Early voting in city elections begins today

As Gainesville voters begin to head for the polls for city elections, political activists vie to get in the last word.

Early voting begins today and will run through Saturday. Ballots may be cast at the County Administration Building, 12 S.E. First St., from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day. On election day, March 24, voters will report to their precinct's polling place.

"We're just making sure we get that final push before the vote," said Eric Conrad, a spokesman for Equality is Gainesville's Business, an anti-Amendment 1 organization.

The amendment would nullify Chapter 8 of the Gainesville Code of Ordinances, titled "Discrimination." Instead, protections would be provided by the Florida Civil Rights Act at the state level.

In effect, this would remove protected status for transgender, lesbian, gay and bisexual

Gainesville residents and loosen protections for other classes.

On Saturday, about 50 people gathered at the Pride Community Center on Northwest 13th Street to prepare people to discuss Amendment 1 with voters. Vol-

unteers watched as group leaders demonstrated how to canvass.

The group then split up to knock on the doors of Gainesville voters. Volunteers have done this during several previous weekends, but this was definitely the largest group so far, according to Conrad.

The anti-amendment group will also offer free van rides to student voters from the Reitz Union to the County Administration Building this week, an effort similar to those orchestrated dur-

ing the November elections.

Citizens for Good Public Policy, the pro-amendment group, is busy approaching voters as well.

"We are doing all the traditional campaign get-out-the-vote activities, which include radio, TV, and print media," wrote Jim Gilbert, a Citizens spokesman, in an e-mail.

"In addition we have volunteers on the ground walking neighborhoods and holding 'YES on 1' signs at key locations," he said.

GFR officials yet to find cause of fire

The cause of a fire that claimed local nonprofit Peaceful Paths' headquarters and part of a physician's office will remain undetermined barring any significant developments, officials said.

 Gainesville Fire Rescue investigators have exhausted all available resources in determining how the building, which served victims of domestic violence, caught fire, according to a GFR press release.

Investigators were able to determine that the fire started in the training room of the Peaceful Paths building, but the extent of the damage prevented any further insight.

"Unfortunately, there are times when we are unable to determine a cause, which can be very frustrating to both the victims and our personnel," said Tim Hayes, deputy fire chief, according to the release.

Peaceful Paths has continued to provide services while relocating to a temporary office space and has experienced significant community support in its time of need, according to the Peaceful Paths Web site.

'Accidental antiquesman' describes work, collection

John Sikorski is an accidental antiquesman.

Sikorski, an Ocala antiques appraiser who hosts a weekly radio show called "Sikorski's Attic" on WUFT, said that though he has been interested in antiques all his life, he "fell" into the business about 30 years ago.

"It was literally an accident," he said. "I never set out to be in this business."

Sikorski said it all started when his wife started studying engineering at UF. He was returning to Ocala from Gainesville after a prom-

ising second job interview with Blue Cross and Blue Shield when he made a stop.

"Up on I-75, there was this big, red antique store," he said. "I had some spare time, so I decided to just stop in and see what was there."

The store's owner was there, and he and Sikorski talked about his experience.

"We got to talking, and I told him about the job. He said, 'Well, it'd be better if you'd come to work for me here,'" he said. "So he hired me on the spot."

The store was Wayside Antiques, and Sikorski worked there for about 10 years, during which time he picked up valuable experi-

ence, he said.

Sikorski then opened his own antique shop, which he ran until he opened his appraisal office about 10 years ago.

He decided to begin appraising after he realized that the buying and selling of antiques wasn't as lucrative as it once was.

"Along came the Internet, and you no longer needed to have a re-

tail store," he said. "But there are a lot of people out there who have things but have no way of finding out what they're worth."

In addition to "Sikorski's Attic" and his downtown appraisal office, a tangled mix of eclectic findings and books from which he studies to stay up-to-date on the business, he writes question-and-answer columns for the Gainesville Sun, the Ocala Star-Banner and the Citrus County Chronicle.

Sikorski also provides a walk-through service for people who want many items in their houses appraised.

"It's a conversation about things in their homes with regard to collector interest and dollar val-

ues," he said, adding that he also offers advice on how best to sell antiques.

Despite having traveled the world collecting and studying antiques, Sikorski said he never loses interest because of the variety of items he comes across.

So far, Sikorski said, the most interesting item he has come across is a footlong hardened walrus penis, called an usik, which sits in a glass case in his office. Smiling impishly, he held out the item for examination before explaining its significance.

