Students settle financial dispute on court television

Two members of the Gator Nation will square-off over a party foul on national TV today in a pre-recorded episode of “Judge Joe Brown.”

Felipe Martinez, 21, successfully sued Chris Carlo, 23, in the judge’s California courtroom for \$2,872 in damages to his ‘98 Chrysler Concorde. Martinez attends UF, and Carlo is a former student.

On Jan. 23, the defendant, Carlo showed up to Martinez’s birthday party uninvited. Carlo got drunk, climbed onto Martinez’s Chrysler and stomped, breaking the windshield and leaving flip-flop prints on the black car’s hood, according to a press release.

After going to small claims court in Alachua

County, Martinez decided to take the case to Judge Brown to claim \$2,872 in damages.

Carlo remembers nothing of the event and said Martinez exaggerated the costs of repairing the car, according to the release. The show paid for the damages, which is partially why the litigants decided to participate, Martinez said.

Trustees approve tuition hike for fall

■ BRIGHT FUTURES WILL NOT COVER THE INCREASE.

Students will likely pay about 16 percent more for classes this fall after UF’s Board of Trustees approved the increases at Friday’s meeting.

The board approved the maximum tuition hike under the state’s differential tuition plan, which allows a 15 percent increase each year until each of the state’s 11 public universities reaches the national average.

The increase, which the Board of Governors is expected to approve this week, is not covered by the Bright Futures scholarship pro-

gram. The board also approved fee increases and the implementation of a new technology fee.

Matt Fajack, UF’s chief financial officer, also briefed the trustees on a new budget model that will change the way colleges within UF are funded.

The new model, being implemented as a result of the budget crisis, makes costs more transparent and rewards certain benchmarks.

“It’s really based on how productive you are—the number of (student credit hours) you teach, the number of students that are enrolled in your program, the amount of research you do, the ability to be creative and come up with entrepreneurial revenues,” Fajack said.

71-year-old man banned from campus after poking student’s butt

A 71-year-old Gainesville man was banned from campus Wednesday after he poked a 21-year-old female UF student in the butt three times at Library West, according to the University Police Department.

Marion Danzy allegedly poked the student three times in the span of about a minute and then left the library, at which point the student contacted library security, according to police.

The incident occurred around 7:30 p.m.

An officer caught up with Danzy minutes later outside the library, where he was identified by the student and banned from campus for three years. Danzy spoke poor English and might have been homeless, said UPD Officer Chris McIlrath.

The student declined to press charges, so UPD will not forward the case to the state attorney’s office. No other students reported being touched by Danzy.

Florida teen charged in cat killings, mutilations

MIAMI — A teenager accused of killing and mutilating more than a dozen cats in two South Florida communities must undergo a psychiatric evaluation before he is released from jail, a judge ruled Monday.

Tyler Hayes Weinman, 18, appeared at an afternoon bond hearing in a Miami-Dade County courtroom via videoconference a day after he was charged with 19 counts each of animal cruelty and improperly disposing of an animal body and four counts of burglary related to the deaths. Judge Mindy Glazer ruled Weinman must also wear an electronic monitoring device if he is released on bond, which was set at \$249,500.

with the addition of a memorial garden for cancer victims.

The Garden of Hope will be a place for patients, their friends, families and the public to relax, said Ted Kruljac, Shands Health-Care office development associate.

"The idea is for people to have that escape. You have patients who have been going through treatment and need that time to reflect, meditate and experience the spiritual side of healing," he said.

The garden will be a lush, green space on the southeast grounds of the cancer hospital, according to Ellen Shapiro, a member of the Garden of Hope Marketing Committee.

"It's a garden for the whole community," she said. "We're really hoping the community will use it."

The garden will feature a memorial wall with plaques displaying the names of cancer victims, commemorative trees and benches, a butterfly garden, an

amphitheater and a pond, Shapiro said.

The garden's cost is estimated at \$250,000, Shapiro said. Developers hope the cost will be covered by donors who purchase plaques for the memorial wall, commemorative benches and trees.

The garden fund has grown to more than \$90,000, mostly from fundraisers called garden parties, that have taken place since spring of 2008.

