UF student drowns while studying abroad

The body of UF student Thad Owens, who was swept away while swimming in a river in Namibia, Africa, was found on Saturday.

Owens was in Africa as part of a study abroad program with UF's wildlife ecology and conservation department.

On Thursday, he was swimming in the Kunene River, near the border of Namibia and Angola, when he got caught in the current and went missing, according to news reports.

A search effort was launched with help from the Namibian government, the U.S. Embassy, local villagers and private search teams, said William Dippel, the Owens' family attorney.

His body was found in the river, according

to a statement from UF.

Owens was a 27-year-old wildlife ecology and conservation major, according to news reports.

He began attending UF in the spring of 2007 after transferring from Valencia Community College in Orlando, according to The Gainesville Sun.

The semester-long study abroad program in Namibia was launched last spring, according to UF's Web site.

About 10 students are enrolled, according to the program's Web site.

In addition to working on research projects — with students split into groups looking at birds, reptiles and mammals — students spent

Fifteen spoken-word artists perform at open mic

A poet takes the stage. She is nervous, and her pages tremble in her hand as she reads. She pauses and admits her nerves are getting the best of her. The audience applauds in support.

"You can do it," yells someone from the crowd.

Spoken-word poets, both new and seasoned, performed Friday at "exhale," an open mic night held in Pugh Hall.

About 15 other poets performed, with works discussing identity, politics and family.

"It's my escape. It's my food. It's my air. I breathe poetry," said UF freshman Jazmine Davis.

Local Muslims strive to educate UF community

He sits, then stands, facing Mecca. He kneels, leans his forehead to the carpet, which is green and striped with beige. From time to time, he thumbs through a Quran, the Islamic holy book.

Mohammad Haider spent his Saturday evening at the Islamic Center of Gainesville, mostly in prayer.

After about 20 minutes of solitary worship, he discusses scripture and then sings the evening call to prayer, which is broadcast throughout the building and into the back parking lot by a network of speakers.

"When we pray together, we have to consider the old and the sick, who may not be able to go for a long time," Haider said. "But when we pray alone, we can take as long as we like."

Said to be in his 60s, Haider stands out in a group mostly made up of men under 30, most of whom are connected to UF.

On Friday afternoon, Zubair Zafur, a member of UF's

Man arrested Friday after being accused of beating girlfriend, trapping her in apartment

A Gainesville man was arrested Friday after he was accused of beating his girlfriend and trapping her in their apartment.

Albert Andrews, 28, got into a verbal fight with his girlfriend after she tried giving her daughter a piece of candy.

According to the Gainesville Police Department arrest report, the fight escalated into Andrews throwing two televisions. Andrews then pushed the woman through a glass window, shattering it and slicing a one-inch-deep cut

into her right arm. The three times she tried to call the police, Andrews took the phones away from her and broke them. Andrews then trapped her in a room by putting a bed in front of the door. After her arm bled for 30 minutes, the woman escaped to her neighbor's house and called the police, according to the report.

Andrews was charged with three felonies including aggravated battery and false imprisonment.

About 7,000 lose power

A fault in underground distribution lines caused power loss for about 7,000 residences and businesses in the area surrounding the intersection of East University Avenue and Waldo Road Friday, according to Gainesville Regional Utilities spokesman Dan Clark. Clark said faults on underground lines are rare because compared to above-ground lines, they are safer from storms and trees bumping into them.

The outage occurred between about 2 p.m. and 3 p.m.

"If we could schedule the outages," Clark said, "that would be a perfect time to do it."

He said that it didn't cost the company extra money to fix the fault because people were already on the clock.

Mher Kalifa, manager of Food Max on East University Avenue, said the power was out for more than an hour and estimated the store's loss at \$200 to 500.

"That's our busy time," she said. "We lost a lot of business."

The Walgreens on East University Avenue lost power for about 45 minutes, but manager Karl said the store did not suffer a significant loss.

