle

Bartra, the ACTIONS! Hunger and Homelessness Week Event co-chair.

The events continue tonight at 6 with the Oxfam Hunger Banquet in the Graham Recreation Room.

On Campus At the banquet, students will be divided into three groups consisting of a poor, middle and elite class, Bartra said.

The division serves to help students learn about the disparities between classes in society, said co-chair Ana Tapia.

"In society you don't get to choose what class you're born into," Tapia said.

Tapia said students will receive different amounts of food and treatment based on the class they are divided into.

The event will also feature three speakers who have experienced homelessness, Tapia said.


The events end Friday at 6 p.m. in the Graham Gallery with performances from student organizations and information about hunger and the homeless.

"Gainesville has one of the biggest homeless populations," Tapia said. "It's important to show that we don't just go to school here. We actually care and want to do something about it."



Tuition hike would protect degree value

It's your typical Monday morning: You grudgingly fight your way out of bed, stumble across campus to class and slump into the first seat you can find in the back of Carleton Auditorium. Your professor walks in and somberly approaches the lectern.

In the next ten minutes, you suddenly snap out of your hangover-induced daze as she informs you that you have one year to complete your degree because budget cuts have forced UF to cut the program.

This is rapidly becoming reality for thousands of UF students and faculty because of the budget cuts forced upon UF by the state Legislature. Putting minute details aside, UF is faced with budget cuts for the academic year, and more are expected as the economy continues to decline.

The quality of a UF degree and education suffers as programs get cut on every level from undergraduate to doctorate. Faculty members are fired on every level, and each year UF will admit 1,000 fewer students.

The State University System, which is comprised of Florida's 11 public universities, must find a way to increase revenues. The solution isn't pleasant, let alone politically palatable.

The best plan of action would be to hike tuition at Florida public universities while simultaneously decreasing Bright Futures eligibility. This plan may not be popular with students, but it is the only realistic solution to the threat facing our UF degrees.

Phasing out Bright Futures would be politically unfeasible in the current economic climate, but this outcome is inevitable, according to the Chair of the State Senate Committee on Education.

Aside from being the only possible course of action,

it actually won't prevent many students from attending a Florida public university.

According to state figures, the average family income of a student at UF is \$100,000 a year. When coupled with the fact that Floridians pay less for their education than residents of most other states — about \$3,300,

compared with the national average of \$6,100 — a tuition increase and tougher eligibility requirements for Bright Futures are both morally and fiscally acceptable.

Students who need help paying for school can get it from need-based scholarships and Bright Futures, which would still pay up to \$3,300 a year. Although this isn't a full ride, which Bright Futures currently provides for some students, it would cover more than half of tuition costs and force high school students to work harder to boost their grades.

Increasing tuition by just \$2,000 a year would generate more than \$70 million for UF, which easily covers the \$47 million in budget cuts we are saddled with. This increase would keep education costs well below the national average, maintaining the State of Florida's famous affordability.

In the current economic meltdown, it is selfish and impractical to allow the quality of a UF degree to deteriorate as funding melts away.

UF must raise tuition and the state must make Bright Futures more competitive. Your future could depend on it.



Former deputy to appeal firing from sheriff's office

A former deputy plans to appeal a decision by the Alachua County Sheriff's Office to fire him for reportedly lying about a minor traffic accident.

An Internal Affairs investigation revealed that Deputy Carl Klock, 36, could not provide any

details about a vehicle that he said rear-ended his patrol car July 8 on West University Avenue.

Three cars in front of Klock were also involved in the accident, said sheriff's office spokesman Steve Maynard.

Investigators determined that

Klock had been the cause of the accident and recommended that he be fired for lying, Maynard said.

Local News

Sheriff Sadie Darnell agreed with the recommendation and fired Klock

Wednesday, Maynard said.

The current punishment for a preventable crash in which the deputy is at fault is a reprimand and loss of patrol car take-home privilege for one night, Maynard said.

There is no monetary fine for

the first at-fault crash, he said.

"A small lie about the accident ruined his career and his job," Maynard said. "His incentive to not be truthful about the accident had no sense in it."

the Florida Law Review.

The group will talk about current legal issues. Rush, Wolf and Dougherty will ask questions submitted by UF law students.