"From one minute to the next, you never know what's going to come in. It's always different," he said. "I love it all."

Discovery launches mission to give space station 'wings'

■ THE LAUNCH WAS DELAYED FOR MORE THAN A MONTH.

CAPE CANAVERAL—Space shuttle Discovery and its crew of seven rocketed into orbit Sunday evening, setting off on a space station construction mission cut short by launch delays that dragged on for more than a month.

Discovery rose from its seaside pad just as

the sun was setting, a spectacular sight for a space agency anxious to get the flight going. As the shuttle sped away like a brilliant star, part of the launch plume glowed pink, peach and golden. The shuttle was visible for several minutes.

A hydrogen leak prevented Discovery from lifting off Wednesday and, before that, hydrogen valves kept the shuttle grounded for weeks in February. Launch pad repairs took care of the leak, and the astronauts were able to board their spaceship and lift off.

"Well, you had a little bit of a wait, but that will just make the payoff that much sweeter," launch director Mike Leinbach told the astronauts.

State News

Commander Lee Archambault and his crew, which includes two former schoolteachers, should reach the international space station Tuesday.

"Thanks for the work, Mike. We'll see you in a couple weeks. Take care and let's go ahead and fire up the sound of freedom," Ar-

chambault said.

They're delivering one last set of solar wings for the space station and some critical equipment for a relatively new water-recycling system.

No one was more eager to see Discovery take off than the three space station astronauts. Commander Mike Fincke was ecstatic when informed nothing was leaking at the pad.

"That is most excellent news," Fincke told Mission Control. "That's exactly what's been on top of our minds."

Study suggests that doodling may aid in retention

If Deborah Kenner has paper in front of her, she's probably doodling.

While in class, the UF sophomore draws her name, flowers and squiggly designs while listening to lectures.

"I always pay attention," Kenner said.

Now she has evidence. According to a recent study from the University of Plymouth in England, doodling can aid concentration and may prove beneficial in remembering information.

The study, published in late February, consisted of two groups of 20 people — one in-

structed to doodle, one not — who listened to a mock telephone message. Participants in the doodle group recalled 29 percent more than the participants in the non-doodle group.

Kenner said she was not surprised.

"I've gone through stages when I've tried not to doodle, but it really just helps me pay attention more," she said.

Kenneth Heilman, a clinical professor of neurology and health psychology at UF, feels the same way.

"I'm a big doodler," Heilman said. "If I don't doodle, I fall asleep. Doodling keeps me alert and awake."

Glen Finney, an assistant professor in UF's department of neurology, doodles mazes and paisley-like patterns when listening to lectures. Doodling allows people to back away from strong thoughts and relax, allowing weaker brain connections to be activated, he said.

"That's a way to find new ideas and not get locked into old ideas," he said.

An example is when a student takes a test. Finney said when an answer keeps popping

into a student's head, but he know it's wrong, he needs to relax and allow other brain connections to activate in order to think of other possible answers.

"Doodling allows you to sort of be weakly aroused," Finney said, "but it's not so detaining that you're highly aroused."

Although he said some people use doodling to keep themselves active and paying attention, others might use doodling as an outlet for their creative urges.

Kenner said she occasionally doodles out of boredom, but it's on a whole different level.

"Those are more drawings than doodling," she said. "I take out a whole piece of paper and stop paying attention."

Fed predicts end to recession if stimulus plan succeeds

WASHINGTON — America's recession "probably" will end this year if the government succeeds in bolstering the banking system, Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernan-

ke said Sunday in a rare television interview.

In carefully hedged remarks in a taped interview with CBS' "60 Minutes," Bernanke seemed to express a bit more optimism that this could be done.

Still, Bernanke stressed — as he did to Congress last month — that the prospects for the recession ending this year and a recovery taking root next year hinge on a

difficult task: getting banks to lend more freely again and getting the financial markets to work more normally.

"We've seen some progress in the financial markets, absolutely," he said. "But until we get that stabi-

lized and working normally, we're not going to see recovery.

"But we do have a plan. We're working on it. And, I do think that we will get it stabilized, and we'll see the recession coming to an end probably this year."



Stewart puts Cramer in rightful place

Online news outlets apparently yanked their thesauruses out from beneath their beds last Thursday, labeling Jon Stewart's interview of CNBC's "Mad Money" host Jim Cramer with headlines such as "Stewart Eviscerates Cramer, CNBC," and "Jon Stewart Thrashes Jim Cramer."