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Harn Museum exhibit displays abstract artwork

"Rediscovering Slobodkina: A Pioneer of American Abstraction" will debut today at the Samuel P. Harn Museum of Art, showcasing the work of Esphyr Slobodkina.

One of the first female American abstract artists, Slobodkina produced more than 500 works of art including the famous children's book "Caps for Sale."

Running through Sept. 6, the exhibit will showcase 66 works including paintings, drawings and abstract constructions made with dissembled everyday items.

Dulce Roman, the museum's modern art curator, said the exhibition was chosen to commemorate the recent purchase of Slobodkina's "Mural Sketch No. 1."

"The modern collection has so few works by women artists, making this an especially won-

derful acquisition for the museum," she said.

Roman said the Harn lent the piece to the traveling exhibit before it could even be displayed in the museum.

The exhibition also displays a few of Slobodkina's major works from the 1940s including "Crossroad No. 2," on loan from the Smithsonian American Art Museum.

Local News In 2002, two years before her death at the age

of 93, Slobodkina established the Slobodkina Foundation to showcase her works. The touring exhibit is organized by the foundation in conjunction with the Heckscher Museum of Art in Huntington, N.Y.

The first guided tour of the exhibit will take place Sunday at 2 p.m., followed by a more formal lecture on the life and works of Slobodkina.

Police find body in bushes

He was reported missing on Thursday

Gainesville police are awaiting the autopsy results for a man whose body was discovered near Northwest 23rd Avenue Monday morning.

At about 10 a.m., people walking on Northwest 23rd Avenue saw two legs poking out from under bushes near the intersection of Northwest 23rd Avenue and Northwest Eighth Street.

When they arrived at the scene, Gainesville Police Department officers found the decomposing body of Robert Ware, 50, in front of Betty Hilgendorf Real Estate, 738 NW 23rd Ave.

GPD Lt. Mike Schiboula said the police are waiting for the autopsy results, which will be available later today. Schiboula said no foul play was suspected.

Schiboula said that Ware lived in Gator Village, 321 NW 21st Lane, near where his body was found.

He said that Ware lived with a roommate who reported him missing Thursday night.

His roommate said that Ware had some health conditions that authorities are looking into, Schiboula said.


While some students enjoy using and following Twitter, she said, it is not something widespread enough to affect the majority of students.

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

City Commissioners discuss budget cuts with locals

George Elmore has attended city hall and town hall meetings for 37 years, but he says this one was not like the rest.

"Most people in attendance came to preserve what they have," Elmore said, referring to the 5 percent budget cut the city will have to make in the upcoming fiscal year. "The declining revenue base is tough for all of us."

The City Commission hosted a special town hall meeting Monday night in District 4. Commissioners received input from about 35 residents on the 2010 fiscal year budget and the 10-year Evaluation and Appraisal Report of the City's comprehensive plan.

Although residents' main concern was the city's budget cut, the City Commission listened to local opinions on topics such as land use, design and redevelopment, transportation, the environment, quality of life

and economic issues, all sub-categories within the report.

Resident Melanie Barr thought the meeting was productive.

"The City Commission was very attentive to what we had to say," she said.

Man gets life in prison for parking garage shooting

■ HE KILLED A MAN AFTER THE UF-FSU FOOTBALL GAME IN 2007.

After a three-day murder trial, a Gainesville man was sentenced to life in prison for killing Tallahassee resident Andrew

Arosamena in the Downtown Gainesville Parking Garage about a year and a half ago, hours after a UF - FSU football game.

The Nov. 26, 2007 shooting occurred on the second floor of the Southwest Downtown Parking Garage near Market Street Pub.

At about 2:20 a.m., a blue car was blocking traffic on the garage's exit ramp.

Arosamena rolled down the passenger-side window of the car he was in and yelled at the driver to move. Nelson, who was

talking to people in the blue car, walked over to the car Arosamena was in and shot him in the head, Mann said.

Okpara Nelson, 23, was charged with two consecutive life sentences for first-degree murder and armed burglary, at about 6 p.m.

Co-defendant Antwan Maye, 26, offered a no contest plea shortly after the shooting, said State Attorney's Office spokesman Spencer Mann.

After entering the plea, Maye was sentenced to four years in prison on charges of accessory after the fact to first-degree murder, tampering with evidence and aggravated assault with a firearm, Mann said.