"Fortunately with a company like Walgreens, there's a store within 2 miles in every direction, basically," he said.

NASA to announce module name on Colbert show

NEW YORK (AP) — Stephen Colbert is still clinging to hope that NASA will name a new room at the international space station after him.

The space agency said Friday it would announce the name of the module Tuesday on Comedy Central's "The Colbert Report." Astronaut Sunita Williams will appear on the program.

The agency held an online contest, letting the public vote on a name for a future addition to the station. "Colbert" beat out NASA's four suggested options: Serenity, Legacy, Earthrise and Venture.

The comedian said in a statement: "I certainly hope NASA does the right thing. Just kidding. I hope they name it after me."

Faithful gather on Easter after deadly twisters

MENA, Ark. (AP) — Easter Sunday prayers were offered for victims of deadly storms that hit western Arkansas and the Southeast last week with signs of damage done by a tornado evident throughout St. Agnes Church.

A stained-glass window gaped open in broken spots and rainwater leaked down the back of a display showing Christ being led to the cross. Even among the bread wafers offered for Holy Communion, a small twig stuck out — a remnant of the tornado

Thursday night that blew through the Catholic parish and the rest of Mena, killing three people, injuring 30 more.

Despite the devastation in the small community, Bishop Anthony Taylor said he had no reservations in proclaiming that "God is good."

"Out of tragedy, really powerful things can occur," Taylor said. "God can use anything for his purposes."

Residents of Rutherford County in central Tennessee were also cleaning up Sunday from Friday's storms, which left two dead, seven hospitalized in critical condition, and more than 40 injured, according to officials.

A fund was set up for the Bryant family in Murfreesboro. Kori Bryant and her 9-week-old daughter, Olivia, were both killed, and husband John was hospitalized with a broken back, officials said.

In Arkansas, an early morning thunderstorm dumped torrents of rain on Mena, an Ouachita Mountain town of about 5,700 people just across the state line with Oklahoma.

The rain soaked electrical linesmen struggling to restore power in Polk County and ran down tarps over damaged roofs, seeping into exposed homes. James Reeves, the county's emergency management coordinator, said the rain left standing water in the county's dispatch center and ruined its remaining equipment.

Islam teaches responsibility

Islam on Campus, prepared for Jum'ah, or weekly service, at the Center. About 100 to 120 people attend Friday prayer at the Center every week. The largest attendance each year is Eid al-Fitr, "the festival of the breaking fast" at the end of Ramadan.

The Center, which is a mosque, is divided in two, one entrance and worship area for women and another for men. This prevents distraction during worship, according to Mohammed Suliman, a UF student who attends the Center.

After removing his sandals, Zafur sat on the carpeted floor of the worship area facing the khateeb, who gives the sermon, along with about 40 other men, only two of whom were seated in chairs.

The role of khateeb is usually filled by an imam, a Muslim religious leader, but in Gainesville khateeb is often respected Muslims with no official title. It is difficult to keep an imam because the student population cycles through every four years, Zafur said.

In Friday's sermon, the khateeb spoke about the Islamic concept of personal responsibility and how it differs from the Christian viewpoint.

A core concept of Islam, some say the most important, is the "oneness of God," or Allah in Arabic. To Muslims, Jesus was a prophet, but not divine, as taught in Christianity.

"No prophet is responsible for our deeds," the khateeb said, while standing behind a lectern bearing the Quran's first two pages in Arabic calligraphy.

In Islam, when a Muslim stands judgment, he or she is directly responsible for all of their deeds, good and bad, he said.

"When reading the Quran repeatedly, the message is 'you are responsible for yourself,'" he said.

The teaching of personal accountability is often paired with personal responsibility. Islam teaches that Muslims

should help those in need, regardless of their faith, said Asad Patwary, who attends the Center.

Following the service, Zafur was taken aside by a Muslim brother and asked for assistance.

Zafur drove the man about eight blocks to Gainesville Lodge on West University and rented him a \$45 room for the night.