The event is the first of the Marshall Criser Distinguished Lecture Series, which was created thanks to a \$600,000 donation in January 2007 from UF law school alumnus Lewis Schott, said Chris Brazda, UF Foundation spokesman.

The donation was matched by \$420,000 in state funds through Florida's University Major Gifts Program.

Robert Jerry, dean of UF's law school, said Stevens and Gonzalez declined to be paid for their appearances.

They were compensated for travel costs, Jerry said.

He said he was pleased students would have a second opportunity this semester to see a U.S. Supreme Court justice at UF.

But UF doesn't intend to stop bringing the big names any time soon, he added.

"There are not many law schools, if any, that have had this frequency of Supreme Court visitors," Jerry said.

JointheImpact.com.

The Web site launched in opposition to legislation passed in Florida, Arizona, Arkansas and California in the Nov. 4 election, including Proposition 8, which overturned a California ruling allowing same-sex marriages.

Over the next 10 months, Join The Impact founders hope to launch at least 10 more nationwide demonstrations, according to the site.

Gainesville residents Daniel and M.J. Roberts coordinated the local event using the Web site and Facebook.

M.J. Roberts, 39, said she relied mainly on word of mouth to advertise the protest. It worked.

At 1:30 p.m., when the protest was scheduled to begin, about 30 people stood along the curb of University Avenue. About 45 minutes later, more than 100 people were lining both sides of the road.

Despite wet weather, protesters stayed until 3 p.m., waving posters that read, "Shame On 2," "Can I Vote On Your Marriage Now?" and "2 is Poo."

Protester Stacie Greco, 31, wore a wedding veil while rallying with her partner, Christine Smith, 35.

Not all attendees were homosexual. "I think it's a civil rights issue," said Alicia Hamilton, 52. "I don't have to be gay to support it."

Hamilton's sign read, "Straight but I don't hate." "I'm ashamed to admit it now, but many many many years ago I voted against some of these rights when I was living in Miami," Hamilton said. "Now it's 20-something years later and my mind has been opened."

For others, the protest was personal. The Rev. Virginia McDaniel, a minister for 15 years, said her lesbian daughter married in California before the state voted to pass Proposition 8.


Now, she worries that her daughter's marriage status will be overturned.

"I think discrimination against people who happen to love people of the same sex is terrible," McDaniel said.

Student protesters from UF also braved the weather to show support. UF botany major Zoe Falcone protested with her girlfriend and a shivering Chihuahua named Widget.

Falcone, who is transgender, said she thinks it's unfair that people are able to decide on her rights.

"Even though we did elect a black president, gays got hit pretty bad this year," Falcone said.

Missing man kills himself in parking lot

A weeklong search for a Gainesville man ended in tragedy in the parking lot of the Jacksonville International Airport Friday morning.

Detectives found David Reiser, 66, in his van minutes before he reportedly shot himself in the head.

The Alachua County Sheriff's Office, or ASO, issued a silver alert for Reiser on Nov. 8 after friends from his band reported him missing, said ASO spokesman Steve Maynard.

The silver alert program, which was signed by Gov. Charlie Crist in October, broadcasts information to find missing elderly people who may be in danger.

Maynard said an alert for Reiser was displayed on Department of Transportation message boards statewide for the week he was missing.

Detectives tracked Reiser's cell phone to the Jacksonville area, where they found what appeared to be his unoccupied van in a parking lot at the airport Thursday, Maynard said.

ASO detective Sheryl Strickland,

along with officers from the airport and the Florida Attorney General's Office, approached the van at about 10 a.m. and saw a sleeping man who appeared to be Reiser through the tinted windows.

Strickland knocked on the window and woke him up, and Reiser spoke to her through the window but appeared confused and disoriented, Maynard said.

State News He then reached over in the van and pointed a handgun at Strickland, Maynard said.

"She yelled, 'Gun! Gun!' and everyone took cover behind the cars," Maynard said.

Officials heard a single gunshot. Because they were unsure of the target, they waited until Jacksonville Sheriff's Office officials arrived with a bullet-proof shield to approach the van.

They found Reiser dead from a self-inflicted bullet wound to the head, Maynard said.