As part of Maye's no contest deal, he had to testify against Nelson in the trial.

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Season to bring fewer shows due to budget

Although one UF program is used to drama, a potential \$90,000 budget cut might be a tough act to follow.

Like other departments, the UF Performing Arts program is facing a 10 percent cut, which could possibly cost the program \$90,000.

With about 50 scheduled performances, the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts will be offering fewer shows this season to keep costs within the budget range, said James Kersey, assistant box office manager.

The program started reducing productions about two years ago to prepare for possible cuts, said Elizabeth Auer, assistant director of the center.

To keep production diversity throughout the season, the center cut one perfor-

mance from each genre to avoid eliminating any one particular branch of the arts.

"It is important to us that we still offer a broad range of styles to create options for everyone attending," said Auer.

This season, the center will be bring in well-known musicals such as "Hairspray" and "Cats" in addition to "Avenue Q," a 2003-debuting musical that pokes fun at issues like drinking and porn.

Although event tickets range from \$30 to \$50, with the help of Student Government, performing arts tickets will be available to UF students for \$10 in the upcoming season. General tickets will go on sale June 18 while student tickets will be available starting Aug. 3.

Marketing coordinator Marilyn Patrick said in order to reach more students and improve ticket sales, UF Performing Arts will be creating a Twitter account this fall.

NASA to attempt launch

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — NASA will try to launch space shuttle Endeavour again Wednesday, after repairing a hydrogen gas leak that thwarted the first attempt.

Top officials decided Monday to bump an unmanned moon mission so Endeavour could have another shot at flying to the international space station.

The delayed moon mission is NASA's first in a decade and is critical to the space agency's long-term effort to return humans to the lunar surface.

The Atlas V rocket had been scheduled to blast off Wednesday with a pair of lunar probes — a moon-mapping orbiter and a craft meant to crash into a shadowed crater at the moon's south pole. That launch is now scheduled for no earlier than Thursday; it would slip to Friday if the shuttle countdown proceeds trouble-free into early Wednesday.

"If you've spent any time on the Space Coast and monitoring launches, you notice that they tend to attract each other, and we've got that very situation here," said Chuck Dovale, launch director for the moon mission.

NASA ended up having to choose between the two missions because Endeavour

could not launch this past Saturday. The potentially dangerous hydrogen gas leak in the vent line leading to the shuttle's external fuel tank halted the countdown. Technicians finished the repairs Monday.

The launch is scheduled for 5:40 a.m. Wednesday. Forecasters put the odds of good weather at 80 percent.

Endeavour and its crew of seven must be flying by this weekend, otherwise it will have to wait until mid-July. That's because of unfavorable sun angles that would heat the shuttle too much while it is docked to the space station.

Murder-suicide not the answer to financial woes

Tragedy struck suburban Orlando on Monday with news of a murder-suicide claiming the lives of a Heathrow family.

John Wood, 41, shot and killed his wife and two children before taking his own life in their posh gated community. Sadly, what may appear as eye-opening news for most neighborhoods could be deemed commonplace in Central Florida.

According to an article in the Orlando Sentinel, there have been at least six murder-suicides in the region since Jan. 1. Three took place within a 10-day period in May.

While there does not appear to be a common thread linking the cases, the Wood family's financial woes may have triggered the unfortunate situation.

Forced to find a new job at a sporting goods store, Wood filed for bankruptcy in 2004 and was set to appear before an Orlando court in August to hash out his fiscal status. On top of the patriarch's financial misgivings, Cynthia Wood recently lost her job. The story of the Wood family's unfortunate struggles echo a tale currently being lived out by countless families across the country.

Simply put, times are tough.

For a man to give up hope and end the lives of his wife and young children speaks of an individual who let finances dictate the course of his life. There is no denying the fact that the ability to find inner peace while struggling to balance a budget demands persistence and determination. But as dire as one's situation may seem, the selfish act of a murder-suicide should never be rendered a viable option.

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

Franken deserves seat in U.S. Senate

I sure hope that Minnesota can get used to being a congressional amputee.

Ever since the state's controversial November election, a legal battle has ensued over who won the rights to a seat in the U.S. Senate.