"Sometimes I worry about making ends meet," Zafur said. "But every time I'm asked for help I give it, and everything turns out at the end of the month."

Islam teaches that those who are generous are rewarded both in this life and the next, he said.

Patwary had advice for people interested in learning more about Islam and Muslims.


"Just come yourself and question with the curiosity you have," he said. "Just have respect for the place and have an open mind."

About 90 students will learn basic life-saving techniques today at UF's Gator Saver Day,

hosted by the UF's Student Health Care Center and Student Government.

Two one-hour sessions will be held between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. at Yon Hall in the east side of Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

Kelee Patterson, an intern at the center, said students will not become CPR certified because of time and cost restrictions, but they will receive an instructional DVD and practice mannequin.

Patterson said CPR is a valuable skill because the six to 10 minutes in which an ambulance will arrive is all the time it takes for those in cardiac arrest to die.

On Campus

SG gave funding to help purchase the \$35 training kits each student will use during the event.

Patterson said online registration is closed for today's free event, but to nab last-minute

spots, students can call the CPR & Safety Training Center at 352-392-1161, ext. 4283.

While today's training is reserved for interested students, the second session on April 25 is open to the entire Gainesville community.

Registration is available at the Web site uf-gatorsaver.weebly.com. Patterson said the second event will take place at Kanapaha Middle School on Tower Road between 9 a.m. and noon and will cost \$10.

"The family has requested that in lieu of



Wake-up Call

Death of MLB pitcher displays fragility of life

An inherent struggle exists when sitting down to memorialize the life of a semi-famous individual – especially in the wake of tragedy.

The crucial question, constantly resurfacing, begs to ask why the media fails to call attention to the innumerable deaths of 22-year-olds who are called home far too soon, unless he or she is a celebrity. With the death of Anaheim Angels rookie pitcher Nick Adenhardt last Wednesday evening came a litany of eulogies and columns expressing sorrow and sympathy for all those who knew the young man. The Editorial Board struggled mightily in deciding whether adding our own commentary was even necessary – leading us to wonder if we would ever hypothetically write about an untimely death of a UF student occurring during the semester.

The story of Nick Adenhardt the baseball player didn't take the familiar path to success as a result of his immense god-given abilities, but rather thanks to a strong sense of resiliency. Dealt the unfortunate hand of Tommy John surgery to his elbow just prior to the draft, the Angels took a risk on the 2004 High School Player of The Year as he faced a long uphill battle in recovery. Due to his feverish work ethic to rehabilitate his arm, Adenhardt earned a call-up to the majors last season – making him the youngest pitcher in the league at the time.

What makes Adenhardt special is not simply the fact that he was a promising pitcher in Major League Baseball, but rather an individual who exhibited true greatness off the baseball diamond. Not to say the numerous everyday men and women who succumb to an early death every single day are not worthy of our ink, but much can be learned from Adenhardt's life. The death of someone as remarkable and so full of promise as Adenhardt leaves even the most apathetic baseball fan begging to question his or her own faith in humankind.

A mere hours before meeting his untimely demise, Adenhardt pitched the game of his life – a performance that he expected and as a result, invited his father to attend. Thanks to six innings of no-run baseball, the young rookie from Maryland showed his teammates why he deserved a rotation spot on one of the best teams in baseball. While Adenhardt was not the winning pitcher on Wednesday evening, his ever-so-brief touch with greatness foreshadowed a brilliant career marked with the awards and accolades fit for an ace.

And then it was gone.

Beyond all the respectful remarks made about Adenhardt's life and career came the raw emotion and genuine love out of the mouth of fellow teammate Dustin Moseley. Through his tears and quivering voice, Moseley paid sincere homage to his friend – a heartfelt press conference shedding light on the impact Adenhardt had made on his life. Moseley pointed out both fans and players alike were drawn to Adenhardt, not just because of outstanding skills as a baseball player but because he was such a remarkable person.