Anyone who watched the interview knows that it wasn't in typical Stewartesque fashion. The host of "The Daily Show" didn't josh around with Cramer; he indignantly crucified him and his network.

Last Thursday Cramer became the regrettable face of everything that's wrong with modern journalism, and worst yet, Stewart epitomized everything that's right.

CNBC, with its programs and pundits that speculate on financial news, doesn't seem to fully appreciate the power it holds in swaying consumer confidence and upholding the idea of Wall Street responsibility. They have championed the senseless idea that money can be instantaneous, or fast, or even mad — elevating the shady 3 a.m. easy-money infomercial to prime-time status and labeling it as American as apple pie.

UF MEN'S BASKETBALL

Gators get NIT berth

For the second straight season, the Gators failed to make the NCAA Tournament.

UF (23-10, 9-7 Southeastern Conference) did make history, though, becoming the first team since Michigan State in 1980 to be left out of the field for two consecutive years after winning a national title.

Any hopes the Gators had of making it to the Big Dance were dashed after Friday's 61-58 loss to Auburn in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament.

UF had an RPI of 51, the 86th-best strength of schedule, one win against a top-50 RPI team (Pacific-10 Conference regular-season champion Washington) and a 2-6 road record in conference games.

"We obviously didn't do enough," forward Dan Werner said following the loss to Auburn. "We could have put ourselves in if we would have won (the SEC) tourna-

ment."

UF coach Billy Donovan said all season that being a year older didn't necessarily make his team a year better.

It turns out he was right.

UF suffered another late-season collapse, losing seven of its last 12 games, and missed several opportunities to lock up an NCAA bid.

The Gators lost eight of their last 11 games last season.

UF has accepted a bid to play in the National Invitation Tournament and will host Jacksonville on Wednesday in the opening round at 8 p.m.

If they win, the Gators will face the winner of No. 4-seed Miami and No. 5-seed Providence.

The Gators are the No. 1 seed in their region and will host the first two rounds of the tournament.

UF is also the first school ever to follow up back-to-back national championships with back-to-back NIT appearances.

No. 18 Arkansas completes weekend sweep of UF

Arkansas pitcher Jarrod McKinney isn't on the soccer team, but he showed some kicking ability Sunday.

With the game tied at 2 in the bottom of the eighth and a runner on third, McKinney struck out on a pitch in the dirt from Patrick Keating (2-3, 3.57 ERA).

On his way to first, he booted the ball away from UF catcher Buddy Munroe, allowing Ben Tschepikow to score from third, carrying the No. 18 Razorbacks to a 4-2 win and completing the sweep of the Gators (9-7, 0-3 Southeastern Conference) in

Arguments from Munroe, Keating and UF coach Kevin O'Sullivan — who was ejected for arguing — proved futile. Home-plate umpire Joe Marion was unwilling to listen to any complaints about McKinney's kicking and did not request help from the other umpires.

"All he had to do was ask for some help, and he may have

gotten the call right," UF assistant coach Brad Weitzel said. "But the runner that scored we walked to lead off the inning, so we got to go back to that point first instead of blaming it on the umpire."

The Gators got an outstanding start from freshman lefty Nick Maronde, who struck out five and allowed just 1 earned run over five innings.

But the team could not give Maronde much run support or defensive help.

The defense committed six errors, including two each by third baseman Mike Mooney and Munroe, who didn't enter the game until the eighth.

Heartbreak in team locker room represents season-long struggles

TAMPA

The room reeked of heartbreak.

As you might imagine, the St. Pete Times Forum locker room that housed the UF men's basketball team fresh off its crushing 61-58 defeat at the hands of Auburn on Friday night was not very welcoming.

It felt like a child asking his parents why they were splitting up.

There are many small reasons — a last-second loss to Auburn being the final straw — but it is never as simple as one of these.

There is always a bigger picture.

The snapshot of the Gators locker room looked something like this:

On your left sits Walter Hodge, the senior who just watched his last shot at getting

back to the NCAA Tournament fail. Next to him is Nick Calathes, the Gators' best player, who flamed out down the stretch.

Panning to the right brings Dan Werner and Alex Tyus into focus, two "big" men who each played out of position yet gave their all. Then finally, directly to your right, is the inconsolable man, Erving Walker.

Hodge may feel like he failed this team and his coach. The lone holdover from the back-to-back national championship teams, he was the veteran who linked those glory years with the rebuilding ones.

But the man who has won more than anyone else in UF men's basketball history couldn't turn his teammates into similar

winners.