Maynard said Reiser had a history of blacking out for days at a time and not knowing who he was.

Harvin, Gators dominate ground game with 367 rushing yards

on the other hand, this was just another blowout in what's become a common theme as Atlanta and a matchup with Alabama creeps closer.

While the Crimson Tide remains undefeated at 11-0, they haven't been blowing out opponents the way the Gators have. Mississippi State kept it close with Alabama for most of the game until the Crimson Tide came out with a 32-7 win. The week before, Alabama only took down LSU by 6, 27-21.

UF's players sprint out of

the tunnel hyped, and they stay hyped. The Gators have outscored their last six opponents — all SEC teams — 101-0 in the first quarter.

"In the locker room before the game, we get so much balled-up energy," sophomore cornerback Joe Haden said. "It doesn't matter who we play. We've got a plan."

Percy Harvin must've been a big part of that plan. The junior do-it-all speedster finished with 173 total yards, 167 of which were rushing, and two touchdowns.

Junior middle linebacker Brandon Spikes said "you can't" cover Harvin, and sophomore strong safety Ahmad Black said it

is "impossible" to cover him.

In what was a near video game-like play, Harvin took the ball twice on the same counter run and had two touchdowns of 26 and 80 yards. He touched the ball just nine times.

Spurrier said.

The scary part for opponents is that it's not just Harvin.

The Gators finished with 367

yards on the ground and had six different receivers catch passes. The last time they rushed for 300 yards against an SEC Team was Oct. 12, 1996, against LSU.

"Our numbers have been outrageous," Harvin said.

That's true on offense and defense. The Gators picked off Gamecocks quarterbacks three times and held them to just 173 yards of offense. It was South Carolina's worst loss since it fell to UF 63-7 in 1995 with, you guessed it, Spurrier as the coach.

Since their 31-30 loss against Mississippi on Sept. 27, the Gators haven't won by fewer than 28.

"I probably didn't envision winning by this much," said quarterback Tim Tebow, who had three total touchdowns. "But the effort and enthusiasm, absolutely (I expected)."

The Gators are potentially four games away from their second national championship in three years.

"That was the best defense I have ever played against," South Carolina quarterback Chris Smelley said.

That's not something Gators fans have heard in a long time. It's not something Alabama wants to hear, either.





Hicks leads defense to two interceptions in blowout

UF linebacker Brandon Hicks had one start this season coming into Saturday's game against South Carolina.

He made his second one count.

Beginning the game at weakside linebacker in place of A.J. Jones (sprained PCL in his knee), Hicks was key on UF's two first-quarter interceptions and a catalyst for the No. 3 Gators' 56-6 win over No. 24 South Carolina.

For starters, Hicks applied pressure to South Carolina quarterback Chris Smelley and forced him to float a pass that linebacker Brandon Spikes returned for the Gators' first touchdown.

"He was trying to throw it off his back foot, trying to run away from the rush," Hicks said. "I was just hoping in my head, I was like, 'I know somebody's there.'"

Two South Carolina plays later, Hicks leaped up at the line, batting a Smelley pass into the arms of strong safety Ahmad Black and setting up UF's next score.

And that's not all. He sacked Smelley for a loss of 7 yards late in the quarter on the play immediately after his deflection.

Hicks said it was the best day in his career.


UF coach Urban Meyer recognizes the depth of his defense, and said competition in practice for playing time will increase in intensity.

"I got a feeling A.J. Jones is going to practice real hard if he wants to play," Meyer said. "You want to play on this team right now. There are guys fighting."

The Gators defense and special teams stymied the Gamecocks throughout the game.

No matter what South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier threw at UF, the Gators were up to the challenge.

Gators go on to Round of 16

With time winding down, the Gators made one final attempt to take a lead into the half.

Lindsay Thompson received the ball from Angela Napolitano with under 10 seconds left. She calmly turned and fired the ball past Central Florida goalie Aline Reis with only four seconds to go, scoring the latest goal in a half in UF history.

"When it came to me, I was just thinking, 'Hurry up, hurry up, just get it in,'" Thompson said.

When the Gators took the field in the second period, the momentum was behind them. They continued to put pressure on the Golden Knights en route to a 2-0 win to advance to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament and redeem their 1-0 loss to UCF earlier this season.