Simply put, the effects felt by the Angels pitching staff will surely be seen over the course of the season, but the loss of a budding leader in the clubhouse will linger on.

An unfortunate perception of immortality and exclusion from the troubles that plague everyday folk continues to exist within the realm of professional sports. Such an ideology is fostered not only by the behavior of athletes themselves, but also through fans whose isolated view of stars perpetuates a notion of invincibility. If there is but one good thing to come from the tragic death of Nick Adenhardt, we sincerely hope all professional athletes learn to realize they do not reside within a bubble.

While the Angels lost a teammate who showed great promise on the pitching mound, the world said goodbye to a man who brought joy and happiness to all those fortunate enough to have known him.





Freshman Chaney to transfer

It was a short stay in Gainesville for Allan Chaney.

UF coach Billy Donovan released a statement on Friday announcing the freshman forward's decision to transfer from UF.

"Allan, his family and I have spoken, and we have mutually decided that he will be transferring from the University of Florida," Donovan said in the state-

ment. "I've enjoyed coaching Allan, and I would like to help he and his family in any way possible to ensure the best path for his future."

Chaney played sparingly during the first half of the season and missed most of the second half with ankle and heel injuries as well as a sprained ligament in his foot. His absence hurt an already-depleted UF frontcourt.

The 6-foot-8, 231-pound forward was held out of the last two games of the National Invitation

Tournament and finished the year under suspension for violating team rules.

Chaney averaged 3 points and two rebounds per game this season in 23 appearances for the Gators.

In his first college start, Chaney scored a career-high 13 points in UF's 86-84 win against Washington in the consolation game of the CBE Classic in Kansas City, Mo., in November.

Chaney was rated a four-star recruit by Rivals.com when he came out of high school in New London, Conn. He has yet to announce where he will transfer.

UF had been facing a scholarship crunch for next season, but with the departure of Chaney and incoming freshman center DeShawn Painter's recent release from his letter of intent, the Gators are now one under their NCAA-allotted 13 scholarships.

This marks the fifth time in four years that a UF player has transferred.

After the 2005-06 season, then-freshman guard David Huertas transferred to Southeastern Conference-rival Mississippi with a national championship under his belt.

After the 2006-07 national title, then-freshman Brandon Powell parted ways with the Gators and moved to Marshall.

When last season came to a close, then-sophomore forward Jonathan Mitchell left UF to play at Rutgers.

Sophomore point guard Jai Lucas also left the Gators for Texas before the first regular-season game of this season.

Watkins becomes 10th '10 commit

The Gators picked up their 10th oral commitment of the 2010 recruiting class Friday, adding to the quick start the team has already made toward building next year's class.

Jaylen Watkins, an athlete from Cape Coral High, committed while at a UF spring football practice. Watkins was impressed by UF on many levels — namely the team's recent on-field success and the school's academic opportunities — but the coaches impressed him most.

"When I went there, the coaches were real. It didn't feel like they were recruiting," Watkins said.

Offensive coordinator Steve Addazio was in charge of Watkins' recruitment.

Watkins said other schools watched his game tape and called Cape Coral coach Mike Goebbel to say they were offering Watkins scholarships without ever meeting him. Addazio's approach was more personal.

"(Addazio) told me they didn't just recruit any guy, that it was going to be a long process, and it was," Watkins said. "They wanted to have a great relationship before offering."

Watkins has Swiss Army Knife versatility, having lined up at quarterback, wideout, safety, cornerback and kick returner for Cape Coral. He said the Gators are recruiting him at cornerback, making him the team's fifth defensive back commit.

While a lot of recruits visit Gainesville frequently during the team's spring season, Friday was the first time Watkins had been to a Gators practice. He said he wanted to stay in town longer, but his grandfather Sam Watkins, a reverend at Zion Hope Missionary Baptist Church and Cape Coral's team chaplain, wanted to get home to prepare for Easter.