The Gators lost 10 games this season, and only one of those was by double digits (79-63 at Tennessee on Jan. 31). Eight of them were decided by 6 points or fewer.

"They need to learn how to win," coach Billy Donovan said of his team. "Just because you're a year older doesn't mean you're a year better."

As soon as Calathes confidently stated he thought his team would make the Tour-

Wilks leads UF men to second place in NCAA Indoors

Lately for Terrell Wilks, another week means another school record.

After notching an automatic-qualifying time in the Virginia Tech Qualifier on March 7, Wilks continued his record-breaking performances in last weekend's NCAA Indoor Championships in College Station, Texas.

Wilks ran a 6.59 in the preliminaries of the 60-meter dash and finished third in the finals

of the event.

Wilks' school-record-setting performance in Texas helped UF's men to their best NCAA Indoors finish since 2005.

UF's men finished as runners-up with 36 points behind NCAA-champion Oregon, which had 54 points. The women's team finished the Indoor Championships tied for 12th place.

Wilks' 60-meter time was his new personal best and UF's new record for the event.

"While we are pleased with being second in the country, we are not satisfied," UF coach Mike Holloway said. "There's still work to do, and we still have the ability to get better. But we are very pleased with what's going on, and

everybody is excited about getting outdoors and trying to get better."

Despite coming up one place short, UF's track and field program is moving in a positive direction, much to Holloway's pleasure.

"I don't think there's anybody in the program that wanted to be second, but second's better than third, and a lot of teams are aspiring to be second, so the program is definitely moving in the right direction," Holloway said.

Wilks' recent performances are a direct result of his hard work and may come as a

surprise to some because of his late start in the sport.

He was a football and basketball player before adding track to his resume as a high school senior.

Subsequently, Wilks has had to put in extra work to hone his track skills.

"He's still learning the intricacies of running the sprints, and as he learns more, he catches on to things. He's just gonna get better and better," Holloway said. "What people are seeing in the last couple weeks is just Terrell starting to really understand what it takes to be a good sprinter, and he now has the three fastest times ever run by a Gator in the 60, so we're pretty excited about that."

Before last season, Donovan had not coached in the NIT since 1998.

"We're grateful for the opportunity to continue our season at the NIT," Donovan said in a statement. "We're looking forward to the opportunity to continue to practice and grow

as a team."

UF made it to Madison Square Garden and the NIT semifinals in New York last season before losing to Massachusetts.

The NCAA selection committee was not kind to the SEC this year. Only three teams from the conference made the tournament, the fewest since 1990.

Tennessee, a No. 9 seed, will face No. 8 seed

Oklahoma State. LSU, a No. 8 seed, will face No. 9-seed Butler. Mississippi State, which earned an automatic bid by winning the SEC Tournament on Sunday afternoon against Tennessee, earned a No. 13 seed and will face No. 4-seed Washington.

Auburn looked like it might have played its way into the field after winning nine of its last 11 games and knocking off UF in the con-

ference tournament. But the Tigers failed to land a spot in the Big Dance as well.

In a teleconference earlier this month, SEC Commissioner Mike Slive said he didn't think a conference's RPI would be a determining factor when deciding which schools would receive at-large bids, but the SEC ranks sixth overall in Conference RPI and last among the major conferences.

"Maronde pitched out of some jams and pitched through some poor defense," Weitzel said. "This is a beautiful field. There is no way you can make six errors on a beautiful field like this."

Maronde's quality outing was the first UF got from a starter this weekend.

Billy Bullock (0-1, 1.84 ERA) made his first start of the sea-

son Friday and lasted only 3 1/3 innings before being yanked. He gave up 6 runs, including 4 unearned because of an error he made on a suicide squeeze attempt, and the Gators dropped the opening game 11-4.

Saturday's starter, Alex Panteliodis (2-2, 6.50 ERA), couldn't even make it out of the second inning before being relieved because of the 5 runs he allowed in the Gators' 8-4 loss.

UF's bats couldn't get much going, either. Entering Sunday's game, the Gators were near the bottom of

every offensive category in the SEC.

Outfielders Avery Barnes and Riley Cooper were the only UF players to record at least one hit in each game this weekend.

They provided the Gators with a little bit of power, each smacking a solo home run in the series — Cooper on Friday and Barnes on Sunday.

After a great opening weekend against then-No. 23 Louisville, UF has now dropped six straight against ranked opponents — Miami is currently No. 13 and Arkansas is No. 18.

starter who played 33 minutes.