Despite dominating most of the match against UCF on Aug. 29 — the Gators outshot

the Knights 17 to 6 and 8 to 2 in shots on goal — No. 2 seed UF couldn't get a goal on Reis.

It was much of the same on Sunday — UF had 20 shots and 7 were on goal to UCF's 7 and 1 — except this time the Gators took advantage of their chances.

Even though Sarah Chapman's apparent goal was taken away because of an offside call, the Gators felt confident they would take advantage of similar opportunities later. Forward Ameerah Abdullah said they knew if they were in the right spots, they would be able to beat Reis on crosses.

UCF coach Amanda Cromwell made one last attempt with 17 minutes remaining in the match to score an equalizer by subbing in five players to prepare a switch in formations.

Before the transition was complete, Megan Kerns capitalized on her own rebound to give

Gators overcome lack of experience, inside play

It was a baptism by fire, and the Gators nearly got burned.

Often outmuscled and almost outmatched, No. 19 UF (2-0) scrapped its way to an 81-58 win against Bradley (1-1) on Sunday at the O'Connell Center during the second round of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic.

The veteran team out of the Missouri Valley Conference came to Gainesville unafraid.

The Braves, who started four upperclassmen, pushed around the less-experienced Gators for most of the afternoon in a game that played out much closer than the final score indicates.

"We're going to see (older teams) during the season," UF guard Nick Calathes said. "That's the SEC Tournament and, if we make the NCAA Tournament, that's the NCAA Tournament, too. So, we better get used to it."

Seven-foot Bradley center David Collins had his way with Alex Tyus in the first half until foul trouble forced Collins to the bench.

"We would have liked to do more inside and around the basket," UF coach Billy Donovan said.

Tyus, who finished with five rebounds, struggled to fight off

Collins and forward Sam Singh on the glass.

UF tried to relieve Tyus with freshmen Allan Chaney and Kenny Kadji, but neither seemed to find a rhythm.

"I got blown by a few times," Chaney said. "Coach got on me about that."

Donovan said a lack of conditioning has limited the minutes the tandem has been able to play. The pair only grabbed five rebounds.

"Both of those guys fatigue a little faster than I would like," Donovan said.

Without a strong inside game, the Gators were forced to, once again, live or die by their outside shooting.

For now, that strategy worked. UF took 32 3-point attempts in the game and knocked down 14 of them.

"We won the game today because of the 3-point line," Donovan said.

The Gators' last seven field goals came from behind the arc.

It was the most threes allowed by Bradley since they gave up as

many to Wichita State on March 3, 2003.

Ironically, the Braves have been one of the nation's best 3-point shooting teams over the last two years, making 695 in that span. Only Virginia Military Institute and Houston have made more.

Walter Hodge (5) and Dan Werner (4) tied their career highs from 3-point land.

After missing 94 of his 136 shots from 3-point range last year, Werner seems to have found his stride.


"I was building (brick) houses last year," he joked.

Bradley started the second half on a 10-1 run that cut UF's lead to 43-35. It looked as though the Braves might have shot their way back into the game until point guard Erving Walker started the barrage of threes that would eventually put an end to the Bradley rally with a little more than 10 minutes left in the game.

Chandler Parsons has gotten off to a slow start offensively this season. The sophomore has scored 12 points through the Gators' first two games.

"His shot obviously isn't falling, but his rebounding is a lot more important than that," Calathes said.

Parsons snatched a career-high 10 rebounds against the Braves.

UF looks to rebound after loss

The UF women's basketball team's season opener on Friday night didn't go as well as the team had hoped, thanks to a feisty underdog.

The Gators' road trip to Florida Gulf Coast proved to be no snoozer, and the Eagles escaped with an 88-86 victory, avenging their two defeats to UF last year.

"It's very obvious how prepared they were, how emotionally up they were for this game," UF coach Amanda Butler said. "We knew we were going to be tested, a lot of adverse conditions."

UF stormed back after being down 13 with about 11 minutes left in the second half to take a 76-74 lead with about six minutes remaining.

The two teams went back and forth from there with six lead changes.

Florida Gulf Coast regained the lead 85-84 with about 35 seconds to go and held on for the win.