His grandfather also accompanied Watkins on his first trips to The Swamp last year during UF's games against Miami and LSU. They were blown away by the stadium's atmosphere.

"That is one of the craziest places I've ever been to," Watkins said. "My granddad and dad loved it."

Weighing only 172 pounds and running a 4.44-second 40-yard dash, Watkins is cut in the mold of an agile playmaker who jukes around defenders. But a look at Watkins' highlight tape shatters that stereotype. Watkins loves contact. At safety, he lights up opposing receivers. On one kick return, he broke two tackles simultaneously en route to a 90-yard touchdown.

"I don't know how others see me, but around my county I'm known as a physical player," he said.

Watkins chose to end his recruiting process early so he can focus on his senior year at Cape Coral. He hopes his early commitment will keep other coaches — and other distractions — away from his team's practices so he can concentrate on winning the Class 5A state championship.

In last year's playoffs, Cape Coral fell to Venice Beach 35-14. Venice Beach won on the legs of fellow UF commit Trey Burton, who rushed for five touchdowns.

Burton has been in contact with virtually every player targeted by UF in the 2010 recruiting class, including Watkins. The two have developed an on-field rivalry and talk frequently.

"I was actually a silent commit on March 30, but I told Trey about it," Watkins said. "Me and Trey are real cool."

Oral commitments are non-binding until a national letter of intent is signed on National Signing Day on Feb. 3, 2010.

Gators walk all over Tigers, win first series on road

Perhaps the Gators were too patient in waiting until their third conference road matchup to secure a series win, but that virtue proved useful in the batter's box Sunday.

After suffering through difficult losses at Arkansas and Vanderbilt, UF (23-12, 9-6 Southeastern Conference) patiently drew 11 walks in a 5-1 win at Auburn (23-12, 7-8 SEC) to take the weekend series 2-1.

"As you go deeper in the season, you never know which (loss) you are going to look back at and wish you had got it done," UF coach Kevin O'Sullivan said. "Go-

ing on the road this weekend and beating a good Auburn team was big for us."

The Gators capitalized on the Tigers' wild pitching, as three batters who reached base on walks wound up scoring.

The biggest benefactor of the free passes was Mike Mooney, who walked three times in four plate appearances and scored twice.

As UF hitters walked around the bases, the team's pitchers forced Auburn's batters to put the ball in play to get on base. The Gators' two pitchers, Anthony DeSclafani and Alex Panteliodis, didn't give up any walks.

DeSclafani started for the first time in a weekend series and al-

lowed just 1 run over 6 1/3 innings, giving up four hits while striking out six batters. The two freshman hurlers limited Auburn — the SEC home-run leader — by mixing up their pitches and using the inside of the plate.

"They both did a really nice job of commanding the ball in," O'Sullivan said. "It's one thing to just pitch in, but you got to pitch in and locate it. Both guys were able to do it."

The Gators' weekend didn't get off to a good start, though.

They were up 5-1 on Friday

night before the game was suspended because of a tornado warning. It appeared the Gators would cruise to victory when the game resumed Saturday, as they padded their lead to 7-1 heading into the bottom of the sixth. But Auburn bounced back quickly, plating 6 runs over its next four innings to send the game into extra innings. In the 11th, Auburn's Joseph Sanders hit his second homer of the game, ending the 8-7 contest in walk-off fashion.

UF must have been preserving its bats for the second game of the doubleheader. Led by Josh Adams, the Gators' offense exploded with a 24-2 victory. Adams finished the night 5 for 6 with 4 runs, two hom-

ers and six RBIs.

The bats cooled off Sunday. Only four players got hits for the Gators, and Daniel Pigott was the only UF player to finish with a multi-hit game. Due to the 11 walks and two Tigers errors, every Gator except Avery Barnes reached base.

Pigott sent a 2-run homer to left field in the top of the eighth for his second hit of the game, giving the Gators a big cushion.