He scored 34 points combined in UF's final four games. He had previously racked up 33 points at Kentucky on Feb. 10.

Give him credit for not making any excuses. Teams started guarding UF differently on the pick-and-roll, Calathes' bread and butter, and fatigue likely set in for the

guy like that."

Then again, it may have been Calathes' own will that effectively stopped him. Fierce competitors hate to lose. When they fall behind or perform poorly, they push themselves harder in an attempt to will the outcome in their favor.

There is a downside to this, though, and his recent slump shows you can't always "try"

your way out of a hole.

Women await tourney bid

The Gators won't be sweating it out tonight.

On this Selection Monday, the UF women's basketball team will not be worried about bubble talk and being left out of March Madness like it was last season.

The No. 21 Gators (23-7, 9-5 Southeastern Conference) are a lock to make this year's NCAA Tournament.

So when the brackets are revealed tonight at 7 on ESPN, UF will be more concerned about who, when and where it will be playing in the first round later this week.

The Gators, once projected as high as a No. 3 seed by ESPN.com's Charlie Creme, have lost some ground over the last four weeks.

Creme has them as a No. 7 seed in his latest version of Bracketology, his daily predictions of the field of 64.

UF fell a few spots when they dropped five of their last six games, including a quarterfinal loss to the Tennessee in the SEC Tournament on March 6.

Though UF appears to be slumping at the worst possible time, it showed glimpses of its early season brilliance in the second half against Tennessee.

After trailing by 17 at the break, the

Gators rallied to within 3 points with less than three minutes remaining.

Despite winning the second half 46-33, the Gators eventually fell 71-67 to the Volunteers.

UF coach Amanda Butler, however, was proud of her team's second-half effort.

"If that Florida team shows up (in the NCAA Tournament), then we're not just in position to beat a great team like Tennessee, but we whipped them in the second half," Butler said.

"We whipped them in the second half like they whipped us in the first half."

Butler added that even though the Gators came up short in their conference tournament, she saw the trouble her team could cause in the NCAA Tournament if it plays an entire game the way it did in the second half against the Volunteers.

"As disappointing as this is to be leaving here with a loss right now, I also think that there's a lot to build on going into the postseason," Butler said after the loss.

If the Gators get the No. 7 seed as Creme projects, they will face a No. 10 seed in the first round and would have a potential second-round matchup with a No. 2 seed.

Nelson throws no-hitter

Stacey Nelson has seemingly done it all in her four years at UF. Sunday, she accomplished something even she previously thought impossible.

Nelson threw her first career no-hitter in No. 1 UF's 4-0 win at Mississippi on Sunday. The senior pitched two complete-game shutouts and led the Gators (27-2, 8-0 Southeastern Conference) to a weekend sweep of the Rebels (11-12, 0-6 SEC) in Oxford, Miss.

Despite a pitcher's usual practice of not focusing on or talking about a potential no-hitter, Nelson admitted her mind kept wandering back to the idea of her first career no-hitter.

"I didn't believe it until that last out," she said. "I always had a joke that no-hitters just weren't my thing."

Nelson (14-2, 0.40 ERA) also made her way into the NCAA record books by improving her career record to 109-33, tied for 25th on the NCAA all-time wins list with Jennie Finch, who won 109 games for Arizona.

Ali Gardiner hit an RBI double to center in the first inning to start the scoring for the Gators on Sunday. Shortstop Megan Bush added to the lead in the fourth with her seventh home run of the season. Later that

inning, second baseman Aja Paculba knocked in the final run of the game with a double down the left-field line.

Nelson's first victory of the weekend came in the Gators' 2-0 win in Game 1 of their doubleheader Saturday. UF's ace gave up five hits and struck out 10.

Nelson traded zeros with Mississippi pitcher Becky Nye until the sixth inning, when Gardiner launched a solo home run over the scoreboard in right-center field for the first run of the game.

"Hitting is contagious, so once you get one hit, the next few will come and open up the game," Gardiner said.

"It changed the momentum for sure."

Nelson struck out the side in the bottom of the sixth, and Aja Paculba added an insurance run with a single up the middle that drove in Michelle Moultrie in the seventh inning.

The Gators took that late-game momentum at the plate into Game 2 and put 12 runs on the board.

Sophomore Stephanie Brombacher (13-0, 0.79 ERA) followed up Nelson's performance with a shutout of her own and allowed only four hits while striking out seven batters.