At first it seemed that Norm Coleman, a Republican, had eked out a victory. But an automatic recount, triggered by the small margin of victory, found comedian Al Franken to be the winner. The state Canvassing Board met and affirmed Franken's victory. The matter has been taken to the Minnesota Supreme Court and a ruling should be handed down soon.

The smart money is on Franken.

Of course, none of this is to say that Minnesota is remotely near electing a senator. Coleman has indicated that he is willing to take this matter all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court.

I'm at a loss to fathom the depths of poor sportsmanship that are driving Coleman to these extremes. Have the memories of the invective heaped upon Al Gore when he retracted his concession already faded from Republican minds? It seems so.

Interestingly enough, the results of a recent Minnesota poll indicate that 64 percent of Coleman's constituents actually favor his concession.

An equally high percentage of Minnesotans expect his defeat, whether they want it or not. Furthermore, Coleman's numbers are weak even when only Republicans are polled.

The message is clear: A majority of Minnesotans believe Coleman should bow out gracefully.

I'm impressed by the tenacity of the man once dubbed the "fourth most corrupt senator." In the digni-

fied body that housed Ted Stevens, that is quite the accomplishment. Coleman only wants what's right for Minnesotans and is determined to do everything in his power to ensure they receive that most precious gift: himself. He will pursue this course of action, even to the point of abusing the democratic

process.

All of this is fair, though. Coleman has the right to throw a hissy fit and sue. That's one of the benefits of the American political system. When an election outcome is too close to call, a candidate can turn to the judicial process rather than resorting to riots and violence. The only problem is that, ordinarily, there should be some evidence of foul play to support judicial mediation. Simply saying "no fair" because you lost is both absurd and pathetic.

Don't expect this situation to be resolved anytime soon. There is a lot at stake. If Franken wins, the Democrats will have their filibuster-proof 60 seats. And, despite the general trend of public opinion, Norm Coleman does have a core group of support. They will stick with him to the bitter end, which may come in an Alamo-style last stand in front of justices Antonin Scalia, John Roberts, Ruth Ginsberg and the rest of the merry pranksters. Coleman has decided to fight, and will, but he should consider one thing:

Is his obstinacy even remotely in the best interest of Minnesotans? This observer doubts it.

Iranian youth rely on Twitter to inform world about elections

Abdul-Azim Mohammed was providing a play-by-play of the Iran Election early Sunday morning. Azim first reported that local police stations had been forced to burn ballot boxes filled with votes for Mir-Hossein Mousavi, Mahmoud Ahmadinejad's presidential challenger. A few minutes later, Azim declared that Internet access and phone lines had been cut off. Later, Azim's reports of people filling the streets of Tehran were verified with BBC footage showing legions of angry young Iranians chanting "Death to the Dictator" in the streets.

Azim was on a roll.

In less than two hours his Internet followers had grown from just a handful to more than 2,000 fans checking in for real-time updates of the growing tension caused by a widely suspected rigged presidential election in Iran. His report that his brother had seen riots breaking out in northeast Iran was as eerie as his report that the Iranian government was claiming that power

failure and cell phone tower outages were caused by maintenance on the city's electrical grid. Then, reports of sirens in his neighborhood hindered the number of times Azim could give the world a glimpse into the electoral drama unfolding across Iran. Shortly after the sirens had passed his street, Azim told his audience that he was using an illegal satellite dish as his connection to the outside world and wrote one last post, "I have to shut down for a bit, the police are looking for satellites."

That was Saturday at 6:14 p.m. EST.

Abdul-Azim Mohammed is not a professional journalist. Azim is a 22-year-old college student living in Iran's capital city, and much like his western counterparts, he's a fan of the social messaging Web site Twitter, where for more than three hours early Sunday morning he sent out 31 tweets, or mini messages, about the state of Iran in the aftermath of its presidential election upset.

While it should be noted that Azim's

identity cannot be verified, there are millions of young Iranians just like him taking to the streets across Iran protesting the supposed electoral landslide that President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, the Iranian Interior Department and the Ayatollah Ali Khomeini are all claiming.

What the protestors are claiming is vastly different than a landslide for Ahmadinejad. Many believe fraud. Still, an anonymous female Iranian journalist in an interview with Radio Free Europe castigated outside observers who called the election a fraud. "There was no fraud; it was a coup," she told her interviewer.