"I know the 2 runs in the eighth didn't make the difference in the ballgame, but they certainly gave us some breathing room," O'Sullivan said. "It's good to see Daniel swinging the bat well."

It may only be spring, and the UF volleyball team's season is months away. But winning still feels good, especially against a rival.

The team went 6-0 against in-state rivals FSU, Miami and Florida International in its spring session at Florida Gym.

"Whenever they're keeping score, you want to win," freshman Kelly Murphy said. "There's a reason there's a scoreboard."

The six matches were considerably more than the two matches per weekend the team is used to playing.

UF finished its first round of matches against Miami and won in straight sets (25-23, 25-22). In the second round, the Gators played the Hurricanes again. It took three sets, but the end result was the same — another UF win (25-17, 25-17, 13-15).

UF played FIU and swept the Golden Panthers a second time before playing its most contested match against FSU to end the tournament. Much like their first matchup of the day, UF came out on top in the second and third sets (23-25, 25-23, 16-14).

"It's nice to see the other competition," sophomore Lauren Bledsoe said. "To see if we've improved as a team, to see if everything that we've been working on is the right thing to be working on."

Wise said the session helped simulate competition that can't be created in practice.

"You try and simulate drills like that, but it's not the same," Wise said. "All of those experiences (Saturday) will help us in the fall."

Enea breaks home-run record in doubleheader sweep

The Gators went nine innings before scoring a run in their first game Saturday. In the first inning of their next game, Francesca Enea put 2 runs on the board with one swing.

Enea homered twice, breaking the school career home-run record, and No. 1 UF (42-3, 20-1 Southeastern Conference) swept its doubleheader against Kentucky (25-16, 8-11 SEC) in Lexington, Ky.

After hitting the 36th and 37th home runs of her career in Game 2, Enea was predictably humble about shattering the school record — previously held by Lindsey Cameron — in just two and a half years at UF.

“I’m really excited I got to do that, but it’s not that big of a deal,” Enea said.

The junior left fielder’s two-home-run performance in Game 2 was a drastic change from the way UF struggled at the plate in Game 1.

Wildcats pitcher Rachel Riley threw a nine-inning, one-hit game, holding the Gators without a hit through eight innings.

Ali Gardiner recorded the only hit off Riley in the top of the ninth, and right fielder Kelsey Bruder’s sacrifice fly drove home pinch runner Le-Net Franklin for

the deciding run.

“We just kept hitting grounder after grounder after grounder, and I think the first fly ball in the air was Kelsey’s,” Enea said. “It was so big for Kelsey to make the adjustment and get the run for us.”

Senior pitcher Stacey Nelson (25-3, 0.45 ERA) shut out Kentucky in UF’s 1-0 victory, striking out 12 batters. Nelson gave up five hits but pitched out of several situations where Kentucky had runners in scoring position.

“When I saw how good their pitcher was doing, I knew that I needed to pitch a shutout, or else we might not get away from that game with a win,” Nelson said.

Sophomore Stephanie Brombacher (17-0, 0.96 ERA) followed Nelson’s performance with a 12-strikeout game of her own in the second half of the doubleheader. Brombacher gave up only three hits and walked no batters in UF’s 6-0 win.

Brombacher had a more productive Gators offense to back her up in Game 2. Led by Enea’s first-inning home run to left field, UF jumped out to an early lead and never looked back. Enea added the record-breaking home run, her 14th of the season, in the

fifth inning.

“We were all just a little frustrated with our swings and wondering why we weren’t getting our hits, so I think going in to the second game, we just wanted to put the first game behind us and do what we know how to do and play the way we know how to

play,” Enea said.

UF and Kentucky were originally slated to play a three-game series, starting with a Friday doubleheader and a single game on Saturday, but rain forced the switch to a doubleheader Saturday.

The weather may have caused

an unexpected change in plans Friday, but it also made the Gators more eager to get on the field.

“We were kind of antsy because we’d been sitting in a hotel the whole day before, so we were ready to go out and play,” Nelson said.