The Gators missed two key layups in the final minute and a half that would have put them on top.

"We got the looks that we wanted there those last few possessions. We just didn't put them in the hole," Butler said. "You can't choke it down when you've got that opportunity to put the ball into the hole."

Butler was disappointed with her team's defense throughout the game. The Gators allowed the Eagles to shoot 50 percent from the field and 57 percent from behind the arc, a recipe for disaster.

"We obviously still have a lot of work to do," Butler said.

The Gators will have to try and rebound from their first loss tonight at 7 in the O'Connell Center when they host Jacksonville, and if last year is any indication, it won't be easy. The Dolphins defeated UF last season in Jacksonville, 75-64.

"Another excellent team. Our state, I think, is very talented this year," Butler said. "We went to Jacksonville and lost last year."

"We've got to bounce back and get ourselves ready to defend our home court."

There were a few bright spots for UF on Friday.

Jennifer Mossor scored a career-high 22 points in the loss.

"It was great to see her feeling it, especially hitting a few big threes for us and making plays down the stretch in the second half that gave us a chance to win," Butler said.

Marshae Dotson had 22 points, and Sharielle Smith fell just short of a double-double with 16 points and nine rebounds.

It was somewhat of a homecoming for junior guard Steffi Sorensen, who began her career at Florida Golf Coast. She added 9 points and fouled out in her first regular season game as a Gator.

Despite some good offensive performances, Butler knows her team will have to tighten up defensively.

"In crucial moments we had some breakdowns," Butler said. "And when you're playing against a good team on their home court, you lose."

Calathes cleared in poker investigation

A UF athletic department investigation into alleged student-athlete gambling revealed that UF guard Nick Calathes reportedly ran up a \$600 online poker debt.

The NCAA does not prohibit athletes from playing online poker, and Calathes has been cleared of any wrongdoing.

"We became aware of certain allegations over the weekend and immediately looked into it," UF Athletics Director Jeremy Foley said in a statement Friday.

"We reviewed everything very thoroughly and are satisfied with our results. We have no eligibility issues and are very comfortable that this issue is resolved based on our review."

UF coach Billy Donovan said he is comfortable with how the situation was resolved.

"We heard the rumors, and we reacted to the rumors,

responded to them, talked to Nick, talked to the team ... handled the whole situation," he said. "To me, it's not even a story. There's no story. Nobody did anything wrong."

Betting on sports is an NCAA violation that results in a one-year suspension from play.

Calathes did not bet on sports and is not under any further investigation.

"I talked to coach Donovan, I talked to the school, and nothing happened," said Calathes, who did admit he plays online poker. "I didn't do anything wrong. I didn't do anything illegal."

Former UF guard Teddy Dupay was kicked off the team in September 2001 following a six-month gambling investigation by law enforcement. Dupay admitted he violated NCAA rules by betting on sporting events.

Calathes scored 13 points in UF's win against Bradley on Sunday.

We all knew that Tim Tebow, Percy Harvin and the rest of UF's offense would rank as one of the nation's best units, but the defense and special teams are clicking at an elite level, too.

Coach Urban Meyer isn't ready to call the Gators better than the 2006 team, but take it from South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier, whose Gamecocks came within a few fingers of taking UF down two seasons ago.

"This team is a lot better than the one two years ago," Spurrier said. "I said they had a chance because they won all of the close ones two years ago. This team they have now is a lot stronger than that one, in my opinion."

He's absolutely right. The Gators are scoring 14.4 more points per game and giving up 2.2 less, and this week they

became the first squad in SEC history to win six straight league games by 28 points or more, including a 101-0 margin in the first quarter. This offense is better than the one led by Chris Leak, but the defense is improved too.

The line may not be good as the one led by Jarvis Moss and Ray McDonald, but the linebackers and secondary are playing as well as anyone could ask for.

There's no Reggie Nelson locking things down at safety — although Will Hill looked an awful lot like The Eraser with his interception Saturday — but the unit still has 17 picks and five touchdowns.

The only thing keeping Meyer from acknowledging this team as his best is the 2006 Gators' win against Ohio State for the national championship. But even he knows that if UF keeps up its current level of play, he'll have to change his stance on Jan. 8 in Miami.