Whether it is a coup or an unexpected election upset, none of the powers-that-be in Iran could have predicted the influence of the Millennial Generation. When their

votes were discounted, the young Iranians showed up to polling places in record numbers. And when the government confiscated NBC and ABC cameras and yanked foreign visas, they never predicted the young Iranians would take to Web sites like Twitter and organize protests and mass exoduses to rooftops in the night to shout Allah Akbar, or God is Great. Interestingly enough, the last time such an ordeal happened was in 1979 when the Shah skipped town after another young generation of Iranians took to the streets.

As black smoke clouds the Tehran skyline and young Mousavi supporters organize more protests from Twitter and Facebook, one has to wonder if the mullahs and the Iranian old guard underestimated the power today's instant technological communications can play in democracies. Perhaps revolutions are, technically, generational.

Granted, some skills you learn in college are directly applicable to specific fields. If you want to be an accountant, studying accounting is really the only way to go.

The criticism usually focuses on people who choose more esoteric, liberal-arts majors. In place of finance expertise, the job market tends to see the choice of personal fulfillment as nothing more than a handicap.

When liberal arts graduates enter the job market, they give their college degree as more of a symbol than a qualification. Graduating college means you are trainable, capable of seeing something through to the end and presumably smarter than you were before. But none of that can necessarily be traced back to college, especially by potential employers.

Maybe you were already smart enough for the job in question before you went to school; maybe you were always committed; and maybe studying art history won't actually help you sell real estate or insurance.

Meanwhile, universities, responding to a greater desire from high school graduates who wanted to stay competitive for the best jobs, opened up more campuses and created more paths to a college degree. The problem is the best students took to going to graduate school in greater num-

bers. The momentary advantage given by a more equal disbursement of college diplomas was simply nullified by those who were always more academic or intelligent (or wealthy).

College is still, as it was 50 years ago, extremely expensive and extremely time-consuming. The difference is that it's also now necessary for jobs that, 50 years ago, could have been taken by high school graduates. But for those who couldn't attend college, because the money wasn't there or because they weren't academic enough to attend a university, they are now excluded from an

opportunity they were not unsuitable for.

All this has a very polarizing effect. The uppermost get the jobs they were always going to get; the middle get the jobs they had before; but the least fortunate suddenly find that they cannot afford to pursue opportunities they used to have.

And, yes, the general population is left better educated. It is also poorer and has less choice. Especially in these times, is that a burden we want to impose on our citizens?

Mayor wants to cut price on Depot project

It may cost \$1.5 to \$2.3 million to reconstruct Gainesville's historic Depot building, a long-term city project located just south of downtown.

But Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan, who has been a long-term proponent of the project, said its price was too steep at a Community Redevelopment Agency meeting Monday.

Burke Bender, of Bender & Associates Architects, provided the estimate.

"I think it's a little crazy to spend \$2.3 million to reconstruct a depot building that cost us \$80,000," Hanrahan said.

The money would go toward restoring Gainesville's oldest train depot, and the large price tag includes money-

saving sustainability standards, Bender said.

While she hopes to cut the project's budget, Hanrahan still believes it is worthwhile.

"I think it's a little crazy to spend \$2.3 million to reconstruct a depot building that cost us \$80,000."

"Purchasing and investing in the Depot is an excellent investment," she said. "Gainesville was actually formed as a hub on the rail line, which was key to the development of the state of Florida."

Football players to join police officers for ride-along

■ THE PLAYERS WILL RIDE DURING GPD'S BUSIEST HOURS.

During the next few weeks, expect to see Florida football players seated in the front, not the back, of local police cruisers.

In four years, the UF football team has racked up 21 arrests, including nine felonies, and three citations. In light of these numbers, the University Athletic Association and Gainesville Police Department partnered to

provide a way for players to see what the other side of law enforcement is like.

Football players can volunteer to attend a ride-along with GPD officers between 5 p.m. and 4 a.m., the department's busiest hours, said GPD spokesman Lt. Mike Schibuola.

"Students get arrested every weekend, but student-athletes get more attention," he said, adding that the arrest rate is similar for both groups. According to Schibuola, about 25 students are arrested every weekend, usually for possession of alcohol by a minor or underage drinking.

In April 2007, former offensive guard Ronnie Wilson was arrested on charges of battery

and discharging a firearm in public, an incident that sparked the phrase "University of Felons in Gunville, Fla." to be used by Gator critics.

Wilson reportedly spat on someone outside of a Gainesville nightclub, took an AK-47 assault rifle out of the trunk of a car and fired it into the air.

After two charges for marijuana possession and a misdemeanor for battery and assault, Wilson was kicked off the team.

Earlier this month, starting cornerback Ja-

noris Jenkins was Tasered and arrested after fighting five people outside of a Gainesville nightclub.

Steve Russell, radio personality for AM 850's "Sport Scene," feels the arrests of Florida football players has been sensationalized.

"In the summer, stories that might not be a big deal in the heat of competition become a little more blown up because there is nothing going on," Russell said.

Still, Russell does not excuse the rate of UF football player arrests.

"Bottom line, there are probably too many, and it is the head coach's responsibility to help make it better," Russell said.

Hundreds of thousands of Iranians protest election

TEHRAN, Iran — In a massive outpouring reminiscent of the Islamic Revolution three decades ago, hundreds of thousands of Iranians streamed through the capital Monday, and the fist-waving protesters denounced President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad's claim to victory in a disputed election.

Standing on rooftops, pro-government gunmen opened fire on a group of protesters who had tried to storm the militia's compound. One man was killed, and several others were wounded in the worst violence since the disputed election Friday.

Angry men showed their bloody palms after cradling the dead and wounded who had been part of a crowd that stretched more than five miles supporting reform leader Mir Hossein Mousavi.

The huge rally reinforced what has become increasingly clearer since the election: The opposition forces rallying behind Mousavi show no signs of backing down. Their resolve appears to have pushed Iran's Islamic establishment into attempts to cool the tensions after days of unrest.

Police and other security forces stood by quietly — some sitting

on stoops with their batons and shields resting behind them as the marchers swallowed the streets in

parts of Tehran. Estimates put the turnout at hundreds of thousands overflowing the square, where

crowds of 200,000 have filled the plaza in the past.

Mousavi made his first public

appearance since the polls closed, and he launched his claims that the vote was rigged to re-elect the hard-line president.

Brief clips of the march were shown on state television in an extremely rare nod to anti-government attacks.

"Respect the people's vote!" Mousavi cried through a hand-held loudspeaker in Azadi, or Freedom, Square — where Iran's leaders hold military and political gatherings.

It appeared that Iran's ruling clerics had opened the door for the demonstration — even giving it news coverage — in a possible bid to avoid more street clashes and seek some breathing room in the growing confrontation.

The United States was "deeply troubled" by reports of violence and arrests in Iran, State Department spokesman Ian Kelly said, but he added that the U.S. knows too little about the conduct of the election to say for sure whether there was fraud.

Britain and Germany joined the calls of alarm over the rising confrontations in Iran. In Paris, the Foreign Ministry summoned the Iranian ambassador to discuss the allegations of vote-tampering and the violence.

"It is an extremely rational approach," said Trustee Al Warrington, "that I think we as trustees should demand and require."

UF President Bernie Machen, however,

said if it wasn't for budget cuts, he'd rather stick with the status quo.

"We are not a business; we are an academic institution," he said. "But it would be naïve of us to sit here and not recognize that we need to pay attention to the way other entities, including businesses, operate."

Trustees also approved a change that will make it easier to lay off staff.

State News

Instead of only being able to consider length of employment and performance evaluations for some staff layoffs, UF will now be able to consider other factors, like skill

and education.

Paula Cunningham, an office assistant in agronomy, told trustees she didn't think staff members were properly notified of the proposed change, which, she argued, will erode the job security of "thousands of UF's most dedicated employees."

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Nelson named to USA Softball Women's National Team

After representing her school for four years, Stacey Nelson will move on to represent her country.

Nelson, who holds nearly every UF softball pitching record, was one of 18 players named to the 2009 USA Softball Women's National Team and one of 16 named to the Japan Cup team on Monday after spending a week at the team's selection camp in Chula Vista, Calif.

Although cautiously optimistic about her chances of making the national team during the camp, Nelson remained as humble as ever about the experience of competing for a roster spot.

"All the pitchers here are so fantastic that I kind of feel like I'm at the bottom looking up," Nelson said in a phone interview Thursday. "But it's such an honor just to be here and to get to pitch to hitters like these."

The selection camp was Nelson's first time on the diamond since Washington swept UF in the Women's College World Series championship series.

"It's kind of helped get my mind off the loss and everything," she said. "That was a long week without softball. It's nice to get back on the field again."

Nelson struggled in her final three college games, giving up an uncharacteristic 10 earned runs while the Gators suffered their first back-to-back losses since March 31, 2007.

The bitter end to an otherwise outstanding career further motivated Nelson to prove herself during the selection camp. By earning a spot on Team USA,

Nelson joins an elite group of pitchers.

As it did in 2008, the national team will carry five pitchers: Nelson; Monica Abbott, who holds the NCAA records for the most wins and strikeouts; Katie Burkhart, the Most Outstanding Player of the 2008 WCWS; Cat Osterman, who is tied for sixth with Nelson in career wins (136); and Jennie Finch, arguably the most famous softball player ever.

"It's so weird to have peo-

Horschel misses cut in PGA Tour tournament

Before Billy Horschel's first-ever PGA Tour event, he attempted to downplay the huge adjustment necessary to make the jump from college to professional golf.

"It's just the same as my four years in college," the former UF men's golfer said. "Even though the level of play is higher, you are still playing the golf course."

However, Horschel might have underestimated some growing pains that come with a promotion to the professional ranks. This past weekend, he missed the cut in the St. Jude Classic and was eliminated after the second round with a score of 4 over par.

After a first-round score of 1 over par, he struggled with his putting in the

second round, shooting 3 over par and missing the cut by three strokes.

UF men's golf coach Buddy Alexander acknowledged the acclimation period the former UF golfer will experience.

"Obviously he's disappointed and I was disappointed for him, but I think it's not totally surprising," Alexander said. "That's a different level. That's a whole other ball game when you move up to play in PGA Tour events."

But if Horschel wants some inspiration, he will not have to look far. Former UF men's golfer Camilo Villegas entered the PGA Tour in 2004 and missed the cut in his first event with a score of 9 over par. Now, according to Golfweek, Villegas is the 13th best golfer in the world. Also, former Gator Brian Gay won the St. Jude Classic by five strokes.

After successful runs at the NCAA East Regional and the Southeastern Conference Championships, the NCAA Outdoor Championships was the last meet for both UF teams this season.

The Gators didn't meet their designated goal.

Though the NCAA Championships, held in Fayetteville, Ark., may not have ended the way the Gators wanted, Holloway and the Gators did not walk away empty-handed.

The men's track and field team tied for

second with Florida State and Oregon, all with 46 points, and the women's team placed ninth with 23 points.

Texas A&M won both the men's and women's team titles.

"Our goal was to win a national championship," Holloway said. "Though we fell short of that goal, it has been a very successful season for both teams."

Junior Mariam Kevkhishvili won the women's shot put with a throw of 58-4.50/17.79m. Kevkhishvili won this event at the NCAA Indoor Championships as well as the SEC Championship and the NCAA East Regional this season.

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


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FSU's Wetherell to retire

TALLAHASSEE — Florida State University President T.K. Wetherell will tell the school's trustees this week that he wants to retire.

Two school officials close to Wetherell told The Associated Press on Monday he will inform the trustees at the conclusion of its board meeting Wednesday. They asked not to be named because they aren't authorized to make the announcement.

Wetherell said Monday he's focused on his budget preparation for Wednesday's meeting and didn't want to discuss his personal plans.

He noted it's routine for presidents to give a year's notice to find a replacement.

"And next year is 2010," he said. "I'll figure that out when I figure that out."

The trustees, who want Wetherell to remain until a successor is chosen, plan a national search for a leader with a background that focuses on academics, the sources said.

A former star football player at Florida State, Wetherell became president at his alma mater in January 2003.

Now 63, Wetherell has been treated for prostate cancer in recent years, but said he got a clean bill of health last week from doctors at the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville.

ple like Jennie Finch at first base rooting you on when you're pitching and just being on the field with athletes I've heard about for years and years and years," Nelson said.

Although the players at the selection camp were among the most talented in the nation, Nelson described the competition among the 41 athletes vying for roster spots as "more laid back than you'd think."

"(The competition) doesn't really carry over off the field be-

cause everybody's really nice here and being complimentary of everybody else's skills," Nelson said. "On the field, it's a little bit laid back, but everybody's trying to do their best."

Softball is no longer an Olympic sport, but Nelson and Team USA will compete in the Canada

Cup in Surrey, B.C., and the World Cup in Oklahoma City in July.

With only eight returning players from the 2008 Olympic team, Nelson is part of a new generation of talent that will represent the U.S. in international competition through three different teams.

Three other Southeastern Con-

ference players were named to the national team with Nelson: Chelsea Bramlett of Mississippi State and Ashley Holcombe and Britany Rogers of Alabama.

The USA Softball Japan Cup team, a separate entity from the national team, will participate in the Japan Cup in Sendai, Japan.

Magic, Rays stories eerily similar after tough defeats

On Oct. 22, I was at Tropicana Field for the Tampa Bay Rays' first-ever World Series game.

My friend, who generously offered his family's extra ticket to me, still pokes fun at me for the stupid grin I had on my face for the first eight innings of the game.

Sure, the Rays were on their way to a 3-2 loss, but I was just happy to be there — on that big of a stage, wondering how I even got there.

Fittingly, over the next week, I watched my team look just as happy to be there as I had been, and the Rays came away with their first-ever World Series defeat, a 4-1 romp at the hands of the Phillies.

Eight months later, as I watched Kobe Bryant and the Los Angeles Lakers win Game 5 of the NBA Finals against the Orlando Magic, it all felt a little too familiar.

Not because Phil Jackson won his record 10th championship, not because Kobe won his fourth ring — celebrating it like Michael Jordan did, standing on stage and waving four fingers in the air — and not because Adam Morrison probably cried at some point.


It was because my team just looked happy to be that deep into the postseason, and for the second time in a year, a central Florida team full of young talent fell 4-1 in a championship series.

Neither team was predicted to even make it as far as they did. The Magic should have fallen to either the defending-champion Celtics or LeBron James and the Cavaliers, and the Rays were a classic worst-first story.

Like Carlos Pena and Evan Longoria, who went hitless in the World Series until Game 5, Dwight Howard and Rashard Lewis disappointed in the Finals.

Howard supposedly announced his presence as a superstar with his outstanding performance in Game 6 of the Eastern Conference Finals, when he did what all the great players have done: put his team on his back and carried it to victory.

Although he led all players in rebounds in four out of five Finals games, he was his team's top scorer just once, matching Lewis' 21 points in Game 3, the Magic's only win in the Finals.



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It was also the franchise's first championship victory, breaking the curse of Nick "the Brick" Anderson, whose four

missed free throws against the Houston Rockets in Game 1 of the 1995 Finals forced Orlando to wait 14 more years for its first win in a championship series, a short eight months after the Rays got theirs.

While the ultimate demise of the Rays and the Magic can be traced to a number of issues — a lack of experience, sub-par performances by their best players and key role players not stepping up, to name a few — both suffered from what I call a "championship moment in a non-championship game."

For the Rays, I thought it was rookie pitcher David Price stepping onto the mound to close out Game 7 of the ALCS against the Red Sox.

When Akinori Iwamura stepped onto second base for the final out, the resulting celebration was like that of a world champion.

For the Magic, it was the six-game dethroning of King James and the Cleveland Cavaliers, capped off by Howard's playoff career-high 40 points.

The best example of this concept was Ali Gardiner's walk-off grand slam against Alabama in the Women's College World Series semifinals. It was such an emotional moment, such a high point for the team and its fans. It was like the climax of a story.

Unfortunately for all three teams, the subsequent falling action was finishing as a national runner-up.

When the unprecedented, miraculous runs to the championship ended for the Magic and Rays, both immediately started to talk about next year.

But with the Rays fighting to stay above .500 and the Magic potentially losing several key players to free agency, there's another similarity: They'll both be even happier to be there if they find themselves back in the title hunt in the near future.



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
